And warm hospitality from a culture accustomed to the diversity of Berber, Arab, Jewish, African and Mediterranean influences. DAILY ITINERARY

MOROCCO | MARRAKESH, SAHARA & FÈS | CULTURE + WALKING

DAY 1

FÈS

- Explore the medieval labyrinth of the Medina
- Relax poolside before dinner

Begin your visit to Morocco with a day of spectacular contrasts, kicking off with a guided walk in the largest Medina in the western world. This walled city has changed little since the 9th century. In the labyrinth of narrow alleys, you'll see small workshops, craftsmen at work on copper and brass, and the tannery where leather is created and dyed as it has been for countless centuries.

You'll enjoy lunch at Nejjarine Square, before visiting the old Jewish Quarter and its 17th-century synagogue. Later, stroll in the ceramic district where artisans share how they create fine tiles and mosaics.

After the exotic clamor of this medieval district, your hilltop boutique hotel is a quiet respite. Recognized by Architectural Digest for its contemporary take on classic design, it's a wonderful look at the modern side of Morocco.

DAY 2

FÈS

- Visit a small Berber village in the countryside of Fes
- Enjoy lunch at a family farm
- Celebrate over dinner in the finest restaurant in Morocco

After breakfast, join your guide for a memorable day in the countryside surrounding Fès. You begin at a tiny one-street Berber village and follow a forested footpath. You're likely to encounter locals carrying wood on their donkeys before your views expand to include apple orchards and olive groves, and you'll pass ochre-colored villages before arriving late morning at a friend's farm who welcome you into their home for tea, locally-grown almonds and homemade pastries. Lunch is served with fresh goat cheese and bread.

Continuing back to Fès where you'll have time on your own to relax at the hotel or shop in the medina before dinner. Tonight you dine at La Maison Bleue, one of the finest restaurants in Morocco, where the specialties are centuries-old recipes prepared nowhere else. The elaborate building is a perfect example of Arabo-Andalusian architecture with intricate floral and geometric patterns carved on plaster and beautiful fountains laid with colorful mosaics.

DAY 3

MIDDLE ATLAS MOUNTAINS

- Walk through cedar forests past Barbary apes
- Spend the night in a Kasbah hotel

You're rewarded with some of the most spectacular scenery and views in Africa as you journey through the Middle Atlas Mountains through cedar forests, high plateaus and clay and cut stone villages.

As one of two days that combines a fairly long drive with scenic walks and visits, just outside Fès you enjoy a walk of almost a couple hours to view the cedar forests up close; Barbary apes and shepherds are your companions along the way. As you move into the High Atlas, the scenery shifts to tall peaks, deep gorges and pre-Saharan hills and sand dunes scattered with medieval Kasbahs and clay villages. In the afternoon, you'll drive across the canyons of the Ziz River between Midelt and Errachidia, which offers the opportunity to enjoy the stunning variety of the Moroccan countryside.

Your home for the night is a luxury boutique hotel surrounded by beautifully landscaped grounds at the very edge of the Sahara. In all the rooms and common areas of the hotel are permanently exposed paintings of European Orientalist painters who lived in Morocco, as well as contemporary painters of Morocco.

DAY 4

MERZOUGA

- Land Rover to the world's highest sand dunes
- Ride camels to North Africa's highest dunes
- Sleep under the stars at your luxury tented encampment

Nearby is the 17th-century walled medieval city of Risani, where your explorations today begin with a morning walk. Pausing to chat with locals, a stop late morning is in the home of a Blue Man family. After the visit, lunch precedes a one-hour drive by Land Rover to explore an unparalleled sight—the soaring red sand dunes of Merzouga. In time to see the sunset over the dramatic landscape, climb aboard camels for a memorable ride to the dunes before continuing back to your own private Berber encampment.

The Berbers are the indigenous people of Morocco who have inhabited North Africa from as early as 3000 B.C. And you are staying in the home of the Blue Men, an ethnic group whose tribal territory stretches over a large part of the western edge of the Sahara. The camp consists of large nomadic tents made of hand-woven camel and goat hair, which make the tents cool and waterproof. Each tent is decorated with mattresses and colorful fabrics and carpets from different tribal origins. The area between the tents is covered with Berber kilims and decorated with lanterns—creating the feeling you have entered a magical world from another time.

DAY 5

TINEGHIR

- Sleep in or watch sunrise over the dunes
- Follow your guide on a walk through a lush palm oasis of almond trees

It's not until you awake in the morning you see in full light how stunning your desert setting truly is. Sleep in, or if you like, join your guide to see the sunrise over the dunes. After an open-air breakfast, return to paved roads for an hour-long scenic drive along the mountainous edge of the desert to Tineghir, where a morning walk leads past fields of

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alfalfa, henna, barley and mint in the shade of palm and almond trees.

Wrap the afternoon with another fairly long drive to Ouarzazate, where your hotel is designed as a ksar, a typical walled Moroccan village. The historic kasbah is surrounded by private gardens, hammam and an outdoor swimming pool.

DAY 6

AIT BEN HADDOU

- Explore a famed Kasbah
- Settle into luxurious hotel in Marrakesh

Start your day with UNESCO World Heritage Site, Ait Ben Haddou, one of the most exotic and best preserved Kasbahs in the Atlas region. As you walk up the hill, you welcome a view of the magnificent structure, a striking example of southern Moroccan architecture. If this Kasbah looks familiar, that's because it's appeared in almost 20 movies, including *Gladiator*, *Romancing the Stone* and *Lawrence of Arabia*. The fortress was also a rest area for the caravans that traveled from Marrakesh to Timbuktu, and you'll walk on the same paths as those travelers did centuries before.

You'll embark on the last segment of your caravan route this afternoon as you continue your way towards Marrakesh, an original imperial city turned modern cultural oasis. Look forward to some time at leisure to relax and explore the grounds of your hotel right in the heart of the medina, or arrange for a spa treatment such as the traditional Moroccan hammam before enjoying a welcome dinner featuring Morocco's best cuisine.

DAY 7

MARRAKESH

- Ride a horse drawn carriage to Yves Saint Laurent's gardens
- Take a guided city walk through souks and famed Djemaa el-Fna square with its amazing performers

Marrakesh, the fourth of Morocco's imperial cities, has long been a center of African Islamic civilization. The world's most famous scholars and philosophers converged here in the Middle Ages, and the wealth that flowed into the city helped create outstanding architecture and public gardens. After breakfast, you'll take a horse and carriage ride to the Yves Saint Laurent botanical gardens to explore the two and a half acre grounds and Berber museum.

Midday, make your way to Djemaa el-Fna square. This is the heart of Marrakesh—where you can see an exhilarating mix of snake charmers, monkey tamers, storytellers, magicians, acrobats and other performers. You have the remainder of the afternoon for a guided tour of the souks, where you'll be able to shop for Berber carpets, tribal jewelry and other Moroccan crafts. The city is at your fingertips for an evening at leisure.

DAY 8

OURIKA VALLEY/MARRAKESH

- Continue your adventures in Marrakesh...OR
- Follow a valley walk among clay villages and in foothills of the Atlas Mountains
- Celebrate over a farewell dinner

Today, choose your own adventure! Either spend your day continuing to dive into Marrakesh's countless wonders, or opt to leave the flurry of city life for a day in the country exploring the picturesque Ourika Valley.

Reaching the Berber hamlet of Tamzenddirt to begin, you follow the river and then up along a winding hillside path surrounded by fields of corn appears the village of Anins. Very possibly, your favorite experience of the week will be visiting a countryside school. Meet the students and teacher and see how class here compares to the ones at home. It would never happen if you were traveling on your own or with a large group, and it's one of those experiences you'll remember forever.

Tonight, enjoy your farewell dinner in legendary La Maison Arabe, a favorite of the likes of Hemingway and Churchill. Sit back, relax and enjoy the memorable meal as you soak in the dazzling hallmarks of traditional Moroccan craftsmanship featuring tadelakt walls and cedarwood ceilings, a perfect blend to provide an exotic yet refined atmosphere.

Your Personal Caravan Awaits

Explore Morocco with our friendly entourage of expert guides, local friends and the occasional camel master.

Deep in the dunes of the Sahara, a Blue Man materializes at precisely the right moment with a string of camels for you. In the maze of the Fès medina, your newest djellaba-wearing friend veers you into a one-person-wide alley to bypass a gridlock of donkeys piled high with hammered copper. On a country walk, just as your stomach starts to wonder about lunch, a family opens the door of their home and invites you in for a hearty meal.

It may feel like good luck, as if somebody in Morocco rubs a magic lamp for you just in time, every time. But exploring with Classic Journeys, you quickly discover that you're actually in the hands of a choreographed caravan of locals who love to surprise you at every turn with exceptional access to their exotic homeland.

To mastermind it all, you'll have the full-time attention of a local lead guide like Saida. She's a thoroughly modern Moroccan, but with deep roots in tradition. A respected journalist in an earlier life, Saida broke the veiled ceiling to become one of Morocco's first female guides many years ago. At the same time, she and her husband raised two children in the labyrinth of Fès. She's your go-to resource if you want to talk shopping in the souks, international politics or the fine points of living in a centuries-old riad. Saida is fond of saying, "My friends are your friends," and she's not shy about proving it.

That kind of kismet happens when you go strolling in the foothills of the Middle Atlas Mountains. Out there, the apple orchards are carpeted in wildflowers. The only other traffic on your trail is a boy leading a donkey — Morocco's renewable cargo vehicle of choice — loaded with firewood. But remote and rural as the setting is, up ahead Tarik and Badria are on the lookout for you at their home. They make sure the mint tea is hot and ready to pour. If you're on one of our Family Trips, your kids can hop onto mountain bikes for a spin ... and you all sit down together for a lively home-cooked lunch.

Farther afield, caravans heavy with gold used to shelter into the ksar of Rissani, a fortified Berber village. Today, the treasure that awaits you is Ali, a native Berber with

a PhD in cultural anthropology and an uncanny talent for bringing history to life. In the shade of date palms that ring the nearby oasis fields, Ali also turns out to be the perfect cultural matchmaker as he introduces you to the farmers and their families.

Even the Sahara — as endless and empty as it looks from your Land Rover — is hospitable beyond what you could ever imagine. At the base of soaring, caramel-colored dunes, that spot of blue you see from a distance is Ibrahim. He's a Blue Man, from the tribe named for their indigo-dyed clothes, and he's your man with the camels. They're ready to carry you on a cinematic ride into the desert. If you want to climb off to surf down one of dunes, your wish is Ibrahim's command. Then, just before nightfall, he'll help you with your dismount at his tribesmen's luxury tented encampment. Dinner is cooking, the campfires are burning bright, and you settle in for a perfectly orchestrated night under the starriest skies you've ever seen.

You've never traveled in the care of such a big and friendly entourage at every step. Whether you're swaying to the snake charmers in Marrakesh, making nice with Barbary Apes in a cedar forest or meeting students in their classrooms in Tamzenddirt, you'll have wonderful, unexpected experiences because you are expected at every turn. To truly see and understand Morocco, it takes a caravan ... and ours is ready and waiting for you.
