

Lilian Braun, Detroit newspaper writer, has come up with the fact that Senator Ted Kennedy's biorhythm chart shows that he was at the lowest physical and emotional state late on the night of July 18 last, which indicates he should have used extra caution in driving and in his general conduct. Further research by the biorhythm experts turned up the fact that the unfortunate Mary Jo Kopechne was also at a critical low point in her emotional cycle.

Biorhythm is a theory of human behavior used by European doctors and industrial psychologists to decide which are our good and bad days. It is widely used by the transportation industry, particularly the airlines, to promote safety. One Japanese transportation company, which had a high percentage of accidents among the drivers of its thousand public-serving vehicles, now lays off their men on what are termed critical days. As a result, they have not had an accident in eight months. Formerly the company's accident ratio was sometimes higher than twenty percent. Biorhythm tells us that all human beings have a twenty-three day physical cycle, a twenty-eight day emotional cycle and an intellectual one of thirty-three days. Each cycle is divided equally into two periods, one in which we discharge our energy, the other in which we literally recharge our batteries. The points at which the cycles change are termed the critical periods when our minds are literally in a state of flux and when we should take particular care to avoid accidents or make important decisions. Many cardiac patients, including Clark Gable and several automobile race drivers, have died when their physical energy was at the critical stage. A recent survey of automobile accidents conducted for an insurance company turned up the evidence that in each case one of the drivers concerned was at the critical low. The half way line on the emotional cycle is equally serious. When we reach it we are inclined to do foolish impulsive things which we regret afterwards. Women are particularly prone to commit sexual indiscretions, have crying fits and quarrel with husbands and lovers.

Biorhythm has nothing to do with astrology. It is purely scientific and is predicated on the date and hour of our birth when our energy is at the highest. That energy later subsides and then rises again and continues to do so until our death. As age increases, the height of the curves on the biorhythm chart decreases as our energy lessens. One summer day in 1943, a U.S. Army Air Force B-24 bomber vanished in the Libyan desert and was never found. Despite intensive search, neither was there any trace of its nine crewmen. The disappearance of the Lady Be Good (as the plane was called) became one of the mysteries of the war. Shortly afterwards, a French medium reported having received a communication from one of the men, but there was no indication of what had happened.

Sixteen years later the wreckage of the plane was spotted by the pilot of an airliner, but there was no sign of the crew. They seemed to have completely vanished. Five years passed. The story of the loss of the Lady Be Good became a legend. Native soothsayers asserted that the men had been destroyed by an evil spirit seeking to revenge itself on the white race. This story prevailed even when the bodies of the men were found eighty miles from where the plane crashed. From then on anything that belonged to the plane has seemed to carry a curse for its owner. An armrest belonging to the Lady Be Good was on board a U.S. observation plane when it crashed into the sea in the Gulf of Sidra, killing all ten men aboard. The armrest was later washed ashore on the Libyan coast. Then a C-47 transport plane, on which a radio part from the bomber had been used, crashed in the Mediterranean, killing the pilot and crew. Later two Arabs, who had used parts of Lady Be Good to construct their homes, were found murdered.

Now the curse seems to be working again. The only known remnant of the ill-fated plane is a rusty propellor, which has been mounted in the Whelus U.S. air base as a memorial to the men who lost their lives in Lady Be Good. Last month the new revolutionary government of Libya ordered the U.S. to vacate the air base which has been used to train pilots of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. This will deprive some 2,500 Americans (who have been living and working on the base) of their jobs -- which amounts to more bad luck.

Mrs. William Hawkins, a marmer's wife of Masham, on England's east coast, not far from King's Lynn, which has been the scene of numerous UFO sightings, rushed to the local police station last week to report that her German shepherd dog, Peter, had been stolen by three giant men dressed in white coveralls, who came from a strange, brightly lighted object which hovered over her pasture for a considerable time. The dog saw the UFO first and ran barking out of the house into the meadow. "He went like he was mad," related Mrs. Hawkins. "I called to him but he wouldn't come back. He's usually a most obedient animal, but this time there was no stopping him until he got right close to the thing. There he stood with his tail bristling, and barking furiously. When I saw these three men I hollered to them to be careful because Peter would bite them, but they took no notice. It struck me they was awful big and I was kind of scared. I saw them give the dog something and immediately he was all friendly and following them like a lamb. They all went back into the door of the ship, which had bright lights, and the thing shot up into the sky like it was fired from a rocket. I thought at first it must be some of the U.S. astronauts, but my husband said that once they was down they could not shoot up, so it must have been some others. When the thing got overhead and it was real high, it kept flashing lights down. They were so bright that I nearly got blinded."

Asked if she thought the thing was an airplane, Mrs. Hawkins said, "I suppose it was, seeing it flew, but it wasn't like no airplane I ever saw. It was like one of those things you get in the comic books. I hope they bring my dog back." Local

Police verified the appearance of the strange craft. A neighboring farmer reported that his sheep had stampeded. No explanation has yet been forthcoming from the Air Ministry which handles UFO investigations in England.

UFO Over Kentucky The cone shaped, orange tinted UFO which was sighted over Cynthis, Kentucky, last February has been seen again. It seems that UFOs are common sights over this area since Kim Peddicond saw this big one which kept changing color as it circled in the sky at great height. In 1966 a factory worker told of a brightly lighted object shaped like a cigar following his car as he drove to work early in the morning. The recent sighting was of a large inverted cone-shaped object with a bright red light at the bottom and white lights flashing from the uppermost flat part of the cone. One report says that it made no noise. Another stated it was humming like a dynamo.

Denmark's Silent UFO

UFOs said to be about two feet in diameter have been making appearances in Denmark. Usually they are seen in the vicinity of factories and defense plants, particularly those manufacturing aircraft. They appear to be made of some kind of material resembling plastic. After hovering over the factory to be inspected, they descend to a few feet above the ground and cruise slowly along, deftly avoiding automobiles. Many attempts have been made to run them down but without success. Usually, after being visible for a few minutes, they dissolve, leaving no trace. Several pictures have been taken of the strange visitors, and they are being examined by military experts. General belief is that the things are some form of TV camera operated by remote control from a mother ship, or even a distant planet millions of light years away.

An unmarried girl of the hippie type, who is a member of a secret witchcraft coven in Dusseldorf, Germany, has given birth to a baby boy with two promontories on his forehead, which indicate the growth of horns. On October 21, 1902, William Dennett, a member of an old and wealthy English family, was driving home from a farmer's dinner in a nearby town, when his horse was scared by the appearance of a woman in white who seemed to be floating through the air. The horse swerved so violently that the buggy overturned and

Mr. Dennett was killed instantly by breaking his neck. Twenty-five years later his son John was driving home along the same road from a similar function in his automobile. Seeing the phantom woman scared him so violently that he lost control of the car and crashed into a tree. There he lay dead, until discovered the next morning, with abroken neck. Twenty years passed. Lionel Dennett, the heir to the family lands, was driving his MG sports car along the same road and, strangely enough, bringing his fiance back from the local farmers' ball. The date was October 21, the day his father had died all those years back. He was explaining this to his fiance when the phantom appeared. She seemed to be walking directly into the car. Thinking she was a living person, young Lionel swerved, with the result that the car overturned and he was killed - by breaking his neck. His passenger was unhurt.

The story has a strange sequal. Early this year a heavy truck owned by the U.S. crashed into the tree and damaged it so badly that the tree had to be destroyed. Local historians supplied the information that the tree had been known as the "Trouble Tree", having been used to hang robbers and highwaymen since the 17th century. The pale figure which caused the deaths of three men in the same family was said to be the ghost of Matilda Ponsonby-Gore, the daughter of a wealthy landowner, who had come to plead for the life of her highwayman lover. An ancestor of the Dennett family had sentenced him to hang. Her request refused, she hanged herself from the same branch where the body of her lover hung in chains, as an example for others, a common practice in the bad old days. After the tree was destroyed, the girl's apparition was not seen again.

UFOs In Western Canada

Residents of Medicine Hat and Turner Valley, Alberta, are concerned over the almost nightly visits of strings of UFOs which have been periodically floating over the areas. One of these flew very low, was oval in shape, and seemed to have what one witness described as a dangling undercarriage. "It looked like a plane about to land," was how one witness put it, but it was more like an airship than a plane as we know them. After circling for a good ten minutes, it turned and flew East at tremendous speed. Local police verified the sightings, but no explanation has been given by the R.C.A.F., which investigates such happenings. Officially, there were no planes in the air at the time. The UFOs seen out there in the West seem to fit the descriptions of those recently sighted in Ontario, except that they were flying low, while the ones over Ontario circled at great height.

Gipsy lore maintains that the woodpecker is the earthbound spirit of a frustrated lover continually knocking at her door to obtain admission to her heart. This may be the case of the bird which is persistently following Mrs. Diana Neilson of Tukwila, Washington. Mrs. Neilson is happily married and has three children. Although the family has moved three times, they cannot get rid of the bird. At their first house, it would hang upside down at the dining room window and keep pecking until they felt they were going crazy. Seeking that woodpeckers are protected birds, there was nothing they could do about it. So

they moved ten miles away. The bird followed and started its pecking. Mrs. Neilson hung thick drapes on the window. The bird flew around the house and settled in to do its thing outside the living room window, all the time staring at Mrs. Neilson. When the couple moved again, the bird followed them. Now it positions itself at the bedroom window and taps until Mrs. Neilson draws the drapes. The noise it makes is worse than one of those rock bands according to Mr. Neilson, who works at night and tries to sleep in the daytime.

Mysterious Warm Winds Return Farmers in northern Chile tell of a recurrence of the strange warm winds which make trees blossom out of season and force root vegetables to mature at excessive speed. In some areas apple trees have blossomed and the fruit has ripened in a matter of days. This, when the rest of the country is in the grip of winter with temperatures dipping below the thirties. phenomenon has occurred several times in the last three years. As yet, no scientist has been able to come up with a logical explanation. Some attribute the warm air to visits of UFOs, which have frequently been seen in the area. Others say it is due to the presence of a vertical downdraft of air warmed by rays from a remote star, which is actually creating an atmospheric gulf stream. According to research reports, a similar phenomenon took place in the Yukon district of Canada in the 80's, when a remote valley surrounded by winter snow suddenly enjoyed Spring weather with flowers, shrubs and butterflies. Although several scientific expeditions set out to solve the mystery, none were successful.
