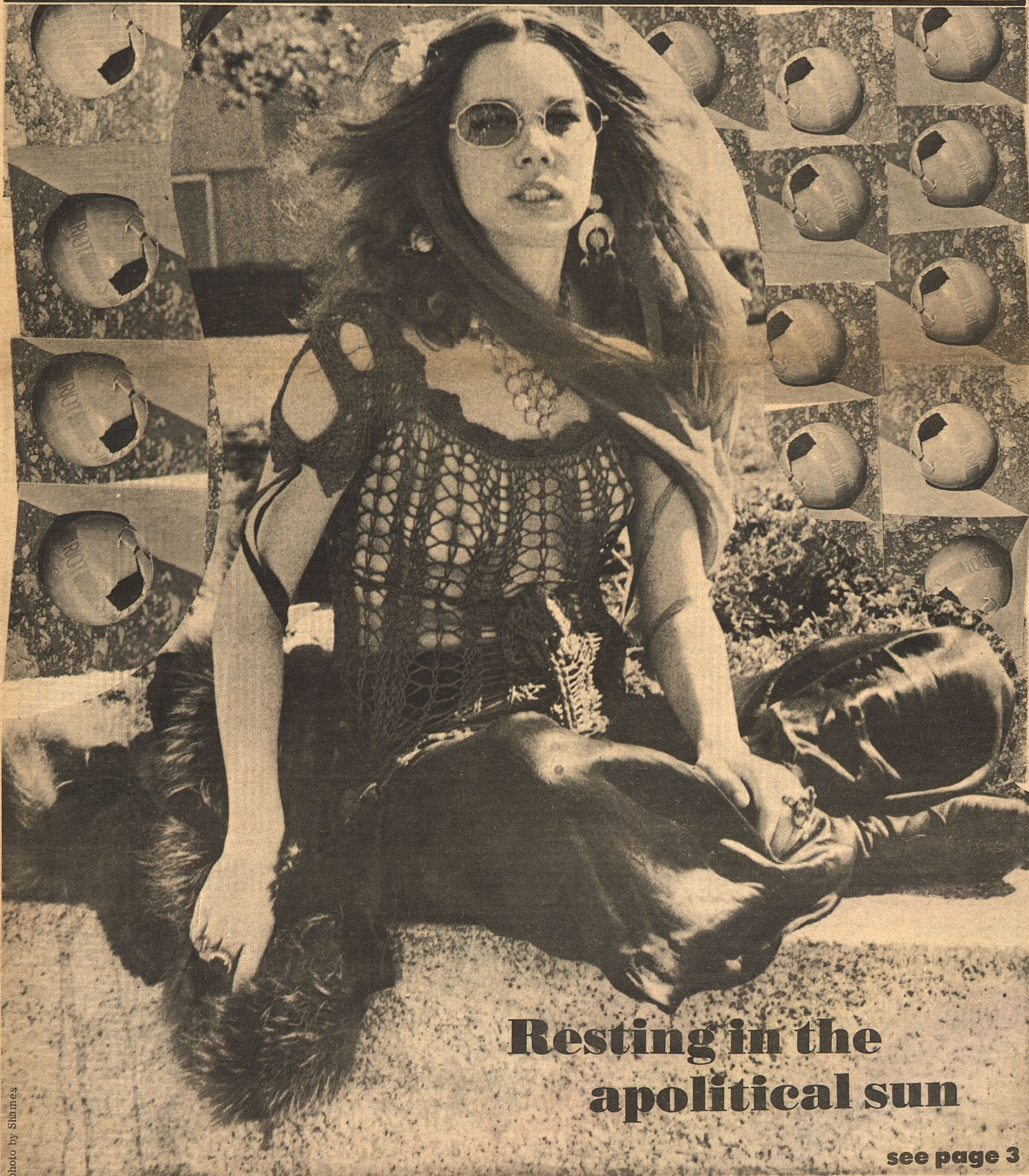

# R & R PLENTY WELCOME

HONOLULU (IWB)--Flight P-115 to DaNang was getting ready to load at Gate 13 at the Honolulu International Airport. The cargo would be a hundred, perhaps more, soldiers on their way back to war after five days R&R in Hawaii.

You saw them everywhere in Waikiki, quiet serious kids with crew cuts and lost, vulnerable, looks. In the evening they would be standing outside the Royal Lanai on Kalakaua Avenue listening to the band, either not old enough or not sure enough of themselves to go inside. Or perhaps the dollar-fifty drink price keeps them out.

But they are most welcome inside, there is a sign by the entrance that says: "Welcome R&R." All the stores and the stands where they sell plastic leis and Japanese ashtrays have signs which say: "Special Discount to R&R".

A reporter in the Honolulu Advertiser writes that the millionth soldier on R&R will arrive sometime in April. And according to that same reporter that millionth soldier will put the final five hundred dollars into the half-billion dollar kitty that the loyal citizenry will have received for their contribution to the war effort made by selling hotel rooms, plastic leis, and Japanese ashtrays to R&R soldiers.

Not all the soldiers have that lost look, a few, very few, have found girls. The island girls don't like soldiers. They find them too serious, too eager, and either too drunk or too sober. But what should they expect? This is the flower of American youth and it should be sufficient that in some slow, bovine, way they will be loyal to mother and country. They aren't very much interested in anything. They are not even much interested in killing people. It is just a job like working in your brother's gas station or selling ice cream cones. Just a job.

Somewhere in Vietnam there are a few people who owe their lives to the fact that tonight these soldiers were standing outside the Royal Lanai listening to "Sweet Someone" rather than being back in the Delta "doing their job."

There are other soldiers who do not look lost, or quite so lost. These are the ones who have brought in their wives. Wives come by the plane load to lie on rumpled sheets in twenty dollar a day hotel rooms and to soothe with their parted legs the pains and cares of their child warriors.

They walk hand in hand with their husbands and nuzzle under

banyan and hau trees and under neon signs. Girls in just-bought red and green and blue mumus and wild bell-bottomed trousers sewed up in local sweatshops especially for the girls from Akron and Chicago.

Nobody talks about the war, maybe nobody thinks about the war. Ask a local type and what would he say? "You kill'em gook like me, I drivem taxi, mixem up first-class MaiTai, all in day's work, No?"

Guys without girlfriends or wives start to get on the plane, they walk straight out to the boarding ladder without looking back. Guys with girl friends and wives are still nuzzling and hugging under the Agriculture Inspection sign.

You watch them, sort of out of the corner of the eye, but somehow you must watch them. They just stand there, not talking. If you watch carefully you can see their eyes dart off to pick up a movement someplace, to watch the man with the baggage truck. They stand entwined not, you feel, because of any remaining or rekindling physical need, not because of the sadness of parting even but because it was the thing to do.

To meet, to make love, to say goodbye, and to go back to killing, not you feel because of any commitment, any emotion, but because it's time to go to work.

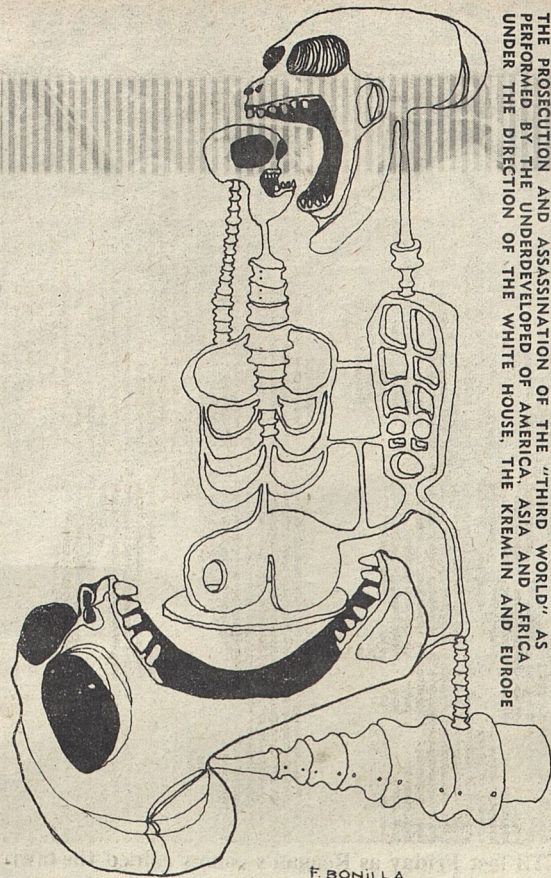
Couples start to disengage. One of the R&R Crew with a yellow armband announces immediate departure.

# STRIKE HOLDS AS TWLF SNAPS BACK TO THE HARD LINE

The Third World Liberation Front snapped back to the hard line Thursday at UC.

Front spokesmen criticized Tuesday's academic senate resolution as not meeting the strike demands.

The spokesmen then laid down the minimal conditions under which a moratorium on strike activities would be called.

Richard Aoki declared that the faculty decision did not "resolve problems relating to when such a (Third World) college would be developed, who would be instrumental in its development, and when and how the funds for such a college would be allocated.

Quelling rumors of a possible sellout, Aoki said, "We will settle for nothing less than a full Third World college for the Fall of '69, developed TW faculty, TW students, and TW community people."

Specific conditions for a moratorium to be declared include the immediate hiring of a chairman and four division heads of an interim department of ethnic studies, and an administration promise for

the college to be created in four to six months. The five people to be hired would be selected by Third World students and faculty.

Other TWLF conditions include the immediate hiring of Third World people in administrative positions throughout the university.

Where it's at, according to Jaime Soliz, is that "We have had a strike, we have a strike, we will continue to strike!"

# SPRING BREEZES BLOW BEST MINDS

Spring confronted Berkeley this week and the UC strike sort of rested in the apolitical sun.

Monday a little business was taken care of when a band of nefarious vandals informed the College of Engineering that a strike was going on. Smash samash smash go the windows.

Later in the afternoon a serpentine assembly of strikers sought to engage in meaningful dialogue with the scabs by chanting: Get your asses Out of classes Join the masses.

Tuesday the Academic Senate sought to calm campus tensions and restore a healthy academic atmosphere conducive to final examinations and institutionalized racism by holding a formal bull-shit session.

Unfortunately the Senate's original choice for a meeting place had to be scrapped when glue was discovered in most of the seats. Apparently no self-respecting faculty member wished to be stuck in the presence of five hundred

So the faculty moved underground inside the physical sciences complex while a couple hundred strikers lay outside in the sun to hear their elders' bull being amplified into the Berkeley atmosphere.

Fortunately, Chancellor Madigan failed to provide an appropriate light show.

And then, lo and behold, the venerable faculty democrats voted to go on record as being in favor of the establishment of a department of ethnic studies which might eventually evolve into a college.

But the celebrated Shorske motion, coupled with Jolly Roger's (Chancellor Heyns') absolute principles for relating to it, was so distant from the substance of the Third World demands, that no one who knows what's happening was even up to asking "Where's the catch?"

Both at SF State and at Cal, the Third Worlders are fighting for self-determination, for a Third World College which will help to liberate their minds and their communities from the tentacles of American racism.

POLKA DOTS

The difference between black studies and polka dot studies is the difference between Jim Nabors and S. I. Hayakawa.

If Heyns and other white academician-bureaucrats are ultimately in control of an Afro-American studies department, then there will be polka dot studies taught. If black students, black faculty and black community people are in control of an Afro-American Studies Department, then black studies will be taught.

Before Tuesday the Berkeley faculty didn't want any kind of ethnic studies. Tuesday they told Heyns he could put together a polka dot studies department for all the Third World students, and if Darwin was on its side then it might someday eventually perhaps become a College of Polka Dot Studies.

Tuesday's faculty resolution could serve as the first step toward a decision by the University to meet the strike demands. But it is a prelude to capitulation and only that.

VERY WIIRD

Along came Wednesday, the spring grew more beautiful, and something very wierd happened. Charles Jackson, a TWLF spokesman, suggested very strongly that the strike might be temporarily over.

About 150 strikers were picketing the center of Sproul plaza when some Third Worlders came up with boxes of oranges and watermelon. Everyone sat around in a circle on the plaza concrete and a very

# GAS OVER BERKELEY

Friday - Chapter Two of the System's newest fascist serial, Gas Over Berkeley.

It's after three, hundreds of students form a stationary picket line at Bancroft and Telly, or is it Tear Gas and Pepper? The kids spill into the streets, they want the pigs to come.

Waiting, waiting, where are the pigs? Don't they want to fight?

About four they finally come. But not out of Sproul Hall at first, and not from their garage up Bancroft. They appear in the street at the corner of Telly and Durant. The main escape route is blocked.

The gas goes off, we escape. My group cuts to the right of Zellerbach and gets out of the trap. The clouds of blue fumes follow us from Sproul plaza to lower Sproul

plaza and on. Later, the news will tell us that National Guardsmen are leading the poisonous attack.

People stream by crying, choking, blinded, wet towels and rags clutched to their mouths like the gift of life itself. Out to Bancroft, the escape route develops. The pigs keep coming, shooting grenades, spraying machines, the gas drives us nearly to Shattuck. Turn around to see khaki uniforms spill into Bancroft from the campus at Dana.

Start moving south, on each block down people are retreating from the ugly clouds. Where is the Berkeley rain now? Work around to Telly, a block below Dwight. The Berkeley pigs control Dwight and Telly, there is no streetpeople-stronghold - bonfire this time around. BPD cars swing around the corner where you hitch from and drive towards us.

A long barrel stretches out the side window of the lead pig car and a corridor of pepper gas keeps spewing at the people on the sidewalk. Other patrol cars behind it,

some of their windows have been smashed out.

Grenades are shot from Dwight to get the kids on the side of the street the pepper machine didn't cover. Flee through British Motors and out the other side. Work back toward campus. At the corner three pig cars pull up. The pork starts to unload, brandishing clubs.

Another escape through British Motors, this time going the other way. Cannisters go off in the garage, kids throw them back. Again on Telly, wait and think and look for new escape routes.

Suddenly it rains a little, suddenly the pigs disappear from the streets. Crowds of kids walking up and down Telly, Tijuana Taco's is open for business.

Somebody switched the channel, the war is over for today.

There he donned a disguise, a Mark I Professor's Uniform, complete with pipe. Thus safely esconced on yonder bank and assum-

ing an intellectual air, Sgt Pepper successfully passed many police check-points.

At the main library, while looking up a book in the card-index, Sgt Pepper overheard two girl student-librarians talking about their strike-instructions. "If any of the demonstrators come in, we are to stand in front of the files and look them straight in the eye!"

Sauntering across campus to North Gate, he was told that "the gas" was still "strong" inside the building - the building being the old wooden architectural classrooms that run up Hearst at Euclid.

"She forgot to duck - no, HE ducked and she didn't and the cop smashed her across the mouth, knocking out most of her teeth and splitting her lip." This happened to a non-striking student last Friday.

After being challenged by the Chancellor's House, Sgt Pepper decided to leave the North Gate area and cross back to Hertz Hall where the UC Symphony was giving see p. 4

# JIM NABORS RAPPING

Jim Nabors was walking through a checkpoint when "two National Guardsmen asked me where I was going.

"I said 'home'. About five paces out from the checkpoint I heard one say, 'I should shoot this nigger.' He put it in the barrel--for twenty paces I was one frightened motherfucker. If I turned around I'm sure he would have shot me."

That was Watts '65, and Nabors had come to see what the scene was all about. If the National Guard threaten his life again in Berkeley '69, it will be because Nabors has emerged as the popular leader of the Third World strike at UC.

Jim Nabors comes from Rotan, Texas, where his father worked a rented farm. "Now he's very destitute, he hires himself out as a worker on the small farms."

Grade school for Jim was a complete bummer. "By the time I got to high school all I liked to do was play basketball and play the French horn in the band."

His first attempt to relate to higher education came in 1958 at Jarvis Christian College in East Texas, a school for black kids. But he was completely unprepared and flunked out, "which put me right back on the farm where I began."

Nabors bummed around Texas and Louisiana for awhile until he got busted for stealing hubcaps. "The man comes in and says, 'You got a choice: you go to the work camp or the army.'"

Jim chose the army, where he became a sergeant. He was stationed for awhile at Ft. Ord. "My basic and foremost introduction to the Golden State."

Getting out of the service, "I immediately threw all my belongings into an old Chevrolet and went to the Seattle World's Fair, blew \$375, on the way back saw a billboard saying Pasadena City Junior College, and said 'I'll try that.'"

Nabors was shunted into a business program and taught to be a

department store salesman because "being black, they immediately assume that you must be dumb and incapable of abstract thinking."

But it was at Pasadena that Jim first began to think and act politically. "During the FSM I was head of the ad hoc committee for Human Rights." The committee proposed to the Rose Bowl committee that the standards for selecting the queen of the Tournament of Roses be changed so that a girl who wasn't white could also win.

"Getting our cue from the FSM, we initiated the Pasadena City College Free Speech Movement and threatened to sit in."

The would-be FSM'ers didn't succeed in getting a Third World chick selected as Tournament Queen, but Nabors learned a few things along the way.

"Up to then I only hated white people for what they had done. Now I began to hate them for what they were capable of doing, the power they held over black lives."

After Pasadena, Jim made the radical scene in New York for awhile, meeting people like Staughton Lynd and Dave Dellinger. Then Watts blew and Nabors hitched crosscountry to see it. "The whole scene was in its last days, but I got a chance to feel what it's like to be in the vicinity of the pigs."

He moved to San Francisco and worked as a salesman for Union Oil. The return to college began at the UC Extension Center, then Merritt College. Jim was going to transfer to SF State, "Until I heard about all the bread they were giving away to smartniggers at UC and I thought it was about time I got some of it."

This quarter is Jim's sixth at UCB. As a member of the executive committee of the Afro-American Student Union, he began to speak at strike meetings and the people have been grooving on his raps ever since.

Jim Nabors is now a committed revolutionary, determined to participate in a movement which will liberate the disenfranchised

peoples of the world.

"People who have a brood, the janitor in Sproul Hall or in Dwinelle, they're human beings who have a right to self-determination.

Nabors told BARB why he is making this fight here and now at UC for a Third World College.

If the College is established, "Number one it means that a very large group of disenfranchised people has now realized a viable system of education."

Secondly, it would mean that Third Worlders no longer recognized the hierarchy imposed on them by white America in which the blacks were on bottom, then came the Chicanos and then the Asians. "Now we realize that we've been duped, and we're moving to a movement based on collective consciousness."

Thirdly, "The most important ingredient--it allows us to rip off the power from those who've had it so long, the power that pertains to self-determination."

Like Nathan Hare, Nabors relates the campus struggles to the overall Third World liberation movement because "Once Third World people realize they do have a heritage to be proud of, this will allow them to have social intercourse on any level as an equal."

Jim hopes that out of the strike will come a movement committed to ripping off the power from those who have disenfranchised the people. He sees himself as representing "all groovy people. That one statement means a hell of a lot to me--Power to the People. I would be willing to be offed if the people said it."

Nabors' vision is that "eventually there will be a hot revolution." He points out that revolutions are always local, and he thinks the Bay Area is the place.

BARB wondered aloud why Nabors was not a Panther and he explained that "rules have always been difficult. I think I follow the rules of love for humanity, and a willingness to die for people, but I don't have that minor ingredient that allows you to take orders from any superior."

Jim believes that he has become a popular leader of the movement because "the people know I won't sell them out. There's no price that they could pay that would make me betray the faith that the people have in me."

He adds that "It's very difficult for me to be what you call popular because that takes me away from the people to a certain extent and I like to be with the people, to sing and to laugh and dance and be happy."

In his 28 years Jim has learned

that "there's no such thing as instant psychic liberation, and when you reach it everything doesn't fall into place, you still gotta keep pushing."

Jim Nabors has said a lot of groovy things during the strike but the one we keep remembering is something he said over beer and a cigarette as dusk came to Berkeley and another long day of the strike faded away:

"I owe a debt to my dead ancestors and that is to be a warrior and to fight until death."

# MACIAS STILL IN PAIN

Ysidro Macias is still suffering from the beating his head took last week at the hands of the Alameda County Sheriffs' Department.

Last Thursday a pig's savage billyclub sent Macias into a semi-coma from which he might never have returned.

This week the Chicano leader was still suffering from blackout spells, dizziness, hearing problems and severe headaches.

No physician can tell yet whether his injuries are permanent.

On Wednesday the UC strike leader told BARB the story of his bust and what's happened to him since then.

"There was a picket line at Sather Gate. Manuel Delgado was on one side, I was on the other side. I saw the blue meanies and

the highway patrol coming up.

"I could tell by the look on the blue meanies' faces that they were after my blood.

"I started to cut through the crowd to get him to split. By the time I got there they already had Manuel and Jesus Ruiz and they had Lanada by the hair--she was putting up a battle."

"Manuel Delgado is another key Chicano leader of the Third World Liberation Front and Lanada Means is a leader of the United Native Americans Party.)

"When I saw them grab her by the hair I tried to walk towards her until this pig hit me in the stomach and drove me back.

"Then I saw this other pig with hate on his face -- I'll never forget that look on his face.

"The crowd was starting to move away, I started to run along with

the rest. The next thing I know, poof. I can't describe it, something just hit me.

"The last thing I remember is seeing my beret and my glasses fall to the ground. Then I remember just falling, just falling into the pit."

Sid regained consciousness briefly in the basement jail of Sproul Hall. "I could hardly move, a doctor had my head completely wrapped up in bandages.

"I remember him saying to the pig sergeant if he didn't have an ambulance down there in a couple of minutes he would raise hell. Because apparently he was really worried about me, I was bleeding all over from the head wound."

The only other thing Sid remembers of that Thursday is being X-rayed in Cowell hospital. He was told on Friday that ten or fifteen doctors had examined him, and that a spinal tap had been performed on him. A friend and an uncle visited him on Thursday night but he had to be told about that on Friday too.

All the while Macias lay unconscious in the campus hospital they had a pig guarding him--he was under arrest. "One time I did regain hearing, I heard this one nurse offering the pig coffee and really playing up to him.

"She asked what had happened to me and this motherfucking pig said, 'He decided to confront the police,' and she said, 'All those people should be sent to Alcatraz,' and he said back, 'Yeah, send them to Alcatraz and make sure there's a lot of sharks out there so that they never come back.'"

Sid indicated that this incident was characteristic of the staff at the students' medical facility on campus -- "Most of the hospital people at Cowell are really racist, dyed in the wool rednecks."

During his periods of consciousness at Cowell Sid was often treated

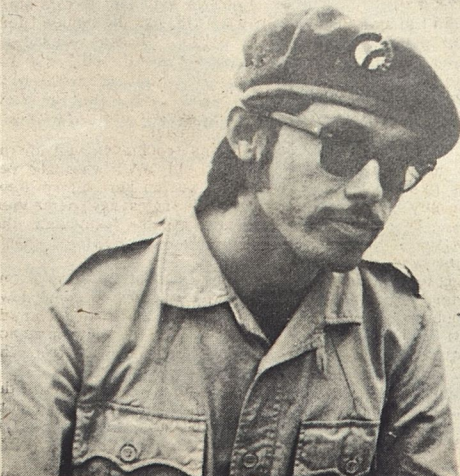

# JUDGE BLOWS COOL

The Oakland Seven's Judge, George W. Phillips, this eighth week of the conspiracy trial, blew his cool. The defense was finally on and the judge angrily admonished defense attorney Malcolm Burnstein in the presence of the jury.

Prosecutor Lowell Jensen tried to debate a Berkeley Lutheran minister on the morality and legality of the Vietnam war, and came out a very distant second.

These were just a couple of the surprises this week. Another came when chief defense counsel Charles R. Garry declined to make an opening statement. He had been denied the opportunity to make a statement at the opening of the trial by Judge Phillips, but would have been permitted to make one on Monday if he wanted to.

"Opening statements in the middle of the trial don't do any good," Garry commented. "I should have been able to make mine right after Jensen made his."

Also surprising was the first defense witness. He was an ex-Berkeley cop, Stephen Lundstedt, who played pig from April through September, 1967. Lundstedt left the Berkeley force in time to participate in Stop The Draft Week, and be clubbed down by the Oakland pigs.

Jensen tried to imply that the hip-looking Lundstedt had been forced to resign from the Berkeley Police Department. Lundstedt, who is now a house painter, denied this was true. "I just lost interest in being a policeman," he said.

Lundstedt testified that he saw the police make unprovoked attacks on the demonstrators on the morning of October 17. He also said he went down to the Induction Center on his own initiative, and not in response to any request by the defendants.

Most of the witnesses who followed testified along the same lines. Many gave vivid descriptions of various forms of police brutality, and said they went down to the Induction Center on their own, to register their protest against the war and the draft.

Almost without exception, they indicated that they had not known any of the Oakland Seven at the time they went to the Induction Center. The latter type of testimony is designed to prove that no conspiracy existed, or if one did, it included so many people, that to try only seven people for conspiracy is ridiculous.

Jensen tried to spar with a few witnesses, but did not fare too well. He is trying to show, that by blocking Clay St. on Tuesday, the demonstrators deserved the clubbings and mactings they received. He is also harping on the sit-in in the Induction Center doorway, (trespass) but nobody has yet connected any of the defendants with any act that took place on October 17.

Jensen's worst mistake was to try to engage the Rev. Ralph Luther Mollering in a debate on the war and the draft. Judge Phillips, in what was probably an unthinking moment, ruled that Rev. Mollering could discuss the legality and morality of the war because he had written about it, and it related to his state of mind about going to the Induction Center.

Jensen in cross-examining Rev. Mollering tried to imply that he supported the NLF. Mollering said that the NLF seemed to have the most popular support, and that he was on the side of people fighting against oppression. Mollering then went into a discourse on how the war violated the entire Judeo-Christian ethic, and under questioning from Burnstein went into the violations of the UN Charter, the Geneva Agreements and other international accords the Vietnam war violated.

The next day, Phillips appeared to be angry that the defense had been able to get such a thorough discussion of the war to the jury. "You got away with cross-examining your own witness yesterday," he told Burnstein, "but see p. 21

# PRESIDIO TRIALS

## SUPPORT SWELLS AS NUMBER OF PRISONERS GOES DOWN

A march which started with a trickle of 13 persons in Carmel February 24 swelled to nearly 800 at a candle-light vigil Tuesday night in San Francisco Civic Center.

An even bigger rally is set to take place March 15 at Marina Green.

This is all coming down because some people outside are not going to let down their brothers inside the Army.

The first three of the so-called 27 Presidio "mutineers" to face the Court Martial Board received an average of 15 years of hard labor. The fourth, Pvt. John Colip got four years last week.

The trial of the next six began Wednesday with their attorneys asking for a change of venue. At BARB press time Military Judge Col. John Lee is still considering the motion.

"I'm not sure what the shorter sentence means," Terry Hallinan, attorney for 16 of the prisoners told BARB. "Maybe the Army is backing down under pressure."

He pointed out that on appeal the sentences of the other soldiers will have to be evened out with

Colip's.

Hallinan feels the lighter sentence is due in part to the strategy of Colip's defense attorney Ron Sypnicki.

"He tried to prove the Army's point of view," Hallinan said. Sypnicki charged the October 14 "mutiny" was fomented by an outside agitator -- namely Terence Hallinan.

Hallinan has vehemently denied the charge.

Last week the number of the Presidio 27 was reduced once again to 24. Pvt. Linden Blake, hospitalized for hepatitis, joined the underground when he escaped through a window at Letterman Hospital. Two other men fled last December and are now in Canada.

When Blake escaped fellow inmates Steve Rowland and Richard Duncan were in the same room.

"They sat this one out because they wanted to stay and fight this thing," Attorney Hallinan said of his two clients.

At the start of Wednesday's trial about 300 supporters of the persecuted GI's were on hand at the Presidio. GI's selected eleven out of the crowd and allowed them to

enter the small courthouse.

"The prisoners say outside demonstrations keep their spirits up," Jeff Hare, a Cabrillo College student and one of those admitted, told BARB. He had talked to Ricky Dodd, one of the six presently on trial.

Tuesday night about 800 demonstrators from all over the Bay Area held an all night candlelight vigil for the imprisoned GI's. The vigil was the culmination of the week long march. By the time the walkers reached San Francisco the small original group had grown to nearly 200.

"It was beautiful," one of the marchers told BARB. "Everywhere people gave us donations of food and money. Many joined the march even for a few miles." He said there was little antagonism along the 150 mile route.

Preparations for the March 15 demonstration at Marina Green sponsored by the GI Association, have been underway for several weeks. A short work meeting will take place at the Free Church (Parker and Fulton) in Berkeley Saturday at 5 p.m.

# PRINCIPLED WAC WINS HONORABLE DISCHARGE

WAC Leonora Blount got her wish, BARB learned at press time Thursday. She's out of the Army. At 1 pm Leonora received her certificate of honorable discharge from the Women's Army Corps.

WAC Leonora Blount would "rather starve than remain in homo haven," she told BARB this week. "Right now I'm a fugitive," she laughed as she entered the BARB office.

Last week in an exclusive account in the BARB the woman soldier said she would never wear her uniform again. Tuesday she repeated her vow before a Summary Court Martial at Oakland Army Base. She was sentenced to 60 days confinement in the WAC barracks.

"My court martial was over so fast," the peace medallion adorned WAC said, "I didn't know what was happening."

According to her Lt. Col. Barbara McNaull, whom she described as "a hostile old woman" was the judge, jury and prosecution. Leonora didn't have a defense counsel. She pleaded guilty to the charge, but feels the sentence is much too stiff.

Earlier brass had assured her she would soon be separated from the Army. She only had to report in daily until she could be processed out. Instead the vengeful WAC heads changed their minds and gave her the maximum sentence. Besides the 60 day confinement Leonora was reduced in rank and fined \$100.

After her sentence, while the brass was discussing what to do with the wayward WAC, Leonora calmly walked away from the base. However, she said she'll turn herself in Wednesday and start a hunger strike.

A small drab room is supposed to be her home for two months. She'll be allowed to leave it only to go to the bathroom. Her husband plans to visit her daily, but even then guards will be inside the room.

"I'm afraid of the guards," the slim dissenter said. "Most guards are dumb lifers. They could be bull dykes for all I know."

During her two year tour of duty she saw young WACs sleeping with scissors and knives under their pillows to ward off drunk lesbians who prowled the barracks.

"I'd rather be in the hospital than face that," she said. "I won't eat until they let me go home with my husband."

Though Leonora is making the hard trip she says it is relatively easy to quit the WACs, "if you don't rock the boat."

Her ordeal has been tough because she went to the BARB ("I only read the BARB," she said, "I wouldn't go to any other paper.") and exposed the reality behind the sweet faced posters of the Women's Army Corps. She doesn't want other young girls to be deceived.

Leonora said last week's story in the BARB has the female lifers all uptight. "It was passed all around the mess hall," she related. "People's heads turned when I walked in." She thinks the brass wants to get her for "slandering" the WAC image.

All this trouble started for the 21 year old WAC when she refused to put on her uniform February 24 in protest against the Vietnam war and the lesbianism she claims is prevalent in the Women's Army.

At the moment Leonora is unsure what's going to come down in the future. She may get an addition to her 60 day sentence for her latest absence from the base.

When she finally kisses off the WACs she hopes to return to school and study law. --J.J.

# GI HUNGER POCKET

Near one of the airforce bases on the coast, a young airforce man in uniform walked into the county welfare office and applied for welfare.

Much surprised, the social worker investigates his claim. The social worker finds the young man and his wife are living off the base in a low cost rented cottage.

He works on the base as a technician, is in good standing, does his work well, and is in no kind of trouble.

His problem is simply that the pay given a young married technical officer does not buy enough for two people to eat. Both the thin young man and his thin young wife spend carefully, cook cheap foods at home eating beans and rice and other "poor man's" food. But they feel hungry all the time and frequently run out of money before the next check.

They lost weight. Friends were taking them out to dinner, and relatives had been sending them food by parcel post. The young officer wants to know why the pay given them by the Federal Government was not enough to feed two people. Was there something he or his wife was doing that was some kind of mistake, he asks.

The social worker checks his rate of pay against her lists of local costs and expenses, rent and

transportation, and confirmed the surprising first estimate. The United States Government was not paying these two young people enough to survive on.

They were hurriedly put on the welfare rolls and given food stamps and access to cheap simple surplus

food. Oatmeal, bags of flour, cheese, the kind of food the poor appreciate.

So there's the bitter truth. Hunger pockets all over--not only in Beaufort, S.C., but even in the military's elite corps.

## PEEK AT NEW LEFT IN PEKING, CHINA

Even Peking has a local New Left to annoy it, reported Dr. Klaus Mahner in a Berkeley campus lecture.

Defining the New Left as any non-manipulated "spontaneous rising of students against the Establishment", Mahner finds it widespread in the Capitalist West, in Communist Europe, and in the Third World of undeveloped countries.

The Chinese NL are die-hard Red Guard students who didn't give up and go home when Mao ended the Cultural Revolution in late '67, restored order, made the people disarm again, and handed power to a New Establishment of "revolutionary committees" dominated by Army and Party.

These SDS types, led by a group in Hunan, in early '68 de-

nounced Chou En Lai as a "bourgeois capitalist dictator". They proposed a China modelled on the 1871 Paris Commune: armed people ruling themselves by electing and RECALLING leaders, who would be paid the same as workers.

Naturally the government is responding about like any government--"You're only hurting your cause this way, That's what all of us Communists say, Nobody likes things the way they are! But you're going too fast, and you are going too far." The left Red Guards get denounced as pseudo-left adventurers and anarchists.

Mahner sharply distinguished this current NL from the liberal free-speech students who led the Hundred Flowers campaign back in 1957.

# SEALE SEEKS PANTHER, TWLF COORDINATION

The Panthers moved this week to shorten the Prelude and get to the Revolution.

Standing next to a TWLF picket line at UC Berkeley, Bobby Seale declared a solidarity pact of Third World revolutionaries as well as white 'Mother Country' radicals.

The purpose of the pact is "to wage a violent insurrection by which the people will overthrow the ruling class of racist capitalists."

Seale, the chairman of the Black Panther Party, hopes to align the

Panthers with the Third World liberation movements on the campuses in order to build a revolutionary front which will bring the whole system down.

On Tuesday Seale tried to move the conflict at Cal onto a more

sophisticated political level by stressing the real reasons why the pigs had been brought on campus.

The pigs are really there, he said, to protect the chemical and biological warfare research which UC does, along with nuclear weapons research.

"The blueprints for the atom bomb were developed right here", he said.

A white 'Mother Country' radical told the press conference that the University is currently seeking ways to put bubonic plague into aerosol containers.

Standing with Chairman Bobby at his campus press conference were several TWLF leaders from SF State and a delegation from the Red Dragon Party of China-town.

Seale announced at the conference that he and other Panthers will leave for Europe in a few days to "meet with other revolutionary students of the world."

Ray "Maasi" Hewett, a leader of the Los Angeles branch of the Party, also got a chance to rap at the conference. He told how he was held in Chicago for attempting to hijack a plane to Cuba.

"After attempting to railroad me," Maasi explained, "they made an offer--we can get you off if you tell us where Eldridge is."

Seale's statement to the press contained a lot of heavy ideological rap. He claimed that the larger issue in the strike at Cal is the University's role of "developing the technical tools to sustain and defend AmeriKKKa, the haven of oppressive capitalism and imperialist exploitation throughout the world."

If the students gained power in the University, he added, then they would throw out the biological warfare research--a prospect the Man cannot allow to materialize.

Another reason, in the Panthers' view, for the police state now existing on campus is this: 'The Police Establishment must maintain locally an image of 'Law and Order', whereby the educational system of this country can escalate its campaign to produce a colossal wave of Third World lackies, and more sophisticated racists, to entrench the capitalist army in the minds and communities of the proletarian masses.'

Seale also attacked the attitude that police 'overreaction' just happens.

"The intensification of pig brutality is not a coincident or an impulsive outburst," he said, "but a vicious calculated strategy" to keep "the Riot Control-War Machine" operating on a "'Business as Usual basis'".

As for the details of Cal's involvement in the biological warfare business, the Panther leader listed several UC projects, including "the invention of very small water droplets containing disease causing organisms such as pneumonic plague, twice as deadly as the bubonic plague."

UC facilities and research teams are working on "other diseases," Seale added, "including Anthrox which can be fatal within 24 hours, and yellow fever transmitted by ticks or mosquitoes."

Chicano students at Merritt College are working on that school's Second ethnic studies department. Due to Black students' efforts Merritt already has a Black Studies Department. Now, Brown students are making their move.

Froben Lozada, chairman of the committee developing curriculum, and Victor Acosta, of the Chicano Students Union, outlined their plans for BARB. They plan 11 courses for Spring and many more next fall. They expect an autonomous Brown Studies Department and hiring of more Chicano faculty.

"We want an education of the whole man," says Lozada. He deplores the current emphasis on the intellectual in education. "Sooner or later the intellectual is used by the system as a tool and pitted against the people of the Third World," he says.

Lozada says, "My education began at the moment I was born

a bastard out of the womb of a 12-year-old mother." Lozada recalls as a five-year-old child in south Texas he went to get an ice cream cone. "Three 'gringos' looked at me and said, 'My, what a nice Mexican boy'. Then they poured ice cold water on my head."

His education has continued along these lines to this day says Lozada. "To peoples of the Third World," he says, "this is part of our education. When we speak of the 'whole man', we speak of bringing in authors who are relevant to Third World people, such as Che Guevara."

Both men agree they don't accept as an authority a sociologist who goes into the barrio for three months with a tape recorder.

"They want to fit an individual into a slot," says Acosta. "We're trying to get away from this logic based on confusion." He says true education should produce, "an autonomous individual who can be his own leader and make his own

decisions." The department won't be oriented toward cultural nationalism. Lozada says, "We must expose causes for poverty, illiteracy, disease, and exploitation that are part of the Third World experience. Then we must move toward eliminating these causes."

Some of the courses for Spring Quarter include: Pre-Columbian Civilizations; Contemporary Latin and Mexican American Movements; Mexican Civilization; Psychology of Racism; Contemporary U.S. Relations with Mexico and Latin America; and a field course in social service in the community.

Acosta notes that Merritt is open to anyone. "We want people off the streets," he says. "If you're interested in 'social change' we have relevant courses."

The classification test for entering students will be given March 13 at 7 p.m. in the auditorium at 5714 Grove Street in Oakland. The Spring Quarter begins April 9.

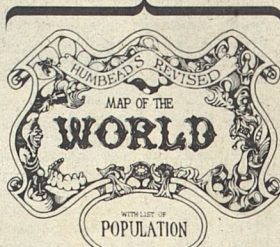

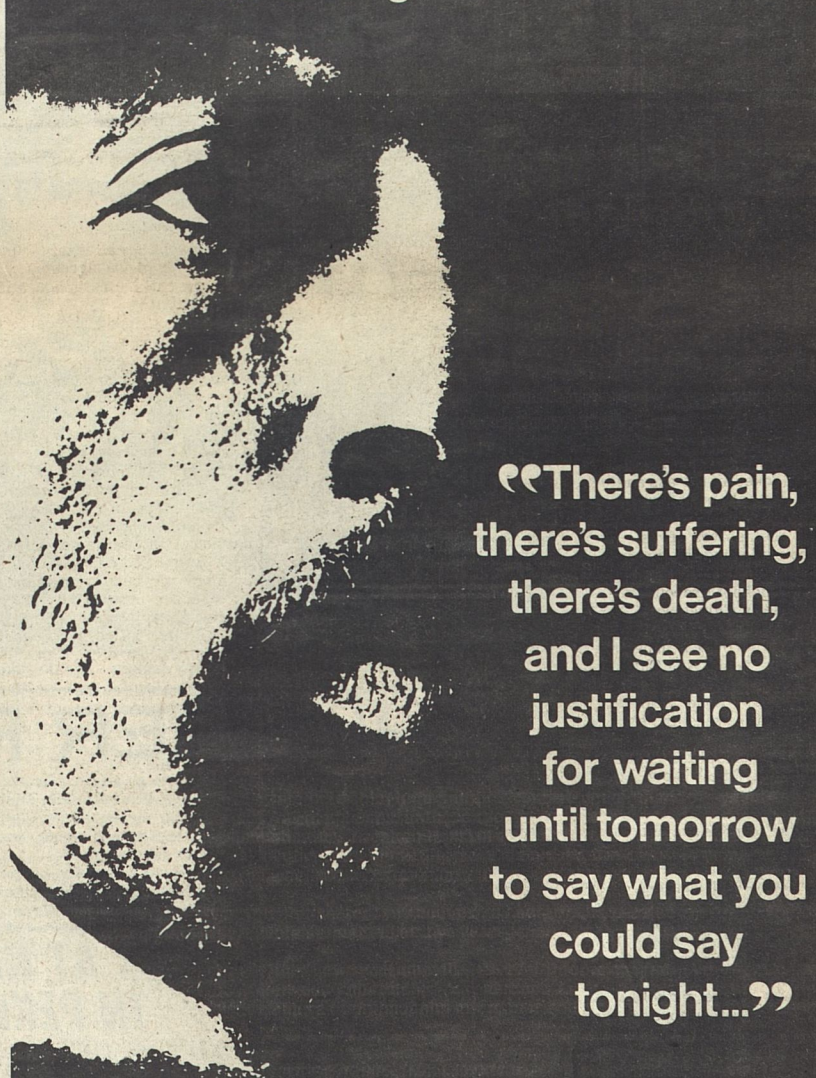

## RED DRAGONS

# WHAT WAS BEHIND BATTLE THAT BEGAN YEAR OF THE COCK

The Red Dragon Party has surfaced in Chinatown.

No paper tiger, members of the Red Dragon Party take credit for the small but startling insurrection in Chinatown last Saturday night in which the San Francisco Pig Department suffered nine casualties.

The Red Dragons can be quickly described as Chinese Panthers. They are prepared to create Yellow Power out of the barrel of a gun.

They have come above ground in order to make coalitions with Asian American and other Third World radicals throughout the Bay Area.

Four leaders of the RDP met with BARB this week in Berkeley. All quotes in this article result from the rap session.

"We want to be able to determine our own destiny in our community economically, socially, psychologically and politically." The Red Dragons have a ten-point program for self-determination which is modeled after the program of the Black Panther Party. Included in the program is a demand for recognition of the People's Republic of China--"Chiang Kai-shek is not our leader, Mao Tse-tung is."

The Party's political head digs the thoughts of Chairman Mao "because they apply to all workers of the world, and the worker in this country is the backbone of the country."

The Dragons find Mao's message that power grows out of the barrel of a gun to be quite relevant and they have armed themselves accordingly.

"Part of the reason we're coming above ground now is that the FBI checked up on us and knows we have guns."

The RDP comes out of Leway, a self-help youth group whose title stands for Legitimate Ways. The change in titles is symbolic of a deeper change in political commitment.

"We're just tired of being exploited, kicked in the ass and stepped on, not only by the white power structure, but by the Uncle Toms passing themselves off as leaders who are exploiting the community."

The majority of the Dragons are "high school dropouts, street-type people in Chinatown." As Leway they took over a pool room which has become a hangout for the street youth in Chinatown.

The poolroom once received a visit from Mafioso Alioto himself. "Alioto walks in, shakes a couple of hands, gets his picture taken and splits. That shows where he's at--he's a pig."

Saturday night's confrontation in Chinatown came about when the Man began to move against the Dragons. The Chamber of Commerce of Chinatown had asked the cats from Leway-Red Dragons to patrol the street fair which was part of the New Year's celebration.

"The pigs came up and harassed some of the members of the Party who were patrolling the street fair--they attacked one and arrested another."

Roving bands of Dragons and other Asian Americans began to retaliate against the police "whenever they were isolated." The Man escalated, sending in the Tac Squad which began to attack everyone within their reach.

"What we actually did was to lead the people against the police that were brutalizing and attacking the elders and young children of the community."

"We led them by pointing out the contradictions between what the police were supposed to do and what they were actually doing."

BARB, thinking that the Dragons might be understating their thing a bit, asked about the cherry bombs which had been dipped in glue and bb's.

"The cherry bombs, molotov cocktails and other weapons were

thought up by individuals in the Party who were enlightened enough to think ahead."

Despite the obvious effectiveness of their retaliation against the pigs on Saturday night, the Dragons consider the small insurrection to be "a military action which was unsuccessful, even though the police were routed."

"When the enemy is isolated in a real life battle condition, the enemy would be annihilated."

The Dragons are quite satisfied with another aspect, however, of the street fair. In the past the profits from the various concessions on the street went out of the community.

This year the bread stayed in Chinatown and "we'd like to commend the Chinatown North Beach Youth Council on the revolutionary act of kicking out some of the exploiters of the community."

In the immediate future the Dragons will concentrate on rapping



with Asian American youth groups about the need for a political-military party to liberate the community.

A coalition with the people involved in the Free University of Chinatown has already been established by the Dragons, and they intend to get together with Asian American radicals in Berkeley. A Berkeley branch of the Party is intended.

The Dragon leaders stressed to BARB their concern not only about the exploitation of the already existing Asian American community in the Bay Area, but also for the problems of the many immigrants coming to the U.S. from Hong Kong. One Dragon compared the immigrants' many problems to those of the Mexican Americans.

Temporary headquarters for the Dragons is the pool room, 615 Jackson Street, "until they blow us up."

The Dragons say proudly that "we're the vanguard of yellow people in this country, the first armed group."

Their fears of American racism are grave. When America went to war with Japan, they point out, the Japanese Americans were put in concentration camps. If the U.S. goes to war with China, "they're going to be putting us in concentration camps."

To prevent that and to liberate their communities, the Dragons hope to build their Party into "an army to be composed primarily of Asian American and Third World radicals."

The Red Dragons want Saturday night to serve as a warning to the power structure.

"If the oppression is kept up, we will escalate our tactics politically and militarily."

# Big Bill Blasts Big "Bomb" Bust

Super Joel, manager of The Store, the only legitimate head shop on the Avenue, was busted at 1:30 am Thursday.

Larry Sandland and Pink Cloud were also arrested at the same time.

The trio are being held on \$13,000 bail charged with possession of a fire bomb and grass.

"This is just another act of police harassment against me and the people who work for me," Big Bill Miller, owner of The Store

charged. "The pigs want me off the street in any way they can."

Miller rapped out how the so called "bombs" found by the pigs are commonly used by many artists in painting abstract splatter type art.

During the dawn raid the pigs ransacked the shop, looking for "bomb making equipment". They found none, and had to be satisfied with sending Pink Cloud's shoes to Sacramento to be investigated as possible dangerous weapons.

"When I'm elected to the City Council", Bill Miller told BARB this week, "I'm first going to do it get rid of about half of these pigs."

Through clenched teeth he added "Starting with whoever is the Chief and then Badge #25, 71, 106, 105, 104, 70, 35, and about 40 others that I know of, then I'll stop and look around a little".

Bill, popular operator of the Store on Tele has had enough dealings with the pigs to know what he's talking about. He ought to, the pig patrol is driving his customers away.

"People just aren't going to come down here and buy anything, or drink a cup of coffee, and get hassled for it" he said, "Sure my business has fallen off, but it has along this whole block."

On this block of Telegraph Avenue the pigs patrol in numbers of three or more, and stop almost everyone to check IDs or make a quick frisk for possible drugs. The candidate feels that there will be more battles along the street, unless it is decided whether the State, county, city or the people who live here have control.

"I'd hate to see someone or even a pig get killed, before the City Council takes some action to stop the harassment of the people in the community" he said.

He also spoke on the idea of police substations, "I think it's a bad thing, I just don't like the thought of being surrounded by pigs, it's better to keep them in one place, so you can keep an eye on them."

Big Bill's intentions of running for office has created mixed reactions. People that try to make the Av as much their home as possible, were overjoyed at the news; the pigs that patrol it shuddered with both fear and anger.

Bill is in need of funds for his campaign. "I had a little money, but gave it to the TWLF Strike bail fund. They needed it more than I did". Bill can be reached at The Store or 849-2499 if you'd like to help.

## WHERE'D MAYORS VANISH?

Both Berkeley and San Francisco are without Mayors. All that is left is the police. Proof?

"The City Council (of Berkeley) should ask the Governor to leave law enforcement to Berkeley authorities," stated attorney Joseph Gordin this week, a candidate for the council.

In San Francisco this week, Mayor Alioto asked for "a little moderation" in the search for the thirty leather-gloved thick necked goons who beat up people supporting bussing at a public meeting of the SF School Board.

Last week, his honor said, "I hate to believe that there were 1000 people present Tuesday night and that the police can't identify anyone."

That's right, Mr. Mayor - they can't come up with ONE goddamned name!

Last week he called for "immediate (same night) arrests." This week he calls for "moderation." Why?

Press reports tell of "cheering" by on-duty cops "in the balcony" as the goons roamed at will on the floor below. These cops made no attempt to come down and "restore law and order."

The goons run the police and the police run the Mayor.

One goon in uniform was "transferred" for macing three black women inside a paddy wagon while they were handcuffed. This Tactical Squad Officer, James Aligo, has been de-tacticalled. His nice goon uniform has been removed and he goes back to "station duty" like any other ordinary cop.

Two other police/goons who felt they had to "protect" an alleged drunken driver (white, female) from the family of the smashed car (black, female) were not even mentioned in the 527 page report by THREE police captains, as far as we can tell.

The "protection" given this white woman was never explained.

This typical SF Police scene resulted in a mass demonstration FOR the police AGAINST the Mayor, led by Teamster Officials and especially by Teamster Jim Rourke.

This same Teamster loudly bragged of what happened at the School Board meeting. He was there but denies any part in the beatings.

Mayor Alioto, last week, had this to say about this pro-cop, anti-bussing leader of "Americans Against Crime, Corruption, and Communism.":

"It seems to me that Mr. Rourke and some of the others knew the men involved. I intend to satisfy myself that the investigation is being pursued vigorously."

The Mayor started out like a lion and ends up like a lamb.

The parallel between the macing in SF and the macing of the Smith family in Berkeley is fantastic. In both cases, mace was used, force was used on blacks for no apparent reason.

Both cases ended in the same manner -- the police admit they were wrong.

This week, attorney Gordin states that "the use of tear gas last Friday resulted in discomfort to innocent citizens...it poses serious policy questions for the city."

# ROYAL RANSOM

Two Burlingame women have offered themselves as ransom for the Presidio 27.

Sali McAllister and Charlene Pope put their future on the line when they failed to appear for sentencing February 27 before San Francisco Federal Judge Harris. Instead they sent a telegram

saying they would remain in hiding until Secretary of Army Stanley Resor launches a full scale investigation of the illegal conditions in the Presidio stockade.

Arrest warrants for the two fugitives have been issued. Recently they were found guilty of destroying government property. Their "crime" was pouring red paint on a US flag October 23 at the Presidio to protest the injustice of the conscription laws.

"They're splendid" the women's pastor Rev Dick York of the Free Church told BARB. "I support their stand completely."

"When they were baptised into the church they promised to serve Christ's Army and no other," Rev York recalled. "They are doing what is right."

US Commissioner Goldsmith called the two women psychologically screwed up.

"The makers of war, keepers of stockades, and judges of injustice are the sick ones," Rev York retorted. "In czarist Russia they committed those who opposed the government."

The two females have risked increased sentences for their stand against military injustice. Rev York has promised them sanctuary in the Free Church.

"But right now not even Sali's husband knows where they are," he said.

Meanwhile, charges against Rev York have been dropped for protesting when federal agents sought to arrest the two women while he was conducting a religious service in front of the Federal building January 20. He had been arrested for "wilfully obstructing a federal official."

## BLACKS RAISE THE ANKH

The crux ansata shimmered March 4 on the black helmets of black men guarding an SF School Board meeting from white racist goonery.

This heretical cross, known as the ankh to ancient Egyptians, resembles a stick-figure man. Ankh symbolizes life, and therefore has become a common emblem for hippies and for the Elysium nudist group.

Our black protectors were the Western Addition Black Security Guards, an agency of the African Descendants' Provisional Government, 1271-A McAllister, SF. Ankh is the national symbol of their black republic, a spokesman told BARB. For them it means "eternal life and resurrection."

He commented that hippies had adopted ankh as a "peace symbol" after the Provisional Government popularized it through mass media. He didn't seem surprised when BARB mentioned the nudist angle.

Ankh lifesymbol brings it all together. Like Timothy Leary says, you just know a black government would have to raise the hedonic index.

Make life, not Wasperity.

# WHAT WORKERS WON

Strikers at the Standard Oil refinery in Richmond voted to go back to work for Big Daddy this week.

They didn't get everything they wanted--but almost to a man they will tell you that the settlement is a victory. The company only came up with an average increase of 58 cents (over two years)--14 cents below the union's original demand, but 20 cents more than the company's first arrogant offer.

But, far more importantly, as the oil workers put it, "They (the bosses) didn't get any heads." Standard had wanted to fire three of the most militant pickets and establish their right to fire anyone at any time for anything--or nothing. But the guys held out until the company agreed to give the three their jobs back while charges against them are submitted to arbitration.

The strikers showed the company that, despite brutal police strikebreaking and almost unbelievable bribing of scabs (some of whom were making \$300 a week), they could stay out for two months and come back stronger. The momentum this time around is exactly the opposite of 1948, when the union was far more powerful before the strike, had a much higher number of refinery workers organized, but was crushed by the company.

Meanwhile, the workers at the four Chevron Chemical plants--part of the same giant Richmond complex as the refinery--are still out on strike. The issue at Chevron--is an even more blatant attempt at union-busting by the Rockefeller corporation.

The Chevron workers have had a union shop for a number of years. Now the company is trying to force them to give it up. One militant woman worker at Chevron told me "Hell, we'll never go back without a union; we'd be fools to do it."

Standard is using the same tactic as its imperialist buddies are

employing in Vietnam: if they can crush the resistance of the people of Vietnam they can hope to demoralize the people of all of southeast Asia.

The success of the Chevron workers in keeping their union intact will keep up the morale of all refinery workers and discourage lesser corporate conglomerates from trying the same union-busting tactics.

And the fact that Standard did not succeed in firing the most militant pickets, will inspire the other workers to risk more the next time. Many students and movement people who came out to the refinery found it hard to understand the hesitancy of the oil workers in their own strike.

First, there are a number of younger guys, especially at the Chevron plant, whose arrest record during the strike stacks up against the best of our brothers on the campus.

Take Terry Tornquist, for example, who was fired by Chevron 9 months ago. His case was still in arbitration when the strike started, and he had held several other jobs in the interim; but when the strike began, he went to the union and volunteered for the front lines--"Because that's where my people are."

He is now fighting as many as 8 charges, ranging from disturbing the peace, to contempt of the court's injunction against militant picketing, to felony charges of assault with a deadly weapon.

True, most of the old workers, were afraid to jeopardize their jobs by engaging in militant acts before the ever-present company cameras. But these guys are not afraid of the cops. 15 or 20 of them volunteered one day to join a picket line of teachers and students at State.

"They'll be a lot of cops there," I mentioned to one of the oil workers. "Hell with the cops," he laughed. "They can't fire me over at San Francisco State."

The great majority of the refinery workers who stuck it out, and the Chevron workers who are still out, feel they took a real step forward by joining forces with the students. They were under a lot of pressure--from leaders of other unions and even the Governor's office--for making and sticking with the mutual aid pact with the AFT and the Third World Liberation fronts at State and Cal.

But they know that the students, along with contingents of Longshoremen have provided crucial leverage against Standard.

Next Wednesday the Longshoremen will be coming out to shut down the Chevron plant. Everyone who has any reason for hating Rockefeller and Standard Oil should come on out.

It's a gas to watch the pigs when the Longshoremen are there, anyway. Last week there were 25 students and 25 Longshoremen at the main gate, and the cops just sat in their cars. "It's just like last year, when we helped out some guys on strike in San Francisco," one Longshoreman explained. "We smashed up some cars and beat up some scabs, and the cops didn't do anything but shake their heads. Afterward one honest cop came up to me and said, 'Look there are only 1200 cops in San Francisco and there are 6000 Longshoremen'."

Meanwhile, the boycott of all Standard and Chevron products (including Ortho products) will continue until the Chevron workers win the right to keep their union shop. (The union itself has agreed not to boycott Standard Oil products, but that is just a legal technicality that shouldn't discourage anyone else.)

And, by the way, if you happen to see your friendly Standard Oil recruiter on your local campus (or anywhere else) do like our brothers at San Jose State last week, and treat him with the same respect that you showed the men from Dow Chemical and the CIA.

# YOU SAY YOU WANT A "REVILYUSHIN" WELL, YOU KNOW . . .

I died defending Che against the Bolivian C.I.A. Where the revolution was, I was. Where it needed a martyr, I died. Where it needed a hero, I triumphed.

# HEMSLEY'S COURT-IN

SAN JOSE (IWB)--Mr. Kirby J. Hensley, President of the Universal Life Church, Inc., was hailed into the San Jose Municipal Court, Monday.

The charge: violation of the California Education Code Sec. 29007. It says that you can't issue or confer a degree without meeting certain standards.

The complaint was made by a San Jose police sergeant and filed by the deputy D.A., Richard N. Salle. The San Jose cop had mailed in his money for the Doctor of Divinity Degree, had received it and the lessons offered, and, as part of the plot, brought the charge.

Some background: Kirby J. Hensley, now 57, came to California from his native North Carolina in 1930. He had been involved with the Baptist Church, the Church of God, and some churches of his own founding in the Bay Area. Some years ago he went into religion full-time.

He founded the Universal Life Church, Inc., and its charter was duly recorded on May 2, 1962. An impressive, diploma-like thing was sent to him by the Secretary of State; it is so worded that it can mean as much or as little as you wish.

The headquarters for this operation are located in Modesto, (1766 Poland Road, where the San Joaquin and Tuolumne Rivers copulate), situated on a two acre plot containing a herd of chickens, a couple of cows and a horse.

Rev. Hensley isn't a fire-and-brimstone man. He doesn't clutch the book with one hand and point to Hell with the other. His way of going at it is to sit by a beat up card table full of mail and rap about anything...politics, taxes, the national debt, you name it.

You can be a minister for free. Requests for the minister document come in at the rate of 2,000 a day. For \$20 you get some lessons and your Doctorate. Mail pull for this action runs about 20 per day. At present, Rev. Hensley estimates the minister count at 30,000 and the D.D.s at 1,200-1,400. I guess there aren't any sheep, just ministers.

So here we were in San Jose on March 3, at 1:30, the place and time posted for the arraignment. The judge, Louis C. Doll, was late. 45 minutes late. He

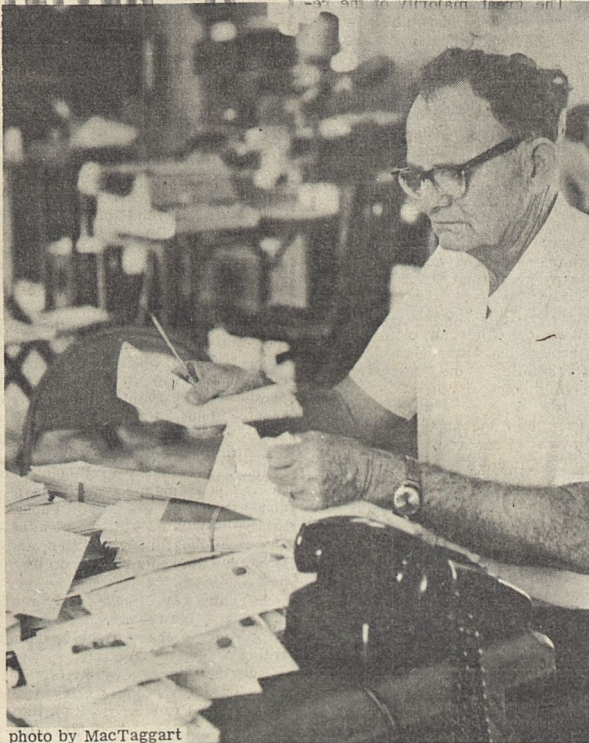

got rid of a number of cases in a few minutes and then came to the Hensley affair.

Judge Doll had a heavy calendar and had the thing sent to another court and another judge, Wm. Harris Jr. Judge Harris, for reasons not disclosed, sent all of us to yet ANOTHER court, presided over by Judge Tielh. (Pronounced teal). This was the end of the buck-passing and poor Judge Tielh had to hear the whole thing.

By this time we had picked up quite a gathering. Every time we were sent to another courtroom we took the whole audience with us. Beards and beads were everywhere. What had started as a simple arraignment turned into a court-in.

Mr. Bienvenu, Hensley's attorney, was cool. His logic was understandable, even to me. Some interesting things developed:

1. Neither he nor his client

had ever seen a copy of the complaint.

2. Bienvenu (Hensley's counsel) had served a demurrer on the D.A. just prior to the arraignment. It turns out that the defense is that the alleged misdeed was not committed within the jurisdiction of the San Jose Municipal Court. (I talked with Mr. Bienvenu before our first appearance in the first courtroom and remarked that this was the nuttiest damn case I had ever heard of. He agreed.)

Mr. Bienvenu and the prosecutor conducted a fairly unemotional dialogue with the judge looking from one to the other in the manner of one who watches a tennis match. The upshot of the whole thing was that the demurrer was overruled and a trial date of May 5, 9:00 A.M. was set.



## Neo-American Church

On Easter Day, April 6, 1969, The Chief Boo Hoo of the Neo-American Church, Art Kleps, will openly distribute the psychedelic peyote to members of his church and others in Washington, D.C.

A temporary church shrine, in the form of a rug bearing inscriptions identifying the participants will be unrolled in front of the Justice Department and the sacraments openly distributed and ingested thereon.

As is well known, the FDA, which formerly had jurisdiction, has granted one church, the Native American Church of the Indians, permission to use peyote while denying the right to all others, in clear violation of the First Amendment guarantees against governmental interference and discrimination in religious matters.

Legal and financial aid to all arrested participants will be extended by the Neo-American Church. Any NATIVE American Church member who wishes to join with us will also have travel and living expenses provided, (if a Native American Church member is arrested, the charges against him will presumably be dismissed on the grounds of his church affiliation!).

It is our hope that this service will be ecumenical and the church affiliations and religious designations shown on the rug represent

our highest hopes for a broad representation of the psychedelic religious community, however, if no others volunteer, the service will be conducted with Neo-American Church members only.

Obviously, our objective is to present the courts with the clearest possible test base - which is in the interest of everyone involved, including the government and the tax-payers.

Note - Dr. Leary has expressed hostility to this operation (he may be contacted at 841-5228 in Berkeley, California) for reasons best known to himself. It is our feeling, however, that peyote distributed in a communion service will provide us with a more meaningful legal confrontation than the series of marijuana "busts" continuously generated by his operations.

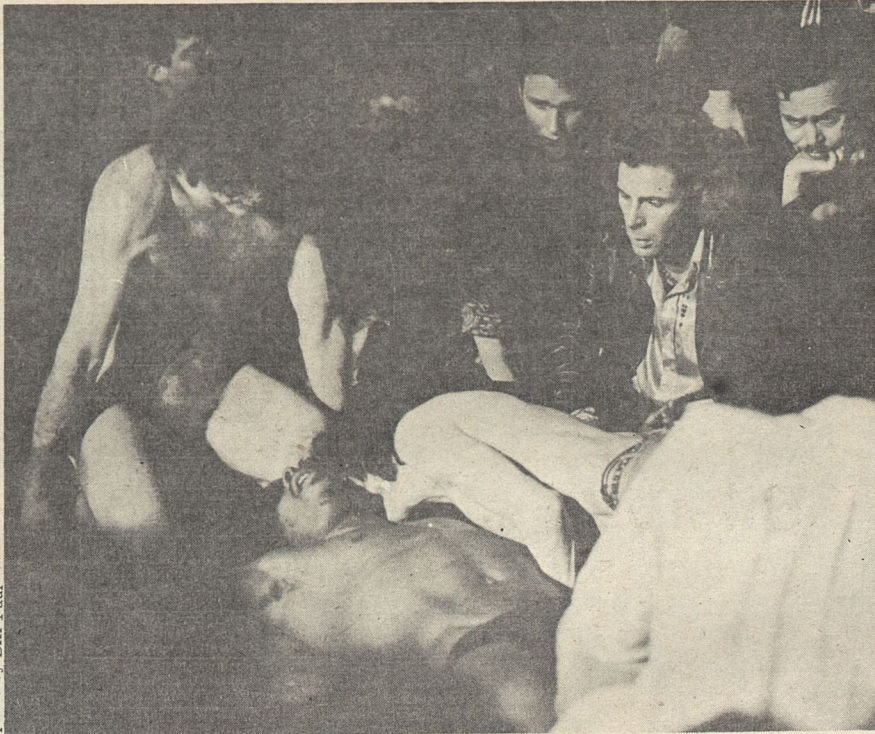

What I think about a filmmaker's films is colored by what I think about him. I cannot make a separation between a man and his work. When I was doing the festival judging shit I would award prizes to everybody I knew and felt any love for (for whom I felt and love), and then to those who made good films.

Only by freely admitting that I was no judge at all was I able to function as a judge.

I spoke to Gene Youngblood who does the film reviews for the L.A. Free Press, and he told me that he really respected a film critic who made films. Gene had it backwards. Only, I'm not a critic, not a reviewer. No even.

A rundown on how I feel about you, filmmakers:

**HERB JEAN DE GRASSE.** Obviously nuts, but harmful only to himself. He shouts a lot, and stomps around. He is very beautiful, but must be avoided whilst the full moon comes. His films are so crude that the word doesn't apply.

A very powerful filmmaker near the beginning of discovery. **VENUS**, his last film, and a short multiple image film he showed me, which I don't think is in release, indicate more poetic power than we ever dreamt was locked inside his mad skull.

**MICHAEL STEWART.** I would be much happier not to be near him. He is driven and desperate, and in some ways, to much on my frequency. His latest films show amazing growth. He works a lot in 8, blowing up to 16. He does extensive re-photography, or optical printing, which is fast becoming one of the hallmarks of the new Bay Area movement. His latest films, like **FREEFORM**, are superb and lovely beyond words. I feel really good about what he's doing.

**BRUCE CONNOR.** I have a sort of admiring hatred for Bruce. There is no hope of our ever getting along. If your yoga is astrology, I'm sure you could find an excuse in the zodiac. Despite

the fact that I'd like to punch him in the mouth whenever I get close enough (I wouldn't go out of my way), I dig his films. **VIVIAN** is harnessed exuberant loving energy.

Say, this Vivian is the same chick in Andrew Meyer's **MATCH GIRL**. What a difference though. Meyers is a terrible filmmaker, and Connor is a great filmmaker. That's the difference. I like Connor's approach to film, which cannot be described here, because of lack of insight.

**BEN VAN METER.** Ben is a perfectly lovely humanbeing, and a terrible filmmaker. His films make me angry because he refuses to edit. I want to take his films and edit them. In Ben's case, editing would mean simple pruning. I like two or three of his films very much, but have a feeling of general hatred for what he does. I dig parts of **GARDEN** (actually most of it is wonderful), and **POON TANG**, and **3-D NUDE**

MODELS, but hell...it's very complicated.

I take it back Ben. You are not a terrible filmmaker. Go cut out some of 3-D NUDE MODELS and you'll have a good film. Cut out about three quarters of it, Ben. Go do it right away. Nobody can love all his footage all of the time.

**BOB BIORGIO.** Never did a straighter guy come on more crooked. Bob must be stoned all the time, and anybody who can stand to be stoned all the time can't be all bad. He appears to be satanic, only because he looks like Satan, but his films look like they were made by Rodin (who as you probably know, isn't usually thought of as having been satanic).

Bob gets very close to the human condition, whatever the fuck that is. I'll tell you what that means. His sensitivity and mine match a good part of the time.

Presently he is enjoying the winter with his loving wife and stupid dog in snowbound N.Y. State. I left him out of a list of Bay Area filmmakers, and I need to make up for it. Bob Giorgio is a Bay Area filmmaker, whose astounding performance as Vulcan in DeGrasse's **VENUS** has thrilled dozens of people. (It's sort of a satanic Vulcan.)

**BOB NELSON.** This guy is tall and built a house once, and didn't sign his name on a brass plaque on the side of it. If I built a house with my bare hands I would put such a plaque on it. By the way, Bob's hands show the suffering of the home builder, which is entirely different from the suffering of the home owner. One is a liberating experience, the other is soul death.

I have neglected to write about his best work for reasons that escape me. He has a cavalier attitude about filmmaking, that I dig more and more. **THE AWFUL BACKLASH** (which he narrates) is just fantastically good, a work of pure vision. **CATCHING THE ASIAN CARP** is the ultimate statement on the subject. Bob's **THE GREAT BLONDINO** went over, around here, like a lead balloon.

**BARRY SPINELLO.** I met him once, and he wears very baggy pants. He is very amusing. Weird statement. Barry Spinello is very amusing. His hand drawn films are the most advanced work ever done

# BERKELEY RIGHTISTS UPTIGHT AND SPLIT

The lawnmower gang in Berkeley is so splintered it will go underground.

After a night long squabble Monday, Concerned Berkeley Citizens (CBC) decided to give only "secret" support to their darlings in April's Municipal elections. Dissension and factionalism came to the fore as a hundred rightists met at Emerson School Auditorium. The CBC failed to endorse a single candidate openly.

"Our endorsement can be the kiss of death" a voice from the floor sounded during the hot debate. The vote was more than two to one against public support of any candidate.

The police boosters had called the "mass" meeting to broaden their base and soften their image. Over 600 people were phoned, including many in West Berkeley. But not a black face was to be seen at the gathering.

Four candidates were scheduled to speak before the vote of endorsement was taken. Councilman Sweeney failed even to show up. Councilman Swingle was nearly birched off the platform for being too "liberal". Borden Price, a moderate right wing candidate, received only lackadaisical applause. Even Tom McClaren, a super roter for the cops, couldn't draw much of a raise from the hard-faced crowd.

After the vote of no confidence in any of the candidates, and the CBC steering committee itself, 40 hard core members remained behind. Chairman Ward Cobb said this was not the end of the line. It was decided to give secretly financial aid to several "suitable" candidates, but to refrain from any more public utterances.

# LIVERMORE GROUPS WAGE ACRONYMIC BATTLE FOR LIFE

Poor Livermore.

An arrogant school board working with the splendid cooperation of an incompetent administration has lowered the public schools here to the level of Hog, Alabama. The 2 1/2 to 1 defeat of the Human Relations ordinance on Feb. 18 proves that Livermore has the racist mentality to match.

The idea for a Human Relations Commission came from a newly formed organization called ACCORD which was created after the assassination of Martin Luther King. ACCORD is an acronym and stands for A Coordinating Committee to Overcome Racial Division.

ACCORD asked the Livermore City Council to set up a Human Relations Commission which after lots of talk, arguing and hand-wringing the council finally did.

The Human Relations Commission was to go into effect on Nov. 28, 1969. It didn't though because an assortment of right wing idiots and racist Birchers submitted a petition with 3,200 signatures requesting a referendum vote which is what they got on Feb 18th when the commission was defeated by a margin of 2 1/2 to 1.

Not to be outdone by ACCORD the blatant racists had banded together and given birth to their own acronym. They named it RAPPORT. Response Against Poor Planning on Racial Tension).

The ordinance lost for several reasons. First of all Livermore is a lily white racist town full of fear and brimming over with boredom. That's the main reason. Another is that people are sick over the school mess, the deficit originally announced at \$500,000 is climbing toward \$700,000 and will eventually hit one million.

Anyhow the people are not going to give established authority anymore power or money as a result of what they've already done with the school system. The atmosphere here is difficult to describe. The problem is not only a financial

one. It's one of ineffable frustration.

The money mess wanders on and on and nobody does anything about it. Neither one of Livermore's newspapers have bothered to dig into the story. They're both content to merely report board meetings with an occasional feeble editorial while the story of the century for Livermore goes untold.

Local attorneys even act scared of it. The only hope seems to be the upcoming school board election on April 15. And even that won't be enough.

Another reason the Human Relations Commission was defeated is that Livermore has suddenly become a suburb and is filling up with new, expensive tracts built exclusively for people who work in Oakland and San Francisco. The houses are so expensive that the monthly payments alone prohibit anyone who lives and works in Livermore, outside of doctors and dentists, from buying them.

Also the Human Relations ordinance was a gutless thing. It would have empowered the City Council to appoint an 11 member commission, each member to serve a 4 year term. 50% of the members were to come from minority groups. Livermore's largest minority groups at present are Mexican-Americans and Filipinos.

The commission didn't have the power to do anything but encourage people to sit down and talk. Many Mexican-Americans were apathetic about the commission and told me they weren't going to vote one way or the other.

And no wonder. It probably wouldn't have changed their lives one bit. Nevertheless, a Human Relations Commission for a town like Livermore would have been a small but decent beginning.

Despite a lot of self-righteousness from both sides during the campaign, the following sign appeared on a telephone poll the day before the election: We Believe in Human Relations; Any Other Kind is Sodomy. Maybe there's hope for Livermore after all.

# FUB GETS THE BOOT

The Free University of Berkeley has been kicked out of all Berkeley Public Schools.

FUB cannot use any of the city's school facilities because of the "mess" left behind at King School after the overflowing Leary lectures. That's the charge made by the uptight Administrative Office of the Berkeley Unified School District in a letter sent to Carol Small of FUB Tuesday.

According to Carol custodians at King school said the mess in the auditorium was no worse after Leary's lectures than following other gatherings. "I don't know why they're down on us," Carol said. "This really screws us up," she told BARB. She pointed out there are very few large places besides school auditoriums in Berkeley.

She plans to see city school officials immediately to find out what's coming down.

FUB still has the problem of a teacher shortage. The need is especially great in courses on survival and encounters. Those interested in teaching should call 841-6794 between 2-7 pm or go to the office at 1703 Grove street.

The Reverend also announced the Free Church is no longer holding its celebrations at Trinity Methodist church. The regular Friday night services are now held at the Parker and Fulton Street sanctuary.

# SF STATE MILD NOW BUT HOT SEASON NIGH

The action at San Francisco State was as mild as the weather last Monday, but the long, hot summer is coming closer.

Monday was the day chosen to show community support at SF State. The picket line had grown to old proportions and lines of cops were separating marchers from the inner campus. It looked like student energy was rebounding despite the AFT decision to return to work.

Then from the administration fortress the P.A. system started intoning the latest injunction: #599911 issued by Judge Arnold. No more than five pickets, no obstructing, harassing, detonating, destroying...

Despite the impotency of previous injunctions (the AFT obeyed some of them) the presence of the long lines of fuzz and the threat of being held in contempt of court dispersed the pickets.

This is the mildness of the student strike at San Francisco State this balmy week.

Roger Alvarado, appearing relaxed and undaunted, says the Third World is "regrouping" and formulating new tactics.

San Francisco doesn't have just one school to worry about. Many high schools have been "visited" by the Tactical Squad as minority problems surface. Despite this general educational crisis, acting president Hayakawa is still calling strike leaders "self-centered, power-hungry individuals," "hooligans", and "gangsters." He went so far (in US News and World Report) as to accuse Associated Student leaders of instituting a vast patronage system with student body funds. The man spins some big tales.

No one appeared to notice a very Freudian slip that Hayakawa

made in his speech to the faculty on February 14. He was describing his Hawaiian fishing trip aboard a motor sampan.

"I had a line out and started catching Opelu...They were plentiful...The Captain saw the school of Opelu...He ordered out a skiff and...net.

"...we began surrounding and catching Opelu not one at a time, but 453 in a single sweep. The sight made me so homesick, I started out for San Francisco that night."

Shortly before the trip, cops requested by Hayakawa had busted about that many students at the famous illegal rally. Candor, candor.

Monday is a target date for reopening the campus cafeteria. It is possible that this will be a rallying point for TWLF energies.

The Fontana Apartments thrust up from the Marina in two huge walls of glass, blocking off the bay view from the surrounding buildings.

Somewhere in that plastic palace is a man who is laying his life on the line for his principles. His position as a newspaper editor would have exempted him from personally endangering himself. We are on our way to see if he really means it.

Ruth Newhall meets us in the lobby and takes us up to the seventh floor apartment she and her husband apologetically call home when they work in San Francisco. "Glorified motel" is how they put it.

She and Scott Newhall were married while sophomore art students at U.C. Berkeley. Scott can trace his family back to 1630 and he publishes a newspaper in a town that bears his family name, Newhall, California.

Today, he is Executive Editor of the largest and most influential newspaper in northern California, the San Francisco Chronicle. He can use the power of that position in any kind of battle, but he chose to place his neck on the block for a principle. We had come to find out if so, and why.

Ruth plays the perfect hostess in the tiny but opulent apartment. We feel uncomfortable so far from the ghettos and streets and jails where we usually work. Her efficient movements and carefully chosen words reveal a strong individuality, a woman to be respected. As we settle down to meet her husband, The Editor, she apologizes for the apartment's small size. We learn later they have homes in southern California and Mexico.

Editor Newhall limps in from the bedroom. He has a wooden leg, result of an infection during his youth. "I don't know what you boys want, but ask anything," he begins. He sits down silhouetted against the lights of the Golden Gate seven stories below.

"One of your photographers was badly beaten the other day and you wrote an editorial daring the men who did it to come and get you. Did you mean it," we ask, "or are there guards in the closet?"

Vincent Maggiora 24-year old Chronicle photographer, was covering last Tuesday night's meeting of the San Francisco Board of Education at Nourse Auditorium. The Board was discussing integration and busing of students from several local schools and the meeting was jammed with determined parents, both pro and con.

A line of burly men wearing arm-bands began to surround the audience and shout at the Board. When they grabbed and beat two men selling the newspaper

of the Progressive Labor Party Maggiora moved in to take pictures. They grabbed him too and beat him so badly "he didn't make sense for three days," Scott Newhall told us.

Witnesses said police at the meeting cheered while the thugs beat Maggiora and three others.

That was the story . . . but it wasn't the first time a Chronicle man had been hurt on the job. Why did editor Newhall react this time and in this way?

He told us in the exclusive interview that he reacted spontaneously when he heard how badly Maggiora had been hurt. He was talking to two other people at the time and in mid-conversation stopped to dictate an editorial. He told his secretary to run it "without even re-reading it." In it he dared the thugs to face him down in his office or catch him alone as he left work. He also included his home address to show he meant business.

And he assured us there were no body guards near or around him anywhere.

"When I heard the boy had been beaten so badly, I made my decision," Newhall declared, "I will clean this thing up or I will donate what is left of this alabaster body of mine in the attempt.

"If they are going to kill me, they are going to kill me," he said, "The only way I can put them down is to show them I don't give a shit."

Then he added, "I translated Vince into thousands and thousands of kids today and I can't let them grow up in a land where this tyrannical treatment is the law--it must not be permitted to be the heritage of our generation."

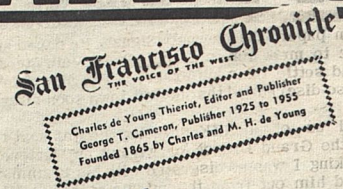
Scott Newhall, "was just as scared inside as anybody, but someone had to face up to this. At first I acted to protect our own people but I also did it to put an end to this hoodlumism."

He not only gave time and place for his appointment with, quite possibly, death, he even gave phone numbers in case the hoods wanted to alter the terms. So far despite many threats by phone, no luck in shaking loose a thug. The threats? "They don't bother me," Newhall says.

But he has meticulously kept this announced routine. Last Friday he came home early to talk to a Time Magazine reporter. The interview lasted three and a half hours. Then the Time reporter who was looking for the story of a fighting western editor told Newhall he felt it deserved deeper treatment. Later, he said, later.

Scott then had Ruth drive him back to work so he could leave at 8 p.m. as promised.

When no one had appeared by Monday he went to the

**LAGUILLO IN ACTION**



**HE HAD PRACTICE**

Al Laguillo, one of the group of Teamsters who have been implicated in the SF School Board "goonings," was one of the most active combatants at another meeting brawl January 5.

Then the organizational meeting of SMART (Silent Majority Against Revolutionary Tactics) erupted in a free-for-all. I was there in disguise.

Once the fighting had begun between supporters of the SF State strike and right-wing toughs, I noticed that one of the most energetic brawlers was a short, fat man with a mustache and swarthy complexion. I got a picture of him slugging it out on the stage.

Several times when the fighting died down he piled into the radicals and started it up again. It was more

than self-defense.

After the brawl was over he came off the stage and shouted to no one in particular "we've got our own organization!"

He had come down front along with a tall, greying man whom I called "old grey" in the article. The two had been sitting together in the audience. Old Grey turned out to be Jim Rourke of the Teamsters Local 85 and head of "Americans Against Crime, Communism and Corruption."

Rourke was apparently the organizer of that SMART meeting. The student speakers converged on him then and talked with him as if he was their leader.

The short man was Laguillo, number two man in Americans Against and owner of two gyms where SF cops practice. He appeared at a press conference last Monday to back up Rourke.

Teamsters Hall where Local 85 was having a press conference. He hoped to meet the goons in person. "I can't dislike them," he said of the men he saw there. "I like human beings, that's one of my greatest weaknesses. I know they have been indoctrinated -- brainwashed -- by Rourke, their leader."

He rolled a silver coin in his hand as he described the encounter. "After the press conference, I went into the back room with them alone. An Examiner reporter had accidentally smashed my finger in a door when I entered and I was bleeding like a pig. One of the men said to me, 'My God, have they gotten to you already?'"

From then on, Newhall said, there was no sense of menace while he talked with the Teamsters, many of whom he described as Spanish-speaking. But he added that although he felt in his bones he was talking to some of the men who beat Maggiora, there was no real exchange of information.

"The bunch at Teamster Local 85 (the waterfront local) are basically a Nazi-like proletariat," Newhall explained. "Rourke must somehow be gotten out of there, I know that would improve things," he said.

"The Latinos," he continued, "are jealous of the blacks and have been brainwashed by Rourke to believe that integration will corrupt their children."

Newhall believes his passible Spanish and fondness of Latinos that he gained while traveling throughout Mexico helped him understand and communicate with the men involved. But although, he said, he told them they could just "sing a few songs" and talk things out, Rourke and the shadow of police complicity were a roadblock.

"The more I got into the problem, the more I felt the problem was in the police department, and the Teamsters are just a symptom," he continued. "People have been calling and telling me bits of information, but they won't give their names because they know they will get no protection. I can hear their wives in the background crying 'they'll kill you,'"

"But somebody had to face up to this. I knew that I must try to put an end to this hoodlumism even though many friends told me it was dangerous."

We asked if anyone had offered to protect him. City Supervisor Tony Francois offered him "all the guards you need," he answered, and a group from Haight-Ashbury offered to guard him. Newhall said he refused them all and waited alone.

This isn't the first time Newhall has refused for answers to challenges or courted danger. He issued a challenge

once in his own paper, the Newhall Signal. He dared an outspoken critic to meet him in the middle of Main Street at high noon and settle their differences. The man didn't show, and was so discredited that he left town soon afterwards.

He also told us of a KKK meeting he was sent to cover. "When the Grand Dragon or wizard or whatever was through talking I was so disgusted with his grammar that I challenged him out from the middle of that hostile crowd. A member of the superior race, I said, shouldn't use a double negative.

Just before the events which made him write last Wednesday's editorial, which he calls an emergency tactic to discredit the thugs and end the violence, Newhall was under doctor's orders to take a rest because of high blood pressure. He put off that rest five days to be available to any goon with the necessary guts.

He began the ordered vacation this Tuesday, but while he is gone top people on the Chronicle are sorting the facts of the corruption in San Francisco's police department.

Newhall traces the recent problems of police violence to Chief Cahill, whom he calls a "tortured man... a captive like the kings of the middle ages -- it's just getting to be too much for him."

The real root of the city's and the State's problems are the governor, according to Newhall. He traces racism, police violence, and the campus wars right to Sacramento.

"The Governor has created the unrest in the state, not controlled it, and I think he is doing it in a very surgical way," Newhall explained, saying that he feels Reagan is creating enemies in the state in order to discredit them and make himself look like the protector of the middle-class racists who put him in office.

Newhall paused and put his knotted hands together in front of his face while he looked out over the bay. His wooden leg leaned at an odd angle against some stacks of paintings on the floor. A marble-like mirrored wall reflected every sag and line of his tired face in duplicate. His wife sat down across from him, her eyes alert.

"I suppose it is possible," he began, "to construct a man of leather, stuff him with sawdust, put a tape recorder in his mouth and run him for Governor... they did it and won... and I have never seen a public official so ill-informed in my life. His press conferences are public spectacles."

We asked Newhall what he thinks about the situation at Berkeley. "I am more interested in how many phony hippies there are inciting the kids to start riots at the direct orders of private and public groups for their own gains," he said. "There are people in this administration who are unscrupulous enough to wreck the university this way just to establish themselves better in power and I think they are doing it."

"My heart bleeds for the kids," he went on, "because many of them are sincere in trying to relate their education to real life. But the governor has created the unrest."

Newhall stopped for a moment. Ruth Newhall joined in saying she couldn't find enough bad things to say about Reagan and the people who live in southern California that elected him. The state is roughly divided by a Reagan-Murphy line, she said, about in the center, and south of that line was where Reagan's support lay.

Ruth is an ex-journalist. She covered Berkeley for five years for the Chronicle during the loyalty oath controversy. "A sad era," she said.

We hear the coins in Newhall's hands go "klink" as he formed the next sentence.

"The governor hasn't had an idea of his own in several decades. Even on Death Valley Days he read a script. The reason a man like that could be elected in this state lies in the influx of lower class whites to southern California. Our administration is a result of that influx of hillbillies, rednecks, or whatever you wish to call them. They have made southern California unbelievable.

"In fact, California may well become an absolutely moronic illiterate state. Beer and TV are the main attractions -- they may even have replaced sex in the San Fernando Valley.

"Because of these people, you can get elected to anything with simplistic slogans. I was going to run against Lt. Governor Reinecke on the sole platform that I stand for a return to the America I knew as a boy, and although you can take that many ways, I would have won."

Earlier Newhall had compared the war at Berkeley with the war in Vietnam. He said the governor had turned the university into "a Stalag 17, just like a German concentration camp." Newhall has always hated violence and the war has struck him deeply, down into his basic beliefs about his country.

"I used to be proud I was an American when I went anywhere in the world. Now," he said slowly, "I wish I had a different passport. I see America now in Vietnam in the same role as Hitler in Czechoslovakia in W.W. II. It is a war that is not a war, fought by an army that is not an army, for slogans nobody gives a shit about except a few military and those that accept their slogans.

"I would have sacrificed my life for the principles we fought for in W.W. II, but I cannot accept Vietnam, it is a tragedy and it has destroyed this country. It is the greatest sociological change affecting America today."

Newhall had said many times during the interview that he did not want or like violence, yet he applauded World War II. When we asked him about his part in the war he said he tried like hell to get in but he wouldn't take him.

So he went to front lines as a correspondent. He called it "my war," as if it was his personal battle. The fighter showed through the lines and sags and slumped body, a fighter who only fought on his own terms in a battle of ideas. He stressed over and over again that one of the things about the goon attack that upset him the most was the use of violence to obtain ends.

The conversation had drifted to one of Newhall's loves, hot rods. The fighting editor with a wooden leg was telling us how he built up old cars and put together dragsters. His wife was talking almost as much as he was. The subject of hot rods naturally got us back around to the subject of police.

"I remember when the California Highway Patrol was

on the roads to protect and help motorists. Now they are young and gunshy, they don't listen. I recall some years ago when my wife and I were a little loaded and had stopped on the Bay Bridge when she fell asleep driving home. Two patrol officers stopped us -- and they didn't know who I was -- drove us home and drove our car home and didn't even give any tickets.

He stopped and moved his leg around to a more comfortable position. "The last time one stopped me... for what he called a dangerous pass -- he didn't listen. He just said a car that old shouldn't be able to go that fast. Well it was one of my hot rods," Newhall grinned, "but I told him I didn't think the ticket was just and I wouldn't sign it. I was arrested and handcuffed and tossed in jail. They were nice about it, but not like they used to be."

The shotgun, Newhall says looms too large now in CHP cars. He calls it self-defeating. He sees them as shakey, unsure of themselves and ready to shoot first and listen second. Again, he laid the blame at the governor's doorstep.

"I think our governor performed a tremendous disservice to the CHP by putting them on the campus. They are a peace force organized to help motorists, not an army. Bringing them on the Berkeley campus was a mistake. Now the shotgun is their symbol and they attract the kind of recruits who see the shotgun as a virility symbol."

Slowly, piece by piece, we see the pattern of Newhall's thinking, how he sees this country. It is terrifying, the picture he is painting for us. In the head of this very influential man is a clear picture of the neo-Nazi government existing in California, and the time is now.

Newhall talked of the movement of ignorant, violence-oriented whites into southern California, up to what his wife calls the Reagan-Murphy Line near the center of the state. Along with this was the migration of the blacks to the northern cities and the pressures they were generating for a better and more dignified life.

The movements came together, at the last election when the scared white racists elected a man Newhall said he would admit to his home only through the servant's entrance. A man who was pushing the blacks and the students down where the establishment wanted them. When they pushed back, Reagan gave them enough rope to hang themselves... on national television.

This is nothing new; BARB has been saying it for a long time. But coming from a leader of the straight press it's sort of unexpected. We wondered out loud, why his paper was keeping quiet about it.

"We have to play it cooler than you underground papers," Newhall explained. "We have to keep the establishment anesthetized so they don't feel the pain as we stick the needle into their archaic veins and give them a transfusion."

"I have to work with the establishment so I have to move carefully when the time is right, whether it be about the rottenness in the police department or in the capital. I must keep the respect of the middle-class or lose my effectiveness. I don't want to blow any of these stories in a one shot deal. I can't act right away like the underground papers, so I must bide my time."

Ruth went out to the kitchen to get Scott more coffee. She handed him the cup and sat down, and surprised us all. "I think the underground papers are the future of American journalism."

Newhall pointed at her and laughed, "There's the real brains of this outfit, she's exactly right."

"The press is in danger," he said. "Not the exciting kind of Hollywood danger, but of dissolving into a grey mass of non-ideas. The underground press will replenish the straight press and keep it alive," he said earnestly.

Newhall went on to say that he is for what young people are doing all over the country. "I would be the first person of my age to hand the government over to the next generation." He said he hopes the revolution -- he called students revolutionaries -- will avoid violence, but "you are bound to win in the long run."

BARB's editor, who had arrived a little before, stopped Newhall. "Would you support a revolution in this country that overturned every existing institutional form as long as it re-established what this country really means," he asked.

"Yes," Newhall answered, "if it were non-violent."

The hour was growing late, or rather early in the morning, and conversation began to drift to more pleasant things. The "good old days in San Francisco" became the main topic. As we put down our pens and leaned back to stories of steak dinners for 75 cents in long-torn down hotels, I stopped and wondered how this man Newhall could exist. I knew he was trapped in the system, his hands were bound right and left within the web. Earlier he had told us that part of the difficulty came from having to deal with superiors who were over 80, who got their ideas from the grey mass of news off the wire machine.

Off in the distance I heard him say he learned at UC in the 30's the same thing that the Third World people are trying to teach now... "everything is in a state of change and flux... to use the intellect, not force to solve problems."

As we got up to leave Newhall asked if these were all the questions we had. "Be as tough as you want," he said. Editor Scherr said he felt Newhall had been leveling with us but there was one more question: Did he think this was the end of it or was he afraid they would get him when he came back from his two-day rest and his guard was down.

"They might," Scott Newhall said, "they might. We'll just have to wait and see."

2) Could this be used as an effective means of contraception as well as groovy orgasms?

Ice Is Nice

ANSWER: Depending on ice cubes for contraception is uncool. If you're not more careful now your old lady will be with child when the frost is on the pumpkin, but I don't know of any other harm that could result from this practice unless you empty a whole ice tray. If I didn't have to mail this column out tonight, I could after reflection, go into an entire ice trip. "Ice box" is only one possibility....

QUESTION: I am pregnant and do not intend to take any trips during the first three months. My friends say after that organic psilocybin would not be harmful. Is this so?

ANSWER: Your friends may mean well but they are not basing their advice on any known facts. It's true that the first three months (first trimester) of pregnancy is the most critical time in the development of the fetus. But some substances can cause changes even late in pregnancy. Tetracycline, for example, taken by the expectant mother can cause changes in the bones and teeth of her unborn child.

In the absence of information

about psilocybin in pregnancy you should not take this drug, or any other, while you are carrying your child.

I assume that by "organic" psilocybin you refer to an extract from Mexican "magic" mushrooms rather than the compound synthesized in a laboratory (incidentally, psilocybin was synthesized by the Swiss chemist Hoffman, who also first reported the psychedelic properties of LSD).

Reports of "organic" mescaline have reached me, i.e. mescaline extracted from peyote rather than produced wholly in a laboratory. Unless you have actually seen these chemicals being produced you have no way of knowing whether they are "organic" or synthetic or even the drug they are said to be. Moreover, there is no evidence that extracted chemicals cause different trips from those entirely synthesized.

Some people whose judgement I respect state there are subtle differences between peyote and mescaline and between psilocybin and magic mushrooms. But the "organic" vs. synthetic question may

be just a shuck used to sell drugs comparable to Madison Avenue gimmicks.

Phocomelia or "seal limbs" was a birth defect rarely seen until the recent thalidomide disaster. Because it usually occurs only once in 100,000 live births, six recent cases in young mothers who took black market drugs early in pregnancy have prompted an investigation by the Food and Drug Administration and the Justice Department's Division of Drug Abuse. Three of the mothers took green and white capsules while three others took yellow and white tablets. The contents of the tablets and capsules are still unknown.

# BEAT GOES ON JUDGE BLOWS IT

USS HECTOR (AR-7) Feb 26, '69  
Dear whoever happens to read this,  
Well, I just got another BARB in the mail today which is always a cool thing because it lifts my spirits & a lot of other guys on this ship dig on reading it too. I'm from Frisco, originally, until I went & joined the Navy so naturally its good to hear from you cats once a week.  
The only reason I'm writing this

letter is to say thanks for the little thing you had in your Feb 21 issue about the Filmore West (p. 3). It really reminded me of what it was like before I came in--the complete feeling of love that engulfs everyone. Even guys that have never been there seem to get the idea when they read that article, 'S allright.  
And so the beat goes on.  
I remain,

The Old Sea Dog

you can't get away with that today." During the recess, Garry made a motion for a mistrial because of Judge Phillips' conduct.  
It was the second time Garry had cited Phillips for misconduct. Phillips has cited Garry once. What these citations actually mean is unclear, but an appeals court could reverse a conviction if they feel the judge has acted improperly.  
Phillips was obviously peeved at the motion, and all through the arguments, kept pounding away at a law book in front of him, repeating, "I stand on the record. I stand on the record."  
While the defense was citing people, it also made a motion to cite Jensen for red-baiting People's World reporter Gene Dennis. Jensen, Garry said, was trying to re-awaken "the spectre of Mc Carthyism".  
Many of those who testified this week were U.C. students, some from the Law School and some

graduates and undergrads. There were also several nurses, two grandmothers, reporters, and even an Alameda County probation officer.  
The show continues next week on the third floor of the Alameda County Courthouse, Monday through Thursday at 9:45 a.m. and 1:45 p.m. See Lowell Jensen and Judge Phillips conspiring to put the Oakland Seven in Jail! Watch Charles Garry, Dick Hodge and Mal Burnstein put Jensen and Phillips up against the wall!  
There are about thirty more defense witnesses, and then the Oakland Seven themselves will probably take the stand.

pleasant party happened.

Then Jackson astonished all around him by announcing that the strike was over for the day, that the TWLF considered the Academic Senate resolution as a paper agreement to meet the strike demands, that negotiations were going on with the deans of Letters and Science to secure academic amnesty for all strikers, and that if these negotiations were successful then the TWLF would call a moratorium on the strike.

### WHY MORATORIUM

"The moratorium will be to see

if the Administration is showing good faith (in implementing the paper agreement)," Jackson said. "We feel it was weak but if they show good faith we can work with it."

It seemed hardly likely that Jackson would be speaking without the authorization of the central committee of the Front.

But at a TWLF meeting for Third Worlders only later in the afternoon the tone was entirely different. The strike and the repression were getting heavier, the war goes on.

Wednesday evening, Jim Nabors came to a meeting of white radicals to announce that he would serve as a liaison between the TWLF central committee and the white strikers.

### ESCALATION

In that capacity he told the "Mother Country" radicals to get ready for an escalation of strike tactics next week. He voiced the Front's policy on finals—Strikers don't take finals, and nobody takes finals.

Nabors also urges the white strike support committee to form a committee which would negotiate with Letters and Science for amnesty for white strikers.

Nabors' message was clear -- We will fight harder, we will not leave the battlefield.

It seems likely that there are some differences of opinion within the TWLF leadership. Some elements within the Front may have regarded the Academic Senate resolution as sufficient reason to call off the strike and call it a victory, pending the future implementation of that resolution.

On a purely tactical level, some

people in the TWLF may think it a good idea to use the promise of a moratorium as the leverage by which to prevent all the strikers from being flunked out of school this quarter. Then the strike would be resumed next quarter.

But apparently the majority within the Front realize that calling a moratorium on the strike at this point would be more of a sellout than a victory and would be seen as such.

Meanwhile it's clear that the Man is not having second thoughts about the repression. Fifty-eight new warrants are sitting on the district attorney's desk awaiting judicial signature.

Eighteen of the warrants are for trumped-up felonious assault charges, and the remaining forty are for trumped-up obstruction charges.

What seems most likely to happen as BARB goes to press is that Thursday and Friday the 7th will be cool. Then on Monday the strike will build toward a complete disruption of the following week's final examinations.

But Wednesday's confusion was not reassuring.

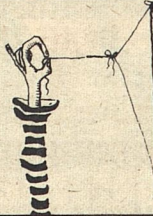

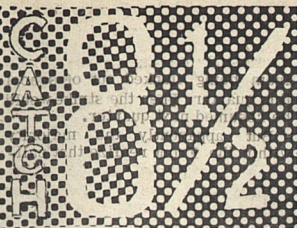

It is rather rare to find somebody doing something just for the thing itself. (Look about you and see how many you can find.)

This thought was triggered by a remark made to me by a reader about Bunuel's movie 'Nazarin'. He felt it was "a soap opera" (compared with his other works). 'Nazarin' - if you remember - is about a defrocked priest in Mexico of the 1900's. He had no church, no parish, and - in the end - he had nothing but what he wanted to be known as to begin with: his priesthood.

Along the way he was robbed, beaten, idolized, insulted, jailed, rejected by his Church, tempted, baited, almost seduced by a prostitute, a beautiful girl falls in love with him.

At the end, as he is being led down a dirt road in chains, dressed as a peasant without shoes and in rags, a peasant woman comes up to the guard to offer the "prisoner" some fruit, asking, "Is this man a priest?"

Thus, in the last thirty seconds of this movie, when the priest comes to realize that in spite of himself humanity exists and we are all brothers and sisters, this, then is where it's at.

He could not deny his own goodness.

Contrast this to psychiatrist R. D. Laing's statement (from 'The Politics of Experience', Ballantine Books, 95¢):

"We are all murderers and prostitutes, no matter to what culture, society, class, nation, we belong, no matter how normal, moral or mature we take ourselves to be... We are potentially men."

Dr. Laing can not deny our own badness.

We are thus faced with an irony: the Catholics who feel "we are born in sin" find goodness in man. The psychiatrists who feel we are born with nothing ('es nihilo') find badness.

This is quite a soap opera. G.K.
