





WHERE? WHERE? THE POLICE ESTABLISHMEN

by William W. Turner. Putnam, 320 pages, \$6.95.

In Los Angeles a motorcycle officer stopped a white doctor whose car displayed a sign in favor of an open-housing measure, "I thought only niggers had those signs," he said.

In New York, a black man was speeding his pregnant wife to the hospital. A white policeman stopped him, pointed a gun at his head and, without a word, shot him to death. him to death.

him to death.

In Oakland, a man ran away from the tavern pursued by the bartender shouting, "Stop! Robber!" A policeman took up the chase and, when the suspect failed to respond to a command to stop, shot him fatally. It was discovered later that the man had simply not paid for his drink. Where does it begin? The President's Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice in its 1967 report found that "a significant number of officers engage in varying forms of criminal

significant number of officers engage in varying forms of criminal and unethical conduct" and that incidents of rudeness and physical and verbal abuse are widespread. The simple fact is that most cops have a white middle-class morality which includes a potent dislike of black people, a distrust of liberals, and a point-blank hostility towards anything questioning their actions and beliefs (civilian review boards). "The Police Establishment" is, as its dust jacket says, "a noholds-barred expose" of the cops. Its author, William W. Turner, presently a Ramparts writer, knows what he's rapping about, since he's been an FBI agent. He is not satisfied with only telling what he knows from his own personal experience. He digs up the records (Los Angeles: minorities — 5% on police force, 40% of population; Oakland: Negroes — 3% of cops, 25% of population, examines the opinions and actions of police commissioners (such as O.W. Wilson of Chicago, who, while modernizing the department and being known as a "progressive", still presented a solid front with his fellow officers in denouncing any criticism of the force), and gives numerous a solid front with his fellow officers in denouncing any criticism of the force), and gives numerous instances of police atrocities (a cop in Newark calmly shot a young Negro boy in the back for stealing a six-pack of beer).

Sure they protect us, But from what? Crime in the cities is not just crime but Negro crime. "Clamping down" and "Getting tough" means usually roughing up the blacks. Are we protected

against crime or, as Baldwin suggests, are we protected really against the Negro? And what form

against the Negro' And what form does this protection take? The form is in large pirouettes of prejudice reinforced by fre-quent outbursts of fear. The New York Police Department habitually consigns its least desirable officonsigns its least destraine offi-cers to Harlem. In Los Angeles, Chief Parker stated that some minorities are "not far removed from the wild tribes of Mexico" and steadfastly refused to meet with any of the Watts leaders

with any of the Watts leaders during the rioting,
When Negroes march in Chicago, Mayor Daley concludes "many of the people who are marching are Communist," and the cops betieve him. When San Francisco, etc. 2 Police-Compunity. cops believe him. When San Francisco gets a Police-Community Relations Unit which is praised by the President, the Police department refuses to allot it sufficient money or men, and its officers sarcastically refer to the unit as the "Commie Relations Unit" and heap ridicule on its and heap ridicule on its members

Sure they protect us from the lawless (i.e. Negro). They also inflame minorities with their senseless brutalities. While it seems a sensible thing to have some sort of Black-White coexist-ence, it's difficult when the police want to preserve their ability to harass.

But they're not harassing need-lessly, they say. They say that to

But they're not narassing need-lessly, they say. They say that to work in a slum you have to get tough. And yet, after each riot— after Watts and Detroit and Newark— it turns out one of the major causes has been years of police

So what of modernize t

mistreatment.

So what do you do? Do you modernize the police force by raising salaries, getting in a better brand of officer, and hoping to get some understanding between cop and civilian worked out?

Try it! Every police force will be against it. They'll shoot down any attempts at mutual understanding (the civilian review board in New York) with a campaign aimed at the middle-class voters showing a white girl walking down a dark street under the message: "Support your local police."

They'll be in favor of higher salaries but the better brand of cop just won't come along because the powers-that-be are dedicated to keeping a nice (ugly) middle-class white morality in their cities.

Mr. Turner is a sharpshooting writer. He examines the ins-and-


Mr. Turner is a sharpshooting writer. He examines the ins-and-outs, the ups-and-downs of this segment of justice with a fine moral comb. He has the suggestions that would lead to a way out but he would lead to a way out but he knows the difficulty in implement-

But time after time, he rams home the truths and the tragedies of this deadwood establishment that "presents a unified front in lobbying for more power and less outside control. Its principal objectives are to nullify Supreme Court decisions by legislation, legalize Big Brother devices in the interests of the 'crime war,' obtain more repressive laws, perpetuate the punitive theory over rehabilitation and become a national thought police system."

A recently circulated directive to all Wing Commanders from the Chief of Staff dated 21 March 1969' and effective to "15 January 1969" tells the Junior Birdmen all about tells the Junior Birdmen all about the hideous dangers of the chemical and the "fact" that "flashback" or "recurrent trip" is a dangerous side effect of acid. They also relate some garbage about a "careful cytogenic investi-gation" which indicated that "100% of individuals having invested the

of individuals having ingested single doses of LSD in excess of 300 micrograms manifested persistent chromosomal abnormali-

They forgot to mention that Ti-mothy Leary, who has ingested probably more LSD than anyone living, was found to have better than normal chromosomes (see

than normal chromosomes (see BARB May 31).

The important part of the order is section (d) which states that "repeated and persistent use of LSD will be regarded as evidence of ... personality disorder which may render the member unfit for military service and thus subject to separation under appropriate

may render the member unnt for military service and thus subject to separation under appropriate administrative regulations."
The order indicates a particular preoccupation with "flashback" or "recurring trip" conditions. Indeed, they should dread the prospect of their flyboys having sudden fits of uncontrollable sanity.

Got the idea yet, men? In case you're slow at it the order warns that "... immature service members who may report such past contact for the purposes of avoiding specific duties or of obtaining separation from the Air Force should be carefully evaluated."

And flash on this — you, too, can turn on, tune in and drop out, Long live Leary!

BLACKS SCORE A WIN IN BRUTALITY BEEF

"Oh shut up," the black man told the Mayor of Berkeley, "I'm going to finish what I set out to say."

The mayor shut up. The city council listened.

council listened.

From midnight to 2:30 in the morning, the council listened as the Reverend Hazaiah Williams and a stream of black Berkeleyans protested another classic example of police brutality in the ghetto.

In this case it was beating and macing of a 65-year-old woman, her daughter, and a young man who came to their rescue. This time victims were Mrs. Willeta Smith, a long-time Berkeley res-dent, Harriet Smith, a former stu-dent body president at Merritt College, and Fred Smith, the newly elected student body president at Merritt.

Merritt.

By the end of the meeting, and it lasted until after 2:30 in the morning, these concerned black people had won two major concessions for themselves and for the citizens of Berkeley:

•An indefinite moratorium on

A personal investigation of police brutality by a committee of

the council.

The blacks waited with enormous patience for five hours before the city council would listen to them. The crowd, which approached a thousand in number during the course of the evening and had to move to the city auditorium, dwin-dled to a determined three or four hundred -- mostly black -- as such hot topics as street widenings and contract awards were discussed.

A number of times Mayor Wal-lace Johnson made references to the planned midnight cutoff time

the planned midnight cutoff time in an obvious attempt to discourage the impending confrontation. His bluff was called by Sid Walton, Merritt College counselor, who took the microphone at midnight and told the council "we won't leave until this matter is heard." He vowed that the meeting would be kept in session "by any means necessary."

Mayor Johnson was about to

Mayor Johnson was about to take issue with Walton when Councilman Wilmont Sweeney inter-rupted to tell Walton that several members of the council had al-ready decided to hear out the ready decided to hear out the complaints of the citizens in spite

complaints of the citizens in spite of the mayor.

The two and a half hours that followed were filled with cries of rage from citizens who refused to accept the brutal behavior of the

cops who beat the Smiths.

The Reverend Mance Johnson condemned the "blatant affront by whites with the power to demonstrate to the minority how power-

strate to the minority now power-less we are."

Reverend Hazaiah Williams said
"these same policemen would not
have moved against white women
as they moved against these black
women."

I'm not jiving, check it. Ask any con or ex-con, or parole officer, you'll get the same answer. They can send you back, take more years of life from you, and here? what

you'll get the same answer. They can send you back, take more years of life from you, and here's what kills me, they don't even care, it's like our lives don't mean anything, never have and never will.

Thank you for the article, for what you are trying to do. If I had money I would send you some, sorry I can't cause I know you need it to carry on.

The sole purpose of the San Quentin Unity Day for Convicts is to focus public attention on the need for an immediate legislative investigation into the practices of the Adult Authority, the state agency which determines their fate.

The AA can arbitrarily decide an inmate's sentence, up to the maximum, and can snatch a parolee back behind the walls on a whim.

Warden Nelson on Wednesday told the inmates that they must choose between the "progress" that had already been made, and the chance of causing an incident. Nelson was apparently referring to the "progress" resulting from a recent meeting of the Inmate Advisory Council with Assemblyman Craig Biddle and Alan Sieroty of the Criminal Procedures Committee and Raymond Procunier, Director of the California Department of Corrections.

Such pie-in-the-sky "progress" is precisely the theorem of the conditions are inhuman right now. The possibilities of an "incident" cannot be dismissed. Not only do many cons say that the January 18, 1967 San Quentin riots were instigated by the staff, but also many feel that squelching the August 3 Unity Day will cause inmate frustration to skyrocket. Some think it's deliberate.

If they are not even permitted to hold a completely peaceful protest which violates no rules, what recourse is left? Complete frustration can only erupt in violence.

TRANQUIL PLAN
Normally on Saturdays a voluntary lock-up is called after breakfast. Then immates with job assignments go to work, and the rest have a choice of spending the day in their cells or going to a recreation area, such as the yard. Usually, only a few choose to go to their cells.

ly, only a few choose to go to their cells. The tranquil plan for the August 3 Unity Day is for those with work assignments to go to work while all the rest of the inmates go voluntar-

the rest of the immates go voluntarily to their cells for lock-up.
But even that mild plan, which would place the immates voluntarily in small cages where they could pose scant danger to anyone, is evidently too much of a threat to prison officials.

Since the cons decided to break no rules, many now expect the Warden to change the rules for them on Saturday.

If The Warden decides to cancel voluntary lock-up, almost all the men thwarted from having a quiet Unity Day will be gathered together on the yard, where trouble starting from any source can easily boil

over.

If "Big Red" takes any such action, it will be obvious who is responsible for causing an "incident." The cons only intend to

dent." The cons only intend to lock up quietly.

WELFARE WORKERS REFUSE TO BACK THOUGHT CONTROL

California?

The effect of a recent order from the state Social Welfare Depart-ment, appears to have brought it closer, but a group of non-comply-

ing social workers say they're prepared to fight the order. State Director of Social Welfare John Montgomery, issued an order on July 15 requiring social workers to submit confidential information regarding psychiatric patients' re-sumes with the name and social security number of the patient. The information is supposed to be sent to Sacramento where it will

be sent to sacration where the becompiled on computers.
Some 450 social workers opposed to the idea have formed the Ad Hoc Committee for Patients' Rights to have the order withdrawn.

The order stands, but many of the social workers are simply ignoring it, David Aroner, aspokesman for the committee says.

"The problem is in terms of safeguards to information given to us in confidence by individuals," Aroner told BARB. "Just who has access to the computers?"

Dr. George David, a physician engaged in welfare work, says that the information on the tapes could be subpoenaed and used against the patient in a court of law.

The committee members main-

The committee members maintain that Montgomery's order con-stitutes "invasion of privacy" pro-tected by the 14th Amendment, and that it violates the social workers code of ethics.

also discriminating, they say, since those who would most likely have their psychic informa-tion stored on electronic tapes, would be the poor, the people who

Thought control in the state of can't afford private psychiatric

care. "There is a mixed pattern of resistance to the order," Aroner told BARB.

told BARB.
"Some people have officially closed out their community patients and work with them unofficially. Others are giving social security numbers by supplying all nines in place of the true number. Many people are violating the orders."

Last week, committee members met with director Montgomery in Sacramento seeking a moratorium on the order until safer means could be devised for gathering the

data. The committee was unsuccessful in its attempt, Aroner said, and succeeded only in obtaining a promise that no disciplinary action

mise that no disciplinary action would be taken against those who had disobeyed the orders before the date of the meeting.

This implies, Aroner observed, that those who continue to disobey the order could be subject to dismissal

missal.

The ACLU however, has already promised that it will defend anyone fired for defying the order, Aroner

told BARB.

"People should be appraised that anything they may say to a social worker could be submitted to Sacramento and used against them in a law court," Dr. George

them in a law court," Dr. George David told BARB.
This, he says, depends entirely on the discretion of the individual social worker. Dr. David suggests that a patient who has anything confidential to say, should first inquire of his social worker to see if the information will remain that way.

from p. 3 Councilman John DeBonis and told him, "don't smile Mr. DeBonis, you are so rude I don't know if I can stand it."

Ruth Hagwood asked "the Jewish people in the audience: At what point should the Jews have revolted against Hitler?" Then she looked meaningfully at the Mayor and said, "We're not going to walk into any gas chamber."

Joseph Ross, the father of four children that Mrs. Willeta Smith was babysitting at the time she was dragged from her home asked "what am I supposed to say to my children about the police when they see policemen breaking into a house, knocking down a door and mishandling women?"

Two of Ross's children apparently also received some mace in

I'wo of Ross's children apparently also received some mace in their faces in the room where the struggle with the Smiths took place, As Ross was protesting this, Councilman DeBonis got up and walked out. He spent the next fifteen minutes lurking in the wings of the auditorium.

Alfred Smith recalled a time in Berkeley's history when the Berkeley police would walk women home at night instead of macing them. "We must have a police force that respects the whole community," he told the council. Edith Austen asked the council, 'who do I call when I find myself in a situation like this — the police? — I want to know." Councilman DeBonis had returned by now.

Austen: "So the police can beat my tail?"
DeBonis: "Oh, nonsense."
A young man, Lauren Jones, told the council: "the black brothers — they tired of this shit. Where I come from shit don't watter. stands the barrel of a gun in his

damned face."

Mrs, Sonja Gamel said that she often used Mrs, Smith as a babysitter and that the children the police abandoned in the house might, on another day, have been hers. "What can you do for me to insure that when I go to work from 8 to 5, that my children will be safe?" No one on the council answered. swered.

Throughout the early morning hours, Mayor Johnson tried to put a cork in the muzzle of the protest by asking that the city manager read a report from Chief Beall which would be "so salutary" that it would make the demonstrations of divisor argorymeres. strations of citizen anger unneces-

This report, when finally read by the city manager, proved an anemic confession of guilt without a shadow

of apology.

Using the royal "our", Chief
Beall's statement admitted that "It
is our opinion that under these ciris our opinion that under these cir-cumstances the chemical Mace should not have been used," and "In our opinion the officer was wrong" for breaking the telephone over Harriet Smith's head.

over Harriet Smith's head.

This was quite a bit less than the

This was quite a bit less than the black people before the council expected in the way of redress. What they did expect was presented in a list of six demands by Fred Smith:

orms.

"It's time to tell the police department that we will no longer accept this kind of behavior," he said.

In spite of the machinations of Wallace Johnson to move the meeting on to other business, Dellums succeeded in part at least. His motion that the use of mace be suspended indefinitely was passed. This left DeBonis muttering angrily into his microphone about "the law of the jungle" and "you people" and "mob rule."

The council also formed an investigatory committee of Councilspite of the machinations of

vestigatory committee of Council-man Brown, Dewey, DeBonis, and Dellums that will personally look into the Smith beatings. The other demands were not met.

Mrs. Wyse is a teacher's aide at Jackson School and has been a resident of Berkeley for 25 years.

She told BARB that the two boys

She told BARB that the two boys were simply standing by a fence near their home looking at a chicken, Her son hopped the fence at one point, fondled the hen a little, then put it down, and hopped back over the fence.

over the fence.

The boy, Mrs. Wyse admits, digs chickens.

When the cop arrived a few minutes later, he asked the boys what they were doing. They told him "Standing by the fence," she said.

The cop then placed the boys' hands on the roof of the squad car,

nands on the roof of the squadcar, frisked them, handcuffed them, and took them to the station. There, Mrs. Wyse says, they forced a confession from the two and booked them for the theft of the chicken.

"They frightened the boys to death and made them say they death and made them say they were going to take the chicken," she said.



FROM ALAMEDA COUNTY **HOW FAR TO ALABAMA?**

"We're trying to project into the
courtroom what the black liberation movement is saying on the outside," Huey Newton's defense outside," Huey Newton's defense attorney Charles Garry told BARB this week.

Outside, BARB talked to Kath-leen Cleaver, the only Panther leader who has not yet been threatened with prison by the white establishment.

"Huey Newton is being tried by a civilian court that acts as if it's military. But the civilian court has no authority over him," she has no autitold BARB.

"Who is the aggressor and what is the justification?" she asked. If, as the Panthers say, the black ghetto is a colony struggling to throw off the shackles of the white mother country, then Huey P. Newton cannot legally be tried by the Alameda County Court. He is a warrior for the black nation, their captured Minister of Defense, and therefore a prisoner of war. As the trial of Huey Newton fin-

heavy guard as they consider the Newton case. He is accused of kill-On Tuesday, prospective. ing a member of that very guard, which is so visibly "protecting" the jurors — and it is no secret that the Oakland police militia wants Huey Newton dead.

Would anyone denv the subtle protectors?

Last week, after listening to an impressive battery of UC sociologists testify that present jury selection disproportionately fav-

selection disproportionately favors whites, and that whites are inherently racists, Judge Friedman denied the defense motion to expel the entire master panel jury. The judge denied the motion without comment. In Alabama a similar action might prompt the presiding magistrate to wink at the prosecutor. But no such overt action was noted in Alameda. "It's a joke," Kathleen Cleaver said after she was able to get into the courtoom twice. "It's as if Judge Friedman had been

on Tuesday, prospective black juror Jewel Liggins testified that he had never heard of Huey New-ton or the Black Panthers, and that he was not opposed to the death penalty.

penalty.

Assistant District Attorney
Lowell Jensen immediately dismissed the juror with one of his
peremptory challenges, which requires no reason.

Garry was to his feet quickly.
"Let the record show," he said,
"that Mr. Liggins is a black
man."

man."

In Alabama, not many black men are selected for jury, maybe because there, too, voter registration lists are used. In Alameda, of the black men who are put on the jurors list, most are immediately challenged and dismissed.

missed.
Throughout the jury-selection procedure, prosecutor Jensen appeared to remove those people who seemed sympathetic to blacks or who oppose the death penalty. The Berkeley Establishment raised the cry of "Resistance" Thursday morning just before press time, midst the click of coffee cups and the raised finger dunking of donuts.

The Mayor of Berkeley was up front before a beefed-up Chamber of Commerce indoor rally.

The talk was of "they" and "we," the "lynch mob" on the streets of Berkeley versus the businessmen of Berkeley ("this admirable group of Americans here today"). The setting was the sort of sedate, slightly shabby Shattuck Hotel.

Invitations sent out to a select list (not including BARB) announced: "The recent riots on Telegraph Avenue and University Avenue are only the beginning -- unless responsible citizens demand law and order, and an end to mob rule!"

The police — the heavily-armed, trained milita which enforces white justice in the black ghetto colony — are everywhere in the courtroom building. Who is being protected from whom?

On Monday of this week, Judge Friedman denied a defense mo-tion to have Newton's former felony conviction excluded from the

In so doing, he said in presence of the prospective jurors, that they could take prior conviction into consideration when evaluating testimony, and give it "great weight, little weight, or no weight," to which Garry strenuously objected.

The defense is taking the appeal to the US Supreme Court, and if it fails there, Newton will AUTO-MATICALLY be tried for first degree murder.

central rotunds where the main guard station is.

Inside the cells go up the walls with no floors in the eight story center of the wings.

There are about 1300 men (all military) in the prison. Half or more were black. This resulted in extensive 'race' riots. Although they actually got started from acts of forced homosexuality and the guards playing the whites against the blacks.

The guards deal and/or withhold

The guards deal and/or withhold dope, guns, knives and money to work up trouble between the inmates. The clothing and the prison itself are left in filthy condition. They 'wash' the clothes but they

always stink.

There are large rats and literally thousands of cockroaches in all of the cells. It's even worse in the cement stalls of disciplinary segregation. They are solid cement cells with a cold slimey cement slab for the bed and a hole in the floor as the toilet. I spent 6 or 8 weeks in segregation during the 10 months in Leavenworth.

weeks in segregation during the 10 months in Leavenworth.

All of the food is cooked by the prisoners. Once in a while as protest or something the cooks put, as I call it, homo sapien defecation in the food. Once that I remember it was in onion soup which made it hard to tell. Some of the men actually ate the soup.

The toilets in each cell were corroded and really filthy, although the showers were more or less clean. There are only 10 showers for the 3-400 men in each wing.

During my 10 months in Leavenworth I heard of at least 10 men who were beaten by the guards. But once I actually saw 8-10 guards attack one man in his cell and then

sut once lactually saw 8-10 guards attack one man in his cell and then drag him off to segregation. He stayed there 3½ months being fed only boiled carrots, potatoes, and cabbage — the usual diet.

One guy was beaten in a stockade in No. Carolina, He had both legs

in No. Carolina. He had both legs broken and some other injuries. Anyway, he was put in Leavenworth while ACLU was suing the Army for damages. damages.

He later went insane and did He later went insane and did things like wipe his ass with a let-ter from his wife. He would always throw his food on the floor and then just play with it. They only beat him some more when he wouldn't sweep

some more when he wouldn't sweep it up. He was so sick he didn't even know how to use a broom.

I had heard of the movement before I went into the army and while I was in Leavenworth. Now that it's over I want to tell everyone what I know. The prisons are terrible places and people have to realize that.

CURFEW UNDER LEGAL ATTACK

BERKELEY (SCN-LNS) — A claim for \$500,000 damage for false arrest on a charge of curfew violation was made this week

few violation was made this week against the Cify of Pittsburg, County of Contra Costa, the Contra Costa County Disaster Office and its Director, Will H. Terry, Jr. The lawsuit has important implications for the legality of police and governmental actions taken last month by the City of Richmond and early this month under Berkeley's 1951 "Civil Defense and Disaster" Ordinance 3216NS.

The recent use of "state of emergency" proclamations in Berkeley, Richmond and Pittsburg, California, may be unconstitutional under state law.

Filing the claim on behalf of Jesse Nathaniel Davis, a black youth from the El Pueblo district, Berkeley attorney Populd K. Cav.

Jesse Nathaniel Davis, a black youth from the El Pueblo district, Berkeley attorney Donald K. Gayden points out in his brief "that Contra Costa Ordinance Section 3105 (a) is invalid and unconstitutional in that the State of California has preempted the field of regulation of disaster preparedness and relief and, further, has reposed in the Governor a nondelegable power to proclaim a state of extreme emergency or a state of disaster."

Never greatly publicized and since eclipsed in the public consciousness by police-community conflicts in North Richmond and Berkeley, the Pittsburg Emergency Proclamation of April 16 involves the call-in of over 120 police from at least 7 agencies to seal off the 5-block nonincorporated minority housing area of El Pueblo, the imposition of a 7 pm to 6 am curfew, prohibition of movement without special passes, searches by the police — without warrants — not only of automobiles but of homes, and confiscation of "all weapons."

Pittsburg High authorities suspended 45 students, recommending 16 of them for expulsion. Attorney Gayden's fight with the authorities on behalf of the students' constitutional rights succeeded in obtaining a restraining order on April 17.

In response to community hostility, the Contra Costa Sheriff's Department sent in massive police

force.

Gayden has already won on a de-Gayden has already won on a de-murrer to the charge against Davis, but Judge Finstermacher did not rule on the constitutional issues, so the Pittsburg authori-ties have recharged Davis under a slightly different portion of the

same law.

The authorities now have 45 days to answer the \$500,000 claim, or, if it is denied, Gayden will file public suit.

the scene of last week's narkbust shooting at Telegraph and Ashby called BARB before he turned himself in to the police.

Tim Conely was shot and killed by narcotics agents during the set-up Wednesday, July 17, at Si's Charbroiler. Conely allegedly opened fire on them.

BARB's caller, who identified himself as "the buddy of the guy who was in that shoot-out Wednesday," had a different impression.

sion.

He said he had recognized a red-headed man in the Si's setup as a notorious "ripper" -- a person who arranges a dope deal and then robs the dope from the and the dealer.

"So when we saw him (the rip-"'So when we saw him (the rip-per) and guns were pulled we thought we were being ripped," the caller said.
"I shouted to Tim, 'We're being ripped, Tim!'"
"'Tim jumped out (of the car), pulled a gun, and yelled, 'Hold it!' and I don't believe he fired,"

BARB's caller said.

At that moment the plainclothed narks cut down Tim Conely with fatal gunfire.

"I don't think Tim knew they were police," the caller stated.

"I think he thought they were trying to rob us."

He said that Conely was not known among his associates to carry a gun. No report made public to date indicates that the narks identified themselves as police before opening fire.

identified themselves as police before opening fire.

The caller said that, after the shooting, people in the neighborhood gave them refuge as the police combed the block. "The people were beautiful," he said.

"I want to identify the guy who set it up. It was Harold Scott—he has red hair—he's ripped people before, He's known in Oakland as a ripper."

The caller said he would probably turn himself in. Later that weekend a William M. Berg gave himself up to police as the miss—

"It is impossible" Clark said, "It is impossible Clark said, to control "abuse" without scientific research and public education as to the dangers. "Failure of one means failure of all,"

In ten years science will come up with 100 new dangerous drugs, he said. The goal of course is to be ready for them. Surgeon - General William H. tans, speak rearnedy, and cause no violence to either property or person. This is a splendid bullshit. The manner and style communicates message, and in the case of the college professor the message is middle class and careerist. and so is the society that it will

and so is the society that it will sustain.

Jerry Rubin's style is sloppy and absurdist; he rarely says anything "rational" and when he does he feels guilty, it is a manner and style that challenges the bourgeoiste from its foreign investments to its pay toilets and is in every sense confrontational. The only career this style smacks of is one of a full-time revolutionary, a career that throws cocktails career that throws cocktails

is one of a full-time revolutionary, a career that throws cocktails rather than sipping them.

Peace and Freedom, reeling from the shock of having to choose a black ex-con bad-assed revolutionary and desperate to get an attache case into respectability-land, picked Dowd.

Jerry decided to run for the Vice Presidency after Eldridge Cleaver suggested the idea. Although opposed to the traditional left-wing use of electoral politics, Jerry went into the convention suggesting that PFP put out comic books for kids, tour the country with a rock group and guerilla theater, organize disruptive demonstrations on Election Day throughout the world against the American elections, appeal to high school and college students as the main constituency and use the electoral campaign to organize a white revolutionary movement.

school and college students as the main constituency and use the electoral campaign to organize a white revolutionary movement.

"You have to nominate candidates who live the revolution, whose very existence embodies rebellion against America," Jerry told the PFP convention.

"Peace and Freedom has to become the party of the people in the streets, people in jail, people fighting the cops, P&F has been buried in paper, offices and bureaucracy."

A lot of the young independents


lot of the young independents A lot of the young independents in the party were for Jerry and they put together a lot of passionate rhetoric and 40 votes (one third). They told the convention of their festicals, providing and dragans.

They told the convention of their fantasies, passions and dreams, but the party told them to get a college professor on the ballot. In the Democratic Party industrial workers go out and campaign for the guy they work for, and who pays their salary; in the Peace and Freedom party students go out and campaign for the professor who grades them.

To show that New York Peace and Freedom doesn't take Black self-defense too seriously they nominated a pacifist, David Mc-Reynolds for the US Senate, who takes no sides on Vietnam (though he is for immediate withdrawal of troops) and who a week before called the Cleaver candidacy a joke.



Careful selection of who does what when and where is becoming an important consideration for

an important consideration for an important consideration for many of the street groups (like the Panthers' "no spontaneous riots", so if a group of agents decides to paint the UC Campanile, they may find themselves alone on the skir-

mish line when the overt police move in with flamethrowers.

A quick U-Turn brings you back to take a second look, assuming you're curious about things out of the ordinary.

And 'No Smoking' isn' tordinary.

And 'No Smoking' isn't ordinary. It is the outlet for a wide assortment of hand-crafted goods, paintings, jewelry, and sculpture produced by independent artists up and down the San Geronimo Valley. It is also a print shop, It is also a boutique. It is also an underground cinema. It is also a working dark room.

"It is supposed to be a cultural center," Ray Muller, one of the three young men who started No Smoking tells me, "that is pretty much what the people in the area involved in the arts want it to be, "All three of us in the shop are doing other things," Muller says, indicating his two partners, Lynn Dutra and Ed Munk.

"We've exhibited in galleries and gotten burned and we know other people who have too. We want a place where the people who exhibit know that everything is right up front and honest."

riot and using obscenity in a public place. Allowed to call home to speak to her two children (but not allowed to call a lawyer), she was booked, fingerprinted, and packed into jail for three days.

The following morning she was slabbed up before Judge Constine (whose son recently was sliced for possession of pot). She was released on her own recognizance. The American Civil Liberties Union refused to handle her case. A private attorney, because the trial is on his birthday, refused also (he told her that if she would plead guilty to the obscenity, she would probably get six months probation). Meanwhile the trial is for Wednesday, July 24 at 9:30 AM in Department 15. Meanwhile she has only the public defender.

Film-makers who read this co-Film-makers who read this co-lumn may be interested to know that I edited my original in the kitchen and threw the unwanted scenes under the table. A work-print was not edited first because print was not edited first because when I edit too much I get a blister on my thumb and also the fumes from an open bottle of film cement causes a tightening in my chest. After editing the original I always clean the film with a conditioner soaked in a soft undershirt. Then I reclean the film to remove the spots the conditioner leaves. Experience is the best teacher and it also makes the best teachers so I must tell you not to leave cans

so I must tell you not to leave cans containing your original footage on any hot radiators. It is also advis-able not to leave your footage in the hallway after you've put them down in order to find the key to your apartment.

All of my dissolves and double exposures were made in the camera because A & B roll seemed

like too much work at the time and

like too much work at the time and I wanted to finish the picture early so I could go to the beach.

With an unlimited budget and all expenses paid, "Unstrap Me" remains a milestone in my career as a film-maker whose job it is to mirror the ugly fat of our society. Having to face this ugly fat after each morning shower, I feel confident in a job well done.



issues, such as the means of implementing medical care, the public
has learned to regard its statements as representing a small but ments as representing a small but powerful union of small business

The public has also learned to respect the A,M,A,'s role in maintaining high standards of medical education in the professional schools, promoting conferences for the continuing education of practicing physicians (even if they sometimes take place in Las Vegas), the dissemination of medical information through health booklets, magazines such as Today's lets, magazines such as Today's Health, educational television pro-

Health, educational television pro-grams for physicians and lay peo-ple and medical journals such as the Journal of the A.M.A.. In the June 24th issue of the Jour-nal, the Council on Mental Health of the A.M.A. presents its views on "Marihuana and Society." Their statement begins as follows: "After careful appraisal of a-vailable information concerning marihuana (cannabis) and its com-

vailable information concerning marihuana (cannabis) and its components and their derivatives, analogues and isomers, the Council on Mental Health and the Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence of the American Medical Association and the Committee on Problems of Drug Dependence of the National Research Council, National Academy of Sciences, have reached the following conclusions:"

Five major conclusions are

Five major conclusions are given.

'1. CANNABIS IS A DANGEROUS DRUG AND AS SUCH IS A
PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERN.''

The Council cites as evidence that dogs and monkeys given the purified and concentrated active ingredient of marijuana, tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), have been completely anesthetized for several days. They also state that on a weight basis, THC is more powerful than barbiturates or alcohol. What they neglect to mention is

a weight basis, THC is more powerful than barbiturates or alcohol. What they neglect to mention is that one would have to ingest several kilos of AMA Goldin order to produce anesthesia in man. The A.M.A. statement continues, "In many countries where chronic heavy use of cannabis occurs, such as Egypt, Morroco, and Algeria, it has a marked effect in reducing the social productivity of a significant number of persons,"

The A.M.A. Council has chosen in this case to ignore the voluminous studies of the British Hemp Commission in India and our own Canal Zone and La Guardia reports which showed no short term or long term personality changes in chronic marijuana users.

"2. LEGALIZATION OF MARIHUANA WOULD CREATE A SERIOUS ABUSE PROBLEM IN THE UNITED STATES,"

Casting itself into the role of prophet, the Council demonstrates its lack of familiarity with the current American marijuana situation by the following statement:

current American marijuana sit-uation by the following statement: "Further, hemp grown in the U-nited States is not commonly of high potency and 'street' samples sometimes are heavily adulterated with inert materials." Most lay people, to say nothing of drug experts, know that while mari-juana can grow almost anywhere,

most is brought into the United States from Mexico.
Contrary to all known evidence, the A.M.A. statement denies that alcohol is more harmful than marijuana. Legalizing marijuana, they say, would "create a comparable problem of major proportions."
The incoherent vomit-covered drunk was a common sight in college infirmaries a few years ago. He is now rarely seen on campuses where students have switched to marijuana.
"3. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE MARIJUANA LAWS ARE OFTEN HARSH AND UNREALISTIC."

Tim Leary, who faces a 30 year prison term for possession of half an ounce of the weed, would, in this case, agree with the A.M.A. (his case will be heard by the Supreme Court this fall). But the A.M.A. does not condemn the principle of legal penalties for drug use, a method notably unsuccessful in the treatment of narcotic addicts in the treatment of narcotic addicts

in the treatment of narcotic addicts and alcoholics.

"4. ADDITIONAL RESEARCH ON MARIHUANA SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED."
Few would disagree with this statement, except for the governmental agencies which have blocked almost all research applications since the La Guardia Report appeared in 1943.

A most perplexing-sentence appears in this section which makes one wonder if a pothead Council member was trying to sabotage the entire report:

the entire report:

"The issue is whether we can ignore the experiences and observations established over centuries of heavy use of hemp preparations in various societies."

In various societies."

Some might conclude this is exactly what the A,M,A, has done — ignore known experience.

"5, EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS WITH RESPECT TO MARIHUANA SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO ALL SEGMENTS OF THE POPULATION."

Right. They should first be directed to members of the A,M,A,'s Council on Mental Health and Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence and the Committee on Problems of Drug Dependence of the National Research Council, National Academy of Sciences.

Marijuana is a drug and there are those who react unfavorably to it. Diabetics may have their insulin requirements altered, a few individuals are allergic to the weed, some people with border-line personality problems have freaked out after using the drug one time.

one time.

But the most important issue here is not marijuana, per se. The important issue is that the scientific judgement of the A,M,A, will now be looked upon with some suspicion by the millions of American marijuana users, most of whom are "productive" and "responsible" otherwise law-abiding citizens. They include attorneys, judges, journalists, policemen, engineers.

gineers.

In fact, the A.M.A. would certainly be surprised by the great numbers of medical students and young residents who chronically use marijuana with no observable detriment to their physical or mental well-being.





NUDITY ICTORY IN L.A.

At last! Sexual Freedom may soon come to Los Angeles.
A 1939 county ordinance making private group nudity illegal has been ruled unconstitutional by a county court.
This materially clears the way for the growth of an active SFL in the area, complete with nude parties. The law had previously dampened attempts to transplant the movement from the Bay Area. It prohibited a nude of any sex to be in the company of two or more nudes of any other sex. Thus, even families at home could be subject

The case which brought about the ruling involved 24 people who were cited for being naked on the grounds of the Elysium Institute in Topanga Canyon.

Judge Merrick ruled that the law violated rights of free association, expression, privacy, due process and equal protection guaranteed by the Constitution.

Ed Lange, Executive Director of Elysium, proudly proclaimed that "... the inherent decency of the human body has been affirmed" by the County Court.
