



## Filter Material Cutting

Cut surgical or N95 mask in to 2.5in x 2.5in (65mm x 65mm) squares as many times as possible.




## Filter Material Numbering


Number each square as 1,2,3, etc. in the corner. This will be your daily filter change schedule. Some mask sizes may make more than 6 square filters when cut, If possible do so.




Remove the filter frame and place your filter over the hole.



Press the filter frame into the mask pressure fitting your filter into place.



When the day is done, remove your filter and place it individually into closed a paper bag. Do not use a plastic bag.



Repeat steps 3-6 **every day** using a new filter each day until it becomes necessary to reuse your filters starting at filter #1.

You must have at least five filters in your rotation, and only use one per day to comply with CDC guidelines.

Do not reuse a filter in less than five days
