from the Mexico jail

I'm writing this with the hope that it will help anybody who gets ripped in Mexico.

At the present time, there seems to be a new harassment campaign against hippies and people under 30. If you are coming to Mexico; here's what's going on.

The Municipal Police are spear-

heading a program to drive hippies, long-hairs, and people under 30, out of Mexico. They are the pigs you will probably meet if you are arrested. The Federales concern themselves mainly with smugglers and large amounts of dope. If that's your bag, I assume you know your business.

Remember: You don't have to be guilty to get arrested. To the Municipal Police, guilt or innocence is often irrelevant, many people are simply extorted on the spot and told to leave town.

The most important part of getting busted is; be diplomatic. I cannot stress this point enough. A recent survey taken here at the carcel shows that four out of five gringos here hadmouthed the man while being arrested.

Assume your guilt automatically and stress the point that it is important to you to pay a fine on the spot. you have to leave town today or whatever.

But time is crucial. The amount of the fine and the difficulty in regaining your freedom both increase the longer you are under arrest. Pay the cop. Whatever he asks for will be the cheapest. If you can't solve your problem on the spot and get taken down-town, the fine jumps to its current level (about \$300.00).

Forget any ideas about legal assistance from the American consul. There is nothing he can do to help until a fine is arranged between you and the police. When it is necessary to have money wired to pay your fine, he will help you but the consul will not represent you, nor will he interfere with the Mexican legal process in any criminal case.

Upon regaining your freedom, leave town immediately. The only other survey taken recently shows that 8 out of 10 gringos here in the carcel are doing their second beef. 80% of the American population in residence failed to observe this point.

Most people who come to Mexico don't have any trouble with the police. If you are unfortunate and get busted, remember; no matter how bleak it looks, its better than getting busted in the States. Keep your head, be diplomatic, pay the 'fine' and get out of town.

ESCAPE HATCH OPEN

While the Canadian border is tightening up on deserters and draft dodgers, it is NOT closed to either.

So says the Montreal Council to Aid War Resisters in a letter dated Feb. 3. The straight press has been running reports that deserters are routinely barred from immigration to Canada.

"The situation is bad," says Ed Miller, Executive Secretary of the Council, "but we are still able to get guys through."

The Montreal Council is helping to prepare a brief pointing up the contradiction between stated immigration policy and practice, Canadian immigration law clearly states what qualities of an applicant are to be considered by officials. Military status, present or future, is not one, and this has been reaffirmed by high officials.

But directives have gone out to lower officials to bar deserters. The Montreal Council refers to an "internal directive" dated July 1968 to that effect which was acknowledged by a "spokesman for the Immigration Department."

The latest word from draft resistance groups in Canada is for prospective immigrants to avoid applying for immigration status at the borders and enter as visitors.

Once inside, application may be made, although the wait may be a problem. "Such applicants may be effectively starved out because they are not permitted to work for as long as six months after submitting applications," says the Council.

"We believe that the delay is deliberate and is designed to demoralize and impoverish the applicants so that they return to the U.S.," the statement says. The Council cites the case of one immigrant who lived with the family of his fiancée for six months before receiving permission to work. He is now married and still may not work in Canada.

"Others have not been so lucky" comments the Council.

It is apparent that immigration should not be attempted without expert advice. The Montreal Council to Aid War Resisters may be reached through Case Postale 231, Montreal 6, Quebec.

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PIGS RUN AMOK

HOW YOU CAN TELL THE COPS FROM PIGS

Police officers or pigs? Last Friday California Highway Patrol Officer Vital was amiably chatting with UC students about his Mexican-American upbringing. Someone asked if he was going to be our leader in the revolution. Everyone laughed. Students even made up a yell "Vital supports the strike."

The next Monday Vital was back at UC, ordering his men to charge defenseless onlookers in Sproul Plaza. I inquired about his former friendly attitude. He said he didn't remember what happened Friday.

When it comes right down to it, none of the friendly conversation will mean shit. The cops become dehumanized robots following orders, or brutal pigs sadistically clubbing anyone in their path. Even after a day on the strike line you learn who the real pigs are and stay out of their way.

Number 302 of the CHP pushed a girl repeatedly with his stick because she was going the wrong way through Sather Gate. Only the shouts of other students drove him off.

Number 323, another CHP tried to trip me as I sought to retreat. Later he was in on an arrest in Sproul Plaza, using his stick gleefully around a striker's throat.

"What kind of people are you," a girl demanded of #288 of the Alameda pigs. The bullnecked bluedecked bastard had just pushed Dave Comstock, A University employee for walking past the police line.

"How can you live with yourself?" students asked him. "Do you know what the strike is all about?"

But 288 remained silent. Sweat formed on his face as he stared straight ahead, cornered by dozens of students. You could tell he was itching to get his club on all the goddamn dirty commies around him. Other cops took him aside before he could blow up.

"Go home and beat your wife," people shouted after him. "Tell her what a hard day you had."

"I have no sympathy for anyone," CHP Vance #3398 told inquiring strikers. They had asked how he felt about police turning dogs on blacks in Birmingham.

Occasionally a few cops smiled to the chant, "Work, study, get ahead, kill!" or to queries if they had seen "Yellow Submarine." But everything became tense when the chant became "Off the pigs."

"It's my first day here," Number 2677 a meek looking cop talking to some medics said. "But I don't know what's going on." He appeared scared, surrounded by hundreds of students.

"He doesn't seem the type to hit anyone," the medic said as he walked away. "But he'd do it just by reflex. He's so nervous."

At 3:55 students chanted "Eim, Swei, Drel!" as their uniformed adversaries marched off the campus in what has become a common event in America.

But atop the Student Union there still remained agents with spy-glasses. Strikers gave them the finger. Another secret policeman in a red sweater was above the cigar store on Bancroft and Telly.

That's an even more frightening view of the America to come.

WHY TA'S WERE ON THE LINE

Pigs on campus make for bad working conditions, according to American Federation of Teachers local 1570 at Berkeley.

AFT 1570 is the teaching assistants' union.

Union members passed a resolution Monday ordering their representatives to stress the importance of the removal of police from the campus and the termination of Reagan's state of emergency in current negotiations with the University administration.

The Monday meeting also resulted in a definite decision to hold a peace picket on campus Thursday to test the state of emergency.

No specific ban on peaceful picketing has been announced since Reagan's decision, but there was a report that police broke up a moving picket line set up by TWLF on Monday.

Union members gave their executive committee authority to call a strike meeting when necessary, but rejected a proposal to set a definite date for it. AFT held a strike vote two weeks ago which was unsuccessful. Members did not want to risk another unsuccessful attempt to call a strike.

The two factors in the background of the union's actions were the current TWLF student strike at Cal and negotiations now under way between the union and the administration over a variety of issues.

AFT 1570 has demanded that the administration implement the TWLF demands, and is also seeking the right to organize on campus.

THURSDAY, 4 PM--

UC Berkeley was a battleground on Thursday. Two hundred or more pigs waged war on several thousand students and compatriots.

The entire AFT picket line was busted. About twenty other busts were made throughout the afternoon, as BARB went to press. Most of the victims being beaten first.

The striker's lines swelled with new supporters, as the helmeted pigs shoved and smacked their way through campus.

Before the struggle for control of Sproul Plaza began, three Third World Liberation Front leaders, Jeff Leong, Howard Ramsey and Elijah Turner, were arrested as the Highway Patrol broke up peaceful picket lines.

Then came a noon rally at which Jim Nabors vowed that "We will seize power, we will rip it off as they ripped it off from us."

Third World Community supporters of the strike failed to show up on campus in sizeable numbers. Ysidro Macias, a TWLF spokesman, attributed this to the economic facts of Third World life. "Our people just don't have the kind of jobs where they can get away to attend a morning rally at UC."

Macias told BARB that "the strike cannot continue as it has. It's going to take a very different character."

TRIPPING ON

We all played red light green light with the pigs on Monday at Cal. But for the kids who got beaten or busted, it was no joke.

For the first time in two weeks, the Administration allowed a Sproul Hall rally to take place. While it was going on the CHP fuzz kept out of sight.

Jim Nabors, spokesman for the Third World Liberation Front, promised the 'campus community'

that, "If there are only ten of us, we're gonna take care of business."

Toward the end of the rally, strikers formed another stationary picket line at the Telly and Bancroft entrance to campus. As soon as the crowd of listeners in the plaza had broken up, out came the police to break up the picket line.

The campus belonged to the Highway Patrol and Alameda County blue meanies now, or so they thought.

The students began to gather in the midst of their lines. We marched up and down the plaza, singing 'power to the people.' The cops didn't like that and, using their clubs to prod us, broke up the march.

It seems sheriff Madigan, commander-in-chief of the occupying army, wanted all us kids on the sidelines.

So students began to gather again on Sproul plaza, in between the armed patrols. More singing of 'power to the people.' More sweeps by combat-ready police.

Things got progressively more upright. People were getting tired of being pushed around their own campus by the robots in khaki. A line of blue meanies kept coming on strong as an imitation Tac Squad.

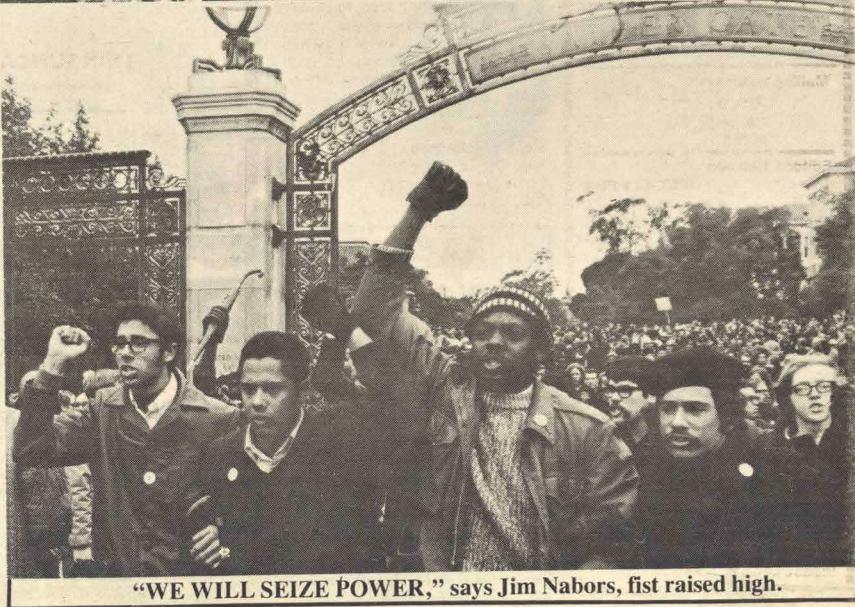
A favorite tactic of one AC blue meanie was to jerk forward his billy club in a sudden ejaculatory gesture, which was accompanied by a fierce grunting from within his plastic visor.

The afternoon got more upright as defiant students were singled out for Alameda County's world-renowned B&B, being beaten and busted.

Several times it seemed that either a police riot or a student-police battle might erupt like spontaneous combustion. But the pat-

TWLF LEADER TELLS WHY HE'S WHERE IT'S AT

"As a child I was interned for four years in concentration camps in San Mateo and Utah."

Richard Aoki takes another drag on his cigarette and continues to carefully and unemotionally describe his life under the gun of American racism.

Richard Aoki is a spokesman for the Third World Liberation Front at UC Berkeley.

After WW II, the Japanese-Americans were liberated from the "relocation centers" and Richard began his education in black ghetto schools in the Bay Area.

"Of my junior high graduating class, more than 50% have been in jail or are in jail now. I see this as a reflection of their being unable to achieve a standard of living through traditional means."

Richard attributes his school-mates' alienation from traditional means to the West Oakland ghetto's "high rate of unemployment, sub-standard housing, inadequate educational institutions, inferior medical services, and constant police harassment."

"One high school teacher advised Richard that 'I'd end up in San Quentin five years after I got out of school."

"I took it on a very personal level when they vamped on me, but in retrospect," he says now, "I see they couldn't have acted in any other way because of the racist nature of the institution."

When he was 17 Richard signed up for the Army hoping to attain a measure of "vertical mobility." He was offered a commission "but I told them I wanted to do some other things."

After the Army Richard spent two years at a junior college in a pre-med program. But, "I gave that up upon being convinced of the racist nature of the medical profession. There is no institution in this country that doesn't have it."

"I started asking around about the medical schools and found that there was a quota system for Asian-Americans."

Having failed to find a racism-free zone in either the service or school, Richard went on the road. He spent six years "wandering about the country, just seeing what it's all about."

Along the way he worked as a truck driver, hospital orderly, clerk and factory hand. He learned two things: that there aren't any areas in this country really free of racism, and that his thing was to work for the Asian-American community.

"I became convinced that this is my country, and if it's going to become a more positive society, then I have to stay here and help."

Leaving the road, he returned to school, graduated with honors in sociology, and is now a grad student at UC. The Third World Strike is his way of creating a racism-free zone for this country's Third Worlders.

"I think the strike's going on quite well. Morale is quite high, we still think we're going to win."

Richard believes the Third World College will help the minority communities by creating "a circular thing where the youth leaves the community, comes on campus, and then goes back to the community."

The TWLF has put a great deal of energy into building strike support in the Third World community. "If we convince them that we're fighting in their best interests, then there will be another dimension to the struggle."

The Front expects this support to materialize Thursday (BARB press time) on campus, and the future direction of the strike depends on Thursday's turnout.

"The Third World College will be instituted at UC," Richard says flatly, "it's just a matter of time. The strike is a manifestation of the question of who's going to control it."

Though the TWLF has received a favorable response from some faculty and administrators, "the

main sources of power at the university have indicated an intransigent attitude of non-cooperation with the Third World Liberation Front."

The Front is aware that many white strikers are dissatisfied with the strike's tactical pace, but "they haven't seen anything yet, we've just started."

"Multi-faceted systems of pressure will be exerted on the University."

"Nothing much has really happened here -- a few beatings, a few fights on the line, petty acts see p. 29

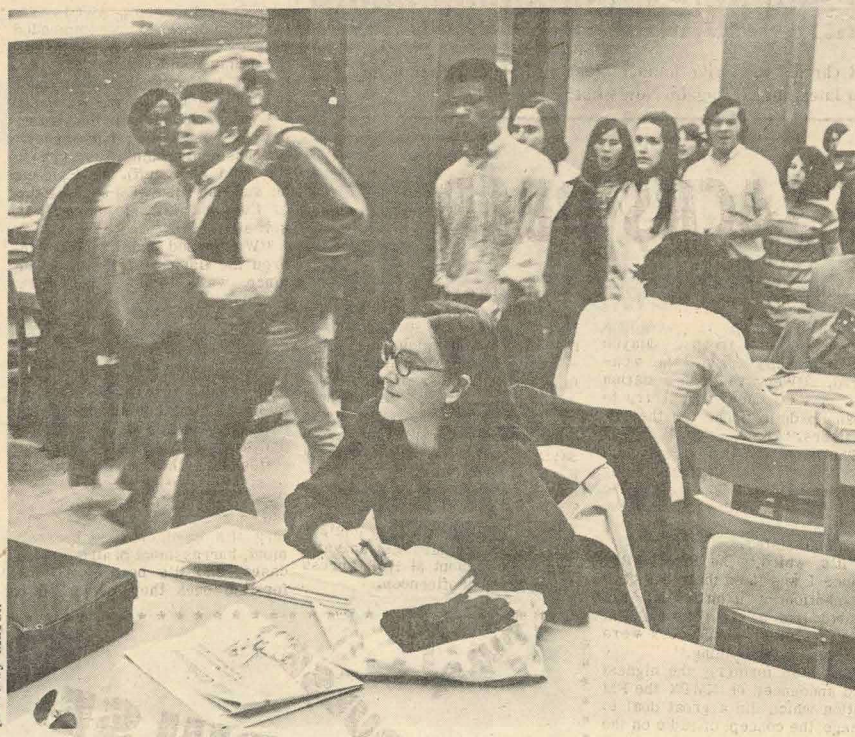

A Third Worlder in the CHP! we begin to yell. A Third World infiltrator behind enemy lines! A TWLF counterspy!

Someone reads the name on the

back of his helmet -- Vital. But most of us think it's Fido.

Fido for Chancellor! we chant. Fido for Governor! We like Fido!

Lieutenant Vital is embarrassed and insecure, uncertain of how to deal with the masses' affection. He moves off, turns his back on his new friends, and starts to talk with a couple of his colleagues.

We, not knowing he's a lieutenant, think he's been called away to be reprimanded.

Bring back Fido, we chant. We want Fido.

Lieutenant Vital returns. I'd appreciate it if you'd all move back about ten feet, he says.

Graciously we move back about ten feet, chanting, Anything for Fido!

News men and photographers cluster around Vital, tuned in to his star quality, wanting to get the scoop on student-police reconciliation at Berkeley.

The good soldier Vital is smiling but he is shy. He shrinks from publicity, the man of a thousand speeding tickets withers in the public eye. He leaves us heartbroken, disappears in a comforting huddle of khaki jackets and gunbelts.

We fear for his safety and long-term job security. We never wanted to screw Fido.

Bring back Fido, we chant. Free Fido! the cry springs up from countless youthful hearts.

But Fido-Vital moves on, seeking new friends and experiences in the Berkeley forest.

Later he is holding court on the plaza, twenty of his loyalist student playmates about him.

The crowd's getting too big, he says worriedly, we'd better move on before the cops come to break it up!

VICTIM TALKS

VOWS HE'LL SUE COPS NOT JUST FOR SELF

Jack Millard, a history grad student from UCLA says he's going to sue the police for false arrest and brutality for the treatment he received Tuesday, February 4. Three weeks ago he came up here to enroll at UC. Last week he found himself enrolled instead in the Santa Rita jail.

Here's his story in his own words as told to BARB:

Tuesday at 12:30 I was watching the action at Sather Gate. Although I'm sympathetic to the strike I've never been in the picket line. Suddenly I saw two men try to drag someone out of the strike line. The next thing I knew I was hit on the head from behind. I got no warning before I was hit. I was absolutely surprised. I think I went out for a second. I fell to the ground moaning. When I touched my head it was full of blood. My glasses were broken.

I remember people picking me up. They weren't in uniform so it didn't dawn on me they were police. I didn't see any badges. Nobody told me I was under arrest. One man talked to me very reassuringly. He was a black medic.

Halfway into Sproul the plainclothes cops yelled at the medic to get out. They manhandled him. Inside I told them I was innocent and not a striker. They photographed and fingerprinted me. One cop tied some bandages over my head wound.

In the interrogating room I saw 4 or 5 plainclothesmen drag John Burke into a chain. He was asked his name and address and he replied. He was asked his age and replied it was on his license. One of the cops gave him a backhand across the face.

Later the plainclothesmen ran out. I think they returned to Sather Gate. As they passed one of them hit me on the jaw and knocked me to the floor. I may have mumbled something to him, I don't remember. Even cop #62 saw him hit me.

At 4:30 we were placed in a police wagon and taken to Santa Rita. I kept asking for medical attention but wasn't given any till 7:30. I requested an X-ray for my head but wasn't given one. I was not even allowed to make a phone call. I'm epileptic and asked for Dilantin for which I have a prescription. It was hours before I got any.

The charges against me are resisting arrest and obstructing traffic. Both are absolute lies. I intend to sue. Not only the brutality on myself, but on others.

"This is a typical outrageous case of a guy who was beaten for doing nothing," Terence Hallinan, Millard's attorney told BARB. "Rather than getting satisfaction for the brutality he has to defend himself against serious criminal charges."

INSIDE REPORT ON PRESIDIO'S SUICIDE SCENE



WHEN KMPX BLEW, BEAR carried the strike banner along with Tom Donahue and other good heads. Almost a year later, shucked again. Now what?

"The present situation inside the Presidio is dynamite. Its ready to blow up any minute."
A young G.I. is describing the tension mounting steadily inside the base in an exclusive phone interview with BARB shortly before it went to press Thursday.
"The soldier who attempted suicide yesterday by burning himself alive was no isolated incident; he's not the only person who has recently been pushed over the edge."
The GI, known to BARB from other days, prefers to identify himself only as "Kurt the Russian". He speaks angrily. He is under Presidio detention, too.
"No one on the outside would believe the shit that has been coming down on all of us who are here for going AWOL. They are pushing us towards mutiny, and at this rate it won't take long".
"Kurt" proceeded to tell in detail what actually occurred at the

Presidio Wednesday morning.
"It had to happen; he was just driven too far. His name is John Brown, and like most of us he was here for going AWOL. The psychiatrist here recommended that he be discharged, but instead the Army decided to send him to Korea. He couldn't take it; he's been there before and its hell."
"We were in formation yesterday in front of our barracks for harrassment (doing push-ups in the mud and stuff). That's when he suddenly poured a can of lighter fluid over himself and set himself afire.
"We jumped on him and smothered the flames. While the ambulance was coming, one of the guards, Sgt. Colbert, told him 'If you want to burn yourself, next time go do it where we can't see you'.
"What broke him is the same thing that's broken others here lately," Kurt continued bitterly. "It's the harrassment, brutality, and torture that's been going on."
"January the 10th was the day it started getting really heavy - the day a new team of Airborne Rangers came to the base. Since then it's been constant harrassment, harrassment of all the AWOL cases, and it's been even worse for the ones they've worked on

in the psychiatric ward."
Kurt described some of the nightmare that he and his buddies have been existing in. He cited cases of people in the psychiatric ward who have been systematically and purposely driven to insanity by the guards. Soldiers whose arms have been broken by guards, and other victims of their sadism whose medical needs were neglected.
Almost casually he told about the Rangers' favorite treatment for the guys in his barracks.
"Well, its a detention cell off by itself in the basement. It's painted black, so we call it either the 'black room' or the 'torture chamber'.
The Rangers like to take us down there one at a time, and beat us up for fun until they get tired."
BARB asked Kurt why the officers in charge of the Rangers don't do something about the situation, and Kurt quickly assured BARB that they did. "The officers like to have their fun too." He named two.
Kurt told of about one time when the MPs filled the SPD barracks that he and other AWOL cases were in with CS gas (a particularly vicious gas that produces nausea and temporary choking and blindness).
Kurt said they did it just for something to do, and added that when the GIs attempted to flee the building for fresh air, the MPs threatened them with AWOL charges to keep them in.
"One of the things they try to drive you into doing is going AWOL again," Kurt explained. "Like one night they stuck 27 of us into one barracks room, and then let the Rangers at us. The next morning there was only five guys left out of the 27. Everyone else had split - they went AWOL."
"One of these times it will be violent mutiny. It will turn into a wholesale uprising, cause we've got to fight back in some way; we've got to defend ourselves."
Kurt told of how scattered incidents around the base are building up to such a climax as they occur with increasing frequency. This included the Administration Building that was set on fire about three weeks ago (it was discovered too soon to do any drastic damage).
He also cited the bomb that went off in the office of the CO see p. 29

KSAN SACKS BEAR

Edward Bear, popular KSAN announcer was fired Tuesday.
"I'd like to let my listeners know I was canned," Bear told BARB in a call late Wednesday night.
The KSAN dj said he was given a 3 hour notice by station manager Vernon Paulsen Tuesday night and dismissed. According to Bear the official reason given for the firing was that he ran two commercials simultaneously the previous Friday.
Bear had a show which presented "music and crazyness."
"It was just me," he said, "It was free form radio with me speaking my mind. But apparently that's dangerous now."
"Recently the station has had a beautiful rating which will be appealing to advertisers," Bear said. "Now they're gonna dump those of us who built the rating--us hairy

revolutionaries.
Bear felt KSAN "decided I was too far out. This is probably a warning to the troops. Maybe this is a new trend," he wondered. "We gave them a station that is vital, now they'll try to clean up their image for the advertisers."
The same day Bear was sacked a memo was passed out asking announcers not to knock and joke about their sponsors, "Otherwise there will be a quick remedy," the memo stated.
"It's weird," he told BARB. "Since I was fired there has been no mention of it on KSAN. I'm treated like a non-person. I'm sure the other announcers were told not to say anything."
Bear was formerly the highest paid announcer on KMPX the FM station which did a great deal to change the concept of radio on the

San Francisco scene.
After the KMPX strike last March most of the staff was hired by Metro-Media which runs KSAN.
"But now that we've fulfilled our function, we're tossed away."
The jobless DJ is not interested in returning to KSAN. "No sense going where you aren't wanted," he said. "It all came down so quickly I don't know what I'll do now. Maybe write a book or just sit and think for a bit."

CO-OP CAPERS

The shopping center for bay area intellectuals - the Co-Ops - has officially come to the conclusion that "the major reason for a per-

sistent decline in patronage at the Co-Op's two Walnut Creek stores" is that the members have a "perception" that prices there are higher than in other stores.
They also found out that "involvement in politics" is not a reason why shoppers stay away).
BARB has been pointing this out for the past two years.
This "startling" information comes to light in the Co-Op News of Feb 10, 1969. Management has not the slightest "perception" on how to think this matter out, especially when a persistent decline in patronage in most other Co-Op stores won't go away, either.
The Co-Op had a survey done in Walnut Creek by David Chale & Associates of Berkeley (hired? volunteered? Not explained). "The 80 page report, the result of an exhaustive survey by both professionals and Co-Op volunteers, is now being reviewed by Co-Op management," states the paper.
One solution this report came up with is that the volunteers, who "contacted members with declining patronage by telephone," continue to do so.
"The other major recommendation," reports the paper, is that "the Co-Op should follow up with appropriate action."
Like lowering prices?
If they can't meet competition, no amount of telephoning is going to save the Co-Op.

There's more. Not only can Lewis time the entire light show to the beat of the drums, he con-



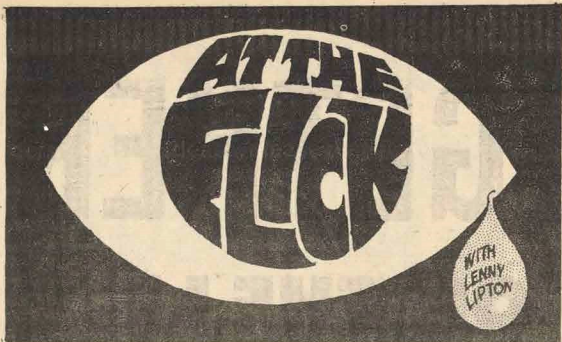

This last week I have gone to many movies, I'm making some movies, I'm writing a book about movies, I'm talking about movies a good part of the time, and even at this moment, I'm supposed to be writing a column weirdly titled AT THE FLICK.

Starting the week, or was it last week, with a preview screening of ISADORA, the story of Isadora Duncan. I can't remember what day that was, but it doesn't matter. The most interesting thing about the evening was that we sat in front of a columnist for a San Francisco paper, and a banker. For about fifteen minutes I overheard their conversation.

You bet I eavesdropped. It isn't every day that I get to spy like this. I understood why a lot of people are talking about having a revolution in this country. The people who have power, like this banker, aren't about to give any of it up.

We were walking around San Francisco one day, looking at a neighborhood going to pieces. We were looking at the facades of the houses crumbling, talking about how the city would assess the owners for more bread if they fixed up their places. This is, without a doubt, a negative incentive to improve your dwelling. Why do the poor get shat upon, we wondered? Off in the distance we could see out toward the bay, and there was the new Bank of America building going up, appropriately juxtaposed with a little playground set in some Irving Renewal project.

The playground was a model of ingenuity, with metal frame camels and other animals the kids were supposed to be playing on, but they weren't. There must have been a dozen kids scattered around the few buildings that constituted what I assume was a city project for lower income families (the culturally disadvantaged -- this is a glaring example of institutional racism terminology).

Not one kid was playing in the playground. The only kid near it, was playing stick ball despite it, having to weave his way through those terribly creative metal monstrosities. I asked him if he liked the playground, and sure, he said, I like it. But that was clearly shit, since it was getting in his way.

But it isn't only the poor, it's the sappy white and blue collar workers who suffer too, in fact, anybody who isn't well off, with few exceptions, gets the shaft. Take income tax. I'm thinking about it, since I visited a friend the other day who was doing his tax, over the phone, with his accountant. He is what I think is called, in some circles, an independent operator. He works for himself, gets his income from a number of sources, lives by his wits more or less. The way he fills out a tax form is the way a Rockefeller must. He gets lots of exemptions, and winds up paying almost no tax. In fact, last year it worked out that he made less than \$1000 after deductions, which is nice on paper, but you can't support a family on that, and somehow he did. Moreover, he did not cheat with his tax form, it was filled out accurately.

Blue collar workers are kept in their place with delusions that people who make a lot of bread have to pay about 90 per cent of it to Uncle Shithead, but they are mistaken.

The woman who lives across the street had her house condemned because it wasn't up to city standards. I live in one of those enclaves found here and there in the East Bay that could pass for a series of rural or country streets. The houses are not in tip top shape, there's lots of grass, and trees, and the street I live on is especially nice since it's a dead end street.

A few months ago we got a yellow notice in the mail telling us that we lived in No Man's Land. No Man's Land, the notice went, was a blight on the city. It had been a sore for years, and now with the help of federal funds, No Man's Land was going to be saved. What they meant to say was that No Man's Land was to be saved for the greedy. On the notice was a photograph of a run down dump, the

GETTING IT TOGETHER

ON THE LINE

The much sought after coalition of workers and students is slowly becoming a reality with the help of Rockefeller's private army; the Richmond Police Department.

"We are forced, in order to prevent vicious assaults against our membership and to prevent further beatings, to call for support from student, teacher, third world and other labor sympathizers."

With this statement Jake Jacobs, Secretary-Treasurer of Local I-561; Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union, told the world last Thursday that students, teachers and oil workers were getting it together in Rockefeller's Richmond Oil Facility.

February 3, students and young radicals met with oil workers to feel each other out and probe Mother Standard.

Each stroke, whether a scab's broken window or some old fart in a gray flannel suit getting el-

bowed, was ecstatic.

The result of this ecstasy was the February 6 news conference of the striking oil workers, SF State teachers local 1352, teaching assistant local 1928 and striking TWLF students, where Jacobs made the statement above.

The first meeting was so successful that they decided to repeat it.

This Monday morning at 6 found a few hundred of the new coalition marching in the grey dawn between the various orifices of Mother Standard.

The company had been prepared for the demonstration of support. "Most of the trucks have been rolling in all weekend," a union man told BARB.

"They have men inside the gates with sleeping bags. Some of those bastards haven't been out for weeks now."

We soon got the word that the trucks wouldn't show at all that day, but it was punch-in time for the suit-and-tie people so we all trooped up to the main entrance.

Nearly run-down robots had to walk a line of angry workers and students. Those that didn't want their lunch smashed or an elbow in the ribs walked around the pickets and in the street.

Rockefeller doesn't just buy pencils though. Last summer he stocked up on clubs and tear gas to put down a black rebellion.

Richmond pigs soon showed to herd a hundred people down the street so the office workers could get through without being told they were scabs.

The pigs left and everybody reformed in front of what is Richmond State's Administration building.

More shoving and shouts of "Scab ... What does Rockefeller pay for your Soul?"

The shit gets too heavy for the office workers and the pigs come rushing down the street again.

Everyone is pushed up to the corner that leads deep into the guts of Standard. Students and other workers soon join the throng.

Jacobs calls for a rally. "Plant Number Two ..."

The pigs start to push and about 250 people are jammed like so

Beneath an enormous banner inscribed with the words: Support the Oil Workers, Support the TWLF Strike, United We Will Win, the Community Solidarity Rally for the Third World Strike at Cal and for the Oil Workers Strike in Richmond and throughout the nation got under way in Pauley.

Chairman Froben Lozada introduced Jake Jacobs, Sec. Treas. of Local I-561 of the Oil, Chemical, and Atomic Workers Union, on strike in Richmond, Standard Oil's fief north of Berkeley.

Jacobs requested continued support for the Oil Workers from Berkeley students. He got his biggest round of applause when he declared, "We appreciate student support of our strike and will do everything in our power to bring the oil workers on campus in support of your strike."

His second biggest crowdpleaser as judged by this reporter was his announcement that the day before the executive board of his

union of which he is a member voted unanimously to support the TWLF Strike at Berkeley.

"I have observed and come in contact with a great current of dissatisfaction in the labor movement," Jacobs said. "But union leaders have become the tools of the establishment. The young group of workers just coming alive has no real leadership. If there was a militant leader at the head of an international union, they would literally flock to him by the hundreds of thousands."

Roger Alvarado of the Third World Liberation Front at State asserted that there is no real gap between the young and those over thirty. "After all," he said, "Jake Jacobs (over 30) who just spoke is on our side. We are just brainwashed. The real gap is between those who must work and those that don't. We want self-determination for the people, not

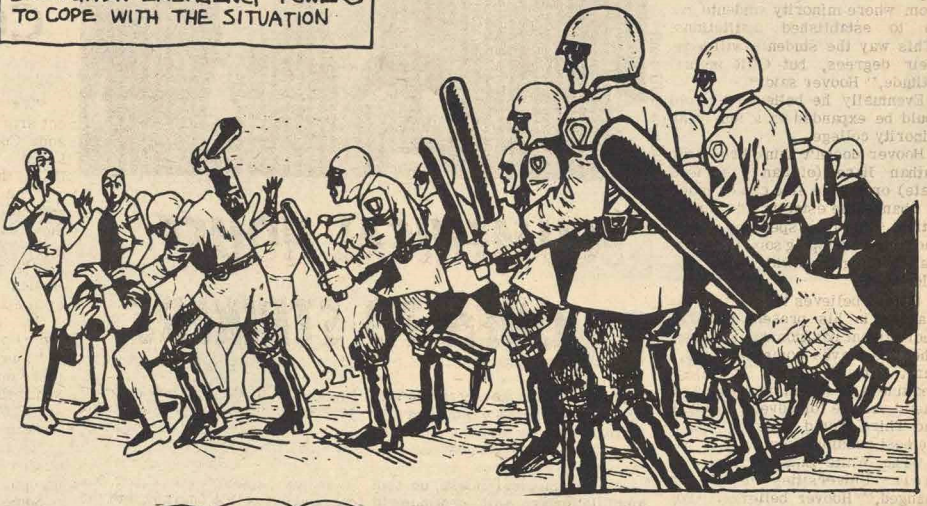

HOOVER OPTS OUT, WILL TRY NAIROBI

From San Mateo to Nairobi. That's the route black educator Bob Hoover intends to take soon. Hoover is presently in charge of minority education and recruitment at three junior colleges in the Peninsula. Formerly he headed the controversial College Readiness Program at the College of San Mateo (CSM).

"But paper shuffling isn't my bag," he admitted to BARB this week. "Once I get things organized I'm moving on to something else."

He wants to help set up a Third World College in East Palo Alto. The residents of the primarily black city call it Nairobi, so Hoover thinks the school should be named Nairobi College.

At first he thinks Nairobi College can be a two year school from where minority students can go to established institutions. "This way the students will have their degrees, but OUR mental attitude," Hoover said.

Eventually he believes Nairobi could be expanded to a four year minority college.

Hoover doesn't think Professor Nathan Hare (of San Francisco State) or anyone else can do much to change the established Universities. "I'd rather spend my energy and time developing something new than working from within," Hoover told BARB.

Hoover believes the staff he has trained in his present minority recruitment position can take over when he leaves sometime before June. Although he sees the College Readiness Program he set up as a useful vehicle for developing black and Third World leaders "it isn't the best possible solution."

"The White Establishment and their Universities cannot be changed," Hoover believes. "But we can still change Black and Third World people. We want to start with young people and give them the right cultural and mental attitudes."

"If Hare proves successful others will follow him, if we are successful they'll follow us," he said.

Meanwhile there are still repercussions from the December 13 strike at College of San Mateo. Five Third World students have filed a federal suit against the school asking that they be allowed to return to class.

The students also have asked the court to delay their college disciplinary hearings until their criminal trials come up in March and April. They claim they will face "double jeopardy" otherwise.

SAN JOSE TEACHERS CALL IT LOCKOUT

"The Administration has locked us out," a spokesman for striking San Jose State AFT teachers charged this week.

"No striking teachers are being scheduled for the coming semester," David Van Becker, associate information officer for the AFT told BARB, Tuesday.

"At least 500 less classes will be offered, according to Van Becker. He believes this will aggravate the strike more and gain the teachers more student support.

The AFT spokesman blames the lockout on political interference by conservative Southern California legislators. The school's president Robert Clark intended to have signups for classes scheduled to be taught by striking teachers, Van Becker said. "But he was afraid he might lose his job if he did, so he bowed to pressure," the AFT information officer charged.

Of the approximately 100 striking teachers 28 have so far been informed they are fired. Seventy six have received no paychecks.

ECUMENICAL HOUSE OPEN TO STRIKERS

San Francisco State strikers will again have an aid and comfort station directly across from the campus when the battle resumes Monday.

The Ecumenical House, on 19th and Holloway, will continue to serve as the Headquarters for the Medical Aid Committee and the Strikers' Ball Fund, Reverend John Jones told BARB this week.

"We are committed to non-violence," he said, "and are open to any campus group."

The House was closed shortly before the end of last semester because the Administration and uptight ministers felt it was too favorable to the strikers.

"Hayakawa put pressure on us by his inflammatory statements," Rev. Jones explained. "He called us a staging ground for revolution and Strike Headquarters."

"But that's an old game," Rev. Jones said. "Hayakawa is trying to undermine the seriousness and legitimacy of student demands by blaming the school's problems on others."

Due to Hayakawa's propaganda Lake side Presbyterian Church complained the Ecumenical House was "prostituting the ministry to ends of violence and discord."

However, a study completed this week, which includes 30 hours of interviewing by a 7 man ministerial committee, rebutted this charge. The Committee found that the House staff had "labored to moderate conflict rather than encourage it."

Last term the police once invaded the House to make an arrest. "They have the guns and can go



But the strikers are not distressed, Van Becker feels.

Unlike other Bay Area college strikes the San Jose State walk-out doesn't have Third World Students in the forefront. "We have a more apathetic faculty and student body than most schools," Van Becker explained. "There is no Third World coalition formed as yet."

A statewide conference on "How to Build the Student and Faculty Strike" will be held in San Jose over the weekend. Striking teachers hope to gather more student support before classes reopen Monday.

anywhere if they believe a felon is inside," Rev. Jones said. "But they don't have to push people or kick down our door."

"Rev. Jones said he had talked to police Captain Scott earlier this week about police charges into the House. The cops complain "mis-siles" have been thrown at them from the Ecumenical House.

The House is operated by the San Francisco Campus Christian Center, Inc. Five separate denominations work out of the 19th Street center. They include the Disciples of Christ, The Episcopal Church, the United Church of Christ, United Methodist Church, and the United Presbyterian Church.

OUT TO WRECK CLUB

Staid, ivy-covered UC Men's Faculty Club will reverberate to rock sounds Friday night.

The Cleveland Wrecking Company will attempt to raze the redwood log structure for the benefit of striking state college teachers.

"History has never seen a rock band in the faculty club," UC journalism professor Peter Steffens informed BARB. He said the old pros who are rumored to live there have been offered rooms in hotels for the night so as not to disturb their slumber.

The dance will raise money to help striking AFT members at SF State and San Jose State. Several dozen of the strikers will be on hand as guests, and can be button-holed to talk about the strike issues.

"They're teachers fighting for a better education and working conditions," Steffens said. "We feel connected in the struggle. Reagan is trying to impoverish public education in the state, we're trying to enrich it. It's a tough fight -- toughest of all on the people on the picket lines."

The informal dance is sponsored by three UC locals, 1474 of the faculty, 1570 of the TA's and 1795 of the library workers. For the \$2.50 entrance fee, food and drinks will also be available. Starting time is 8 pm.

Unlike the students, who live in co-educational dorm complexes, the UC faculty has separate clubs for male and female profs.

MASS PICKETING SET BUT NO WORD ON CONFRONTATION

There will be mass picketing at SF State on Monday, but indications are there will be no major confrontation.

As the student-teacher strike goes into its second semester, a spokesman told BARB strikers may briefly show their faces in classes to ensure enrollment before resuming the total boycott of college functions.

Tactics for the new semester will probably change from long-

range, announced moves to more spontaneous happenings, the spokesman said. Labor union supporters are on call to beef up picketing.

Appearing at UC's Pauley Ballroom Wednesday night, TWLF speaker Roger Alvarado put down Moses Hall-type pacifism where scores of students submitted peacefully to arrest.

"Our lives are too precious to spend in prison," he said.

Registration week at San Francisco State is almost over. The campus was temporarily tranquil with only a couple cops in the administration building and some AFT men passing out handbills at 19th and Holloway.

"Enroll for the strike," the bills read.

"By registering you (a) preserve your status as a striker and (b) make it difficult to fire striking professors."

Students had the usual hassle with registration, but this time it was complicated by administrative confusion. New students arrived, complaining they didn't get their registration instructions in the mail. They were shuttled from room to room, building to building, trying to find their registration packets.

Emerging from this labyrinth, they doubtless felt that they are due a more relaxed pace during normal spring classes.

Normal, hardly. They will find that besides the absent AFT teachers, some non-striking instructors have "despaired" and left. In signing up for many departments' courses, registrants were told which classes are and aren't being given. One department which was previously difficult to get into has been admitting new students in expectation that some of its students will not return.

Conclusion: the whole SFS operation is resting on a thin thread of confidence.

Striker strategy has been to register for the maximum eighteen credits, nine of which will be taught by striking teachers. Retaining these, the remaining nine taught by finks will be dropped after the semester begins.

People strolling in campus glance at other people, trying to determine which side of the fence they're on. Groups of blacks congregate and rap. Some clean-cut high school graduate types are evident, awed by big-daddy college.

At a Sacramento meeting of National Guard and police officers, Reagan gave himself the option to extend his state of emergency to SF State. Now that the National Guard is on the University of Wisconsin campus at Madison, Reagan has a precedent.

A rumor has it that Dr. Hayakawa would like to leave; he has no real power, but is still expected to face the fan when the stuff hits. The acting president addresses the SFS faculty on Friday and the AFT will march to the meeting to show their strength and solidarity.

CHARGE SNEAKY SEMANTIC

Hayakawa has magnanimously agreed to "rehire" striking AFT teachers.

But just what does "rehire" mean?

It's a lot different from "reinstatement" an AFT spokesman told BARB. "Rehiring means we have to start from scratch," he said. "All the accrued sick leave, tenure, and sabbatical leave goes down the drain because his letter said we are considered resigned under section 24311 of the Education Code."

"We haven't resigned," the spokesman said, "we're merely employees who are on strike."

WHERE COURTS COP OUT

"We view the courts as a direct arm of the system," Tony Miranda Co-Chairman of the SF State Legal Defense Committee told BARB this week.

"The powers in this state are attempting to use the courts as they used the pigs to try and break the Strike."

Miranda ran down some of the tactics being used to break the Strike and Strike leaders.

(1) Thirty people have had their probation revoked so far.

"The Probation Department picks out the names of leaders and sends them to the courts," Miranda stated. "From there the judge orders the probation revoked."

No hearings, no trial; just the swift revenge of the State for being an uppity nigger.

Some of those that the shit has come down on include George Murray and Jack Alexis of the BSU and Jan Salgonick and Gene Marchie of SDS.

(2) The issuance of what Miranda has termed "phony bench warrants" for not appearing in court.

"Bridges Randall is in jail with a \$2500 bond for a court appearance that he knew nothing about."

(3) The use of extra heavy fines to punish students. The first conviction for "Disturbing the Peace" which normally carries a \$100 fine was \$350.

Another cat was busted for "Illegal Possession of an Egg." His fine was \$365, and a year's probation for resisting arrest.

(4) Lack of co-operation if not illegality of the court judges.

"They are pushing trial dates as fast as they can," Miranda said.

"When motions of Continuance come up they are denied, Alvarados and my lawyer asked for a motion of Discovery and that was denied."

A Motion of Discovery asks for the evidence that the DA has for the case.

They are told, remarks Miranda, "The records can not be handed to the lawyers because they are in Sacramento with the Central Intelligence and Investigation Division of the State."

The Legal Defense Committee views the courts "not as an arm of justice but as an arm of oppression."

To help those 675 people that have been busted so far at State the Legal Defense Committee has been set up at the corner of Fell and Fillmore streets in San Francisco.

There you can get referrals to lawyers, help with the documentation of busts and injuries or get self defense training if you are going to act as your own lawyer in a jury trial.

Miranda emphasized, though "The basic defense is the continuance of the Strike."

Defense is in the perspectives of the fifteen demands and the principles of self-determination, seizure of power through the demands and fighting against racism.

"We are not going to get side-tracked in bullshit issues of free speech and campus autonomy" Miranda said emphatically.

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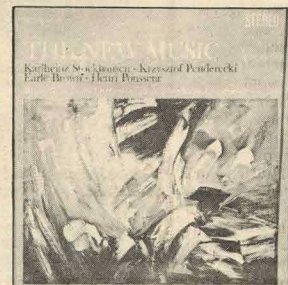
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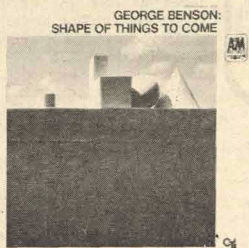
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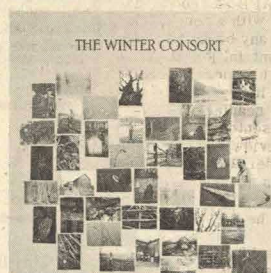


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AIR FORCE OR NAVY IT'S ALL THE SAME

We can all sleep easier now. As of last Saturday the Air Force and Navy had meted out punishment to those dread twin menaces to public safety and military morale, Sue Schnall and Mike Locks.

The courts-martial vindicated the view most GPs I've met have of the court system to which they're subject. They call it the Non-uniform Code of Military Injustice.

The "crimes" had been essentially the same -- organizing and leading (in uniform yet!) the October 12 GI march against the war, in San Francisco. The only significant difference was that Lt. (jg) Schnall, a poised, beautiful and articulate Navy nurse, had shown a little more chutzpah by leaf-letting the Alameda Naval Air Station from a light plane with her husband Peter two days before the march.

Both were found guilty as charged, she of disobeying an order and conduct unbecoming an officer and gentleman, and he of disobeying an order.

Yet Sue's sentence was much the lighter. She was given a Bad Conduct Discharge and six months "at hard labor", which is being suspended according to Navy statute because any woman officer with less than a year sentence does not serve the time. Thus she is right now back at work at Oak Knoll Hospital for six more months; as for the discharge it is less than Honorable but better than Dishonorable (which would have meant loss of voting rights and the equivalent of felon status for the rest of her life.)

Airman Locks, on the other hand, was sentenced to a Bad Conduct Discharge, had his rank lowered from Airman 1/C to Airman, and was given a year term which will be served at Leavenworth unless the commanding officer of the Fourth Air Force exercises his option to lower the term when the case comes before him for customary review next week.

Meantime Mike is being held in what are, certainly by military standards, very plush quarters for a convict. The only similar military facility I've seen or heard of was Captain Howard Levy's at Ft. Jackson, South Carolina, before he was sent to Leavenworth. (I visited Mike on Sunday and asked three different officials what the Air Force calls their jails. Each frowned, thought about it for a minute, and then said, "Do you mean the Confinement Facility?" Like meeting a garbage man at a party and having him tell you he's a sanitary engineer. . .)

In any case Mike shares with the few other prisoners being held at Hamilton AFB a good size common room with a couch, television set, and any books he wants and can get sent in. For the time being, anyway, his morale seemed high. After all, he was finally getting around to reading ULYSSES. Besides, his sentence might be reduced on review, which would mean serving perhaps six months in roughly this manner at Hamilton or Travis AFB-- far from the worst fate he could have expected.

Furthermore, his attorney Richard Wertheimer has launched a suit to challenge the constitutionality of both the orders Mike was convicted of disobeying. And somewhere along the line he might be able to get out pending appeal.

The interesting thing about the light rap on the knuckles given Sue was that it came after the prosecutor argued for a heavy sentence using an eloquent women's equality line. Here was a man who would probably divorce his wife if she suggested he wash a dish, pleading in sonorous tones that this woman be judged exactly as she would be if she were a man. At least you've got to give him credit for realizing how much her particular brand of honest, strong femininity would impress the panel. (Shades of liberals crying "reverse racism" as soon as blacks turn their blackness into a positive asset.)

Heliotope, the four-month-old University of San Francisco and Marin, follows in the pattern of the Free University of Berkeley and the Mid-Peninsula Free University (Palo Alto) as a center for really unlimited education of the people, by the people and for the people.

Through it, you can take any number of forty courses for \$15; everything from Elementary Moog to Participatory Salad.

Running Through the Woods. Belly Dancing.

Heliotope in the simplest sense is a meeting place for those who want to teach and those who want to learn. It's about as easy to become a teacher as to become a student. Classes are held in homes.

I rapped with instructor Wayne Moskow about his class in Indian Instrument Orientation, where he teaches practical fundamentals of sitar, sarod, tambura, tabla, flute and other instruments. He does not

mon, director of HFU and a former Harvard man.

The unobtrusive San Francisco office is at 2201 Filbert St. near the dear and intimate little shops of Union St. in the Marina district. The Heliotope atmosphere is of gentleness and comfort. Mod-dressed Dave, upon hearing a rumor that the Palo Alto MFU had been "taken over by leftists" said HFU's viewpoint would remain apolitical -- but that individual classes were open to teachers of any persuasion (could the strike scene ever reach Heliotope? It's a strange world.)

Free University registration fees are apparently being bent toward publicity. Free, attractive course catalogs, color posters, and handouts are stored in large quantities at the HFU office; the handouts being distributed at such out-of-the-way spots as Fisherman's Wharf and Montgomery St.

Could HFU handle a huge influx of registrants over its present level of three hundred? Sure, Dave

Christmas. There must be thirteen people sitting around asking questions.

A lot goes by ... Book of Shadows ... Pan ... Diana ... Covens ... Some of these people are really knowledgeable. I get around to asking why witches have such a bad name with outsiders.

Patently, exactly, the seraphic instructor explains that witchcraft is a loving and religious art that has been distorted by Christian-influenced drama and persecution. Nowadays Christians just refuse to admit that witchcraft exists.

I hear that during one of the recent storms the witch community in a house freaked out when the electricity failed; they felt "spirits pressing close." Posters were torn off walls and chairs thrown around.

Participants in this class can become witches after one year of study, becoming an initiate in the rites (sometimes done in the nude) and inner secrets of witchdom. Beginners can start right in with

give lessons in performing, instead is very heavy on the nitty-gritty of tuning, stringing and caring for instruments. Despite his reputation and experience he does not have enough students to satisfy him.

More traditional courses cover such scenes as architecture, filmmaking and mountaineering.

I didn't nail down the derivation of the word heliotope. Pretty office volunteer Linda Parker thought that the heliotope was a kind of flower that grew toward the sun -- a symbol, I suppose, of the learning process. For another analogy, know that a heliotope is also a mirror device that signals by reflecting the sun's rays.

The Heliotope sign is just as ambiguous and intriguing, resembling a Disney interpretation of flying spaghetti. From a relaxed coil anchored in the center by an organic shoot, a spiral warps upward and outward into boundless space. "Energy" says Dave Mar-

says, sounding like he wants the whole of San Francisco and Marin in his card files.

He would like to up his curriculum from 40 to 100 classes. Dave runs the show with the aid of volunteer desk and street help. With the new quarter coming up on April 1st phone calls are frequent -- "Can I register? I'm fifty years old." "Sure."

Sunday at sundown I visited a class in the occult at a high old house on Scott St. in SF. Went to knock on the door but it opened of itself. All right, I say to this chick with me, keep a cool head.

We're met by a woman with a very bewitching plunging neckline. She says she's used to reporters -- TIME was there last week and a TV crew is coming at some later date.

After that, I don't feel so intrusive. Upstairs, immersed in incense and candlelight, is a white-gowned, white-haired witch-instructor who looks all the world like one of Dickens' ghosts of

candle magic and love potions. Wow, DO they work, says the head-itch.

Scholars would like the class even if they couldn't swallow the regimen. The occult has been the inspiration for countless stories and films -- among them Rosemary's Baby -- and witches knew about mind-bending drugs long before regular people got on to them. Dennis Bolling (with Adonis Auriel) is the learned instructor.

Heliotope springs up on the force of enthusiasm alone, without all the hangups of public education. HFU doesn't have to worry about what Sacramento will think, or how well it can serve the machine-slave complex. It merely sees itself as part of the McLuhan global village, where the telephone, radio and printed page bring folk together to learn from and enjoy one another.

killed the fervor to go on organizing and working with other GPs. Mike is up to his ears in planning and perspective for the GI Association, and Sue is as busy as ever. Mike seems to have had at least one success: as we walked out at the end of visiting hours one of his fellow prisoners flashed the V at us right in front of the guard. Come to think of it, he didn't look too upset about it, either ...

Legal expenses are still a big problem. A Schnall-Locks Defense Fund has been set up and contributions can be made out that way and sent to Mr. & Mrs. Tom Caruso, 684 6th Ave., San Francisco

shrank to thirty or forty tired and annoyed persons, mostly members of BBC, CNP, and other left groups.

The Council had spent most of the preceding five hours arguing about zoning variances for assorted individuals and special interest groups. The list of people signed up to speak on the agenda even included four candidates for City Council: Loni Hancock of the Berkeley Coalition, Allen Wilson and Herman Pecot of the Black Caucus, and

ALIOTO'S COPS OUT ON LIMB

A Berkeley-style black bust in San Francisco last week has made Mayor Alioto wish he had that Cardinal he recently asked the Pope for, because, man, does his honor need help!

(On second thought, if Rome can't come through, perhaps the Ford Foundation can.)

The brutal arrest of a middle-class, non-hippie, non-activist NAACP black family comes in the midst of the manslaughter trial of SF policeman Michael R. O'Brien over the fatal shooting of black George Baskett last September.

Both police/black confrontations were caused by the same thing -- a minor traffic accident.

It follows the same pattern of a Berkeley Police black bust of the Smith family over a minor telephone-pole posting of a campaign sign.

Berkeley's case ended with "all charges dropped" against the family, Police Chief Beall stating his men acted not in good judgment, especially in Macing the small children being baby-sat at the time, and one of the Berkeley cops suddenly resigning from the force.

(The Berkeley Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring a "testimonial dinner" for Chief Beall, who leaves his Berkeley post to become Chief of UC police. The "entire community" is invited. Does this include the Smith family?)

This week, Mayor Alioto dropped all charges against the Fuller family, indicated the SF police did not use good judgment, and stated "the use of Mace bothers me, frankly."

"Its use on persons already in custody is a violation of the Police Department's own rules."

Mayor Alioto's honeymoon with his uncontrollable police is rapidly coming to an end. His vision of becoming Governor of California is fading in direct ratio to the way his police beat up blacks.

"This may very well be the turning point for race relations in this city," said Dr. Arthur H. Coleman, a black physician.

Thomas Neal, of the Hunters Point-Bayview NAACP called for suspension of the fuzz "responsible for the sadistic and cruel action."

A bi-racial delegation of 65 students from the UC Medical Center, "all of them classmates" of one of the black women arrested, handcuffed, and maced while inside the Patrol Wagon, called on the Mayor and the District Attorney.

US Attorney Cecil Poole "ordered the FBI" (SF Chronicle) to "start yet another probe after he conferred with the Atty Gen's office in Washington."

The SF DA assigned a "top investigator" to the "case."

Chief Cahill "ordered" three police captains to "look into the matter."

All this action by "delegations of outraged civic leaders and students -- both black and white" (SF Chronicle) not only moved the Mayor to drop the charges, it also moved the cops the move.

A group of SF fuzz protested that the Mayor is not supporting THEM.

A "delegation of aroused policemen and Teamsters Union executives bitterly complained to Chief Cahill ... we want to find out if a policeman is a second-class citizen."

If this were not enough, the Mayor has to contend with the following two happenings ...

"Racial slurs against black people are rampant in the police department, representatives of Officers for Justice -- the newly formed black policemen's association -- declared at a Police Commission meeting here yesterday," according to the SF Chronicle.

One example of this white racism was told by Sgt Henry Wil-

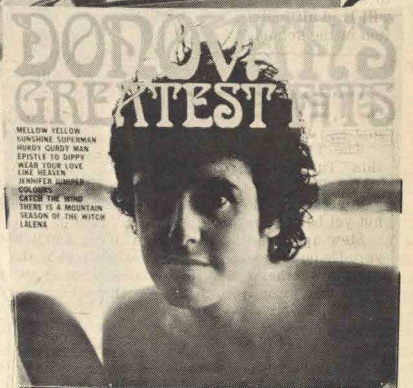
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YES, SOME SFS GRADS DO CARE

"I'm prouder than ever of having gone to SF State," an alumnus told BARB this week. "It's too bad older alumni don't feel the same way."

Jerry Irwin, a 1967 graduate in psychology, is organizing a support committee for the strikers. He's been to lots of alumni.

"The older grads in the Alumni Association think a quiet and peaceful campus is the ideal. They are all for giving Hayakawa a vote of confidence," Irwin said. "But the younger ones feel differently. Many of us believe the grievances of the BSU and TWOF are justifiable."

Those supporting the strike have formed an organization called Concerned Alumni Against Reagan's Encroachment (CARE).

"We're mailing out questionnaires to the alumni and informing them of the issues," Irwin said. "I'm sure once they learn what the strike is about any reasonable person will see through the propaganda of Hayakawa and the news media."

The young alumnus charged the press has given a lot of misinformation about the strike. It has given very little coverage to the activities of CARE, he said. "Maybe they don't want people to know the striker's side."

"The Alumni Association refused to give us their mailing list," Irwin said. "But we got it anyway," he laughed.

A meeting is scheduled by CARE on Feb. 24 at the Golden West YMCA at 20th and Euclalytus, Assemblyman John Burton will speak on local control of education.

Irwin is interested in getting more alumni on the picket line once the campus reopens. But since many grads are working he plans to suggest an information picket line at the downtown extension center on Powell Street.

"Everything the Administration has done shows a complete disregard for the students and the community. It's politically manipulated by Reagan and the Trustees," Irwin said.

"I audited a course from Hayakawa when I was a student and was impressed by him," Irwin recalled. "But now he is laughable. Everything he says has such faulty logic it's pathetic."

"But," he's done a good job of influencing the non-thinking masses, Irwin conceded.

"If the problems aren't settled a lot of people will drop out of the system," Irwin said. "The difference between violent and peaceful revolution will diminish."

The Academic Senate is also getting more and more upset at Reagan and the Trustees for not talking.

"The situation is desperate" the Senate said in a resolution this week. "Although still 'open' in some legal or political sense the college is rapidly closing intellectually and spiritually."

"Unless some immediate resolution is found" the Senate continued, "the point of a bayonet will have to be used to maintain a posture of business as usual."

"The escalation and further polarization will make it impossible to start the spring semester and will lead ultimately to the destruction of the school."

STEW'S TRIAL

The Trial of Stew Albert began this Tuesday and by 4:30 when Judge Talbot adjourned the proceedings till Thursday the jury had not yet been chosen.

Stew appeared as his own lawyer. He questioned the jury closely as to whether they believed a policeman would lie under oath for political reasons. Most of the prospective jurors confessed that this was a definite possibility.

The proceedings are expected to continue through Friday and perhaps Monday. All are cordially invited to attend this showdown between the good guys and the bad pigs. It is being staged at the Berkeley Municipal Court on Grove Street, next to City Hall. The game begins at 9 AM.

COME ON TO THE PARTY

Huey Newton will speak to the people on Sunday night.

A tape recording made in prison by the Black Panther leader will be heard at the birthday party to be held in his honor here in Berkeley.

Many other celebrations of the imprisoned Panther's birthday will be held across the nation this weekend. Last year, there was a single, history-making celebration in Oakland, when the Panthers set their sights nation-wide.

Katiteen Cleaver will speak at the Bay Area's tribute to Huey, as will Charles Garry, his attorney, and Tom Hayden.

The poetry of Alprentice "Bunchy" Carter, one of the two Panthers assassinated in LA, will be read at the gathering, and Country Joe McDonald and Barry Melton of the Fish will perform.

In addition to honoring the Panther Minister of Defense, the party will also serve as a fund-raising benefit for the Newton-Cleaver Defense Committee.

"Prelude to Revolution" and "Off the Pigs," two films, will be shown.

"The birthday celebration," Frank Jones, Panther Deputy

Minister of Information said this week, "is to symbolize the love and respect that we have for our Minister of Defense and can serve to inspire us in the pursuit of our political goals."

"The birthday celebration is a symbol. The substance of our political efforts is freedom -- freedom for the oppressed and immediate freedom for Huey P. Newton."

Le Ballet Afro-Haiti, Rev. George Johnson and guitar, and Ray "Masai" Hewitt of the LA Panthers are also featured on the program, and the Oakland Seven will attend. Father Earl Neil of Oakland will be the master of ceremonies.

Over 35 local and national organizations have formally endorsed the event, including the American Federation of Teachers, Locals 771 and 1570; Black Caucus of ILWU Local 6 and UAW Local 1364; National Lawyers Guild, Bay Area Chapter.

The party will be held in the Berkeley Community Theater at 7:00 p.m. this Sunday night, February 16. Tickets are \$2.50 at the door.

many sperm deeper and deeper into Mother Standard. Spasmodic but solid and hard, fifty Richmond pigs shove the mass along.

A misfired tear gas canister, jabs in the back with a long Samurai club, and a few rocks and bottles thrown at the pigs make up the action.

Union people aren't waiting deep inside the plant, but are scraped up as the pigs push legal pickets, five at each gate, into the flow.

About two miles of steam, filthy pipes, railroad beds and soggy wasteland line the march.

Plainclothes pigs drive slowly through the marchers -- stop -- and sort of wobble away with a flat tire.

The rally point is situated at plant #2, a building enclosed in barbed wire, with mesh cages over the windows and beefy security guards inside looking at us

and swinging baseball bats at their sides.

A short wait for two Volkswagen buses of longshoremen from Martinez, and the rally begins on a pick-up truck in front of Plant #2.

Jake Jacobs reads a copy of the mutual assistance pact between the Union, teachers and students and Roger Alvarado of the TWLF speaks.

"You either own the Motherfucker or you work for it," says Alvarado, and to the shouts of both workers and students the coalition begins to shape.

Walking back from Plant #2, Jacobs remarks to another union official, "It's really surprising the way the boys have picked up on that clenched-fist."

The new coalition will feel its first birth pains at San Francisco State Monday, February 17 in a mass picket.

THE SEVEN SCORES AS PIGS COME UP WITH A GOOSE EGG

The second week of testimony in the conspiracy trial of the Oakland Seven ended with the score: Defendants 3 - Pigs 0.

Prosecutor Lowell Jensen has put three Oakland Police officers on the witness stand since he began presenting his case to the jury in an attempt to establish the guilt of the Seven.

Thus far, each police witness appears to have done the defense more good than the prosecution. Several other witnesses have been called, but they have been minor.

The action promises to be hot and heavy next week. Jan Blais, assistant to the Dean of Students at Cal is on the witness stand and is undergoing a piercing cross-examination by chief defense counsel, Charles R. Garry. Garry and Judge George W. Phillips have also had some heated exchanges.

Garry, and defense co-counsel Richard Hodge disposed of the testimony of Oakland Deputy Police Chief Raymond Deputy quite effectively last week. Late in the week, James Bruce Coleman, a plastic looking, 22-year-old undercover agent, took the stand to describe the different defendants doing a variety of things during and preceding Stop The Draft Week.

"Mr. Coleman, do you know what a ratfink is?" Garry opened his cross-examination. The defense attorney proceeded from there to rake the young police

NATIONAL GUARD ON MADISON CAMPUS

The Madison campus of the University of Wisconsin has taken the lead in repressive measures against striking students.

Nine hundred National Guardsmen were called out and stationed on campus late Wednesday by Governor Warren Knowles.

Both the University administration and the local mayor are claiming credit for the call. No state of emergency was declared, however.

Members and supporters of the Black People's Alliance have been conducting a strike on the campus since Monday. At issue are several demands for increased black control of black programs.

Several buildings have been occupied and barricaded. Police cleared one building which held the President's office. No arrests were reported in that action.

Only four arrests were reported in the entire action to date, but mobile strike tactics have kept the cops hopping. Madison Mayor Festge claims that he called the Guard because "the city police were bone weary".

Fifteen hundred students marched to Bascom Hall Wednesday morning to blockade several buildings and stop traffic. No major



violent incidents were reported provoked, although anti-strike students pushed some strikers into police lines.

One hundred opponents of the strike showed up wearing blue armbands bearing the letter H for Hayakawa. They forced their way into buildings driving strikers against police who laid on with clubs and mace.

At BARB press time the Guardsmen had not been deployed and the strikers were reported meeting to discuss strategy.

officer over the coals for most of the day Thursday. On Monday morning, Coleman was ordered to bring the original notes he took while attending the various Stop The Draft Week meetings to court, so they could be compared to the synthesized, xeroxed notes he depended upon so heavily for his testimony.

A quick comparison by the defense attorneys turned up several discrepancies.

The high point came when Garry asked Coleman to read a statement from his xeroxed notes. Coleman had attributed the statement on several occasions to Bob Mandel. Reading from his original notes, Coleman was forced to admit, "It says here that the statement was made by Morgan Spector."

Coleman also said that he saw several other members of the Stop The Draft Week steering committee at meetings he attended far more often than the seven men now on trial. He said that there were five other men who seemed to be key leaders of the Committee, more important perhaps than the Oakland Seven.

Lt. Ernest Smith was the next cop on the stand. He didn't fare much better than Coleman. He testified that he took more than 700 pictures during Stop The Draft Week, but he could only come up with two of Mike Smith, and one of Bob Mandel. Smith admitted that he had been assigned to photograph Mandel, Smith, and four others in particular. He couldn't remember the other four, he said.

Although he could recall he was wearing tennis shoes, green socks and a sport shirt, he couldn't recall whether he was wearing a press badge or not. "Is your memory poor, or don't you want to admit that you were masquerading as a press photographer?" Garry asked.

Smith also denied seeing any acts of police violence, although he was shown his own pictures of people on the ground, trying to cover themselves to prevent injury.

Garry came into conflict with Judge Phillips and Jensen late Thursday when he attempted to cross-examine Blais about the role Alameda County DA Frank Coakley might have played in pressuring university officials. Jensen objected strenuously to Garry's questions, and Phillips generally sustained the objections.

It is believed that Garry is trying to show that the Oakland Seven were selected for prosecution, not for what they did during Stop The Draft Week, but because Coakley wanted to "get" some of the leading political activists on the Left.

PANTHER HELD UP IN JAIL

A Black Panther is still being held political prisoner in the Alameda County Jail.

Warren Wells, 22, has been holed up in the pen since his trial ended in a hung jury several months ago.

He was the first Panther to be tried for the April 6 shootout in Oakland in which Bobby Hutton was killed.

The jury voted 10-2 to acquit Wells on an attempted murder charge, and split evenly on an assault with a deadly weapon charge.

Normally such a weak showing by the prosecution means the case is dropped. But not if the defendant is a Black Panther.

Wells has to stay cooped up until his new trial, which will start once his attorney Charles Garry finishes with the Oakland 7 case.

Meanwhile a defense fund has been set up. \$20,000 cash or premium plus equity in real property is needed. Help in the form of bread or ideas can be given through the Warren Wells Defense Fund %S. Lee, 1621 - 101st Avenue, Oakland 94603

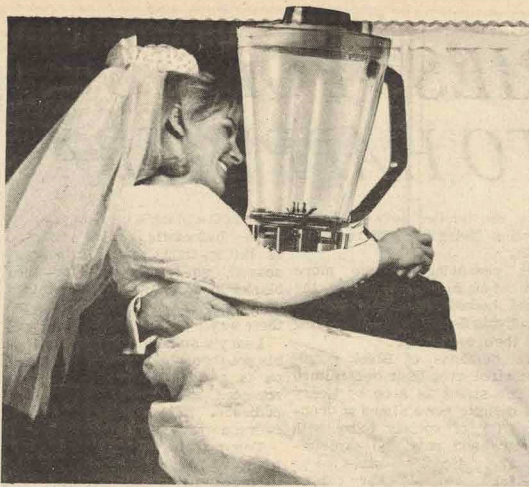
We sure can capture the peasants! Adm Behrens Jr. must have had an extra drink on THIS 'victory'.

plus more effectively and certain specific concessions on wages and working conditions.

Union leaders said they could not tell BARB specifics of the negotiations, but did say that there had been three sessions held last week, with a fourth scheduled for Thursday, February 15.

The University does not recognize unions on campus through formal contracts, even in areas like the building trades. A court decision in 1954, upholding the University on this point during a strike of construction workers on the campus was in fact, the legal precedent for Judge O'Day's injunction against striking professors as SF State.

Peter Steffens of the Berkeley professors' union and AFT president Conn Hallinan also urged members to support strikers at SF State as the school attempts to reopen next Monday.

HIGH PRIEST POINTS AHEAD TO HAPPY ERA

"We meet again, old friends..." With this phrase, Timothy Leary opened the first lecture of his series of five in Berkeley this month.

"I'm here to tell you about some of my trips . . . and to hear from some of you about yours." Every seat in the King School Auditorium was taken Wednesday evening as people came to pick up on one of the greatest explorers of the human mind. Often roaring with laughter, clapping and stomping, yet in some moments so quiet you could almost hear the thoughts in their heads, the listeners gave "St. Timothy" their full attention as he laid his trip out to them.

He started with some easy rap on recent experiences, and mentioned his earlier days in Berkeley. By the time he got into his subject for the night - "Psychodelic Psychology", the audience was with him all the way. His trip on the subject was the hedonistic gap, which he called "the real problem of the world today", and he related his theories on the matter in a fashion that everyone in the crowd could relate to.

Hedonism is simply living in the way that makes the individual most happy, in contrast to living according to social conditioning. Leary put it clearly as "living for pleasure instead of living according to the punishment - reward system that an up-tight society wants to keep us all trapped in".

His explanation of the different hedonistic levels that people are in was a mind-trip alone. Roughly, an individual's awareness level expands from his sleeping state, and rises through the levels of emotions, reacting to the reward - punishment conditioning, physical stimulation, sensory awareness, influence by the individual's genetic heritage, and the final stage of absolute being: vibrations of pure energy.

In explaining how different people register on the hedonistic index, Leary cited the school teacher's relationship to her primary school pupils.

"Here are the little kids playing out their lives of princesses, Indians, soldiers and explorers (etc) that are coded in their genetic backgrounds. The school teacher, who is living in the punishment - reward world, breaks up their trips, and conditions them to her hedonistic level, which operates on good/bad, Heaven/Hell, etc.

So the children are gradually brain-washed to fit conditions of society, and the previous memories of freedom, love, and living lives of beauty and enjoyment are all but erased forever.

"But the people who drop-out by cutting their ties to the punishment-reward system, and de-condition their heads through turning on," Leary told his fascinated followers, "have picked up on this, and can withstand the bring-down vibrations of those people who are on lower levels IF they are aware of the hedonistic gap."

The turned-on people can even bring those functioning on lesser levels up to the level that they live on if they can realize and relieve the fears that trap those people into their plastic pre-planned lives.

Leary carried it even further, explaining that the hedonistic gap, if recognized and acted upon, could

lessen the friction between entire societies living on different life levels.

His reasoning became more clear when he related it to the typical hedonistic gap today; that of individuals or groups wanting to do their own thing.

The demands of Black people for control over their own culture and life-styles is seen by Leary as a definite move aimed at dropping OUT of society today with its wars and pain and exploitation. The nationalism stressed by the black movement, Leary rapped on, is a move towards a higher hedonistic way of life, based on their free beautiful African heritage, recorded and stored in the back of their brains.

The bummers that pull them down are the up-tight white community that's afraid of losing its power and riches (and therefore

were in the black's territory.

The hedonistic gap is reduced as the up-tights are a little less scared, so it's easier for the blacks to do their high-level thing with fewer bumper-elements in their way.

Leary's smooth style in relating his pet theory of how being turned-on is a different dimension was accepted whole-heartedly by the audience. He was so clear that everyone just dug it.

Towards the end of the session, Leary opened the stage microphone to members of the audience who wanted to share their trips. Several wandered on-stage and clued the rest in to what was going through their heads. Freudian slips were numerous and outrageous, and this pulled everyone in the auditorium into a beautiful trip en masse. "Saint Timothy" ended the seminar by reading his list of 21 dif-

ferent ways to turn on. He added a preview of the subjects he will cover in his four lectures to follow: which are: Psychodelic Marriages (Feb. 14th), Psychodelic Communities (Feb. 18th), The Hedonistic Revolution (Feb. 20th), and the Hedonistic Society of 2001 (Feb. 22nd). (Same place: Martin Luther King School, Grant and Rose.)

Leary closed with a farewell that would "last until we meet again as one". The time was 11 pm; the seminar had lasted much later than had been expected, but even Leary left the stage reluctantly.

Leaving the Auditorium, there was lots of talk in anticipation of the four lectures still to follow, and it seemed that the audience's contact high was pretty strong. Everyone plain got the message.

REAGAN RUNNING LIKE DOG

Ronald Reagan will run for reelection as top dog in California. In fact, the 1970 campaign has already begun.

This was suspected when he promised a tax cut (after doubling them earlier in his reign). The money is available now but the 10% cut won't come until 1970. If the citizens got their money now they might forget who "gave" it to them by election time.

With his ludicrous "state of extreme emergency" all doubt has been removed. If he can't be the chief hog of Washington, D.C., he'll settle for another term in Sacramento.

His second campaign was brief. He promised not to run for president and almost kept his promise. He didn't officially announce until he got to the convention in hyper-American Miami Beach. By that time his tongue was hanging out after his cross-country run.

An exhausted Reagan finished a distant third. Nixon, Thurmond, and Company had bought the bone he was seeking long before he arrived. Even the Rockefeller millions couldn't shake down Dicky's Southern strength. Reagan returned with his tail between his legs.

Thoroughly recovered, Reagan runs to the dog pit for another term. His potential opponents are Jesse Unruh and Joe Alioto. Unruh has seen the writing on the dog-house wall and is howling for law and order on campus. Still, he can only talk about law and order. He has no army.

Joe Alioto, on the other hand, has a small but well-trained army. It's called the San Francisco Police Department. Alioto can practice what Unruh can only preach.

The S.F.P.D. is compiling a fine record of police brutality and murder. At San Francisco State, and in the Third World communities, Alioto's troops make law and order a harsh reality. Given America's march toward repression, this should make Joe a favorite of the citizenry.

In the face of this threat to his image as top dog and protector of the American way, Reagan had to act. His first move was flipping the bird at Cal students during a recent meeting of the Regents.

His image makers decided, though, that just saying "Fuck you" wasn't enough. He had to actually do it. So we see a state of extreme emergency, a gauntlet of pigs in Sproul Plaza, and proposed statewide blacklists for political activity.

He's making a dogged effort. Some of us suspect, though, that he's impotent.

messed up to the tune of \$500,000. And the article talks about that. But you get the idea that it's not the Board's fault. You get the idea that poor Barbara Adams and her fellow school board members are a collection of goody good people striving to run a school district in spite of the frivolous nitwit public they represent.

The fact is that the educational establishment in this town is more stupidly arrogant than the combined forces of S. I. Hayakawa AND Ronald Reagan.

Due to their accounting sloppiness and the right wing Superintendent they hired three years ago, Peter Bancroft, the school district has had to cut back such "extras" as hiring substitutes and kids taking showers after gym class.

Teachers in the elementary grades are sending lists home with the children begging for supplies like rugs for the floors, picture books, paints and paper. Even though the taxpayers in Livermore pay \$4.80 per \$100 assessed valuation for their local schools.

What has the board done? They met in a phony secret session late last spring avoiding the Brown Act by some parliamentary gimmick that is always available to the establishment and renewed Bancroft's contract for three years increasing his salary to \$27,000 per year. (Max Rafferty makes \$25,000 per year.)

This was done in the face of loud public complaints from a growing vocal minority. It now appears that even though Bancroft has resigned due to the shit hitting the fan (effective June 1969) the people of Livermore will be legally bound to continue paying this enormous salary for the next three years.

What else has the board done? Early last spring Bancroft decided to send a couple of administrators to England to recruit teachers for the district. That's right. All the way to England to hire new teachers. Even people who have been digging into this financial slop differ on how much this eventually cost the school district.

One source told me it cost \$3,000. But another source even closer to the finances estimates \$25,000. The net result of this merry sojourn at the taxpayer's expense? Two new teachers. The trip was authorized by the board of trustees in spite of loud protests from the public.

On Jan. 30 of this year the Livermore Education Association issued a statement calling for Bancroft's resignation. Bancroft resigned a few days after the statement was issued.

The LEA statement, representing 430 teachers or 90% of the teachers in the district, said in part: "He (Bancroft) has attempted to undermine this professional organization by creating strife and doubt among teachers and by failing to support the goals and programs of this organization."

And what did the board do about that? Under the leadership of Mrs. Adams they issued a statement signed UNANIMOUSLY putting the LEA under claiming the statement "underminded" the district.

Two years ago several high school kids were expelled by the board for smoking pot. Only God knows how this exercise in suburban compassion chewed up their lives. Eventually some were reinstated in Livermore high schools. Some finished at Contra Costa schools. One boy that I know of was urged into the Army by his family in order to avoid the "disgrace." And who was the loudest in her moralistic denunciation of these kids? Barbara Adams.

Incidentally, James Nordahl who was recently appointed for man of the 1969 Alameda County Grand Jury served on the Livermore Unified School Board until late last spring when he resigned. He was part of the board when they sneaked through Bancroft's contract renewal. He responded to public criticism by verbally attacking the critics because they wore beards. The man bears watching.

FOR THE DEFENSE

Forty people have been busted at UC Berkeley since the start of the Third World Liberation Front Strike.

David Helms, of the UC Defense Committee told BARB, "The word is that thirty-five more warrants are waiting on the DA's desk."

The majority of busts have been for "obstruction." Seven of the bust have been for Felonious Assault on a Police Officer, most of them stemming from the ar-

rests by plainclothes men by Sather Gate on Bloody Tuesday.

"Eight of the forty warrants issued have come from the University, with five of those against third world people," Helms remarked.

The majority of bustees are out on bail, with only two people still being held.

"Witnesses to any arrests are desperately needed," Helms stated. "Anyone having any pic-

tures of an arrest could also help."

THE GOD GAME

The door opens and Timothy Leary quietly ushers us into his Berkeley home. The magic has just begun.

Like Siddhartha before the Buddha, we have come to hear the acid prophet speak.

Upstairs we move and beside the fireplace we settle down, atop pillows on the floor. The house becomes a garden and we get high with a little help from Leary. Then he lights the fire and brings the wine, his wife greets us and it all is stunning.

As the tape unreels throughout the evening, amidst a touch of amazement, we come to understand the rarity that is Leary—that his life style and his thought are like Brahman in their oneness.

So many things to be asked of Leary. We begin by asking him about the world we are stuck in, the arena of political struggle. What does the Movement look like from his psychedelic lens into reality?

"The Leftist-activist movement," he answers, "is the perfect yang to the ying of the defense industry, plastic, capitalist system, so that the capitalist system creates the activist Left.

"But both of these are irrelevant to the future which is going to be psychedelic."

Amongst us sounds a chord of disappointment; we wish he'd said the political activists were the perfect yang to the ying of what he calls the psychedelic revolutionaries.

"The activist movement," he goes on, "is very necessary and I'm delighted by it. It's just as inevitable as



the winter follows the summer. You have to have the activist movement to show up in clear perspective for everyone to see the insanity of the capitalist, defense industry, middle class system."

So Leary can in a way dig the radical scene. But in his vision, "left-activism is ridiculous too, the political power struggle is ridiculous. I think most turned-on people don't want to have that power, as far as running the University of California or running SF State goes, because no education takes place there anyway, or very little does."

The future is what counts and the political people, it seems, are not relating to it at all.

"The real activists are the dope dealers and the rock and roll musicians. They're relevant because they're blowing minds and they're making people feel good and they're bringing about neurological changes which create a new generation."

Activist youth is tragic youth, alienated from the hedonic future. "It's just bad karma, just bad luck if your cosmic karma leads you into political activism. But somebody has to play that role. It's just too bad.

"Next time around, I hope that Tom Hayden can sing it with the band."

Leary does see a revolutionary force at work in America which will rock us into the future. "The powerful force in this country is the enormous, almost fairly silent, majority which is probably 90% of the people under the age of 25, North and South, East and West, black and white, who are psychedelic.

"They just want to feel good. And they don't want to get involved in any system or any activity which will make them or any other people feel bad. They don't want to be brought down.

"Therefore, they're not going to be working for defense industries and they're not going to be leftist-activists. They're going to float along and create a new society."

Pleasantly seduced by the stoned power of his being, we sense that he is right and that the streetfighting gigs of the present could not be our thing in the future. But like a case of the crabs, the doubt nags on that we cannot float into the new society, that instead we must struggle in order to get it together. So we muse that Leary is a man belonging too much to the future to handle the nitty gritty choices of the present.

Leary is much more into the black liberation movement because "the Afro-American is closer to his body, closer to his senses, closer to the humorous wisdom of where life is at, I think blacks are closer to this sacred mystery of life than whites.

"The black culture and the American Indian culture is very psychedelic to begin with. The average black man and woman in this country has had the advantage of a very psychedelic upbringing. Grass is the gift of the black culture to the white middle class. It was the blacks and the Mexicans who were turning on to grass long, long decades before the white man discovered it. Psychedelic drugs blacken the white man."

About the current Third World strikes on Bay Area campuses, Leary says that "the intelligent blacks are trying to liberate the educational system, not because they want to be like the white student or the white professor, but because the strategic place to bring about

the revolution is on the campus, that's where the young people are.

"The intelligent black is just using the universities as the stage for the broader revolution, which is to free all of us."

Leary feels that Black Power is America's ticket to ride into the new society. "I think that the black culture is the salvation of the human race.

"If blacks get more power, they'll loosen it up and make it more free and they'll make it funnier and they'll make it more physical and they'll make it sexier and more hedonic."

Though he believes that "a lot of blacks have white minds and have become middle class," Leary expects that, on the whole, "the blacks will just zoom through middle class affluence in maybe just a year or two. The concept of soul is such a powerful and wonderful concept, and I don't see blacks giving up their soul. According to Eldridge Cleaver, when the blacks talk about soul they really mean body."

Of course, Leary has a special interest in Black Power. "I want the police chiefs in every American city to be black, because I know that not only will he end the ghetto problem and he'll end all the insecurity that we all feel about the police, but he won't bust me for smoking pot.

"I just know that no black man in power is going to lay that heavy anti-ecstasy trip on me."

He also understands the Third World strikes to be generational conflicts. "The Third World Liberation Front, their average age is 25, and the Administration, their average age is 65. Well, you know who's going to win, you know what side to be on, you know where it's going.

"The black movement is a young movement and middle-aged Negroes like Whitney Young and Roy Wilkins are its worst enemies.

"Any time I see young people opposed to old people I've got to be on the side of young people. Young people are closer to their bodies and they're closer to the life principle and they're just about to have babies--they've got to be closer to the celestial pipeline than an older person."

He does not believe that the black movement on the campuses will be co-opted by the system as a means of bringing the blacks into the middle class-student mold. "I don't believe that young black men and women want to become horn rimmed-glassed graduate students, square, uptight, inhibited, booklearning, white graduate students."

UNDER THE GUN OF THE EMPIRE

Leary begins to rap about his many busts on drug charges.

"I think that being raided and harassed by the police is one of the existential, authentic experiences of our time. Anyone who's living in the United States today and doesn't feel the threat of imprisonment hanging over him just isn't involved in what's going on.

"It's like living in Hitler Germany--if you didn't have that sense that ruthless, armed agents of your government were around, probably after you, then you were just out of what was going on.

"We've all lived with this knowledge for many months and years now. It's been over three years since we were arrested in Laredo, Texas, so it's just part of the reality of where the world is now. If you were living in Greece and didn't feel the pressure of the police, where would you be at? Or if you were in Czechoslovakia? Or in Russia?

"There's a tendency to think that these are especially bad times. Actually, it's always been this way. Anyone who's been interested in individual freedom, anyone who's been interested in individual pleasure, has always been under the gun of the empire."

Despite the repetitious repression which history has recorded, Tim Leary expects the future to be different.

"If man is going to survive, the population explosion and the technological explosion are such that man has got to start becoming a lover, because he just can't go on being a hater, and he can't have an anti-hedonic society any more.

"An anti-hedonic society is an uptight society, is a punishment society and it's a warlike society, and we just can't afford that any more if we're going to survive as a species. That's what the kids in Barcelona are catching on to and the kids in Prague, and Cuba and I'm sure in China too."

The hedonic gap is causing the empire to collapse. "The only issue today, as in the past, is the hedonic gap. Every issue, whether it's a psychological conflict, personality conflict, or social-political conflict always comes down to an hedonic gap.

"Some people try to bring others down or make them feel worse; the innate struggle of every individual is that he wants to feel better and that's really behind the black-white thing.

"The white had it figured out that he did good and the black felt good. The black man is saying he can do well in addition to feeling good, and that's horrible. The average middle class white man has given up everything for the one little thing he's got, which is that he's a middle class white man, that's all he's got, and now he has to give that up, which is intolerable. No wonder they're arming the police.

"You either have to declare a state of police emergency or you have to turn on."

IF SOMEONE HAS TO COME ALONG IN 1965 AND TRY TO TURN ON THE UNITED STATES

The Supreme Court will soon decide whether or not Leary will have to spend 30 years in prison because he had a little bit of dope on him one day in Laredo, Texas. Leary has said he will journey to India if the decision is in his favor.

We ask him why he had not tried to do so already, without the punishment society's permission.

As is his manner throughout the interview, he stares off into space, almost disappearing from our presence, while contemplating the question. Suddenly he returns, his voice mystically charming and relaxed.

"Exile and banishment are classic techniques in the spiritual martyr game. I think that exile and banishment were quite civilized techniques, I'm glad they got rid of burning at the stake. But I am very much opposed to

the spiritual martyr game, because it makes everyone feel bad. It creates guilt, and the example of Christ bleeding on a cross has led to nothing but bloodshed and suffering.

"No, I have not given any serious thought to what would happen if I lose the case. Because I think that your own nervous system determines, tends to determine, what happens, and the reality I'm trying to create now is that we will win this case, which will liberate several thousand federal marijuana prisoners, myself included. So that's the movie script I'm writing."

Can one really write the script, we ask, and have it work out?

"When I say that I'm God and you are too, I'm not kidding. My wildest fantasies of more than five years ago have more than come true, I wasn't glib enough.

"If you take your own divinity seriously you have to set up rules for yourself. You have to grant divinity to other people too, which means you have to adjust your divinity to where others are. Otherwise you're going around saying 'I'm God, take your clothes off and follow me,' and that's not conducive to making others feel good. You have to play out your divinity saying 'I'm God but the DNA code put me together in this particular form and threw me into this particular drama which is of Timothy Leary in the United States in 1969.'

"The God Game is solitaire. When you play solitaire you could cheat, you could make it so that you could win every time. But the way the God Game is played, you let it happen minute to minute, card by card.

"My divinity deals with the unique set of energies that I find myself creating around me. The greater energies you get involved in or the grandiosity of your style of the God Game--you're playing for very high stakes and you get involved in very powerful ying-yang energies.

"I've stirred up an incredible amount of hatred. The economics of the game is that if you do something that brings about a great increase in pleasure for one group, you're going to create a great deal of envy, discontent, and hatred on the part of another group.

"I've not seen any way out of that. In the future it will be different, but if someone has to come along in American society in 1965 and try to turn on the United States, that involves a tremendous release of both positive and negative energies, or of love and hate energies."

Fascinated, we listen to Leary sift through his life as an acid prophet.

"I have been affected by the negative energies that I've stirred up. But it hasn't bothered me very much; it's a heavy weight that I see all the time. I sense this pressure because it's real and it's there, of the millions of people who think that I'm the devil or that I am this crazed, vicious, degenerate, drugged person trying to corrupt youth. That hatred is real.

"The choice that I made, I thought that it was really



a good thing to do, to make the older people more upset because younger people are getting more free. The reason I chose to do this is because I do think our civilization is ended--it just can't go on.

"The only thing that is really important is the hope that the younger generation will produce a society of love and pleasure. If I do something that makes younger people feel good, then they will have children and be more hedonic parents. So that the seed thing of lovemaking and ecstasy and humor is released, although that does put the older generation very uptight.

"Many thoughtful people say I'm too hard on old people, and I think that is true. I've tried very hard to explain to the older generation what is happening. I've tried to be a bridge to bring to them what is happening, but the role of a bridge is often to get stepped on."

HOW TO WIN AS TOLD BY TIM

Satisfied with his choice, hurt by the hatred it aroused, and now threatened with three decades of imprisonment, Leary still digs his own style of the God Game.

"I am not a martyr; I have no intention of being a martyr; I have no intention of feeling bad. I have no intention of suffering. Whatever happens to me I hope that if any image develops from it, if any energy goes out from it, it will make people feel more hopeful and more cheerful. Because I've never complained about police harassment or years in prison and all that in the sense of an atrocity.

"The way I play the God Game I never rule out suffering. I say I'm going to try not to suffer, but the closer you get to the line, the higher the energies you deal with, or the more willing you are to blow your mind--cause if you're going to take LSD you just blow the whole thing.

"Every time you take LSD you put all your chips right on the table: your personality, and your ego, and your identity, and your sanity, you put all your big chips on the table. You never know what's going to happen. When you get into really powerful energy there's no sure thing. It comes up for a gamble, every flick of the coin, every tick of the clock.

"There is a 50% possibility that I'll feel terrible tomorrow. I may win the case and become a great hero-liberator and then the plane will crash at London airport on the way to India and my body will be burned.

"It's a bad metaphor, gambling, but it's a gamble in a way. The more energy valves you open, when you're actually living second to second, you can feel terrible.

"A prison is a terrible place. It's just like they took all the bad vibrations of the whole country and located them in prison. The prisoners feel bad, the guards have got to feel bad, all the rehabilitation people feel terrible because they're not doing any good at all. So that a prison is a monument to futility.

"On the other hand, I don't think I can remember the name of any man in history whom I respect a great deal who didn't spend a great deal of time in jail or had to run out on it or was caught and tortured or killed. Again, the greater the energies in the game you're dealing with, the greater the chance you'll run into getting assassinated or imprisoned."

Eldridge Cleaver is, for Leary, a man who plays the game well.

"Eldridge hooked himself up, as I have, to just a lot of energy--Black Power. In order to do that he had to expose himself to the law. But still, if he hadn't done that--he said in one of his own interviews--he would still be in jail today, if he hadn't been a Black Power person. So far he has gambled with the energy and he has released a lot of energy for himself and, God knows, for millions of black and white people, and he's still free, so I would say he's not a martyr."



RISKING YOUR SOUL

"The essence of life and evolution is that you're always right on the edge, you're always taking a chance. As soon as a species stops doing that, as soon as a human being stops doing that, as soon as you start holding back and saying 'I won't take chances any more,' that's called aging.

"I'm sure that some bio-chemist will win the Nobel Prize when he discovers that aging is the body's tendency to stop taking chances.

"Risk is the essence of life, and I don't mean risk in the Hemingway sense, going out and risking that way, but risking your soul."

GOD IS A CONSERVATIVE OR GOD IS A PROGRESSIVE

In being God, should we just sit back, watching it all

happen, or should we jump in and try to make it happen our way?

"There are two definitely well-accepted God games--one is that God is a conservative and the other is that God is a progressive. The Maharishi says, 'just meditate,' he doesn't teach you how to make love better or he doesn't tell you to do something about Vietnam. Just merge along, just flow, if your father and mother want you to cut your hair short and wear a tie, then you do it, you just float along, just meditate and find the ocean of bliss.

"That does lead to a conservative thing, that does lead to worship of the Establishment, it goes along with minimizing, if not eliminating completely, union with the opposite sex.

"The Maharishi himself sits there and he doesn't have his chick with him on that platform.

"After all, the Maharishi's great message is not what he says, but the way he runs his life. And his model is not the dominant God who's engaged.

"If you're going to go through everything that's possible for you, maybe you have to do all these things, and then come out with something that's absolutely new and unique, because you're the mutant, that's the youngest of the great God players. So there are times when you have to learn how to withdraw and some times when you have to go out."

Let it out and let it in, Leary certainly did begin. He describes the cellular experience as the process of learning how to describe and release energy.

"The more energy you have going through you, the more is likely to come. So that I don't see how anyone can play the God Game and not get involved in such energy, depending on how you use it--there's always the temptation to use it selfishly, of course that's the first thing not to do if you play the God Game--but I don't see how anyone can get involved in the God Game and not have so much energy be developed that you've got to become well known.

"Not that you want to, because if you want to, then you're not going to get it. The rules of the God Game are just the opposite of the secular game, you want to avoid publicity. But if the energy's flowing through you, then it will inevitably affect other people and when that happens, then you're engaged, and at that point you're either for the war or you're not. And you just have to fly out and say, 'Stop all fighting.' And then you're either for sex or against it.

"There's no holds barred. You've just got to say that the energy flowing within you is good, that love is good, and that peace is good, and that turning on is good, and that feeling good is good, and anything that brings people closer together physically, emotionally and spiritually is good. You can't hem and haw about it and say it's all right for me to do it but not for you."

Leary sees his role in America as being the right God at the right time.

"There are periods of repression and periods of opening up. I am a spokesman for opening up, which is a position of such incredible prophetic power now because it's such a closed down system.

"There is a great deal of fun to be a leader of a trend which has the whole of evolution behind it."

Though he is a most radical spokesman for opening up, he believes that "life and every form of energy, including the structured atom, is a tension between control and free energy. The proton and the electron, the

DNA and the structure around it which keeps shedding, so that the tension between structure and process, between form and energy, between control and freedom is going all the time."

Just as there are some whose karma it is to fall into the political bag, so "There are people who's karma it is to keep in control, because that's necessary too. If we're all just going out all the time, there'd be no structure left."

Out of the hedonic society, which will replace this one, will come "the next Puritan movement. It will probably take the form of such things as sensory deprivation, sensory isolation, sleep treatments, suspending life functions for long periods. When the swing comes back, the new Puritan will be fired from Harvard in thirty years because he's teaching his students how to suspend biological functions for periods of fifty years.

"90% of the sophomore class at Harvard will go into a deep sleep for a hundred years."

In addition to an Eastern-like interest in sensory deprivation, "There will be a great movement toward esthetic suicide within twenty or thirty years."

But the pendulum's ride back will be on a higher level than our old repressive ways. "Low level turn off things like Meher Babaism, Billy Grahamism or Maharishism are just bad esthetics, not in tune."

Leary still believes that grass is cool, but acid is what's really fine.

"LSD demands more than marijuana. You can keep your plastic job and then come home at night and turn on and make love better and enjoy music better and enjoy your dinner better and enjoy your friends better. That's good, that moves the whole middle class up a notch.

"But LSD is still the only challenge of the really intelligent person, because LSD requires a change of mind. Marijuana is the perfect drug to make you feel better, which is obviously necessary now, but there is no great spiritual challenge."

Several years ago Leary was really high on acid's psychiatric applications. Today we ask about that and he asks in turn, "Are there still psychiatrists?" Then, "I'm in favor of legal psychotherapy and legal prostitution."

Leary has often laughed throughout the cap, digging the humor of his life and the world, and his thoughts about them. At times he's asked us to erase the tape because "it's only marijuana rap, and you know where that leads."

Now he playfully remarks, "I think that if this material is handled intelligently, you can get the Pulitzer prize in journalism."

We wonder aloud if, considering the tension between form and energy, perhaps he's overdone it. A bit stunned, he replies quickly, "The Vietnam war is going on, there's a Nixon administration, and you ask me if I've overdone it?"

And then Leary takes a last look back.

"There's no feeling that I've overdone it--I've been too cautious all the way through.

"My only regret is that I didn't turn on a thousand times more than I did, and that I didn't start earlier and that I didn't take more dope and that I couldn't persuade more people to take dope. My only regrets are bad esthetics and bad communication."

RECORDS RAP

Anybody remember the nitty-grit electric blues sounds of Chuck Berry, Muddy Waters, Sonny Boy Williamson, and many more produced on Chess/Checker records?

According to a recent statement by Chess executives the policies that brought the world all this fine music have been changed.

Time warp: back several weeks ago to a Rolling Stone report from Chicago that rapped down how Chess had cornered Howlin Wolf in the studio with a "modern sound" back-up band (ie. ala Cream, Hendrix) and virtually demanded he record some of his old standards (Spoonful, Smokestack Lightnin) with a Foxey Lady beat.

Wolf reportedly didn't go for it, and it wasn't till Phil Chess himself came down to the studio and laid on a thick rap that the 260-pound back door man reluctantly condescended to the contrived cop-out.

After the sessions were completed, Wolf is reported to have told one Chess official, "Man, that stuff's dogshit."

A similar stunt was pulled by Chess last fall when it released a long play piece of shit called "Electric Mud" which feathered Muddy Waters doing almost totally unrecognizable versions of his oldies. It's sales were a reflection of the album's content; nobody will pay for shit when there's so much of it around for free.

(Those with good memories will remember that I gave the lp a favorable review, on the basis that it was a "live" record by Mud, putting the modern day Claptons in their places. Sorry to say, I take gas on that one, Chess was serious even if Muddy was not.)

In response to the Stone article I rifled off a hot letter to Chess, in defense of Howlin Wolf. I called their attention to the Stone blurb and the implications thereof, and told them that I consider the release of an "Electric Wolf" ill-advised, ill-timed, and a potentially great detriment to Wolf's esteem in the blues world.

I also called attention to the fact that Wolf himself had termed

the lp "dogshit." Said I, "I get enough "dogshit" (promo) in everyday."

"Furthermore, if this is a new policy in the Chess/Checker/Cadet organization," (ie. fucking over their artists against their artists; better judgement), "and if such a policy is to be retained, kindly remove our name from your mailing lists."

Several days later I received the following reply: "Dear Mr. Jaisun: Tis done! Your name has been removed from our files. Very truly yours, Dick LaPalm, Chess/Checker/Cadet Records."

Well, baby, it's no sweat off my ass. I get my records used at Moe's. But there are a few million blues listeners in this country who may not take it so lightly. Those of us who have already heard advance cuts of Electric Wolf on FM radio know what shit it is. Let's see how many copies you sell. Let's see if you can make one of the biggest names in blues a tool of Top Ugly 40 radio. It's all relative to your toilet.

It kind of makes me wonder who Wolf was singing about years ago, and if it isn't applicable now, in the words, "I shoulda quit you a long time ago, and I wouldn't be here now people, down on the killin' floor."

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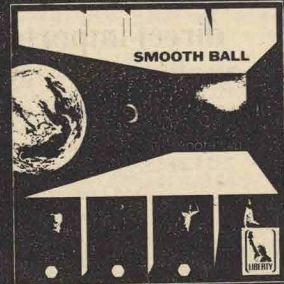

Widening The Generation Gap

This is a lesson in how to screw up relations between the old and the young, parent and child. I've just returned from a trip to Miami, Florida, an area only now awakening to the phenomenon of drug use by young people. In their concern and fright over potential dangers to students, school and law enforcement officials, some physicians, civic leaders and the Miami HERALD-Miami NEWS have joined together in a campaign against drug use which borders on hysteria.

I watched a TV program in amazement as a physician, who "sees a narcotics pusher behind every palm tree", according to one Miami HERALD reporter, described what he believed to be the dangers of marijuana use. First he said that marijuana damages chromosomes, a statement which would be debatable even if it referred to LSD. No source even semi-reliable claims marijuana use damages chromosomes. Then he described how THC can cause a trip similar to LSD. He neglected to explain that massive quantities of marijuana leaf would be required to achieve a similar result.

The physician continued with descriptions of how LSD and heroin are added to marijuana joints in order to "hook" the user.

Now these arguments are frightening indeed to the concerned parent but laughed at by their children. That's the problem. Lie to a kid about marijuana and he won't believe what you say about speed or heroin. Why should he?

School officials in Broward County, just north of Miami, recently began unannounced, unauthorized searches of school lockers and desks. Dade County (Miami) school officials have asked permission to deputize the school system's security personnel to give them police powers off the school grounds so they can prowling school parking

lots and nearby businesses.

At a meeting sponsored by the Dade County School Board, Florida State Attorney, Richard Gerstein, said narcotics was the single greatest crime problem. Understand now that South Florida has for many years been a stronghold of organized crime and that civic corruption and blatant racism are accepted modes of life there. Restrictive covenants, though illegal, are still being used in sections of Miami which prohibit home owners from selling to those who have "one-fourth or more Hebrew blood."

Gerstein's assistant, Al Sepe, urged the audience to "search rooms, shoes and drawers" of their children to gather "proof" of drug usage. He said a well brought-up child would understand.

Drug abuse is a public health problem with potentially serious consequences to individuals. We don't know all the right answers, but we do know some wrong ones: One is the punitive approach to health problems. A second is lying about the effects of drugs. A third is fostering distrust between parent and child, "authorities" and lay people.

The best approach to any social problem must be education. And if the chief danger from a drug is its illegality, we must tell that, also, to potential users.

David Hull never believed the cops could be "so rough."
 "I was very frightened by what happened to me," he confessed, as he spoke to BARB after his arrest at UC on Bloody Tuesday.

The 18 year old student had come to Berkeley from Milwaukee just two days before. He was on the campus to visit his mother, who works there.
 About 3:30, David was standing in front of Sproul Hall when he saw someone busted. "A group of cops ran up the steps, others come from another direction," he related. "I was caught in the middle."
 "I froze," he said. "One cop pushed me with a club. I turned to brace myself and he charged, pushing me down with his club."
 "When I was on the ground I took off my glasses. I didn't want them to be broken. Without them I can't see much. While I was down they clubbed me all over the head."

David still had lumps on his head as he spoke, a week later. "It still hurts," he said.
 "I heard someone say, 'Let's arrest the mother-fucker.' That's all I remember."

"When I got up 4 or 5 grabbed me and I was handcuffed. The handcuffs were very tight.
 "I was pushed down the stairs going into Sproul. I fell. Before I had a chance to get up they pulled me in by my hair and the handcuffs. Then they threw me in a cell."

Inside David's cell was a black named Abercrombie, arrested the same day. "He had a huge cut over his eye and his nose was bleeding."

"I was booked. Then I called my relatives who bailed me out," Hull told BARB. Charges were disturbing the peace and obstruction.
 And what about his mother?
 "My mother is very distressed," said David, "that is, with the cops."

 Immediately after the rally a mass picket line formed at Sather Gate, alongside the soon-to-be-busted score of striking teacher's assistants.
 CHP charged up to push the pickets off the bridge behind the gate. A new line formed in front of the pigs and more CHP were deployed on the bridge to keep the student strikers off it.
 The police began to look like utter fools; as we continued to form our marches inside their lines.
 The Alameda County Sheriffs were sent in to get rid of us, and when they couldn't do it by intimidation, they began to swing their clubs.
 A black KRAL reporter got the shit beat out of him by four or five zoot-suited hogs. A Third-Worlder who fought back was mauled by a squadron of about 20 pigs.
 The students circled back and

merged, defiant, in Sproul Plaza. By now there were at least 200 pigs arrayed against us, positioned from the far side of Sather Gate to Bancroft Avenue.
 Again and again they swept up and down, jabbing girls, picking off

a guy at random. Thursday afternoon made two things clear. The repression is

going to get heavier, and the strikers intend to take care of business.

 Joe Grodin of the Democratic Caucus. All four told BARB that they wanted to ask the Council to hold a public hearing on criteria for selection of a new Police Boss. The action started with Al Silbowitz, BBC Chairman. Silbowitz began, "Spending almost an hour discussing a glorified hamburger stand and allowing fifteen minutes at midnight to talk about selection of a new Police Chief doesn't add up to good government."

At this point, our good Mayor Wallace (Horatio Alger) Johnson jumped in with a long tirade that had obviously been prepared in advance. He concluded, after a battle for the floor with Silbowitz over the public address system, by ruling any discussion by the Council of the choice of a new Chief out of order.

Councilmen Ron Dellums and Wilmont Sweeney disagreed, and moved that the City Council hold a public hearing to "let the people have their say."

Dellums offered, "Choosing a new department head from within the department without advertising for outside applicants means settling for a built in racial bias. Suppose there's no eligible Black person within the department because of the historical problems of minority group members? We need to discuss this and other problems in public."

The argument continued for another half hour between Councilmen, between Councilmen and the Mayor, between the City Attorney and Councilmen, between John DeBonehead and himself. No other scheduled or unscheduled speakers from the public were allowed to interfere.

DeBonehead called Silbowitz a "freak" and the audience "idiots." The City Attorney gave a tight-assed interpretation of the law that excluded City Council discussion of any hiring policies by the City Manager. Councilwoman May thanked heaven for Berkeley's sacred City Charter which enshrines a holy form of government in which an appointed City Manager has all

the power while elected representatives sit on their hands.

Silbowitz never did get to finish, since the Council spent all its time debating his right to say what he didn't get a chance to say, as the Mayor kept intoning, "I know what you're going to say" before he could say it. Tennis anyone?

When the Tuesday night farce ended for this week BARB cornered Silbowitz and scooped the Council by asking, "What were you going to say?" Silbowitz smiled freakishly and said: "Berkeley must reach outside its own Police Department for a new Chief. This city is deeply divided, more than many cities, on the question of police. If a real gesture, a real acknowledgement of the need for change in the old ways doesn't happen soon, the beautiful culture that has been growing all these years in Berkeley is going to die. But it probably won't be a peaceful, quiet death. The choice of a new Police Chief gives us a chance to make that gesture, just as the recent choice of a new School Superintendent was used creatively by the School Board. But they don't hide behind a City Manager."

In a letter to the City Council, Loni Hancock and three Black Council candidates, Pecot, Wilson, and Widener, urged the Council to set up a public hearing, create a citizens' committee to determine the type of new Police Chief that Berkeley needs, and begin a nationwide search to find him or her.

In a separate letter to the Council, Grodin also asked that a Citizens' Advisory Committee be set up to advise on selection of a new Chief.

According to Silbowitz, BBC plans to involve Berkeley people in the selection process if it can, probably by a strategy of direct action. Lots of luck.

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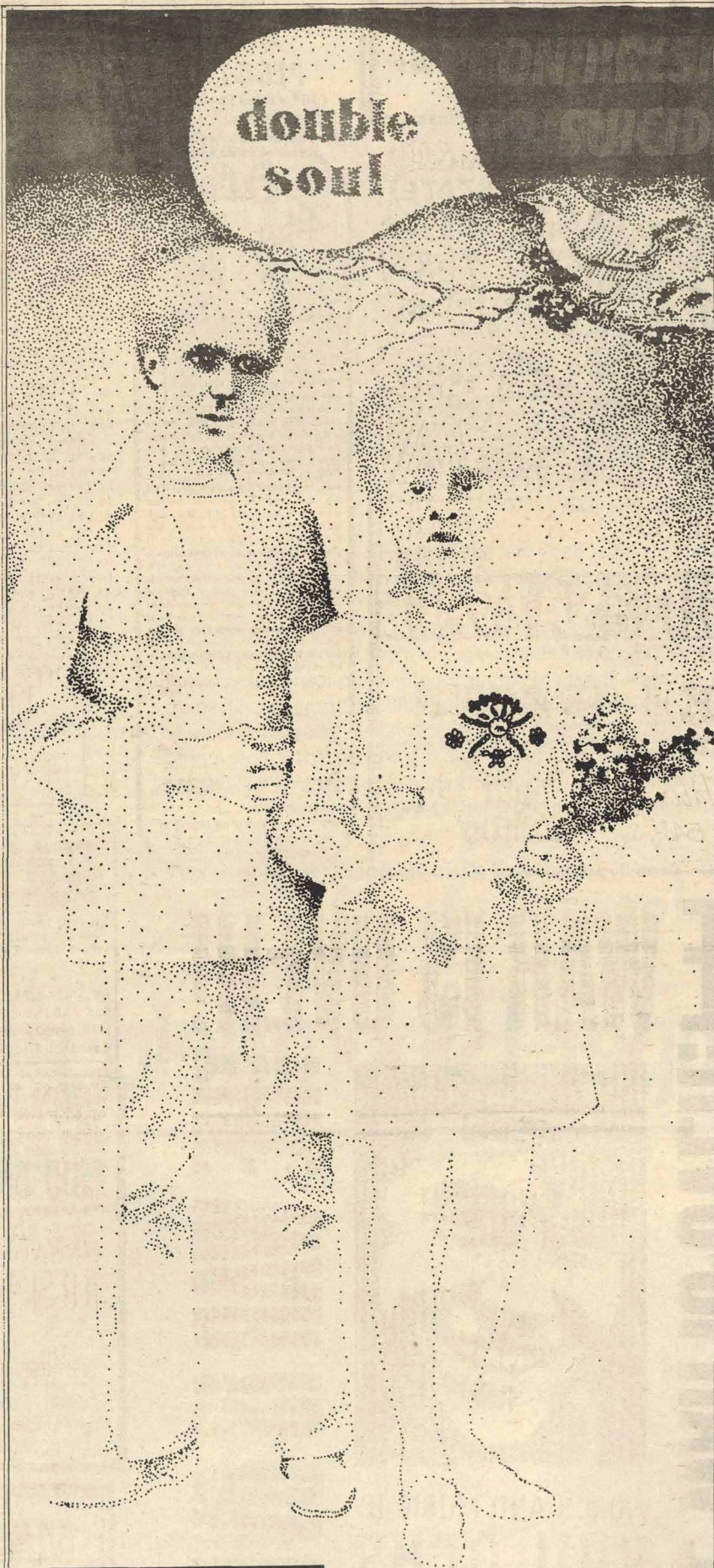

in charge of the SPD soldiers. Unlike the fire, the office - bombing was very efficient.

Meanwhile, the Presidio brass is threatening GIs off the base, too. Scotty McNutt, a GI scheduled to speak at a rally in support of the Presidio 27 on Saturday the 15th, may fall victim to the long arm of the Army even though he will speak off the base.

This is a fear that Jean Savage of the GI - Student Action Committee expressed to the BARB this week.

"A man who said he was a government agent told me Scott's name has been turned in to the authorities. He approached me Wednesday at noon while I was at UC and said Scott would be arrested even if he speaks out of uniform."

Another speaker who plans to appear Saturday at the S.F. Civic Center rally, scheduled for 1 pm, is Terence Hallinan, attorney for 16 of the Presidio 27. His clients will go to trial March 18th.

One of the original 27 charged with mutiny, Nesrey Sood, was found guilty by his Court-Martial Board early Thursday afternoon. As BARB goes to press he has not yet been sentenced.

However, he can receive the maximum sentence, that of life-

imprisonment. The severity of his sentence may set a precedent for what the other GIs will get.

At present, Sood is the only GI from the 27 to receive a conviction. Two other men, Lawrence Reidel and Louis Oszczepinski, were arraigned in a military court, but instead of handing down a decision presiding Judge Lt. Col. George Robinson ordered new psychiatric hearings for the two.

of vandalism which we disavow. I personally disavow petty acts of vandalism because they're petty."

Richard allows that the TWLF at Cal is not in the same place as the Front at State. He says that the Cal branch of TWLF still considers itself to be "responsible," and has been trying "to keep a lid on things."

But he warns that the powers in the University had better move quickly to meet the demands before the lid flies off and "every-one does his own thing."

for the Rockefeller's or the Ken-
nedy's, but for us."

Alvarado warmed up; "The
mother-fuckers who run our
country won't tell you that most
of the poor are white," he said.
"Most of the farm workers, all
those people in Appalachia, and
the hillbillies in Chicago are white.
And YOU must go back to these
people, back to your roots in your
community and face up to the John
Birchers next door, or third world
people will have to fight him and
his wife and his children because
their attitudes are our oppression.

"We have to fight what has be-
come known as the war of the
flea," Alvarado explained. "We
don't go along with that stuff at
Columbia and in Moses Hall. Our
lives are too valuable to spend two
or five or ten years in the mother-
fucker's jails. We figure that the
dog can scratch at a flea and try
to bite him, but after a while his
quantitative irritation will become
qualitative and dog will have to
move because he has no choice."

Richard Aoki and Jim Solis of
TWLF in Berkeley, Scott Smith of
SF State and many others re-
affirmed their determination to
keep striking "tomorrow, the next
day, the next, and the next, until
our demands are won."

It will be a long month for the
pigs.
