Mountains, Fjords & Glaciers

Half the people we know have cruised to Alaska. The other half plans to. But as much as we love a cruise, it just seems a shame to float right past some of the most spectacular landscapes on earth. After all, the Kenai Peninsula offers a range of wonderful walking options that don't require "bush" skills. There's the world's most northerly rain forest...Exit Glacier where a scenic path allows us to experience its awesome scale up-close...Resurrection Bay with its humpback whales and orcas...the wildflower meadows too far from shore to ever be spotted by a landing party. With Classic Journeys, you'll see it all—and you'll meet local fishermen, naturalists and other friends. Accommodations include historic lodges and hotels. Even if we don't offer a 2 a.m. dessert buffet, we think you'll take home equally happy memories of a lakeside salmon-bake followed by fresh-picked blueberries. And then you'll know you've truly touched Alaska.

DAY 1

BIRD POINT / GIRDWOOD

- Spot Beluga whales at famed Bird Point
- Walk a footpath through America's northernmost rainforest to Glacier Creek

Alaskan adventures begin in Anchorage when you head to famous Bird Point in search of pods of Beluga whales that make the Turnagain Arm their home. It's typical to find white adult and gray adolescent Beluga whales swimming here as they hunt for fish. Have your camera ready; we often see a variety of Alaskan wildlife in this area and the stunning views from the overlook are picture-perfect.

Enjoy a scenic drive to the quaint resort town of Girdwood and set out for a stroll along a forest trail that winds through America's northernmost rainforest. Cross a wooden bridge over a thundering blue-water gorge, high above Glacier Creek as your expert guide points out fauna and flora along the way. After your afternoon walk, relax at your perfectly-sited lodge before enjoying a dinner of fresh local specialties.

DAY 2

GIRDWOOD / SEWARD

- Explore a historic gold mine
- · Walk along the famed Iditarod Trail
- Ride the Mt. Alyeska tramway for spectacular views

Your morning walk begins at the site of Alaska's richest gold mine, built in 1898. Eight of the buildings have been restored and are on the Register of National Historic Places. After exploring the mining camp, your expert guide shares Alaska's fascinating mining history. Even today, locals and visitors come to the mine to relive the days of the gold rush and recover some of the precious metal that has been left behind.

From here, stroll along a favorite section of the historic Iditarod Trail through tall spruce and hemlock forests, and past a series of small waterfalls. Lush ferns, devil's club, blueberry bushes and horsetail line the route, and along the way learn about the local wildlife, including moose, bears and a variety of songbirds.

In time for lunch, you'll board the Mt. Alyeska tramway for the spectacular ride 2300 feet above the valley floor. Savor a lunch of local specialties, like king crab salad and reindeer sausage, high atop Mt. Alyeska as you enjoy the panoramic views of the rugged Chugach Mountains, Turnigan Arm and Seven Glaciers. After lunch, explore one of the various trails ideal for capturing the beautiful Alaskan scenery before a scenic drive brings you to Seward, one of Alaska's oldest towns. After dinner, you may want to explore the local shops and galleries that line Seward's charming streets.

DAY₃

SEWARD

- Walk on a glacier to see a waterfall and ice fields
- Enjoy an insightful visit at a marine institute
- Cruise through the picturesque Kenai Fjords

Just a few miles outside Seward is landlocked Exit Glacier, where you'll follow a scenic path to the face of this slow-moving sea of ice. The 3-mile-long glacier, fractured and crackling, pours 2,500 feet down out of the Harding Ice field. Your morning walk will take you up to the face of the glacier where you'll be dwarfed in its enormous shadow. If you like, continue on a more rugged footpath that leads up glacier-scoured rock from the moraine to a beautiful vista of the glacier, waterfall and ice fields for a truly Alaskan view. As you return to Seward, keep an eye out for moose, eagles, and black bears along the way.

After lunch, enjoy a special visit to the unrivaled Alaska SeaLife Center. The world's first cold water marine institute, the SeaLife Center, is dedicated to the research, rescue and rehabilitation of Alaska's marine environment.

Late afternoon, hop aboard a local boat for a spectacular excursion into Kenai Fjords National Park that provides an up-close view of the marine wildlife and magnificent glaciers. In addition to the breathtaking vistas and awesome glaciers, you'll have

the opportunity to see the wildlife that makes Alaska famous, including bald eagles, puffins and the endangered stellar sea lions. With a bit of luck, you might also see humpback whales and orcas, so be sure to have your camera ready.

DAY 4

HOMER

- Learn about (and look for) wildlife at Kenai National Wildlife Refuge
- · River raft down the gentle Kenai River

Fortified from a breakfast of local specialties, embark on a spectacular route through Kenai National Wildlife Refuge watching for Alaska's big game, including moose, bear, caribou, Dall sheep and mountain goats. Your first stop is the tiny town of Cooper Landing to enjoy a gentle rafting excursion down the Kenai River with the Kenai Ridge and Cecil Rhodes Peak as a breathtaking backdrop. As you float down the calm river, your rafting guide will share insight into the local natural history of the area's glaciers, as well as the history of the Kenaitzi Tribe who made its life on the river's shores.

Later, make your way to Old Town Kenai in time for lunch and a visit to one of the oldest standing Russian Orthodox churches in Alaska. The church is a designated National Historic Landmark and has been the principal representative of Russian culture in Alaska. Arriving in Homer late this afternoon, you'll enjoy spectacular views of Kachemak Bay and the Kenai Mountain Range. If you like, take an early evening walk along the Spit as the local fishing boats return from sea to unload the day's catch. Tonight, dinner is on your own, affording you the opportunity to immerse yourself into this small Alaskan community and enjoy one of several exceptional local restaurants.

DAY 5

HOMER

- Hike to a glacial lake to see icebergs up close
- Picnic on locally caught Alaskan seafood
- Enjoy a boat ride and wildlife spotting in Kachemak Bay State Park

After a leisurely breakfast, you'll take a spectacular boat ride across the bay for an exciting day in the Kachemak Bay State Park. En route, you'll pass a local rookery where its common to see a variety of seabirds including puffins, cormorants, kittiwakes, murres and even the rare fork-tailed storm petrel.

The scenic footpath follows the coast where commercial fishing operations can be seen seining (fishing with a large net) for salmon next to the beach, and then turns inland through stands of spruce and cottonwood trees with views of Grewingk Glacier and the surrounding Alaskan wilderness. Your walk brings you to the banks of a glacier-fed lake for a chance to rest your feet and enjoy a delightful picnic of Alaskan specialties. Your return route along a saddle trail offers spectacular views of Halibut Cove, Grewingk Glacier and lower Cook Inlet. Early in the season, there are fields of colorful wildflowers and later in the summer the wild berries are abundant along the trail.

Back in Homer in the late afternoon, there's an option to visit The Pratt Museum. With a special exhibit on the 1989 Prince William oil spill, you'll really appreciate the scale of that event now that you've seen so much of the rugged coastline.

DAY 6

HOMER

- · Visit to local artists' farmstead and art studios
- Part company at Homer airport

Homer is renowned throughout Alaska as having one of the most active communities of artists in the state. The area's natural beauty is a source of inspiration for potters, painters, printmakers, jewelers, weavers, sculptors and stained-glass workers all over the world. This morning, you'll get the 'only with Classic Journeys' experience to meet Alaskan artists, Ranja and Jeff Dean and learn more about the creative Alaskan lifestyle, including a visit of their farmstead, gallery and art studios overlooking Kachemak Bay and the Kenai Mountains.
