












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








































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DAREDEVILS OF THE DEEP

THE thrilling story of diving spans a period of thousands of years, and in our earliest writings can be found references to the intrepid explorers of the vast and mysterious world under the sea.

Many wonderful and weird contrivances were developed throughout the ages to extend man's stay underwater beyond the natural limitations imposed by the hold-your-breath method. But modern diving did not begin until the invention of the first workable diving suit in 1878. And modern diving really came into its own with the development in 1944 of the famous Cousteau-Gagnan aqualung.

Obviously, the full story of diving cannot be treated in one brief article, so we shall concern ourselves here with the history of diving prior to the free-swimming skin diver and his aqua-lung; and in Part 2, which will appear in the next issue of AQUAMAN, we shall conclude with the exciting story of the

modern frogman.

The most primitive form of diving is still practiced in the seas of southern Asia, where divers descend into shark-infested waters in search of sponges. Their equipment is simple: a rope around their middle, a weight to speed them to the bottom, a knife to cut the sponges from the rock, and a net for their booty. These fearless divers work underwater for about a minute and a half.

But, almost from the outset, divers experimented with devices to extend the capabilities of their own lung-power. The Greek philosopher, Aristotle, wrote about a diver in 360 B.C. who breathed underwater by letting down a metal cylinder containing air. Alexander the Great is reported to have made a descent in a similar contraption called the Colimpha.

Pliny, a Roman writer of antiquity, described divers equipped with a tube which fitted in their mouth while the other end was attached to a float on the surface. Livy, who lived at the same time, wrote a report about vast treasures brought up from the sea during the reign of Perseus, a Macedonian monarch.

The first concentrated effort to provide divers with an underwater breathing apparatus seems to have begun in the 16th century. In a

book printed in 1532 is shown an illustration of a pearl diver under the sea breathing air from a leather gourd he carries in his hand. And in a later edition of the same work appears an engraving of what is probably the first design for a diving helmet. Since the discovery of rubber didn't take place until some time later, the helmet was made of leather. A tube of the same material was joined to the top, while the other end of the tube extended to the surface where it was kept afloat by an inflated bladder.

An Englishman named Repton, in the 17th century, came out with a suit of "water armour," which was unsuccessful. But untested was a "diving case" invented in 1715 by William Lethbridge, of England. The "case" held half a hogshead of air and was so constructed as to permit free play to the

wearer's arms.

The first modern diving suit design was brought out by a German, Augustus Siebe, in 1819. A metal helmet and shoulder pads were fixed to a leather jacket, and air was supplied


from the surface by a force-pump.

Siebe kept working on his suit, and in 1837, he corrected its defects in the first "closed" diving suit. The helmet of the new model was equipped with an air-regulating outlet valve as well as an intake valve. This gave the diver complete security, making it possible to remain underwater for long periods of time. Although many improvements have been made since then, Siebe's underlying principle remains in effect till this day.

But the long, trailing air hoses and lines limited the movement of divers. Clearly, the next step was to bring down a portable supply of air. The first successful attempt in this direction was made by two Frenchmen: one, a mining engineer named Rouquayrol; the other an officer in the Navy, Denayrouse. Instead of using an air line, the diver carried a heavy steel drum strapped to his back into which enough air had been compressed to enable him to remain at a depth of 30 feet for 22 minutes, or at 90 feet for 11 minutes.

The day of the aqua-lung and the frogman was close at hand. And in Part 2 we shall relate their appearance into the underwater scene.
