**FED PRISON HEADS TELL OF SORRY HASSLES**

With Liberty and Justice for almost Everyone -- Dearest People,

Yesterday, a fellow freak somehow copped the July 12th issue of the BARB. This was the first decent piece of "subversive" literature I've read in more than four months.

My, no, I should say OUR problem happens to be the disgusting fact that we are federal prisoners in the Englewood Federal Correctional Institution approximately fifteen miles south of Denver, Colorado.

**IS THERE A LAWYER OUT THERE?**

To Whom It May Concern:

My name is John Hughes, my Army name, Prisoner John Hughes RA 19863265. Sir, I went in the Army Nov. 1, 1965. I spent a year in the States and a year in Vietnam which was against my will because I don't believe in it at ALL.

Sir, I need a lawyer to help me in court because I cannot stay in the Army any longer, I was AWOL for about seven months. I am at the Army stockade now and I have been here for a week and no one has told me a thing about my situation. I think this is the way it will be for awhile too.

Sir, I have no money at the moment but in the future I know I will.

Be more than glad to lay it on your organization. I have no way for getting in touch with you again so please notify me as soon as possible. I have more information about my status but I would like to tell to my lawyer in person,

We, Rick Winland -- Los Angeles (illegal production of acid, transportation of narcotics, and conspiracy to smuggle),

Larry Reese -- San Francisco (draft evasion, and sales of acid), Garry Cassidy -- Houston, Texas (smuggling smack)

Jim Peck -- San Antonio, Texas (smuggling grass),

Robert Spofford -- Denver (sales and delivery of speed),

Dennis McClure -- Los Angeles (possession of grass),

Tom Weis -- Los Angeles (possession of grass), and

Casey Mahoney -- Palo Alto (possession of grass) just want to thank you for keeping us informed on what's happening in the Bay Area. It's all so beautiful, just beautiful.

Quite a few of our friends realize we've been captured, but aren't aware of just how to get in touch.

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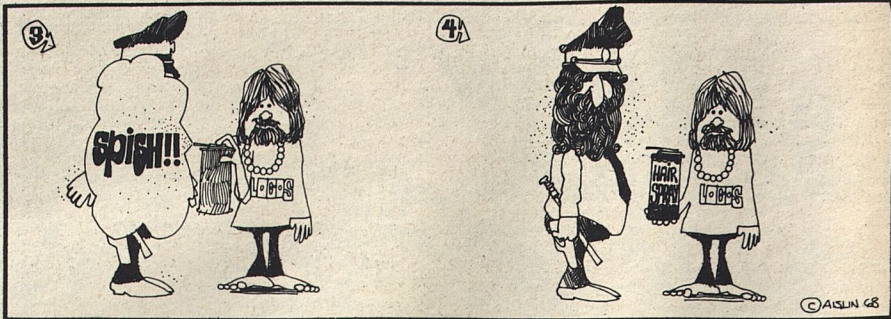
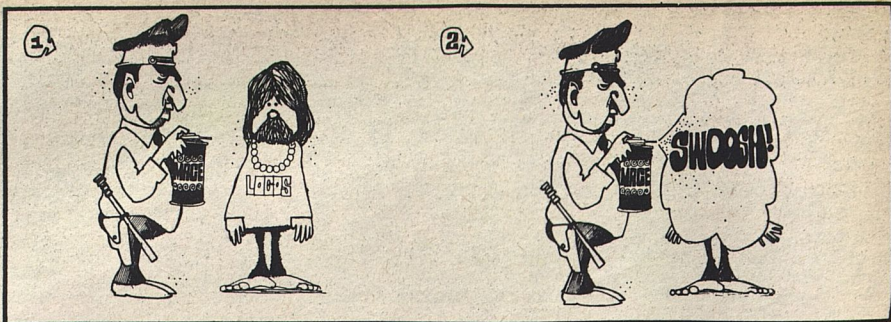

**WHERE? WHERE?**

**THE POLICE ESTABLISHMENT**

by William W. Turner. Putnam, 320 pages, \$6.95.

In Los Angeles a motorcycle officer stopped a white doctor whose car displayed a sign in favor of an open-housing measure. "I thought only niggers had those signs," he said.

In New York, a black man was speeding his pregnant wife to the hospital. A white policeman stopped him, pointed a gun at his head and, without a word, shot him to death.

In Oakland, a man ran away from the tavern pursued by the bartender shouting, "Stop! Robber!" A policeman took up the chase and, when the suspect failed to respond to a command to stop, shot him fatally. It was discovered later that the man had simply not paid for his drink.

Where does it end? Where does it begin? The President's Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice in its 1967 report found that "a significant number of officers engage in varying forms of criminal and unethical conduct" and that incidents of rudeness and physical and verbal abuse are widespread.

The simple fact is that most cops have a white middle-class morality which includes a potent dislike of black people, a distrust of liberals, and a point-blank hostility towards anything questioning their actions and beliefs (civilian review boards).

James Baldwin believes that the police "are present to keep the Negro in his place and to protect white business interests, and they have no other function."

Miriam Makeba says, "I don't see the difference between the police here and the police in South Africa. You hear them saying they shot somebody in self-defense. But like the South African police, they always aim to kill."

"The Police Establishment" is, as its dust jacket says, "a no-holds-barred expose" of the cops. Its author, William W. Turner, presently a Ramparts writer, knows what he's rapping about, since he's been an FBI agent.

He is not satisfied with only telling what he knows from his own personal experience. He digs up the records (Los Angeles: minorities -- 5% on police force, 40% of population; Oakland: Negroes -- 3% of cops, 25% of population), examines the opinions and actions of police commissioners (such as O.W. Wilson of Chicago, who, while modernizing the department and being known as a "progressive", still presented a solid front with his fellow officers in denouncing any criticism of the force), and gives numerous instances of police atrocities (a cop in Newark calmly shot a young Negro boy in the back for stealing a six-pack of beer).

Sure they protect us. But from what? Crime in the cities is not just crime but Negro crime. "Clamping down" and "Getting tough" means usually roughing up the blacks. Are we protected

against crime or, as Baldwin suggests, are we protected really against the Negro? And what form does this protection take?

The form is in large pirouettes of prejudice reinforced by frequent outbursts of fear. The New York Police Department habitually consigns its least desirable officers to Harlem. In Los Angeles, Chief Parker stated that some minorities are "not far removed from the wild tribes of Mexico" and steadfastly refused to meet with any of the Watts leaders during the rioting.

When Negroes march in Chicago, Mayor Daley concludes "many of the people who are marching are Communist," and the cops believe him. When San Francisco gets a Police-Community Relations Unit which is praised by the President, the Police department refuses to allot it sufficient money or men, and its officers sarcastically refer to the unit as the "Commie Relations Unit" and heap ridicule on its members.

Sure they protect us from the lawless (i.e. Negro). They also inflame minorities with their senseless brutalities. While it seems a sensible thing to have some sort of Black-White coexistence, it's difficult when the police want to preserve their ability to harass.

But they're not harassing needlessly, they say. They say that to work in a slum you have to get tough. And yet, after each riot -- after Watts and Detroit and Newark -- it turns out one of the major causes has been years of police

mistreatment.

So what do you do? Do you modernize the police force by raising salaries, getting in a better brand of officer, and hoping to get some understanding between cop and civilian worked out?

Try it! Every police force will be against it. They'll shoot down any attempts at mutual understanding (the civilian review board in New York) with a campaign aimed at the middle-class voters showing a white girl walking down a dark street under the message: "Support your local police."

They'll be in favor of higher salaries but the better brand of cop just won't come along because the powers-that-be are dedicated to keeping a nice (ugly) middle-class white morality in their cities.

Mr. Turner is a sharpshooting writer. He examines the ins-and-outs, the ups-and-downs of this segment of justice with a fine moral comb. He has the suggestions that would lead to a way out but he knows the difficulty in implementing them.

But time after time, he rams home the truths and the tragedies of this deadwood establishment that "presents a unified front in lobbying for more power and less outside control. Its principal objectives are to nullify Supreme Court decisions by legislation, legalize Big Brother devices in the interests of the 'crime war,' obtain more repressive laws, perpetuate the punitive theory over rehabilitation and become a national thought police system."

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# BOMBER BUMMER MAY BE A BOON

If you're in the Air Force and don't want to be, you may be able to Drop Out and have a revealing experience at the same time.

The Air Force, long accustomed to a morbid paranoia, has found another encroaching enemy.

LSD! A recently circulated directive to all Wing Commanders from the Chief of Staff dated 21 March 1968 and effective to "15 January 1969" tells the Junior Birdmen all about the hideous dangers of the chemical and the "fact" that "flashback" or "recurrent trip" is a dangerous side effect of acid.

They also relate some garbage about a "careful cytogenic investigation" which indicated that "100% of individuals having ingested single doses of LSD in excess of 300 micrograms manifested persistent chromosomal abnormalities."

They forgot to mention that Timothy Leary, who has ingested probably more LSD than anyone living, was found to have better than normal chromosomes (see BARB May 31).

The important part of the order is section (d) which states that "repeated and persistent use of LSD will be regarded as evidence of ... personality disorder which may render the member unfit for military service and thus subject to separation under appropriate administrative regulations."

The order indicates a particular preoccupation with "flashback" or "recurring trip" conditions. Indeed, they should dread the prospect of their flyboys having sudden fits of uncontrollable sanity.

Got the idea yet, men? In case you're slow at it the order warns that "... immature service members who may report such past contact for the purposes of avoiding specific duties or of obtaining separation from the Air Force should be carefully evaluated." And flash on this -- you, too, can turn on, tune in and drop out. Long live Leary!

## BLACKS SCORE A WIN IN BRUTALITY BEEF

"Oh shut up," the black man told the Mayor of Berkeley, "I'm going to finish what I set out to say."

The mayor shut up. The city council listened.

From midnight to 2:30 in the morning, the council listened as the Reverend Hazaiah Williams and a stream of black Berkeleys protested another classic example of police brutality in the ghetto.

In this case it was beating and macing of a 65-year-old woman, her daughter, and a young man who came to their rescue. This time the victims were Mrs. Willeta Smith, a long-time Berkeley resident, Harriet Smith, a former student body president at Merritt College, and Fred Smith, the newly elected student body president at Merritt.

By the end of the meeting, and it lasted until after 2:30 in the morning, these concerned black people had won two major concessions for themselves and for the citizens of Berkeley:

- An indefinite moratorium on the use of mace.
- A personal investigation of police brutality by a committee of the council.

The blacks waited with enormous patience for five hours before the city council would listen to them. The crowd, which approached a thousand in number during the course of the evening and had to move to the city auditorium, dwindled to a determined three or four hundred -- mostly black -- as such hot topics as street widenings and contract awards were discussed.

A number of times Mayor Wallace Johnson made references to the planned midnight cutoff time in an obvious attempt to discourage the impending confrontation.

His bluff was called by Sid Walton, Merritt College counselor, who took the microphone at midnight and told the council "we won't leave until this matter is heard." He vowed that the meeting would be kept in session "by any means necessary."

Mayor Johnson was about to take issue with Walton when Councilman Wilmont Sweeney interrupted to tell Walton that several members of the council had already decided to hear out the complaints of the citizens in spite of the mayor.

The two and a half hours that followed were filled with cries of rage from citizens who refused to accept the brutal behavior of the cops who beat the Smiths.

The Reverend Mance Johnson condemned the "blatant affront by whites with the power to demonstrate to the minority how powerless we are."

Reverend Hazaiah Williams said "these same policemen would not have moved against white women as they moved against these black women."

And at one point the outspoken minister looked at the smirk of

## PAROLEE TELLS HOW BULL BEGAN SAN Q RIOT

Dear Sirs:

First off, this is not a hate letter, quite the contrary. I read your July 12th issue and your article on and in support of the convict thing was telling it like it really is; I know cause I did 6 1/2 yrs. there. Things happened while I was there, like, remember the riot (so called) last year when the bulls lined the walls and got a chance to show off their sub-machine guns?

Yeah, well, they would (like) the public (to) believe that it was a race riot that started in the mess hall; true it did start in the mess hall, but a bull started it, a white bull; I saw what happened, he stuck his dirty finger in a black cat's milk "deliberately"; in prison you don't mess with a man's food, so the guy hit him.

Here's how they justified the race thing. Everybody was in the yard mingling together, they went into their Nazi storm trooper act, guns and all, and in that manner separated the guys, beating them with clubs; whites here, blacks over there, Mexicans over there; then, (ready?) took photos quickly not showing of course the bulls who kept them at bay with guns and clubs.

We are not mad dogs; we are people also, with feelings, perhaps we feel even more than the average person because we have been denied the right to feel. They would have us just "exist" for them. The more people they keep in prison the more money somebody makes.

I am on parole right now and if they knew that I had written this to you they would find a way to have me sent back; actually they don't even need a reason they just send you back. I know a guy who was sent back for a parole violation, (ready?) getting married.

I'm not jiving, check it. Ask any con or ex-con, or parole officer, you'll get the same answer. They can send you back, take more years of life from you, and here's what kills me, they don't even care, it's like our lives don't mean anything, never have and never will.

Thank you for the article, for what you are trying to do. If I had money I would send you some, sorry I can't cause I know you need it to carry on.

So I can only say thanks from the bottom of my heart for thinking of us as human beings.

## PEACE AND LOVE AND HARMONY

Free Church is having a service as a tribute to John Wesley Harding. It will be held Saturday night at 8pm at 2516 Durant. Songs composed by Bob Dylan will be sung by local musicians.

The community is cordially invited to come join in Peace, Love, and Harmony.

The sole purpose of the San Quentin Unity Day for Convicts is to focus public attention on the need for an immediate legislative investigation into the practices of the Adult Authority, the state agency which determines their fate.

The AA can arbitrarily decide an inmate's sentence, up to the maximum, and can snatch a parolee back behind the walls on a whim.

Warden Nelson on Wednesday told the inmates that they must choose between the "progress" that had already been made, and the chance of causing an incident.

Nelson was apparently referring to the "progress" resulting from a recent meeting of the Inmate Advisory Council with Assemblyman Craig Biddle and Alan Sieroty of the Criminal Procedures Committee and Raymond Proconier, Director of the California Department of Corrections.

SKY-PIE

At that meeting Biddle indicated that he would send someone to San Quentin to interview a "sample" of the inmates, as a prelude to a study projected for 1970-71.

Such pie-in-the-sky "progress" is precisely why the convicts decided to have a Unity Day to get the legislature to act at once. Prison conditions are inhuman right now.

The possibilities of an "incident" cannot be dismissed. Not only do many cons say that the January 18, 1967 San Quentin riots were instigated by the staff, but also many feel that squelching the August 3 Unity Day will cause inmate frustration to skyrocket. Some think it's deliberate.

If they are not even permitted to hold a completely peaceful protest which violates no rules, what recourse is left? Complete frustration can only erupt in violence.

TRANQUIL PLAN

Normally on Saturdays a voluntary lock-up is called after breakfast. Then inmates with job assignments go to work, and the rest have a choice of spending the day in their cells or going to a recreation area, such as the yard. Usually, only a few choose to go to their cells.

The tranquil plan for the August 3 Unity Day is for those with work assignments to go to work while all the rest of the inmates go voluntarily to their cells for lock-up.

But even that mild plan, which would place the inmates voluntarily in small cages where they could pose scant danger to anyone, is evidently too much of a threat to prison officials.

Since the cons decided to break no rules, many now expect the Warden to change the rules for them on Saturday.

If The Warden decides to cancel voluntary lock-up, almost all the men thwarted from having a quiet Unity Day will be gathered together on the yard, where trouble starting from any source can easily boil over.

If "Big Red" takes any such action, it will be obvious who is responsible for causing an "incident." The cons only intend to lock up quietly.

"RED" LIBERTARIAN

Earlier, Warden Nelson demonstrated his libertarian spirit by posting on the bulletin board in the main yard a copy of the July 12 BARB article which reported the forthcoming Unity Holiday.

Sources inside indicate that Nelson lamented he was unjustly accused of keeping a veil of secrecy

## WELFARE WORKERS REFUSE TO BACK THOUGHT CONTROL

Thought control in the state of California?

The effect of a recent order from the state Social Welfare Department, appears to have brought it closer, but a group of non-complying social workers say they're prepared to fight the order.

State Director of Social Welfare John Montgomery, issued an order on July 15 requiring social workers to submit confidential information regarding psychiatric patients' resumes with the name and social security number of the patient.

The information is supposed to be sent to Sacramento where it will be compiled on computers.

Some 450 social workers opposed to the idea have formed the Ad Hoc Committee for Patients' Rights to have the order withdrawn.

The order stands, but many of the social workers are simply ignoring it, David Aroner, a spokesman for the committee says.

"The problem is in terms of safeguards to information given to us in confidence by individuals," Aroner told BARB. "Just who has access to the computers?"

Dr. George David, a physician engaged in welfare work, says that the information on the tapes could be subpoenaed and used against the patient in a court of law.

The committee members maintain that Montgomery's order constitutes "invasion of privacy" protected by the 14th Amendment, and that it violates the social workers code of ethics.

It is also discriminating, they say, since those who would most likely have their psychic information stored on electronic tapes, would be the poor, the people who

can't afford private psychiatric care.

"There is a mixed pattern of resistance to the order," Aroner told BARB.

"Some people have officially closed out their community patients and work with them unofficially. Others are giving social security numbers by supplying all nines in place of the true number. Many people are violating the orders."

Last week, committee members met with director Montgomery in Sacramento seeking a moratorium on the order until safer means could be devised for gathering the data.

The committee was unsuccessful in its attempt, Aroner said, and succeeded only in obtaining a promise that no disciplinary action would be taken against those who had disobeyed the orders before the date of the meeting.

This implies, Aroner observed, that those who continue to disobey the order could be subject to dismissal.

The ACLU however, has already promised that it will defend anyone fired for defying the order, Aroner told BARB.

"People should be appraised that anything they may say to a social worker could be submitted to Sacramento and used against them in a law court," Dr. George David told BARB.

This, he says, depends entirely on the discretion of the individual social worker. Dr. David suggests that a patient who has anything confidential to say, should first inquire of his social worker to see if the information will remain that way.

Councilman John DeBonis and told him, "don't smile Mr. DeBonis, you are so rude I don't know if I can stand it."

Ruth Hagwood asked "the Jewish people in the audience: At what point should the Jews have revolted against Hitler?" Then she looked meaningfully at the Mayor and said, "We're not going to walk into any gas chamber."

Joseph Ross, the father of four children that Mrs. Willea Smith was babysitting at the time she was dragged from her home asked "what am I supposed to say to my children about the police when they see policemen breaking into a house, knocking down a door and mishandling women?"

Two of Ross's children apparently also received some mace in their faces in the room where the struggle with the Smiths took place. As Ross was protesting this, Councilman DeBonis got up and walked out. He spent the next fifteen minutes lurking in the wings of the auditorium.

Alfred Smith recalled a time in Berkeley's history when the Berkeley police would walk women home at night instead of macing them. "We must have a police force that respects the whole community," he told the council.

Edith Austen asked the council, "who do I call when I find myself in a situation like this -- the police? -- I want to know." Councilman DeBonis had returned by now.

Councilman DeBonis: "Call the police."

Austen: "So the police can beat my tail?"

DeBonis: "Oh, nonsense."

A young man, Lauren Jones, told the council: "the black brothers -- they tired of this shit. Where I come from shit don't matter. A white man only understands the barrel of a gun in his

damned face."

Mrs. Sonja Gamel said that she often used Mrs. Smith as a babysitter and that the children the police abandoned in the house might, on another day, have been hers. "What can you do for me to insure that when I go to work from 8 to 5, that my children will be safe?" No one on the council answered.

Throughout the early morning hours, Mayor Johnson tried to put a cork in the muzzle of the protest by asking that the city manager read a report from Chief Beall which would be "so salutary" that it would make the demonstrations of citizen anger unnecessary.

This report, when finally read by the city manager, proved an anemic confession of guilt without a shadow of apology.

Using the royal "our", Chief Beall's statement admitted that "It is our opinion that under these circumstances the chemical Mace should not have been used," and "In our opinion the officer was wrong" for breaking the telephone over Harriet Smith's head.

This was quite a bit less than the black people before the council expected in the way of redress.

What they did expect was presented in a list of six demands by Fred Smith:

suspension of the officers involved, dropping of the charges against the Smiths, a personal investigation by the city council, no more use of mace, establishment of a civilian review board over the police, and a mechanism for handling citizens complaints about city services like the cops.

Councilman Ronald Dellums, visibly angered by the treatment human beings had been receiving from the cops, tried to get the council to pass several of these reforms.

"It's time to tell the police department that we will no longer accept this kind of behavior," he said.

In spite of the machinations of Wallace Johnson to move the meeting on to other business, Dellums succeeded in part at least. His motion that the use of mace be suspended indefinitely was passed.

This left DeBonis muttering angrily into his microphone about "the law of the jungle" and "you people" and "mob rule."

The council also formed an investigatory committee of Councilman Brown, Dewey, DeBonis, and Dellums that will personally look into the Smith beatings.

The other demands were not met.

# RIDICULES CHICKEN THIEVERY CHARGE

The Berkeley Police Dept., in maintaining "law and order", has heroically nabbed two more dangerous "criminals" lurking on the streets of our fair city, a little "before supper," Tuesday.

According to one source, dauntless fuzzi singlehandedly apprehended two 14 year old black boys induced a confession from them, then had them booked for chicken thievery.

Mrs. Cecelia Wyse, however, mother of one of the boys arrested, is a little skeptical about officer's bravery.

Mrs. Wyse is a teacher's aide at Jackson School and has been a resident of Berkeley for 25 years.

She told BARB that the two boys were simply standing by a fence near their home looking at a chicken. Her son hopped the fence at one point, fondled the hen a little, then put it down, and hopped back over the fence.

The boy, Mrs. Wyse admits, digs chickens.

When the cop arrived a few minutes later, he asked the boys what they were doing. They told him "Standing by the fence," she said.

The cop then placed the boys' hands on the roof of the squad car, frisked them, handcuffed them, and took them to the station.

There, Mrs. Wyse says, they forced a confession from the two and booked them for the theft of the chicken.

"They frightened the boys to death and made them say they were going to take the chicken," she said.

Ired by the incident, Mrs. Wyse went down to the police station Wednesday seeking an explanation.

"What is the purpose of searching and handcuffing a 14-year old boy?" Mrs. Wyse asked the person to whom she had been referred. "You're giving a child a criminal record for looking at a chicken!"

"That is the law," said The Man.

# ROUGH RIDDEN IN RENO

RENO (UNS) -- Snide cops have been busting dozens of hip residents here, telling their victims they were being arrested for "breathing the air" or "walking on the left side of the street."

At the station, the charges transform themselves into "disorderly person" or "jaywalking" -- in a town where drunken superstraight tourists spill into the neon streets.

Over 50 such arrests are estimated during the last three weeks.

In some cases, a short stay in jail includes a haircut due to "sanitary provisions" in jailhouse rules.

When asked about uncut chicks' hair, one cop retorted "you're splitting words with me," and ended the conversation abruptly.

Until recently, the Reno scene has been blossoming with relatively few hassles, although communications within the community are still imperfect. The local hip newspaper, "Love," has seen five issues, but has not yet welded a "we" community.

Communication is somewhat hampered by the police, who break up clusters of folk who gather in downtown Arlington Park, warning them against obstructing something or other.

In response to such treatment, members of the hip community are planning a Day of Shame in Reno this weekend, probably Sunday. Plans include a courtroom trial skit, in which the people will be tried for the fake offenses initially mentioned by the busting cop.

Attempts to raise bail funds are neatly curtailed here. In Reno, soliciting funds for anything without a license ist verboten.

# NEWTON RALLY

There will be a massive rally of support for Huey Newton, Minister of Defense for the Black Panther Party, 1 p.m. Sunday, July 28.

The rally will feature nationally known leaders of the black and brown liberation struggles and the anti-war movement. Scheduled are Stokely Carmichael, Reies Tijerina, Eldridge Cleaver, Bobby Seale and TV star Ivan Dixon of "Mission Impossible," as well as spokesmen from the Peace and Freedom Party and SDS.

The program also includes as representatives of black culture, dancers, musicians and actors. Location of the rally is DeFremery Park at 16th and Adeline, Oakland.

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# WHY WHITEY MUST STOP BIRTH CONTROL

Wednesday night, July 24, it is reported that THREE blacks (count them, 1 - 2 - 3) caused...

"The entire Ohio National Guard to report to their armories" --

"Police used Brink's armored cars" in Cleveland --

"Four policemen (or more) killed plus 11 policemen wounded" --

"Raging Gun Battles ... Supermarket burned to the ground ... cars set on fire" --

"Mayor Carl B. Stokes tells of warnings last week violence would happen in Cleveland and other cities" --

Three blacks (count them, 1 - 2 - 3).

(The figure of three blacks has been escalated to the stupendous amount of seven - "Tuesday night's violence was an isolated (sic) event instigated by a seven-member black nationalist gang, all of whom were either killed or captured.")

(Press reports continue to show how this perfect example of guerrilla warfare is being hid from the American people: "Both Mayor Stokes and an aide maintained that the entire gun battle . . . lasted only one half hour.

("But a Cleveland Plain Dealer reporter on the scene said snipers held off police for four hours and that the battle was so furious that wounded and dying policemen could not be retrieved by their comrades.")

Okay -- if three men can cause all THIS, just what will happen when 3,000,000 blacks do the same thing, huh?

Military experts? You will fuck up just as you have in Vietnam, and especially, in Saigon.

Multiply three million by 20,000 National Guards, and you get 60,000,000,000 (sixty billion), National Guardsmen to "maintain law and order," for if it takes twenty thousand to control three, it will take sixty million to control three million. (Robinson's Law of Universal Linearity? -- Ed.)

Lots of luck, boys. There's heavy breathing in the Pentagon's "Control Center" tonight!

Meanwhile, back in Moscow, there's lots of puffing in THEIR control center, too. "For the first time in memory", a civilian call-up has been ordered for the Red Army. Also, "trucks and vehicles, needed in the harvest, are being taken" for what is sometimes called "military maneuvers."

If this is scaring the Czechs, they don't show it. A newspaper in Prague (the Prague BARB?) had a cartoon of a Russian tank on top of a girl in bed, caption reading: "My, how friendly you Russians are."

If there is any sense at all to Russian activity, other than sheer political paranoia, then it is this: the Russians see the war ending in Vietnam THIS YEAR, so --

What's to become of the 500,000 American GI's in Vietnam?

Answer: they will move "into" Europe.

Sgt Pepper feels that this, too, is political paranoia. But then, maybe they know something we don't know. (Is there a psychiatrist in the house?)

Last week, we left the South Vietnamese Army scared shitless on top of a mountain while the NLF held the base (we had flown our loyal allies in by helicopter).

Clark Clifford was in Saigon to "prepare" the South Vietnamese Army to "assume a greater share of the fighting", and we ended with "Hey, Clark old boy -- how are you going to get them off that there mountain?"

This week we got the answer: we flew in more helicopters and took them off. Who has "assumed the greater share of the fighting"? Good old American GI's!

Clark Clifford, Sec of Defense, attorney for General Electric and other business-giants in America, also flew back home. He had nothing but praise for our "loyal South Vietnamese."

As long as we have American boys to get killed, General Electric et al will never never never have to worry (excepts worry about the blacks, of course).

# FROM ALAMEDA COUNTY HOW FAR TO ALABAMA?

"We're trying to project into the courtroom what the black liberation movement is saying on the outside," Huey Newton's defense attorney Charles Garry told BARB this week.

Outside, BARB talked to Kathleen Cleaver, the only Panther leader who has not yet been threatened with prison by the white establishment.

"Huey Newton is being tried by a civilian court that acts as if it's military. But the civilian court has no authority over him," she told BARB.

"Who is the aggressor and what is the justification?" she asked.

If, as the Panthers say, the black ghetto is a colony struggling to throw off the shackles of the white mother country, then Huey P. Newton cannot legally be tried by the Alameda County Court. He is a warrior for the black nation, their captured Minister of Defense, and therefore a prisoner of war.

As the trial of Huey Newton fin-

heavy guard as they consider the Newton case. He is accused of killing a member of that very guard, which is so visibly "protecting" the jurors -- and it is no secret that the Oakland police militia wants Huey Newton dead.

Would anyone deny the subtle pressure on the jury of its own protectors? --

Last week, after listening to an impressive battery of UC sociologists testify that present jury selection disproportionately favors whites, and that whites are inherently racists, Judge Friedman denied the defense motion to expel the entire master panel jury.

The judge denied the motion without comment. In Alabama a similar action might prompt the presiding magistrate to wink at the prosecutor. But no such overt action was noted in Alameda.

"It's a joke," Kathleen Cleaver said after she was able to get into the courtroom twice. "It's as if Judge Friedman had been told what to do, denying Garry's

put Huey Newton to death."

On Tuesday, prospective black juror Jewel Liggins testified that he had never heard of Huey Newton or the Black Panthers, and that he was not opposed to the death penalty.

Assistant District Attorney Lowell Jensen immediately dismissed the juror with one of his peremptory challenges, which requires no reason.

Garry was to his feet quickly. "Let the record show," he said, "that Mr. Liggins is a black man."

In Alabama, not many black men are selected for jury, maybe because there, too, voter registration lists are used. In Alameda, of the black men who are put on the jurors list, most are immediately challenged and dismissed.

Throughout the jury-selection procedure, prosecutor Jensen appeared to remove those people who seemed sympathetic to blacks or who oppose the death penalty.

ishes its second week, all attempts by Charles Garry and the defense to get a fair trial have been thwarted.

On April 15 when the trial began, Judge Monroe Friedman stated, this is Alameda County, not Alabama.

Kathleen Cleaver, however, said, "The courthouse is an indication of the police state we live in."

She pointed to armed guards at every door, police in the elevator, one door in and one door out of the courtroom."

She told how every black person who goes up to the door of the courthouse is stopped, questioned, harassed -- even the people who work there."

To even the casual observer, the fortress of the Alameda County Courthouse appears to be more of a military post than a public civic building.

The police -- the heavily-armed, trained militia which enforces white justice in the black ghetto colony -- are everywhere in the courtroom building. Who is being protected from whom?

It is easy to imagine the effect on the court and jury of their

motions."

On Monday of this week, Judge Friedman denied a defense motion to have Newton's former felony conviction excluded from the murder trial on the grounds that it would prejudice the jury.

In so doing, he said in presence of the prospective jurors, that they could take prior conviction into consideration when evaluating testimony, and give it "great weight, little weight, or no weight," to which Garry strenuously objected.

The defense is taking the appeal to the US Supreme Court, and if it fails there, Newton will AUTOMATICALLY be tried for first degree murder.

In Alabama, a sly smile may have wrinkled an old judge's face while engaged in similar proceedings. In Alameda, everyone keeps a straight face.

"The prosecution is overtly racist," Kathleen Cleaver went on. "In jury selection he peremptorily dismisses black people first." The other people he challenges, she said, are the "humane people," those who say they don't believe in capital punishment. Jensen is doing everything he can to

As the process is continuing through its second week, the defense is objecting to prospective jurors for just the opposite reasons.

"We're trying to get the white racists off the jury," Charles Garry told BARB. "Every white man has some racism, but he at least has to be aware of it."

At BARB press time, the battle inside the courtroom for the seating of jurors continues. The defense has 10 more peremptory challenges -- the prosecution eleven.

More than 50 prospective jurors have already been rejected. Of the dozen tentatively seated, one black man remains -- David B. Harper, a former Air Force officer, presently a bank official.

Outside, the Panthers have deserted the stone fortress and have discontinued daily demonstrations around the courthouse. They have gone out into the community to "educate."

But the distant sounds of "Free Huey" can still be heard throughout the City of Oakland, throughout Alameda County, and by now, probably throughout Alabama.

# BERKELEY C of C SEES A SPECTRE

The Berkeley Establishment raised the cry of "Resistance" Thursday morning just before press time, amidst the click of coffee cups and the raised finger dunking of donuts.

The Mayor of Berkeley was up front before a beefed-up Chamber of Commerce indoor rally.

The talk was of "they" and "we," the "lynch mob" on the streets of Berkeley versus the businessmen of Berkeley ("this admirable group of Americans here today"). The setting was the sort of sedate, slightly shabby Shattuck Hotel.

Invitations sent out to a select list (not including BARB) announced: "The recent riots on Telegraph Avenue and University Avenue are only the beginning -- unless responsible citizens demand law and order, and an end to mob rule!"

Between the Mayor and the money men who control all of the power and the police in this city there ran waves of fear. Scare-vibes.

To show the Chamber their fears were well-founded, Mayor Wallace Johnson read them the latest request for a permit from the Berkeley Resistance and the Student Communications Network, in the name of the Berkeley Commune.

It asks that Telegraph Avenue be closed August 3, 10, 17 and 24, for a street dance "and celebration of life on the Sabbath."

Then the Mayor lit into the street people represented by these groups: "They use such terms as THE PEOPLE because they want us to believe that THEY are the people." Us and they. Lines drawn.

The Mayor didn't neglect to spice up his little speech with a little sex. He knows how to arouse his own, even if he has to put it down, you see.

For instance, he described a "disgusting" scene: "There on Telegraph, there was a naked man sitting there with his legs spread apart beside a woman who is simply ignoring him. I find this disgusting." Of course, Mayor, nobody likes to be ignored.

Then he described a Barricade illustration: "Two mice having sexual intercourse. This is the tone. I want the ladies here to know." Now the ladies know. Mice ball.

And then President Johnson (as he's called in the council chamber) showed further how wonders never cease. Referring to the alien term -- commune -- until I read it in the BARB, I never thought I'd be a reader of the BARB, but you have to read their own stuff to know what's going on.

Hello, Mayor Johnson? Would you care to score the BARB?

The Mayor drew other lines. Speaking of the black people who gathered before the City Council on Tuesday night to protest the police beating of the Smith household -- a brutality admitted by the Chief of Police himself -- the Mayor said:

"The group of people who were trying to pressure the Council this last Tuesday night were in a large group right down in front. The more normal people were spread out through the auditorium."

Those in front at that meeting were almost 100 percent black people.

Downtown Merchants Association president George Jelten later added his opinion of the citizens who sought redress from the Council.

Noting that the Tuesday night meeting lasted until 2:30 in the morning, he told the Chamber that he went home at 12:45 because, "We have to go to work the following day, the other faction does not." Maybe he could help find them work.

To deal with "them," "there has to be unity among the business community -- geographically and otherwise," the Mayor declared.

Further, the Mayor felt, the businessmen need to support the

# LEAVENWORTH GRAD TELLS HORROR TALE

(NOTE: Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas, May 17, 1967 -- March 5, 1968. Pete Hepple did his time because of an attempted escape from the Army stockade at Ft. Benning Georgia where he was awaiting a Courts Martial for AWOL.

Pete enlisted in the Army Sept. 1966 knowing that he would go to jail instead of performing military service. He had, however, the need to 'do his thing' while he was still as young as possible.

Pete thought of refusing induction after being drafted or refusing an order in the Army; both could have netted five years in prison. He finally decided that by getting into the stockade he could attempt to escape. Result: one year maximum sentence and a BCD.

Following is Pete's story. A story of 10 months of living in filth and brutality, guard encouraged riots and, from time to time, human shit in the food).

After being in the stockade at Ft. Benning since January 1 (great way to begin the new year) I finally arrived at Leavenworth on May 17, 1967. The prison itself is right out of the movies: eight stories tall with eight 'spokes' coming off the central roundabouts where the main guard station is.

Inside the cells go up the walls with no floors in the eight story center of the wings.

There are about 1300 men (all military) in the prison. Half or more were black. This resulted in extensive 'race' riots. Although they actually got started from acts of forced homosexuality and the guards playing the whites against the blacks.

The guards deal and/or withhold dope, guns, knives and money to work up trouble between the inmates. The clothing and the prison itself are left in filthy condition. They 'wash' the clothes but they

always stink.

There are large rats and literally thousands of cockroaches in all of the cells. It's even worse in the cement stalls of disciplinary segregation. They are solid cement cells with a cold slimy cement slab for the bed and a hole in the floor as the toilet. I spent 6 or 8 weeks in segregation during the 10 months in Leavenworth.

All of the food is cooked by the prisoners. Once in a while as protest or something the cooks put, as I call it, homo sapien defecation in the food. Once that I remember it was in onion soup which made it hard to tell. Some of the men actually ate the soup.

The toilets in each cell were corroded and really filthy, although the showers were more or less clean. There are only 10 showers for the 3-400 men in each wing.

During my 10 months in Leavenworth I heard of at least 10 men who were beaten by the guards. But once I actually saw 8-10 guards attack one man in his cell and then drag him off to segregation. He stayed there 3½ months being fed only boiled carrots, potatoes, and cabbage -- the usual diet.

One guy was beaten in a stockade in No. Carolina. He had both legs broken and some other injuries. Anyway, he was put in Leavenworth while ACLU was suing the Army for damages.

He later went insane and did things like wipe his ass with a letter from his wife. He would always throw his food on the floor and then just play with it. They only beat him some more when he wouldn't sweep it up. He was so sick he didn't even know how to use a broom.

I had heard of the movement before I went into the army and while I was in Leavenworth. Now that it's over I want to tell everyone what I know. The prisons are terrible places and people have to realize that.

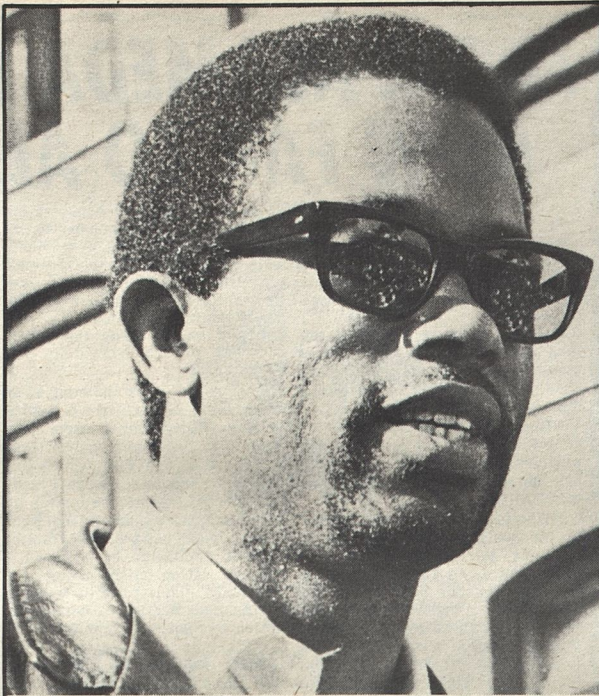

NEW YORK July 24 -- The Black Panther Party today announced their intention of asking the United Nations to send observers into Black America to supervise a plebiscite which will allow Black people in this country to determine their own destiny.

NGO status is granted to "Non-

Cleaver said he and other Panthers had met with the Cuban and Tanzanian delegates.

The Panthers put out this word at a press conference attended by the entire Panther Steering Committee. It was held in a building across the street from the UN.

## LAWYER SUES FOR PRESIDIO 'SNEAK'

What ever happened to the nine servicemen arrested in the 'chain-in'. The ones who declared themselves resigned from their various services and chained themselves to different clergymen?

If the Army has its way, the answer will never be known.

One of the Army privates, James Seymour, is bringing suit against the monolith for denial of his right to counsel.

In a brief filed with the Federal District Court, Gerard Glass, attorney for Seymour, described how he was initially denied permission to consult with his client at the Presidio immediately after the arrest.

Glass was told to come back two days later at the same time and he could see his client. He extracted a promise from the brass hats that Seymour would not be moved until he could consult with him.

At the appointed hour Glass showed up at the Presidio.

The desk zombies told him that his client had been shipped to Fort Ord three hours before.

Glass then filed suit in his client's behalf for 100 thousand dollars damages. The defendants are the US and three officers. Now, what about the other eight?

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# CURFEW UNDER LEGAL ATTACK

BERKELEY (SCN-LNS) — A claim for \$500,000 damage for false arrest on a charge of curfew violation was made this week against the City of Pittsburg, County of Contra Costa, the Contra Costa County Disaster Office and its Director, Will H. Terry, Jr.

The lawsuit has important implications for the legality of police and governmental actions taken last month by the City of Richmond and early this month under Berkeley's 1951 "Civil Defense and Disaster" Ordinance 3216NS.

The recent use of "state of emergency" proclamations in Berkeley, Richmond and Pittsburg, California, may be unconstitutional under state law.

Filing the claim on behalf of Jesse Nathaniel Davis, a black youth from the El Pueblo district, Berkeley attorney Donald K. Gayden points out in his brief "that Contra Costa Ordinance Section 3105 (a) is invalid and unconstitutional in that the State of California has preempted the field of regulation of disaster preparedness and relief and, further, has reposed in the Governor a non-delegable power to proclaim a state of extreme emergency or a state of disaster."

Never greatly publicized and since eclipsed in the public consciousness by police-community conflicts in North Richmond and Berkeley, the Pittsburg Emergency Proclamation of April 16 involves the call-in of over 120 police from at least 7 agencies to seal off the 5-block nonincorporated minority housing area of El Pueblo, the imposition of a 7 pm to 6 am curfew, prohibition of movement without special passes, searches by the police — without warrants — not only of automobiles but of homes, and confiscation of "all weapons."

Overt disturbances in Pittsburg began at the high school April 5 after Martin Luther King's assassination. Pittsburg High authorities suspended 45 students, recommending 16 of them for expulsion.

Attorney Gayden's fight with the authorities on behalf of the students' constitutional rights succeeded in obtaining a restraining order on April 17.

In response to community hostility, the Contra Costa Sheriff's Department sent in massive police force.

Gayden has already won on a demurrer to the charge against Davis, but Judge Finstermacher did not rule on the constitutional issues, so the Pittsburg authorities have recharged Davis under a slightly different portion of the same law.

The authorities now have 45 days to answer the \$500,000 claim, or, if it is denied, Gayden will file public suit.

He condemned fellow members of the City Council for wanting to suspend the two cops involved in the Smith beating, pending the forthcoming investigation of the incident. This was, in his opinion, a prejudgment of the case.

Then he stated, "Maybe one of the men is completely innocent -- which he is! . . ."

For such superb titillation the Chamber gave the Mayor a standing ovation.

Then it unanimously adopted a resolution from the Downtown Merchants Association that declared support of the City's present ordinances, "establishing policy regarding the use of public streets, sidewalks, and other public places," and support of the City Council and City Manager "with every resource at our command."

# THIRD MAN TELLS HOW NARK TRAP KILLED TIM

The man who got away from the scene of last week's narkbust shooting at Telegraph and Ashby called BARB before he turned himself in to the police.

Tim Conely was shot and killed by narcotics agents during the set-up Wednesday, July 17, at Si's Charbroiler. Conely allegedly opened fire on them.

BARB's caller, who identified himself as "the buddy of the guy who was in that shoot-out Wednesday," had a different impression.

He said he had recognized a red-headed man in the Si's set-up as a notorious "ripper" -- a person who arranges a dope deal and then robs the dope from the dealer.

"So when we saw him (the ripper) and guns were pulled we thought we were being ripped," the caller said.

"I shouted to Tim, 'We're being ripped, Tim!'"

"Tim jumped out (of the car), pulled a gun, and yelled, 'Hold it!' and I don't believe he fired,"

BARB's caller said.

At that moment the plainclothed narks cut down Tim Conely with fatal gunfire.

"I don't think Tim knew they were police," the caller stated. "I think he thought they were trying to rob us."

He said that Conely was not known among his associates to carry a gun. No report made public to date indicates that the narks identified themselves as police before opening fire.

The caller said that, after the shooting, people in the neighborhood gave them refuge as the police combed the block. "The people were beautiful," he said.

"I want to identify the guy who set it up. It was Harold Scott -- he has red hair -- he's ripped people before. He's known in Oakland as a ripper."

The caller said he would probably turn himself in. Later that weekend a William M. Berg gave himself up to police as the missing third man at the Wednesday shooting scene.

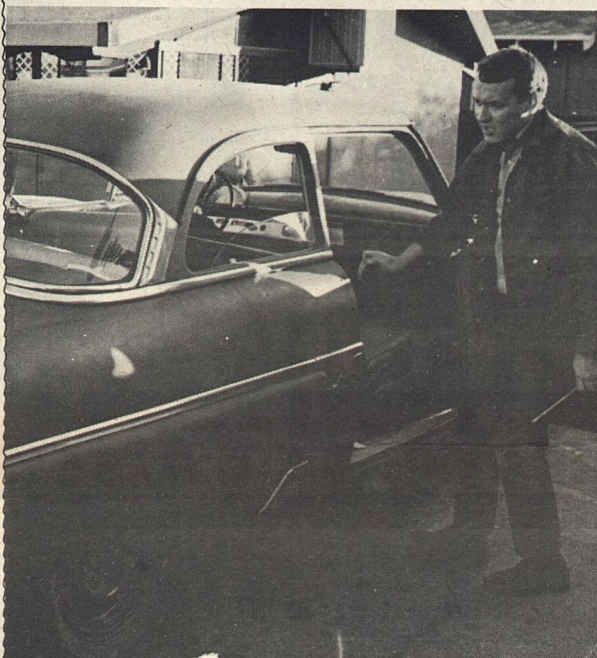

# RICHMOND BOYCOTTERS OUT TO BUCK BIRCHERS

"We will persist until we get some justice for blacks," Julius Thomas, a representative of the Richmond Boycott Committee told BARB Wednesday night.

"We hope to go out in full force Friday and Saturday."

The Committee has been picketing black-patronized stores like GallenKamps, Pennys, and Macy's in an effort to gain merchant pressure on the Richmond Police

to desist from racist behavior.

This weekend they hope to expand their efforts to include a larger number of merchants. In particular they wish to affect the business of those 133 dealers who signed the recent Birch Society petition to the city council which gave the Richmond Police the right to shoot for reasons other than in self-protection.

The demands the Committee has made of the merchants include: black police for the black community, a black man to fill the current city council vacancy, reenactment of the short-lived landmark law that allowed police officers to shoot only in self-defense, an end to police harassment of the black community, more black police, a more representative government for Richmond, the replacement of Police Chief Murphy and a share of police administration given to a black man, and true justice for the poor and not just the property taxpayers.

# OKAY, IT'S STUPID, SO GO ON AND REPEAL IT

In what may be memorable honesty, Attorney General Ramsey Clark admitted this week at a Washington, D.C. meeting of the National Co-ordinating Council on Drug Abuse Education and Information, that laws for which there is no strong respect are unenforceable.

Telling this body of medical, pharmacy, law and public health organization representatives that youth wants facts he went on record as saying that "it is impossible to enforce a law people don't believe in, where there is a disagreement as to truth."

This much we know even if we didn't read our local daily. What is surprising is that it took the New York Times Tuesday edition to reveal that it "is believed" that Clark referred to "mood altering drugs like amphetamine and barbiturates, psychedelics like LSD and STP, opiates and marijuana."

"It is impossible" Clark said, to control "abuse" without scientific research and public education as to the dangers. "Failure of one means failure of all."

Adequate enforcement must come from research leading to FACT and ultimately to relevant law, he continued (One law that keeps cropping up is taxing dope like it was a real live business.)

In ten years science will come up with 100 new dangerous drugs, he said. The goal of course is to be ready for them. Surgeon - General William H. Stewart has pointed out "marijuana research is in its infancy." Its long term effects of course are only known to heads.

"It is not enough to hurl alarms; there are too many gaps in our drug knowledge," was the word at the meeting.

The only thing that the New York party has is an alliance with the Panthers, but it was the West Coast branch that earned it. New York PFP nominated Eldridge Cleaver for the Presidency, but when I picture the P & F in the same room with the Panthers I see them as fight managers who have the next Black heavyweight champion of the world under contract, with no fists of their own to slug with.

There was a struggle over the Vice Presidential nomination. The party chose an upper-New York state college professor over Jerry Rubin.

Prof. Douglas Dowd stands for the type of politics that, although radical sounding, communicates itself in the manner of the society it is trying to destroy. In this approach you wear suits, sip cocktails, speak learnedly, and cause no violence to either property or person. This is a splendid bullshit.

The manner and style communicates message, and in the case of the college professor the message is middle class and careerist, and so is the society that it will sustain.

Jerry Rubin's style is sloppy and absurdist; he rarely says anything "rational" and when he does he feels guilty, it is a manner and style that challenges the bourgeoisie from its foreign investments to its pay toilets and is in every sense confrontational. The only career this style smacks of is one of a full-time revolutionary, a career that throws cocktails rather than sipping them.

Peace and Freedom, reeling from the shock of having to choose a black ex-con bad-assed revolutionary and desperate to get an attache case into respectability-land, picked Dowd.

Jerry decided to run for the Vice Presidency after Eldridge Cleaver suggested the idea. Although opposed to the traditional left-wing use of electoral politics, Jerry went into the convention suggesting that PFP put out comic books for kids, tour the country with a rock group and guerrilla theater, organize disruptive demonstrations on Election Day throughout the world against the American elections, appeal to high school and college students as the main constituency and use the electoral campaign to organize a white revolutionary movement.

"You have to nominate candidates who live the revolution, whose very existence embodies rebellion against America," Jerry told the PFP convention.

"Peace and Freedom has to become the party of the people in the streets, people in jail, people fighting the cops. P&F has been buried in paper, offices and bureaucracy."

A lot of the young independents in the party were for Jerry and they put together a lot of passionate rhetoric and 40 votes (one third). They told the convention of their fantasies, passions and dreams, but the party told them to get a college professor on the ballot.

In the Democratic Party industrial workers go out and campaign for the guy they work for, and who pays their salary; in the Peace and Freedom party students go out and campaign for the professor who grades them.

To show that New York Peace and Freedom doesn't take Black self-defense too seriously they nominated a pacifist, David McReynolds for the US Senate, who takes no sides on Vietnam (though he is for immediate withdrawal of troops) and who a week before called the Cleaver candidacy a joke.

Unless the National Convention of the Peace and Freedom Party comes up with someone for the Vice Presidency who can speak to the whites who are going into the streets all over America, the way the Panthers speak for the Blacks, the party is going to be a pushover; George Wallace will smash it running on the laundry ticket.

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# GRASSROOT MEET SHOWS ROOTS GO FOR BEST SOIL

Two years ago, California Democrats had a horror of splitting their vote.

Today, they don't give a damn. This was the message given to 30 delegates to the Democratic National Convention at a "Grassroots Platform Hearing" Saturday at the Hilton Hotel in San Francisco.

He said, "The draft is slavery, it encourages our foreign policy in Vietnam and elsewhere, brutalizes our youth, and encourages violence inside the United States." The 18-year-old-vote got quite a push.

At the "Foreign Policy" panel, a Democrat pointed out that a cease-fire will "never be achieved" as long as "United States policy is linked to anti-communist governments all over the world."

He also appealed to Democratic candidates "not to use peace as a smokescreen just to get elected."

# COMMUNE STRIKES FEAR IN CHAMBER'S HEART (?)

The band of loosely affiliated street people known as the Berkeley commune is giving more ulcers to Berkeley's established elite.

The Chamber of Commerce, with Mayor Wallace Johnson and Councilman John De Bonis, met Thursday morning to discuss how to deal with the Telegraph Avenue people. (See story elsewhere this issue.)

While the pressed suits are fighting panic, Berkeley's street people are experimenting with varying success with their new form of non-organization.

Links are being forged with the Haight Defense Group and the Diggers in San Francisco, and with the Up Against the Wall Motherfuckers and "Guerrilla," a street newspaper, in New York City.

For whatever motives. The Forum coffeeshop -- shut down by a completely successful street-people's boycott during last week -- The Forum is being very cooperative with the Commune's requests.

According to voices from the streets, The Forum has offered room on its terrace for use during rain, and let's its back room be used for storage of Berkeley Commune equipment, and will let a colorful mural be painted on its blank, arched facade.

And will let space inside be used for music, poetry, and for showings of Newsreel's movie of the Berkeley Siege.

Last week 24 people were rousted from an abandoned house they were using as a crash pad. The house was University-owned. Several days later a different University-owned, abandoned house caught fire.

Police-type whistles were recently distributed for blowing each time the fuzz appear. After an opening orgy of whistle-blowing, the whistles soon began being used as intended.

The Berkeley Commune now has its own mimeograph, and is acquiring sound equipment to make music and speech freely audible on The Block on Telegraph.

(Last week's BARB told the street people's story of a Forum-strike leaflet of theirs being edited and deballed by the Young Socialist Alliance, who duplicated it. An irate YSA phoned to say that they published the street leaflet,

and then published another one, with the O.K. of the strikers.)

A rally of some 250 people last Thursday for Tim Conely, killed by narks last week during a set-up at Si's Charbroiler on Ashby near Telegraph, showed that friction can develop from the rubbing together of diverse, autonomous persons and groups.

In a reply of the night of July 4, some wanted to close the street, others didn't. They didn't.

Speakers each related Conely's slaying to his own thing - Huey Newton, Mafia/police control of drugs, and the continuing role of outside police in Berkeley.

When some unfamiliar people showed up at the rally with barricade materials and prefab banners, some thought they were agents provocateurs, i.e., police finks, and others thought they might be an unknown segment of the Berkeley Commune coming temporarily to the surface.

The recognition of new people as friend or foe remains an un-

solved problem for the Berkeley Commune in this Telegraph Avenue training ground for undercover phoneyers from a dozen agencies -- not a new problem -- but the loose clustering of special, independent groups provides a first safeguard against professional finks.

Careful selection of who does what when and where is becoming an important consideration for many of the street groups (like the Panthers' "no spontaneous riots", so if a group of agents decides to paint the UC Campanile, they may find themselves alone on the skirmish line when the overt police move in with flamethrowers.

The next Berkeley Commune action designed to strike terror into the hearts of the Chamber of Commerce is an open poetry reading Sunday, July 28, at the flower stand next to the Commune table in Cody's Plaza at Haste and Telegraph.

"The poet's platform is the garbage can," a street person said.

# A CANDLE FOR S.I.R

"Organized homosexuals have made San Francisco the 'gay capitol of the world' where it's respectable to do-you-r-thing-without people getting upset about it," a S-I-R officer said Wednesday night. It was the 4th Anniversary of the Society for Individual Rights.

Like most port towns, San Francisco was always liberal going back to the days of Emperor Norton. Maybe that's why SIR now has nearly one thousand members and an annual budget of over \$60,000.

Popping champagne bottles with a cop present SIR's birthday party was a hell of a lot different than the first organizational affair.

It was a tiny room in a corner of the Falstaff Brewery. It was a super-secret thing, founding members recall -- strictly underground. Everybody seemed scared, except several Episcopalian and Methodist ministers that were helping.

A revolution has occurred in

four years. Even the middle-class heterosexuals in the Sexual Freedom League admit being jealous of SIR. The gay kids now have their own large Community Center in downtown San Francisco, complete with a stage, dance floor, library, offices and kitchen.

"Largest homophile group in the country," said the New York Times. Look called SIR "most successful of all homosexual groups."

Strange thing about these gay kids is that they never have sex at their functions.

But, a gay boy can dance with another boy (if over 21) at SIR, or join a modeling group, Theatre, or even find out which politicians hate the homosexuals (i.e., Max Rafferty). The SIR Bowling group is so big it completely takes over an entire S. F. bowling alley (Park Lanes) every Thursday night.

Cops used to worry the fledgling organization. The fuzz, for example, four years ago raided a drag ball on New Year's Eve. They ignored attorneys (busted

them, too) who insisted it was a private affair.

Even that's changed. "In the last four years, not one arrest has been made in San Francisco for homosexual acts in private," according to Office Elliott Blackstone, a cop who even sponsors a Tenderloin club for transsexuals called COG, (Conversion Our Goal).

"These gay guys make dates at their parties, but never do their thing in public. Our (police) problems are with the homosexuals in the Tenderloin who hustle the straights and sailors. They get picked up, beaten, robbed, and sometimes murdered. The trouble is on the street, never at a SIR function," the cop said.

"Our society has a heterosexual fetish," said Dr. Earle Marsh, San Francisco Sex expert and Kinsey Institute consultant who addressed the SIR Anniversary party. "Freud is mainly responsible for the jibberish and nonsense that a man isn't mature if he screws

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# MISSION SWITCH BUZZIN'

The new Mission Area Switchboard opened last week with an already full schedule and bustling files.

The much sought after Communications Center is strategically located at 1045 Valencia, in the block between 21st and 22nd Streets, in the heart of San Francisco's Afro-Latin Community.

Even before the M.A.S. had a chance to announce an official opening date it was deluged with phone calls and visits from a number of organizers and representatives of various factions and levels of the ever struggling multi-ethnic neighborhood.

Asked for an explanation of the unexpected response, Sherry Riley, a wide eyed, young literary artist from Houston Texas, who was formerly with the Haight Ashbury Switchboard, commented on the lightning speed and reliability of the normal grapevine.

One group which recently plugged into M.A.S. as a base of operations goes under the blanket name of A.B.C.D. (Advisory Board of Consultants and Developers). It consists of several performers and entertainment promoters who have banded together to act as organizational trouble shooters. They hope to implement a Cultural Alliance for Progress, (C.A.P.), and establish a Living Art Workshop as accessible as pool halls on both sides of the bay.

Sherry feels the oppressed need for better communication and, she says, her friends agreed.

"It seems to me," she affirmed, "that a central clearing house for gathering and disseminating information would provide an answer to this problem." The rest didn't take long to settle. Before she knew it the constant ringing of the phone and door bell were her closest companions.

The main purpose of M.A.S. is to link up people who have services and ideas to offer, with those who need them. Some of the categories covered are political, legal, jobs, housing, events, medical, draft, education, transportation, economics, entertainment, and religion.

Services include taking messages and securing mail for people. Anyone who has special interests which he wishes to rap on should feel free to call 824-3563 or come into the office at 1045 Valencia.

Organizations listed so far are: WACO (Western Addition Community Organization), Black Man's Free Store, Martin Luther King School, E Cology Action Workshop, Peace and Freedom Movement.

## WATCH IT! YOU PASSED THE 'NO SMOKING' SIGN

Coming around a curve in Lagunitas (Marin County) you glance at another "No Smoking" sign by the roadside.

Only this one's different: it is in five foot high red letters and it dominates the front of a building that has flashes of bright color in the windows. It looks almost like the sign for a store.

It IS a store. A quick U-Turn brings you back to take a second look, assuming you're curious about things out of the ordinary.

And "No Smoking" isn't ordinary. It is the outlet for a wide assortment of hand-crafted goods, paintings, jewelry, and sculpture produced by independent artists up and down the San Geronimo Valley. It is also a print shop. It is also a boutique. It is also an underground cinema. It is also a working dark room.

"It is supposed to be a cultural center," Ray Muller, one of the three young men who started No Smoking tells me, "that is pretty much what the people in the area involved in the arts want it to be."

"All three of us in the shop are doing other things," Muller says, indicating his two partners, Lynn Dutra and Ed Munk.

"We've exhibited in galleries and gotten burned and we know other people who have too. We want a place where the people who exhibit know that everything is right up front and honest."

The people in the area who know Dutra, Munk, and Muller feel that the trio is as good as its word. A number of community members wander in and out regularly, in-

volving themselves in the project of getting the store-center going.

The colorful tissue collage ceiling is the result of volunteer labor by many local willing hands. A poet from the area spent several days decorating the counter "while stoned out of his head." Several rock groups participated free in the recent "grand opening" of the center.

So you can see, a lot of people are beginning to take that "No Smoking" sign seriously.

## CALL IT CONCERN

On that Wednesday, she was walking on Haight when she saw a cop chasing a kid. When he caught him -- when the kid was completely unresisting -- the cop clubbed him until he was bleeding. Many people watched this happen. Quietly. The chase, the clubbing, the blood. No one did anything. Quietly.

The cop dragged the boy to the patrol car. As he was passing Cynthia, she said quietly "You mother fucker." He turned around furious, grabbed her, handcuffed her, and told her she was under arrest.

She remained handcuffed in the police station for half an hour. The boy was gushing blood. Only later was he taken to Park Emergency Hospital. Cynthia learned from the boy that he had been taken for "doing his thing."

The Peace and Freedom Party announced this week it will hold a national convention on August 17 & 18 at the Michigan Union on the campus at Ann Arbor, Michigan.

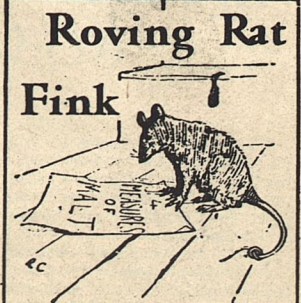
Other organizations with a "radical orientation" and an interest in witnessing the national convention are invited to attend as observers.

"The general purpose of the convention," The National Organizer states, "is to stimulate the development of a radical political party. Specifically, the convention will consider the politics of the 1968 presidential campaign, the nature of a national electoral organization of the left, and the selection of presidential, vice-presidential and cabinet position candidates."

The organizing of the convention will be the job of the National Organizing Committee, composed of two representatives from Calif-

ornia PFP, one from New York PFP, and one representative from the New Politics Party of Michigan.

The convention will also establish a new National Organizing Committee to continue the work of the interim committee.



You know the French folk song: "Sur le pont/D'Avignon/L'on y danse..."

And you know that item on the job questionnaires, "Have you ever been arrested?" with the rider "Disregard minor traffic violations."

In other words, if you got a ticket for running a red light, which you can kill people that way, just forget it. But if you were arrested for harmlessly sleeping on a park bench, you better mention it, or you're withholding information.

And we all know how the City of Berkeley recently opted to run itself many thousands of dollars into debt, do uncalculated damage to people, and give itself a major black eye, rather than let one city block be for one hour cut off from the Great Bay Traffic.

Time was that word "traffick" was never used except as a put-down. People spoke of "traffick with whores" or "traffick in contraband." But the implication sure has changed along with the spelling. Today, Traffic is treated as a major value for the society to uphold.

Understand, I am no more anti-automobile than anti-motorboat. Both are legitimate and useful means of transportation. But if I lived in a society where swimming was a rarely-granted privilege in order that the motorboats should not be impeded, it would make me raise a few questions too.

The National Rifle Association's pro-gun arguments are often pretty specious. So cars kill more people than guns; so cars are registered, why not guns? But they do point to a truth:

The society that was thrown into a major tizzy by half a dozen gun-killings is the very society that for fifty years has been conditioning itself to regard continual carnage on the highways as merely part of the human condition.

The truth is that we have reached the point that automobile traffic (and I exempt trucks and busses and refer only to what is ordinarily meant by "cars") is a plague and a pestilence and a major social problem. It is something that those in charge of the society should be trying to phase out, rather than setting up more and more facilities to accommodate it.

Thus, that week in June, if the Berkeley city council had been at all far-sighted, they would have welcomed the demonstrators' request for a permit as an excuse to make some people stay home, or walk, or take the bus; and thus to keep a few tons of high-powered scrap iron temporarily off the streets. But no...

The fact that I am a non-driver may possibly prejudice me. But equally, the facts mentioned above have a lot to do with the fact that I am a non-driver. --- R.R.

riot and using obscenity in a public place. Allowed to call home to speak to her two children (but not allowed to call a lawyer), she was booked, fingerprinted, and packed into jail for three days.

The following morning she was slugged up before Judge Constine (whose son recently was sliced for possession of pot). The Public Defender told her the court would drop the inciting to riot charge if she pleaded guilty to the obscenity thing. That way she would get only 15 days in prison.

At this point, she cried. And she refused.

The cop told the court that she was screaming mother-fucker many times. Then Cynthia was allowed to tell what had really happened. Afterwards, the Public Defender explained the rules of the game as "you're only making your case worse." Her case was scheduled later for a jury trial. The next day the public Defender told her that if she pleaded guilty to the obscenity charge she would only get a time-serve sentence.

She was released on her own recognizance. The American Civil Liberties Union refused to handle her case. A private attorney, because the trial is on his birthday, refused also (he told her that if she would plead guilty to the obscenity, she would probably get six months probation). Meanwhile the trial is for Wednesday, July 24 at 9:30 AM in Department 15. Meanwhile she has only the public defender.

"I had no control over what I did on Haight," she says now. "I'd try not to do it again. But I probably would. I can't be silent. You can't sit back and do nothing. Course I didn't do too much . . . ."

Not only is George a great filmmaker (Mike, you're great too, and Larry, in your own way, let me say), but his prose style is something else. With barbaric honesty he bares the secrets of his first full-length picture.)

Having just completed a feature film for Hawk Serpent Prod. Ltd, I feel compelled to write about the project at length (Most of my own projects deal with width as personified by "I Was a Teenage Rumpot.")

Hawk Serpent is a fictitious name for Walter Gutman, painter, writer, Wall Street financier, depraved drunkard who at sixty-five years old is still going strong in the area of on-the-rocks debauchery. ...Actually this is not true as the film unceasingly shows.

What is true is the realization that the picture is unceasing...being my first feature-length film with an international cast of circus entertainers and post-office clerks.

Filmed in Ektachrome EF with some 7255 spliced in, this picture was filmed up and down the East Coast from the trash piles of Massachusetts to the smoking pots of harmony-grits in Florida.

Featuring such big name stars as Iris Holtzman and her \$500 wig collection and Doris Zeitlin who recently sprained her back at a dude ranch, "Unstrap Me," is a day by day chronicle of today's elderly people and the motivations behind their reckless plunge into the psychedelic madness of erotica U.S.A.

For all of its 85 minutes, "Unstrap Me" will leave you breathless all the way to the urinals as you empty your bladder. The very beautiful Donna Kerners gets a lot of screen time as Tempy, the raven haired beauty with legs to watch. Her husband Hopeton has designed for her the most unusual collection of fashions for a film, fashions that have earned him the title of "Mister Shmata".

The rare Swedish beauty, Janine Solderjhelm, last seen on American Screens in the Czechoslovakian film: "Rebel Mohegan Squaw," gives a vividly etched portrayal of an actress trying to master her craft.

Also in the cast are Dorian West, whose apartment stinks because he owns a big dog that's untrained, and Lucinda Love, a striking creature of shimmering face creams and detachable human hair.

Based on a true-to-life experience of Walter Gutman and adapted to the screen by myself, "Unstrap Me" is the fusion of the Pepsi generation with the Schenley set, a distortion-free cohesion of myopic egos.

Film-makers who read this column may be interested to know that I edited my original in the kitchen and threw the unwanted scenes under the table. A workprint was not edited first because when I edit too much I get a blister on my thumb and also the fumes from an open bottle of film cement causes a tightening in my chest.

After editing the original I always clean the film with a conditioner soaked in a soft undershirt. Then I reclean the film to remove the spots the conditioner leaves.

Experience is the best teacher and it also makes the best teachers so I must tell you not to leave cans containing your original footage on any hot radiators. It is also advisable not to leave your footage in the hallway after you've put them down in order to find the key to your apartment.

All of my dissolves and double exposures were made in the camera because A & B roll seemed

like too much work at the time and I wanted to finish the picture early so I could go to the beach.

With an unlimited budget and all expenses paid, "Unstrap Me" remains a milestone in my career as a film-maker whose job it is to mirror the ugly fat of our society. Having to face this ugly fat after each morning shower, I feel confident in a job well done.

For, if the USSR claims the right to pass judgement on the affairs of other communist nations, then who passes judgement on the Soviet Union?

For, if the activities of other communist nations disturbs the USSR, by the same token, then, do not the activities of the Soviet Union disturb other communist nations?

These questions have never been put to the USSR before. Over the past twenty years, however, starting with Yugoslavia and on through China to (now) Czechoslovakia, the Soviet Union has been open to all these questions.

The only country she has been able to get along with "normally" is the United States. "Every night America goes to bed thinking that when they wake up tomorrow there will be no Red China. They dream that the Russians will have finally seen reason. Time, Life, and Reader's Digest will have Russian editions," from The Billion Dollar Brain, written in 1965.

Every night the Russians go to bed they think when they wake up there will be no Red China, Yugoslavia -- and now, no Czechoslovakia. But there will always be an England, I mean, an America!

The A.M.A. and Marijuana

When the American Medical Association speaks out on social issues, such as the means of implementing medical care, the public has learned to regard its statements as representing a small but powerful union of small business men.

The public has also learned to respect the A.M.A.'s role in maintaining high standards of medical education in the professional schools, promoting conferences for the continuing education of practicing physicians (even if they sometimes take place in Las Vegas), the dissemination of medical information through health booklets, magazines such as Today's Health, educational television programs for physicians and lay people and medical journals such as the Journal of the A.M.A..

In the June 24th issue of the Journal, the Council on Mental Health of the A.M.A. presents its views on "Marihuana and Society." Their statement begins as follows:

"After careful appraisal of available information concerning marihuana (cannabis) and its components and their derivatives, analogues and isomers, the Council on Mental Health and the Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence of the American Medical Association and the Committee on Problems of Drug Dependence of the National Research Council, National Academy of Sciences, have reached the following conclusions:"

Five major conclusions are given.

"1. CANNABIS IS A DANGEROUS DRUG AND AS SUCH IS A PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERN."

The Council cites as evidence that dogs and monkeys given the purified and concentrated active ingredient of marijuana, tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), have been completely anesthetized for several days. They also state that on a weight basis, THC is more powerful than barbiturates or alcohol. What they neglect to mention is that one would have to ingest several kilos of AMA Gold in order to produce anesthesia in man.

The A.M.A. statement continues, "In many countries where chronic heavy use of cannabis occurs, such as Egypt, Morocco, and Algeria, it has a marked effect in reducing the social productivity of a significant number of persons."

The A.M.A. Council has chosen in this case to ignore the voluminous studies of the British Hemp Commission in India and our own Canal Zone and La Guardia reports which showed no short term or long term personality changes in chronic marijuana users.

"2. LEGALIZATION OF MARIHUANA WOULD CREATE A SERIOUS ABUSE PROBLEM IN THE UNITED STATES."

Casting itself into the role of prophet, the Council demonstrates its lack of familiarity with the current American marijuana situation by the following statement: "Further, hemp grown in the United States is not commonly of high potency and 'street' samples sometimes are heavily adulterated with inert materials." Most lay people, to say nothing of drug experts, know that while marijuana can grow almost anywhere,

most is brought into the United States from Mexico.

Contrary to all known evidence, the A.M.A. statement denies that alcohol is more harmful than marijuana. Legalizing marijuana, they say, would "create a comparable problem of major proportions."

The incoherent vomit-covered drunk was a common sight in college infirmaries a few years ago. He is now rarely seen on campuses where students have switched to marijuana.

"3. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE MARIJUANA LAWS ARE OFTEN HARSH AND UNREALISTIC."

Tim Leary, who faces a 30 year prison term for possession of half an ounce of the weed, would, in this case, agree with the A.M.A. (his case will be heard by the Supreme Court this fall). But the A.M.A. does not condemn the principle of legal penalties for drug use, a method notably unsuccessful in the treatment of narcotic addicts and alcoholics.

"4. ADDITIONAL RESEARCH ON MARIHUANA SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED."

Few would disagree with this statement, except for the governmental agencies which have blocked almost all research applications since the La Guardia Report appeared in 1943.

A most perplexing sentence appears in this section which makes one wonder if a pothead Council member was trying to sabotage the entire report:

"The issue is whether we can ignore the experiences and observations established over centuries of heavy use of hemp preparations in various societies."

Some might conclude this is exactly what the A.M.A. has done -- ignore known experience.

"5. EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS WITH RESPECT TO MARIHUANA SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO ALL SEGMENTS OF THE POPULATION."

Right. They should first be directed to members of the A.M.A.'s Council on Mental Health and Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence and the Committee on Problems of Drug Dependence of the National Research Council, National Academy of Sciences.

Marijuana is a drug and there are those who react unfavorably to it. Diabetics may have their insulin requirements altered, a few individuals are allergic to the weed, some people with borderline personality problems have freaked out after using the drug one time.

But the most important issue here is not marijuana, per se. The important issue is that the scientific judgement of the A.M.A. will now be looked upon with some suspicion by the millions of American marijuana users, most of whom are "productive" and "responsible" otherwise law-abiding citizens. They include attorneys, judges, journalists, policemen, engineers.

In fact, the A.M.A. would certainly be surprised by the great numbers of medical students and young residents who chronically use marijuana with no observable detriment to their physical or mental well-being.

Dr. James L. Goddard, former commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration, said he would rather have his daughter smoke a joint than drink a highball. Last fall, a California State narcotics agent, speaking on a San Francisco radio station, said he would rather have his daughter use heroin than marijuana.

on San Quentin, and posted the BARB clipping to show he could keep things in the open.

Convicts are reportedly unimpressed that "Big Red" is not keeping their own Unity Day a secret from them.

Outside support for the August 3 Unity Day now includes the Peace and Freedom Movement, several Mexican-American and black groups including the Black Panther Party and the Brown Be-

rets, and a Los Angeles group planning a simultaneous vigil in L.A. Spokesmen for the various black, brown and white organizations will hold a press conference outside the prison walls during a sympathy demonstration the day before the Saturday unity day. P&F Senatorial candidate Paul Jacobs is scheduled to speak.

Black Panther Minister of Information Eldridge Cleaver, candidate for the Peace and Freedom

Presidential nomination, urged his campaign to begin exposing the inhumanity of California prisons. He said the public should demand open visitors hours, so prison officials could not dress up the prisons for expected visitors.

Cleaver spent several years in San Quentin.

Because the California Peace and Freedom nominating convention is currently scheduled for August 3, the "anarchist caucus" of P&F is now circulating a petition to change the date of the San Francisco convention to August 4, so P&F can attend the Saturday demonstration at San Quentin in large numbers.

In Los Angeles, a 24-hour vigil is planned at the state office building where the Adult Authority meets regularly. The vigil, scheduled to begin at noon August 3, will be by candle-light during the night.

Outside the walls at San Quentin on Saturday, The Phoenix rock band will play, and a mariachi group is also being sought to per-

form on the same day.

Meanwhile, whatever happens outside or inside the walls on August 3, the San Quentin convicts are seeking public pressure on the legislature to look into the conditions in California state prisons without delay.

If, as many say, life on the inside reflects what's happening on the streets, the results of failure of the legislators to act are easily predictable.



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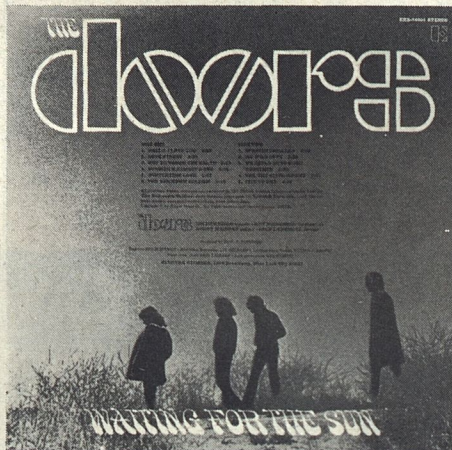
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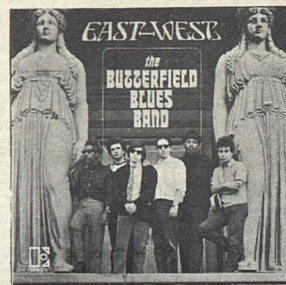
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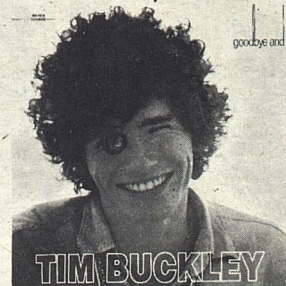


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# DIDN'T YOU KNOW IT?

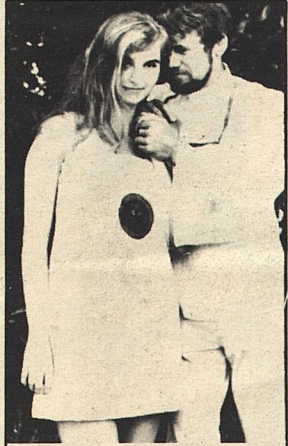
"Homosexuals should accept themselves AS THEY ARE without feeling guilty about it," Dr. Marsh said, and that's just what SIR is doing.

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# NUDITY VICTORY IN L.A.

At last! Sexual Freedom may soon come to Los Angeles.

A 1939 county ordinance making private group nudity illegal has been ruled unconstitutional by a county court.

This materially clears the way for the growth of an active SFL in the area, complete with nude parties. The law had previously dampened attempts to transplant the movement from the Bay Area. It prohibited a nude of any sex to be in the company of two or more nudes of any other sex. Thus, even families at home could be subject to arrest.

The case which brought about the ruling involved 24 people who were cited for being naked on the grounds of the Elysium Institute in Topanga Canyon.

Judge Merrick ruled that the law violated rights of free association, expression, privacy, due process and equal protection guaranteed by the Constitution.

Ed Lange, Executive Director of Elysium, proudly proclaimed that "... the inherent decency of the human body has been affirmed" by the County Court.

Those familiar with those courts may conclude that their traditional love of obfuscation may have accidentally worked for the right side.

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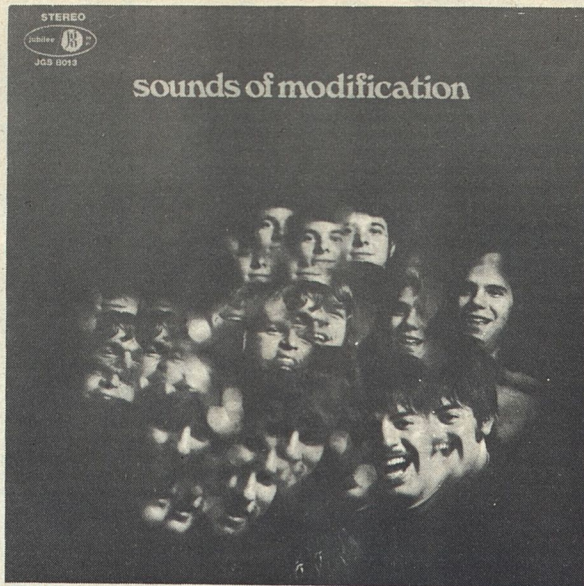

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# TAKING GANDER AT GOOD GANN

"I started thinking when I volunteered for Vietnam."

John Gann's learning process began, as it did for most of us, with the war. Last Friday Gann, who enlisted, became the third man in history to leave the military on a federal court order as a conscientious objector.

"John, you're out," squealed the Resistance chick.

"Yes, I'm free," the last word fell off, not quite real in his mouth. Technically, he is on extended leave, while the Army decides whether to appeal.

At a party a seminarian asked how he got out.

"On a writ of habeas corpus --" "Oh, you're John Gann. Why didn't you say so?"

He smiles, is enjoying his notoriety, yet he's amused at the supposed magic of his name.

Ya, ya. He proved it could be done. And the federal courts have recognized that the military is

a branch of the federal government," must adhere to its regulations, that the three were being confined illegally.

He told BARB about his 11-month struggle to get out like you tell a good story for the 29th time, a habit that comes easily to Resistance folks. But he was enlivened in talking about ways to organize and inform army people.

Possible project: coffee house near bases, here, where servicemen can have contact with the peace movement. It's worked in other parts of the country -- like South Carolina.

Goals: inform on individual rights. Ways to unionize or organize loosely for ad hoc projects.

Target: discipline (what else?) Tool: your ears. Stop hearing.

A year ago in Germany the Army stopped hiring civilians for KP work. Gann, then a Morse Code

operator, sent a petition over the wire and found 100 enlisted men willing to put out \$10 a month to pay civilians. When he "got called down for it" -- the men stopped hearing.

"But, Sarge, KP makes us too tired to do our work." They won in a few weeks.

"Enlisted men DO have the power if they could organize themselves," Gann said.

Direction of the Resistance is, Schmuck, use what you've got, but don't stop living. Gann is "gloating off" for a couple weeks, first flick in three months -- Space Odyssey -- "wowwww." Look for job, groove on borrowed floppy black farmer hat, Berkeley in the fall, "more to learn than for a degree." What to use.

"The military taught me how to live without money." GIs average \$90.60 a month (see THE DRAFT published by AFSC). Gann got from \$68 to \$145. He said they get \$250 in Vietnam.

"In reaction to it I learned how to talk, to stand up for my beliefs."

Gann learned something else from his resistance: dramatic liberating acts are transitional, commas in a runon sentence. When he turned in his military ID on April 3, after the Army rejected his request for discharge as a CO, "I wasn't even touching the ground."

He returned to his post, Two Rock, near Petaluma, and was put into the stockade ("the Box") following his refusal to wear a uniform and get a haircut. Fasted for 30 days -- 6 feet one, 120 lbs. when released.

But the dragging legal process brought him down, He read -- Camus, Hesse -- to retain something of his April 3 high. The "Go, Gann, go" response of most of the post's 500 men helped him up. He has discovered the need for new sources of energy in ideas, activity.

Gann's last stand: Two Rock's new commander, Col. Joseph F. Jewett IV, has ordered all to get

# OAKLAND REFUSES TO PAY

The city of Oakland is refusing to pay for damages to an automobile which was shot up when Oakland police were gunning down 17-year-old Black Panther Bobby Hutton. This refusal, says attorney Gary Crimm of West Oakland Legal Aid, has prompted Mrs. Ernestine

Ballard to sue the city of Oakland and the police department for \$350. The suit, filed last week in Municipal court, charges the Oakland fuzz with "failure to exercise due care in enforcing the law." Grimm told BARB.

Mrs. Ballard lives on 28th Street next door to where the Oakland police killed Bobby Hutton on April 6.

Police shot out all the windows and put numerous bullet holes in Mrs. Ballard's '58 Chrysler during the shootout.

"The city has taken the position that it can't pay," Grimm said. "Mrs. Ballard is receiving public assistance and the car is the only means of transportation for her and her children."
