

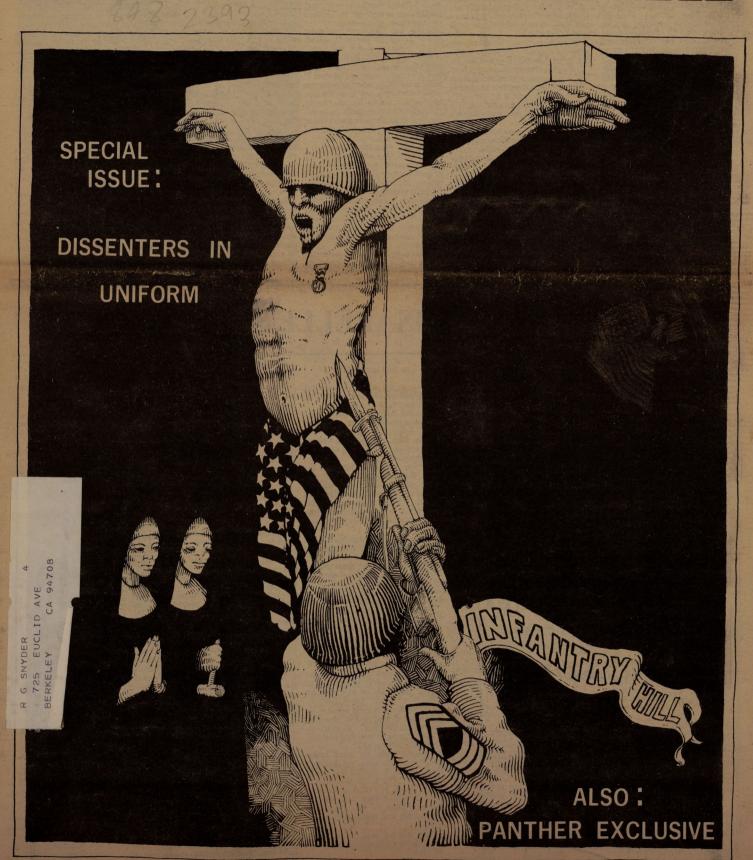

GRADUATE STUDENTS

There are two places in the world today where you are likely to find a homogeneous group of highly skilled individuals with an average of 18 years of formal education plus a wide range of work experience (and the potential of earning \$9,000 to \$12,000 yearly) performing menial tasks for little or no renumeration.

The first (and most tragic) is the Third World, where the institutional structure cannot yet accommodate highly trained individuals.

The second place is the American university at the graduate level. Here the problem is not one of institutional immaturity, but one of sterility and senility, although the immaturity of the first and the senility of the second are not wholly unrelated. Conditions in the Third World are at least partly aggravated by the failure of American universities to relate to the problems that exist there — or in any real world.

The disgrace is not that a potential source of highly skilled expertise is underpaid but rather that it is underemployed in a world with massive problems crying for experimentation and vigorous new approaches. Yet the immoral waste persists and the methods (or madness) of graduate education remain substantially unchanged from the medieval model.

Not only does the system persist, but it is sustained by an almost fanatical defense, centering around some vague and ill-defined notion of Academic Freedom in loose translation a subterfuge for Academic Featherbedding. The real fear of the defenders is that if reality were allowed to creep instiduously into their midst, the whole sinecure would collapse about them.

Reality is allowed to penetrate to innersanctum of Academia only

of statistics and translated into professional jargon. The job is so complete that even the most idealistic sophomore is bored stiff; the graduate student, his idealism dulled by multiple hours of the same, no longer looks for any meaningful connections between what he memorizes and the world with which he once wanted to connect. Any suggestions that scholars are students mix the realities of their everyday lives with the theoretical constructions which supposedly explain these realities is viewed as ignorant or a vicious breach of scholarly method. Good scholars barely talk with scholars from other disciplines, let alone intersect with the great unwashed world of reality.

What, then, besides the hope of

world of reality.

What, then, besides the hope of an additional year's deferment, continues to attract increasing numbers of students to graduate schools across the U.S.? For most it is probably a stalling technique designed to buy an extra year or two before making that awful commitment to a life as empty as their education.

Some, convinced that the B.A. degree is the last hurdle to be crossed before they are allowed to spend their time studying issues with guts, enter graduate school with the same excitement they had as freshmen.

The first weeks of their graduate careers reduce all of this to that same gray despair with which they finished their undergraduate careers. But this time, there is the additional element of realdisillusionment, and eventually of cynicism.

Job offers have been rejected, apartments rented, money borrowed, books bought, etc., etc. Besides, the stigma of dropoutism is worse than playing a game at which they are, by now, fairly adept. It is not that things would have been a whole lot different in the corporation; but there, at least, nobody but the

most outrageous recruiter promised anything more meaningful than tailfins.

It is almost universal opinion among graduate students that the best thing to do after waking up is to salvage what you can from the wreck. This means finding out exactly what the rules of the game are, seeing what corners can be safely trimmed, and serving out your term. After all, there are worse places to do time.

For those who are not content to accept their fate, but insist that Academia, make good on its promise of "excellence in the pursuit of truth," graduate school can be a very bad place to do time. For while some indulgence is granted to the wayward undergraduate, the graduate heretic is an object of special scorn.

To insinuate that he is ignorant or insane is to cast doubt on the system that produced him. Thus there is no doubt the "heretic" is obviously a trouble maker. The only remaining question is whether he is part of a nationwide (and/or worldwide) conspiracy. If he should happen to use language or tactics similar to dissidents elsewhere, he is automatically part of a conspiracy, and probably a ringleader by virtue of his advanced age and experience.

Waste is a luxury we can probably afford in the U.S. But the rest of the world is neither so affluent nor so tolerant and our sins of omission are beginning to come home to roost.

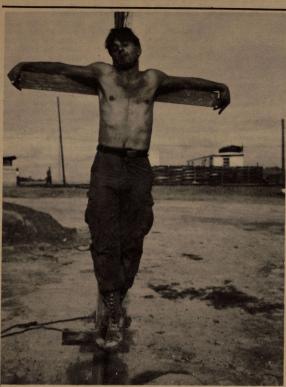
Shouts of "No, No". A gentleman in the crowd proffered a twenty dollar bill for ball money.

The following rap is transcribed from a tape recorded last week in the BARB office with a GI vetran of two and a half years in Vietnam. We hope to make these conversations a regular feature of the BARB and we encourage any servicement who is fed un with the the BARB and we encourage any serviceman who is fed up with the military to come in and talk a while, All names will be held in the strictest confidence.

BARB: You were in Vietnam for a pretty long time. What outfit were you with?
ARMY: I was there from January, 1967 until July of this year. Most of the time I was with the 199th Infantry, that is up until the time of the Tet in early '68. Then I was a Duty Driver for the Third Field Hospital in Salgon, Just this past January they sent me back to the 199th.
BARB: What was it like when you went back to the infantry this year? What were some of the changes you noticed?
ARMY: Well, the attitude of the GI has changed quite a bit, I remember in '67 the 199th had just got to Vietnam, Everything was new and we were freshly brainwashed as to what our "cause" was and what we were supposed to be doing. The idea, the cause, in those days was for the GI to win the confidence of the Vietnamses.

You were supposed to try to

win the commence.

You were supposed to try to show the people that you were their friend. You tried eating their foods. You tried kidding around a lot. Big propaganda line, but it sort of worked. When we used to come into a village it was a big thing. There would always be a lot of waving

from the people. And the GI's would be yelling and waving back and throwing candy and cans of C-rations to the kids. But when I went back to the Infantry six months ago, right away I saw that the men have a different attitude.

Now when we were out in the villages, or going through a town in trucks, you didn't see the waving from the GI's. We still got it from the Vietnamese, but the GI's weren't concerned with it anymore. In the last six months, I never saw any GI's waving at all. It's a small thing, maybe not much, but it hit me right away and I think it's pretty significant the way the GI's attitude has changed like this. It's funny in a way. We started out trying to win their confidence, and now we don't even have any confidence in them.

I think the reason it's turned out this way is because first of all you have a completely different group of GI's coming to the Nam now. They're convinced that the war is bad even before they get there. But also the GI's are getting more bitter all the time toward the Vietnamese because after a while you found out that the Vietnamese that you were supposed to be helping, pacifying or whatever you call it, during the day-time, were the same ones who turned out to be VC as soon as the sun went down. In fact, most of the villages are Viet Cong.

BARB: How large would you say the support is for the VC' Are they the most powerful group? ARMY: Well, they have more support than the Americans or the ARVN, that's for damn sure. Lis-

The following letter by Carlos Rodriguez, who is currently in segregation in the Fort Dix, New Jersey stockade, was sent to the BARB by the Workers Defense

The story I tell you in this letter is 100% fact. Imay be courtmartialed like many others and it is so important that my story pierce the ears of the people in the world outside the stockade. Chances are that when you read this I will be taken to court, but that is beside the point as long as you discover and can see what the army is really like.

In this testimony I will talk mostly about the Military Police Company working in the stockade. These most involved are the 532nd and the 759th, but the 532nd are, in my opinion, the worst. I think that these M.P.s., with a few exceptions, must be psychopathic. Certainly their anti-social and immoral conduct would indicate something like that, for they are sadists.

If you think that torture is no longer used you are wrong. The army has devised these leather belts which they call straps. Straps put on your wrists with your wrists twisted behind your back as far as they can go and tied to your ankles and you lie with all your weight on your stomach on the wooden bunk because in that position your chest can't even touch the ground.

With this in mind let me give you a few cases. I'll start with

I'll start with Jimmy Friend (of course that is not his real name because I don't have permission to use it), I was in Mental Hygiene when I looked out the window and saw this prisoner being taken into segregation. He was being hit on top of the head when all of a sudden he let one go and landed on Sgt. Branhover's face. (Sgt. Branhover is a lifer). Then they really put it to him. The word from Major Casey was, "Toro him." As I went then to my cell I saw big bruisers go in his cell and they followed Major Casey's orders with enthusiasm. He was in the straps about five or six hours. He was laid on a bunch of boards about eight inches off the ground and every thirty minutes or so he was picked up and let fall, hitting his head and abdomen, each time from higher up. As a result the man was unable to use his legs without support, his face was bashed up and he couldn't use his arms. He was in extreme pain in every muscle, bone and pore of his body. How long he endured this completely useless and unbearable pain I don't really know. He was in cell 12 and I was in 14. The next day he was processed out of the pound.

June 5th, - this is a true report except I don't think that the man was put in the straps. I was not in the same cell block at the time.

TORTURE AT FORT DIX

His name is Johnny Sanchez and he has been to Viet Nam and risked his life fighting Communism and all the Noble Reasons the government produces. The man went through many hardships as anyone who has been to Viet Nam knows. When he finally came state-side the man was a complete nervous wreck. I myself once was startled as one day I walked past his cell and there he was shaking as if his life depended on it -- perhaps it did.

I could go on and talk about the price Johnny Sanchez paid for that war and got nothing out of it but becoming a nervous wreck and I could talk about who is getting the profit from the war, but most people know that now -- or they shrould. Anyway, he was beat up by four guards, taken to the barber shop and all his hair was cut in front of every single eye in the stockade. I think the army was afraid of a protest against the treatment and conditions in the stockade and they were making an example of Johnny Sanchez of what they could do to anyone who objected or protested. They were saying that if anyone gets out of hand they would get what Johnny got. And by getting out of hand they would get what Johnny got. And by getting out of hand they wend get what Johnny got. I was out of segregation at the time, approximately 2 to 3 hours. Next thing I know there's a disturbance which the army calls a roto. And I'm back in segregation with about twenty other prisoners. Why, I don't know, 'till two days later. That's when I find out it's a bum rap--Code 13 (CID investigation). I don't want to discuss this part so much because if I tell too much about the inhuman abuses we suffered here, I know how these people work and they will try to cover their holes. But, I will tell you the report because I tend it from the guards; ("NECES-SARY FORCE NEEDED AND USED."

Before I proceed, let me explain this little saying since it is not rare that you'll see it in

one,).
Jones, which is his real name, was told by one guard in control, "Don't Smile." A few minutes later a smile came upon his lips and all of a sudden four guards, as if anticipating his smile, came from

everywhere. They pounced on this man as never before. When the officers saw what was happening they did nothing, but passed on by. When they sent him to the hospital his face -- I mean what I'm saying -- his face was hardly visible along-side the bumps and blood. He was brought back to segregation at night so no one could see, outcome, the man was not put in the straps, but put on Code 11 (very dangerous) which means shower and shave once a week only. The report when he was taken to the hospital was "Necessary Force Needed and Used," You figure it out and don't smile.

The next thing I tell you is absolutely true and I can use the person's name because it was me, Carlos Rodriguez. I have nothing to hide and here it goes: I've been now in segregation approximately 35 days. If you don't count the few hours I spent outside on June 5th, they I've been here fifty days on this Bum Tip charge, on July 8th I was told to move from Cell Block 77 to Cell Block 85. After some hassle about a foot locker a Gung-ho PFC Cleland threw my clothes on the floor. I then refused to move until someone picked up my clothes and put them back where they belonged. Then Set. Himan called me a punk because he needed all those other guards to back him up. At this time Sp/4 Miller tried to beat me on my back but I noticed him coming and put it towards the wall. Then Set. Himan started punching, Next thing I know all six are trying to put me down. Blows on my head, punches all over, but I cover my face. Between all of them they get me down and tie my hands behind my back and begin to put on pressure. More punches on my back, sides, head, and, next thing I know Set. Himan, to prove he is the man he isn't, puts my head on the floor, left side up, and leaves an imprint of his boot and bump on the other side. All of this after they had put my hands behind me and tied them and I was completely subdued, Was it "Necessary"? They tried to put me against the bars of my door, but I side-stepped. For that I got another imprint on my left side.

So, as you can see, where my story is leading, I'm talking about Military Police Brutality. Most likely, if you have any insight, you will see why these people Re-Up: simply because of their inferiority complex that they cannot compete with people on the outside. And really they can't, because they'd be by themselves and just that thought makes them shudder.

There's a lot to bitch about in the infantry. I mean it's bad enough just being in the Infantry and being on patrol. But even when you're not on patrol, you're in a base camp pulling bunker guard. You're always working. If somebody got the idea you were resting or catching a breather, they'd jump on you right away. You could never get comfortable. They're always harrassing you. I don't know what it is, This is part of the great Military Way: hassling the Infantry. Why should an infantryman have to go through harrassment from the NCO's after he's been on a patrol? The Army claims that this is what makes a good soldier. Well, that's bullshit. It doesn't make a good soldier. It makes you hate everything. The so-called Pride of the Infantry is Jwindling away very fast.

Because they do strange things to you. Like who ever heard of shaving in a war zone? Why, they'll go out of their way to get shaving

move around, you can't think. You have to go by the book.

And time after time the EM's proved that the book, the Army Way was all wrong, But you could never get a lifer to admit it.

The only thing that ever got a working relationship going between the EM and the lifer was when the men would put the lifer on the spot. I've heard quite a few guys say that this or that officer could catch a bullet from either end, from the VC or from behind. And these are guys who meant it, believe me. This is really the only thing that keeps them in line, and it doesn't come under the military Code. But it works.

BARB: In your two and a half years in the Nam, what were your feelings about the war as a GI?

ARMY: Well, I'm not what you would call political, but I'm against the war. It's all been a complete waste in every way. Nothing's been gained. This is the only war we've ever been in where a body count had to be taken in order to show progress. They tell you: "Well, we killed 2000 VC this month and we only lost 500 GI's." That's progress? I remember one time this Colonel came into the barracks and said that he'd give two free cases of beer for the first man who brought him a body count. This is the kind of stuff the lifers go for. "'You like being a queer, don't you?' If he said no, they'd take him out back to their special cell and pound the hell out of him. But he always said 'yes.'"

We sat in a car parked near the VISITOR CONTROL OFFICE on Treasure Island Naval Base. Speaking was a sailor just released from the base Brig.

We could see a red "Love It or Leave It" sticker on the OFFICE door.

"The guards would take this one little short kid out of formation and make him get down on his knees in front of them. Then they'd ask him if he liked being 'queer'. Like I said, he always said 'yes'. Then they'd make him say things like: 'I want to suck your dick. I love your dick'. Things like that,'"

The sailor had been imprisoned for 24 days. Upon release he wrote an angry letter to the BARB, published in our last issue, describing the Brig's vicious treatment of prisoners.

He was released because, as he said, "legally they couldn't hold me for over 25 days without a written order from the commanding officer. And no commanding officer is going to sign anything illegal like that, since I'm innocent."

He has asked that his identity be kept anonymous, and the details of his "crime" secret, for fear such publicity might jeopardize his future court martial.

The sailor, who for convenience we will refer to as Joseph K., was speaking tensely, under tight control, determined to give a pre-cise description of his 24 days in "hell."

BARB: This sort of treatment of

BARH: This sort of treatment of that homosexual is, of course, against navy regulations?
JOSEPH K: Of course, Ninety per cent of the guards don't pay attention to the rules. Except they ARE careful not to beat you out in the open before four p.m. After four the officers go home to their wives

and kids, and so the guards can beat you anywhere they feel like without being seen.
BARB: They don't leave evidence,

BARB: They don't leave evidence, do they?
JOSEPH K: No, they know how to hurt you without leaving any marks. They don't hit you in the face. They hit you in the stomach, chest, side, and kidneys.
BARB: How about the crotch?
JOSEPH K: I never saw a guy get hit in the rocks. One guy said he got kicked in the groin. He was a long-hair who turned himself in after living in Haight-Ashbury for a year. They kept making him walk around with his dick hanging out of his pants.

out of his pants.

BARB: It sounds like the guards have a few homosexual problems of their own.

JOSEPH K: Yeah, I kept waiting to be molested. But they got their kicks with their fists.

BARB: Did you ever get beaten?

JOSEPH K: I was pretty lucky.

I got slugged a lot, but I was only beaten badly once.

BARB: What for?

JOSEPH K: For looking from side to side. I was standing in formation, and when you're in formation you're not supposed to move except when they tell you to. I guess I was looking out of the corner of my eye, because this one guard got pissed off and started yelling at me to quit looking at him?

JOSEPH K: Yeah. This one officer was crazier than the rest. He was scared of being watched. He was short, fat and bald. Maybe he thought I was looking at him and laughing at his appearance. Or maybe he felt guilty. I don't know. But if he caught you staring at him he'd just go crazy He'd startyelling things like 'Pm going to put out the smoking lamp forever.' Insane things like 'Pm going to put out the smoking lamp forever.' Insane things like that, I was planning on calling him up at home after I got out and when he answered, say "Staff Sergeant ---, I'm looking at you.' Then hang up. But I couldn't find his phone number.

BARB: So what did he do to you this one particular time? JOSEPH K: Well, two ofthe guards took me out of formation and marched me to the back cell... BARB: The back cell? JOSEPH K: They have a special cell in the back of the Brig where they take you when they're going to beat you up. There's nothing in the cell, and there they aren't seen. Most of your screams can't get through the walls. They stand you up against a wall, and two or three will pound you.

BARB: What happened to you in this back room?
JOSEPH K: These two guards stood me against the wall. I was plenty scared. One started yelling at me, saying 'You asshole, you're so fucking stupid you couldn't tell your ass from a hole in the ground.' Original things like that. Then this Sergeant came in and said 'You looking around, hun?' 'Yes, I was, Sergeant.' You had to agree with them. Otherwise they really hurt you. So he punched me. Then I started shaking. They ordered me to quit shaking. They ordered me to quit shaking. They ordered me that the shake even more. My body just went spastic. So they beat me and beat me. I was shaking all the time. I tried to stop, but I couldn't. They can't stand fear, so they hit me real hard.
BARB: They're afraid of fear?
JOSEPH K: I guess so
BARB: You mentioned a 'smoking lamp'?
JOSEPH K: The smoking lamp is

JOSEPH K: Tygess so BARB: You mentioned a 'smoking lamp'?
JOSEPH K: The smoking lamp is supposed to be on all the time. It's just a light in the main sleeping quarters that, when it's on, means you can smoke. But the guards keep flicking it on and off, until you're a nervous wreck. I smoked three packs a day here, while in San Diego's Brig I only smoked one every five days.
BARB: Is the Treasure Island Brig worse than San Diego's?
JOSEPH K: It's not only worse than San Diego's, it's the worst in the country. At least that's what sailors say who should know, At least in San Diego I could talk to funds.

funds.

Veterans previously were allowed to keep their low cost Grinsurances even after they were out of the service, despite pressure by big insurance interests.

"For more than a quarter of a century," Dacey explained, "the industry bitterly fought GI insurance, and its agents lost no opportunity to cajole veterans into replacing the low-cost non-profit government coverage with more

the guards like human beings. Here they keep trying to make you think you're lower than shit. They want you to believe that they're better than you. They think you're like them, that you'll believe anything you're told. They're pigs. BARB: Don't the officers know what's going on in the Brig? the Black guards would get pissedoff.

BARB: They have Black guards?

JOSEPH K: Yeah, and they hit just

BARB: What did you do during the day to kill time?
JOSEPH K: The guards took care of the boredom. They got us up at five a.m. every morning and made us go out in the cold fog without coats and do calisthenics. Or march. Then they held count at least five times a day.
BARB: Count?
JOSEPH K: Yeah. We go out into the courtyard and count off one two three... At night sometimes they'd harass us by making us count off in front of our bunks, then turn out the lights, and just after we got into bed turn on the lights again and have a nother count. They'd do that four or five times in a row, until you cou dn't see. Sometimes for as long as an hour. They'd leave a light on every other night, right in the middle of the barracks. They wouldn't do it every night, because then you'd get used to it. Some guys can't sleep unless it's completely dark, you know.
BARB: In your letter you said the

get used to it. Some gaps and sleep unless it's completely dark, you know.

BARB: In your letter you said the food was bad?

JOSEPH K: Yeah, Almost always cold. And they kept marching us expensive commercial policies on which the agents collected a fat commission."

But three years ago, he continued, the government "gave in to a powerful insurance industry lobby." Now, any GI who manages to escape the jungles of Vietnam alive and returns to his family is given exactly 120 days to convert his GI coverage to an expensive commercial policy, with a commission payable to an agent.

into the dining room and letting us sit down, then a minute later marching us out. Legally they have to give time to eat, so they give us a minute. They keep you on edge all the time.

BARE: Were some of the guards coul?

JOSEPH K: One or two. But they had to be careful not to let the other guards see them talking to you like a human being, or else they'd get in trouble. One little Mexican guard said to me that he didn't believe in hitting prisoners. He helped one prisoner get released to be with his wife while his kid was being born.

BARB: Do you think stories like this will help to get places like the Brig cleaned up?

JOSEPH K: No There aren't enough of these newspapers. Just young people read the Barh, and young people don't have any power.

BARB: Do you think all the marijuan and drug use going on in the forces now will help to cause the military to collapse?

JOSEPH K: No chance. I was in Nam, and everybody there gets loaded. You can kill easier stoned than drunk.

BARB: Or at least more efficiently.

JOSEPH K: There are at least three kiloes floating around the barracks here now, thank God.

BARB: One last question. A rather foolish one. But we must be fair to our military, you know.

JOSEPH K: Of course. We wouldn't want to hurt any Marine's feelings.

BARB: Are there any good things you can say about the Brig?

JOSEPH K: Goodl?! Christ, Idon't know... After the shift hit the fan at the Presidio guards to the Brig here and re-trained them. But that just means the Presidio must be really fucked. Let's see... Anything good? Oh, yeah, one good thing: No calisthenics on Sundays.

As you drive away from the Treasure Island Naval Base, you see a sign saying: DRIVE CARE-FULLY -- WE WANT YOU BACK. Like the sticker said, "Love It Or Leave It."

DISSENTERS IN UNIFORM

EX-CORPSMAN TELLS IT LIKE

(The following article was written by ex-corpsman Gary J. Gianninoto, Hospitalman, U.S.N. (ret.) A veteran of combat in Viet Nam and of the Danang Brig Rebellion, Gianninoto here gives his version of incidents he witnessed during his tour of duty, which the military and Establishment newspapers pretend never happened. The article is reprinted from "The Bond", an underground newspaper for the armed forces which is published by the American Servicemen's Union, Cary won his discharge (UD) last month and is now a free man aiding the ASU. —-Editor,)

"Where can I shoot myself so that it won't completely wreck me?" guys in the platoon would ask me. I can count 11 of them that actually did shoot themselves just to get out of there. That's how bad it was.

LIES ABOUT CASUALTES
"During the time I was with the Marine 27th division we would sometimes hear news reports of battles we had been in. According to them we always had "light casualties" and it might also be reported that we had killed maybe 50 or 100 "VCs" when we hadn't killed one.

The truth is we got slaughtered. I would say that of the 3,000 men about 1,500 were casualties, a large share of them due to just sheer ineptitude, disorganization and stupidity on the part of the Brass.

Take for instance the time this lieutenant called in artillery on us by mistake. Everybody was nervous and shooting at things that weren't there and he called in the

artillery fire and then walked it right back onto our position. A shell caught this friend of mine and blew one side of his rear end and part of his leg off. I ran back to where the lieutenant was and there he was wrapped up in a little ball in the corner of his hole whining, "STOP it! STOP it!"

BIGOTED OFFICER GETS JUMPED

Our company commander was an out and out bigot. He treated the black guys like shit, He used to especially pick on one black guy named Brown from Detroit, But one day he pushed it too far, When he told Brown to get his "black ass moving," Brown turned around and knocked him right on his back and then jumped on him and began to really beat hell out of him. The captain got guards to drag Brown away but Brown broke away from them and took two hand grenades and went after the bastard, He ran. They didn't try to court-martial Brown because they knew the captain was wrong. They transferred Brown to another unit.

The end as far as I was concerned came the day they stationed us a blocking force while the rest of the companies made a sweep. They were supposed to drive the VC and NVA into us, It never happened that way. They never caught anything, You could hear them coming a mile off, hollering "Bring up the line on the left" and "hold it up" and "go ahead,"

This is how screwed up things were. They were supped by VC position in a woods and they didn't even let us know about it, We had orders to move up along this tree line. We were walking out in the open not suspecting a thing

MOUNDED

I saw one guy lying on his side, He was still breathing. The tank ran right over his head and smashed it down into the ground. You know what the news report said? "The Marines had light casualties." They also claimed we had killed a lot of VC. Actually only two bodies were found.

That was the end, Itold the senior corpsman, "I'm going out, the only way you're going to stop me is to shoot me in the back." I got on the helicopter going out.

They court-martialed me but I refused to go back. I told them "Out there it's screwed up; this is screwed up; and the country is screwed up. I'm through; I don't care what you do I'm not going back there."

That's how I happened to be in the Marine brig at Danang during the riot there. A special court-martial gave me four months hard labor. That was on July 9, 1968.

Conditions were rotten in the Danang brig. They took us out on working parties in groups of 10 men each and we had to string barbed wire in the sun, It must have been 125 degrees. One day when we were out working they refused to give us a real meal in the mess hall even though we were working right next to it. Instead they threw us some C rations.

a truck.
When six of the ten of us con-When six of the ten of us continued to refuse to work, they took us back to the brig and put us in segregation (solitary) for 5 days. They said they were charging us with "mutiny" but they never pressed the charge.

About half the prisoners in the brig were black and one night the watcher (guard) made some remark about a light being out and

watcher (guard) made so me remark about a light being out and it's being dark and added some racist crack about the black guys. Word of this got around fast among the black guys. They were angry. Every so often when we were sore about something we'd have a 'moorah'' -- that is, after lights out we'd start banging our tin cups on our bunks. It's contagious. A few guys start it and then more and more pick it up until practically everybody is doing it. There were about 300 guys in the brig at this time. It makes a hell of a racket. This night it didn't stop at that. We went right out to the fence. We had a bucket, We all pissed in it and when the sergeant of the guard came along we let him have the whole bucketful.

Then guys got two by fours and snapped off the chains that held the gates between the sections of the brig. Everybody went. We took over the whole stockade.

They ringed the place with Marines with shotguns and dogs, but that night we had control of everything inside. We supplied ourselves with food from the mess hall and we held the place from Friday, August 19, to Sunday afternoon. During the time we were in control we took good care of the seg-

regation cell blocks where they put you for punishment; we burned the whole place down. We knew who the informers among us were. Guys took care of

you for punishment; we burned the whole place down.

We knew who the informers among us were. Guys took care of them too.

On Sunday afternoon they stormed the place with tear gas. They took 11 men who they said were the leaders and imprisoned them in the dog kennels -- with the snakes, fleas, lice, and the rain for two weeks. Four of these men were finally charged. Of the four, three of them were black. The other eight were shipped to the Philippines and Okinawa and elsewhere to clear them out of the brig.

Four or five weeks later I charged with illegal entry into the hospital dispensary section of the brig. But the charge was never pressed.

After the riot, the food improved somewhat and they got some new personnel to improve running the place. But there was another change harder to pinpoint but more important.

The leaders of the rebellion were the black guys. After we had taken over the brig they began to hold court on white guys who had shown racism and I got worried about the situation. Most of the black guys were friends of mine but you couldn't talk to them then. It looked as if it might turn out bad.

But it didn't work out that way. Instead, after it was over there was a new and deeper sense of unity and comradeship among the guys, black and white.

There was also a new feeling of strength. We'd taken over the brig. Sure, they had overpowered us this time. But who knows what might happen next time?

PVT. AND THE POT

We are writing this to you because we are presently serving in Viet Nam against our will, ideals, and beliefs. We are "marines" serving in Marine Air Support Squardron 3 presently at Chu Hai. The reason for our letter to your paper is that possibly something can be done about the injustice towards persons serving over here away from anyone with any power to intervene in our behalf. There are several reasons for this letter. We all smoke grass and have been continuously hassled for it. We were in a bunker during a break and the pigs came down treating us like criminals because we don't believe in war or this bullshit that "might makes right." So the following week we left the area to get away from the pigs and they called the Military Police to come down in the junk yard and hassle us. We have tried to reason with them but this is hopeless.

A very good friend, David Martin,

they still won't let him go home, supposedly because he was sent to the brig for possession of marijuana. Approximately two weeks after his return he was ordered to sleep in the command bunker by the pigs because he was supposedly drunk. Yet when anyone else gets drunk and gets violent by tearing up the area all that happens is he has to go to his own bed. This is only one instance. Time does not permit me to list all the other injustices of a similar nature. It's getting so one of us cannot walk down the area without someone following us or hassling us for something. I only hope there is something you can do, possibly print our story for everyone to read.

That concludes all I have and we wish to thank you for your time. If there is anything you could suggest, please advise us. Thank you again for your time. Pvt. Michael Riley.

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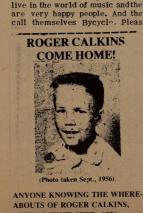

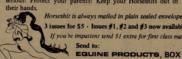

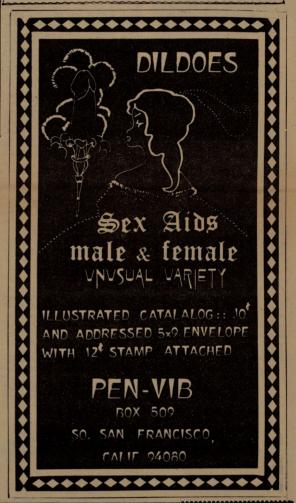

The very sign of his masculinity comes to be a source of shame. As a domesticated male animal he must learn to perform this act of self-castration, for just as with the other animals, an uncastrated male is not easily subject to the manipulation or the will of others. Castration must always accompany domestication. Performing the act of self-castration the individual learns how through an act of the intellect he may kill the life within himself, for feeling must always be subordinated to the intellect which is the internalized representation of culture.

The society seeks to repress sexuality through the separation of the sexes. This results in the association of boys with boys and girls with girls. An association which is encouraged in grammar school, high school, and even into college, with sex-segregated dormitories. This serves to prevent unwanted pregnancies, but in no way dampens the sexual ardour of the species. The sexual drive, unable to manifest itself in the normal way, chooses the next suitable object available which in the ordinary course of events is an individual of the same sex.

Persons assigned to manage sex-segregated facilities are normally themselves homosexuals; for what better occupation could there be for homosexuals than to have charge of a large number of young persons of the same sex? Sex, toilets, washbasins, and eliminative functions are in this manner equated with one another.

served in a highly unappetising style. Alternating between the food at his home and the food in the school cafeteria, he is unable to adjust to one diet or another. Whatever concoctions are presented to him as food by the mechanized dietician of the school cafeteria, he is obliged to eat, if he does not want to go hungry. He eats his food amidst a clatter of plates, and deafening din of chatter which is designed to stop even the hardiest digestion from proceeding in a normal manner. The cafeteria—is filled with life-destroying odors emanating from the various solutions used to assure an asceptic, sterile atmosphere. No human digestion system can emerge unscathed from such assaults.

In school the child is surrounded by strange children with whom he has in no way chosen to associate. Children from various cultural backgrounds are thrown together in a manner seldom experienced the the adult world. The child's immature ego must therefore cope with a bewildering display of behaviour for which he has 'learned no responses.

Adult anthropologists not infrequently suffer from 'culture shock' when they affiliate with members of other cultures. How much more traumatic must the child's experience be under similar circumstances, which are increasingly being forced upon all children in this society? How can trauma possibly be avoided as the children of white and negro cultures are forced together, when even the adults of the society are unprepared and reluctant to cope with the differences? There are very real cultural differences between negroes and whites, and it is up to the adults, not the children, to take the first steps to accommodate these differences.

If he inquires why this is so, he learns that there is an abstract entity called "They" (or the State) which requires his attendance in school, and which has absolute authority over his parents and over all other adults. The school then represents the authority of this abstract entity, and the child, like primitive man, respects authority. How, he seems to inquire, can "They" be so powerful unless they know what they are doing? Might makes right. The parents' opinions have no weight against this powerful structure. Powerless, the parents can be ignored. Truth, the child believes, is what the teacher tells him. If the parent expresses a contrary opinion, he is old-fashioned and ignorant, and at any rate, a person of no great consequence. If the parent can be wrong about matters pertaining to knowledge, it is likely in the child's estimation that he can be wrong in many things.

The child is taught little as to what relates to his actual life. He is indoctrinated with subjects which bear only an abstract relationship to happenings in his world. He is taught lies and platitudes about relationships between other human beings. While he is completely enslaved he is taught that he is born free. There is a false implication that his slavery will somehow end when he becomes an adult.

minself. The society can never be wrong. The burden of guilt is always the child's.

The child attends school six hours a day. After school he is also assigned tasks which by some oversight have escaped a euphemistic appelation and are honestly called "homework". Schools encourage the child to spend as much time on homework as possible, and it is not unusual for a child, particularly if he is hounded by his parents, to spend upwards of three hours per evening engaged in this task. The child then has a work day of upwards of nine hours, whereas the average adult works only eight hours per day. In addition, the child has no choice as to the work he performs, whereas an adult does. It is evident that child labor laws have had absolutely no effect on the exploitation of children. If the child is disobedient in school, his punishment is that he must remain there longer. This alone evidences the penal character of our educational institutions, which is also evidenced by the fact that our schools are ordinarily surrounded by high-wire fences.

Instead of facing a single initiation rite at puberty, as is ordinary in primitive societies, the child is time after time initiated into new groups and new statuses which he anticipates apprehensively, since with each change of status from grade to grade and school to school, he must accommodate himself to a new set of rules and a new group of strangers. At no time can he look forward to enjoying the security of close friends with mutual interests. The school system usually segregates the child from his friends. He is not seated according to his inclinations but alphabetically. If he makes friends with the person seated next to him, the seating arrangements are changed. He must come to realize that life is not to be enjoyed, but that his purpose is to work.

Teachers, both male and female, who have been sexually frustrated all of their lives, are not prepared to tolerate any signs of sexuality, which become intense among the students are considered transgressions of the school

feelings. He must ignore his body and plasticize his mind. After twelve years of education he has thoroughly learned how to perform an autoamputation through which he renders himself incapable of feeling.

At college he is confronted by what he has been taught are the intellectual leaders of his nation. His professors, however, are completely domesticated, de-sexualized, servants of the society, whose demasculinized activities take place behind the refuge of a cade mic freedom. Academic freedom means that the professor will serve any master; that he is a thinker, not a fighter, and that he constitutes no threat to the established power structure. As is well – known, he never thinks freely but confines himself to areas delineated by his masters. To understand him it is sufficient to recognize that his business is to stay in business. Another aspect of academic freedom is that the society of academic endeavours are equally worthwhile and they thereby support one another's activities regardless of how trivial and meaningless they in fact are. The student is exposed to four years of indoctrination in some of the most useless trivia ever deemed worthy of consideration by the human species. He must spend day after day memorizing and attempting to understand bits of trivia which are seldom understandable or meaningful in any human context. He learns to pay minute attention to the manipulation of meaningless symbols, and since the entire force of society assures him that this plasticization of his psyche is all relevant to human existence, he fails to develop any powers of discrimination or any critical understanding of the material which he is forced to assimilate but cannot possible digest. His psyche becomes as artificial as the society in which he lives.

Nowhere in this educational system does he learn anything about his true nature. He learns only that it is man's lot to work, and to accumulate, and that apart from this existence has no meaning. He emerges from the educational system a plastic man, ready to be harnessed to the wheels of industry and commerce. This has been the goal of the entire educational system. He has learned to continually postpone the gratification of his sensual needs and in the majority of cases this has rendered him incapable of enjoying sensuality even if the occasion should arise. His many years of education have brought about the degeneration of his bodily feelings and the atrophy of his capacity to experience the delights of his body. He has been made a living corpse, an instrument of the state, and of those who will exploit his mechanized body. Education has transformed him into an extension of the mamachines which he will operate.

And so we see that it is every living man who is Adam, whose psychic forces are split so that he uses a portion of them to control himself. The superego, the internalized force of society, represents the Olympic dicties who cast lightning bolts against the forces of nature, the imprisoned Titans. Christ is all those who recognize the need for the reconciliation of the forces, and anyone who attempts to take the steps necessary to achieve this reconciliation. 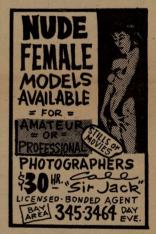

The Algerian festival, Police De-centralization, and hard words to student radicals.

The People's Park fight has strained the brain of the Berkeley movement, What began as an issue with wide popular support degenerated in the past month into a phony dream full of Bastilles and 26 de Julios. The novelty of being shot at with real guns shocked many people, but at the same time it fascinated the imaginations of a certain group of young white radicals. It was the first taste of political reality that they had ever had, and they didn't want to let it go; so they organized a whole campaign around the Park Fence and began talking about Power from the Barrel of a Gun.

In the month of July the Panther Party sponsored the first national conference for a United Front Against Fascism, and 300 radical and progressive groups came to Oakland from across the country. Out of the conference came concrete plans to decentralize the police depart ment on a local basis, all over the country, but the street revolutionists and the student radicals didn't pick up on it. In the corridors of the Oakland Auditorium on the last night of the conference, you could see the looks of disappointment on the faces of the young intelligentsia manning the tables of SDS and the other student groups.

The new program wasn't revolutionary enough, and besides, it had the odor of politics on it. Somehow, even the killing of James Rector didn't suggest the need for community control of the cops to the people of Berkeley and the students in general. Rector's name, shouted many times from the podium, seemed to hang in the smoke of the ceiling-lights high in the roof of the Oakland Auditorium asking a question. But again, nobody picked up on it.

Power from a gun. You can feel it just by watching the people running up Telegraph Avenue in front of police rifles. But the thought never occurred to the street people to take that power away, to take it for themselves.

Now if you look around at the various radical organizations, you see that one group stands above all the others—the Black Panthers. They are approaching their situation on an enti

BARB: (to Hilliard) While you were in Algeria at the Pan-African Arts Festival, what was the subject of your talks with Eldgridge Clea-

ver?
HILLIARD: Well, mainly it was concerned with Eldridge's desire to return to Babylon and take up the struggle again. I am confident that the man is completely just

present. And it's necessary that we get our Minister of Information back to America, because Eldridge was the most effective representative that we had in terms of focusing attention on the persecution of Huey Newton.

I'm convinced that this is the reason that Eldridge was forced into exile--because of his outspokenness, because of his great ability to make situations crystal clear to people, and because of his political position against all the tyrants of this so-called democracy. Particularly Mayor Alioto, and as Eldridge calls him, Mickey Mouse Reagan.

And he made it clear to me that if he's not allowed to return to America and stand trial as guaranteed by the Constitution, if he's not allowd to have his day in court and return through legal channels, then he will come back to America the same way that he left, And I'm sure that he will be back one way or the other. BARB: Well, the Algerian festival was a cultural festival, aimed at promoting cultural solidarity among the oppressed people, At the same time the festival was going on, in America we had the conference for the United Front, promoting political solidarity. What is the relationship between cultural revolution and political revolution?

HILLIARD: The Black Panther Party has consistently espoused that your culture must be subordinated to your politics. The only culture that we promoted at the Algerian Festival was the culture of the revolution, we are a proletarian culture, a culture where all the oppressed people rise up as a bastion, an iron fist to smash the oppressor.

BARB: Well, in Frantz Fanon's book, WRETCHED OF THE EARTH, he talks about the decolonization process and says that what it amounts to is the replacing of an old species of man with a new species. That is, the replacment of the colonizer by the colonized, "The first shall be last and the last shall be first," he says. The new man will also have a new culture when the proletarian literature and art, but after the revolution, what will it be like?

be like? HILLIARD: Anything that exists after the revolution would be legitimate. And I think that what Fanon represented was applicable to the Algerian conference. But I would rather take the Marxist-Leninist position and say that national culture is bourgeois culture and that the advocates of a national culture could only be expressing a culture of oppression.

could only be expressing a culture of oppression.

The only culture that we're interested in is an international culture, the proletarian culture where people can begin to move from a common interest against the common enemy. The kind of culture manifested in a proletarian internationalism would definitely be a revolutionary culture in the sense that all people would have the one thing in common. There would be a universality of will and a common language. And that language would be "Down with American Imperialism and all reactionary forces."

BARB: This was the language of the United Front's first confer-ence, (to Seale) Also, at the con-ference you referred several times to "jive anarchists" and "jive Trotskyists," Who were you talk-ing about? SEALE: I meant that there are

many students who act in a very anarchistic manner. We understand that they can't relate to organization at all. Most of them we find are only interested in laying up someplace where they can blow weed and drop acid. But when you talk about the people's struggle, when you want to serve the proletariat, then you have to use some sort of organization. And these people that I mentioned at the conference have no real interest in that. You have to go forth, not with weed, but with something functional for the peo-

revolutionary comrades. We wouldn't use such narrow means for weeding people out.

But the one thing that we're very careful of doing now is distinguishing between real friends and real enemies.

BARB: What is the attitude of the Panthers toward SDS? Have you heard anything from them since the United Front conference? Are they going to work with the National Committees on the police decentralization petitions?

SEALE: They refuse to circulate the petition in their own white

ple. These students are anarchistic. Their whole way of doing things is out of context with the principles we put forth for the struggle.

BARB: And the Trotskyists? They aren't anarchists, What does the Panther Party feel toward Trotskyist organizations?

HILLIARD: The arguments that took place in Russia between Stalin and Trotsky still reside in the museums of history. We don't condemn Trotsky since he was an integral part of the Bolshevik Revolution. We only condemn Trotsky's later actions—when he cut himself off from the lumpen masses and took the side of the Social Democrats, But it's a historical question, as I said.

We have no disagreements with the advocates of Trotsky. He led Lenin's opposition as General of the Red Army and the man did some good things. So that we don't use Trotsky as a point of departure or a point of association when we ally ourselves with our

communities. Their politics are messed up. If they want to go around propogating some absurd stuff about how revolutionary they are, and if they think they're going to come in here and try to run things in the black community, then they got it all backwards. The best thing they can do is to respect the Young Patriots, because the Young Patriots are going to circulate that petition like hell. We relate to the Young Patriots because they're operating on the same class level as the Black Panther Party. HIL LLIARD: Myattitude--and Ithink that I share a unity of concept

HILLIARD: Myattitude--and Ithink that I share a unity of concept and will with the Party--is that SDS is a little dizzy from success. They have asserted the right of the revolutionary vanguard of the mother country, but the Black Panther Party doesn't endorse that. We don't see SDS as being so revolutionary. We relate to the Young Patriots and the suffering masses.

We see SDS as being just another

pacification front that's being given credit by the Fascist establishment in order to cause diffusion. The establishment credits them in the hope that it will weaken support for the Black Panthers. They had better get their politics straightened out because the Panthers are drawing some very clear lines. We're not going to be attacked by any of those mother-fuckers from the oppressor country.

BARB: There's been talk among
some of the young white radicals
about taking up the gun. There
was a lot of this at the conference
and some since then. Where do
you think that's at?

HILLIARD: We say that theory
means nothing without social practise. We say that they must do

said to..take up the gun, we say
that power comes from the barrel

SDS will not attain any revolutionary credibility just because

Because there's been a coup in America. The Panthershave over-thrown the Roy Wilkinses, the James Farmers-it's clear that the Black Panther Party is the only recognized government for black people. That was made obvious by our invitation to the Algerian festival We were the guests of the Algerian government and we were there in the midst of all the liberation struggles against U.S. imperialism around the world. And we made some important links while we were there.

We're drawing some very clear lines. Tell SDS that at the rate that they're moving, they've got a lot of cleaning up to do
BARB: Well, SDS seemed to have fairly good relations with the Panther Party before the United Front conference. Is this new attitude toward SDS directly related to the conference?

HILLIARD: Well, we say that the

toward SDS directly related to the conference? HILLIARD: Well, we say that the conference was like a magnifying glass. The conference was sort of a de-settling process. It was a weeding out the good from the bad. Some distinctions were made be-tween reactionary and revolution-

tween reactionary and revolutionary.

We found that all the so-called revolutionaries from the oppressor country are just as oppressive as they always were in the past. They're not revolutionaries --they're national chauvinists; they're national socialists. acute case of racism, the kind that's manifested in every organization that they're allowed to participate in.

We're sick and tired of them trying to dictate to us how we should run our struggles. We are the vanguard of the struggle; not because we're Black Panthers, but because we are black, and our situation as such dictates that we must be vanguard in order to survive.

I think that they ought to be reminded that if it were not for the Black Panthers and black people as a whole, there would be no need for SDS. That's our position, and if they think we're jiving, let them make one more reactionary statement against us.

BARB: Out of the 300 organiza-tions at the conference, which ones emerged from it that you consider to be real friends? Which groups do you feel you can count

SEALE: We think that the Young Patriots exemplify the people's struggle in the mother country and we respect them because of the class level that we both exist on. We don't relate to a bunch of jive bourgeois national socialists and national chauvinists who want to dictate what's happening in the black community. We respect the Young Patriots because they will work in their own white communities to raise the consciousness of the poor white working class. BARB: Other than the Patriots. What other groups do the Panthers relate to?

SEALE: We relate to a number of organizations, different kinds of organizations. The Medical Committee to Defend Human Rights is one. Youth Against War and Fascism is another. But some of the so-called revolutionaries, all the way over to SWP, are just jiving. They're lying to themselves. They don't even know what a black person is. They don't understand that black people aren't going to sit around and play no games with them They have to get up off of it.

Other organizations, the ones I've mentioned who will work, are respecting black people's right to self-determination and the internationalist line which we constantly put into practise. We relate to other people because our struggle is only a part and parcel of, and one with the whole world revolutionary struggle.

BARB: What's your relationship with the American Communist Party?

SEALE: We aren't against Communism at all. We DIG Communism. We do have some criticism of the American Communist Party, and lately they have related to some of that criticism. We told them to put a few more things into practise, and now they're doing better than some of the organizations because theyactually came out and did some real work to put the conference over. HILLIARD: Let's get it clear. What we're interested in is creating some conditions so that we can once and for all sit down, and the opinion that we voice will be an internationalist opinion that will be the opinion of the people.

All these little splinter-groups, all these little boy-scout and brownie groups that call themselves revolutionaries are coming up against something that is obviously too revolutionary for them to deal with.

They criticize the circulation of our petition, not because they're not intelligent enough to realize the revolutionary implications of it, but because one always finds excuses for taking the line of least resistance. SDS and all the other people of that lik are very well geared to doing that. They understand what the petition means.

It means that the Fascists won't be patrolling the black communities anymore, making it safe for the capitalist businesses. It means that the people of the community would have control over the guns in the neighborhood. Then you'll

see the people exerting some power. The power would be in the hands of the people, and we see that as a revolutionary steptoward making the revolution, toward seizing the means of production.

seizing the means of production.

Anyone who can't see this is either an idiot or an opportunist. If SDS can't see this, then they're not involved in revolution at all; in fact, they're actually a part of the oppression.

Pm satisfied myself that SDS isn't revolutionary. All that they did was to give play to our tenpoint program. They said that they ADOPTED the Panther program. They must think that the Panthers are a bunch of ignorant niggers. niggers.

niggers.

The SDSers, the PLers, the pigs and Fascists had all better get it straight that we have a mind of our own. Yes, we support Al Fatah in the Palestinian struggle. We support who we want to support and we're here to make revolution. If those mother-fuckers are in opposition to that revolution, then that just means we'll have to muster more guns in our community in order to move against all the racists, be they young or old.

BARB: I don't think that SIG IS questioning the revolutionary aspects of the police decentralization program But they feel that since the Fascists won't leave power by force of petition, why put the time on the program?

SEALE: This would be the last ditch stand of the ballot or the bullet, just like Malcolm X put forth. From there the people will understand that you can't use today that which you used in the past. You must first exhaust the political means. The Party has to work with the level of consciousness of the people.

We're not going to fall victim to prophetics. We're not prophets and we realize that all revolutions are dependent on the actions of the people. Weapons are not really decisive in the final analysis. But we don't have a blue-print for the revolution. We don't have a crystal ball

All that we know is that our decentralization program would have very profound effects, it would be a Ph.D. in political understanding for the masses

We expect all the people who were in attendance at the national conference to have the courage to circulate that petition. Now we say that would be a vanguard step, even for SDS. We're not going to let them worm their way out of their duties. If they are revolutionary, then this is what we, as the vanguard of the revolution in Babylon dictate—that they circulate that petition, not in our communities, but in their own.

We want to have control over the people who patrol our neighborhoods. We want to de-centralize the community imperialists. We want to put socialism into practise, even if it's only on a community level at first.

That's probably too Marxist-Leninist for those mother-fuckers to understand, but Stalin was very clear on this point--that socialism can be implemented in a single country.

We say that it can be put into practise in a single community. Any mother-fuckers that come in here moving against our program are in fact supporting the imperialists and the fascists, and we're going to deal with them. We're not going to look upnames. We're not going to check out their long hair. The only thing we're going to start checking out is credits and what they've put into practise. We're damn tired of people slinging phrases, because we're up against the wall and we know what the Fascists have in store for us, so we're working on a time schedule.

We're putting every ounce of our energy into bringing Eldridge Cleaver back to Babylon. And we're going all out to get Huey Newton out of jail, get his feet on the ground again and have him functional. And, in the end, we're going to liberate the black community.

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VIOLENT GENERATION THE

America is many things, among them the greatest and the sickest nation in the world. The Violent Generation is one symptom of this sickness, which is yet producing generations of Americans who will grow up to be mentally disturbed, non-productive, allenated, violent enemies of the State and of one another. The over-thirty generations prefer to wallow in self-righteousness ("America is NOT a sick country!") rather than face this problem, and thus they react to symptoms of it with repression, like parents and teachers who punish neurotic children for being neurotic. This has resulted in a national trend towards, on the one hand, social disintegration and, on the other, governmental totalitarianism.

Assaults on the fence surrounding "Peoples Park" exemplify the first phenomenon while legislation to crack down on such activities is typical of the second. If the Violent Generation continues to riot on behalf of non-issues and lost causes, it will precipitate a complete crack-down without having even afforded itseii a real chance to overthrow the Establishment and change American society -- it will have lost its cake without having even tasted it. The members of the Violent Generation are rebels without a cause, thrill-seeking gladiator types who gain sado-masochistic pleasure from violent confrontation with the Heat. They cannot win because they have no goals; they will die because they are outnumbered and out-gunned.

That the Violent Generation wants to lose its "struggle" against the Establishment is evidenced by, among other things, the lengths it has gone to isolate itself from potential allies in that "struggle." Rather than attempt to communicate its "ideas" about what is wrong with America, for example, the sado-masochistic Violent Generation prefers to categorically denounce everyone not committed to itself as a fascist, rascist, pig capitalist exploiter—a sure way to win support. Worse than this, however, are its actual "views" on what is wrong with America. Not that there is any intellectual consistency or cohesive political thought among the Violents, but when asked just what it is that they have against America, they invariably utter nonsensicalisms about there not being enough "freedom and equality."

Making the generous assumption that the Violents really do want to improve American society, what may one infer from their bellicose demands for more "freedom" and "equality?" First, it should be obvious that the freest and most egalitarian country in the history of mankind is not going to solve its problems by suddenly inaugurating even more freedom and equality; if anything, the fact that America's problems have worsened throughout a period of great freedom and equality would indicate the appropriateness of an opposite course.

The cry for "freedom" and "equality" is a sham, a cowardly snivel voiced in lieu of the truth, which is that the Violents really crave and need order, authority, and discipline: they are filthy because they want to be forced to be neat; they are insolent because they want to be disciplined; and they are violently destructive because they want to be forced to behave constructively.

The single, overriding failure of America's older generation, the one which could spell death for it and for the United States, is its colossal failure to integrate its own sons and daughters into American society. The American middle-class is producing young people who are incompatible with it, is rejecting them, and is, in turn, being rejected by them—this is the mechanism of social allenation today. The Violents represent only the most extreme manifestation of this failing, however, the tip of the iceberg, beneath which there are a million more young Americans with no

neath which there are a million more young Americans with no

The Violents themselves are the children of Liberalism, of unmasculine, incompetent, weak, inhibited, self-doubting-guilt-ridden fathers and unfeminine, managerial, inhibited, guilt-ridden mothers who raised them to believe in nothing save uncertainty. At school they were taught irrelevencies and were pushed, by their status-conscious parents to pursue a college-preparatory course of studies, which is even more irrelevant to life. The males, moreover, were systematically humiliated and degraded by being forced to compete with female students, who out-shined them because females mature faster than males, and were demascullnized by their maladjusted, managerial female teachers, who gravitated between mothering and abusing them.

Then came the university. Those who had been successfully conditioned to be competitive got in and stayed in for four years or more, only to discover upon graduating that there was little opportunity in America for anyone unable to be phoney, practice cuthroatism, and dedicate himself to years of non-creative, unproductive, uninteresting labor. It was at this point that the parents said: "Well, good luck; it's been nice knowing you," And so THEY dropped out.

The Drop-outs continued to like the physical comforts of middle-class existence, and for this their parents called them "bums," since they would not work. Many, in particular the Flower Children, decided to live in poverty rather than sponge off their parents, and for this they were called "pigs," An attempt to create a paradiscal alternative to suburbia in the Haight-Ashbury failed because the Establishment could not let it succeed and because the Flower Children were irresponsible. Thus many Drop-outs ended up in Berkeley, where they came under the influence of the revolutionary Ginks. But why the attraction to Ginkdom?

Ginkdom?

The Drop-outs have embraced Ginkdom or come under the influence of the Ginks first because they are both destructive and self-destructive and Gink activities of fer innumerable opportunities to commit acts of destruction and self-destruction and, second, because only the Ginks have offered active opposition to the Establishment.

The type of society the Ginks would create however, can be seen in Russia, China, Cuba, North Vietnam, and 1984, vulgar slave societies dedicated to the maintenance of power over the many by a few depraved oligarchs who live to torture people. Is this the type of society for which the street people of Berkeley are fighting? Probably not, since they do not think far enough ahead of their actions to make any serious plans for real social change. For what kind of society, then, should young people be willing to fight?

The New Society must, above all, be a just one, and a just so-

ciety can survive only if it is founded upon the Truth, especially the Truth about the nature of human beings. This means that young people who are interested in the creation of a new society must reject the popular myths that "all men are equal" and all people want to live in "freedom" and want to be "free."

Those who understandhumanity, be they good or evil, know that the notion that "all men are equal" is untrue and is, moreover, the product of the depraved Liberal intellect. To fight for a society in which "all men are equal" is a waste of time, since no such society has ever existed or will ever exist, since if cannot exist. The Liberal notion that all people want to be and should be "free" is equally ridiculous, for everyone who understands humanity knows that human beings are social and like to live in groups (societies), which are governed by leaders, in primitive societies leadership being determined by charisma and tradition, while in sophisticated ones it is determined by a complicated process known as politics. And one cannot be "free" so long as he is governed by others.

Young people must fight for a society founded upon the principle that all people are DIFFERENT, having different personal characteristics, abilities, and needs, and which is organized to make the most of these differences. First, there are three fundamentally different groups or classes of human beings: men, women, and children. The Liberals and the Ginks squeal with rage whenever anyone dares to point out that men, women, and children equal; men who make the worldgo'round, for better or worse, who are responsible for the advances and declines of civilization, and whohave it within their power to make a he aven or a hell of human existence. Normal

iticians, or statesmen. Normal, healthy women living in a normal, healthy society make excellent lovers, wives, and mothers but are not suited by nature to excell at the above endeavours. The squeals of the local Lesbian League to the contrary ("male chauvinismi"), these immutable human traits are the products of at least tens of millions of years of evolution and must be well considered when deciding upon what types of inter-sexual relationships the New Society should promote.

Children, and particularly adolescents, must be recognized as adults in the making, not as miniature adults. Children are dedependent, immature, and incompetent by nature, and adolescents at ransition period which can bring the child to maturity, competence, and independence from parents, i.e., to adulthood, but which too often does not, as witness the innumerable "adults" today who are just overgrown adolescents. The New Society must above all concern itself with the successful growth of its children into adults.

The New Society, then, must be one which is centered around and run by men. But which men? All men are not equal but different, a few having great ability and a few having great ability and a few having great ability, but with most in between. Clearly, the rulers of any society should be, and usually are, men of great ability. But they are not always good men, nor do they always follow good policies. A great task of the New Society, then, will be to seek out good men of ability and place them at the head of a government in which they will be disposed to do good work.

The best way to achieve this is to give the governors a sufficient amount of power to accomplish their tasks and, in addition, to give them great honor and glory, for having this, which is prized by good men above all else, they will desire no further power nor will they be disposed to dishonesty or aggrandizement, since this would betray the trust vested in them, making them less than they were and gaining them nothing, but rather they will undertake to rule mo

The greatest tyrants in history, Hitler, Stalin, and Mao, personally avoided material extravagance; personal comfort meant nothing to them, for they cared only about

power, which they experienced by torturing people.

power, which they experienced by torturing people.

Young people must reject their inherited prejudices a gainst honoring and glorflying their fellow men and particularly their rulers. They must reject the notion that all men shouldparticipate in the decision-making process, for all men are not competent to make important decisions. It is sufficient to choose good leaders and rely upon them to make the right decisions.

Those politicians who publically reject this concept out of supposed love for "democracy," "the common man," and "the will of the people," whatever these innane slogans mean, are hypocrites who have contempt for the people they rule; these include most politicians today, from psuedo Liberal pigs like Boss Daly of Chicago to the aforementioned tyrants. Young people must reject the clamouring of the Ginks for "peoples" this and "peoples" that, realizing that the Ginks abhor the people and all human pleasure and live only for revolution and power. Young people must remember that the most tyrannical dictatorships in history have been those established "in the name of the people."

Voung people must reject Ginkdom and the Violent Generation, s mall but destructive forces headed only for destruction, and they must fight for the creation of a New Society, founded upon the Truth about and the needs of human beings. It must be a society in which children can be happy as children and then grow successfully into adults, in which men and women can relate happily to each other sexually, personally, and socially as is natural, and in which good and able men govern not in the name of "the people" but in the name of Justice, not for what is popular but for what is right.

It must be a society in which there are no isolated members and, therefore, no alienation, in which sexual, family, and social relationships are correct and natural and there is, therefore, no mental illness, and a society which rewards the worthy with honor and glory, thereby precluding the growth of materialism, the worship of the accumulation of material goods as the highest mark of personal success.

The first priority of Young People today should therefore be to get off their ass, quit wandering a imlessly around Telegraph Avenue, Haight Street, and places like that, ignore the Ginks, and start building a new, dynamic movement around new leaders and new ideas to create the New Society for which they have supposedly been fighting by assaulting the Peoples Fence and "the pigs."

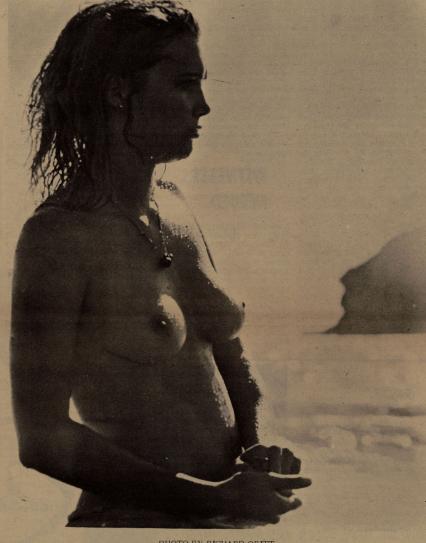

On August 16th and 17th, a conference will be held at the University of California Medical Center in San Francisco entitled LSD, THE PSYCHEDELIC EXPERILENCE AND BEYOND. This conference will be jointly sponsored by the U. C. Psychopharmacology Study Group, the Guy S. Millberry Union, and the Haight-Ashbury Free Clinic.

The objectives of the conference will be three-fold: 1) To present the latest information on the chemistry, pharmacology, and toxicology of LSD and related psychedelic drugs including an analysis of two often quoted but poorly documented statements that "LSD leads to brain damage" and that "LSD leads to brain damage" and that "LSD leads to genetic damage;" 2) to review the psychedelic experience including its potential value in psycho-therapy and its effect on contemporary American society; and 3) to analyze "nondrug turn ons" or techniques of achieving psychedelic chemicals. Specific presentations will be made by a panel of outstanding experts including Dr. Alexander Shulgin, Dr. Kay Blacker, Dr. Stuart Loomis, DR. STAN GROF (Prominent Czechoslovakian psychiatrist and LSD psychotherapist), DR, GENE SCHONFELD ("Dr. Hip-Pocrates"), DR. TIM-O'THY LEARY, Dr. Earl Marsh, and DR, DAVID SMITH.

Proceedings of the symposium, LSD, THE PSYCHEDELIC EX-PERIENCE AND BEYOND, will be published in Vol. 3, Issue 1, of the Journal of Psychedelic Drugs, published by the Haight-Ashbury Clinic. (For those who already have subscriptions to the Journal, it is hoped that Vol. 2, Issue 2, on Amphetamine Abuse will be available for distribution at the symposium, As in the case of prior symposiums involving the H-A Clinic, volunteers and donations will be solicited for continuation of the clinic's work, For those who have continuing interest in the various free clinics that have developed in the U.S., descriptive literature regarding the National Free Clinic Council and its November 15th, 16th symposium on free clinics is also enclosed, All inquiries and registration for both symposia should be directed to: LSD Symposium, ia 94122.

Imagine two Fillmore Wests, both subsidized by the federal and city government, each coughting up 40% to avoid any power hassles. Each would have, besides the main dance floor, abar and coffee house: in one there would be a room for movies and a t.v. room, in the other a half a dozen rooms for free form grooving. And it all costs 55 cents!

Well, in Amsterdam, Holland this is more than a wistful pipedream, it's a habit. It startedover two years ago with a club called the Sigma Magic. Contrary to some of the bullshit that's been coming out of the straight press on Amsterdam recently, these clubs weren't started as a sociological experiment and there are no sociologists on their four-man staffs and grass is not distributed by the staff. Sigma Magic was started by a city government harrowed by streets full of aimless, bored kids. About a year ago, while the Fantasio was sprouting up on the waterfront, the S.M. shitted over to the Free Church and became the Paradiso where it will wait another year and a half during the building of a bigger and better Paradiso by the government.

Right now Amsterdam is the most promising and fastest growing scene in Europe, It's a relatively small city of less than 500,000 people, with the main part being the old part of town resembling on a map the aerial view of a Greek Theatre. Though they're reserved, the Dutch give hardly any shit at all to hip people (especially compared to, say Italy or Germany). And in spite of contentions by businessmen that the hippies have hurt the tourist rade, the movement to legalize grasshas

This would just be a legal gesture anyhow. The aroma of euphoria pops up everywhere, street corners, street cars, even the telegraph office. Ironically the one place I never smelled it was the main hip daytime hangout, the square in front of the royal palace. Busts aren't unknown, however, just extremely uncommon. As Fred Wessel, art director for the Paradiso and a former associate of The Fool (ex-designers for the Beatles) explains, "They (the police) look at grass the way they look at prostitution, Did you know prostitution is illegal here? Ya, so ya see ...," tralling off with a chortle and a gesture toward what claims to be and must be the biggest and best stocked red light district in Europe. The chicks sit reading or knitting, in microskirts and halters a hairs-breadth above nipple level, in display windows under blacklights. And there's a police station right on one of the main streets of the district.

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The permissiveness has somehow been interpreted by straight reporters as official sanction. A cover story in Nova, a sort of British McCall's, claimed that hash and grass were distributed by the clubs themselves.

"I wish we could sell it," said Wessel. "Actually, though, the police come in here once or twice a week. They're just looking for the big dealers though,"

Considering the price of admission, 2 gilders (about 55 cents), neither club can afford to pay much for groups. Yet while I was there Richle Havens play two nights at the Fantasio. This club doesn't have as much "formal" entertainment as the Paradiso. It does have a kind of coffee room with a stereo in the front of the building. The main dance hall has an elevated stage and, the night I was there, a carpet of bodies grinning beatifically in the blare of huge stereo speakers.

I missed Havens, but the night I was there was one of those several nights a week, for both clubs, whenthey don't have groups. They just open the doors and close the ticket booths. Although it may be larger in that it has more rooms scattered about, the rooms in the Fantasio are smaller, so there's a more intimate atmosphere, like one big living room. Everyone, everywhere is stoned. There's no paranoia at all and you can be sure you'll be asked several times if you want to score some hash or grass.

In fact, one night in the lobby of the Paradiso I was grabbed by some brute, a head bigger than me, who told me to with his eyes, but asked with his voice, if I would buy some hash. I avoided complicated explanations about my abstinence, and the consequences of a blunt no, by saying I was broke. This sent him flying off to the next possible client.

When I got on the dance floor I was amazed at the similarity between it and the old Fillmore,

they are almost identical. On stage there was a light show squirming all over a Salvation Army rock band that actually didn't sound too bad. Wessel had said that anyone who wanted to play or preach there got their chance. Later a really fine group called (Ithink) the Blues Machine came on.

There was a small room with escalated bleachers where a Laurel and Hardy movie was showing. Upstairs there was a bar with music going, situated in the same place in the building and about the same size as the restaurant in the old Fillmore. Like all the rooms in both clubs this was comfortably crowded, there was always a place to sit and there were dope deals being haggled over in most corners.

It's hard to guess at the future of this scene, already rot has set in, in the form of a smack and speed clique. Although both clubs are completely tolerant of grass and hash, as Wessel said, with a lot of conviction, "Anyone caught shooting up is out." This is a smooth, calm urban scene with still more potential than has already been realized. I hope it doesn't contract the Haight-Ashbury blues.

## WITNESSES NEEDED

San Francisco police have instituted a campaign of harassment against the so-called "sex theatres" of the City. There are about 23 theatres in San Francisco which fall into this category; their shows specialize in various types of skin flicks,

Last Friday Afternoon at 3:30 PM. two officers came in with a warrant, informed owner Jim Mitchell that he was under arrest, and confiscated 1300 feet of a film called "Lessons In Love" they claimed was "obscene."

"They send their people in every week to view the films," manager Jack Edwards explained. "They bring cameras with them and photograph stills right off the screen. Then they write a report, show their pictures to a judge, and get a bench warrant.

"The interesting thing about this," Edwards continued, "is that the police acting in their line of duty become the judicial review. There are no other witnesses than the police present at the hearing. Just what kind of movies does the theater show? "Nothing different than the kind of thing Hollywood and foreign films have shown in the past few years. Implicit rather than explicit fucking. We're using filmakers from University Departments of film-making -- real artsy-craftsy stuff -- and still they bust us. Our position is that we are going to continue taking an artful approach to films which we feel are genuinely erotic. We see nothing wrong with showing erotic movies."

Here are some juicy exerpts from the police report describing the confiscated films:

"A male and female in the complete nude engage in mouth-to-mouth kissing, tongue-to-tongue kissing, and mouth to body kissing, of each other's face, neck, breasts, and pubic area."

"The climax of the film involves the female mounting on top of the male who is on his back in a simulation of -sexual intercourse."

"A female stands in a tub while he places his face on the pubic area of the standing female in what appears to be an act of oral copulation."

According to Edwards, the courts are not behind the police. "They had one conviction in the last two years but they continue to make arrests," he said, "It's just harassment -- I think its the so-called legitimate theater owners are putting the pressure on us because we're taking some of their business away. The cops said they would be in every Tuesday. It costs you a couple of grand every time you get arrested, but we're going to continue showing these movies."

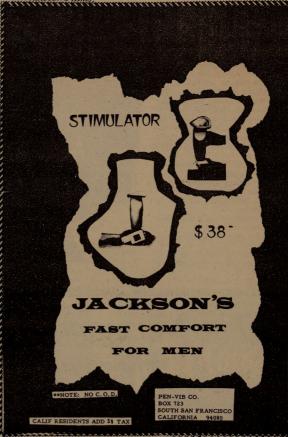

# **POWER**

This is a new column. We're going to rap about light shows and visual art. It is new not only to the BARB, but also to the world. We're going to get into the visual environment in ballrooms and into how light shows lift your head. To begin a discussion on a few of the basic aspects of the art form as they have been developed by local talent will tell how bay area shows are set apart from those of the rest of America. Light shows have two basic parts: things that move, and things that stand still. The show's focus is the moving part; things that stand still achieve interest from the way they are assembled, overlapped or changed in color content. The first category - things that move - includes liquids, films, and individual special effects. The second category ideals with sildes, overhead masks, color wheels and flash disks.

What sort of trips do the shows get into through movement? Some use it only as a highlight, concentrating on building assemblages into cohesive total environments. Other shows deal with the kinetic movement as an end in itself: to keep the environment as totally fluent as possible; to offer nothing as a fixed focus. The first method highlights the flow of sounds; the second method moves on to the speed and action of the ballroom.

What are the in-between uses that liquids get into? Why do some look like organic roots eating across the stage, and others like amoebas growing, breaking, receding and growing again in multifingered shapes?

It all has to do with the materials used in the dish and the proportions in which they are mixed that determines the appearance of the liquid. A proportion-guiding rule of thumb is that the lighter the total combination of liquids in a dish, the faster the action on the screen to get a good effect. A dish with alcohol and only a little oil unit of give flowing patterns, but will produce speedy, spidery effects. And a dish with oil and only a

little water and alcohol will simply not work fast. This process permits the water to flow in organic shapes through the oil.

DISH COLORING

Dish coloring is a whole trip in itself. Each show uses slightly different techniques or mixtures, producing distinctive colors and patterns to liquids, some shows color just the water -- others, just the oil, and others color both. The brightness of the projectors controls the intensity and saturation of the coloring that the show can use in its dishes. This is especially the case when both the oil and water are colored from opposite sides of the special triangle. The water colors used come in many different varieties, from simple food coloring to specialized flourescent dyes. The same can be said of oil dyes, butthey are harder to use and control than water dyes.

Each of the liquids an color dyes earns a separate place on the light artist's palate because of the different effects produced upon the dish. Each can alter the water and oil reaction. Each can change the liquid's surface tension. Perhaps the worst consequence is that each can precipitate out if the dish gets hot, leaving muddy colors behind.

An entirely different feeling is achieved when there is only one dish on the projector and the coloring is made to flow in marbled patterns on the top of inert liquids. This is the type of liquid the HOLY SEE has perfected. For your own fun, try some Pental Ink dropped into a can of water. You'll see that it takes a good deal of experimenting to get it to behave just the way you want it to.

This column has not even scratched the surface of what goes on in a light show. In the future, as individual shows get a chance to discuss their techniques here, a good number of the methods will be revealed.

One last word: if you dig a light show, tell someone involved with it; if you don't dig it, tell him that, also. Light artists need and want to communicate with you.

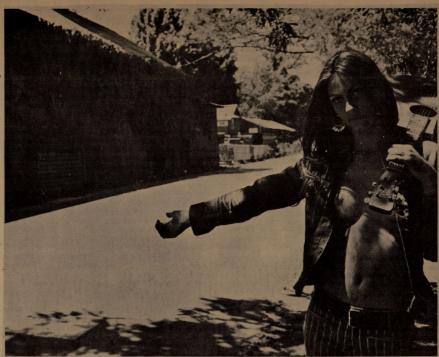

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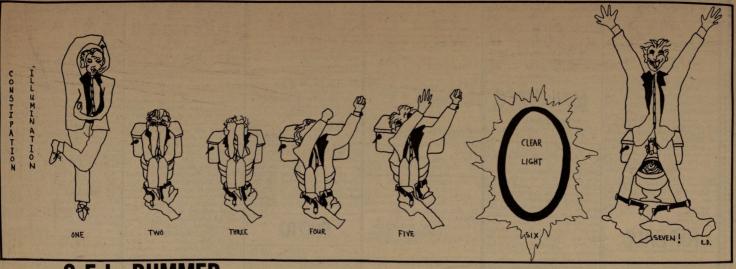
