EXCLUSIVE CHARGES COPS SPRUNG TRAP

Kathleen Cleaver, weary but somehow tireless, came to the BARB offices Wednesday night to talk about the latest police attack on the Black Panthers, in which young Bobby Hutton was gunned down and her husband was yanked off to prison.

She made it clear that each attempt by police to chop down the Panthers' leadership has only made their black liberation movement grow larger and more determined.

"The support we've received for Eldridge Cleaver is tenfold what we received when Huey Newton was shot, and we thought that support

The first one out was Bobby Hutton. He emerged, his hands in the air, from a burning tear-gassed basement where eight of his Black Panther brothers were still holed up. He stepped into the bright searchlight. Oakland police shot him dead.

"BRING THE BOYS HOME" COULD BE A FASCIST SLOGAN

President Johnson has lost control of the cities in America and the war in Vietnam. He will be overthrown by a military junta before the November elections "to save the nation and win the war."

This is the full meaning of the assassination of Martin Luther King. He warned of a Fascist take-over in the United States just as he felt he would be cut down by an assassin's bullet.

It is going to take an awful lot of nonviolence to save America from the Fascists.

The United States, during the past week, "does not give the impression of normality at all," was the comment of the editor of the London Statesman.

"World influence of America is fading because of this Vietnam thing and now this racial thing," was another British observation, while one put it simply, "Can there be confidence in the US with troops ringing the White House?"

These comments were made by BBC on Public Broadcast Laboratory (Chan 9) Sunday night.

Each news-broadcast brings reports of additional cities being turned on by the blacks in their strike for freedom. "Federal troops were rushed to..." or "Meanwhile, troops enforce a shaky calm..."

The assassin that killed Martin Luther King was hired to provoke the blacks into action BEFORE they were ready and, also, to give the junta an excuse to stop the President from negotiating his way out of THAT mess.

What we are seeing in America is NOT an organized effort on the part of Black Power. That will come. What we are seeing is unorganized pent-up hatred exploding in full fury, block by block, city by city, and state by state.

The mistake of the "let's win in Vietnam" junta was they underestimated the blacks just like

they underestimated the NLF. They may take over the government, but it will be a burned out shell.

Consider the position of Gen Westmoreland: he flies from his Hq in Saigon (still under fire) only to find himself in another command post formerly known as The White House.

Perhaps he is wondering just why he was fired.

He finds his Commander-in-Chief drawing on troops needed in Vietnam from "as far away" as Texas and Colorado and West Germany. A few more cities catch on fire, Westmoreland may have to yield up some of his OWN troops in Vietnam.

The General also finds that the President is caught in another bind: the call-up of 60,000 reservists might give North Vietnam the wrong impression. If he does not call them up, however, he may lose more cities.

Gen Westmoreland has lost TWO North Vietnamese Army divisions this week in Vietnam while LBJ was losing a few cities in America. "US STRATEGISTS' DILEMMA - 2 MISSING RED DIVISIONS" reports the NY Times. "We can't read his mind," one 'high Marine spokesman' is quoted as saying.

This Marine was speaking of N, Vietnam, not Westmoreland.

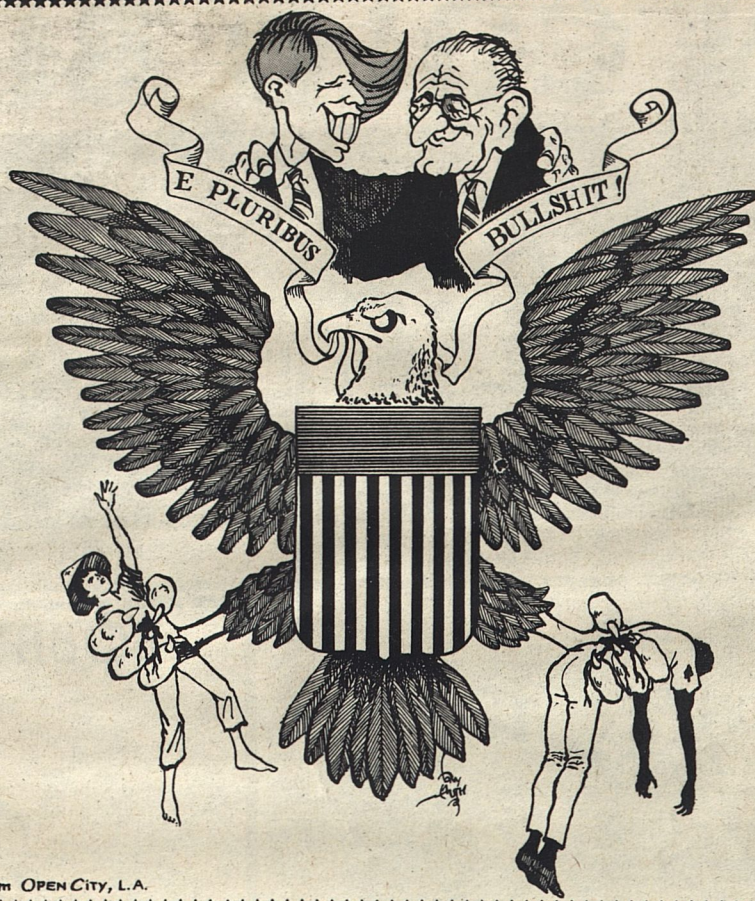
Our fear is, apparently, that having pulled out of Khe Sanh (not "driven out" as we claim), "he" might attack Da Nang, "thesecond largest city in South Vietnam."

We used to have lots and lots of troops at Da Nang, but it seems they had to be "decreased" to "counter enemy movements around Khe Sanh." In short, they have us flat-footed again, wondering where "he" is going to strike next, especially with two missing divisions.

But those North Viets we know about still cause us trouble. "A drive to retake the allied camp at Lang Vei, which the Communists overran two months ago, was delayed yesterday by a North Vietnamese attack" (AP).

Pres Johnson not only "delayed" his report to Congress on Civil Rights this Monday, he has completely postponed it. Never has so much happened to one man in one week. From the over 4,000 telegrams of congratulations he got in FOUR HOURS after his withdrawal speech, he has plunged into a limbo of confusion.

Man--"he's" hurting, and I don't mean North Vietnam!

WHY POLICE CHIEF WON'T LET CLERGY IN COP CARS

Remember sitting in front of your tube last weekend, feeling helpless?

You knew that with King dead, something was going to bust loose, and you couldn't do a damn thing ("after all," shrug, "what can one person do?").

Well, one person was doing something. She is a little chick with long brown hair named Beverly Heskin. She started calling up ministers in the East Bay Friday night asking them if they would be willing to ride in police cars in the Oakland ghetto to "keep tempers down, to cool things off."

Beverly is the chairman of a Merritt College group called Whites Against Racism and through her contacts with active Black militants on that campus, she knew that the Black community would be in favor of such a move.

"I thought it would prevent violence on both sides," Beverly told

BARB over the phone. "The fear the police breed in the ghetto would be reduced if the ministers were around and it might have diminished the police fears of being shot at."

A number of ministers, priests and rabbis agreed with her and said they would be willing to ride. So Beverly called the Oakland Police.

"When she called, her attitude was contentious," Chief Charles R. Gain told BARB later. Besides, "It was not a practical thing to do." So he said no.

Beverly said she asked Gain why. She said she got this reply: "I am the Chief of Police and my answer is no. I don't have to give a reason."

Gain said this was a misunderstanding, that he hadn't really had time to go into the reasons for his refusal.

The reasons he gave BARB were that his department needed time to "research the legal implications" of having citizens in the cars in case of injuries and of possible "suits against the city." Also, "I will not subject my policemen to the grave responsibilities of caring for a minister in their cars."

Asked by BARB whether the ministers could sign waivers absolving the police in case of accident, Gain conceded that this was a possibility. However, he believed that the obligation of the police department was to protect citizens and not place them in danger, especially "in a tension-type situation."

But, BARB asked, if the ministers were willing to accept this danger to act as observers and protect other citizens, why couldn't the police cooperate? Gain answered that having observers implied that police brutality existed and that this was an unjustified assumption.

"If we've got some people who think they can cure the ills of the world by snooping on the police," he said, "they're very much mistaken."

"Let's not come up with something that will save your conscience by putting the monkey on my back," he added.

Noting a tone of irritation in the Chief's voice, Barb asked Gain if he thought he was being argued with. Chief Gain apologized for sounding touchy and said he had put in a long day and that he had four people still waiting to see him (this was after five o'clock). He was tired of people

who constantly attacked the police. He felt that people ought to support and respect their police and stop all this negative thinking.

Beverly Heskin called the Oakland Police on Friday night. On Saturday night four Oakland policemen and two Black Panthers were wounded. And seventeen-year-old Bobby Hutton, unarmed, died, with seven bullets in his body.

KING WAS NO TOM

Dear Sir:

In the wake of Dr. Martin Luther King's death, the administration spokesmen and some "negro leader" cop-outs have called for honoring King's memory through the assertion of law and order and the re-affirmation of faith in the American Institutions.

It is clear, however; that Martin Luther King did not stand for law and order but for the violation of all unjust laws. It is clear also that Martin King did not stand for the acquiescence to the perpetrators of racism and wars, but for the application of non-violent confrontation with those who seek to oppress and exploit, Martin Luther King was a man of principle, a man of militant action and consequently he spent many of his days in the establishment jails. He had love in his heart for all men, but unlike the Vice-president he had no room in his politics for racists and murderers.

Such is the position of the Campus Movement Workshop, a U.C. centered group dedicated towards the innovation of direct action non-violent tactics against the forces of racism, war and poverty. The movement workshop strives for revolutionary change in America. It stands as part of the anti-war movement, and the black liberation movement, but it's fundamental position is that revolution is not only a change in government or the economic system, but a change in the very basis of American government--the elimination of violence as a bloody tool for coercion.

BLACK LEADERSHIP SETS SIGHTS ON FINAL DAY OF RECKONING

The spontaneous popular black insurrection covered the USA at mid-week.

"Fires and looting spread in Kansas City, Mo., and there were new outbreaks of violence in Newark and Trenton, NG," reports the AP Wednesday, April 10.

A black youth was shot and killed by "white nightriders" as he sat on his bike "in a Negro section" of Jacksonville, Florida.

Brooklyn had "nearly a dozen" fires Tuesday night, and there were "sporadic outbreaks" of fire-bombings and looting in half a dozen "suburban towns" on Long Island.

In Baltimore, "despite the presence of 10,000 troops", more fires took place "during the day." Washington DC, "in the grip of 14,000 federal troops", remained quiet. But the authorities did not save the life of a white professor of the U of Cincinnati who was pulled from his car and stabbed to death.

Channel 4 "Today" Show interviewed a black leader of a "street gang" in Newark who is helping "cool it." He said: "Back of your mind and (looking right into

the camera) in yours, too, you all think we're nothing. But we're humans, just like you. You got to understand this, see - we just as human as you."

In Chicago, a "meeting of two notorious Negro street gangs" brought a temporary peace between themselves while they helped authorities "bring order" to the streets.

Cities under siege or "shaky calm" are: New York, Brooklyn, Washington, Baltimore, Detroit, Chicago, Tallahassee, Memphis, Minneapolis, Weldon, Wilmington, Charlotte, Greenboro, Raleigh, Durham, Columbia, Allen U, Benedict College, U of Michigan, Richmond (Va), Macon, Mobile, Pine Bluff.

Hot Springs, North Little Rock, Malvern, Oakland, Youngstown, plus many others which the AP referred to as "the growing list of areas hit by racial turmoil."

In the West, close to home only the cool of revolutionary intent held back the flames. Revolutionary leadership made it clear the day of reckoning was not far off.

black freedom. If he had survived the seven shots that shattered his life, Bobby Hutton would have been 18 years old this month.

“We all knew Bobby Hutton,” someone at the Black Panther headquarters told me, “he was beautiful.”

“Bobby Hutton was one of the first brothers to run with Huey and me,” Black Panther Chairman Bobby Seale told BARB. “We made him treasurer right from the start, even though he was so young.”

Hutton was just 16 when Seale and Huey Newton organized the Panthers in 1966.

“He was right with us the whole time,” Seale said. “When I met him, he was so dedicated to the fight for black men to be free, vague as his notions were then, he felt it all over. Huey and I worked with him. We loved him.”

“And he stuck to us, stuck as long and as hard as any black man I know.”

GO OUT NAKED

Panther Communications Secretary Kathleen Cleaver told BARB what happened in that basement in West Oakland Saturday night:

“Tear gas began to explode in their faces. My husband told Bobby Hutton to take his clothes off and leave the burning basement naked. He told Bobby he wouldn't be shot at if he did. He went out fully dressed -- with his hands in the air.

“He stepped into the searchlights,” she continued. “A policeman told him to run to a squad car. Then they murdered him with a volley of bullets. The body fell on the sidewalk at the house next door -- because they knew he was unarmed. If there had been any suspicion, the cops would have killed him on the spot.”

Eldridge Cleaver came out stark naked. “That's why he wasn't murdered,” his wife said.

Cleaver, was wounded in the leg during the gun battle which raged for over an hour and a half on a West Oakland street last Saturday night. The Panther Minister of Information and seven other Panthers were holed up in the basement at 1218 28th Street. They surrendered after police killed Hutton.

DIDN'T STOP

Oakland Police say officers ordered Hutton to halt as he ran from the building. He was shot after he refused to halt on command, police insisted Sunday.

Newspapers reported early this week that the Oakland Police Department claimed that the officers could not tell if the youth was armed or not and that they did not fire until fired upon.

Seale claimed that the Oakland police knew Hutton was unarmed.

“The Oakland Police have established that he was not armed,” Seale said. They said he wasn't armed. (Police Chief) Gain himself said it.”

“Oakland police attacked the Black Panthers in the black community. I have witnesses to prove it.”

Seale said he had a number of witnesses, some of whom were caught in the cross-fire. He would not say how many.

“Make a note that I'm being silent about this right now,” Seale told BARB. “I'm going to keep quiet about the names of these people until the right time.”

Seale indicated that his witnesses would disprove the cops' claim that a planned ambush had been set for them.

Deputy Police Chief Robert Cazadd said Sunday that over 100 spectators had watched the fray from the ghetto street.

Cazadd told reporters that the incident began at 9:07 p.m. on Saturday when Officers Richard R. Jensen and Nolan R. Darnell stopped their patrol car after turning onto 28th Street from Union. He said they were going to check out a man “crouching down behind a parked automobile with Florida plates,” and were getting out of

their car when they were caught in a cross-fire from both sides of the street.

Police sources called the incident a “planned ambush.”

Cazadd said the two policemen radioed for help and received reinforcements from the Oakland and Emeryville police forces. They sealed off a two square-block area surrounding the house.

The suspects were said to have run around the corner, and charged into a house at 1218 28th. Others were reported to have fled to another address at 30th and Union.

No version of the story indicates how many were involved in the street battle, or to whose house or houses they fled.

POLICE FIRE

Police said they themselves were armed with automatic weapons, shotguns, handguns, and tear gas. They besieged the house firing from cars and utility poles, playing a strong searchlight on the small white house.

The gun battle which followed tore large chips of wood from the house, showered seventy or eighty bullets into the basement side, knocked all the windows from the building, and finally when tear gas was used, caused it to catch fire.

Reports indicated that at least two residents, two women, or a woman and a child were allowed to leave the burning house while police held their fire. No one was identified, however, and as late as Wednesday, Panther headquarters didn't know whose house it was.

Hutton was the first Panther to leave the building. He was shot running toward the police barricade. Deputy Chief Cazadd said Hutton refused to halt on command.

Eldridge Cleaver, one of the

Panthers who fled to the basement, claimed that the police told Hutton to run toward them to a squad car at the curb.

It was reported that the youthful Panther leader was felled “as he left the home, hit at least seven times.”

SIX SHOT

Two other Panthers were wounded in the battle, as were the two Oakland police officers who radioed for help and two other unidentified cops.

Cleaver, 32, was wounded in the leg, presumably in the street battle that preceded the basement barrage. The Vacaville State Medical Facility reported Sunday that Cleaver had sustained a “considerable number of gunshot wounds.” Cleaver was transferred to Vacaville from a San Quentin dispensary where he was taken as a parole violator. Police said the transfer to Vacaville was made “for security reasons.”

Warren Wells, 21, another Panther, was hit in the buttocks by police fire and was reported to be in “fair condition, under guard,” at Highland Hospital, Oakland on Monday.

Policeman Jensen was reportedly the most seriously wounded of the four cops. He was said to be in good condition at Merritt Hospital. Jensen claims he did not fire a shot in the fray.

His partner Darnell also listed in good condition at Merritt, says he got three shots off, one of which he says hit Wells.

The other two policemen were said to have received minor injuries.

BIG BAILS

Arrested along with Cleaver and Wells were Charles Burse, 21; Terry Cotton, 21; David Hilliard, 25; Darnell Lankford, 18; Wendell Wade, 23; and John Scott, 17. Five



of the eight arrested were in jail Tuesday with \$40,000 bail on each of them. Wells is also under \$40,000 bail.

Cleaver, who is being detained until Friday at Vacaville, was put under a \$63,000 bail. On Friday, he will appear before the California Adult Authority for a hearing on his parole. Wells was released from Highland Hospital Tuesday. John Scott was still being detained in Juvenile Hall.

Seale admitted that they were going to have a tough time getting Scott out.

“He's a righteous brother and I'm sure he's giving the pigs a time. He won't lie to them the way they want him to. He won't give them their statement. We'll have a tough time with getting him out because he's a juvenile.”

Scott and Hutton were the same age, 17.

Each of the six under \$40,000 bail faces two counts of assault and intent to commit murder against a police officer.

Cleaver, under the higher bail, faces three counts, which include assault, intent to commit murder, and parole violation. As a parolee he is not permitted to have a weapon.

The Panther Minister of Information faces a life sentence, which because he is still on parole, can be imposed without a trial. Cleaver was convicted by a Los Angeles County court and sentenced to prison in March 1958 on three counts of assault. He was paroled in December 1966 after having served 8 years at San Quentin.

Cleaver, a staff writer for Ramparts Magazine and author of a new book, “Soul on Ice,” was in semi-seclusion until recently. His post as Minister of Information had been listed as “underground.”

A spokesman for the Peace and Freedom Party charged that police had been following Cleaver prior to the Saturday night incident.

COPS KNEW

“For all intents and purposes, it seems the police were trailing Cleaver. Few people knew where he was that night when the cops just happened to show up on the right street with the right guns.”

Cleaver, in a statement issued to the press Monday through his lawyer, said, “Police moved against Huey P. Newton, our Minister of Defense, and are now well-advanced in framing Bobby Seale, our Chairman. And now, for the first time, they have moved directly against me, shooting me, and attempting to kill me. I think this is a calculated plan.”

The arraignment of the eight Panthers which began Tuesday was continued to Wednesday. Panther defense attorney Charles R. Garry sought early in the proceedings the reduction of the severe bail and release on own recognizance for six of the Panthers.

All of them pleaded innocent

to the charges which stemmed from the shoot-out.

Cleaver appeared in court Wednesday in a wheelchair. Wells in pajamas and on crutches. Municipal Judge Stafford P. Buckley denied Garry's bid for a reduction calling the move “standard bail structure.”

Preliminary examination was set for April 22 at 10:30 a.m., after a bid for an immediate hearing was also denied. Cleaver was then returned by ambulance to Vacaville.

BLACK MONEY

Later Wednesday, Panther Chairman Bobby Seale held a brief press conference at Panther headquarters, 4421 Grove. Seale announced rather triumphantly, although the six had failed to get a reduction, the Panthers would be freed.

“We bailed out this morning, the first of them,” Seale said. “Even though the bail is set at \$40,000 each, an atrocious price. They are beginning to come out today.”

“We have raised the first \$40,000,” Seale told the press, “and we are half way into the next \$40,000. And I want this made known: this is the black community's money supporting us. It is the black community that is giving us this money, and I hope they will continue to give us money.”

Seale said either Wells or Hilliard were the first out this morning.

ILLEGAL GUNS

Hilliard was one of six Panthers arrested in Berkeley on February 25 when police raided Seale's home and arrested persons leaving it. Seale, his wife, Hilliard and three others were charged with felony gun violations. The case was handed up to a superior court last week.

Oakland police claimed Monday that an illegal cache of weapons was also discovered on Saturday night. According to the Oakland Tribune, “Police said Cleaver and Hutton were holed up at 1218 28th Street with two 9 mm automatic pistols, two AR-15 and one military-type M-14 automatic rifle, and a large supply of ammunition, some armor-piercing.”

A report said that 18 rifles and handguns “not obtainable on the open market,” were seized in the action.

MORE PANTHERS

A PFP spokesman said “Black Panther membership has doubled in the past three weeks since the harassment of their leaders. The Panthers have opened new offices in Oakland, San Jose and San Diego.

“Their growth seems to be directly proportional to the harassments,” the spokesman commented. “It increases with every action the cops take against them.”

A nationwide drive to begin more Panther groups, in conjunction with a similar PFP program, will get under way immediately following Hutton's funeral Friday.

HUTTON BURIAL

TIME FOR ACTION NOT FOR MOURNING

Bobby James Hutton was born on April 24, 1950 in Arkansas. He lived at 898 56th St., Oakland with his mother and two brothers.

"He attended Oakland Tech for a while," a Panther told BARB, "but he didn't finish. You know how hard it is for a smart black boy in white man's school..."

Bobby Hutton became Treasurer of the Black Panther Party for Self-Defense at its inception in October 1966. A trusted friend of Huey P. Newton and Bobby Seale, the two made him an officer of the Party in spite of his age. Hutton was 16.

RACISM REACTION

When the gas and the smoke had cleared after Saturday night's street battle, first reaction to Hutton's slaying was powerful. It came directly in the wake of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King in Memphis. Community officials reared more trouble.

Panther Chairman Bobby Seale called for quite, denouncing spontaneous outbursts as unnecessary and unproductive. "The East Bay was quiet because we told it to be quiet," Seale said later.

By Monday, Hutton's name had already been added to the list of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Malcolm X., Medgar Evers and others. On the Berkeley campus, Hutton's name was a rallying cry.

The Peace and Freedom Party joined with the Black Panthers to march against racism. Thousands of students and concerned citizens trekked to Oakland's Alameda County Court House on Monday, through the white neighborhoods, to protest the racism that struck down King and Hutton and dozens of others.

PRIVATE RITES

Private funeral services for Bobby Hutton are scheduled for 11 a.m. on Friday -- at the Ephesian Church of God in Christ, 1709 Alcatraz at King, Berkeley. Fouché-Hudson Funeral Parlor told BARB that Hutton's mother asked that they be kept private.

Panthers and the PFP had asked earlier that all Californians, black and white, attend the services. Several changes had to be made in the arrangements. Fouché-Hudson confirmed however, that they would handle the final plans, according to Mrs. Hutton's wishes.

A spokesman for PFP said that a Memorial Meeting for Bobby Hutton would be held for the public on Friday beginning at 1:30 p.m. in Merritt Park across from the Alameda County Court House. These plans were made in accordance with Mrs. Hutton's wishes to keep the funeral services private.

CLEAVER CARAVAN

A caravan of cars and buses is planned to Vacaville after the memorial service. Eldridge Cleaver, Panther Minister of Information and PFP Steering Committeeman was held at Vacaville after his arrest on Saturday. His hearing before the Adult Authority concerning his parole is also scheduled for this Friday.

It is assumed that the caravan in support of Cleaver will depart as planned from Merritt Park and continue to wherever the Panther leader is being detained following his hearing in the Ferry Building, S.F., on Friday morning.

The spokesman for PFP described for BARB the triple purpose of the Caravan for Cleaver.

"First, we are gathering massive support for Cleaver, to free him from his detention. Many dignitaries, both black and white, will help us with this campaign, noted artists and writers of great stature.

"We will also announce a proclamation by the Black Panther Party and Peace and Freedom Party to the United Nations, stating the facts behind the genocide of black people in the United States. We will chronicle this slaughter for all the world to see; to every nation we will present the ugly facts we have collected. We will ask the U.N. to sponsor a national referendum in this country,

and ask that they send observers into the ghettos. Finally we shall ask them to have the U.S. censured by all the world.

"On Friday we will also launch a campaign to begin immediately Black Panther and PFP groups all across the country."

The PFP spokesman said it was "a significant political action" that the first group to successfully organize in the ghetto was the Black Panthers.

Peace and Freedom Party also revealed that a massive telegram campaign to aid Eldridge Cleaver's fight for freedom had been undertaken on Tuesday, to rally support from prominent figures all over the country and bring many of them to Oakland. Carlos Aponte, a PFP spokesman, said the telegrams addressed to the Chairman of the Adult Authority had already begun to arrive by Wednesday.

INDICTS COPS

Official PFP and Panther reaction to the death of Bobby Hutton and arrest of the others was expressed in a statement prepared by Panther Communication Secretary Kathleen Cleaver and PFP State Steering Committeeman Jack Weinberg.

Their statement to the press Monday, made on the steps of Sproul Hall, said the murder of

WHERE FUZZ SPRUNG TRAP

The 1200-block of 28th Street is a quiet factory street in the West Oakland ghetto. One side is lined with little white houses. One of them, the third from the corner of Union, Number 1218, had a red and white aluminum awning over the front window last week.

Wednesday when this reporter visited the 28th Street, the house had an awning but no windows and barely had three sides. It looked like any other house that had been bullet-ridden and gas-bombed by police.

Bobby Hutton walked from that house on Saturday night as it was burning. He left it with his hands in the air, and was slain by Oakland police.

He fell to the sidewalk just beyond the house. A shrine was placed on the spot of blood there at the corner of the property. Originally, it was just a shattered print of a painting and a few

TELLING IT LIKE HE IS

"Nonviolence is not an obligation, brothers. It's a favor . . . The white man has got to learn that.

"He'd damn well better learn it because unless he does, the black man is going to burn him down, house by house, and city by city."

That's not Stokely Carmichael or Rap Brown. It's Dick Gregory. It was what he was saying last year, before becoming a prospective Peace and Freedom Party presidential candidate.

Last week, when Chicago was in flames after Martin Luther King's murder, Gregory said, "If we took this country away from you tonight and put you in the same trick you've had us in, you'd burn it down to the ground."

Right now, from Good Friday through Easter Sunday, Dick Gregory will be kneeling in front of the White House in a total fast to exert whatever personal pressure he can against racism and war.

Although Gregory uses such means as 40-day fasts and follows a vow that "I am not going to have my hair cut, or shave, or wear anything but work clothes until the war in Vietnam is stopped," he does not ever put down advocates of militant black power.

"Rap Brown and Stokely Carmichael taught me nonviolence," he said, "but then they saw the same rat that bit a baby five years ago bite another one today."

"I am a nonviolent vegetarian pacifist," Gregory told an Evansston audience earlier this year. "I am opposed to violence, but that's my hangup. I can't tell Rap and Stokely they should be against violence. I'm a vegetarian. I think it's wrong to kill animals. But I won't knock a steak from your hands."

On another occasion Gregory commented on the effectiveness of black militants: "They have scared the mightiest nation in the world to death. Why? Stokely doesn't have a missile. Rap Brown doesn't even have a canoe. Why? They told the truth."

"Stokely has been accused of reverse racism -- whatever that is. The real meaning of Stokely's message is I got a right to hate you the same way you hate me. This is an honest ethical statement. Stokely helped make the movement honest by giving the hypocrites a reason for copping out."

The Peace and Freedom Party may select Dick Gregory as its presidential candidate. He has already received the endorsement of the new party's Black and Brown Caucus. PFP groups in Kentucky, New York, and Pennsylvania have

The furnishings were recently moved out of the house--what was left of them. Nothing remains upstairs behind the splintered white wood front, except the burned walls and a fragment of a living room mirror. The upstairs smelled strongly of tear gas still--four days after police bombed the basement.

This reporter was forced to leave the house after a few moments because the gas did such damage to his eyes. Walking out into the air, I was conscious of the red-painted front stairs. But the people below were blurs. A tear-gassed man's eyes nothing, a d a parently can do little harm to those who await him.

The fury of the police action was concentrated on the right side where the basement once crouched behind a door. There's no door now. What was the basement is just a black hole--all char and some iron which was once a bed-spring.

Nine Panthers hid there and tried to hold out against the police fire. Seventy or eighty bullet holes, some two or four inches long, point to the exit. The char tells another part of the story, a fire at close quarters. Flames and tear gas. Not much choice for men trapped in so small a space.

Bobby Hutton chose to leave the basement and walk into the search lights fully clothed. --s.b.g.

going to choose a politician, keep Johnson."

"Our involvement (in Vietnam) began under John F. Kennedy," Gregory told one audience recently. "If you don't want to admit this, you're too dishonest."

Gregory tells young black people that if their parents can still follow the corrupted, hollow promises of the Democratic Party, they, the young, should nevertheless look to people "working" for black lib-

erty the rest of April talking up and down California, including events with Peace and Freedom and with the Black Panther Party.

He will speak at a PFM rally in LA on April 16. He will visit Huey Newton in jail on the 19th, the same day he will talk at Berkeley Community Theater under the sponsorship of Lany College. A rally for Gregory will be held in Tilden Park near Berkeley on the afternoon of April 20. ---jas

SEALE CALLS SHOTS AS PRESS RETREATS

A visibly tired Bobby Seale, just returned from Atlanta, called reporters to Black Panther Headquarters to discuss the events following Saturday's shoot-out with the police in a West Oakland ghetto street.

Seale, Chairman of the Panther party, compared the murder of his friend and compatriot Bobby James Hutton to the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Seale attended the King funeral in Atlanta Tuesday.

"We understand the murder of Martin Luther King. It is significant much in the same way as the murder of our Bobby Hutton. We see it as the same kind of racist bullet."

"Doctor Martin Luther King struggled for Bobby Hutton. Bobby Hutton, young Black Panther Bobby Hutton, struggled for Martin Luther King -- he struggled for all of his black brothers."

The straight press had their hair combed and parted; had their fancy lights, cameras and microphones. They jumped on Seale quick with their questions.

"What did you do in Atlanta?" "What do you think of the new civil rights bill?"

"Why was the Bay Area quiet last week?"

Seale answered them all: "I talked with a lot of people in At-

lanta, with many black men who had been close to Martin Luther King. We all know that he advocated non-violence in the forefront, but they told me that he would never try to convince an individual black man that he should be non-violent if others were coming down on him."

"The new civil rights bill? It's the same shuck."

"San Francisco and the Bay Area was quiet because we told them to be."

There were a few other questions. The reporters unplugged their expensive equipment, and their paid ears and began to leave. "Hey," Seale called after them. "Don't you want to know what happened in court this morning? With the bail on the seven?"

The reporters came back, plugged in again. Bobby told rather excitedly some of the news he had wanted to give them, how the Panthers were going to raise all the money for the bails even though they had not been reduced.

When the straight press had left, BARB asked Bobby Seale to talk about his friend Bobby Hutton. Bobby Hutton had been killed by Oakland police while attempting to surrender to them unarmed. Bobby Hutton would have been 18 in less than two weeks. (Full details elsewhere this issue.)

TO MARK FULL YEAR WITHOUT EXECUTIONS

"California holds the world's record for the number of people under sentence of death," Doug Lyons, chairman of Citizens Against Legalized Murder (CALM) stated this week.

Of the 448 people sitting on death row in the US, 4 are teenagers, and 75 of those await death in the state of California, Lyons told BARB.

Lyons and Reverend Lester Kinsolving will speak Monday noon in Sproul Plaza, on the first anniversary of the last state execution in California. Rev. Kinsolving, an Episcopal minister, was a leader of last year's abortion-liberalization drive.

The rally in Sproul Plaza Monday will commemorate the death of Aaron Mitchell, executed by the state on April 12, 1967. Mitchell, a black man was convicted of killing a white Sacramento policeman. Governor Reagan refused to commute the sentence.

Since Mitchell's death, both CALM and the ACLU have been testing the constitutionality of the death penalty. Until a decision is reached in the California courts, all executions have been stayed.

"This is causing a backlog of people sitting on death row," Lyons stated. Last Monday, 13 new cells were opened to accommodate this backlog at San Quentin.

Lyons told BARB that these men will sit and wait to die "for an indefinite amount of time," because if the California Supreme Court refuses to eliminate the death penalty, the case will go into the federal courts, and a federal stay on executions is expected until a ruling is made.

"If by that time, the US Supreme Court also refuses to abolish the death penalty, there will be such a backlog on death row that a blood-bath will ensue," Lyons said.

The ACLU is challenging the constitutionality of the death penalty because it is a "denial of due process" and "constitutes cruel and unusual punishment."

According to an ACLU spokesman, these two constitutional guarantees are sacrificed because the death penalty is imposed whimsically and "without standards or guidelines," because people under penalty of death are denied counsel in legal procedures beyond the supreme court, and because of the exclusion from juries of those opposed to the death penalty.

Lyons also pointed out that more than half the people who have been executed in the US have been black. "Blacks are executed far out of proportion to their population and to the black crime rate," he said.

On the first of this month, assemblymen Lester McMillan and John Miller introduced a bill in the California Legislature to abolish the death penalty, but Lyons was pessimistic about the bill's success. "Reagan said he would veto any bill to abolish capital punishment," Lyons stated.

CALM's rally in Sproul Plaza on Monday will be part of its continuing effort to have the death penalty outlawed throughout the US.

"Although the ban on executions still exists in California," Lyons said, "we want to impress upon people that the law is still on the books and that the gas chamber is still kept in working order."

The most common argument for the existence of the death penalty is that capital punishment is a deterrent to crime.

Lyons pointed out however, "Tennessee has capital punishment, but the killer of Dr. King wasn't deterred -- Texas too has a very active electric chair, but the killer of President Kennedy wasn't deterred either." TAR

Last week I publicly lent my support to the KMPX strikers and stood with them on the stage at Winterland because I accepted the validity of their cause. However, since that time, I have investigated the situation more thoroughly and have been forced to re-evaluate my position.

The strikers apparently have been misled by irresponsible and self-interested leadership. It is very unfortunate that in continuing to support this leadership, without a realistic evaluation of the actual issues involved, the strikers may be doing themselves irreparable damage. In this connection, the union contract demands speak for themselves.

We are all threatened now with the possible death of KMPX and all it has come to stand for. It is tragic that the unique and beautiful concept of KMPX has been the victim of distortions, hatred and ugliness. Everyone who has had the good fortune to be a part of KMPX -- the staff, listeners, advertisers, and supporters -- have a responsibility to do everything possible to perpetuate the concepts that KMPX stands for.

Rather than abandon my personal commitments to the kind of radio I believe in, I feel I must try in the best possible way to salvage the situation. Before the strike began, the former program director quit and that position has since stood vacant. The program directorship, being an executive position, is therefore not an issue in this strike. To make it an issue would be clearly a case of placing personalities above the issues. This position has been offered to me, and in the interest of finding the best possible way to salvage the situation I have accepted that position.

OF STRYX AND SHUX-- DJ ON RECORD AS JUST A WEE BIT SCRATCHY

At precisely 8pm Wednesday night Larry Miller showed his true colors to the entire listening audience of KMPX. They were a bright shade of chickenshit.

Miller, who was fired by Station Manager Ron Hunt four months ago for assorted fucking off, returned saccharin-voiced in the 8-12pm spot,

which, in his opening words, he "covets." The spot used to belong to D J Tom Donahue, whom Miller blames for his firing.

Shortly before Miller went on the air he issued a vague statement, in the Bobby Kennedy tradition, saying that he had "been forced to re-evaluate" his position in the strike. He charged that "the strikers have apparently been misled by irresponsible and self-interested leadership" and may be doing "irreparable damage" to themselves.

At 9:30 pm this reporter entered the KMPX control room to ask Miller for a clarification of the ambiguous release. His reply was that legal complications and restrictions brought on by the strike and negotiating lawyers prevented him from saying anything for public record.

"That doesn't make any sense," said striking DJ Bob McClay later. "We're dealing in specifics, whereas he's making vague charges for which he expects equal consideration from the public."

Miller denies that one of the reasons for his breaking the strike is a personal vendetta against Tom Donahue. "This whole thing has been blown out of proportion," Miller contended. "I was as straight with him as I could possibly be. We didn't get involved in getting uptight with each other till after the strike."

Miller came back as Program Director, a position which Donahue had held since shortly after joining the station a year ago. Donahue quit his position several days before the strike.

Dusty Superchick, irate engineer, had a different story.

"Bullshit, man. We all worked with that paranoid mother for a year. It's his own ego thing; it's his contention that he started KMPX and that it's really his thing; therefore he ought to be in control. That's bullshit man."

Everything else aside, somebody in there is scared. The night Miller went back on the air they hired a rent-a-cop to stand guard outside the station door in the event anyone unsympathetic should get overly carried away. At least one person (not a striker) did, but was prevented from entering the studios.

According to the station's secretary, listener reaction calls were running "about 10-1 in favor" of Miller's return. But perhaps Miller explained it away himself when he inadvertently remarked that "Most listeners are confused. All they know is that KMPX doesn't sound as good as it used to and they're not sure why."

For the first time, BARB was able to speak with Lee Crosby, owner of KMPX and its sister station KPCC in L.A. However, once again as in the past, Crosby maintained that things were going very well.

When questioned about the strikers' charges concerning financial conditions Crosby took cover behind "legal restrictions against making any public statement," but assured that the BARB would be notified as soon as Management was "prepared to make a statement."

The management did have something to say to several advertisers who went back on the air Tuesday. Despite their contention that "We're not trying to convince anyone that the strike is over," striker Bob McClay had a version of his own.

"United Air Lines told me that the station management told them the strike was over, and that if they withdrew their ads now the

station would send the NEW employees down to picket."

United canceled shortly after informational leafletting began outside their offices. Western Desk, one of the first advertisers to be heard on KMPX, also re-canceled.

Nitty gritty time for Miller, according to McClay, was early this week. "It was either go on the air or leave town and go back to Detroit." In a call to Miller Wednesday evening McClay said, "You're where we'd all like to be with honor, except you're there without it."

Miller, whose attitude and expression reflected the weariness of the circumstances surrounding his decision to return to the air, allowed that it was "a very difficult decision to make. It's really putting me through changes."

Miller was invited by McClay to participate in an all-night show on KPFA to discuss the issues with the strikers, sans Donahue, but declined. He told BARB, "Man, what can I say? I've already talked to those people all week, and legally I'm restricted to say anything in public."

This reporter then pointed out that perhaps he had an obligation to the listeners to clear up whatever "confusion" he could regarding the present situation at the station. He shrugged it off with basically the same comment.

"If Miller hadn't gone back on the air we could have ALL gone back in two days," McClay said. "Now it will be at least another two weeks."

In this reporter's view what it amounts to is that Miller doesn't give much of a fuck about see page 16

"The causal point of view tells us a dramatic story about how D came into existence: it took its origin from C, which existed before D, and C in its turn had a father, B, etc. The synchronistic view on the other hand tries to produce an equally meaningful picture of coincidence. How does it happen that A', B', C', D' etc., appear all in the same moment and in the same place? It happens in the first place because the physical events A' and B' are of the same quality as the psychic events C' and D', and further because all are the exponents of one and the same momentary situation."

This, from the introduction to the I CHING (Princeton University Press) by Jung, is one of the best explanations of the structure of the new film. If we take the letters ABC to represent elements of the film, shots, or frames, or sound elements, then we can see that synchronicity is a fundamental principle of experimental film construction.

I'm not saying that every good experimental or advanced film must base its construction on this non-linear, or non-causal basis, because some rather good films are made which more or less avoid the synchronistic form.

Fred Camper's JOAN GOES TO MISERY is an example of an interesting film that is constructed essentially in linear terms. Although it is a character study, it more or less follows a dramatic or story form.

Joan receives something from a man on a street corner. What it is I don't know, and you never find out. He hands it to her and says: "It's not exactly pretty, but I guess it's what you want."

Most of the film is silent, until Joan's telephone rings, or she turns on the radio. Joan goes home, gets undressed, and stuffs herself with cake and cookies. Anyway, that's her problem. Psychologically speaking, she's a fat pig. I think Freud talks about the syndrome.

The grooviest part of JOAN is the color, which is swirly-grain-indoor-sunset. That's one way to describe it. Another, is to say that the overall color, Joan's skin color, her clothes, everything in fact, is tinted by the color of the walls of the room the scene was shot in.

ANTI-U TO FOSTER ANTI-CLASSES

"If there's an Antiuniversity and if they have a place to meet that's reasonably warm I'll be there. And I'll be ready to talk to anyone who wants to talk to me."

Yes, Edward Dorn, there is an Antiuniversity. It's at 49 Rivington Street, Shoreditch, London. BARB has its catalogue. You teach an anticlass in poetry at three o'clock on Saturdays. Fortnightly, of course.

There are other anticourse offerings at the Antiuniversity of London: Steve Abrams will deal with the advance techniques of turning on, John Cowley with the sociology of guerilla warfare, Francis Huxley with dragons, and Joseph Berke with anti-institutions, of course.

Flying visits will be made to the Antiuniversity by Stokely Carmichael, William Burroughs, Allen Ginsberg, Gary Snyder, and others, if and when they are in London.

The Antiuniversity, which identifies itself with the Free or Critical or Anti-university schools like the Free University of Berkeley, opened in February. According to its modest little yellow catalogue, "it seeks to develop the concepts and forms of experience necessary to comprehend the events of this century and the meaning of one's life within it, to examine artistic expression beyond the scope of the usual academy and to promote a position of social integrity and commitment from which scholars now stand aloof."

....which can hardly be disputed.

Commercial films go out of their way to drain this spurious color out of their photography, even in location shooting, thereby draining believability out of their work.

As a matter of fact, Joan at least in this aspect, is an example of the influence of home movies on underground filmmakers. The home movie has been as much an influence on experimental film as anything I could name, and at least, I believe, more influential than commercial products.

What do you find in the home movie? Crazy exposures, double exposures, beautiful drifting into fiery lightstruck flashes, flash frames, jitter, punched code numbers, and, most important, chance arranges the elements of the film. Chance. Or to give chance its proper emphasis as a guiding structural force, synchronicity.

Read the first paragraph again, the quotation from Jung, and you'll see that the key to the home movie is coincidence. A conventional point of view would have it that home movies are examples of total disorganization. True they don't tell a story, or even involve the kind of progression that might be found in a non-narrative, but linearly constructed work.

Many of the techniques of the home movie have been applied to the experimental film because they add authenticity. The techniques are in opposition to the techniques that have been accepted as the grammar of the film. And films which use the conventional theatrical grammar, more often than not, lie to tell lies. Experimental films lie to tell the truth, if they are any good.

Naturally, when these new techniques, or rather home movie techniques, are used self consciously, they stick out like a blanching pelvis, as does any improperly used technique.

The free elements, home movie elements, that I can isolate in JOAN, are jump cutting, and the colors. JOAN, as a character study, is completely believable. It rings right. It's surprising that so few underground films have attempted to portray a character, however so briefly.

The other festival, open to 16 mm films, will be held April 26 and 27 at San Joaquin Delta College, in Stockton, about an hour's drive from Berkeley.

I have high hopes that this festival will have a festival air. Besides the screenings, workshops and sessions with filmmakers will be held. The workshops are free, the screenings are not.

How foxy can you get, and what do you get if you're foxy?

If you listen to the critics (or even read the ads), "The Fox" is a dirty movie. Director Mark Rydell, the story goes, has foxily plundered D. H. Lawrence's novella to legitimize what nonetheless remains a "sexploitation film." But if that's what Rydell was working for, I'm afraid he failed.

True, the film has its moments. Three of them, to be exact: first, March (Anne Heywood) arises from her bath, looks longingly at her body in the mirror, puts one hand

RENO READY TO ROCK

RENO (UNS) -- Sounds of rock bands are beginning to compete with the plastic rattle of roulette wheels as the hip community here continues to grow and do its thing. An Easter Sunday Be-In at Idlewild Park on the Truckee River will feature local rock bands and free food.

Within a week the free people of Reno expect to publish the first issue of "Love," a new underground paper, including a calendar of local events.

A recent demonstration protesting eight "Beautiful America—Get A Haircut" billboards drew a large group of sympathizers and gained 350 signatures in support of RUB, Remove Ugly Billboards.

Changes in the Reno vibes are hinted by the lack of police harassment lately. Last October, when the Reno community sponsored a love-in at the Sutro mining area, sheriff's deputies set up a roadblock and brought people down.

to her crotch and masturbates while the camera moves demurely to her shoulders; second, March and Paul (Keir Dullea) play out a fairly standard (nude) love-scene on the floor of a shed; and finally, March and Jill (Sandy Dennis) indulge themselves in a very beautiful, very passionate kiss.

Those who are offended by these scenes defend their position by maintaining, quite correctly, that Lawrence never wrote them, and, perhaps less correctly, that he never would have. I personally find the issue as irrelevant as it is unanswerable: Lawrence wrote as much as he could at the time, and the film contains nothing not implied by him.

"The Fox" is per Lawrence. Lewis Carlino and Howard Koch, who did the adaptation, remained remarkably faithful to the text. Where they deviated from Lawrence, they did so for the better.

Jill's parents are cut from the end, and one wonders why Lawrence didn't do the same. A tree which he brings in only when he needs it is converted into a thematic element of the film. A wayward cow carelessly thrown out of the novella is marvelously returned to the screen.

The casting, too, is superb. Sandy Dennis plays her usual dazed and fluttering female, but here she fits. Keir Dullea (David in "David and Lisa") is properly male and menacing, a true fox in the henhouse. And Anne Heywood, seen in this country for the first time, seems to be precisely the woman Lawrence was talking about.

Two things, however, did bother me. The first, confessedly personal, objection is the slaughter of the fox. Lawrence treated this scene almost perfunctorily, almost as an accident of fate. But Rydell has converted it into a display of innumerable cruelty, beginning with a butchered chicken, and ending with a full-screen (color) close-up of the fox as the buckshot tears it to pieces.

The second problem is that of the ending. Both Lawrence and Rydell make the Jill-March relationship seem much healthier, much more joyful and honest, than that between March and Paul. Yet the Hero gets the Girl by callously, if somewhat fortuitously, murdering Jill.

Sic semper Lesbianis. Despite

the best efforts of all involved, the scene contains a definite, although elusive, note of falseness. (Perhaps it's the sound of the deus ex machina.)

But if one wishes to quibble with the film (Rydell's first), the complaints, I think, will ultimately have to be referred to Lawrence. As a measure of the skill which has gone into the making of "The Fox", I suggest that you compare the film's final image with last few pages of the text. In this case, one picture seems to be worth approximately 2,160 words.

IBM WORKERS TO RESIST VIA ACM

A new look for Resistance may be in store, perhaps in the form of IBM cards for the anti-war effort.

They have noted that the initials ACM (for Anti-Complicity Movement) are perhaps to be confused by professional computer programmers as Association for Computing Machinery.

A spokesman for the new group feels that the computer/data-processing profession might be a logical place to organize for social responsibility because the war machine is an extremely sophisticated technological thing.

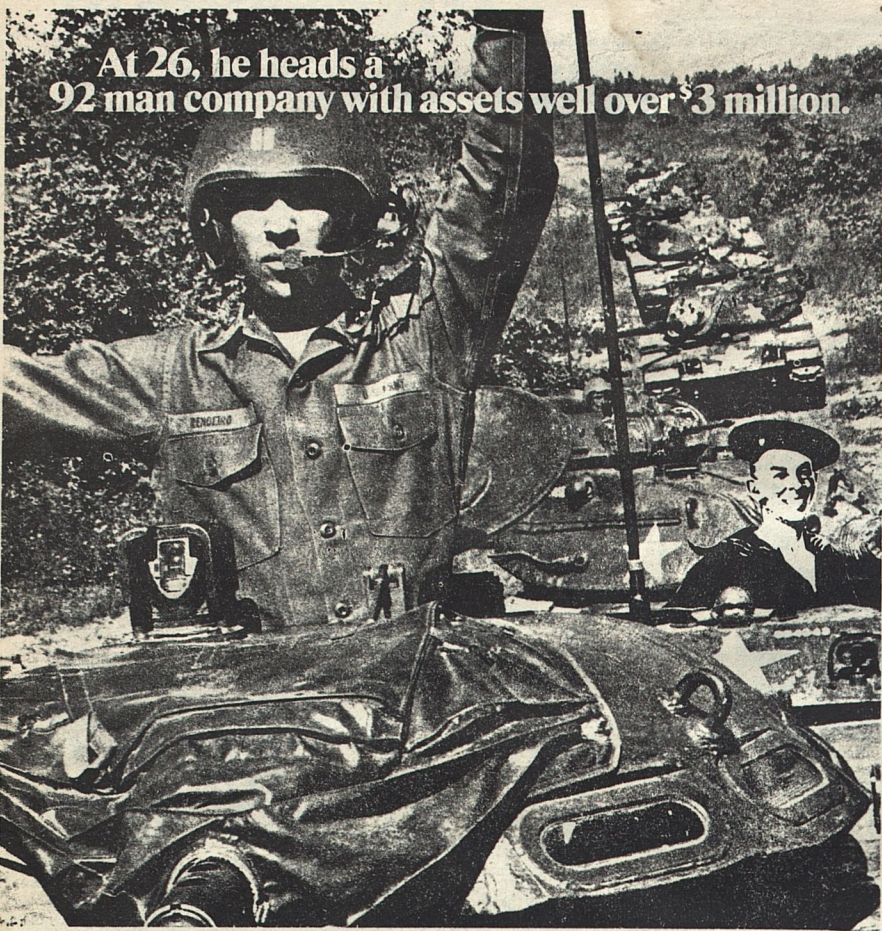
IBM 1401 computers are employed by the government in the battlefield jungles to keep track of military material and personnel, he pointed out. Special air-conditioned units must be constructed to house them in such conditions.

The spokesman said that salaries and opportunities for programmers in Vietnam are vast according to advertisements in Sunday papers. ACM feels that programmers, being essentially rational men, are able to see the solution to problems without violence. Such Vietnam offers should not be tempting, he indicated.

AND WHAT KIND OF ASSETS DO YOU HAVE, PETRICK?

In nearly every Army post in the nation are GPs willing to work for the antiwar movement.

This information comes from Howard Petrick, an ex-GI who was threatened with a court-martial for speaking against the war. Petrick was eventually given an "undesirable" discharge when the Army found it had no case against him.

Ex - Pfc Petrick is currently on a nationwide speaking tour in an effort to have the "undesirable" removed from his discharge papers. In a Los Angeles interview he spoke of the withdrawal of Johnson and its impact on the GI.

"Many of the GPs question the whole thing," said Petrick. "After all, Johnson was the one who was laying the pattern for the war in Vietnam and he was the one who was telling the GPs to go off heroically and fight. Then when he turns around like this and just withdraws it means he is expressing a lot of doubt about the whole program he was carrying out in Vietnam."

Petrick also spoke of the attitudes of Black soldiers toward the war.

"They see it as racist. They know they don't have equality here and they know they will have the same problems when they return. When I went into the Army in July 1966 many black GPs didn't have a political understanding of Black Power but by the time I got out they had more respect for Stokely Carmichael and Rap Brown.

"... the Mexican - Americans hang around with the blacks. They are aware of racism and they know it is against them, too. They see the blacks as soul brothers, al-

though they are not as politically aware as the blacks.

Petrick entered the Army with the intention of exercising his rights as a citizen. He spoke out against the war and refused to stop.

"Anyone who speaks out against the war gets a lot of support from among the GPs," he says, "both from the leftwingers and rightwingers. Certainly they are not given any answers from the military..."

He says that the GPs "... read anything they can get, especially the underground press. At Fort Hood, Texas, where I was stationed, they would read and pass around The Rag, from Austin; the LA Free Press and the BARB."

"There are GPs who participate in the civilian antiwar movement. Some of them got leave to go to Washington DC last October 21 and they went back to their posts and said, 'The antiwar movement is on our side.'

"But what the GPs need most is

KING DEATH PUTS NAACP IN NEW BAG

With the death of Martin Luther King the NAACP may be getting into a different bag.

"We have to get back to representing the black community," Robert Hayes, a spokesman for the San Francisco branch of NAACP told BARB this week.

After expressing his dismay over the white politicians "making an issue over Martin Luther King's murder for political advantage," Hayes told BARB: "We had better start identifying and deciding where to go. This is no time to straddle the fence---we have to get back to the black community."

Hayes also intimated that there was a shake-up coming within the NAACP, the oldest of the Negro rights organizations.

"House niggers are gone, and those making \$20,000 a year don't need our help," he said.

On April 15, the SF branch of the NAACP is sponsoring a discussion entitled "The accomplishments of Elijah Muhammad in the Past 37 Years."

The open meeting will be held at 8pm at 1399 McAllister St. in San Francisco.

A Black Muslim Minister of 18 years experience, Henry Majied, will be the guest speaker in the tribute to Elijah Muhammad.

The Society for Individual Rights (SIR) held the dance at their Community Center at 83 Sixth Street in San Francisco. SIR is the largest homosexual organization in the nation with nearly 1000 membership, primarily in northern California.

Enlarged copies of gay want ads from BARB were scattered around the room.

"Male model, young, blond, cute, 21, experienced and versatile, call..."

"Butch stud, hung, muscular, student, 18, wants same for work-outs and ? Call ... in Oakland."

"Gay Girl wants to meet single girl, 22, fun & games."

These and other swinging ads set the mood.

"These ads might give you kids some ideas for Barb ads of your own," Jim Skaggs, SIR president announced during the dance.

Every weekend SIR has gay dances with different motifs, such as this one called want ads. Beautiful things happen at them. Like the two college type young fellows I saw sitting alone at a table near the dance floor. Laughing, talking, looking deeply into each others eyes... obviously in love with the scene.

Music filled the room. Moving to the dance floor, both fellows --one blond and tall; the other a darker Italian with long flowing black hair--started dancing. Soon the room is filled with fellows swinging to the beat.

In public, the gay community isn't permitted the privilege of showing love or affection to each other by society's customs and laws.

But inside the private SIR Community Center, gay males and females are relaxed and happy. Or maybe just plain gay.

COUNCIL MEET COMES UP WITH "PIOUS FRAUD"

The entire world's youth (and their parents) have heard of Mario Savio, but apparently the Mayor of Berkeley hasn't -- he continually referred to this PFP leader as "Mister Sayviah" until he was corrected by Mario himself.

This illuminating incident shows exactly where the Berkeley City Council is at -- nowhere near reality.

Asked by Mario, speaking for the Peace & Freedom Party "to act NOW if racism is to be ended peacefully in America," the council rejected councilman Ronald Dellums "sense motion" of support and approved a move to hold a public "study session" April 30 based on their proclamation issued immediately after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King.

The difference between the two motions is this:

While the PFP motion states

"the time has come to separate the pious frauds from those who genuinely share the goals of racial and social justice which Martin Luther King struggled for all his life," the Council motion is precisely that, a pious fraud.

Instead of talking about "the immediate ending of all acts of police harassment and brutality" (PFP), it deals with "looking into your hearts" and other platitudes, without asking for any action.

In the confusion of the three hour discussion on the PFP motion (mostly among the council), it looked as though councilwoman Margaret Gordon's motion was in support of the PFP resolution.

But in the last thirty seconds of discussion, Mayor Johnson somehow got it to come out as supporting their own proclamation. The surprised look on Margaret Gordon's face indicated she either was not aware she had supported the PFP, or that the Mayor had given her the shaft.

Dr. Gordon (a professor of economics at UC) did get passed, however, a "Martin Luther King Memorial Fund" to provide money for a "West Berkeley Health Clinic" and other human rights projects.

Since the PFP resolution was not on the agenda, Mario got on the mike immediately and asked if the council could discuss it at some point in the meeting.

Dr. Gordon moved that it be brought in after the City Manager's report, and the council supported this motion, with the Mayor voting against.

The standing-room-only audience sat patiently for over one and a half hours, listening to the report.

It was after Mario made his presentation that the audience began to vocalize. When councilman DeBonis called the PFP supporters "people who lived in a jungle," he was answered by people calling him "the biggest ape of all."

When the Mayor mentioned the possible need of a "leash-law" for dogs, a voice called out "Put the Berkeley cops on a leash." The Berkeley Gazette termed this rank-and-file talk "insults hurled by PFP."

But the Mayor said, "I wish to compliment the good sense of humor of these remarks made in an emotional situation."

The ugliest insult of all was made by DeBonis against Dellums. He said the black councilman had "just moved up near me. He doesn't want you to know this because he was elected to represent the people in West Berkeley." DeBonis lives in the Thousand Oaks hill area.

Mario repeatedly pointed out Tuesday night that "America is about to go down" over White Racism "and you must do something about it."

While he was speaking, what he was talking about was actually taking place in Kansas City, Mo., where "Open Warfare" was taking place. Five blacks were "shot to death in a second night of violence as snipers exchanged shots with the National Guard."

The Guard ran out of ammunition, but not the Berkeley City Council. They are going to have a "study session" and a "Health Clinic" while America burns.

A third release recently received by BARB says that George will be honored Sunday at a "gala" \$100-per-couple dinner-dance and fashion show at the Bermuda Building in Oakland.

HAWAII HIPPIE HELL?

"Hippies and beach bums" were condemned by local officials in Hawaii's Kauai Island as "a terrific monster moved onto the island."

Giving the beach bums the bum's rush is apparently what Supervisor Henry Gomez had in mind. According to an article in the Honolulu Star-Bulletin, Gomez was joined by other supervisors in asking for "ordinances to impose restrictions against such undesirable."

"We must ask the public to cooperate, to chase these people out of private property. We know some local people are using drugs," he said.

Another public official said, "The reason they come is because we make them welcome. This is one time we must forget our aloha spirit. Make them unwelcome... show by actions that they are not wanted here."

SCUM RESURRECTED

JERUSALEM (Caesarian News Service) -- Roman authorities, acting on information from a paid informer, have arrested the leader of a dissident group of pacifists, Jesus Christ, of no fixed address, was brought before Magistrate Pontius Pilate and bound over for trial. He was arrested in the company of several suspected homosexuals while loitering in an olive grove near Jerusalem. The Romans state that their attention was drawn to Christ when he was observed kissing another man under a tree.

Authorities feel that with the arrest of Christ, the anti-militant group will become disorganized and disperse. The former carpenter and magician drew a large motley following of malcontents with his idealistic philosophy of peace and love. While paying lip service to the law, his teachings are believed responsible for draft dodging and the desertion of tax collectors.

In a public statement, King Herod said that the Christian group is a social blight on the city. Their

refusal to work at normal jobs and lack of decent home lives are an insult to decent citizens and a bad example for children. "Christians are scum, and scum always rises to the surface," he said. Herod expressed the hope that the group could be brought back into society.

Deputy Chief Centurian Fiskus of the Romans later announced that the arrest presaged an intended crackdown on the "Christian" community. He referred to the raid as a warning to "Christians" against congregating in Jerusalem this summer. Fiskus said that the Romans had conferred with legal

experts to find existing laws that could be used against the group.

The charges against Christ include: Loitering in an area appurtenant to a public building; having no visible means of support; practicing medicine without a license; conducting an unlawful assembly; public mischief; assault of money changers in a religious building; creating a disturbance by shouting; failure to pay income tax; obstructing an officer; and several counts of advocating an illegal act.

Christ is also held on suspicion under the Narcotics Control Act.

He has claimed to have seen 'visions' and claims supernatural powers for himself. Authorities feel that this is probably the result of using drugs.

One official referred to the "Christians" as a group of parasites who add nothing to the betterment of society. They wander aimlessly around the country, he said, frequenting the company of thieves, drunkards and prostitutes. "This anti-social behavior goes against everything we have been taught to believe in."

Antonio Sooderius, one of the producers of the Sever O'Sundial Show at the arena was "re-assigned" to other duties after publicly comparing Christ with Moses. Two hundred irate citizens threw clay tablets charging "sacrilege" and "heresy".

Roman and Hebrew officials feel that with the arrest of Christ, his unkempt following will quietly disperse. "This is a passing fad," one said. "If we stop it right now it will never become a major problem."

The trial of Jesus Christ is set for Friday and a group of responsible, interested citizens have announced their intention of attending and making the views of the community known.

With luck, Rome will have heard the last of this bearded troublemaker and his strange philosophy. from Georgia Straight (UPS)

TO DEMONSTRATE RADICAL INTEGRITY

The next Stop The Draft Week will have as its purpose demonstration of the fact that a large number of radicals will not be bought off by establishment tokenism.

Taking the form of a street rally at the Oakland Induction Center, the action will focus both on U.S. imperialism abroad and the colonization of Blacks at home.

The Induction Center demonstration will last from 6:30 a.m. until 9 a.m. on April 23 and will be followed by a rally at the Alameda County Courthouse in support of the jailed Panthers. Hope-

fully, the buses coming to the Induction Center will be delayed by the rally.

It is hoped that the police will not attempt to disrupt the rally in either place. No deals are being made with the cops. However, tactical plans are being made for all contingencies, and it is suggested that defensive equipment be brought.

As BARB goes to press these tactical plans are being brought before the Regional Steering Committee for approval or modification. In all plans the right to self-defense is reserved, although no provocations are planned.

The action is not intended to be a repetition of the last STDW, and barricade-building tactics will be discouraged unless provoked.

Speakers at the rally will stress the connection between the draft and the suppression of the Black community by federal occupation troops. The lack of real alternatives on the part of the Democratic candidates and the possibility of fraudulent negotiations on the war are also issues. --L.F.

LIKE, WHO'S MORE RADICAL?

To The Editor:

Ken Blum presents as an example of radicalism the fact that "The ISC pushed for a Peace and Freedom stand in favor of labor breaking from the Democratic Party."

By itself this might be considered a mildly radical position. But at the Richmond convention the ISC pushed it IN OPPOSITION TO proposals that the Peace and Freedom Movement (1) be opposed not only to the two capitalist parties, but also to the capitalist system, and (2) adopt as its primary goal the creation of a labor party. In this context, the ISC's role as an anti-radical force becomes obvious.

Other evidence is also available, such as the refusal of the ISC, which gives lip service to the idea of a labor party, to join with others in PFP who were making a serious fight for such an orientation through the Labor Party Caucus.

The Richmond convention definitively established the PFP as a political formation with a middle-class base and a middle-class program. The ISC feels comfortable in this sandbox; but serious socialists have no business there.

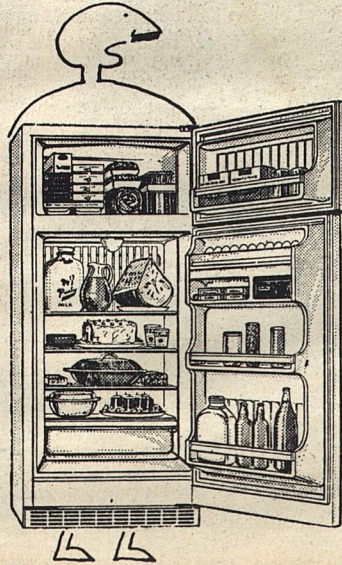

However the engineers are presently considering the advisability of testing the model in relatively less pure conditions such as exist in mountains or rural areas of U.S. The completion date has not been announced as yet. The total conversion may take up to twelve years; however, engineers plan frequent tests of partially converted model during that period. The earliest of these tests will probably occur during spring of 1968. At the factory the new model is now referred to by code name: Ram DASS.

TO THE BASTILLE

The first march to end white racism ended on the green shores of Lake Merritt within one hundred yards of Huey Newton's prison cell atop the Alameda County Court House in Oakland.

There, nearly five thousand people who had marched from the UC campus in Berkeley shouted "Free Huey -- Free Huey" and Huey heard it up there in his cell because prisoners and trustees thrust their hands out through the bars in the "V for Victory" sign of the march.

Tiring of the speeches made from the top of the Peace & Freedom Truck parked in the museum hall (Jack Weinberg was left in mid-sentence), the students and youths, black and white, got up off the grass and swarmed across the street to the building.

All traffic was stopped and the marchers flowed up to the main entrance behind which was a solid phalanx of helmeted policemen.

Holding up signs of protest for the cops and office workers inside to see, they pounded on the glass-doors until the cops came out and slowly pushed the demonstrators back across the street.

No confrontation took place. Somebody in the Peace & Freedom Party wisely collected all the shields and placed them inside their truck.

After shouting their slogans and making their point to the passing commute auto and bus traffic, the

members slowly broke up and went home.

This was the most non-violent violent demonstration that ever took place in the experience of this reporter (who has been in all of them since the troop-trains in Berkeley).

We pushed the cops to the brink,

the cops pushed us back to the sidewalk, and everybody knew that nothing else was going to happen.

Earlier, one black was rapping away before the speeches started. "If you want to free Huey, go get him," he was shouting to anybody who would listen.

Many did. "How long have you sung 'We Shall Overcome' and nothing happened? I'm no leader. We don't need no leaders. Go get him!" he said.

Bob Avakian, of P&F, got on the mike and said, "I didn't come five miles just to hear speeches." He asked for a show of hands to "surround the Court House whether the pigs like it or not."

Most everybody held up a hand. But the speeches did go on. Prof. Moe Hirsch, of UC Mathematics Dept., was chairman (and made a speech). Bob Mandel, an organizer of Stop The Draft Week, pointed out that there are "now over 30,000 troops in America, while in Vietnam in 1964 there were only 16,000 men."

He said that on April 23, they will "close down the Oakland Induction Center, and when the buses come and we can't stop them, we shall march over to this Court House and support Huey and Cleaver. This year, the Stop The Draft Week will have both these points."

Mike Jones asked people "to get up off it" and tell it to "your

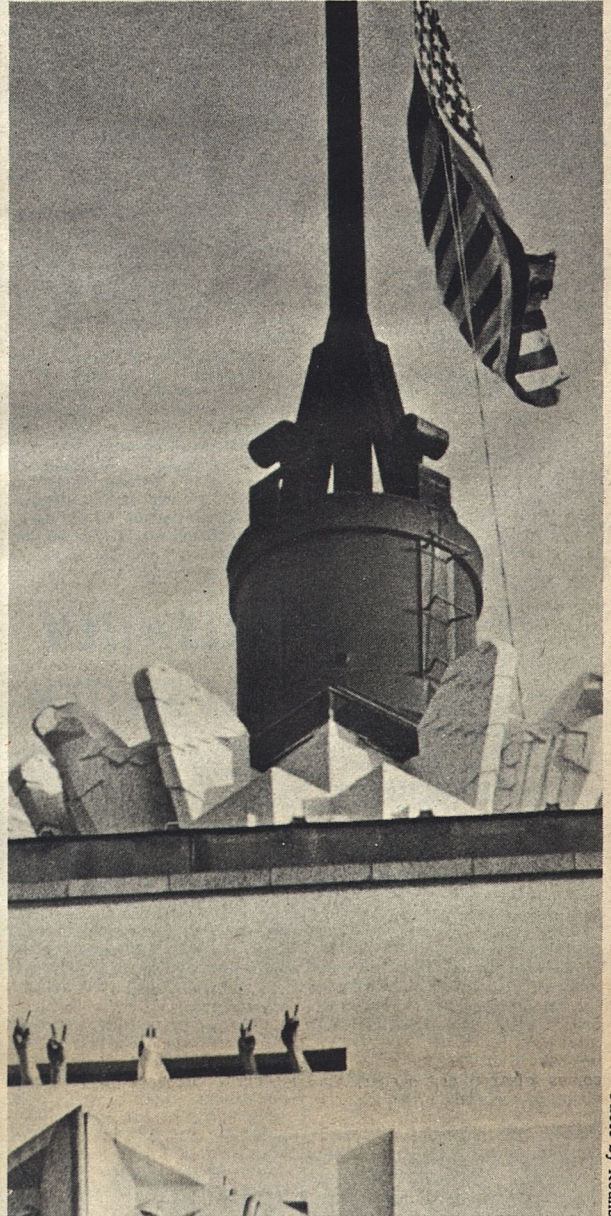

city councils."

Paul Jacobs spoke, and his eloquence nearly made Lake Merritt overflow.

By this time, people were shouting "let's go free Huey."

Jack Weinberg attempted to put HIS political content to the meeting. "We must understand that it is necessary to make the following decisions . . ." and the marchers started getting up and leaving.

A young black somehow got on

the mike and made stinging indictment of white power structure. "We're all Americans, but us blacks don't get nothing. Black and white get killed in Vietnam, but us blacks at home don't get nothing. I'm ready to die here instead of Vietnam. I want freedom now!"

That's where it was Monday, that's where it's at today, and that's where it's going to be tomorrow.

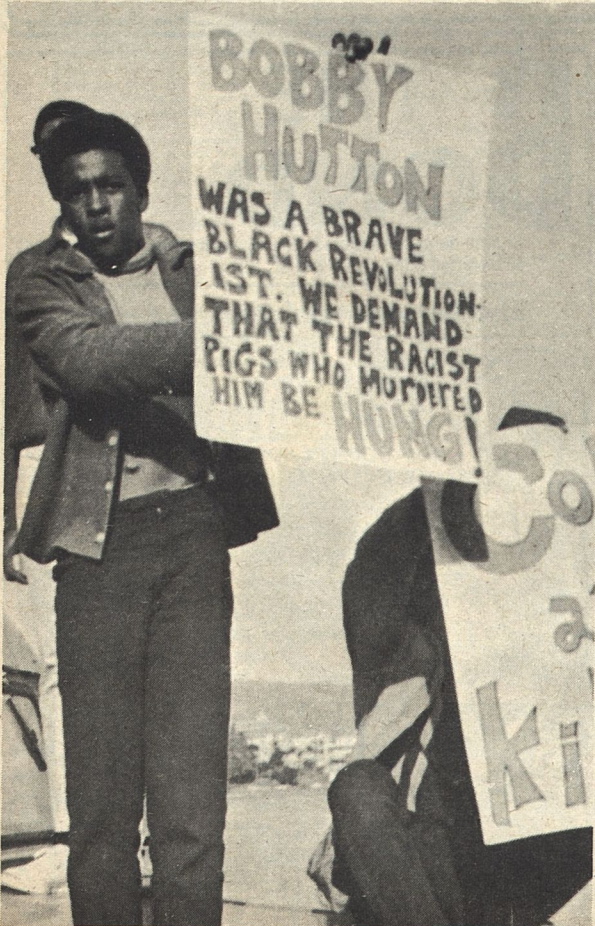

 was overwhelming," she said.

"Since everything Eldridge was doing was for the defense of Huey Newton, it simply means that the support for Huey goes up."

Kathleen couldn't find words adequate to convey her feelings about the Oakland cops shooting 17-year-old Bobby Hutton to death as he was trying to surrender.

"I, myself, am more shook up over Bobby Hutton's murder than over any other killing in the civil rights struggle," she said. "It was subhuman. It was — it was savage.

"That whole attack — with machine guns, floodlights, teargas, just because more Panthers were gathered there — was so blatant, so, so brutal, it shook up the community to no end.

"If they're interested in stopping the spread of the Panthers, that's the worst thing they could have done."

Kathleen Cleaver spoke in a calm, quiet even voice which betrayed not even her exhaustion after days and nights of work to aid the Panthers arrested in the Saturday battle.

She smiled that Eldridge, her husband, since December, was in good spirits during jail visits, despite being shot, gassed, kicked, locked in solitary, and quickly shuffled from Highland Hospital to City Jail to San Quentin to Vacaville.

When BARB suggested that the Adult Authority has customarily had an easy time violating parolees back into prison on a whim, Kathleen pointed out that it would be different with Eldridge.

"When the Adult Authority takes Eldridge Cleaver, they have one of the most powerful leaders working to defend Huey Newton, and the author of a book (Soul on Ice) that looks like a budding best seller.

"With Eldridge, the issue becomes clearer and deeper: the rights of the individual against a police state. It becomes a key case in regard to their supposed right to violate people into prison."

With attorneys Charles Garry

and Alex Hoffman watching the legal side, and thousands of outraged citizens keeping alert to his fate, Kathleen doesn't expect Eldridge to disappear unnoticed behind the walls, as happens to most ex-convicts sucked in for alleged parole violations.

The importance of the Black Panthers and their Minister of Information, Eldridge Cleaver, is indicated by the fact that Cleaver's parole was suspended by the Adult Authority meeting in Sacramento to invoke an emergency suspension procedure.

A formal hearing of the Adult Authority will be held on Friday, April 12, at the Ferry Building in San Francisco to affirm or reject the emergency action.

Kathleen Cleaver surmised that inaccurate accounts in the daily press of Eldridge's record arose from overzealous interpretations of "Soul on Ice."

The local dailies said Eldridge was convicted of rape. In fact, Kathleen pointed out, he was never charged with rape. The only likely source of such a notion is some descriptive passages in Eldridge's book.

"His actual trial (for armed assault) was unfair," she said. "He was convicted by the word of a white man."

Despite the fact that the Black

Panthers have always strongly opposed spontaneous outbursts of violence -- "which only hurt the black community," Kathleen noted -- and adamantly insist upon self defense, not offense, the Oakland police have branded them as the cause of violent ghetto incidents.

The way the Panthers tell it, the branding is no accident.

"The attack on Saturday was just the latest in a series of attempts to wipe out the Panther leadership," Kathleen said. "That day we got information from a black policeman, who was very upset, about plans by the Berkeley, Oakland, and San Francisco police departments to destroy our leadership.

Huey Newton, Minister of Defense; Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information; Bobby Hutton, Treasurer; Bobby Seale, Chairman -- these are only the most well known of the Panthers who have been arrested or imprisoned or shot or killed in their fight for black liberation.

The usual pattern for less well-known Panthers is night-time hassles by bands of cops whose actions have made "pig" the universal word for cop in the Panther vocabulary.

One Oakland Panther pointed out that he was never bothered by cops until he began wearing the identifiable "uniform" of leather jacket, "Free Huey" buttons, and black beret. Since then, he says, he has been repeatedly harassed by the "fascist pigs."

What happens when they bust a leading Black Panther was related by Kathleen Cleaver after she spoke with Eldridge at the Vacaville prison.

"When he was in the squad car," she told BARB, "they kicked and beat him. Here he was shot in the foot and couldn't see or breathe because of all the tear gas, and they

still had to do that to him.

"When they got him to Highland Hospital they tried to get rid of all the nurses so he couldn't get medical help. Then they took him to City Prison for booking, but didn't have any charges, so they shot him to San Quentin immediately.

"Then they sent him to Vacaville for 'medical treatment,' but put him in solitary where there's no ventilation so he could hardly breathe and they couldn't hear him if he needed medical care.

"He told me, 'If I didn't need medical attention when I was at Highland, I sure did by the time I reached Vacaville.'"

While authorities were playing this shell game with Cleaver, his attorneys were going from jail to jail trying to catch up with him.

Kathleen has a hunch about another reason for moving Eldridge around. "They know Eldridge," she said.

"The prisons were already tense over the King murder, and they were afraid he might set something off."

"He told me he felt the only thing that saved him was that he had taken all his clothes off (when he walked from the besieged house into the police floodlights)," Kathleen said. "Since he was naked, they couldn't claim they thought he was armed."

She said Eldridge had told Bobby Hutton to disrobe before surrendering, but he had been too embarrassed. So seven bullets cut him down, unarmed.

"When they killed Bobby in cold blood, they created another symbol," Kathleen Cleaver said. "Now they have intensified the feelings of the people on a broad scale. People now feel they have to take some kind of action, action to protect the leaders of the black liberation struggle nationwide.

"When they murdered Martin

Luther King, they were killing the past. But when they murdered little Bobby Hutton, it was like they were trying to kill the future."

racist Oakland cops of the young developing leader "can be no more tolerated than the tragic assassination of Martin Luther King by a Southern racist."

The statement indicts the Oakland police for provoking the incident: "We believe that the Oakland Police must take full responsibility for the incident, that Cleaver and the other Panthers are innocent, that the only criminal proceedings should be initiated against the police that murdered Bobby Hutton, and we will campaign to bring the truth to the people of California, the nation, and the world."

"The police account that the Panthers attacked them is a lie," the joint statement said. "Rather, the Panthers did what they always said they would do. They were attacked by white police in their community and the defended themselves."

The statement accuses the police of attempting to eliminate the leadership of the Black Panther Party, and of using the law as a political weapon against them. "An attack on the Black Panther Party is an attack on the Peace and Freedom Movement" it said.

Perhaps their best epithet for Bobby James Hutton is the sentence which the Panthers put beside his photo on a poster for the Mass Meeting and March: "He died fighting for our freedom." ---s.b.g.

WHERE DID THEY EVER GET THAT WAY?

To the Editor:
 Communist bureaucracies? Of course, and very bad. Oppressive? Soviet people don't think so; others in East Europe do. Communist imperialism? A contradiction in terms, invented during the Cold War and persisting because of the contempt for ideological thought the New Left has accepted from the end-of-ideology liberal professors it thinks it despises.

Imperialism is not a policy but the post-laissez-faire stage of capitalism: monopoly, finance capital (bank control of industry), export of capital (instead of goods alone), colonialism (today neo-colonialism) to safeguard those capital investments, struggle to re-divide the world due to desire for monopoly advantages in colonies of neo-colonies (U.S. takeover of previous French, British, Japanese spheres of influence).

For detail, see Imperialism, by V. I. Lenin, a seemingly little-known Russian, b. 1870, d. 1924, led a revolution in 1917.

Soviet "Russia impedes the industrialization of Eastern Europe"? A lie. U.N. figures show more rapid growth of industry since World War II for that area than for any other part of the world, including the USSR itself. The charge re E. Europe is not only a lie, but a vicious and filthy one, because the industrialization came out of the sacrifice of the Soviet people, which provided the equipment, after suffering the most devastating losses modern history has known, and without benefit of the assistance the U.S. gave capitalist countries to rebuild.

Communist "ruling class"? Idiocy. What does retired Krushchev own? What are his children assured of other than education?

Source of the ISC position? Trotskyism, the most sterile of all socialist ideologies, which has never changed a society anywhere on earth, but has served solely as the most subtle of media-messages against existing socialist societies, because its criticism sounds revolutionary and is therefore persuasive among population segments new to radicalism. Perhaps ISC ought to go to Merritt College and re-educate the students who were saying last Friday: "That thing (King's assassination) didn't happen in Moscow or Peking. It happened in the U.S.A."

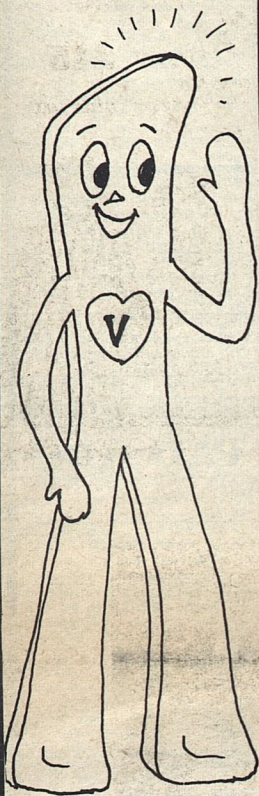
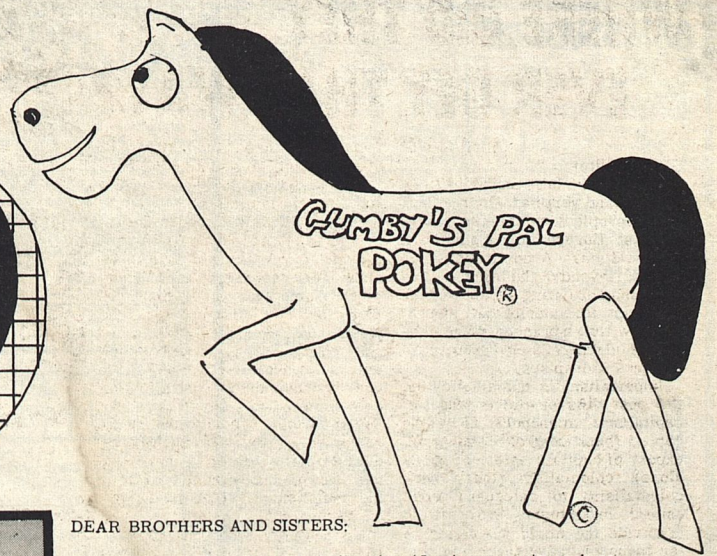
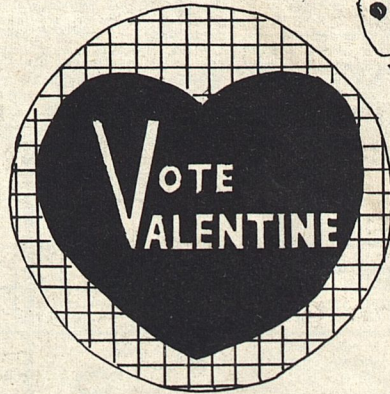

This picture of my grandfather hung in the living room of his farm house in Millington, Michigan. As a child I was fascinated by the big curl in his hair that looked like a large BUMP. Later when trying to decide on the shape of Gumby's head I remembered my grandfather's "bump." I therefore immortalized this bump in my semi-abstract boy-hero, Gumby.

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS:

From phone calls and people in the street I get comments such as these: "Hey, what is it???... Who is this Arthur?... What's all this Candid Candidate and Valentine Party thing anyway? Well, let me begin and answer these questions in order. Over the next several weeks it should all be clear to you. First, What is IT? — IT is my MANIFESTO which is defined by Webster as "A public declaration, usually of a sovereign or political group, showing intentions and motives." I declare my intention to offer myself as your Host at my Valentine Party. I invite you to be my guests at a Valentine Party. My motive is that I want to give New Heart to this nation first and eventually to the world. I feel America's Heart is broken and needs renewal and regeneration. Part of that New Heart is hidden in each of you. I intend to help uncover and bring out and bring together these precious Parts into a Valentine PARTY. I do my part first, opening my heart to you by starting to answer your question: Who is Arthur? Arthur is a CLOKEY. However, since you are not likely to know Clokey, I will begin with a more familiar part of Arthur; that is, the GUMBY of Arthur. A few years ago I had a delightful experience in Boston where I had gone to persuade toy jobbers to distribute my Gumby doll. The largest jobber there had just turned me down saying he didn't think Gumby was very well known and didn't have any sales potential. Dejected I walked away from the office and down this street in a poverty district toward my car. Walking up the street toward me came three black boys about 12 or 13 years old. I pulled out a green Gumby doll and held it up saying: "Do you fellas know who this is?" They all answered in unison: "GUMBY!" By their expressions on their faces I knew they loved Gumby.

This incident occurred at a time when my Gumby Film Company was on the edge of collapse financially. I learned the hard way that honest quality films for children were not considered "commercial" enough by most TV stations. Thanks to the tiny minority of the smart station managers (like Fred Thrower of WPIX, N.Y.) who could see the true potential of my honest creation Gumby, I received enough exposure in a few large markets to prove my point; namely, that everybody loves Gumby! Gumby is my Child of Clay, green clay. The children of this continent and of Europe, Australia, Asia, and Africa have been tripping with my little Clayboy for over ten years now. A few weeks ago at a rally where I heard Dr. Spock it occurred to me that whereas Spock specialized in concern for babies' bodies, I followed up with concern for their hearts and minds through Fantasy during childhood. Now like Spock I feel deep rage at what the Manipulators are doing to Gumby's former "clay-mates," the young rebels thruout our land trying to live a life of joy like Gumby instead of stereotype robots. It was interesting the way Gumby was born. About 1955 I made an experimental Abstract Art Film entitled GUMBASIA which, by the way, has the distinction of being the only ABSTRACT film included last year in Playboy Magazine's series History of Sex in Cinema! Gumbasia, a film of clay changing shape and color to music, was shown to Sam Engel of 20th Century Fox. Sam, who loved children, suggested that I create a clay puppet boy character for a children's TV film series using my Gumbasia Dimensional Animation technique. I did this and he financed a pilot film, the first Adventure of Gumby. When Tom Sarnoff of NBC saw the film, he immediately signed me up. NBC financed the first part of my Gumby adventure. Within two years I was able to start producing the Gumby Series independently of NBC. Well, enuff fer now.

FLOWER POWER TOPPLES TOWER

"If I could turn off the lights for awhile, they might listen." That, Dale Morrow told BARB, is why he drove a bulldozer into a PG&E power tower in San Mateo last week, blacking out ten Peninsula towns.

Morrow called BARB an hour before turning himself in to the lawmen "to make sure people know the real story." Essentially, the real story is that he wanted to end the war and to cut the Achilles Heel of The Man.

"Now that the blacks are rioting," Morrow told BARB Monday, "they are listening, but they wouldn't listen before. The only thing they understand is power. They're nothing without their machines. They can't fight a war without electricity."

Morrow said he had planned to continue disrupting major power lines all summer, "but I can't continue to fight them on their own terms. I can't justify destructive actions—as they always do."

He described a way to use an explosive charge to throw a cable over high voltage lines to short them out. "I was going to do that Friday night—there's a place near South San Francisco that would black out the whole city (San Francisco)—but I'm glad it didn't work because it would have caused bloodshed."

Other cities that Friday night were fighting flames and calling in troops. Twice that night Morrow failed in his efforts to shut off all electrical power in San Francisco.

"Something greater prevented it," he said.

Although he says he has not been involved in other recent raids on electrical power lines in the Bay Area, Morrow indicated that such action could affect the war.

"It would force them to bring the troops out of Vietnam to protect their own selfish interests,"

he said.

Recently a construction laborer working on BART, Morrow spent 3 years in the 2nd Airborne where he learned about methods of chemical and biological warfare.

"I know what kind of madmen are creating these instruments of death," he said.

Morrow turned himself in because "this way I'll have a chance to say something. Besides, right now they are doing the worst they can do to me. It would be better to be locked up than forced to work for their goals."

He said he wasn't sure where he would turn himself in, but would wander around the SF City Hall until he found someone willing to take him. It wasn't easy.

Carrying Kahlil Gibran's "The Prophet" and a few philosophy books, he tried the SF sheriff's office. They directed him to the nearest police station.

Morrow then ambled into the City Hall press room, where the Chronicle reporter there interviewed him for about a yard of good copy before taking him to the Hall of Justice.

Since details of his story checked out with unpublicized facts, the San Mateo D.A. decided to charge Morrow with a felony, maliciously injuring or interfering with electric power transmission lines.

TEAR UP THEM PRINTED WARRANTS

Printed arrest warrants often used by cops to hassle people off to jail without sufficient evidence have been ruled unconstitutional by the California Supreme Court.

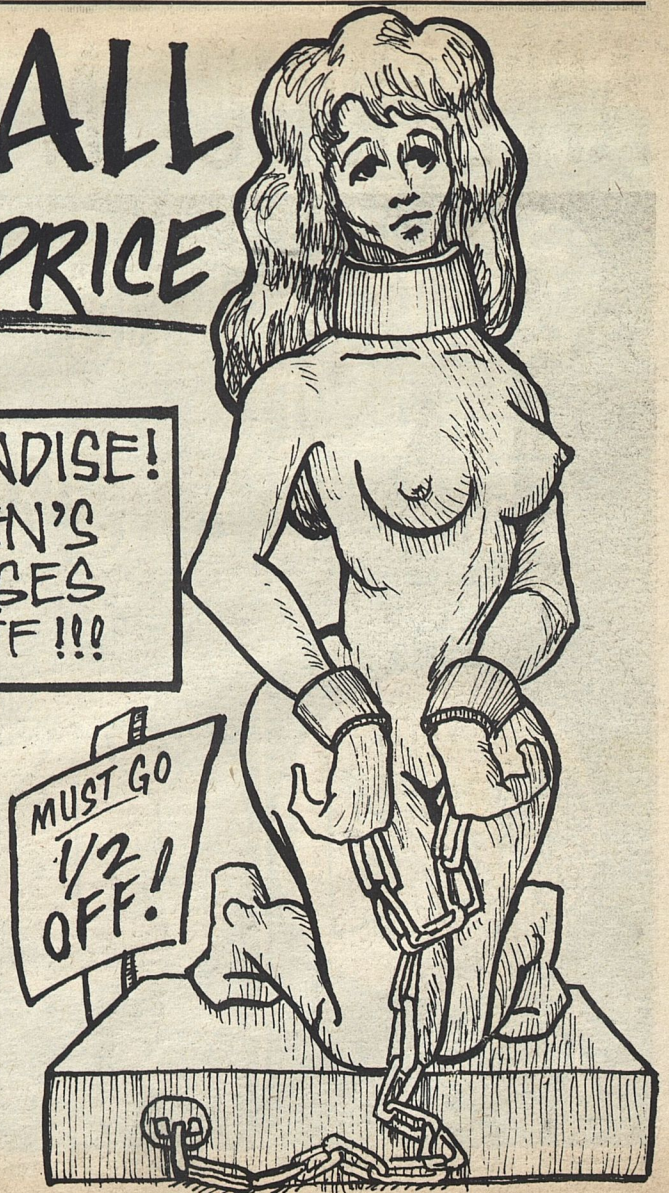

And, like a certain English author, my experience of coincidences is that they usually aren't.

I quote from the Elder Edda: "Hard is it in the world... an axe age, a sword age, shields shall be cloven, a wind age, a wolf age, ere the world sinks."

It hits too close to home right now to be evaluated as poetry. Nothing specifically said about a rifle age, but the point remains...

And maybe I'm all wrong. Perhaps in another six months I'll be writing about how the death of Dr. King was what forced the smashing of the right-wing forces behind the outrage, and the triumph of all that he stood for. I hope so. That's all there is to do is hope.

That's all we can all do right now, is hope. Sometimes it works. -R.R.

QUESTION: Our last kilo contained hundreds of chips of crushed moth balls. We have heard tell of grass cured in moth balls, but had never seen any before. The grass had a peculiar medicinal odor and a metallic taste, but it did stone us better than average. Could there be any possible harm in smoking or swallowing chips too small to see?
ANSWER: Your friendly dealer may lose a lot of customers. Moth balls usually contain 100% naphthalene. Naphthalene is fatal in quantities of 2 grams for children and 5 to 15 grams for adults when ingested at one sitting. The drug is also quite toxic when inhaled.
Some of the symptoms of naphthalene intoxication are headache, confusion, excitement, nausea, and sometimes sweating and vomiting. Death occurs when the red blood cells are destroyed and the kidneys damaged by the cellular material released by the lysed red cells.
