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(Ed.Note) Last issue ve thought we had some good news for all of us Shaver Mystery fans, as we announced. We, too, were disappointed when Ray Palmer's latest issue of "Other Worlds" came out with only a rather flippant reference to Dick Shaver and his stories, Consequently we waited until we had en answer from Dick, himself, to show you. So here it is, Read it and you'll know as much as we do!

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We quote, "The 5,000 woras is a misprint. The story is fifty thousand and I think pretty good. It is a sample of tamper in the printing plant which will get worse when and if the stories take on any particular emphesis of the rystery.

It could be that Palmer is skittish of the whole thing after nearly dying of a broken back for which I don't blame him. He is always full of plans, some of which materialize, some of which do not. So far as I know the ad in Amazing is still to come, but he may forget about it entirely. His editorial was disappointing to me, too, as I had no idea he had any partioular difficulty as to whet to do with me, as he puts it. He printed my stories right along under other names and they were accepted as top stuff by all the fans .................... One thing that is bothering you is the usual lag in the time between writing a story and seeing it in print. R.A.P's mags are printed up six to eight issues ahead. The issues we work on today von't see the stands for six or eight months, and some stories will be deleted and others put in. The plans he outlined are much the same, you just expected them before they are really due. I know the first issue containing "Sun Smiths". has gons to the printers, but it may not be on the stands for two months yet. Maybe the next one is "Sun Smiths" as in his editorial you quote. So far as I know that is the story he is talking about, and most of it is a d-n lie yet it contains angles interesting to Shaver fans.

I think the Project Hermes for telaug is very likely to be successful for in truth the telaug is a very simple device like radio. It is to me a wonder it has never been developed before. I am not radioman enough to judge the diagrams but I have seen the teleug in action, and some very simple types. There is no reason why it shouldn't work. I suspect all such experiments are wetched and the successful designs are ruined in operation, just as radio can be jamned so that the experinenter never knows when he has the right wave tuned or the right set-up.
R.A, P's book contains some photos of saucers you haven't seen, but I can't say about the material as I haven't read it.

I think the world is building up to a climax of catastrophas, too, directly due to the shocks of the successive detonations of A- and I- bombs. The flocds, screwy weather and earthquakes in Oklahoma and other areas where they never occur are all directly traceable to the atom bomb testis, this is especially noticed if you put a time table of actual detonations down alongside a time-table of catastrophes, floods, heavy rainfall, precipitrate arops in temperature, earthquakes (especially) and volcanic eruptions. This train of catastrophes immediately following A-bomb concussions is due to reverberation petterns within the core-bell. The core is very dense. If you pick up a physics book and look up wave patterns in solid matter you'd find some illumination on this. Such weves bounce back and forth in the core and at certain focal points they meet each other coming back, sometimes three or four sets of waves from the same bomb meet each other at one point and you have an earthquake or an eruption.

In the weather they produce a sinilar effect though the pattern is different. The boab blows a chimey hole in the stratosphere, the hot air rushes up into the cold wind area, and the cold air from the north ruches down to replace the hot air that goes up the new chimney. A drop of forty degrees follows every blast (unless it is a small bomb such as they are developing for the troops in the field to use on each other). This upsets the pattern of the winds over the whole earth, places used to lots of rain find the winds heve taken their rain clouds elsewhere and they have dry spells and vice versa. Lately they have weeks of ninety degree weather in Canado which is unprecedented for this time of year. This will also cause the tornado belt to appear elsewhere, and nay even bring some of the fast, 200 mph strato-winds down to the surface and really raise hob.

The A-bomb is due to give us a lot of grief aside from its radioactivity dust which drops willy nilly where the high winds take it. After every bomb, from the news can be traced a series of outbreaks of strange maladies, 3 day measles, virusx , etc, are samples. The radioactive dust it scatters gives us radioactive rain in quantities and in places very unusual. Witness the series of desert floods recently. They have a lot to learn about the bombs effect in more subtle ways, such as its effect on the all-over integrative rate of earth-life, the real life-force or elan vitale.. Every bomb reduces the pulse of vitality in every one of us, and gives the.-life-charge of the earth itself a blow, which, we can actually feel individually in depression and laziness. I suspect the recent feverish work on atomic fire is the worst possible path science could take, and is a perfect sample of 'science's' inherent lack of coordinated intelligence toward a sane goal. Every new atom pile is a nev strain upon the vital forces which keep life pulsing over the earth's surface. A sudden increase in this disintegrative activity all over earth's surface such as an atom war will in truth decrease the intensity of life everywhere to such a degree that one will hear on every side the words - "Life is a misery, life is not worth living" etc. They are right. I fear the increase in atom piles for industrial heating and other uses will mean that men will become in very truth the fool of all fools among the species. Also "Life" magazine, April 7, 1952 article on 'Have We Visitors From Space?' ... very good, and first time a public admittance of possible space visitors ... A flying saucer was seen over Rio De Janiero, carefully photographed and the prints sent to the Pentagon in Washington. was a meteor SEATILE'S "Meteor". ... Just about every AP wire paper in the country carried the story on about May 12 th of the terrific meteor 'explosion' over Seattle on May 11th. We quote from Herald-American, Chicago, May l2th, Air Force investigators and estronomers, after checking hundreds of eyewitness reports, said today a fiery object which exploded with violent force over Seattle and the surrounding Puget Sound country early yesterday probably Heavy sightings of saucers all over the country again, but not as numerous as 2

They continued questioning witnesses from Olympia, 50 miles south of here, to Bellingham, 80 miles north, however, and started a search for "strange" materials they said might have come from a meteor. Airline pilots and ground observers said it exploded with a blinding flare and burst into flaming streamers. The rumbling concussion that followed rattled windows and shook doors. Col. T. Allan Bennett, commanding officer at McChord Air Force Base near Tacoma, and Dr. J. Hugh Pruett, U. of Oregon astronomer, agreed it was a meteor. Bennett said none of the radar installations in the Pacific Northwest picked up the object on their screens and he doubted the object could have been an aircraft or guided missile."

Glen R. Ward, 610 Fillmore St., Taft, Calif. writes on 'Project Hermes' ... (can't print all of it but have on file for reference) "Don't give up giving out with the technical info, fellas. I'm trying like everything, hampered as I am finencially, to play an active part in this business ... I have gone to some lengths to obtain knowledge of photo-tubes and circuits using them for speech reprouction. The telaug in Zine \#il I could assemble in a few minutes - if I had the parts. I did not list the "A" or "C" batteries .. an ordinary flashlight cell will do for "A" and "C" if necessery, must be found by tríal. Personally I don't think much, if any, "C" bias is required ... so would try it first without a "C" battery. I added a double pole single throw switch to the order I enclosed. (He notes wrong connection on crystal diode, too, see previous note)... if excessive current flows through (6) and (2) try reversing the leads to (6) or add a condenser to block d.c. (Condensers pess a.c.) Would imagine that a .01 mfd or less condenser vould be sufficient ... if we only knew what goes on in the circuit."

FLAME-FILLED BABY TORNADO ... Mrs. E. M. Savage of Lindsborg, Kaneas, sends a clipping from the Hutchinson(Kans.) News-Herald, we quote .. "A baby tornado, its center filled with a long slender column of fire, raced thru' sandhills 25 miles north of \#utchinson, and 10 miles south, five west of Sterling at noon Wednesday ... The swooping wind spread fire over 5 to 7 acres of pasture within a matter of seconds, Then the whirlwind died down in a 3 acre pond... The vhirlwind originated, Jones said, on the side of the hill about 100 yards from where the men had been working. The fire and wind came within 25 yards."

BRAIN VIRUS ...Charles B. Williams, Salyersville, Ky. writes us of an article in The Cincinnati Post, oct. 11, '51, we quote, "Doctors Find Virus In Brains of Mentally 111.. The discovery that a virus-type disease may cause mental illness opens up an entirely new field for the future treatment of psychotic patients, Dr. James W. Papez said here. He spoke at a meeting of the Governor's'Commission on Mental Eygiene. Dr. Papez is head of the nek laboratory for biological research at Columbus State Hospital. He began his research project 9 years ago, while a professor of Anatomy at Cornell University.

Said Dr. Papez, We have found virus-type bodies in the brains of persons suffering severe mental ailments. These viruses were embedded in the brain (next page)

BRAIN VIRUS (continued) ... growing in a chain-like form and extremely active. This is really a new concept in mental hygiene. It opens the door to a multitude of research projects which may completely change treatment of mental illness. our research applies chiefly to chronic mental diseases. 9 yrs . ago we discovered that the brains of extremely psychotic persons showed damage similar to that caused by encephelitis. Continued research has led us to believe ve had found something which will change all our idees about the causes of mental illness." Charles Williams says, "Any one who has followed the Shaver Nystery closely will recognize one of the facts brought out in some of Shaver's writings. One in particular I have in mind but would have to hunt for a while to name. But would do so if anyone desires. Some checking on : this might help us all. Yours for more and better Mystery News."
GEORGE HARTH writes, "Keep those messages coming from Dick, really delighted to hear he will be in Other Worlds from now on, THAT was a real lift. I noted you had the telaug mech that was in 'Round Robin'. Good deal, don't know if is any good but would like to try, will later. One thing I hever understood with your telaug with the prism was the ear phones. How would thoughts be turned into sounds to be heard? I would think thoughts would be just thoughts. How about this? (EA.Note.. We are no authority, George, but we've been given to understand that the phones serve several purposes. (1) To pick up broadcasts from the nether world coming over color wavelengths, i.e. by voice. (2) To create an electrical field around the head which helps the mind to pick up broadcest thought and nerve impressions. As you perhaps know most modern thinking is done by voice. That is you talk to yourself but no one hears you. Your mind thinks in terms of words ... words you know in your own language. Thus the more words you know the meaning of, the better you can form your own thoughts, and the better you can convey your meaning to others. To illustrate a point if a man could not write, talk, or hear any one else talk or read, then his thinking processes would be extremely elemental end he could only learn by manuel instruction. And etc. Thus a telaug, in order to work at all on the average person, would have to impress your brain with hords in your own language to convey any meaning.)

RADIOACTIVE FISH. . Harth sent us a clipping of an editorial printed by The Dalles Chronicle, The Dalles, Oregon which wo quote (June 1, 1951) "Yesterday's report from Richland, Washington on the effect of radioactivity on Columbia River fish confirms what had become more or less common knowledge. The Colunbia is slightly radiosctive as the result of Hanford atomic operations but fish caught in the river can be eaten without harm. An atomic scientist said, ' 100 lbs . of salnon would have to be eaten at one meal to give a person an appreciable dose of radicactivity'. We, have heard of some prodigious feats at the table but none so great as to involve that sort of risk. The subject can be dismissed as having no particular bearing on the health of Columbia basin citizens under present safeguards used at the atomic installation upriver. *** The scientist's report is especially interesting because it takes up the subject of degree of radioactivity. Special tests he ve been made with salmon raised in water contaminated to much greater extent then the river below. Tests have also been conducted on nearby farm crops and the effect of their consumption of livestock. Radioactivity can be dissipated but not destroyed. Some of it is picked up from the water by small organisms, and men who should know what they are telking about claim a Geiger counter reading can be obtained at numerous places along the Columbia's shoreline. All of this was aiscussed only in hushed tones a few months ago. Then a national magazine published a story saying Columbia river fish could 'take their own pictures' that is their radioactivity would expose a photographic film and leave an image. The subject was considered so delicate that little information was released for fear of misinterpretation and resultant alarm on the part of thepublic. It was brought out openly during the radiological monitoring course in The Dalles last winter, but nothing officially was said about it to the press. Information was sketchy at that time; now it is fairly complete end there is nothing in it that could possibly cause trouble, least of all a boycott of the salmon market." (Ed.Note. This is of interest to Shaver fans. Radioactivity is an old story to all of us. This article gives us just about the truth as to how information is first held from the public, then alibis and so-called scientific 'proof' dug up. The real truth is that very little is known about the effect of radioectivity on any kind of life, including human. Aside from actual tissue damage, who knows what effect it has on mental processes, nerves, life itself, life expectancy, resistance to disease, and etc. You will note that it is clearly stated that tradidactivity cannot be destroyed'. Whet happens when on area gets so loaded it has to be vacated? How much is 'enough'? How much is 'too mach'?
