USAID/FH PARTNERSHIP IMPROVES CURRENT, FUTURE FAMILY NUTRITION

With support from USAID's International Food Relief Partnership (IFRP), a Title II-funded program, Food for the Hungry (FH) is working with communities in the Western Highlands of Guatemala to build resilience and food security and improve the nutritional status of vulnerable individuals and families in areas with some of the highest rates of poverty, hunger, and child malnutrition in the country. Thanks to this partnership with the U.S. government, FH local staff have reached over 14.000 children

in more than 112 communities through the distribution of a fortified micronutrient soup mix used to supplement meals, alleviating hunger and addressing vitamin and nutrient deficiencies.

FH also provides support to create home gardens that further diversify diets, as well as hands-on training and cooking demonstrations that incorporate locally available and affordable ingredients to create traditional, nutritious dishes. These investments address hunger and malnutrition in the immediate term, while also building long-term resilience and food security by equipping families with the knowledge, skills, and resources to diversify their diets and improve their nutritional status.

CHILD SPONSORSHIP

Children Sponsored in 2023: 162,453

Khoun, a mother of three in Cambodia, was grateful when her 12-year-old daughter Sievminh became a sponsored child through Food for the Hungry (FH). But she had no idea that her own life would be transformed.

Khoun and her husband, Chanthon, were rice and cassava farmers. But their income couldn't even provide the basics for their family.

Their health was affected by drinking dirty water and poor household sanitation, and they constantly pulled their children out of school to help farm.

Khoun's first experience with FH was educational training to help her children in school. She set up a learning space for her children in their home so she could help with their homework. Both parents started reading books in their native language, Khmer, to Sievminh. They also learned how to engage effectively with her teachers.

As a result, Sievminh's sponsorship didn't just help her. It empowered her whole family. "Now my parents encourage us to attend school regularly," Sievminh says.

FH also trained Sievminh's parents in improved agricultural practices, health and hygiene, nutrition, and business practices. As a result, they're earning higher wages and taking better care of their family.

Now Khoun wants to ensure her children will go to college, ending the family's generational cycle of poverty.

As for Sievminh, she dreams of pursuing a career that will impact families like hers. "I want to become a teacher to help children in my community have a good education and brighter futures."

Thanks to child sponsors partnering with FH, this whole family is growing, learning, and reaching their Godgiven potential — and eager to expand that impact throughout their community.
