Northern Lights Exploration

Nothing can prepare you for your first sighting of the Northern Lights. The way they swirl through star-studded skies. The neon colors. The majestic silence. And the same goes for Alaska's winter landscape. The Last Frontier state is a wildlife wonderland—wolf packs, grizzlies, foxes and hares roam free while eagles soar overhead—and from electric blue glaciers to cinematic fjords and bubbling hot springs, Mother Nature has truly outdone herself (no wonder Santa chose here, we wish we did too).

DAY 1

MT. ALYESKA / PORTAGE VALLEY

Ride a tram to the top of Mt. Alyeska

Explore Portage Valley with its icebergs

Your week begins on one of the most photogenic roads on the planet: as Alaska's Seaward Highway winds its way to Anchorage, you'll want to photograph every turn. One moment you're cruising past a lake, carved by the glaciers surrounding it, with grizzlies fishing in the shallows. The next, you're surrounded by thick snowy forest—blink and you'll miss the flashes of red as foxes dart between the trees. Moments later, you find yourself face to face with a dramatic fjord...or you're watching bald eagles circle mountain peaks...or gazing over the ocean, where a pod of beluga whales play.

After a few favorite lookout stops along the way, we reach goldmining-turned-ski-town of Girdwood. Formerly known as Glacier City, it borders the half million acres of gorgeous glacial wilderness that makes up the Chugach State Park. You'll soon be peering over the park's vast majesty from above, after a ride on Girdwood's famous tramway.

Up at the top of Mt. Alyeska, you're 2300 feet above sea level, turning in every direction for soaring sights of hanging glaciers, endless wilderness and the Turnagain Arm below. You'll immediately see what Captain Cook couldn't from the water—that the passageway to Europe doesn't exist (Cook eventually turned back, hence the name, Turnagain).

From the top of the world, you'll continue your journey to a lake so deep it could sink a skyscraper: Down in the Portage Valley, mountains give way to the vast Portage Lake, forged by surrounding glaciers so vividly white and blue they nearly glow. Once filling the entire valley, these glaciers exist in a state of constant change—which you may witness before your eyes as icebergs plunge into the lake.

Such starkness and silence surrounds you that it's hard to imagine how Alaska's wildlife exist. You'll see for yourself this afternoon, at the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center. Spanning 200 acres and guarded by the Chugach peaks on the shore of the Turnagain Arm, the center is dedicated to preserving, protecting and providing a home for Alaska's orphaned, injured and endangered wildlife. Watch playful bears, crafty foxes and skulking lynx, and see just how enormous wood bison grow as you explore the grounds and meet the amazing people who care for them (there are some incredibly daring rescue stories).

DAY 2

MATANUSKA GLACIER

- Walk a cinematic route across a glacier
- Marvel at the vast sweep of the Milky Way as the Northern Lights paint the velvet night skies

A path sculpted by shifting snow and ice, Glenn Highway heaving in glacial gorgeousness—is the route to today's destination. You'll see Matanuska Glacier, a mammoth 27mile river of ice pouring from Chugach peaks, before you reach it. But you won't fully appreciate its majesty until you're right on top of it, boots crunching across the frosted surface. With your expert guide in the lead, you'll walk a cinematic route across this ancient natural phenomenon, passing ice-formed caves, spires, crevices and curvatures of unfathomably bright white and electric blue.

All of your equipment, clothing and boots will be provided, as well as a delicious lunch at a local eatery. From salmon to venison and potatoes to wild berries, Alaska's fresh produce makes for magnificent mealtimes throughout this trip. Enjoy more of it at this evening's welcome dinner, before we turn our gaze to the Talkeetna skies...

Talkeetna's wild landscape of rivers and peaks has deliciously little development, letting the Northern Lights dance across the sky, uninterrupted. Your guide will calculate the best time and place according to the current conditions—just wrap up warm and prepare for a night show like no other.

DAY 3

TALKEETNA

- · Hop into a dog sled for an incredibly run ride
- Meet pro mushers who recount their experiences in the Iditarod race

You're spending today with some of the world's most impressively accomplished—and irresistibly adorable athletes. Huskies. Dog sledding is more than a tradition in Alaska. It's part of life, celebrated annually at the Iditarod Sled Dog Race. Meet pro mushers who'll recount their experiences of the harsh landscape and extreme weather synonymous with "The Last Great Race on Earth", and enjoy plenty of time petting their four-legged teammates, from roly-poly puppies you'll want to take home with you, to championship veterans with impressive accomplishments.

Then, take to a trail, sat snug in your sled as a musher takes the reigns and your new furry friends show you their favorite pastime. The excitement of the dogs is palpable as they prepare, and once they're off, it'll only take seconds speeding through crisp air and utterly silent, snow-white forest— to realize why Alaskans fell so in love with this sport.

You'll still be talking about the huskies this evening, as you marvel at the vast sweep of the Milky Way, and watch for more Northern Lights in the velvet Talkeetna skies.

DAY 4

DENALI NATIONAL PARK

- Gaze at America's tallest peak as you explore Denali National Park
- Join a snowshoe walk in search of Alaska's Big Five

Words and pictures don't do justice to Denali National Park in wintertime. They can't capture the sheer silence, spanning all six million acres of the park. The tremendous wildness of the tundra. Or the monolithic presence of North America's tallest peak, which Native Athabascans perfectly named "Great One". You have to be there. To feel it. And you will, today. On a snowshoe safari with your naturalist guide. Keep watch for Alaska's Big Five: grizzlies, wolves, moose, caribou and Dall sheep, as well as white hares and hundreds of different bird species. The park's Murie Science and Learning Center is filled with fascinating facts and exhibits. Discover Denali's dinosaur past (where your snowshoes trod today, three-toed theropods stomped millions of years ago) and meet park rangers who work to protect the stunning surroundings.

Just when you thought the skies couldn't possibly get darker, enter Denali after dusk. The sheer solitude of this region, almost totally free from light pollution, provides staggeringly good stargazing and sightings of the Northern Lights.

DAY 5

CHENA HOT SPRINGS

- · Walk with reindeer through a countryside winter wonderland
- Take advantage of your prime position in the Auroral Oval to watch the iridescent glow of the aurora borealis

Today, you'll meet our friend Jane at her charming Reindeer Ranch in the Goldstream Valley. Join her on a walk-through wintery woodland straight from a fairy tale, as the resident reindeer roam and graze alongside you.

This afternoon you have a choice: fire or ice. If you choose ice, you're off to see all kinds of weird and wonderful creations carved from a thousand tons of ice from the surrounding area in the Aurora Ice Museum. World championship carvers Steve and Heather have created a fabulous two-storey observation tower to view it from, and you'll hear about their achievements and art on a visit.

Choose fire and you'll soak in natural hot springs that have been steaming and gurgling for thousands of years. Since being discovered by goldmining brothers in 1905, people have been visiting from near and far for the healing benefits of the mineral water.

This evening, our favorite restaurant will host us for a farewell feast, as we reflect on our Alaska adventure so far. It's not over yet. Nightfall is when the real magic begins in Fairbanks, thanks to its prime position within the Auroral Oval. We've saved you Alaska's best Aurora sighting 'til last—spend the evening in astral awe as clear winter nights reveal radiant constellations and the iridescent glow of aurora borealis. A grand finale of the greatest show on earth.

DAY 6


