and tomorrow.

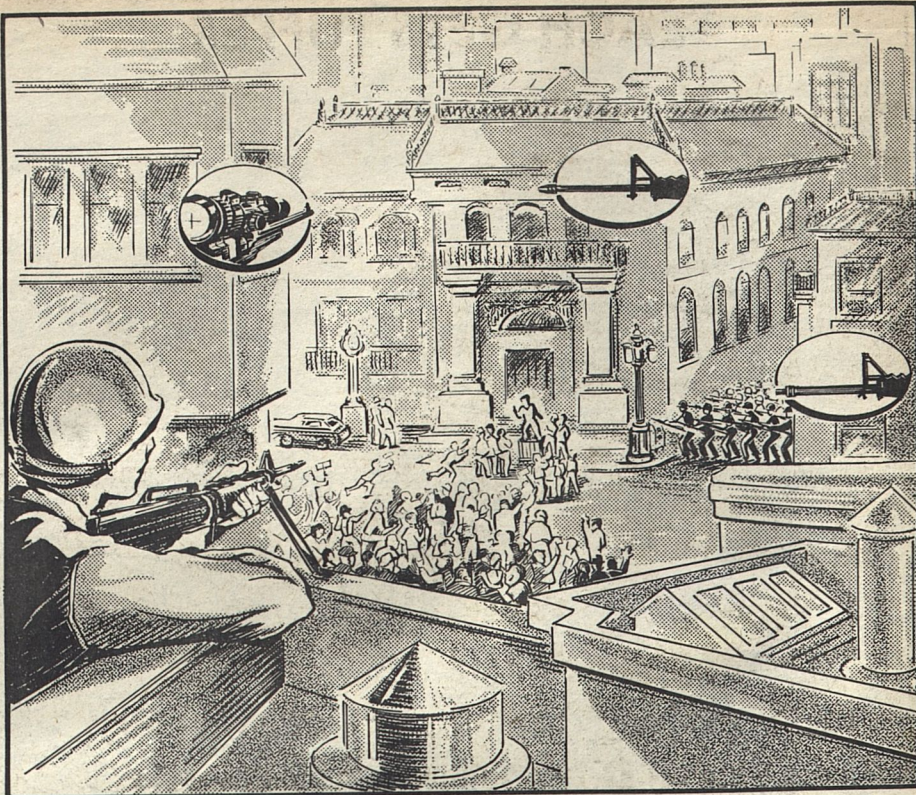


Figure 7-4. Rooftops are secured before committing forces.

"Roof-tops are secured before
committing forces," according to
the tactics outlined in Army Field
Manual FM 19-15 on "Civil Dis-
turbances and Disasters".

FM 19-15 -- the Army plan
published in March, 1968 for deal-
ing with uprisings in Black com-
munities -- can be bought for a
check or money order for \$1 made
payable to the Superintendent of
Documents addressed to the U.S.
Government Printing Office, Wash-
ington, D.C. 20402.

The manual, an updating of the
1959 booklet of the same title,
contains information on Army plans
and tactics "assisting civil author-
ities in the restoration of law
and order" in the event of "civil
disturbances".

It includes sections on "con-
taining and isolating the area,
operations in built up areas; arson
and protection of firefighters; anti-
looting measures; anti-sniping
measures; riot control formations;
riot control agents; relief proced-
ures; and termination".

For example:
"A violent mob can be effec-
tively developed by a trained agit-
ator," notes the Manual.

"... Some of the common
techniques are--The Use of Ex-
tensive Propaganda... A Forceful
Harangue by a Fiery speaker...
The Appearance of an Irritating
Individual or Object... An irritat-
ing object frequently used is
a newspaper photograph depict-
ing alleged police brutality...
The Successful Accomplishment of
an Act of Violence... The Use
of an Emotion-Provoking Rumor."
The Manual is full of goodies

their school board and its pres-

Anyhow, the whole mess can be

the average BARB reader may
never have thought of. All of the
following is verbatim:

"Objects may be thrown from
various vantage points, such as
windows and roofs of nearby build-
ings and overpasses. These objects
may include rotten vegetables and
fruits, rocks, bricks, bottles, im-
provised bombs, or any other ob-
jects available at the scene.

When troops are located on a
slope or at the bottom of a slope
dangerous objects can be directed
at them such as vehicles, trolley
cars, carts, barrels, liquids, etc.
On level ground, wheeled vehicles
can be driven toward troops, and
the drivers can jump out before
the vehicles reach the target. This
tactic may also be used for breach-
ing roadblocks and barricades.

Rioters may set fire to buildings
and motor vehicles to block the
advance of troops, to create con-
fusion or diversion, or to achieve
goals of property destruction, loot-
ing and sniping. They may flood an
area with gasoline or oil and ignite
it as the troops advance into the
area or pour gasoline or oil down
a slope toward the troops or drop
it from buildings and ignite it.

Dynamite, or other explosives
may be placed in a building, timed
to explode as troops or vehicles
are opposite the building, or they
may be exploded ahead of the troops
or vehicles so that the rubble blocks
the street. Demolition charges can
be buried in streets and exploded
as troops or vehicles pass over
them. Vehicles rolled or driven
against the troops may contain ex-
plosives. Dogs or other animals

with explosives attached to their
bodies may be driven toward the
troops. The charges may be ex-
ploded by remote control, fuses,
or a time device.

Demolition charges may be em-
ployed to breach a dike, levee, or
dam to flood an area, or the charges
may be employed to block an under-
pass by demolishing the overhead
bridge.

Weapons fired against troops
may take the form of selective snip-
ing or massed fire, and may come
from within the ranks of the rioters
or from buildings or other adjacent
cover.

The weapons used will vary from
homemade one-shot weapons to
sophisticated automatic rifles. The
imagination and resources of the
rioters should not be underesti-
mated.

One commonly used tactic is to
employ weapons fire against troops
to inspire more daring and violent
action by rioters. Weapons fire
may be intended to cause troops
to employ more severe measures
for purposes of developing antogon-
ism toward the civil disturbance
control force. Troops engaged in
civil disturbance operations must
anticipate rioter-originated weap-
ons fire as a diversionary tactic.

In an effort to breach barriers,
individuals may throw grapples
into wire barricades and drag them
away or attach grapples, chains,
wire, or rope to gates or fences and
pull them down. They may use
long poles or spears to keep troops
back while removing fences or
barricades or to prevent troops
from using bayonets. They may
crash vehicles into gates, or fences
to breach them.

Thus ends the list of danger
"our boys" must face in the
streets. In addition the manual
warns:

Women, children, and elderly
people may be placed in the front
ranks of a mob. This is done to
play on the sympathy of the troops
and to discourage any counter-
measures. Where countermeasures
are undertaken by the troops,
agitators may have photographs
taken to create further public an-
timosity and embarrassment to civil
disturbance control forces.

Although the Manual has detailed
references and photographs on
"rioters", every single person
portrayed in every photograph in
the Manual is clearly white.

The Army apparently anticipates
large scale riots in the near fu-
ture among the white middle-class
population of urban areas. --de

WAR!

SF STATE Mon. Tues. Wed. Thurs. Fri. Mon. Tues. Wed. Thurs. Fri . . .

Not for minutes, not for hours, does a revolution live, but spans from man to man, his life.

"After three years of negotiations, we hereby announce an official declaration of war," declared Leroy Goodwin, BSU off-campus coordinator.

"Under this state of war, all ad hoc rules and regulations set up by the acting president Hayakawa to hamper freedom of speech or freedom of assembly will be disregarded, and the battleground, tactics and time sequence, will be determined by the central committee of our revolutionary people," Goodwin said.

Okay — there it is. Ignore it at your peril. Some already have.

On Wednesday, the administration of SF City College started a two day "convocation" instead of closing down the school (as asked by the BSU) in support of SF State.

The blacks walked out, and the president of the college "vowed" to keep his school open "even if we have to use the police."

This will be repeated from campus to campus, city to city, no matter how much "mediation" is done by the Pillars of the Community.

But the issue will not be contained on campus. Already it is reaching the minds and bodies of underprivileged and—dig—even the overprivileged industrial workers.

Dig this. This week the United Auto Workers Union sent an observer, Jim Cohen on the campus. And the next you know he was so shook up by what he saw he declared to students at a rally, "If you lose the right to strike here, they might try to take the right away from us too." That's a broadening thought.

The police at SF State Wednesday had their hands full. Not only were they kept on the run, breaking up student meetings of the strikers and arresting a dozen students, they also had to keep an eye on an ON-CAMPUS picket line (around the Ad Bldg) of the AFT professors' local.

Police used Mace on handcuffed students, or, students being held by another cop. The SF Chronicle published a photo captioned "a sergeant in the SF Police Department shot Mace in a striker's face."

Once again, TV viewers saw cops

beating students while they were on the ground. The vicious energy put forth by the cops indicates they must enjoy beating, prodding, and flailing away at prostrate students.

In another case, Wednesday, the students supporting Hayakawa and wearing blue armbands attacked strikers with blackjacks. It was a short, furious fight, and "police officers assigned to nearby positions did not interfere", reports the SF Chronicle.

Stung by militant student leader Tony Miranda (who told the professors "we're out there getting busted every day and beaten by the pigs while you're sitting around waiting for strike-action"), they have announced THEIR minor revolution:

If the Trustees don't mediate by this Friday, then come Monday the AFT will strike SF State.

The SF Tactless Squad tried to stop the professor's line, but Prof Bill Stanton (also an attorney) told the fuzzi, "you can arrest every one of us, but we'll sue each and every one of you for false arrest."

The fuzzi moved off-campus. Later, when the fuzzi came back on to chase down single students who had Hayakawa's "greetings" for them, Stanton and his colleagues placed themselves between the cops and the students.

"Go tell Alioto to get his men off this campus!", he shouted. Meanwhile, the plague is spreading. The professors at Cal State Hayward announced they will ask the Alameda County Central Labor Council for strike sanction in sympathy with their fellow-profs across the bay.

Fresno, Chico, and San Jose also are supporting SFS.

HAYAKAWA NAGGED

"My campus for a horse!"

or such like, as Hayakawa called in fuzzi on horseback to take care of yet another "illegal" rally at SF State. But it's going to take more than horses, more than the black brass to keep the action "respectable."

Like King Hussein, of Jordan, who can't control his own El Fatah guerrillas, the State Board of Trustees, the AFL/CIO Labor Council, the black ministers and leaders, the Association of State College Professors found they couldn't keep the militants from breaking 22 more windows.

The really started at noon with nearly 2,000 students and supporters of the strike circled the commons shouting "On Strike — Shut It Down!"

It became rapidly apparent, however, that this action means nothing, for circling back to the speaker's platform they heard a member of the BSU declare:

"They're still holding classes at Business Education. Do we close it down?"

A yell went up as students surged

up to the building and proceeded to break the windows as those students inside retreated from the silent viewing of the strike.

As the cops came in on the double, the students faded back into the center of the commons. It was then decided to march off campus, letting the Ad Building, and others still holding classes, know their feelings by breaking some of those windows, too.

The strikers marched off campus at the 19th st entrance.

It was at this point that twenty SF Cossacks arrived. Clippety-clippity up Holloway, followed by hundreds of fuzzi on foot, they surrounded the Ecumenical House.

There, they arrested David R. Brooks, who had run into the House. Police claimed he "assaulted" an officer.

Hayakawa, however, has rescinded "temporarily" the suspension of students taken off the college rolls for their activity in support of the strike.

"In many cases," reports the SF Chronicle, "police warrants for the arrests were signed by Hayakawa himself."

He also bowed to another demand

from the Academic Senate that hearings on these students be held by a student-faculty board rather than by a single hearing officer.

A leaflet by the Strike Support Committee pointed out this single "hearing officer" was to be Prof George Derugin, of the World Business Department, who got his Ph.D. in economics at the University of Berlin, 1942.

"He will begin to suspend and expel people today for alleged actions of disruption that have not been proven in court," the leaflet states.

This has now been cancelled.

While the campus is strike-strike-strike, downtown at the Labor Temple it was talktalktalktalktalk. They are going to slice the baloney thinner and thinner, even to the point of calling in an expert slicer, Ronald Haughton, of the U of Michigan.

New Haya-Cry, Off Nonstudes!

The Nonstudents are coming! Hayakawa says so!

From Berkeley, from New York, and even from Paris! He said so!

Every true paranoid knows that campus disturbances are caused by outsiders, nonstudents who turn up to agitate and spur on our good clean kids to acts of defiance and riot. Our darkies would be happy -- if it only weren't for those non-students!

The charges of "nonstudent invasion" were actually made by Hayakawa last Sunday, Dec. 10. He also said that the militants were on drugs. And to prove what a victim of foreign assault he was, he said that one of the nonstudents had come from as far away as Paris.

BARB talked with the only person who could have qualified as the object of that last statement Wednesday night, Dec. 6. Yves Salessio, a revolutionary French student, was in town that week on a tour of the country after attending a convention of revolutionary youth in Chicago late November. Yves had been a prime mover

in the French "events of May". What he had to say about SF State didn't quite qualify him as an agitator.

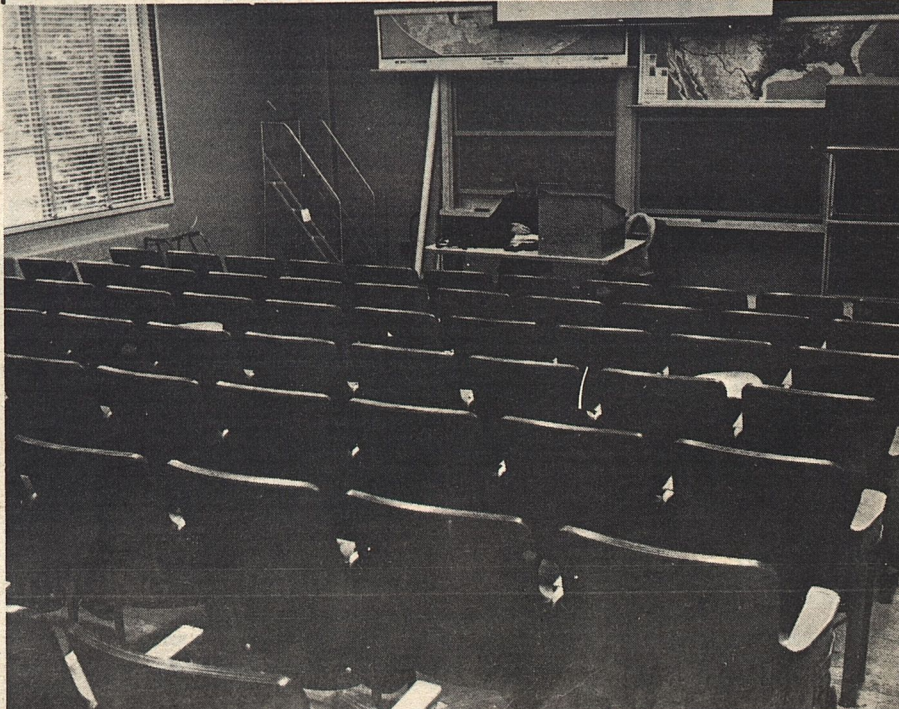
He had spoken on campus that Monday and was appalled by the lack of organization. He was, however, impressed by the fact that even without leadership of any substantial sort, thousands of students were willing to face up to the cops.

When asked, he didn't have any suggestions for setting up organization. He knew that it had to grow from below. So much for that agitator.

Hayakawa and his great "silent majority" would do well to turn their attention to the activities of certain other off-campus, non-student agitators. Most notably, Ronald Reagan, Joe Alioto, Al Nelder and Glen Dumke. All of these people have been active in inciting people to rash and sometimes violent acts against the interests of higher education.

REFUGEE-SPARKED CANADIAN CLUB MAY FIZZLE

American exiles in Canada are slowly and painfully drawing together.

So reports Jane Boyer, writing from Vancouver. She tells of the formation of a new organization of American draft exiles.

The group publishes a newsletter entitled "Yankee Refugee" which has gone through two issues.

Fifty showed up at the first meeting, reports Boyer. The discussion centered around the political and the social aspects of life in exile.

Since many of the refugees were politically apathetic in the States, there exists both a potential for creating new radicals and a tendency towards inactivity and timidity. During the Vancouver march in support of the International Days of Protest the group marched behind a banner identifying themselves as American exiles.

There was some opposition to this identification from members of the group who preferred to march as individuals. This typifies the problem of getting the exiles together.

The other barrier is the social. Most exiles suffer from feelings of isolation. The group serves an important function as a social forum. But some who thought it would be exclusively social in nature have become disappointed and have dropped out.

Most of the articles which form the basis of the "Yankee Refugee" are autobiographical in nature and concern the whole scene: social and economic as well as political. They serve as orientation for the survival and adaptation of newcomers.

Evidence of the need for a unifying organization also came to BARB this week in the form of a letter from an ex-Berkeleyan. David Mandel writes from Fort William Ontario, on the Minnesota

border.

In his preface Mandel writes: "Having split to Vancouver on May 25, I've now been in Canada for 6 months and trying to figure out what value I can be to Berkeley as a draft splitter. I get the barb and news from Berkeley every week and now I've found a use for myself."

His following letter is a plea for support for the Oakland Seven: ". . . O.K., so where are you, Resistance?" writes Mandel in part. "All you loving heads, starving students, mamas for peace, teenyboppers for music? If you want peace, if you cherish a sunny California day, if you want to live to see another one — oh, for Christ's sake, do I have to write a shitty letter from another country to wake you up? The Oakland 7's trial is now!"

How many yanks in Canada would second his appeal if they had the opportunity?

like, in front of the Bank of America. At 1 Powell Street, SF, like?

Yes, the United Farm Workers Organizing Committee will hold a demonstration there Friday from 4 PM to 8 PM.

The striking grapeworkers charge Bank of America presently owns over 5000 acres of vineyards valued at over \$6 million. The money giant has refused to meet with Union representatives.

"The Bank has set up a phoney corporation which has bought out the Divizich Ranch in the Delano area," Kathy Murguia of the San Francisco UFWOC office told BARB.

"The Bank is maintaining that it has nothing to do with the Divizich Ranch. But we checked and found the members of corporation which owns the ranch are all Bank of America attorneys," Mrs. Murguia said.

If the Bank refuses to negotiate, farm workers throughout the state will withdraw their savings from the Bank of America, she said.

Concerning other developments, Pete Velasco, Bay Area co-ordinator of the Agricultural Labor Support Committee told BARB Lucky Stores and Mayfair are the only chainstores still refusing to remove grapes from their shelves. A picket line is presently set up,

and will continue through Sunday, in front of the Lucky Store on Park Boulevard and East 18th Street in Oakland.

A recent check of independent East Oakland stores revealed not a single one is stocking grapes, according to Velasco.

"We hope to have all grapes off the shelves in the Bay Area by January," Velasco added. He pointed out that on December 2 P & X Stores removed their scab grapes, and Louis Stores have agreed to do the same by December 16.

While the pickets will be doing their share locally, caravans from all over the state will converge on Delano Saturday with Christmas gifts for strikers' families.

One caravan will leave about 7 AM from 568 47th Street, Oakland. Another will leave about the same time from the San Francisco Labor Temple at 2940 16th Street. People can still donate food, toys or money at the UFWOC

office.

Those who wish can also accompany the caravan to Delano. "Bring your sleeping bags. There'll be lots of room at the Filipino Community Hall," Velasco told BARB.

After delivery to Delano the gifts will be distributed throughout the country to families of boycott crews and organizers who don't have time to come home for Christmas.

CONGRESS IN MOOD TO REOPEN JFK PROBE

As the Supreme Court gave the go ahead to the prosecution of Clay Shaw, named by Garrison as a conspirator in the murder of President Kennedy, BARB learned that a new probe of the assassination is being quietly conducted by investigators of at least one Congressional sub-committee.

Rumors of a possible "reopening" of the investigation have been coming out of Capital Hill. Investigators have been interviewing persons who may have additional leads on the case more than five years after the fateful Dallas event.

One BARB reporter has visited one of the investigators connected with the Congressional sub-committee.

According to the Washington (DC) Examiner of November 21, a Capital source said that the sub-committee has been looking into the assassination "more or less as a hobby. But it became a full time job when they became aware of further discrepancies in the Warren Report and other published and unpublished documents."

The Examiner stated the investigation is conducted under Congressional auspices. If this no longer is possible, the investigators would continue to work on their own, the paper reports.

A sub-committee spokesman said a new administration might enable further investigation into the case without fear of contradicting the Warren Report.

"This is not to say that the present administration has hampered any investigation. But an administration totally unconnected with the assassination might not be so emotionally involved in reopening old wounds," the sub-committee spokesman added.

The Supreme Court announcement of December 9 lends credence to this view.

The sub-committee investigation will probably focus on such questions as: Was there a conspiracy to kill Kennedy? How many shots were fired and from which direction? Was Oswald the only assassin?

Evidence such as autopsy photos would be viewed by the sub-committee. According to the spokesman the sub-committee has found some Congressmen who are sympathetic to the reopening of the case.

A Southern California minister who appeared before Jim Garrison in New Orleans is hiding for his life in the bay area claiming that he has been threatened by a man Garrison is investigating in connection with the alleged plot to kill President Kennedy.

The minister, Reverend Raymond Broshears, who was with the Universal Life Church of Long Beach, California, also claims that the same individual who threatened him had threatened Garrison's life.

Broshears claimed to be a room-mate of Ferrie's and says that back in 1965 Ferrie "admitted being involved with the assassins."

At the time (1965) Broshears

maintains he considered Ferrie's allegations ridiculous and termed Ferrie as a "kook". He says he didn't believe it because "faggots" have a way of making up unbelievable stories. Ferrie had been publicly identified as a known homosexual.

Broshears does not hide the fact that he is a member of the homosexual community. He said he met Ferrie in New Orleans through the "gay night life" activities he and others engaged in.

Broshears says that minister friends helped him "get out of town alive" after police officers threatened to kill him in Long Beach.

"My home was riddled with bullets...My tires were slashed - brand new tires", he said, forcing

him to make the move to the Bay area where he considers things more suited to his health and welfare.

If Reverend Broshears were overly anxious about an imminent death hanging over his head it was not evident in the free and breezy exchange he had with this BARB reporter. Chuckling at intervals in the interview the Reverend said he did not believe he would be around much longer to enjoy either the spiritual or temporal world.

But his face became quite agitated when he discussed the role of the police in spying on his activities in Long Beach. He held up a leaflet advertising a "Town Hall Meeting" in September that had as its subject, "The

Garrison Investigation." This meeting, he said, was infiltrated by police agents as were other meetings he held.

Broshears said he relied on a group of young men known as the "Monitor Training School" to "give us protection from the police and from the radical right" at this Garrison meeting.

Broshears said that at one time two police officers came into his office and made a threat on his life.

"They came in - they called me a dirty Commie - they called me a filthy queer and things of this nature. They said I was helping mess up the country and they wanted me out of Long Beach."

One of the officers then told Broshears: "We're going to take you down for questioning."

Said Broshears: "I says 'fine' - On what charge?"

For being a homosexual was the reply by the cops.

"I then quoted to them the California State Penal Code which states that the only crime concerning homosexuality is committing the act - there's no law against being a homosexual and so this officer swung at me and called me a smart ass and he knocked over my lamp and several articles on the desk. ... He then says: 'Why don't you run, mother-fucker, and he was just reaching around his coat pocket and then he pulled out his gun.'

"Come on - run, mother-fucker," the cop egged him on. "You, too - you Commie bastard!" the cop yelled, pointing his pistol at a minister friend who was also present.

This drew a chuckle again from Broshears who described his friend, Reverend William Jordano, as "anything but a Commie".

"But Bill (Jordano) wouldn't run and I wouldn't run and they tried to force us to run and I said I'm not going to run officer. I said because if I run you're going to kill me and then you're going to be able to say that you killed me because the two were fleeing."

Broshears said that the man who made both threats on his life and Garrison's is connected with the Central Intelligence Agency.

He claimed that this alleged CIA agent warned that "none of the witnesses (in the Garrison investigation) will live to come to trial."

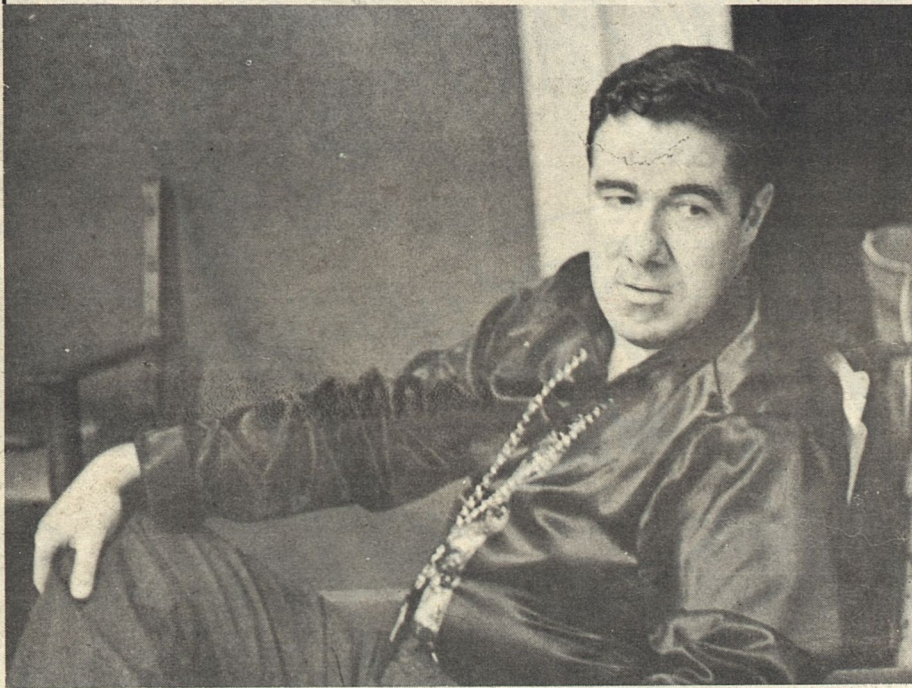
Garrison, Broshears maintained, would be assassinated by two "Spanish gentlemen" who had been sent to New Orleans to perform the deed.

Another sensational charge that Broshears let out of the bag in the interview was his claim that the famous Oswald photograph showing him holding the alleged assassination weapon he supposedly used in murdering both Kennedy and a Dallas police officer was a fake because David Ferrie named the individual who was really in the picture. Broshears revealed the name to this reporter.

(Oswald is reported to have said when he was shown the photo that the picture was a fake because someone had put his (Oswald's) head over someone else's body).

All the information pertaining to this is in Garrison's possession.

HOW HAYDEN RAISED HASSLERS HACKLES

Tom Hayden doesn't expect to be around as a free man very much longer.

"I expect to watch this country crack up from behind the bars of a penitentiary," Hayden told the newsmen on the CBS program "Face the Nation" last Sunday night.

Hayden said that he had received information that Federal authorities are preparing to prosecute him under the "Rap Brown Act" which forbids crossing a state line to "incite a riot".

"Daley wants his pound of flesh and he's going to get it," Hayden explained, "to retaliate for the destruction of his police's image."

Hayden, an organizer of the Chicago demonstrations, noted that when the establishment sees that permissiveness will not work in quieting protestors "... they will use more tear gas and Mace and Daley dozers and machineguns" to stifle the dissent.

He had no hopes for the Nixon administration. "When Nixon says that drugs are the curse of youth and that he does not have a Beatles record in his New York collection and when he courts his daughter and David Eisenhower as models for American youth it shows he's out of touch."

The normally suave newsmen were falling over themselves to throw questions at Hayden, and most of the question periods

sounded like a frantic news conference with three reporters shouting at once.

Hayden made it clear that he did not regard the program and the presentation of his image as essential.

In response to a question about his opinion of the Walker Report on the cop riot in Chicago, Hayden quoted Kenneth Kenniston as saying that the worse the country gets the better the reports get. He had no hopes that the reports would be implemented.

Later in the program the newshounds tried to get Hayden to admit that the system was really all right. They quoted the fact

that poverty had been declining over the past 100 years; Hayden retorted that any poverty was too much.

The questioners inevitably got on to the favorite topic used to discredit radicals; the Soviet Union. When asked whether Soviet power should be opposed in Czechoslovakia, Hayden answered that indeed it should -- by the Czech people, who, he noted, are also communists. The reaction to that statement was scorn.

Hayden did comment that there are some "beautiful things" about American society, primarily the "small revolutionary tradition" never dominant but always vocal.

And no one was shooting at them. The Admiral, Bernard F. Roder, called the exercise an "unqualified success", according to an AP story.

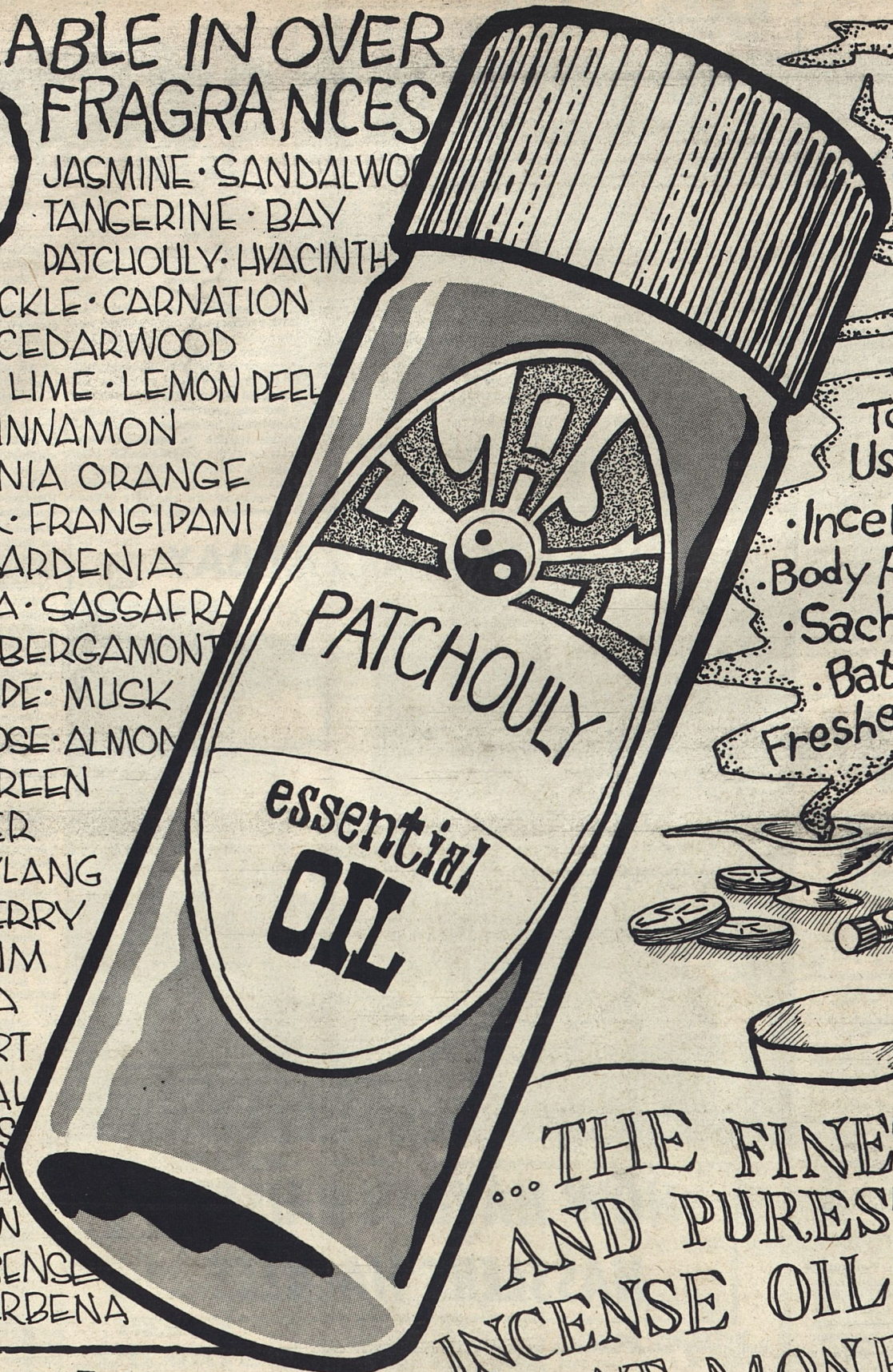

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PORT CHI VIGIL FADES AWAY

The Port Chicago vigil quietly ended on October 14. It ended so quietly that this is the first public report of its death. Friends of the deceased preferred it that way.

Soon even Port Chicago will be no more. But the Naval Weapons Station is going strong as ever.

Every day for over two years and two months vigilers camped by the gates of the Weapon Station, protesting against the death dealing merchandise produced inside. It was the longest continuous vigil against the Viet Nam War. Thousands of demonstrators took their turn at the gate trying to stop the weapons from being loaded for shipment to Vietnam.

"The non-violent protest has outlived its usefulness," one of the original organizers, who asked to remain anonymous, told BARB. "The death of Martin Luther King was the end of an era."

Now the people who worked on the vigil have split to different parts of the country to help the movement in their own way, the spokesman said.

"We made a lot of inroads with individuals in Port Chicago, but the official policy of the base never changed," the spokesman said. "The Navy actually started buying up the town when the vigil was taking hold. The Navy said the town was to be razed to prevent a catastrophe like 1944 (320 workers killed by an ammo explosion), but that sudden concern sounds too coincidental."

The attitude of the town changed once it learned about the government's plan to buy it out. Formerly it was very prowar and pro Johnson, but later "LBJ sold us out" signs appeared everywhere.

Port Chicago had over 3,000 residents. The town is literally deserted now. A sign on the old movie marquee says, "Freedom was born in the USA, and died in Port Chicago."

DOG-GONE DOG NOT GONE DOG

The Avalon Ballroom, for more than three years the home of San Francisco acid-rock music, will be silent this weekend. And forever.

The ballroom was swallowed this week by a gloating generation gap. Family Dog Productions, which has sponsored thousands of hours of music, dance, and good vibes within the Avalon's walls, lost an appeal Monday for a rehearing on the revocation of their dance permit.

The vote of the Permit Appeals Board was 3-2 against. A further appeal, this time to Superior Court, is being considered but not very seriously.

"It would involve litigation against the board members and the complainants," an Avalon spokesman told BARB this week. "It would take an awful lot of money, and we're not even sure we could still have the building."

The Ballroom had remained open an extra weekend due to a gentlemen's agreement between Chet Helms and landlord John Whooley. However, a week ago Tuesday Whooley changed the locks on the building and hung a for rent sign on the front door.

He also demanded \$300 rent for the previous Sunday night, which was the day following official termination of the lease. The Dog had been paying a monthly rent of \$1600, including an extra \$100 for maintenance of the grounds surrounding the hall.

The Dog is now looking for other sites to hold its gatherings and hopes are high that a new hall will be ready for New Year's.

"We're still a family," BARB was told, "and we're still hanging on."

Vicki is a innocent-faced, blond chick who is the main attraction at Topsy's on San Francisco's boob avenue. She first busted into the news when she ran for student body president at Stanford last spring.

Interviewed at her drab little dressing room upstairs at Topsy's Vicki in bellbottoms and large round specs, sat on the floor and spoke at length about her scene. With her was her old man, Joey.

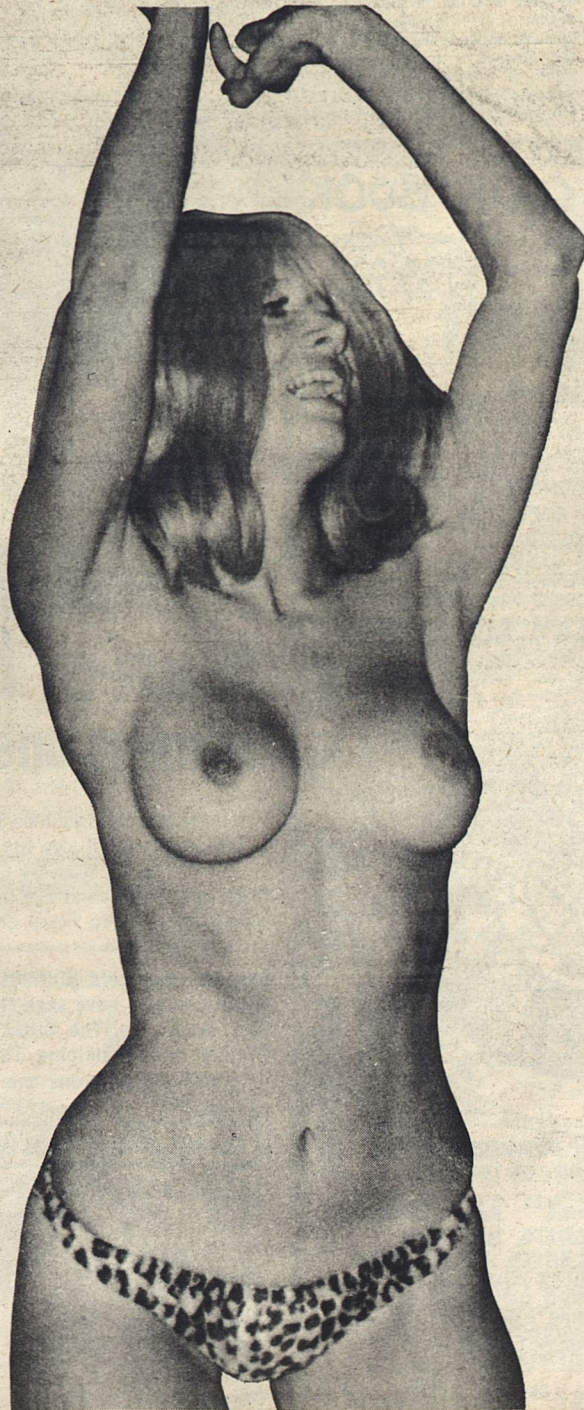
"Here is my working costume," Vicki tore off a three-inch strip of Air-Vent Clear Band Aid. "This is all I wear in front of the customers. Usually I don't wear my contacts, so I can't see them. They're a drag," she added.

"I hate them," Vicki continued. "I think they're all from Iowa or somewhere. They come because Broadway is considered wicked. They think it's a circus or a

freak show."

Vicki doesn't think anybody is exploiting her body. "That never even enters my mind," she says.

"They have to pay \$ 3,500 minimum to see me. They are the ones being exploited. I work for 10 minutes six times a night and the rest of the day I'm completely free. I don't have to kiss anybody's ass for my bread."

Vicki grew up in small towns of Oregon and Washington where her father is a Methodist minister. "Now he has accepted my freedom" she says. She and Joey have been making it for two years. They met as students at Stanford.

Vicki gets a kick out of putting on the straights coming in to stare. But she doesn't like to tease. "I don't want to turn them on. I just like to come out nude, dance to Brother Buzz (Topsy's band), and feel beautiful," she says.

In one of her acts Vicki is "Morton the BARB seller" from the corner of Broadway and Columbus, complete with moustache and papers in hand. She comes off the street and dances a few minutes on stage before throwing off the moustache and revealing herself completely as beautiful Vicki.

"There is a horrifying artificiality about my job," Vicki says. "There I am all naked on the stage and the customers cannot do anything. It's the ultimate in alienation."

"Maybe some of them go home and screw their wives afterwards," she wondered.

Periodically police come into the nightclub to inspect the girls' costumes. The way they do it is to look up their legs to see if there's enough tape. (Red tape?)

"The pigs want you to have so much tape on it looks like you have a plastic puss," Vicki complained. She says that she doesn't bleach her hair. "The logic the pigs use is absurd. Showing pubic hair's obscene, but if you shave it off it's all right."

Vicki was involved in radical politics at Stanford; she went for 3 years and belonged to SDS. Until recently she lived in a Hobbit hole, sitting in her room, listening to the radio.

"Now I can see we're on the edge of a revolution," she said. "My only goal is to survive. That's all you can do in the state of saige we're living in now."

From her daily appearances at San Francisco State she has formed a definite opinion of acting president S.L. Hayakawa. "I don't like the expression 'Only jocks support Hayakawa', the insinuation is that he is a prick," Vicki says. "But goodness, pricks are beautiful! It is an insult to them to be compared to Hayakawa." Vicki believes all parts of the body are beautiful.

COAKLEY AND GAIN ESCAPE STAND

"There is not one shred of evidence that Chief Gain's actions during Stop The Draft Week were discriminatory."

An attorney for the Oakland Police Chief tried to lay that on a Federal Court in San Francisco last Tuesday, as the Oakland Seven hauled Gain, and Oakland DA Frank Coakley before the federal bar.

The Seven, joined by four U.C. Berkeley professors and three clergymen, charged that Gain and Coakley have systematically tried to stifle First Amendment rights in Alameda County. They asked the court to restrain the duo from further constitutional trespass, and to declare the California conspiracy law, under which the Seven have been indicted, unconstitutional.

Those who were clubbed, gassed, beaten and arrested during Stop The Draft Week probably have a different view of Chief Gain, but according to his attorney, who sounded like his mother, Gain is a flaming liberal. He even gives out parade permits for demonstrations . . . sometimes. (Tell that to Huey, Eldridge or Bobby).

The Seven had intended to drag both Coakley's and Gain's asses into court, but it being a civil action, neither of these worthies was required to appear. Coakley sent his assistant, Lowell Jensen, the prosecutor-persecutor of Huey Newton to represent him.

Jensen didn't have much to say about Coakley's character (there evidently being little of a positive nature there) and stuck to the legalisms, "state court jurisdiction . . . evidentiary hearing . . . before the fact . . ." and other turgid comments, that did nothing to liven up the sterile surroundings for the 100 or so Bay Area radicals who were in attendance.

The Left at least had tried to enliven the proceedings by wearing pink gags over their mouths as they entered the courtroom. This was to protest a ruling by an Oakland judge last week that the Seven could not discuss their case in public, especially in the mass media. The three judges may have freaked out at the sight of 100 pink gags as they entered the austere trial chamber, but if they did, the only sign that they gave were a few astonished blinks.

The Seven's attorneys, Bernard Dreyfus and Albert Bendich, then ran it down about how Gain and Coakley were misusing the conspiracy law which was originally drawn up to control gamblers and operators of brothels, (whatever they are), and how Coakley was inspired to prosecute the Seven only after listeners to right-wing commentator Pat Michaels urged him to do so.

Coakley, said Dreyfus, is "attempting to elevate insignificant misdemeanors into a felony." (The Seven are charged with conspiring to commit various misdemeanors but conspiring to commit them is a felony which can carry a three year jail term plus a fine.

The judges looked as if they were trying to hide disinterest behind bland faces, until presiding Judge Wollenberg began to question Bendich with the ferocity of a DA on cross-examination. After three or four hours of argument, the judges decided they couldn't decide -- at least right then.

But they did promise a decision before the Seven go on trial in Oakland on January 13. The decision is actually expected sometime next week. So defendants Gain and Coakley are still temporarily at large.

Bob Mandel, one of the Seven, and a plaintiff in the federal suits, told the assembled media representatives that "the police who beat, gassed and clubbed us during Stop The Draft Week are the same police who are attacking San Francisco State students today."

He pointed out how attempts at repression have already started all around the country.

The Federal suit was only the

Like -- "Hold That Line -- Hold That Line" or "Time Out For USC -- The Halfback Wants His Salary" or "Rah-Rah-Siss-Boom-Bah!" or as the police of Chicago (and GI's in training) chant: "Kill -- Kill -- Kill!"

When 'Newsroom' reporter, George Duscheck started to ask the professor a question, Hayakawa cut him short. "May I finish my question?" asked Duscheck.

"Why is it this is the only station that treats me this way?" pleaded the professor. When editor Mel Wax said reporters don't create the news, Hayakawa shot back, "The hell you don't."

The professor said his door is "always open" but nobody came to see him, especially the BSU and Third World students. These students have been going through open doors, in the front and straight out the rear, for three years, but apparently Hayakawa thinks his door is different.

When he asked the staff why they didn't report that students applauded when the police came on campus, Jim Benet said, "I was there today and nobody applauded."

"Of course you'd say that," retorted Hayakawa. "I've had enough." He got up and left.

KAYO SET FOR FAR OUT BAR FRACAS

What the defendant himself describes as "a far out trial" will take place Monday, December 16 at 9:30 AM in Department 23 of the Hall of Justice in San Francisco.

Attorney Terence "Kayo" Hallinan is scheduled to face a judge for "assault and battery on a police officer", May 21.

"I'm confident I'll be acquitted," Hallinan told BARB this week. He explained that the incident in question occurred at San Francisco State during last spring's confrontation. Hallinan intervened to help a girl who was knocked down by the Tac Squad. The cops clubbed him and charged him with assault to justify their action, Kayo says.

The charge against Hallinan carries a maximum penalty of ten years, and of course disbarment. "The cops use this law #243 to make you plead guilty to a lesser charge," Hallinan said. "But I won't make any deals."

Kayo's father, world-renowned attorney Vincent Hallinan, will handle the defense.

Kayo is countering the cops by filing a \$500,000 false arrest and assault suit against Michael Brady the Tac fuzz who clubbed him.

Hallinan is also seeking an additional \$500,000 from Mayor Alioto for slander. He says Alioto called him a "right wing attorney" on a news broadcast.

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THE MAN THE PIGS COULDN'T PEN

John Dillinger was the first White Panther.

He scared shit out of the bankers, pigs and the FBI. His gang roamed the Mid West ripping off police stations and banks! He was the man J. Edgar Hoover hated most.

Dillinger could have been a fucked over Indiana farmer struggling to keep his land out of the bankers hands. It was during the Depression. Dillinger decided the life of the bank robber was a hell of a lot better.

Most of his fellow townsmen agreed even if they didn't have the guts to take up the gun and join him. He could walk the streets of Mooresville, Indiana at the height of his career, and nobody would think of turning Johnny in.

We can learn a lot from the Dillinger gang's tactics. They supplied themselves with bullet proof vests and machine guns by breaking into Police Stations and putting the pigs up against the Wall.

There wasn't a pigpen that could hold either Dillinger or his gang brothers. They took turns springing each other. Many farmers would have been willing to wear "Free Johnny" buttons.

Dillinger's greatest moment was when he broke out of the Crown Point, Indiana Jail with a wooden gun. The National Guard surrounded the jail and planes flew overhead. The sheriff boasted that this was the end of the outlaw's career, but photographs taken of Dillinger in jail show that he knew the whole scene was a paper tiger.

His cellmate was Herbert Youngblood, a black man who liked to whittle. John borrowed his knife and carved out a wooden gun which he covered with shoe polish. Everybody fell for the rife, and Youngblood and Dillinger left town in the Sheriffs car.

The Dillinger gang was a model of participatory democracy. John was the leader by virtue of his style and courage. There were

no bureaucratic structures and the relationships were voluntary. If anyone had to be kicked out of the gang it was a collective decision. Nobody was ever cheated out of his bread or offed for getting out of line. Contrary to ruling class bullshit, there was a high and beautiful honor among the Dillinger thieves.

We should never confuse the crime syndicates built out of prohibition with the outlaws who fought the bankers during the Depression. The syndicate was big business rob-the-poor capitalism. It bought its way into the establishment and sent its daughters to high class finishing schools. It bought off politicians the way Standard Oil did and invested in banks rather than robbing them.

The outlaws were anarchistic rebels fighting in self defense against everything big and ugly in the oppression that America's rulers called law and order. Men like Pretty Boy Floyd, Clyde Barrow and John Dillinger had contempt for the bureaucratic gunman

of Chicago. They turned down offers to go to work for the mob.

It is an interesting fact of class justice that the syndicate has never been scratched and dominates many industries in America. All of the anarchists were hunted down and murdered in cold blood. The FBI put out a shoot on sight order for John Dillinger while Mafia executioners sipped cocktails with judges and businessmen in Miami Beach.

John Dillinger was trapped on at least three occasions by the FBI. In each case he shot his way out. For a period of months the Feds were looking like fools. A special Dillinger squad was created and dozens of agents worked full time to trap him. John was declared public enemy Number One with a ten thousand dollar reward on his head.

The outlaw had a lot of the public sympathy that Eldridge on the run now has. Many average Americans wrote letters to the editor demanding a pardon for Dillinger. He was portrayed on Broadway and in the movies in the "Petrified Forest," as Duke Mantee. Humphrey Bogart built his career by imitating Dillinger who possessed in real life the existential courage and cleverness that Bogey went through the motions of on the screen.

Dillinger's end was inevitable. The odds against him were too great. He was denounced by FDR and all the Wealthy Press. The American Legion, National Guard, posses and police sallied from their stys looking for him. There is so much you can get away with as a loner and then the shit comes down.

The outlaw was betrayed by a screwed - up chick. A Rumanian who faced deportation and went to the pigs and squealed. The FBI agreed to a deal to let her stay in the country if she revealed John's whereabouts. The setup took place outside the Biograph Movie Theater in Chicago. The executioners were waiting outside.



The Lady with Dillinger was dressed in an easily spottable red. They cut him down cold, shot in the back without warning. To show their gratitude the "Lady in Red" was deported.

In his whole career John Dillinger was charged with killing one man, a pig, shot down in a gunbattle. He never was known to act in the cowardly fashion of his murderers.

J. Edgar Hoover has a death mask of Dillinger outside his office in Washington D.C. It's a kind of trophy to the virility of the FBI. It should be made out of chicken shit.

We must all become at least a little like Dillinger. The pigs have been getting away with outrageous sadism. I can imagine them at their parties laughing

over the chick they kicked in the cunt or hair they pulled out of some hippie's beard. There are some pleasures that must not be tolerated.

The Police lived in terror of John Dillinger. When they had him in jail they never messed with him. The pigs knew Johnny was going to break out and they better not fool around. He was treated something like visiting nobility.

I think of the time I got the shit kicked out of me in the Berkeley Police Station, the pigs really enjoyed that. There were the smiles on their faces as the blood flowed in Lincoln Park.

Dillinger knew how to wipe those smiles off. He didn't ask as many questions as we do, but he sure had a lot of right answers.



WHY IT COULDN'T BE 'PANTHER SHOOT-OUT'

A letter from the Black Panther Party Headquarters sent to the mass media (including the underground press) this week reiterates the Party's contention "an agent provocateur or someone who flipped his mind" was responsible for the November 19 cop-Panther shootout in San Francisco.

"When people hear that a Panther held up a service station a few blocks from the San Francisco Police Department it becomes quite clear the incident tends to discredit the Black Panther Party," Bobby Seale, Party Chairman writes.

"Any member who violates the Black Panther Party rules is subject to suspension or is kicked out of the party," Seale continues.

The Panthers have strict rules that have to be known by heart. Ten were originally given by Huey P. Newton. Sixteen others have been added since.

The party rules forbid members to have narcotics or weed in their possession while doing party work. Members may also not be drunk on duty, commit any crime against other party members or blacks; or use, point or fire a weapon of any kind unnecessarily or accidentally at anyone. When arrested members are to give only their name and address, and nothing else.

Failure to comply with the rules results in expulsion, according to an insert included with the letter.

CHIANG LIKE CAPONE

"FDR thought Chiang Kai-Shek was the leader of the Chinese people. Nothing was farther from the truth. Chiang Kai-Shek started life as a gangster, a rascal. You had a man in Chicago just like him, called Al Capone, Scarface."

Those are the words of Dr. Shang-ying Wu, former Secretary General of the Chinese National Assembly during the Chiang Kai-Shek era on mainland China. Dr. Wu has been lecturing at the Free University of Berkeley this week on the Vietnam War and American imperialism in the Far East. His final lecture is tonight (Friday) at 7 P.M.

Dr. Wu's information is first-hand -- he knew Sun Yat-sen, Mao, Stalin and Chou-En-Lai, co-authored the 1947 Chinese constitution and held a cabinet post. BARB caught him Tuesday when he ran down the history of European and American exploitation of the Orient.

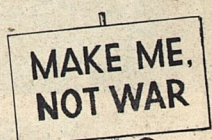
The White Man, he said, created

a myth of his own superiority to justify his economic enslavement of the orientals. This self-created prestige of the White Man, which supposedly gives him the right to call the Easterner "boy," is an illusion and will not be allowed to continue by the Chinese and the Vietnamese.

Since 1841, the end of the Opium War, when Britain established dominion over Hong Kong, Europeans have had free reign in draining the Far East of its resources and exploiting oriental labor. The U.S. continues this imperialistic policy by warring on the Vietnamese under the guise of halting the spread of Communist aggression.

Although not a communist, Dr. Wu agrees with Mao's analysis. "Mao calls this country a paper tiger. Vietnam is not 1/20th the size of China and you have half a million troops over there. You have gotten nowhere. To fight China you will need twenty million troops. And that's impossible for you".

"Nationalism," he says, "finds its expression in communism." -- Jon Rosenblatt



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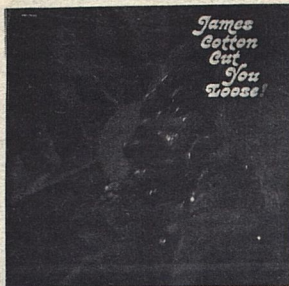
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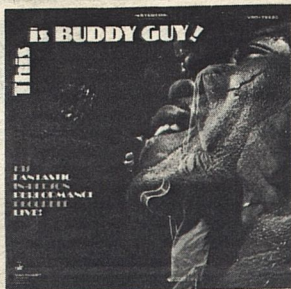

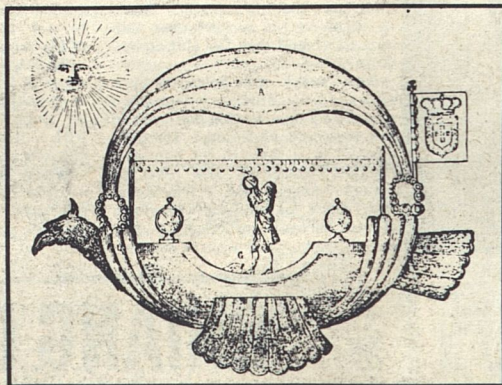

"When I first saw students get beaten I cried. I'm not used to it even now. It upsets me so inside to see it," an 18 year old San Francisco State freshman told BARB this week.

The baby-faced, long haired chick wanted to remain anonymous because her parents might get annoyed. She goes to the campus every day to support the strikers.

"More and more I feel they are justified. At first I wasn't sure, when they were disrupting classrooms. But now I think the strike is growing because it has so much moral support," she said.

She described to BARB what happened at State Wednesday afternoon.

There was no rally or rock-throwing by the strikers. Around noon four students put on a skit on the library steps. People stopped to watch. Then about 20 Tac cops came and surrounded the crowd, only to be surrounded themselves by a larger crowd of students.

"The students in the inner circle became tense," she said, "And started to leave the middle. Suddenly the cops charged to the outside and chased some people toward the cafeteria.

"I saw two boys caught and

beaten, others squirmed loose and escaped," she reports.

The Tac squad was looking for a special person and made all those sheltered inside the cafeteria come out single file. They didn't find their man, she said.

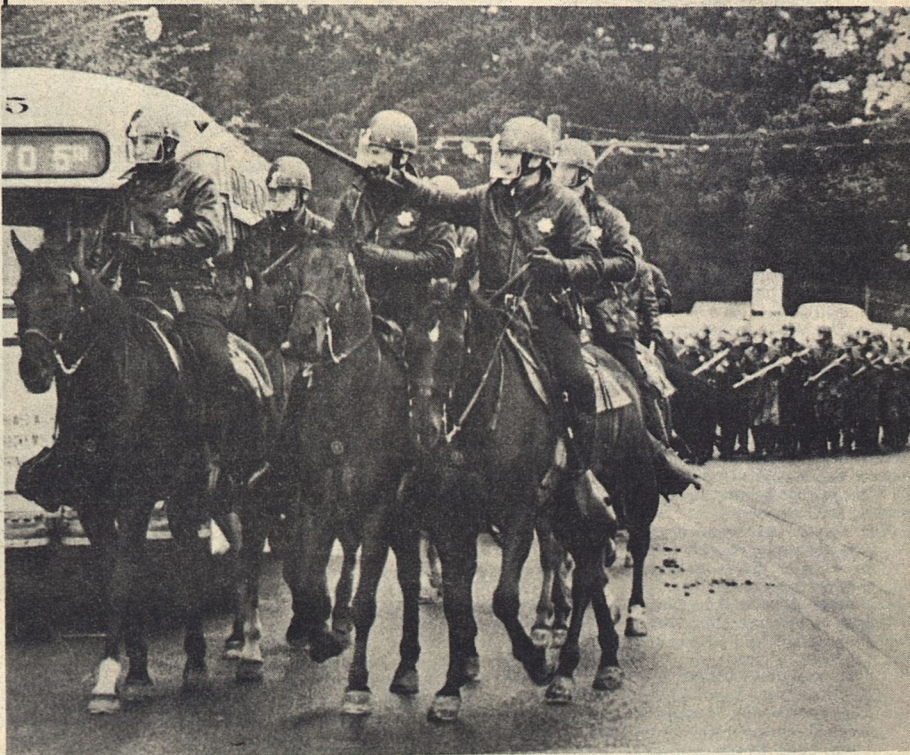
"Later I saw two guys in blue armbands beat a student with rubber clubs. It was amazing nobody did anything to stop it," she said. The beaten student was lead away to the CAE (blue ribbon) office, she reported.

The freshman girl also told of seeing an older heavy set man hitting a student with a lead pipe. "I was too scared to do anything," she explained. "Other students surrounded him, but again nobody was willing to interfere.

"Finally the police came, but they didn't arrest the man, they let him leave," she complained.

She observes that the police on campus have lately been very tense. When a cop accidentally bumped into one of his own, the other trooper wheeled around with his arm poised ready to strike.

"The situation won't change as long as Haykawa is in command," she concluded sadly. "But I don't want to transfer to another school. That would be a cop-out."

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Catch 8½

(Note: this column was written before the SF State strike. Observe how Alioto and Hayakawa think and operate in a medium of another age — radio. They have absolutely no concept of this electronic TV age that turns any situation into a global-village, or, if you will, a global-campus. For more of Hayakawa, see this issue elsewhere.

(When the Mayor appeared on TV last week to deplore how his fuzzi "was being treated" by the press and TV media, he was asked, "Would you like to see some scenes?" And, in full view, apparently for the Mayor for the first time, but for many of the viewers the second and third times, TV films of cops beating students, priests, and bystanders.

(The Mayor was dumbfounded. He, quite obviously, doesn't watch TV, for — if he did — he would not let himself get caught with his global pants down. If he keeps this dumb attitude up, Alioto won't even be governor of Fisherman's Wharf in 1970).

"War and Peace in the global village" by Marshall McLuhan and Quentin Fiore (with marginal quotes from "Finnegans Wake" by James Joyce) and co-ordinated by Jerome Agel (Bantam Books, \$1.45).

This is a canned book. After one reads it within the hour, one gets the feeling of having just watched "Laugh In" on TV. Man — is the medium the message, here! (See "Catch 8½").

McLuhan (and all his little helpers including the huge assist from Joyce Napoleon and Siddhartha) turned a book into a tube. If Marshall doesn't watch out, he will come back to earth as a colored TV set.

Having read "The Medium Is The Message" and having attended (on a UC Extension Scholar-

ship) a seminar "On Understanding McLuhan" last year, this reviewer has been waiting for this book.

It had to come. Why? Marshall's much better book "The Medium..." came out BEFORE LSD, so to speak, so this book it sort of catching up and, predictably, McLuhan blows it.

Know what he says? Come on — you can guess: "The impulse to use hallucinogens is a kind of empathy with the electric environment but it is also a way of repudiating the old mechanical world."

Further: "The sense of touch had been anesthetized in the mechanical age, but today television is only one of the tactile agents transforming popular awareness.

"Of course, color TV is very much more tactile than black and white ... this environment itself constitutes an inner trip, collectively, WITHOUT THE USE OF DRUGS" (emphasis added).

Now, this is ridiculous. Marshall's problem is that he is not turned on, only plugged in. Since he has made his bed, he must reside in it. What he won't admit is that here is ANOTHER MEDIUM and, instead of addressing himself to it, he tries to burn it down to his OWN theory.

(For readers who wonder what just in the hell IS his theory, it is this: just as printing caused a revolution, the medium of electricity caused another via the electric light (his favorite symbol), the telegraph, the radio, the TV, the computer and automation.

(Instead of the message getting through the way it started out, the MEDIUM of communicating the message CHANGES the thought into something else, i.e., he claims that if Hitler had to appear on TV, he would have been a failure, but, on radio, he was the Top Ten for some time.

(And, from the book being reviewed: "We are now in the midst of our first television war (Vietnam) ... Along with the computer, it has altered every phase of the American vision and identity ... The public is now participant in every phase of the war, and the main actions of the war are now being fought in the American home itself.")

But then he goes on to say that LSD doesn't "alter" the identity, rather, it is just another TV trip. "These drugs, which stimulate more intensely our new electric environment, therefore enhance these senses that have long been neutralized by the merely visual culture of the mechanical age."

This reviewer's biggest beef with McLuhan is that he lacks a sense of philosophy (naturally — electricity has no philosophy) and when he comes face to face with a situation that SCREAMS OUT FOR SOME MEANING, ANY MEANING, where is McLuhan? He's fiddling around with his god-damned TV set.

Example: "Just as the Japanese insist that it is not the tea but the ritual that gives meaning, Dr. Kormos suggested that it is the procedure of group participation and sharing of the drug that lends 'a sense of belonging and identity that may be more important to the student than the effect of the drug.'"

Okay — why doesn't he comment on 1) the "sense of belonging" exists in ALL cultures and mediums, 2) the electric/computer age ALIENATES MUCH FASTER PEOPLE FROM PEOPLE INS! BRINGING THEM TOGETHER IN "global village"; it does not CREATE this alienation, that was created much earlier when there were only TWO people around.

Example (at the very end of the book): "One thing about which a fish knows exactly is water, since they have no anti-environment which would enable them to perceive the element they live in... a fish is always a fish and always manages to continue to be a fish while it exists at all. Such is not, by any means, the case with man."

Leaving that last sentence to go its merry way for the moment, it seemed to this reviewer IMMEDIATELY upon reading the above

As attorney for the student body, Kayo is planning to file a show cause order for a preliminary injunction this weekend before Federal District Judge LM, Peckham. Affidavits affixed to Hallinan's order testify to systematic denials of First and Fifth Amendment rights on the campus. Besides seeking to close the campus, Hallinan also will press for the firing of Hayakawa and disbandment of the Tac Squad.

CAL REBELS RENDERED HELPLESS

"We can't even defend ourselves now."

That's Harvey Waldman's reaction to his probable dismissal from the University of California as a result of the Sprout Hall sit-in of October.

Disciplinary hearings have just been completed on the Berkeley campus for the more than 120 students who crashed on the floors of the bureaucracy's fortress in order to protest the Regents' denial of credit to Social Analysis 139X, Eldridge Cleaver's course.

The majority of protestors were tried en masse before the Student-Faculty Committee on Student Conduct and the punishment recommended for them was two quarters disciplinary probation. Several of the group, like Waldman, were summoned to individual hearings because of past records.

It now appears that Waldman is the only one to face the shit full blast. He was already on probation this quarter for his participation in last December's Sprout Hall mill-ins.

In a BARB interview Waldman recalled that the mill-ins were protesting the suspension of two of the leaders of Stop the Draft Week. Now Waldman is being forced off campus as an Enemy of the State, magna cum laude (suspension ranks as cum laude and expulsion as summa cum laude).

Part of the reason they're coming down on him so hard is, he believes, that "They didn't like my attitudes. I was pretty honest with them about why I took part."

In essence, however, he sees his "punishment" as part of the Administration's divide and conquer style repression. "They play the movement against itself. Those students who take the most radical stands are cut away and then the students are afraid to take really radical action."

The result of this selective repression is, in his view, that "for all intents and purposes there is no movement at Cal."

Harvey attributes this stagnation partly to the fact that Berkeley lacks a Hayakawa. "At Berkeley there's no personality to represent the Establishment and that's a smart move. In the future, the Establishment will become less and less distinguishable from the machines."

In order to handle the movement's stagnation he suggests that all radicals leave the country for awhile "to get some perspective on what to do next. We have to do something."

Waldman intends to appeal his dismissal, but since his appeal must go to Chancellor Roger Heyns, who appoints the Committee on Conduct and then makes the final decisions on punishment based on the Committee's recommendations, Harvey has little hope of receiving justice.

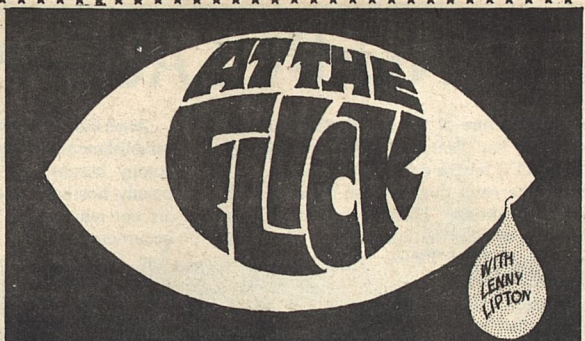

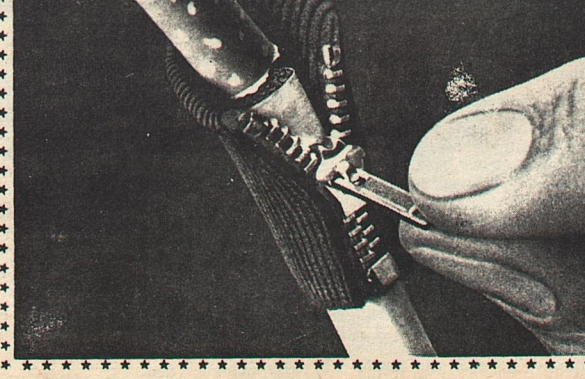

CHEW'EM UP! RONNIE RAT'S POLICY PREVAILS

"If you've seen one redwood, you've seen them all."

Consider the towering stupidity one would have to speak from to utter that incredibly asinine and ugly statement. Ronald Reagan said it. Who else?

This week, from the lofty Berkeley branch of the University of California bureaucracy came an echoing of that almighty gubernatorial stupidity. Worthy of it, one might say.

Academic dead heads in the decision department decided to go ahead with the University's onepostponed plans to build a cross-campus road by destroying a living redwood grove. Can those who sit behind their mahogany desks making small decisions for the giant Berkeley campus be so stupid as to cut up their own face in order to spite their plans to keep the campus one of the most beautiful in the world?

The answer came this week: Only four trees will be removed. Just four, they said. If you've seen one, why have four? Why have any? Why leave trees standing when we can teach about them in the classroom? Anyone who is qualified for admission to the University will be able to study them. Lots of good school don't have any trees, they pointed out.

But two years ago, students at the City College of New York sat down in the path of bulldozers which had come to take away the few that they had.

The plan to bulldoze part of the Berkeley campus has already come under fire, largely through the efforts of a group called Active Conservation Tactics. Petitions raised last year by the conservation group pressured the University to abandon its plans to build a cross-campus road through the

Wickson Redwood grove. But 500 signatures this year were not enough.

The ultimate plan will be carried out, the Chancellor said, because great "inconvenience" was caused by the year-long experimental closing of such a drive. There are more than 50 trees in that grove, anyhow, his spokesmen have said.

Bids for the destruction open in three weeks. Plans call for tree-cutting ceremonies to begin in February. University officials would not say whether initial-carving would be permitted in coincidence with Valentine's Day activities, or whether the trees will be fenced off prior to their annihilation.

The possibility of fresh redwood toothpicks for the Faculty Club, Alumni Center, and the Golden Bear restaurant was not discussed, according to an unreliable spokesman.

With the inevitability of a trans-redwood grove highway just down the road, several still active members of Active Conservation Tactics suggest that any one interested in saving the trees should send a letter to Chancellor Heyns. His secretary, who will accept bids for blade sharpening in one hand, has been instructed to accept conservation letters in the other, they say.

One campus person interviewed at the scene of next month's crime, expressed his fears that Berkeley would begin to look as asphalt-ugly as U.C.L.A.

"Wasn't it Joyce Kilmer who said: I think that I shall never see a campus lovely as U.C.?" he asked. "First they take away the good grassy areas, then they start hauling away whole trees," he lamented.

"A tree,; he told BARB, may in summer wear a nest of robins in her hair."

He described the proposed cross-campus highway as a very foolish thing. "Roads are made by fools like me, but only God can make a tree." The spokesman said he was neither an Active Conservationist, an English major, nor a divinity student. "I just like to look at trees," he explained. "Besides, if you've seen one cross-campus road, you've seen enough." --s b g

PRESIDIO VICTIMS FATE STILL UNDECIDED

The fate of the 27 Presidio stockade GI's being investigated for mutiny is still up in the air.

Several weeks have elapsed since the Army finished its preliminary hearings on whether the men should be court-martialed. Everyone is waiting for the decision. For the men it is a question of life or death, since death might well be the punishment dealt out.

Meanwhile, on December 6, Terence Hallinan, attorney for 17 of the men, sent a writ of Habeas Corpus to the Military Court of Appeals in Washington DC asking that the Army be prevented from quartering prisoners in the Presidio stockade because of the illegal conditions inside the brig.

Hallinan is sure the military will turn down the writ. He says he is merely following the advice of Judge Albert Wollenberg, who suggested that every possible avenue be exhausted before submitting the case to a civilian court.

Hallinan submitted the same writ to Wollenberg on November 26. The judge ruled it premature and asked Hallinan to try the military appeal court first.

"If we get turned down, we'll have tried everything," Hallinan told BARB. "Letter to Washington, appeals to Congressmen, delegations to see the commanding general, petitions by the prisoners -- everything has failed," he said.

Tuesday a group of ten prominent Bay Area citizens went to see Colonel Garnett, the base's Judge Advocate and asked that charges against the 27 soldiers be dropped. A spokesman for the War Resisters League said Garnett was non-committal in his reply.

The incident in question occurred on October 14, when the 27 prisoners refused to work to protest the killing of a fellow inmate by a guard three days earlier.

SCHOOL HURTIN' FOR KIDS

There's at least one public school in the East Bay that's not overcrowded. In fact, it's hurting for kids.

And if they don't show soon, the pupils of Canyon school will have to forsake the woods, foxes, raccoons, and clean air they enjoy and be bussed to city schools.

Unless a family with several children moves out to the little town over the hills from Oakland, the local 2 room school will be closed. The school, which has two teachers and grades from kindergarten through seventh, has recently fallen below the teacher-pupil ratio required for a public school.

The twenty pupils still there face the possibility of having to commute to nearby Moraga if no federal funds are supplied for the community school.

"Canyon is really a beautiful place for children," Henry Viveiros, a resident told BARB this week. "It is an ideal environment for people who like country life."

Living quarters at low cost are available to several families who would like to move out to Canyon, both for the benefit of themselves and the children already there.

HITCH-HIKING IN LAOS

It's weird.

Future historians, in analyzing the causes of the Laotian War (or World War III, as the case may be), will be stumped by a curious footnote which will cause them to take off (or put on) their spectacles, shake their heads slowly, and say, "It's weird." They will be amazed, of course, at the presence of "hippies" in Laos and the part they play politically in the games of intrigue that are so characteristic of Laotian government.

First, it is necessary to note that Laos, aside from being "The Land of a Million Elephants and the White Parasol," aside from bordering on almost every major Southeast Asian country including China and the Vietnams, aside from being governed by a shaky and sometimes non-existent coalition government, is also one of the few places in the world where marijuana and hashish are absolutely, totally, and completely legal. Consequently, the beleaguered Westerner finds life in Laos idyllic, as the setting of an enchanted fairy tale. Complications are not created by the Laotians (who attach no importance to the fact that marijuana -- called "ganja" locally -- is sold in the Vientiane marketplace at the tobacco stalls) but by the Americans (who else?) who are conscientiously dedicated to the development and enlightenment of the Laotian people.

There is growing in Vientiane a curious arms race: on the one hand, the American presence makes itself felt with increased aid to the Royalist government (\$67 million a year), American "advisers," U.S.A.I.D. rice, Air America and Continental Airways (two airlines run by the C.I.A. in support of the Lao Royalist Troops), a U.S. road construction project that will, when completed, make it easier to deploy troops from Vientiane (the major city) to Luang and, on the other hand, hitchhikers from all over the world have convened in cafes on Rue Dong Palane to smoke opium (in illegal but well-protected dens), open discotheques, botiques, give light shows, and just generally blow their minds in a paranoia-free atmosphere. One enterprising young Frenchman named Max makes and sells some of the finest joints in SE Asia and, in the spirit of supply and demand capitalism, he does quite well.

U.S. officials in Laos are nervous, concerned, baffled, and frustrated by all this. The "hippies" (or "hitchhikers" as they call themselves) are a factor that never entered into the planned U.S. intervention (and take-over) of foreign countries and the whole situation leaves the C.I.A. embarrassingly short of tactics.

The Laotian people must regard with amusement the rival groups of "phalangs" (foreigners): rigid, bourgeois, crew-cut types who drink liquor, talk about increased crop production, worry about strengthening the royalist troops and defeating the Pathet Lao (Laotian version of the Viet Cong) while colorful, marijuana-smoking hitchhikers float around Vientiane in native garb working in various and ingenious ways to sustain the mythic existence of life in Laos (where rent is \$30 a month, food is one dollar a day, grass is practically free, the weather is sunny and the Mekong River flows nearby).

Imagine some poor State Department official as he surveys his task. Vietnam was easier, he thinks. In Vietnam, all that was necessary was barbed wire and a few soldiers. But the Laotian people are not civilized. They don't care about the war between the royalist troops and the Pathet Lao (which is fought, incidentally, by the Americans and the North Vietnamese). The Laotians don't care about ideology, about the Communist Threat, about The Yellow Peril, about the U.S. Information Service. Indeed, the Laotian people don't care about anything. They are uneducated. (They are stoned.) The Laotian people are not interested in Stopping Communist Aggression and, as if things weren't bad enough, these hippies come in here and reinforce this unconcern about Reality. Damn dirty unwashed filthy beatniks. Their growing prominence in Vientiane and their evangelistic missions to outlying villages endangers

the whole infrastructure of war and destruction that the United States has planned ("at the invitation of the Prime Minister") for the country of Laos.

As must be the case, this situation abounds with improbable personalities. There is a guiding light behind the circus of faces that hitchhike to Vientiane and stay ("It's incredible: I came to Vientiane for a look around and I've been here six months" is a common complaint) and that guiding light is one of the most improbable personalities: Dr. Sheldon Cholst, a wealthy psychiatrist from New York who is waging his own private war against Insanity by dropping out and supporting, in Laos, the influx of artists, writers, creators, inventors, hitchhikers, adventurers and maniacs who gather joyously at Dr. Cholst's cafe "The Third Eye" and discuss, amidst the smell of hashish, the coming consciousness revolution.

Says Cholst, "I am a psychiatrist by profession and American society is very sick. As a physician, I would be remiss if I did not prescribe a remedy. It is useless reconstructing the mental health of individuals when the whole environment of life in America is so unhealthy. For this situation, I prescribe marijuana. Marijuana would serve to relax and stimulate the American people, thereby liberating their creative energies without further aggravating the prevailing situation of guilt, paranoia, and aggressiveness." Dr. Cholst has, in addition to lending financial support to The Third Eye, written a Constitution for The World where he advocates, among other things, an annual stipend for everyone by virtue of their Right Not to Work. The career of Dr. Cholst reads like the riot act and he is not the only "phalang" that causes officials in the U.S. embassy to wring their hands in despair.



The arms race in both the "hippie" and the "army" camps has escalated with Vietnamese regularity. As the fighting between the Pathet Lao and the royalist troops (U.S. supplied and financed) ebbs and flows, the number of U.S. generals that can be seen chauffeured through the streets of Vientiane in black, unmarked cars increases. It is not secret that the U.S. has been bombing Pathet Lao controlled areas of Laos (which, by the way, may be well over 50% of the country) where the North Vietnamese take refuge. While U.S. supplied planes streak through the air bringing rice to the "friendly" troops and bombs to the "enemy," U.S.A.I.D. officials show the People (in order to Win their Hearts and Minds), propaganda films at the local Buddhist temple which, I was amused to note one night, included old travelogues and an army training film on combat techniques.

But no one seems to be taking the Americans and their Holy Mission seriously, except for the few Laotian generals who benefit financially from all the talk about "security" (which is fast becoming the most dangerous and deadly word in the American language). The supreme tolerance of the Laotian people is manifested by the fact that they put up with both the pushy, self-seeking Americans and the gentle, bizarre hitchhikers. The Laotians accept aid (guns and rice) from the former and sell opium to the latter, perfectly content to let considerations of communism, morality, or philosophy go undiscussed. The thinly disguised hostility between the rival groups of "phalangs" is considered to be an internal affair and the Laotians stay out of it, granting visas and visa extensions impartially.

American officials are afraid, most likely, of the establishment of a permanent Vientiane-based artist colony because the members of such a colony are openly hostile to the war next door in Vietnam and are not reluctant to work actively to prevent such an occurrence in Laos. If the fledgling community on Rue Dong Palane can become economically self-sufficient (as it is tending to become), the position of the U.S. influence in Laos will be weakened in a very subtle and important way.

The hitchhikers and the resident European community (primarily French businessmen left over from colonial days) can unite to give the Laotians more options in dealing with the Western world than just the traditional Asian ritual of accepting American "aid" and yielding to American pressure. The colony that is entrenching itself on Rue Dong Palane contains many educated, talented people who can offer the Laotians instruction in many of the skills and methods of Western society. These people would actually make better teachers -- whether the subject be airplane mechanics or English -- than the U.S.A.I.D. people because their life-style is closer to the Laotian than that of the American U.S.A.I.D. official and this implies acceptance of (or at least great respect for) Lao religious and cultural values.

The American comes into Asian societies like a bull in a china shop, blind to the subtleties of Eastern thought and antagonistic to the rhythmic, cyclical slowness and (In) efficiency of life in Asia. The contact between East and West demands not that the East abandon its centuries-old heritage and copy Western habits, but that both viewpoints (the agrarian and the industrial) yield, change, and grow. A failure to communicate culturally in this confrontation can, and does, have disastrous results -- as the war in Vietnam clearly shows.

Two types of Westerner has emerged in reaction to the contact between East and West and these two types are in cold but serious war in Vientiane. The first type regards Western ways as being superior and seeks to impose them on the East. The second type realizes that Eastern civilization is a deep and rich source of wisdom from which even Westerners can learn much, and, consequently, he adopts a more receptive attitude toward the Oriental viewpoint. The tension that exists between these two personalities is at once amusing and serious.

The phenomenon of "hippies" (or pro-Oriental Westerners) in Laos is interesting, but its significance is more sociological than political. The people who leave their warm, secure homes in the West to travel through mystic India and finally settle in the smoky corners of Vientiane generally shun history and politics. These people are forced onto the historical stage because of circumstances -- 1) the coincidence of a senseless, brutal war being fought next door in Vietnam and 2) they symbolize the collapse of indigenous values in the West.

It is an illusion of American officials that the ideological complexion of Asia is vital to the defense of the United States -- and the influx of "hippies" into Asia is suspicious in the sense that it deviates from the strong, straight, pro-American line that the U.S. has been trying to cultivate with money and "aid." To the eyes of U.S. generals, the "hippies" are undermining everything that the U.S. has accomplished in Asia (including death and destruction) and should martial law ever be declared in Laos (as it often is) these people will be the first to receive expulsion orders. It is the nature of the "cold war" between the hitchhikers and the army that is serious.

But another aspect of this subtle rivalry is amusing. Dr. Cholst, who lives on the Thatdam (Laotian embassy row) struck fear into the hearts of U.S. embassy officials by placing a sign on his gate that read "The Free U.S. Embassy." Dr. Cholst declared himself the Ambassador to Laos representing all Americans who are "internally free." The Laotians and the hitchhikers found this incident to be highly amusing; the U.S. embassy (which is five hundred yards away from "The Free U.S. Embassy") was not so easily pleased. According to Dr. Cholst, he removed the sign when the C.I.A. began making serious attempts on his life. Such is politics in Laos.

Monday night saw an amazing first in the history of US television, an hour-long special with an all Black cast.

The Temptations and Diana Ross and the Supremes scored an hour of prime network time to present their Moutown review. This fact in itself was one of the few redeeming features of the program.

The show came on like an 1890's minstrel show, a bad version of soul and a trite rendition of "Hill ya'll. Us darkies is gwine per-

form to yo white folk."

Diana Ross, for all her super-fine looks, was a bore. Most of her lines (verbal) rang insincere and too very slick. The idea seemed to be to present her as an African Polly Bergen, and it just didn't make it.

Adding insult to injury, Mary Wilson and Cindy Birdsong, the other two Supremes, received virtually zero percent camera coverage. In almost every song the group sang (most were shortened

medley style) the camera would zoom in on Diana cheating it up, while all that was visible of the others was the back of Cindy's head.

Even the Temptations couldn't pull it out. It was obvious some dumb whitey choreographed much of their moves. And their costumes . . . in one number it was mod clothes and white face collars. Oh Yeah!

As a whole the show lacked basic continuity, shuffling the girls off and the guys on, and the guys off and the girls on, etc. The crap dished out in the opening minutes of the show prompted a friend to exclaim, stunned, "Whatever happened to the soul spades are

supposed to have?"

The worst incidence of bad continuity came near the end of the show when the Temptations boogalooed through their smash "I'm Losing You". With everyone finally worked up and ready to get it on, the camera panned to Diana who dribbled a saccharin medley of "With a Song In My Heart" and "Without A Song".

Anyone remember those two great soul tunes?

The producer of the show was named MacKayie. How's that for a good old down home name.

Anyway you look at it, however, it took a lot of balls for everyone involved to put the show on the air. Kudos for that.

It is too bad, though, that it turned out to be such a white-wash. Next time, brothers and sisters, Say It Loud!

COURT GAGS GARRY

Charles Garry, attorney for Warren Wells, has been gagged by the court.

The injunction against all comment on the trial of Wells, a Black Panther accused of attempted murder, was slapped on Garry before the trial began.

Meanwhile Joe Alioto keeps up his barrage of shrieks and squawks about "the long record of Black Panther violence" and is calling for the third time for a Grand Jury investigation of the Panthers.

Garry has moved for a mistrial on the bases of these statements by "flannel mouthed" Alioto (the man in the grey flannel mouth?).

Garry, of course, had no comment on the trial--not even for BARB.

This week saw defendant Wells stand up and shout "that's a lie!" at a cop who testified that he had not pulled down Wells' pants after arrest or said "you oughta be dead, nigger!" to him.

The appeal for Huey Newton is percolating slowly, as such things normally do in the legal maze. The transcript has not yet been compiled, (it's 4000 pages long) and no action can be taken until it is filed.

Meanwhile, a request for bail has been filed with the Supreme Court and a ruling is expected "any time," according to Garry.

BIAFRAN SYMPATHY PICKET

The British Consulate in San Francisco will be picketed on December 20th in protest of the slaughter in Biafra.

The demonstrators at 160 Sansome Street from 9 am to 3 pm will ask the consul to advise his government to cease its arms supplies to Federal Nigeria, and demand the Federal Army to lift its blockade of relief supply routes to Biafra.

International agencies estimate that 3,000 people, mostly helpless children, are starving to death every day in the war torn areas of Biafra. Britain, spurred on by pure neo-colonial and economic interests is supplying arms to the federal side, hoping to preserve its oil interests in Nigeria.

On December 16 there will be an open planning meeting at the War Resisters League, 833 Haight Street, to decide exactly what form the demonstration of the 20th should take. Those who want more information should contact the WRL by calling 626-6976

The festivities, including lighting of the candles and a retelling of the major events of the guerrilla struggle, will take place in the Heller Lounge of the ASUC student building at U.C. The community is urged to bring latkes, dreidels, and good spirits.

The following night at 8, the Union of Jewish Students will counter - attack at the Newman Center.

In contrast to the Spartan simplicity of the New Left, the Union promises a deluge of delights.

Like, "plates of steaming potato latkes and soft jelly doughnuts swallowed with mulled wine."

Rabbis and priests will lead the hosts in prayer and celebration. And there will be -- Hassidic dancing, poetry, and a light show.

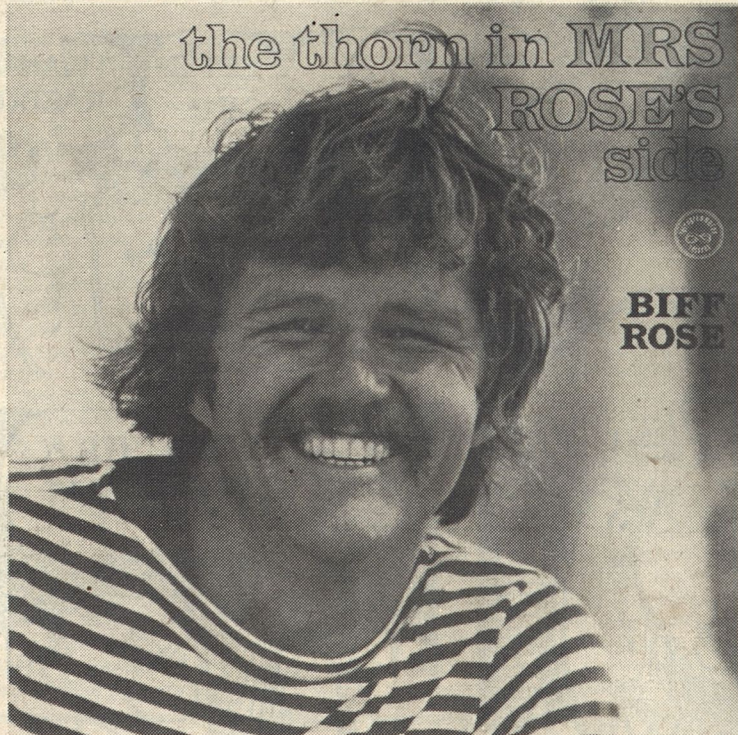
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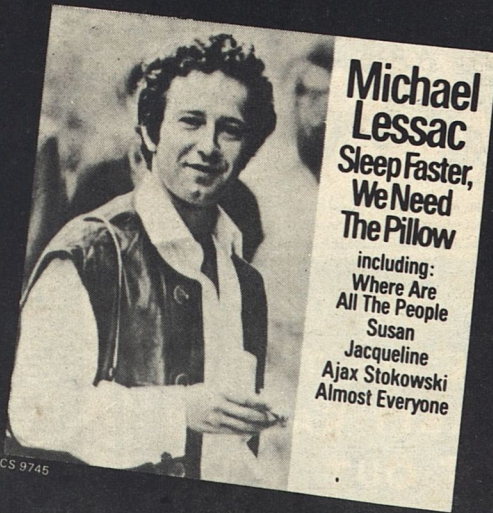

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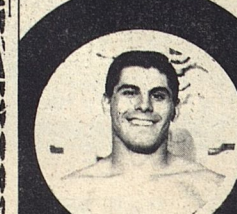
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Roving Rat Fink

ched, will leave a small recess in my skin. When I pull a hair out I have a small white "head" at the end that I would like to put into the recess, doing this until I have a sizable patch of 14-inch long hair dangling from my cheek.

I know it would look out-of-sight if I did it, but I don't know if it's safe.

ANSWER: Out-of-sight. But it won't work and you could easily cause an infection this way.

There is a relatively new operation in which dermatologists "transplant" small patches of hair from densely covered parts of the scalp to bald areas, a surgical procedure similar to skin grafting. Several operations are necessary and it's quite costly.

QUESTION: What's the advisab-

ility of turning on someone who had a nervous breakdown years ago and had a bout with paranoia?

She seems to be on her feet now. Would she flip out on grass? ANSWER: She might. Psychotic reactions following the use of marijuana are rare but they do occur. Paranoid feelings under the influence of marijuana are common, depending usually on the pre-stoned state of the individual. If your friend were with strangers in unfamiliar surroundings, the chances for an unpleasant experience would be greatly increased.

Birth control pills can be purchased from a vending machine at the University of the Philippines, according to the PHILIPPINE COLLEGIAN. The machine carries several popular brands of "the pill" and was installed by the school's student council to reduce the number of unwanted pregnancies.

We don't handle "the pill" so casually, and with good reason, but very few American student health services provide birth control information and devices. Many student health services are entirely supported by student fees, the University of California's system, for example. It's strange that students at these schools have not insisted upon provision of contraceptive devices.

Another method of preventing unwanted pregnancies was proposed recently by India's Family Planning Minister Sripati Chandrasekar.

The cheapest and safest method of family planning, he said, was abstinence. Abstinence for a year would be of great benefit for the individual and the country, the Family Planning Minister said in a speech at Poona University. Sure, Sripati baby. What else is happening in Indian population planning?

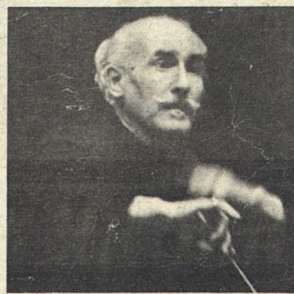

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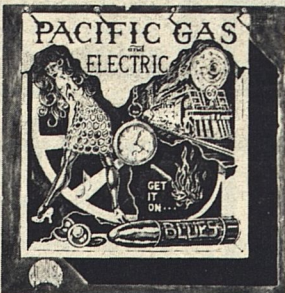

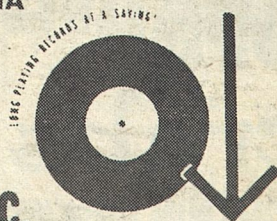
