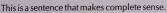


Subject And Predicate

#### A sentence has two parts:

- (a) subject
- (b) predicate

Example: Rahul likes playing football.



- 'Rahul' is the subject because the sentence is about 'Rahul'.
- 'likes playing football' is the predicate because it tells us about the subject 'Rahul'.

The part of the sentence that tells us what or whom the sentence is about is called the *subject*.

The part of the sentence that tells us something about the subject is called the predicate.

Look at the following sentence.

The predicate always includes the verb.

#### SENTENCES

Statements Interrogative sentences

Imperative sentences

- A statement says or states something. It begins with a capital letter and ends with a full stop.

The above sentences are questions.



An interrogative sentence or question asks something. It begins with a capital letter and ends with a question mark.

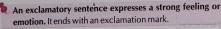
The above sentences are imperative sentences.



An imperative sentence requests, commands or gives directions. It usually begins with a verb. It begins with a capital letter and ends with a full stop.

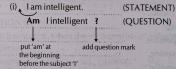

## **Negative Sentences**

These sentences are positive sentences.

These sentences are negative sentences because they have the word not or no.



A negative sentence is a sentence that has a not or no in it.

#### POSITION OF 'NOT'

In a sentence, when the verb consists of a single word, we add no or not after the verb.

Examples: (i) She is sad. (positive) sad. (negative) verb negative word

> (ii) She has money. (positive) She has no money. (negative) verb negative word

In sentences where verbs are made of two or more words, we put not after the first word to make the sentence negative.

Example: She is singing. (positive)

She is not singing. (negative)

negative word 'not'



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To make an imperative sentence negative, we put do not/don't in the beginning of the sentence.

(positive) Examples: (i) Come inside. (negative) Don't come inside.

(negative word 'Don't')

(ii) Clap your hands.

(positive) Don't clap your hands. (negative)

(negative word 'Don't')

Sentences are made up of words. These words belong to different classes or groups. These groups or classes are called parts of speech.

There are eight parts of speech and they are noun, adjective, pronoun, verb, adverb, preposition, conjunction and interjection. Now, we are going to discuss nouns in detail.

# **Kinds Of Nouns**

There are three kinds of nouns: common, proper and collective.

Common Nouns are the names given to things, animals, places or people which? are of the same kind. Examples: girl, glass, boy, clock, pencil, park Proper Nouns are the names of particular persons, places, animals or things. Examples: Jawaharlal Nehru, India, New Delhi, Commonwealth Games, Himalayas

## Nouns: Number

#### Singular and Plural Nouns

Today is Rinki's birthday. Read on to find out what she has to tell you.

"For my birthday party, all my friends were invited. My room was decorated with colourful balloons and stars. A cake was brought by my brother. I got many gifts. Jyoti, my friend, gave me a book which Hiked the most."



The nouns which are in bold talk about a single thing or person such as 'party', 'cake', 'book', 'brother', 'friend'. They are singular nouns.

Nouns which stand for one person, animal, place or thing are called singular nouns.

The nouns which are underlined talk about persons or things which are more than one in number such as 'friends', 'balloons', 'stars'. They are plural nouns.

Nouns which stand for more than one person, animal, place or thing are called plural nouns.

#### **Plural Nouns**

Plural nouns are formed in different ways.

We add 's' to most singular nouns to make them plural. Examples:

**Vowels and Consonants** 

The English alphabet consists of 26 letters in all. a board Of these, 'a', 'e', 'i', 'o' and 'u' are vowels. The rest of them are consonants.







The words 'book', 'table', 'board', 'boy', 'teacher' and 'chair' are all nouns. All of them are singular in number. They begin with a consonant sound and we use 'a' before each one of them

Examples: a school, a bag, a toy

We use 'a' before common nouns which are singular in number and begin with a consonant sound.

## Remember

While using 'a' and 'an', we should understand the difference between vowel sounds and consonant sounds. Vowel sounds are 'a' as in 'apple', 'e' as in 'egg', 'i' as in 'ink', 'o' as in 'orange' and 'u' as in 'umbrella' and some consonant sounds are 'b' as in 'bat', 'd' as in 'duck' and so on.

#### Article-AN

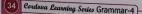

The words 'elephant', 'ant', 'ass' and 'ox' are nouns. They are also singular. But all of them begin with a vowel sound. So, we use an before all of them.

Examples: an octopus, an apple, an orange

We use an before common nouns which are single or one and begin with a vowel sound.

- We say 'an honest man' because 'honest' begins with the vowel sound 'o' as in
   'orange'. So, we put 'an' before 'honest'. (The letter 'h' is silent in the word 'honest'.)
   Some more examples are: an hour, an honour
- We say 'a utensil' because 'utensil' begins with the consonant sound 'yoo'. So, we put 'a' before the word 'utensil'.

Some more examples are: a useful animal, a used car

Words like 'plays', 'goes', 'is crying' are action words that tell us what a person does or is doing. Such words which tell us about the action of a person are called verbs. Let us know more about verbs.

A verb mainly tells us three things:

What a person, animal or thing does. What a person, animal orthing is. What a person, animal or thing has.

A verb expresses what a person or thing does, what a person or thing is, or what a person or thing has.

Verbs tell us what a person, animal or thing does.

- Examples: (i) The boy plays in the garden.
  - (ii) Jyoti goes to school.
  - (iii) She studies very hard.

The words 'plays', 'goes' and 'studies' express actions. They tell what persons or things do.

Examples of verbs that belong to this category are 'come', 'call', 'read' and so on.

Verbs tell us what a person, animal or thing is. Read the following sentences.

Examples: (i) Meena is a student.

- (ii) Rahul will be happy to hear the news.

The words 'is', 'will be', 'was' tell us about 'Meena', 'Rahul' and 'Mrs Verma'

The words in bold are verbs and they tell us what Rohan does every day, All these verbs are in simple present tense.

We can see that in the simple present tense, we use the original form of verbs like: 'wake', 'brush' and 'reach'. But in some cases, we add -s like, 'picks' and 'drops'.

## Adverbs



Adverbs add meaning to a verb, an adjective or an adverb.

Examples: (i) She sang sweetly.

(Sweetly is an adverb that adds meaning to the verb sang.)

- (ii) She is a very intelligent person. (Very is an adverb that adds meaning to the adjective intelligent.)
- (iii) She sings very sweetly on stage. (The word very is an adverb that adds meaning to another advern sweetly.)

#### KINDS OF ADVERBS

There are different kinds of adverbs that are used for different purposes.

Adverbs of manner tell us how an action is done.

- Examples: (i) The old man walked slowly.
  - (ii) She danced gracefully.
  - (iii) He ran quickly.

Here, 'slowly', 'gracefully' and 'quickly' describe how certain actions are done These words are adverbs of manner or how adverbs.

Most adverbs of manner end in '-ly'.

Examples: softly, quickly, loudly

Some adverbs of manner do not end in 'ly'.

Sometimes, the spellings have to be altered before adding '-ly.' Examples: simple - simply merry - merrily angry - angrily happy - happily

Example: 'fast', 'well', 'hard'

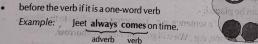

# **Prepositions**



Prepositions show the relation between a noun or a pronoun and other words in a sentence

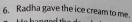

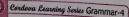

# Interjections

# MORE ABOUT INTERJECTIONS

'Hurrah', 'Alas', 'Oh' are sounds expressing sudden joy or sorrow and are called interjections. Some interjections like 'help' are words and not mere sounds. Some interjections are made up of more than two words like 'Goodluck', 'Welldone'. Interjections are followed by an exclamation mark (!)

Nowadays, the exclamation mark is, sometimes, put at the end of the sentence.
