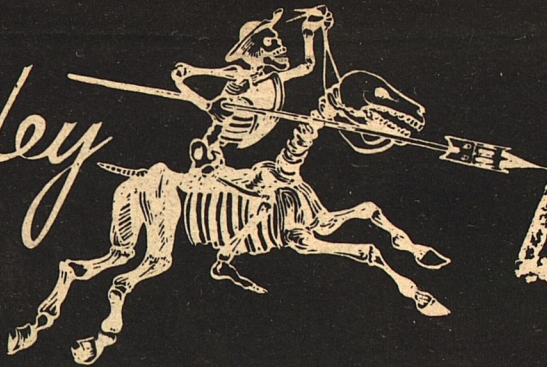

# WHAT COLOR IS A REVOLUTION?

"Who was that black I saw you with last night?"  
 "That was no black - that was a revolution!"

In a white world that has to keep airliners on the ground in California because they can't be "guaranteed" a landing in New York, what is one to think of the following statistics (compiled by the People's World):

NY City's public school system is made up of over 1,000,000 students, 57,000 teachers, 370 administrators, spending 1.4 BILLION dollars each year, yet -

More than 50% of the students are black or Puerto Rican but more than 90% of the teachers are white and about 95% of the administrators are white.

These are the statistics of a revolution. Consider...

Under French, Spanish, and British rule, the entire Arab world - from the Atlantic shores of Africa to the Suez Canal had NO universities for the natives.

Under French, Spanish, and British rule, the entire continent of Africa had little or no colleges for the natives.

Under French rule in "French Indo-China" (now Vietnam, etc.), there were less than 900 college students a year!

(In the Philippines, the United States was different. Sgt Pepper couldn't move twenty miles without seeing a school, a high school or a college).

But INSIDE the USA, the black peoples have been kept out of school and universities just like the colonial peoples mentioned above.

The natives, however, are getting restless.

"Policemen, provoked by bottle, rock and garbage throwing students, charged a crowd of 1000 outside a school...many were injured, including several children about 12 years old."

SF State? No. Oakland Tech High? No. "Bands of teenagers

roamed through Manhattan and Queens, smashing windows and tearing up subway stations."

New York City, where our planes can't be "guaranteed" a landing - too many tourists going to Europe. "Melees erupted at several high schools in Brooklyn's Ocean Hill-Brownsville District, focal point of the 35-day strike."

Since the blacks can't administer and teach their own children in their own schools, nothing short of a revolution will bring the Man around.

This, of course, is lost on the power structure - be it Hayakawa, Alioto, or Mayor Lindsay (of NYC). Instead, they will bring in more cops and beat more kids.

That's what we are doing in Vietnam - and losing.

"Commander of a big allied task force tightened a cordon near Da Nang yesterday and laid down a surrender-or-die ultimatum to Communist troops inside the noose." That was last week.

This week, "a US Marine force walked into a Communist trap 13 miles south of Da Nang...the Communist fire was so heavy, Marine ambulance helicopters were unable to reach the US wounded."

On Thursday (Dec 5), US Marines gave a "three day or else" warning to nearly 2,000 South Vietnamese villagers "to leave their homes."

The civilians are placed in "refugee camps."

This is STILL part of operation "Meade River" and the villages are only nine miles from Da Nang where the US Marines are trapped by the NLF.

Look - for Christ sake! "Operation Meade River" has been going on for over a week and, instead of putting a noose around the NLF, they put one around us.

The NLF has NO helicopters, bombers, napalm, tanks, New Jersey Battleships with 16-inch guns - all they got is guts.

Just like the blacks in America.

The military mind (continued): "The Navy appears to be eager to help make the film (of Pearl Harbor) because the picture will advance public awareness of carrier airpower - in which the US Navy has a big stake." - AP this week).

Okay. The day before Pearl Harbor, the Admirals were before Congress, asking for more money for BATTLESHIPS and not carriers. They claimed "an airplane has never sunk a battleship."

The reason carriers were used during WW II was because that's all we had, the Japanese knocked out most of our battlewagons at Pearl - the others we kept under wraps because of Japanese airpower.

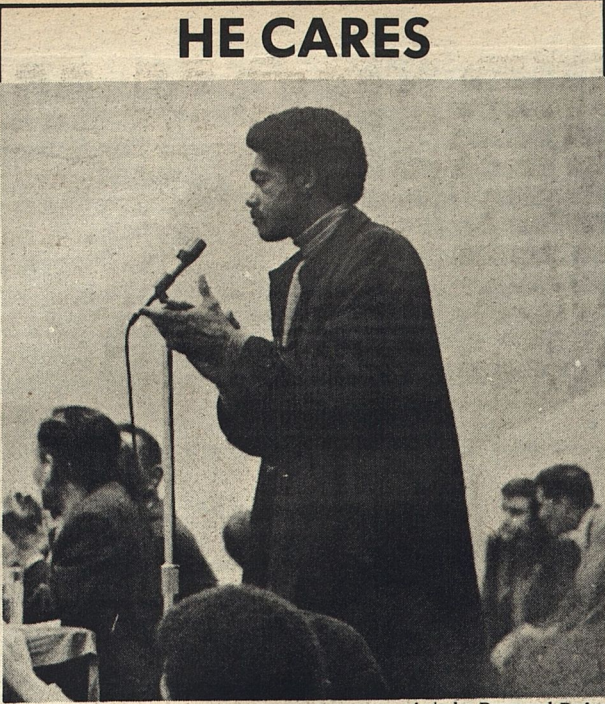

# SEALE LAUDS NLF AT MONTREAL MEET

"The NLF called themselves the Yellow Panthers, and we called for Yellow Power to Ho Chi Minh."

Bobby Seale did his thing in Montreal this past weekend at the Hemispheric Conference against the war in Vietnam and was rapping about it.

"We can really relate to the NLF," Bobby said.

"They send us a care package of inspiration, and we help them by making a revolution in America, by fighting the racist pig power structure. Resistance is our care package for the Vietnamese."

The conference had "a lot of jive cultural nationalists," he related, "and some black CIA saboteurs. They formed a sort of black caucus and demanded that the conference pass a resolution supporting black liberation in America as a major demand or they would walk out."

Seale emphasized, "The Black

Panthers are internationalists."

"At a conference like this," he pointed out, "it's wrong to push our struggle ahead of anyone else's. The purpose was to support the Vietnamese in their struggle against American imperialism, our common enemy. We opposed the cultural nationalists and I guess you could say we saved the Conference from disruption."

"We're remembering the faces of the saboteurs, and someday we're going to kill them," he said.

"It was a real privilege to meet with the Vietnamese. They are the leaders of our common worldwide struggle."

The Panther "also dug the French Nationalists in Quebec. They don't jive, and they're not social democrats. They relate to guns and bombs, and are true brothers of the Black Panther Party." -- S.A.

## BIGGER 'N' BETTER BOMBS BLAST MOVEMENT SHOPS

The peninsula is blowing up -- bit by bit.

Bombs and Molotov cocktails have been added to the brick and bottle arsenal of the unseen yahoos who have hit and run at various movement offices and stores in Palo Alto and environs.

Kepler's Book Stores have absorbed the brunt of the window breaking, suffering attacks by hatchet, brick, bullet as well as explosive device.

The Midpeninsula Free University Store was the latest victim December 2 of a black powder pipe bomb which demolished pottery and artworks in their store valued at \$500. Most of the wares were on consignment, so the individual artists suffered the loss.

Other targets of bombers have been the Resistance office and the Kennedy Action Corps.

At the MFU an interesting technical point was made. The front window was blown out into the street by the blast -- in one piece.

Tired of having it broken, MFU had had the glass window replaced by one of Lexan, a tough, flexible plastic which is impossible to

crack. It was back in place an hour after the blast.

Two cops were scheduled for the MFU's Co-ordinating Council meeting this week to explain why the superfuzz can't find the bombers. LF

Poland set off half-believing one such rumor, but upon its disproof by cold reality took the opportunity to counterpose his own utopian ideals to that reality.

"Bill Graham loves you so much he's gonna let you in free!" cried the preacher strong in his Faith as he hit the bricks once more.

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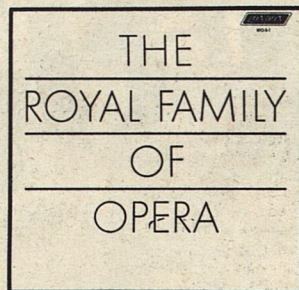
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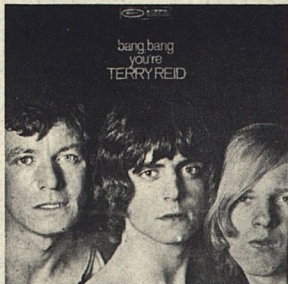
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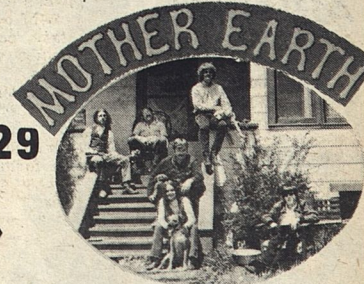
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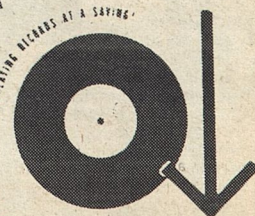
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# BLACKS BACK BROTHERS

## BLOODY AND BATTERED...



SF STATE THURSDAY--

Yesterday's talk of the black establishment leaders looked like the start of a revolution. For the first time they joined the revolutionary black students and Third World on SFS campus.

They pledged to lay their bodies on the line, even their lives. They finally realized their lives are bound together.

Today, there was more of this talk. Everybody was there, from Willie Brown to Ron Dellums. There also were spokesmen from Chinese, Japanese, Filipino, Chicano, and many, many black organizations. (Sadly, no industrial unions have put their bodies on the line.)

But... history grabs us by the balls. "We can't hold endless rallies. This has got to stop. Willie Brown - come join us!"

A young black issued this cry on the steps of the Ad Bldg, right under the amazed nose of deputy police chief Al Nelder.

At THIS precise moment, the revolution bloomed into being. Hundreds of students poured into the building, chanting "We Want The Puppet - We Want The Puppet!" Chief Nelder looked upset.

So did most of the minority brass, for the difference between words and thought is action. Any idea without action is a fraud.

From the top of the building came the riot call. Circling the grassy sward of the commons, that small group of black and whites looked awful lonely. Then an amazing thing happened... Students started walking between the police and joined Dr. Goodlett in the lonely middle until the area again was filled with students!

All this time, Hayakawa was announcing via his private loud-speaker on top the Ad Bldg, "The police have been called - clear the campus. You will be arrested. There are no innocent bystanders." (The cops had just cleared his building with mace).

More students joined the others inside the police lines. After two minutes, Dr. Goodlett was arrested. Then the police started their little game of "sweep the campus".

As they formed a solid phalanx and make the sweep, we would pour around the cops and FOLLOW them across the grass.

Three paddywagons were brought in to follow the police, and us. Among the cops were men from Berkeley (without badges), Alameda, Fremont, and the CHP.

By pushing the students off campus, however, the police created a massive traffic jam on 19th Avenue in front of the Ec House. Students unhooked trolleys from the street cars and rolled parked cars down on the cops.

Meanwhile, back on campus, the aimless, endless sweeps of the police produced the following message over the cop-radio: "let obvious students stay on campus."

To this hardcore bystander-reporter, it seemed time to split. Thursday thus ended with a double-victory for the students and a flop for the minority brass.

So when push came to shove, the only black community leader who put his body on the line was Dr. Carleton Goodlett. Speaking eyeball with the SF Tactless Squad, he announced to the police ringing in the militant blacks and other students --

"If you arrest us, you must take us all. Bud do it non-violently."

Dr. Goodlett was arrested. So was campus chaplain, Jerry Pedersen (Lutheran and white), who was handcuffed, roughed up and put in in a paddy wagon.

Another priest at the Ecumenical House across from the campus was arrested. So were a few students. The students got beat up.

That young black on the steps of the Ad Building made history when he called for no more words but lots more action.

## PIGS PANIC, KIDS COOL

Tuesday, San Francisco -- clear and cool.

Tuesday, S.F. State -- brows clouded, blood boiling, blood spilt.

On the edge of the campus, at 19th Avenue and Holloway, a crowd waits for the light to change. Cars zoom by on the 6-lane thoroughfare, people waiting for the tram, ladies walking by with shopping bags.

Suddenly -- hut, hut, hut. Heads turn. Everyone stops. A squadron of 15 blue-helmeted troops emerges from the trees, marching in formation. Each with a long piece of manhood in his hand. Their commander scans the horizon with field glasses, beaming in on the Ecumenical House across 19th Avenue.

"Looks like Murray over there." The sergeant is looking at a group of blacks across the street. One of the blue helmets raises a black-gloved fist. His companions laugh. A forced laughter to show courage to the on-lookers.

Hut, hut, hut. The light changes. They meander off like overgrown boyscouts playing at war. They head for their recuperation and rest center a block away at the Park Merced Commons.

"Wow, what a bunch of porkers," a bystander comments. "And people feel sorry when we call them pigs."

THE BATTLE

At 1:30 p.m., about 3000 people

are in the central quadrangle. A scattering of blue-banded strike-breakers are visible on the outskirts of the throng. An "illegal" rally is just finishing. There were no microphones.

At 1:50, a black student on the platform shouts, "On to BSS!" Fists go up in support, and the mass moves up the hill chanting, "On strike, shut it down! On strike! Shut it down!"

The Business and Social Science building is undefended. No cops close by. Inside strikebreakers press against windows to watch the action. But as the missiles

start to fly, their faces vanish.

Big-paned windows smash out, the shout of "Strike!" continuing. It's over in a few minutes and the strikers move toward the Ad Building, chanting "Down with Hayakawa!"

Suddenly, all hell breaks loose. Troops appear from all directions, going after the crowd with clubs. One foolhardy Tac man, Paul Juul, runs into the crowd by himself. Next minute his mates are guarding his unconscious body. "Back! Get back!" They prod with their black sticks.

## THE GLOBAL VILLAGE IDIOT

Proof that Prof. S. I. Hayakawa is the global village idiot of 1968 was established Wednesday morning when he addressed the leaders of the black community and told them how he had "cleaned toilets" as a youth.

He explained that he "knew" Negroes because he had "slept in their homes in Chicago." He called a black lady at the meeting "baby" and insisted that "Newsroom" (Chan 9) reporter, Mel LaPlace, be thrown out of the gathering.

Gov Reagan's happy choice for SF State had as his main thrust that if you work and study hard, like he did, and wash a few toilets, you wouldn't be striking today.

Sometime around this point, Councilman Ron Dellums, of Berkeley, said, "This man is a puppet. We are talking to the wrong man."

Dr. Carleton Goodlett then remarked that "We have taken a half hour of his time and he has taken a half hour of our time."

Hayakawa stormed out of the meeting, shouting "You are all irrational people!"

Mel LaPlace said his feelings were that the professor of Semantics spoke to the leaders of the black community "as if they were children."

But Dr. Goodlett put it where it's at. "Hayakawa has created an impossible void - he no longer

can serve as a spokesman for the minority and black communities."

Not only has the student body government at SFS asked Hayakawa to quit, but even the leading Japanese-American newspaper in the US thinks, "Dr. Hayakawa is not and never has been a man of our community."

While supporting the BSU's program (but deploring its tactics), the 'Hokubei Mainichi' (SF) editorial goes on to state "it was stupid of him...to expect any sort of personal support from our community."

Editor Howard Imazeki writes Hayakawa is "yet too small to occupy the responsible presidential chair permanently."

## JUST ABOUT EVERYTHING 'ILLEGAL'

The thing about SF State is this...

Prof S.I. Hayakawa was "appointed" at a secret meeting - all subsequent tactics of the administration flow from this secret meeting -

This meeting was not repeat not shut down and was hailed as a victory by the striking students who had been repeatedly "warned" see p. 10

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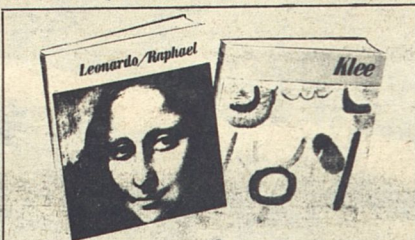
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# To House A Panther

"Even the so-called liberals won't rent to us," Patricia Hilliard told BARB this week.

"Every time the real-estate man finds out David is a Black Panther organizer, he mysteriously finds someone else to rent the house," she said.

Patricia is the wife of Black Panther Chief of Staff David Hilliard.

They and their four children are presently living in a cramped apartment with Patricia's father.

The pigs take the place out day and night.

"This place is too crowded to bring up a family in and we would like to find someplace that we thought the pigs weren't getting

ready to pounce on," Mrs. Hilliard said.

"One time when they had David arrested," Patricia related, "the pigs came up to our next-door neighbor and tried to get her to swear on a complaint for being noisy."

"They were trying to find an excuse for breaking into our apartment," she pointed out. "We think they would plant something and then try to take the children away because they would say we were unfit parents."

Patricia told how they "had a deal with a Negro," but after he found out who they were, he pulled out of the deal.

She feels "property owners are under some sort of pressure and

are afraid the pigs will break up their house."

She told BARB, "A few nights ago, there was a fire in the next yard and we suspect the pigs tried to throw something incendiary into our yard and missed."

The Hilliards would like to find a decent place to live in North Oakland, Berkeley (away from the pig station) or Emeryville.

To rent an apartment to a Black Panther is a radical political act, the pigs won't like you and they might not like your property. If that doesn't get your digestion upright and you know of a place available, contact David Hilliard at the Black Panther National Headquarters in Berkeley.

The Walker report on Chicago is liberal pluralistic jive. It sees a variety of competing elements as responsible for the violence that took place during the Democratic National Convention. It sounds like a description of the mythic checks and balances that control the American economy.

I think the whole thing might be a set up. If the Federal government comes down with indictments against the Yippies and the National Mobilization, they can make it all seem democratic by busting a few pigs to show they're against violence on both sides.

This report was put together by liberals, and they must be proud of their work. They have disassociated themselves from the fat ugly police that made Walter Cronkite cry over National Television, without in any way identifying themselves with the bloody anarchists of the streets.

We should not think that we have found new allies. Instead, our Prosecutor has been provided with a liberal cover. He must be a very grateful man.

## LAW TEST ON KID BUGGERS

A suit was filed Wednesday in San Francisco Federal Court challenging the harassment of ghetto youths by police.

Attorneys for ten Mission District juveniles claim a section of the California Welfare and Institutional code is unconstitutional. "Section 601 allows preventive detention," Michael Sorgen, one of the attorneys told BARB Thursday. Under our system this should not exist. Juveniles should only be picked up if they commit a delinquent act, not just for being out on the street," he said.

Sorgen, who works for the San Francisco Neighborhood Legal Assistance Foundation, says that under Section 601 police are given blanket authority in picking up youths.

"We are working on establishing a harassment pattern," he said. "This law is often applied to minority youths who haven't done anything wrong. They are detained in Juvenile Court, fingerprinted and photographed. After they are picked up several times they get a record as delinquents."

Section 601 was originally designed to keep youths from leading "idle, dissolute or lewd life." But it does just the opposite for it gives juveniles criminal records.

## COME AND SEE JUSTICE SUCK

The first party in the Smith case, which is still an embarrassment to the Berkeley establishment, is going on trial Monday.

Harriet Smith will stand trial for illegally placing a poster on a telephone pole and interfering with a police officer.

Harriet was arrested last summer along with a friend and her 65-year old grandmother when police charged into her home, MACED the grandmother, and hit her over the head with a telephone.

All of this because Harriet was suspected of placing a poster on a utility pole.

How this simple offense escalated into the police violence which ensued, was never explained. One of the arresting officers was subsequently suspended from the force.

Harriet's grandmother was charged with assault and both Harriet and a friend, Fred Smith, were charged with interfering with a police officer.

For those interested in hearing the Berkeley Browns try to explain THIS one, the Smiths encourage spectators at the Monday morning court appearance in Berkeley. - tar

# INDIAN OUT TO ZAP U.S.

An American Indian is fighting the United States army. Donald Bitsie, a member of the Navajo tribe, is refusing induction into the armed service on the grounds

that his Original Indian Rights supercede the rights of the selective service system to draft him. His effort so far has left the American legal system "red-

faced".

Bitsie's trial, set for November 12, was postponed, due to the fact that both the presiding judge and prosecuting attorney recommended "waiver of jury". They felt a jury would not understand the "legal explanations" as well as a judge would.

Donald has demanded his right to a jury trial in a federal court. He feels "his Original Indian Rights to homeland and self-determination have not been relinquished through sale or surrender, through treaty, or any other means, and therefore the U S has no rights to enact laws affecting him on Indian owned lands of California."

On December 9th a district court in SF will try to "legally explain" why Donald is no longer entitled to his rights.

Bitsie received heavy support from his Indian brothers at the November 12th trial. Members of the Hopi, Navajo, Shoshone, Paiute, Mohawk, Yurok, and Maidu tribes were present. Many of the brothers traveled hundreds of miles at great expense to attend. The postponement has only made them more determined to see the trial through.

Bitsie's new trial is set for Monday, December 9, at 10 am in the U S District Court (Federal Building - 450 Golden Gate Ave) in San Francisco. It should be a real gathering of the tribes... Honest Injun'.

## PARTY

The Oakland Opposition Center will celebrate the opening of its new office with a party Saturday night, December 7.

The new office is at 5003 Foot-hill Blvd. in East Oakland. Staff member Mickey Tennenbaum told BARB that all interested people are welcome.

"The Center will function as a political and community headquarters for East Oakland groups opposed to war, racism and poverty," staff director Linda Sanborn said.

One of the continuing functions of the center is draft counselling, which is available from 12 to 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

The Center is trying to organize a free food and clothing night on Tuesdays. Tennenbaum told BARB that this would be a permanent thing if it can gain enough support. He is asking people to give donations for this purpose.

"We would also like to get advice from someone who has experience with this kind of thing," Tennenbaum said.

## WOULDN'T THEY LIKE TO KNOW?

A pig car stalled outside the Panther office in Berkeley this week, and everybody shouted, "Hey, do you know where Eldridge is? We can't find him. Will you find him for us?"

Bobby Seale recounted the incident while rapping with BARB. "The pig was really red-faced," he said.

In a more serious vein, Seale explained why Eldridge didn't submit last week.

"The reason Eldridge didn't show up," he said, "was that the pig murderers of the people can make no laws that are binding on us. They have won their power through the blood of our people. The Black Panthers will never submit to the authority of the executioner."

"Eldridge committed no crime in the eyes of the people," he concluded, "there is no reason why he should go to jail."

# HUEY HASSLED

Huey Newton's refusal to work for less than the minimum legal wage is being used "as an excuse to isolate him from the rest of the prisoners, and to keep him in jail for a long time," Berkeley lawyer Alex Hoffman charged in an interview with the BARB this week.

Alex had visited Huey last weekend. From what he saw, it is obvious to him that the political persecution of Huey P. Newton is continuing behind the walls of the San Luis Obispo jail.

"There are many prisoners who are taking courses in higher education in lieu of doing menial work," the lawyer pointed out.

Huey has offered to take courses, but the authorities have refused, and have confined him to his cell."

Huey has refused to do any work for which he is not paid \$1.25 an hour. It's not hard to see how happy it would make the pigs to put a broom in Huey's hands and have him sweep up their pig sty.

"They are trying to build up a discipline record against Huey and to use this as an excuse for not paroling him," Hoffman explained.

"They let Huey out of his cell for three hours a day for meals, but other prisoners are warned they cannot speak to him."

One guy was sent to a stiffer prison because he was friendly, according to Hoffman.

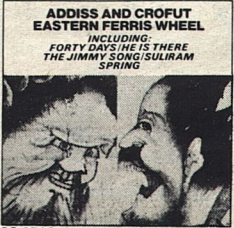
Although Huey can't use library and recreation facilities, according to Alex, he still gets his subscription to the San Francisco Chronicle. Ramparts Magazine was recently banned from the prison.

They sent Huey Newton to San Luis Obispo because it's far away from Berkeley and it's the sort of place that cons were not likely to make trouble in. It's one of those soft berth places for old people and small offenders.

But apparently Huey turned out to be too contagious to be allowed free movement even in prison, so they have locked him up in an allday cell.

If we forget about our brother, they will throw away the keys.

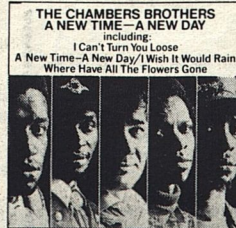
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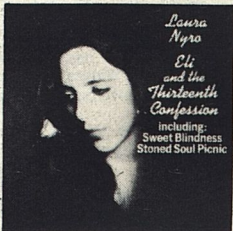
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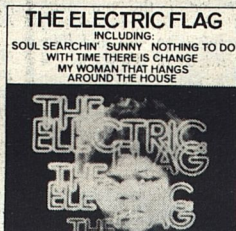

 enough. A mistake. The cop jerks him inside a circle of troops. As they are trying to wrest him to the ground, a blue bastard charges from ten yards away and administers the coup de grace with a club to the student's groin. All the while, the strikers are shouting, "Pigs, Pigs, you fucking pigs! Let him go!"

Overhead, helicopters whirl. Black leathery reinforcements arrive, fan out and expand the occupied territory.

The students back up. "Walk, don't run." Then from the other side, 50 more troops. Which way to go? Press men scurry out of the center, holding their little yellow cards in the air.

Then, a second charge. Unexpected. It hits the library steps, not the center. Girls scream. Students fall over each other trying to get out of the way. Most were fast enough to get safely inside the library.

The library steps are quickly secured. Several students dragged away. Charged with obscenity for being too slow to escape, or with assault for hitting a billyclub with their head.

By 2:10, stormtroopers control the central quadrangle of the campus. Two hundred standing in a big circle keep students off the grass. Quiet. Tense.

A creaky loudspeaker yaps. "Attention! Achtung! This is your acting president Hayakawa speaking."

Crowd reaction. "Fuck you, Hayakawa!" Drowning out part of his slow droning voice. "This is declared an illegal assembly. Please disperse."

By 2:30 the campus is at a virtual standstill. The student guerrillas have won again!

Several hundred strikers lock arms and proceed to walk off campus. "On strike. We'll be back!" they chant, marching to 19th Avenue.

About 50 Highway Patrolmen are coming the other way for the afternoon shift. The bewildered brown-shirts stand to one side and let the students pass. "You can have the college. We'll be back tomorrow," some girls shout. The cops are equipped for rough stuff, without badges and neckties.

Of the 350 military personnel on campus Tuesday, only one black was noted.

### CLASSROOMS

It was evident to anyone around on Tuesday afternoon that, des-

pite claims by the CAE and Hayakawa, very little classroom teaching was going on.

Inside the HLL Building, the halls were almost empty. Notes on doors told the story. Room 124 had a sign by professor Michael Gregory.

"Regretfully I must announce memorial services for the late San Francisco State College to be held at the times formerly set for classes. This is providing the military government of this college permit our meeting at all."

English 256, 186, 156; Anthro 124, 136, 165.1; Lit 52.1 and 177 were among the numerous courses with notes on the doors telling students to go off campus to Temple Methodist Church.

Edwin Kelly, an econ prof had a handwritten paper on his door, "No exam until problems settled."

The Journalism Department door said, "We will meet on campus only if it is clear no off-campus police will be used."

### PRESS CONFERENCE

At 4 p.m., the acting president is scheduled to hold a press conference. About 40 cameramen and reporters are crowded in a stuffy hot little room, waiting for him to appear.

Outside, there is still the noise of debate, arguments between the blue bands and strike supporters.

"Close the windows, we don't want any flying glass," someone says, drawing feeble laughter from the pressmen.

Hayakawa comes in alone. Clad in a red and white lei, smiling. He reads a long prepared statement. "I want to make it clear to everyone that I am determined to break this reign of terror."

"Classes will continue to meet at their regular times. I want to urge students, faculty, and staff to exercise responsibility in their campus conduct. Do not form crowds. Do not join crowds that already exist. There are NO innocent bystanders in this situation, because a bystander, even of innocent intent, serves to shield with his body the activities of the trouble-makers."

"We will continue to cooperate with the officers on campus. Arrests and suspensions from college will continue."

Hayakawa says he is optimistic about the future. He says class attendance was higher than expected.

not to hold this meeting.

One reason why was described by the SF Chronicle. "Donald Stewart, the campus' chief security (sic) officer, approached the platform with three uniformed and helmeted policemen at noon, but the anguished cries of the speakers and activists in the crowd made their apparent attempt to shut down the rally unsuccessful," stated the paper.

Again: "With the help of some 50 Highway Patrolmen, the 250 police at one point had the ring-leaders surrounded. But they refused to move in because of the much larger number of onlookers (sic) than rebels also caught in

knows this is pure bullshit. Their faces show it. They have seen for themselves what took place at 2 p.m., they know that no classes were being held on campus."

Hayakawa brushes off questions about mass faculty resignation, calling the national guard, or closing off the campus. "I'll think about that when the time comes," he says.

He describes his two days as president as the "most exciting days since I was ten and first rode the roller coaster."

To one reporter, he retorts, "You're in tough luck, baby, if you don't know what anarchists are."

Somehow his attempt at humor doesn't come off. Reporters look at each other, shaking their heads. "This guy is amazing," one says. "Everything is a joke to him." "Now I've seen what a puppet is like," comments another.

By 4:30, few students are left on campus, some clustered in discussions. By the library steps, an overturned table. Next to it, crumpled papers, discarded film, and a pool of blood.

the circle."

Prof Hayakawa was held a virtual prisoner by his own "security" force. They would not let him out of his office after his wire-tearing spree.

What the police were after, later in the afternoon, was the successful tactic of the student-strikers in moving about the campus OUTSIDE the buildings where classes were still being held and banging on the walls and windows of the classrooms.

Earlier, the administration played loud music over THEIR loudspeakers to drown out the dissidents, but to no avail. When the strikers found Hayakawa was not going to come to them after the rally, they went to him.

Holding a mass meeting on the steps on the Ad Building, English instructor George Murray, a Black Panther leader, brought it all together by stating, "Let's put these motherfuckers up against the wall - let's go in and see Hayakawa."

As the students poured into the building shouting "Hayakawa, show

your face!", the Tactless Squad - complete with a huge "pepper-fog" (gas) machine trotted into the building and sealed it off.


Then, inexplicably, they trotted back out a few minutes later, only to come back AGAIN within the next half hour.

The second time they came back, this reporter was helping a girl student who was closing the windows sticking out along a passage-way. "People can get cut on these edges," she said.

Then we latched opened the doors of the Ad Building at the precise moment the fuzz was trotting back in again? "They probably think we are opening the doors for them," I said as we walked the other way.

Meanwhile, back at the loud speakers, voices were calling for "5,000 students Tuesday to shut this campus down." The administration's faceless voice was silent.

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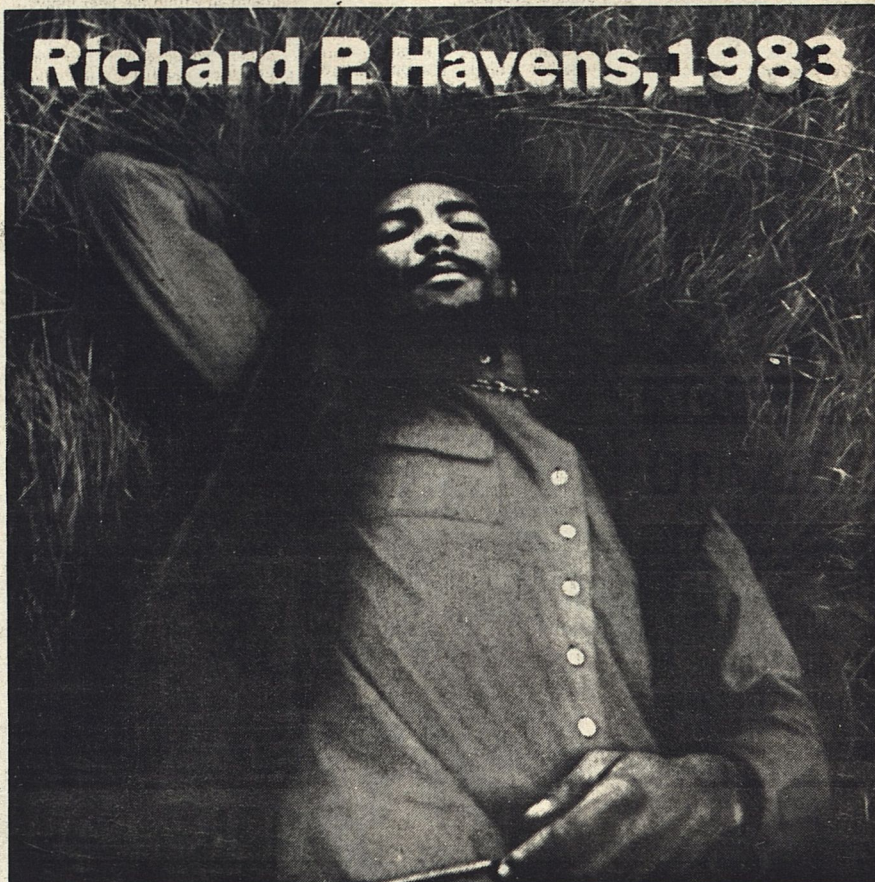
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# GI CONFAB TO FOLLOW CHRISTMAS

A National GI-Civilian Antiwar Action Conference has been called for Chicago on December 28th. This conference is part of a week-end series of meetings between GIs and civilians to plan joint projects and call a mass antiwar action in the spring.

The call for the conference was initiated by the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (SMC) and has already been endorsed by 10 active duty GI and veteran peace organizations and 6 GI antiwar newspapers.

"GIs have the legal right to oppose a war they are being forced to fight and which is not in their interest and in which they do not believe," Howard Petrick staff member of SMC says. "We support their legal right to free speech and urge them to join us in massive antiwar protests."

A GI Teach-in will be held the evening before the conference on December 27 to discuss the history and nature of the Vietnam war and the civil liberties of GIs and what forms of protest activities they may legally participate in. A major portion of the program will be an open mike for servicemen to express their opinions.

The day following the GI-Civilian conference, on December 29, the SMC will hold a national student conference to take up specific tasks and projects of that student based organization. SMC supported demonstrations in some 12 cities during the fall antiwar actions involving tens of thousands of civilians and over a thousand active-duty GIs.

A number of active-duty GIs who planned the nation-wide GI-led demonstrations in October are sponsors of the conference. Among them is Lt. (j.g.) Susan Schnall who is now being court martialed for her part in building and leading the October 12th demonstration in San Francisco.

Individuals endorsing the conference included among others, Donald Duncan of Ramparts, Clark Kissinger of the Guardian, and Michael Kennedy of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee.

The conference will be held during the Christmas holidays and in centrally located Chicago to make it easier for GIs to attend during their holiday leaves.

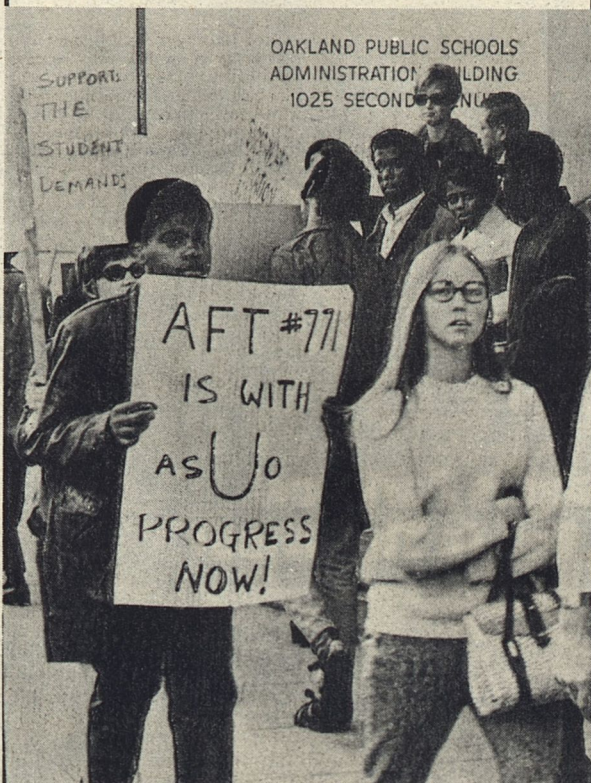

## NITTY-GRITTY SCENE AT OAKLAND BOARD

The Oakland Board of Education now faces the same situation that has led to open conflict at San Francisco State and other schools across the nation.

Tuesday at 4:00 p.m., a broad united front of high school students and teachers presented a list of 14 demands to the Oakland Board of Education. They threw up a picket line in front of the Board of Education to emphasize their demands.

The demands were made by the Associated Students Union of Oakland, a coalition of student groups from Oakland high schools, including the Black Student Union, Mexican-American Youth Association, Students for Political Action, Asian Bloc, Caucasian Association to Unite Student Efforts and other student groups.

About 50 Black, Mexican-American, Oriental and Caucasian students walked the picket line, together with about eight teachers from Oakland high schools who carried picket signs of support for the students by American Federation of Teachers local 771, Oakland Federation of Teachers, and Teachers for New Alternatives.

Support signs from two community groups -- S.E.D.G.E. and Oakland Opposition Center -- also appeared on the picket line.

No police were visible outside the building or near the picket line, although two police cars were parked in front.

BARB overheard a school secretary comment that "there's never been so many security guards around here before."

The Board of Education will hold a special noon meeting Friday to draft a written reply to student demands.

They include:

- Sensitizing of teachers, coun-

selors and administrators to problems, basic needs and history of Black, Chicano, American Indian, and Oriental students.

- Emphasized minority history as "an integral part of history and social studies at all grade levels."

- Re-evaluation of present text books and supplementary materials in reading, English, social studies, literature and history to include materials and works by authors such as Ellison, Baldwin and Leroy Jones, along with "contributions made by Black, Chicano, Indian, Oriental, etc."

- Four special classes in line with the foregoing.

- Vocational training classes... that train high school students for jobs that are in demand or will be in demand within the near future... such as computer programming, IBM, aircraft maintenance, etc."

Other demands were for more counselors, qualified tutorials, a human relations council in all schools, more minority teachers, and classes to do away with language barriers.

# QUIET

The latest attempts to bring educational activity at the University of California's Berkeley campus to a halt has come from the faculty-constituted Board of Educational Development (BED). Early this week, the BED turned

down 14 of a proposed 24 student-initiated and experimental education courses, and left the fate of remaining courses in doubt.

Twenty-one of the course ideas came from the Center for Participant Education (CPE), the group which originated the controversial Cleaver Social Analysis 139X course this quarter.

According to spokesman Rick Brown, the CPE submitted their program ideas to the BED as outlined by the procedure followed in past years. This year, because of the Cleaver scandal, they met with a solid wall of resistance from the credit-supplying BED body.

"This is essentially an attack on experimental education and student-initiated courses," Brown said. "The Administration has decided that these courses are a source of irritation to the Regents and the state legislature."

Brown said that the BED acted out of fear. "Because they are afraid of a Regental attack on the University, they have acted to remove the potential cause of any attack by curtailing the BED programs and virtually ending the CPE."

The BED was created by a recommendation of the Muscatine Committee in response to the Free Speech Movement. The CPE was begun in winter 1966-67 as a student group under the auspices of the BED only in so far as the faculty group's approval was necessary to obtain credit for CPE-suggested courses.

The effect of this week's refusal to approve the large part of CPE's program has been to "emasculate the BED," and "destroy the CPE" according to Brown.

In addition to the 21 courses suggested for next quarter by the CPE, one course was submitted by the Asian-American student group and one by the Mexican-American Student Confederation.

Fourteen courses were turned down by the BED at Monday's meeting. Brown explained that eight others were pending and that one had been tentatively approved. Those that are said to be pending, await appointments and money.

Brown suggested pessimistically that the so-called problem of "appointments and money" could be used as an excuse to deny any or all of the courses.

Once the BED has turned down a course proposal there are no channels for reconsideration or appeal. Brown said, however, that there was a chance that the Committee on Courses could consider granting credit to some of the student-initiated courses if they were resubmitted through departmental offices. He said they were investigating the possibilities but that it was already very late.

According to the Daily Cal, BED Chairman John Kelley admitted that his group was "in some respects yielding to external pressures generated by this quarter's furor over Social Analysis 139X."

Kelley also said that it was impossible to give each proposed course the amount of attention necessary for approval, the student paper reported.

Six of seven courses suggested by the CPE were immediately approved last quarter prior to the Cleaver ordeal.

Brown said that a S.A. 139X-B was not suggested by the committee because one of its principal participants would probably not be available.

## downer for 27

A San Francisco judge last week turned down a writ that would have freed GIs imprisoned in the Presidio stockade.

Judge Albert C. Wollenberg ruled that he has no jurisdiction over the military base in turning down a writ of Habeas Corpus submitted by Terence Hallinan, attorney for 17 GIs facing the death penalty for a supposed mutiny October 14.

The judge said that a writ should be sought through the Court of Military Appeals. Hallinan plans to do this, but is not optimistic about the outcome.

Hallinan has charged that conditions in the stockade are so bad that an injunction should be issued to prevent the Army from quartering other GIs there.

Meanwhile, outside supporters of the 27 soldiers facing the mutiny charges are waiting to see what decision will be reached by the commanding officer of the base after he reviews preliminary hearing reports of the October 14 incident.

Randy Keeler, a spokesman for the War Resisters League, told BARB Wednesday that he has received some favorable response from California Congressmen about the case. Senator Thomas Kuchel and Congressman Jeffery Cohelan and Willie Brown have replied that they are seeking inquiries into the case.

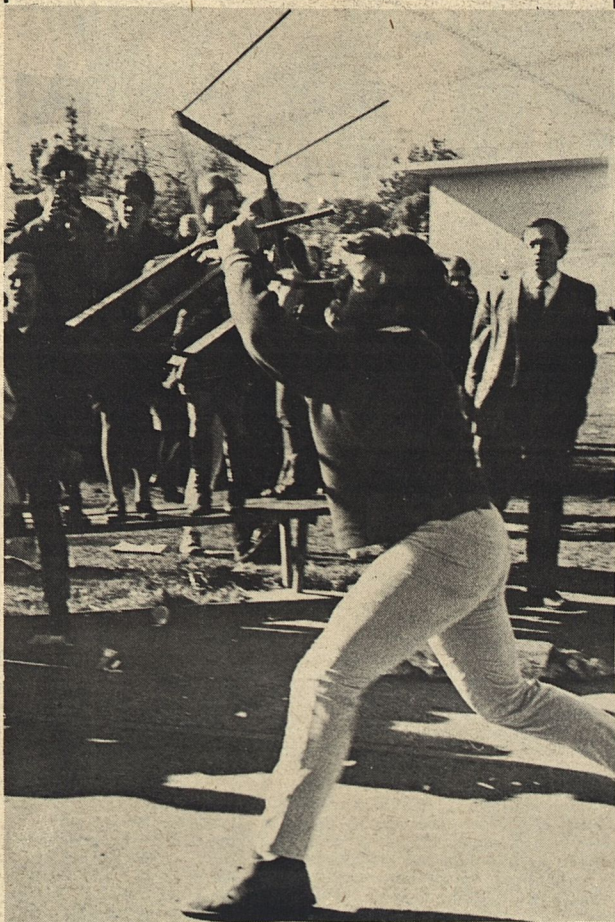

# THEY'RE SO QUIET THEY'RE HARDLY THERE

Downstairs, inside the battered BSS building, a small room serves as the office of the Committee for an Academic Environment (CAE). Perhaps 20 students with blue armbands were there when I entered. Guys in expensive sweaters and neatly groomed vitalis hair. Most are business and economic majors.

"We're passing out more blue ribbons than ever," one of them said.

"But when we get into trouble, it's hard to see one," a girl complained. "People are afraid to wear them."

"Lone wolf packs attack our members," Lowell Klucas complained. He handed me a leaflet which said, "SDS or SS. The radicals scream about dictators. But they've got the loudest Hitlers in America. What kind of shit is that?"

Another leaflet charged that

"The radicals plan to rule the campus with their own secret police force."

"We're not against the BSU and Third World program," Klucas said. "But we don't support their violence. I think an ethnic program is very good. Hayakawa supports it. We trust in him. But I don't believe all blacks who apply should be admitted just like that."

There are no minority students in the CAE. The blue ribbon clan claimed they had won the day. They said that attendance was as good as ever in their classes. "We're just students who want to get an education."

"We're for non-violence, yet the strikers attack us for wearing blue armbands," Klucas said. "And they call us racist pigs for that. Be sure you're fair to us in your paper," he added.

# ON COMING TOGETHER

A non profit cultural development corporation has been established at the old Fillmore.

The group is called Orumbi, which is Swahili for "coming together." It is replacing Mama Bear Productions which has been dissolved.

Performances will be given at the old Fillmore on 1805 Geary which is now renamed the New Drumm. "We will have new artists go on in conjunction with established performers," director Julio Ramirez said.

The auditorium will be available to any groups who want to use it

for community projects.

Besides Ramirez, other organizers of Orumbi include Roy Ballard from Black Man's Free Store, Anthony Williams from Dialogue Black and White, Charles Bible author of Black Hero Posters, and Ovid Adam an art teacher at Mc Clymonds High School in Oakland.

An initial fund raising program is planned for December 13, 14 and 15 at the New Drumm. Hyler Jones and the Fantastic Three are scheduled to perform.

The Friday 13 program at the New Drumm is a benefit to raise funds for students arrested and injured at San Francisco State.

Ramirez said that Orumbi is in need of office and sound equipment. Anyone wanting to donate items should call the Mission Switchboard 647-1012 for information.

# HOW TO MAKE IT BY LOOKING OUT FOR YOURSELVES

"You should be able to get General Assistance simply because jobs aren't available, or because you can't work for social reasons, but the law and current practices don't coincide," welfare lawyer Steve Antler taught his class of ten hippies.

"A doctor will examine you to determine your employability, so you should have in mind the valid reasons why you're ill (at least temporarily) and unable to work."

Panhandlers should forget about spare change, advises the Welfare Rights Organization, and get welfare checks instead.

Almost any poor hippy can get General Assistance (GA) aid of \$100 per month. Persons unable to work steadily can get more, about \$150 monthly in Aid To The Disabled (ATD), perhaps because of psychological alienation, previous mental hospitalization, or psychiatric 4F draft status.

Pregnant chicks, and mothers or couples with children, easily get AFDC if the father is gone or jobless.

As a local county program, GA lacks the procedural safeguards, clear policies, and "fair hearings" offered by federally-subsidized programs like ATD and AFDC. SF Neighborhood Legal Assistance Foundation hopes eventually to guarantee some rights for GA clients.

Many potential recipients wrongly assume they're ineligible. Others get shafted by the welfare department. To get full legal benefits, hippies should attend the Haight-Ashbury "welfare rights classes", sponsored by WRO and taught by attorneys from SF Neighborhood Legal Assistance Foundation.

Also they should take a trained layman "advocate" from WRO with them to the welfare office...you get better treatment from The Man when he knows you've got a group behind you.

If you don't know what to say when you apply, you can get bogged down. A hippy couple told their classmates they had been afraid to admit they were living together unmarried, so they had each applied for GA separately.

What's more, the dude was so anxious to please the welfare system that he tried to present himself as employable altho in fact he isn't (in today's society). Luckily they got sympathetic social workers who helped straighten out their contradictory stories. The couple applied and were rejected several times, but continued coming back every day and applying anew, and finally were approved.

As part of the qualifying process, the couple had to blow \$24 in a spending spree to reduce their savings to the one-dollar (\$1) maximum allowed in GA cases.

A single cat, newly arrived in SF after graduating from an eastern college, reported he got 10 days of GA for a bad cold. This illness had lost him his previous "job": selling blood plasma twice a week to the United Biologics skidrow bloodbank. He lives precariously in a downtown hotel while his home draft board tries to induct him into I-A-O noncombatant military service.

Parents were viewed as an obstacle in getting welfare. For

GA, unlike ATD, relatives are considered responsible for the applicant -- regardless of age. Welfare workers phone or write the parents of young people to solicit an offer of support. Like, "Sure he can come home if he shaves and goes to Mass every week and ..."

Once such an offer (however insincere) has been gotten, welfare won't do any more than buy you a ticket home and support you while you're waiting for your departure date.

Sympathetic parents can best help their hippie offspring by flatly telling the social worker, "Hell no I won't support my adult child whom I've kicked out of the house." Or by refusing to accept collect calls from the welfare department.

Single recipients must be 18, but if married only 16. There's no age minimum for mothers or pregnant girls. Antler strongly warned other juveniles against applying for welfare.

In the short run, argued a Welfare Rights Organization activist, applying for ATD might be the easiest way to get GA. When a person applies for a federal program, and says they are in immediate need, they usually get GA on an emergency basis during the several months of waiting for their AFDC, ATD, etc.

In such cases there's a better chance of getting GA in checks, instead of awkward IBM cards labelled "food order" and "rent order".

Classes will be held Monday evenings in the auditorium of Dudley Stone School in Haightbury. This first class, Dec. 2, was hurriedly moved to nearby All Saints' Episcopal Church when the school janitor failed to show up and let the shivering welfare group into the building.

Experienced welfare recipients are needed to serve as advocates.

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# BUFF NOT BLUFFED

Coogan's Bluff is incredible. Now playing at the United Artists and other theaters in the East Bay, it is the kind of film Ronald Reagan would enjoy after a hard day of smashing up higher education, farm workers and the mentally ill on the evenings when he's too tired to play with his electric train.

This film is where it's at, baby: a lovely allegory for middle aged fascists. A yummy bedtime story for Mayor Daley and the nice ladies from Richmond.

Clint Eastwood is Coogan, a Deputy Sheriff from Pite County, Arizona who travels to New York in order to bring back an escaped prisoner. Eastwood moves slowly like a bull with tired legs. He speaks in a self-righteous monotone from his lower abdomen with his face frozen in a dry grin reminiscent of Dick Nixon's Checkers speech back in the early fifties.

This is the most blatantly racist film I have ever seen. It opens with Coogan barreling a jeep through the Arizona desert hunting down an American Indian. Coogan and the Indian have a brief shoot out. Coogan wins; slugs the Indian in the stomach and stands grinning over him as he writhes in pain in the Arizona dirt.

He humiliates the Indian in a number of ways: by sneering "Put your pants on, Chief"; by refusing to give him a cigarette (a favor he grants his white prisoner at the end of the film) and by tying him up to his married lover's front porch while they make love in the bath tub.

There isn't any reason for this brutal Indian scene. It's totally unrelated to the rest of the story unless it was deliberately put there for an added touch of racism.

Later on in a New York police station a cop says to a Puerto Rican woman: "Look lady, why don't you just divorce the bum." And she responds in broken English: "I can't officer, we're not married." (A sock it to'em moral for the Yes on Proposition 14 crowd.)

Near the end of the film, Coogan

Lee J. Cobb plays McElroy a New York Police Lieutenant who is made out to be an exasperated nitwit because he keeps reminding Coogan of silly dumb things like the rights of the accused and due process of law. McElroy is the straight man in this obscene comedy. He feeds Coogan juicy lines and comments about the sissy old Supreme Court and what the Hell you've got to apply for extradition and Look Buster a doctor has to sign the bastard out of Bellevue.

Coogan, the simplistic simon pure upholder of rugged Goldwater individualism can't understand it. So he impersonates a New York cop to get Ringerman (the prisoner), played well by Don Stroud, out of Bellevue Hospital. (God, what some people will do in the name of law and order.)

The credits list several writers including Howard Rodman but they're not kidding me. I know George Wallace helped write it. Some of the lines spoken by Coogan in this Big Message movie are: "Pity? What color is Pity? Pity is red. The color of an Arizona Sheriff's blood spilled out all over a bus station floor because he had Pity for a criminal and let him say goodbye to his wife who slipped him a six inch knife and got it in his gut." (Get the message?)

Finally, Coogan gets his man after a groovy motorcycle chase (the best part of the film, lots of action) and then the really big swat at the Criminal Coddlers and the biggest boon yet for the Support Your Local Police boys. Coogan, the big two fist, virile Sheriff from Arizona makes a citizen's arrest. Because it's easier than going through all that commie legal red tape.

Coogan's Bluff was produced and directed by Donald Siegal. What's next, Don? The life story of J. Edgar Hoover, perhaps?

by the Supreme Court decision on Gault in 1967," Sorgen explained. "The Court stated that juveniles must have the same rights as others arrested on criminal charges."

Although a California court in 1953 declared Section 601 constitutional, Sorgen is optimistic that he can win because the total approach to juvenile delinquency is changing.

If the suit succeeds the overcrowded conditions in juvenile halls will be alleviated by eliminating arrests made without good reason, Sorgen claims.

The United States District Court has twenty days before it decides what action to take on the suit.



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### SOCIAL COMMENT:

Our society is so furtive and mid-Victorian about sensuality and sexuality, that anything connected with them, such as pregnancy, immediately becomes impossible to deal with on an open social level. Embarrassed, infantile loss of control is the usual response, or perhaps the usual scene of the woman being rejected by her family at the doorstep is just as frequent. The result is that the women of America end up wandering the Streets of Mexico and the U.S. looking for someone to help them, if the price is right, so they won't have to face the wrath and indignation of their "friends, loved ones, and society." I have flown to many places with a female gynecologist from the Bay area. We posed as a couple in need of help and contacted as many "doctors" as possible in order to see their facilities and techniques. We saw many young girls with their mothers and boyfriends, and older women, wives and daughters of "prominent and successful" members of American communities taking risks of tragic proportions. They have to do this because we in this country, who help castrate men in India by bribing them with transistor radios, can't allow a woman the privacy and control of her own body.

State legislation in the area of legalized abortion is degrading to the woman in need of help. Not only must she submit to the cross-examination of two psychiatrists and a hospital board, but she must sign a standard form which reads in part as follows:

"...the undersigned hereby authorizes the doctor and the hospital to release and disclose any or all information contained in the patient's medical record to the state department of public health, the district attorney of the county in which the pregnancy resulted, and any other instrumentality

of government required by law to receive such information."

I have yet to see an unborn child suffer on this earth but ten thousand of us starve to death each day. Perhaps after we are able to grant the right of survival to all viable post-natal human beings we will be able to afford the luxury of granting metaphysical and legal considerations to the fetus and perhaps even sperms and ova. Perhaps man should create new life as an act of will and not one of chance.

### PRACTICAL COMMENT:

If you are pregnant there are many considerations which should be made. Perhaps the following suggestions will be of assistance:

- 1.) If you are a teenage girl under the age of 18, you become, in the eyes of California Law, an adult the moment you become pregnant. You are then able to sign for, as an adult, any standard medical services you feel you need and this includes a therapeutic abortion. You may do this without any obligation to inform or involve your parents no matter how vigorously people insist that you should tell them.
- 2.) Very few girls who believe that their parents won't understand or help, find themselves to be quite mistaken. Most of the time the resources of help and understanding are available, but the lines of trust along which these resources flow are in need of reestablishment.
- 3.) Any girl 14 and above not living with her parents and declaring herself an emancipated minor is entitled to consideration as an adult according to California Law and may obtain any medical help she needs.
- 4.) If you are told of any doctor in the bay area who promises a miscarriage by the use of pills or shots don't fall for it. These medi-

cations are effective for the induction of a late period only and not for miscarriage. If you are told that someone was successful with this method, see if you can find out whether she had previously had a competent, positive, medical test for pregnancy. The answer will probably be no, meaning she was most probably just late and not actually pregnant.

- 5.) Be very careful in the use of mimeographed lists of doctors who perform abortions. These lists are sometimes sold for as much as twenty dollars and might give very dangerous and antiquated information. There have been many girls who have called my office having just returned to the bay area after spending large sums on plane fares, wandering the streets of Mexico, and having close calls or trouble with the Mexican police. They did this in hopes of calling one of the numbers listed and obtaining help only to be turned away.
- 6.) Abortion is illegal in Mexico, therefore the utmost care should be exercised.
- 7.) Abortion is very illegal and dangerous in the United States. Records show that from two to three hundred women died in the U.S. last year as a result of botched abortions and thirty of these were in California.
- 8.) Fifty percent of the maternal deaths in this country result from poor abortions.
- 9.) A medically competent abortion is three times as safe as gestation and childbirth.
- 10.) If you obtain an abortion of any kind, see a local doctor immediately. Most doctors will respect your privacy and needs for post-abortion care.

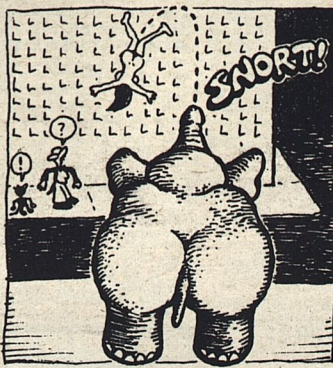
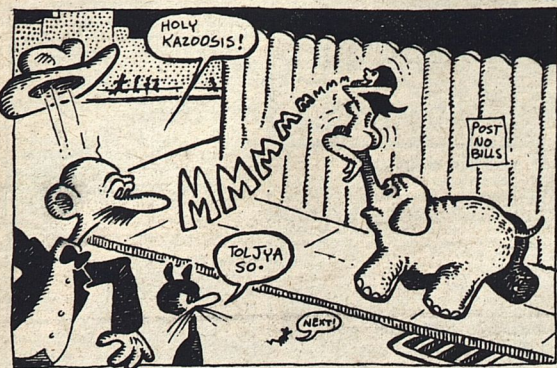
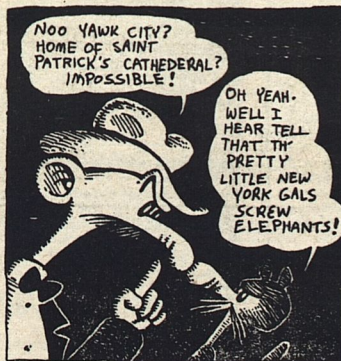
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# grapes.

United Farmworkers headquarters also reported this week that picket line operations are continuing at Lucky's stores in Berkeley and Oakland. Operations leader Pete Velasco said that he checks the grapes in the stores every morning, and "they are rotting in the stands".

In other words, nobody's buying.

Concerned people with time to spare for the picket lines, or the Delano Christmas Caravan, are urged by the strikers to contact the United Farmworkers at 655-3256 to see how they can be of the most help.

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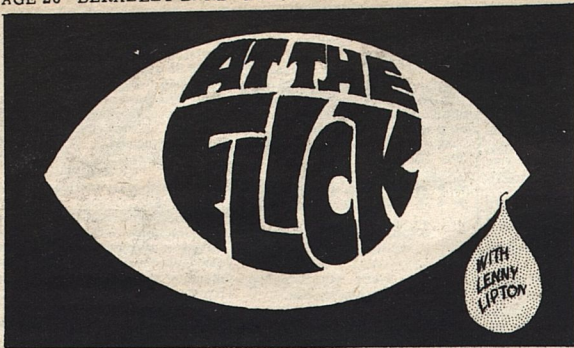

and it's time I had my tartar removed, if you know what I mean.

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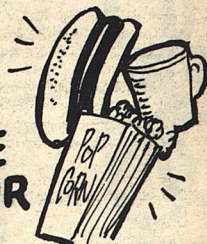
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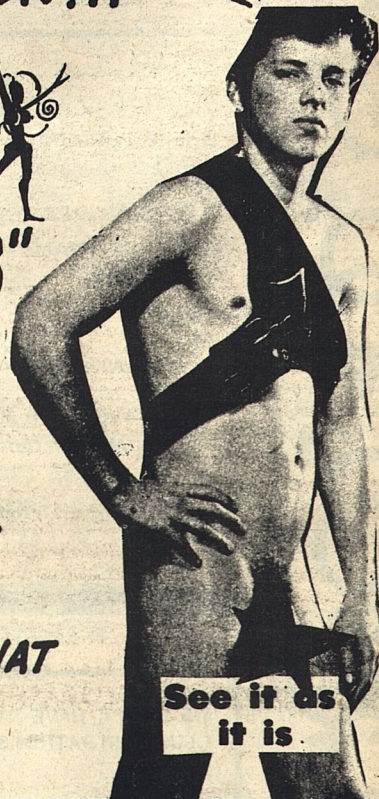

I have just seen the Magic Theatre production of Ubu Roi, and I find it hard to describe its impact. Best to say that it was equivalent to the play's initial impact, when I first read it years ago.

Back before the Problem of Evil became an In topic in intellectual circles, Alfred Jarry apparently just accepted evil as part of reality, put it down on paper like it is, and showed that even evil can have its comic side.

If the main protagonists of the play were to be regarded as human characters, the plot would be basically this:  
Papa Ubu, a loyal mercenary in the service of the king of Poland, is egged on by his wife to kill the king and usurp the throne (an obvious crib from Macbeth). Once successful in this, the dark side of his nature breaks loose, and he institutes a reign of horror until defeated and dethroned.

But don't make the mistake of regarding them as rounded human characters.

Papa Ubu is sheer, uncut, glacial human evil. He is the distilled essence of what we humans are capable of; a one-man Nazidom. Ken Grantham handles the role close to perfection; and his dead-white getup (like a really abominable snowman) underlines, in a way that conventional black would not, the iciness of real evil.

By contrast, Mama Ubu, "hardly full unsweet" (Charles Goldman is tremendous in the role) stands as forgivable human imperfection. She can steal the treasure, but not all the finance in the land. She can kill the king, so that she can be queen, but she couldn't kill everybody. Her husband's atrocities turn her against him, but don't make her see why she shouldn't get something for herself out of the mess.

We get into human characterization with Captain Bordure (the Falstaffian Kerrigan Prescott). Between Mama Ubu's charms, Papa Ubu's promise of nobility, and his own hatred for the king, he is enticed into the murder plot; only to find himself the helpless servant of evil, and then its victim. He could be you or me.

As to other players: Bob Hirschfeld makes a fine comic Botgrelas. Bob Gardner, among other roles, comes on strong as a magnificently decadent Czar Alexander. Charles Ingrassi is equally good as the queen and the horrifying Disembraining Machine. The protean Steve Brown shifts smoothly from role to role, king to peasant. Charles West, Rick Grould and Henri Piscioti are good

enough in minor roles to show that they could handle major ones. The famous element of vulgarity in the play is strongly brought out, but it would be hard to imagine anyone objecting. It is less a matter of mere coarseness than of stripping evil of any pretense to dignity. Papa Ubu letting a fart is funny; Papa Ubu licking blood off a weapon is not. After you've watched him pace the stage torturing rubber dolls, you'll find that a good forthright "Shit" clears the atmosphere.

The production involves cuts in the original text, and also additions, that may but purists. But there's no denying that director John Lion has done a notable job of making coherent and convincing a difficult play in which archetypes walk the boards along with humans.

Performances will be discontinued during the Christmas holidays, but will resume in January. R.R.

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# HIPPOCRATES

"My first year at Stephens College all the girls were getting weird diseases. They were just starting to make it with boys and went to the college dispensary with a whole lot of vaginal complaints-trichomonas, fungus infections and strange discharges that didn't seem to have a name."

We were discussing the ways emotional distress is often expressed through bodily complaints--once called psychosomatic illness, now termed psychophysiological illness. In females, distress is often literally discharged through the vagina. Gynecologists are all too familiar with stubborn vaginal infections that clear up only when the patient's mental state improves.

"I'll never forget my first gynecologic examination. I was really scared. Getting undressed wasn't so bad. Then I lay down on the examining table and the nurse put my feet in those metal things, what are they called?"

"Stirrups. They're to hold your legs up, apart and steady so the doctor can see everything he has to see."

"One of my girlfriends said she was examined by a doctor who didn't have a nurse in the room. I thought that was a law."

"There's no such law. The nurse is there to hand instruments to the doctor and also to protect him from the possibility of a rape charge. Some patients are a little nutty when they have to have pelvic examinations."

"So, there's no such law?"

"No. And I think some women would be more comfortable if only the doctor were there, though, of course, others feel better if a nurse is in the room. Doctors are considered good targets by some predatory patients and lawyers who know they are forced to carry malpractice insurance in large sums."

"Well, then the nurse hung a sheet over my legs. What's that for?"

"Some women get nervous when they see the doctor exploring their private parts. It's also less embarrassing for those who would be embarrassed--both doctor and patient."

"First, he seemed to be examining the outside of me. What was he doing?"

"He was examining the entrance to the vagina, the Bartholin glands which secrete lubricating fluid, the urethra and the clitoris."

"Then he used one of those instruments that are always so COLD!"

"That was a speculum. They're made of stainless steel and look something like a duck's bill. Many doctors try to warm them before use so they're less uncomfortable."

"What's it used for?"

"With a speculum a doctor can see the inside of the vagina, including the cervix. First he lubricates the two rounded blades of the speculum so it's easier to insert. After it's in the vagina, he can spread the blades by pushing a lever. If there's a discharge, he'll note the color and odor and can

take part of it for laboratory examination. Usually he'll do a Pap smear too."

"A Pap smear is a cancer test isn't it?"

"Yup. There's always some discharge even in the healthy vagina. Some of this mucus as well as a smear of the cervix is taken for microscopic examination. Very early cancer can first be picked up by examination of cells which have been sloughed from the cancerous tissue."

She shuddered, "I don't think I want any more Pap smears. It'd be horrible to find out I had cancer."

"Not at all. Cancer of the cervix in that stage is 100% curable."

"Anyway, that metal thing, besides being cold, is so hard. It hurts. Why don't they make them softer-like bodies." Her green eyes twinkled a bit.

"Well, they have to be sterilized for one thing. And I think that even if they were body soft (or hard) there would still be complaints of pain because many women are literally up-tight during

a gynecologic exam. Plastic speculums are available. That would solve the cold problem but they break easily and can be used only once so they're comparatively expensive.

"Because it was my first pelvic exam, the doctor decided to tell me about everything he was doing. After he finished the speculum examination, he examined me with his hands."

"A doctor's hands are among his most sensitive instruments. Part of a gynecologic examination includes palpating or feeling the internal organs of reproduction--the uterus, Fallopian tubes and ovaries."

"That's right", she said, "he would push up from inside me and have me feel just about the pubis with my hand whatever he was examining."

"Do you know what this is, he would ask."

"No, what is it?"

"That's your right ovary."

"He did that with both ovaries, tubes and my uterus. After a while, I wasn't scared at all. I was mostly curious about what I was going to feel next. Finally, he pushed up from inside again. What's that? What's that? I was really curious."

"That's my right index finger", he said.

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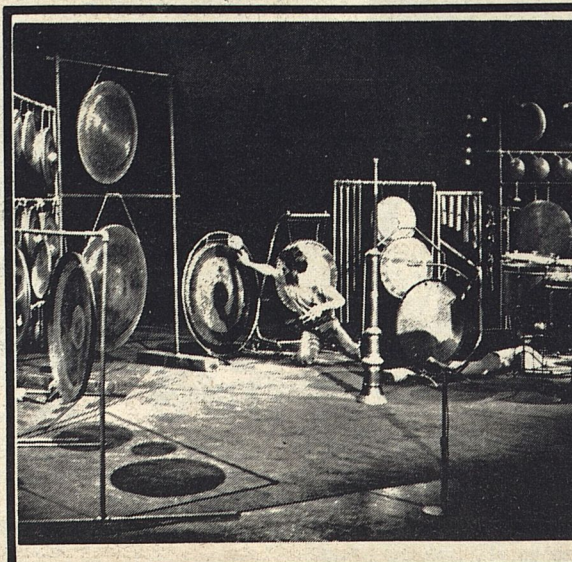
