# **NURSES' STRIKE** ere Were We?

The Bay Area nurses' strike which ended Wednesday was, in a very professional way, about making the decisions which affect our lives. our lives.

The nurses demanded they be allowed to set up a Professional Performance Committee to de-Performance Committee to de-termine the quality of patient care -to make proposals to the hos-pital administrations, and to have the proposals implemented. The nurses felt they can best determine what 'overcrowded' means, rather than hospital ad-ministrators sitting in isolation in their air-conditioned offices.

their air-conditioned offices.

The Professional Performance The Professional Performance Committee, as the nurses pro-posed it, would be elected by the nurses themselves from each hos-pital, and would talk directly to the hospital administrations.

the hospital administrations. The nurses won their channel of communication in the settle-ment, but it winds through a lot of red tape. Committees are being set up, that deal directly not only with hospital administration, but also with department heads, so the nurses can communicate with every denartment. every department.

Recommendations of the committee have to be submitted to four member review committees which include nurses, administra-tors, and members of the board

the settlement because they feel that basic demands were met. They also won a number of fringe bene-fits which bring them up to stand-ard with other hospitals. Original demands were that

bed nurses and supervisors be part of the bargaining unit. In a move typical of all mana-gerial bureaucracies, the hospital administrations were trying to di-

administrations were trying to the vide the working nurses. In the new contract, head nurses are covered, but supervisors are not. The California Nurses Associa-tion is a professional association,

tion is a professional association, not a union, and the nurses are very concerned with maintaining their professional image. They have a "neutrality" clause in their contract, which means they do not honor other picket lines, and have crossed picket lines in the past. As a result, hospital workers unions did not honor the nurses lines. The Teamsters, would not cross the line, but they delivered goods outside the line which the hospital workers would carry inside.

The nurses did not want to shut down any hospital completely, cause that would compared patient care. On the picket line outside Children's Hospital in San Fran-cisco, nurses would voluntarily leave the line to give emergency treatment. In many cases nurses treatment. In many cases nurses would stay on their job and give money to the strike fund, or they would stay and work their shifts and then go out on the line. At that, only 50% of the nurses at

that, only 50% of the nurses at Herrick and 50-60% of the nurses at Alta Bates went out. This type of professionalism, as happened here, leads to the nurses isolating themselves from the rest of the workers as well as from other unions. At the same time, it's always been a policy in labor struggles to keep vital ser-vices available, at least on a minimal basis.

minimal basis. If the nurses had been able to overcome some of the uptightness of their professionalism (without sacrificing their professional skills) and unite with other unions, then they would have been opera-ting from a much broader base of then power. They might have won their demands more quickly and withou interference from Alioto's men have

jobs as nurses. The doctors in hospitals are mostly men, and many doctores look down on the nurses as lower beings. A friend nurses as lower beings, a friend of mine was having surgery on her teeth, and she bit the nurses hand. The doctor said: "Just go ahead, Marsha, you bite her all you want".

My friend croaked something through a mouthful of blood and finge

ers. What did she say?" asked the doctor.

"She said that I'm her sister, and you're a male chauvinist", replied the nurse with a good deal of pride. There's little doubt that the

hospitals treat women nurses as second class citizens. Most male nurses hold administrative and supervisory jobs. Many doctors individually supported the strike but couldn't be bothered to say but couldn't be bothered to say anything. This was a strike which was about women demanding a voice in what was going on. But partly because they were women the administration vacillated even

The Berkeley community sup-ported the strike and many peo-ple, women and men, walked the lines. The women's liberation movement should have been the first to be there, because of the oppression the nurses were ex-periencing as women. A number of women did talk with the nurses about women's problems, but no group project ever got off the ground.

ground, Basically, the nurses' strike was ignored by the radical com-munity. What justification do we have for trying to organize the working class in other communi-ties when we fail to relate to what's happening in our own back-vard? vard?

by Phineas Israeli The hip community of Aptos, Cal. armed itself and success-fully defended their lives and homes Tuesday night. Twenty longhaired guys with guns

held the three houses atop Cathedral Hill through the bullet-riddled night.

A group of red-necks and Birch-A group of red-necks and bh dr er-types had threatened to burn the 'hippies' out on that evening. Trudy Faughn, a friend of the hip fam ilies, told BARB the straights did not escalate beyond rifle-fire at the houses because of

the heads' numbers and weapons. "We think they'll pick the quiet-est night and then hit," she said. The hip craftspeople believe they are the target of a paramilitary

Minuteman group spread through-out the area, Trudy said. Santa Cruz attorney Bob Ludlow called Trudy at midnight Tuesday to offer his help. He is now trying to bring the FBI into the affair. The story is further proof the blacks are not the only people in America today to be threatened

with genocide.

The great American countryside, folksy citadel of all the virtues that made our country clean and free, is now waging a war on that community of individuals who, in

community of individuals who, in their everday ways, are living the Cultural Revolution. Tuesday BARB received an ur-gent phone call from a threesome of hip families who faced a bloody showdown in several hours when an ultimatium circun them to how to ultimatum given them to leave

"Enjoy your last night here be-cause I'm gonna kill you," is what they had been told that afternoon.

Six houses sit by Cathedral Drive near the edge of Aptos, a town 15 miles south of Santa Cruz. Three of the houses are hip, three are straight.

Right after the heads moved in, four weeks ago, the straight peo-ple threatened to kill their dogs if everyone wasn't out in five days, Judy Miller, a member of the hip group, told BARB. One of their houses was broken into and a vio-lent threat delivered, she said. Jeffrey Finch, owner of a Berk-eley leather shop before moving to Aptos, was shot at and beaten up. Sabotage aimed at driving the group out included ripping up their electricity and turning off their Right after the heads moved in. group out included ripping up their electricity and turning off their water. The only 'justification' the straights have offered for their actions, Judy said, was that the heads' houses have a water leak. But the message was run down clearly enough when Judy and her friends were told by their neigh-bors, "Don't give us that peace and love shit, we're trying to kill vou." vou.

In an effort to get law and order In an effort to get law and order to protect themJudy explained, the hip people sent for the county sher-iffs from Santa Cruz (Aptos has no local police). The county pigs came, but refused to arrest the man Finch and his brothers ac-cused of doing the shooting. "The rolice work do anything "

"The police won't do anything," Judy said, "until someone's hurt." Why are these straight people laying an Old West style range ware on their hip neighbors? Judy understands, her anomics to be "are on them in preignors? Judy understands her enemies to be "just birchers." "They're out to get any hippies. Last night they threatened to kill two sixteen-year old girls." old girls.

On Monday night the straights escalated their war by setting up roacblocks on Cathedral Street. The houses are not bunched closely together, and seven carloads of armed men blocked off the road, or leaving the hip houses. Police came along finally and the

roadblock was broken up, but the pigs took no action against these anti - hippie hoodlums. The straights explained to the cops, Judy said, that they were "fixing a car."

On Tuesday night, the time was up on the last of the five-day threats to get out. During the day the hip families evacuated their women and children from the hill. The male members of this small hip community and a few friends armed themselves and remained on the hill to defend the houses. Twenty

armed longhairs. "I just called up the hill to the

people,'' Judy told BARB at about 7:00 p.m. Tuesday. "They said it's really bad up there."

The threat, which was repeated The diffect, which was repeated Tuesday afternoon by the same man the heads claim shot at Finch, specified that if the houses were not abandoned they would be burned to the ground and all of their in-

"We're craftspeople," Judy said, "and we came here to do our thing out in the woods and not be bothered.

"Now there's nothing else we can do but fight." Joe Mickey, another member of the hip tribe who all at one time or another lived in Berkeley, then got on the phone. He explained that the families had unsuccessfully tried to get restraining orders against their threatening neighbors.

### BATTLE **TO SAVE** HAPPY HAVEN

The Inevitable Man is at it again complete with fuzz, bull-dozers, and official eviction notices

This week, in what could well become a sequel to People's Park, the forces of official terror moved against Muir Beach in Murray County. Those who have been to Muir remember it as one of

Beach remember it as one of the last refuges of natural beauty and sanity along the California coast. Until last month, the beach and small strip of land alongside the creek which runs, nested be-tween the coastal cliffs, from Mt. Tam to the ocean, were privately

Tam to the ocean, were privately owned. Free people came to swim and sunbathe freely in one of the only places which has resisted until now the cement urinal, the hot-dog stand, and the toll gate. But that was last year. The great Plastic Octopus has once again reached out and officially snatched the land from its people

again reached out and officially snatched the land from its people. In May, the attorney general's office proclaimed that Muir Beach had been purchased by the State of California for use as a State Park. In protest, the residents refused to pay their rent, and the owners had the electricity turned off. off.

Then, after more than a month of being hassled by the police, and county officials of all kinds, the Marin Water Dept, turned off the water, and the state served eviction notices on the occupants of the cabine of the cabins. The Muir Beach community is

presently in the courts trying to presently in the courts trying to get extensions on the eviction no-tice. Extensions, they say, will give them enough time to find other homes. Most agree though they are waging a fight against the State and what has become its classical method for eliminating the hip people who have rejected the official life style of the Cali-fornia agri-business complex.

the official life style of the Cali-fornia agri-business complex. One member of the Muir com-munity, called Neptune, went to the Park Dept, to lodge a protest. Neptune could only find out, he said, that there was not enough money available to develop the property for two years. Yet, last Monday, a bulldozer arrived at the beach and leveled the Pavillion, which for the past few years has served as a gather-ing place for the young people of the area. Last year weekend rock concerts were held there throughout the summer. Neptune and a number of other people are presently setting up a corporation to save Muir Beach. It's called Free People of Marin. Anyone interested in assisting in

Homosexuals took to the streets in New York City last weekend and joined the revolution, A two-day battle resulted after New York City Pigs busted a popular gay bar, the Stonewall Inn in Green-wich Village

City Figs store bar, the Stonewall Inn in Green-wich Village. The pigs first moved in last Friday with six squad cars for a "small" raid, according to under-ground reports. They trapped everybody inside and began herd-ing customers one - by-one into ing customers one - by-one into paddy wagons waiting outside. Ironically, it was a chick who

gave the rallying cry to fight. Pigs were loading her into the wagon when she shouted to a big crowd of bystanders: "Why don't you guys do something!" That did it. The crowd rushed the police wagon as someone yell-ed: "Let's turn it over." The pig friver dreve off scenning the argrey

driver drove off escaping the angry

driver drove on escaping the angle, crowd. Meanwhile, pigs inside the bar were raising hell. Reports from the scene say they looted a juke box, cigarette machine, telephone money, the safe, cash register, and tips. They also busted 13

overnight, signs were chalked on the walls outside the Stonewall: "SUPPORT GAY POWER!" and "WE ARE OPEN!"

"SUPPORT GAY POWER!" and "WE ARE OPEN!" Saturday night, the action began about one a.m., according to an eye-witness, J. Marks, author of the book "Rock & Other Four-Letter Words." The street was mobbed for a-bout 5 blocks near the Stone-wall bar. "I saw a taxi make the mistake of turning into the street when an enormous roar came from about 400 people," said Marks. "They attacked the cab, banging in the sides, and parading on the hood and top. "The cabbie got out and began messing up a few kids and about fifteen jumped him. Meanwhile, about 15 others were trying to let the passengers get to free-dom. "A city bus ran through the

dom. "A city bus ran through the street, but the mass of people wouldn't let it through. They created a thunderous sound beat-ing on the sides of the bus before

Created a hinderous sound beating on the sides of the bus before passing it through.
"Police came and the crowd pulled away for a moment, then they descended onto the prowl car. They first knocked off the red flashing light. Then they started shaking the squad car sideways as if to tip it over.
"At that point, an enormous group of TPF (Tactical Patrol Force) arrived with helmets and started marching in a line and swept the crowd back.
"The kids formed a chorus line opposite the helmeted police line and started singing and dancing. The TPF advanced again and scattered them."

The IPP advanced again and scat-tered them." That ended Saturday night's bat-tle, the eye-witness said. Sun-day, the word passed for another gay demonstration. Help was ex-pected from the SDS, but they never showed up. "The gay community in New York City has been inspired by your homosexual liberation stor-ies in the BARB," Marks told me via transcontinental phone. Alan Ginsberg visited the Stone-wall bar Sunday, according to

Alan Ginsperg visited the stone-wall bar Sunday, according to Marks, and said: "Gay Power! Isn't that great, We are one of the largest minorities in the count-ry, ten per-cent you know. It's about time we did something to assert ourselves."

Ginsberg reportedly told the Stonewall crowd, "The guys here are so beautiful -- they have lost that wounded look that fags all had ten years ago."

cracked Sid's skull into a scine coma state. Macias, who is out on \$3500 bail, said that DA Dutton has re-fused to make any deals which would lower the charge to a mis-demeanor. Sid figures that Dutton has him pegged as a really bad dude.

has him peged as a reary in dude. Facing Sid Thursday across the bar of injustice was Judge Dieden. Dieden is in Sid's words, "the heaviest pig of them all. He has a long history of sending people to correctional and educational insti-tutions, shall we say." Macias' main hope of avoiding the incarceration which faces all student strike leaders is currently that Dieden will assign the case to a more liberal judge.

The job on People's Pad is be-ing done by the Berkeley School Board and something called the South Berkeley Model City Neigh-borhood Task Force, a predomin-atly black, predominatly middle class group which claims to re-present the black community. The School Board got their fin-gers into People's Pad because they happen to own the land. Fifty-four families, eighty percent of them black, were evicted from Savo Island in March on the grounds that a new school would be built on the site. The buildings were abandoned and the place became abandoned and the place became run down. The school is supposed to be constructed this fall. Wan-

run down. The school is supposed to be constructed this fall. Wan-na bet? The Telegraph Ave. Summer Project then arranged to lease the land for a crash pad. "Who-opee!" thought the radicals and street people. "We can extend our park idea through the Pad. Groovy." So we all marched down there last week and began People's Pad.

So we all marched down there last week and began People's Pad. We thought it would be the same as People's Park. Just come on down and do your thing. The first thing we know, the liberal Berkeley School Board gets uptight. "You've got to have rules and regulations," they scream. (This is exactly what the con-servative Board of Regents told the Park People.) "You can't have men and women sleeping in the same place. You've got to have a responsible manager. You need insurance. (The Regents brought this up too). What about drugs.... and wine?

this up too). What about drugs.... and wine? The School Board, in conjunc-tion with do-goodin Fred Cody, the man behind the Summer Pro-ject, draws up a set of regula-tions, the Pad People will have to adhere to in order to get the it

LATINO 7 PIGS VAMP ON YOUNGEST BROTHER

Jose Rios just turned 18. Friends say he stands about 5 foot 5 and weighs around 130 pounds. He has been ill for several weeks, suf-fering from hepatitis. Yet when he went to the hospital he was hand-cuffed and "escorted" by 20 San Francisco pies

cuffed and "escorted" by 20 San Francisco pigs. Jose is one of 7 de la Raza, who have been indicted for the murder of Joe Brodnik, an under-cover cop shop with his partner's gun on May Day. His widow, Mrs. Jessie Brodrik, has been public-ly asking the death penalty for Los Stete. Los Siete.

Los Siete. And though no trial has yet been held, the brothers have also been declared guilty by the straight press. Their treatment in jail indicates they are already being punished.

Jose recently appeared in court, where it was decided he must stand trial as an adult, even though he was only 17 at the time of the alleged murder. "His eyes were yellow. It was obvious he was very sick," says Sue Castro of the de-fense committee. Attorney Charles Garry demanded that Jose's ill-Garry demanded that Jose's illbe entered into the record.

The judge was reluctant to do " says Sue, "until Garry talked about a possible epidemic." The guardian of justice then said Jose must be seen by a doctor.

Jose told the court he had been sick and needed medical atten-tion. He said the doctor had seen him before and prescribed asprin

for the illness. For his court appearance Jose was not given his own clothes. Instead he was given some rag-ged clothing and not allowed to have his hair cut. "They tried to make him look like a bum," says Sue. The judge's instruction finally mt lose to a boshial on Sunday.

The judge's instruction inally got Jose to a hospital on Sunday. Now the defense committee for Los Siete is trying to get pro-per medical care for Nelson Rod-riguez, another brother who is il1.

"Its a humiliating kind of thing," says Sue. She said the brothers have even been forced to go weeks at a time without

Roger Alvarado sees the case of Los Siete as part of a national pattern. "As the Brown movement has become a national effort, the

has become a national effort, the Man has accelerated his attacks on Brown leadership," he says. Alvarado mentioned the "jive" conspiracy charges against Brown leaders in Los Angeles. He also referred to the case of Black Beret leader Sal Candelaria in San Jose. Candelaria's family was forced to leave town fearing their lives were in danger, Roger said. Candelaria, himself, was commit-ted to Agnewfor several days with out so much as a hearing.

At home, "Alioto and Cahill are waging a war against the Brown community," said Alvarado "Their street combat force is now up to 400," he said. "They got 150 more pigs for the "Paranoid Squad' and now they even have a second-string for the Tac Squad."

I'd like to send a very special word to sister Erica Huggins, the wife of our slain, murdered Deputy Minister of Information, John Huggins, who was murdered along with our Deputy Min-ister of Defense, Brother Alprentice "Bunchy" Carter, He's Bunchy to me,

Sister Erica is now incarcerated in Connect icut. The pigs have plotted with this bald headed, renegade, that boot-licking, black capitalist, cultural nationalist reactionary, Ron Karenga and his stooges, to take the lives of these two dearly be-loved hard working brothers.

And now, the pigs have compounded this by taking this woman, this black woman, this sister, after inflicting this horrible pain upon her by murder-ing the father of her newborn child. Taking her away from her child and placing her behind bars on some trumped-up charges.

I know Erica, and I know that she's a very strong sister. But I know that she is now being subjected to a form of torture that is horrible. I know that she is strong and that she will endure and sister Erica, be strong sister.

We must not rest until this sister is liberated, and if she is not out at this moment, then she should be out just as rapidly as it is possible for us to get her out. And an example to all of us, let it be a lesson and an example to all of the sisters, particularly to all of the brothers, that we must understand that our women are suffering strongly and enthusiastically as we are participating in the struggle. And I'm aware that it has been a problem in all organizations in Babylon to structure our struggle in such a way that our sisters, our women are liberated and made equal in our struggle and in regard to sister Erica, I know that the Minister of Defense, Huey P. Newton has spoken out many times that the male chauvinism that is rampant in Babylon in general, and also rampant in our own ranks,

The incarceration and the suffering of Sister Brica should be a stinging rebuke to all manifes-tations of male chauvinims within our ranks. That we must purge our ranks and our hearts, and our minds, and our understanding of any chauvinism, chauvinistic behavior of disrespectful behavior toward women. That we must too recognize that a woman can be just as revolutionary as a man and that she has equal stature, that, along with men, and that we cannot prejudice her in any manner, that we cannot relegate her to an inferior position. That we have to recognize our women as our equals and that revolutionary standards of principles demand that we go to great lengths to see to it that disciplinary action is taken on all levels against who manifest male chauvinism behavior.

Because the liberation of women is one of the most important issues facing the world today. Great efforts have been made in various parts of the world to do something about this, but I know from my own experience that the smouldering and the burning of the flame decend for liberation of women in Babylon is the issue that is going to explode, and if we're not careful it's going to de-stroy our ranks, destroy our organization, be-cause women want to be liberated just as all oppressed people want to be liberated.

So if we want to go around and call ourselves

a vanguard organization, then we've got to be the vanguard in all our behaviour, and to be the van-guard also in the area of women's liberation and set an example in that area, and all of us to start being respectful and not condescending and patronizing, but to really understand and look upon this guestion, recognize, that women are our other half, they're not our weaker half, they're not our stronger half, but they are our other half and that we sell ourselves out, we sell our children out, and we sell our women out when we treat them in any other manner.

We have to be very careful about that, and Sis-ter Erica Huggins is a shining example of a revolutionary woman whose been meted out the same kind of injustice from the pigpower structure that a revolutionary man receives, So they didn't put tionary woman to be just as much a threat as a revolutionary man.

And so we recognize that we also have a duty to stop inflicting injustices of misuse of women. We have to be very careful about that, and we all know the problem. But I'm saying that it's mandatory, the Minister of Defense Huey P. Newton has said that it is mandatory that all manifestations of male chauvinism be excluded from our ranks and that sisters have a duty and the right to do whatever they want to do in order to see to it that they are not relegated to an inferior position, and that they're not treated as though they are not equal members of the Party and equal in all regards. And that they're not subjected to male practices.

And Sister Erica Huggins is a good example of revolutionary woman who has sacraficed everything, including her husband. So Sister Erica Right On. ALL POWER TO THE PEOPLE



All of the charges placed a-gainst the people rounded up in the mass bust on Shattuck Avenue,

the mass bust on Shattuck Avenue, May 22, are being dropped. ents. The DA offered no objec-tion. "Are you saying that you wanted the case dismissed too?" asked the Judge. "Why did you let us argue for an hour?" The DA then moved that all charges be dismissed, and every-one work home. Similar, stories

one went home. Similar stories were told by other groups. In all cases all charges were dropped.



### BLACK STUDENT'S VICTORY

No youth can be expelled from high school without full notice and a hearing at which he can defend himself.

This expansion of the legal rights of high school students is one of the fruits of Dorothy Allen's vic-tory over the Oakland School Board.

Dorothy, a black teenager, was expelled from Oakland Tech last fall after she (allegedly) slapped a white girl who (allegedly) slapped a white girl who (allegedly) called her 'nigger', The expulsion, which made it illegal for her to attend any public school in Oakland, was

handed down without any hearing. The Board of Ed. overlords saw fit to deprive Miss Allen of her right to an education. They did not

right to an education. They did not feel it necessary to notify her of the charges against her or give her the opportunity to confront her accusers in a legal proceeding. Alan Kalmanoff, Dorothy's at-torney, won the case in federal court last Thursday. After months of futile effort to get the School Board to grant Miss Allen a hear-ing. Kalmanoff convinced Judge

harris to rule the expulsion illegal. Kalmanoff told BARB he intends to go back to court to win \$1,000 for Dorothy to pay a tutor so she can make up the months of school work she missed, Dorothy was out of school from Sept, 27 until about a continuation school in Berkeley. Kalmanoff also told BARB that

he believes the decision will act as a precedent to guarantee in the law the following rights to a high school student facing expulsion:

--The right to a prior hearing --The right to notice of the harges and the witnesses against him

-- The opportunity to make his own defense, with the aid of a lawyer.



### FREEDOM **MOVES ON WAY**

"We hope to have the Presidio 27 out of prison by October 14." Phil Farnham, Director of Clergy and Laymen Concerned, said this week. "By that time they'll have spent a year in jail for something that wasn't a crime at all." During the summer months Clergy and Laymen Concerned will launch a miassive clemency cam-paign to get the men out. The drive will be concentrated on the thome towns of the imprisoned "mutineers." The primary objec-tive of the campaign will be to put pressure on legislators represent-ing these towns so they will speak poor clemency in Congress. A-bout half of the 24 men convicted for mutiny are from the Bay Area.


bout half of the 24 men convicted for mutiny are from the Bay Area, (Three of the 27 have escaped and are believed to be living in Canada.) The military brass has told peo-ple outraged by the convictions to be patient, and wait out the normal appeal procedures before embarking on the pardon drive. But Farnham doesn't dig that, a "The men could complete their sentences before the reviews are completed--they take years," he og said bitterly. "We have to act can now."

said bitterly. "We have to act now." He feels the most important thing is to get the men out, so the campaign won't always be pol-itical in tone, but focused more on moral outrage. "In some of the small towns a political at-tack on the System might back-fire." Farnham said. Several weeks ago he was in Washington DC and to-gether with Dr. Spock talked a-bout the case to Robert Jordan, the Chief Counsel for the De-partment of the Army. Kayo feels the meeting was pro-ductive. Although Jordan refused

Kayo feels the meeting was pro-ductive. Although Jordan refused to discuss clemency, he showed great interest in the psycholo-gical defense Hallinan used for his clients at Ft Ord. At the end of the meeting Kayo agreed to let the Department of the Army check out the psychia-tric evaluations of the 14 men made during the trial. At pre-sent honorable discharges are hard to get, and are only given on the to get, and are only given on the basis of "unsuitability," Kayo said. He feels the Army might become more flexible after studying the trial records.

become more flexible after study-ing the trial records. Meanwhile, a Canadian court has released one of the escaped Presidio GI's after finding him not guilty on a shoplifting char-ge. Private Walter Polowski, who escaped from the Presidio brig last Christmas, had been brought to trial after Canadian cosp pick-ed him up in a Vancouver store for allegedly pocketing something. Army brass at nearby Ft, Lew-is, Washington, sent up one of their legal man a Capt, Bennett to "help" Polowski. The Captain offered to defend him if he would consent to return to the US af-terwards. The escaped soldier wisely ignored this offer. He was acquitted on the frame up char-ges and is nowreportedliving on a British Columbia farm--free. --jj --jj

Anthony Salamanca, SF State associate director of the Educa-tional Opportunity Program, be-came the first chicano adminis-trator to quit State this week. He thus joined his chief Reg-inald Major, director of the Pro-gram, and three other blacks who earlier voiced their disgust at be-ing "niggers in residence" and with Acting President S. I. Haya-kawa. kawa.

kawa. Salamanca's resignation followed a meeting that he attended this week with S. I. and a committee of 26 Mexican - American representa-tives. At the meeting Hayakawa tried to explain to the people why the Educational Opportunity Pro-gram funds were being cut back to allow only 150 students to at-tend under the program instead of last year's 400. Apparently he did not say ---'

tend under the program instead of last year's 400. Apparently he did not say - - -' because this is a racist mother-fucking institution and those black and brown people cause us a lot of trouble.' No, he just said that there wasn't enough money. This decision on the EOP cut-back was what triggered the res-ignation of the black administrators when it was announced earlier this month. Salamanca's announcement came immediately after watching S. I. go through his act again last Tuesday. In commenting to the press, he emphasted that, "We are in a strictly lackey type position here." Quitting along with EOP chief

position here." Quitting along with EOP chief Major were Ed Reavis, assistant dean of studenta; Elmore Cooper, dean of studentactivities; and Dr. Joseph White, dean of undergraduate studies.

One administrator who was a central and controversial figure during the recent strike refuses to quit eventhough Hayakawakeeps saying he is fired,

That man, Dr. Nathaniel Hare, has been serving as head of the Black Studies program. Hare was the object of much of Hayakawa's wrath during the strike. The press has played up Hare's coup at the microphone during a Hayakawa speech on Valentine's day as the cause of his firing. Hare says that is not the reason. The real reason that I was fired

The real reason that I was fired was because I refused to be a strikebraker. The strike demands, which were non-negotiable, called for the hiring of 20 professors for for the hiring of 20 professors for the black studies program. Haya-kawa said we could have 11.3 pro-fessors and demanded that I sub-mit a report stating the course descriptions and the hiring re-quirements. I refused to submit the report because it would have been strike breaking. That's the reason for my firing." But in the face of all the charges against Dr. Hare, one fact has been consistently missed, Dr. hare has been totally cleared by two different juries of the Aca-demic Senate's Grievance andDis-ciplinary Committee.

ciplinary Committee.

"They weren't even liberal jur-ies," explained Dr. Hare. "Haya-kawa has the power to rule on three of the jury members and he used it to get rid of the liberals. Even under those circumstances I was cleared."

Several reasons figure in Dr. Hare's decision to fight his sev-

erance. First of all "they can't get anybody to stay around but myself. I promised the black stu-dents, the black faculty and the community leaders that I would stay. I have their support and I intend to stay on." 

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


