• Introduction

- ▼ In this study we will look at the life of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
- ★ As God, His life has no beginning (or end).
- ▲ As man, His life began with the begetting of his human soul and spirit [Ps 2:7].
- ➤ His human soul and spirit were joined together with His deity in what is known as the hypostatic union.
- ► The term incarnation refers to Jesus coming in the likeness of sinful flesh [Rom 8:3; Heb 2:14].
- ▼ The hypostatic union pre-existed the incarnation of Jesus [John 1:1-2, 14].
- ➤ Prior to His incarnation, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, already in hypostatic union, was actively involved in human affairs [1 Cor 10:1-4].
- ➤ Many Old Testament events which describe the appearance of God are Christophanies appearances of Christ Himself [John 1:18; 6:46].
- ▼ The term "an angel of the Lord" in the N.T. is a reference to one of the holy angels.
- ▼ The term "the angel of the Lord" in the O.T. is a reference to the preincarnate Christ.
- This includes the meeting with Hagar [Gen 16:7-13], the restraint of Abraham [Gen 22:11-18], the burning bush [Ex 3:2-6], the encounter with Balaam [Num 22:22-35], the rebuke of Israel [Judges 2:1-4], Gideon's visit [Judges 6:11-23], the message to Samson's mother [Judges 13:2-25], the encouragement of Elijah [1 Kgs 19:1-8], the choices for David [1 Chr 21:9-30], the admonishment of Joshua [Zech 3:1-7], etc.
- ➤ In our study of the life of Jesus Christ during His first advent, we will follow His life event by event through what is known as a harmony of the Gospels.
 - The harmony of the Gospels we will use was taken from Nelson's Complete Book of Bible Maps and Charts and was adapted according to Chronological Aspects of the Life of Christ by Harold W. Hoehner.
 - Using this tool, we will take a chronological journey through passages in all three of the synoptic Gospels as well as the Gospel of John.
 - Before diving into the details of these events, we will do a read-through in order to get the big-picture view of His life.
- ► Before we begin that read-through, we need to understand the differences between the four gospels.
 - <u>The Book of Matthew</u> was written with a focus on Jesus as the promised Jewish Messiah and King.
 - Matthew is filled with Old Testament quotations.

- Matthew places an emphasis on Jesus' teaching ministry.
- Much of Matthew is arranged logically and thematically, not strictly chronologically.
- The Book of Mark was written with a focus on Jesus as the Suffering Servant.
- Mark is written in everyday Greek with vivid and descriptive language from an eyewitness perspective.
- Mark places an emphasis on Jesus' actions.
- Mark is pastoral, encouraging discipleship.
- <u>The Book of Luke</u> was written with a focus on Jesus as the Son of Man.
- Luke was written in language more familiar to Gentile readers.
- Luke places an emphasis on Jesus' humanity.
- Luke presents many details about Jesus' earthly life.
- Luke is the only gospel that speaks of Jesus' childhood.
- <u>The Book of John</u> was written with a focus on Jesus as the Son of God.
- John records many of the miracles that Jesus performed.
- John places an emphasis on Jesus' divinity.
- John was written much later than the synoptic gospels.
- John was written to encourage people to believe in Jesus.
