
Melted iron is poured from a charging ladle into the pear-shaped converter. It is then turned upright and the air is forced in.




The impurities burn for about 20 minutes. Multicolored flames leap 30 feet into the air and are visible for many miles at night.




More than 100 years ago, the bessemer process made large tonnage steel output possible. Discovered by Sir Henry Bessemer.



















































KEYS OF KNOWLEDGE WILD ANIMALS of AFRICA NUMBER 14
