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

Dear Sir: I am presently trapped in slav-ery to the military. A year ago I joined the Coast Guard to avoid the bloody Vietnam War and per-haps do some service to humanity. As it turned out I was grossly disallusioned by the bullshit the recruiters feed you. Since I've been in I've been screwed out of Hospital Corps-man School, put to work doing the most routine worthless jobs imag-inable. My personal life has been so restricted and confined by the Gun-Ho bastards that runthe fuck-ing outfit that I can no longer stand it.

I've always had psychological difficulties in dealing with people and at times become super de-pressed and have a long record of suicide attempts, I don't think I have to add that the service ag-gravates this condition. I am presently in a psychiatric ward trying to get discharged thru the channels but once the govern-ment has you it is difficult to get out.

I really dig on the BARB and what it represents. I've especially been following the trials of the "mutineers" at Fort Ord. Three of them escaped to Canada which is cool but Ithought they could legally be returned. Is this true? Iwould really appreciate any info on deser-tion and Canada. Thank you for any help.

In answer to letters like the above, the BARB offers the follow-ing information for servicemen who have had it with the military.

If you are planning to desert, Canada would seem to be the logical choice. Sweden is making it in-creasingly difficult on deserters, although they still admit some. Air fare to Sweden is \$288, one-way. However, if you are admitted, Sweden provides language training welfare benefits, and schooling for political refugees. France is some-what less hospitable, but does pro-vide 3-month work - immigration visas.

According to the Committee to Ad American War Objectors (P.O. Gesterers are expeditiously getting anded immigrant status in Van-couver. They advise:

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A deserter who has a high school degree and at least a year's experience in white collar or skill-ed trade work probably can get landed. A person without a high school degree but with a trade, skills, or membership in a skills trade union probably can get land-ed. A person with two years of college but no specific job skill can probably get landed.

2) A deserter can come into the country as a visitor; he could marry a Canadian girl while here. This will almost automatically as-sure his admittance as a landed immigrant. (The BARB has learn-ed that there are many Movement chicks who will gladly "marry" anyone - - - on paper - - - to help remove them from the Amer-ican military machine.)

3) A final possibility is that a deserter use Canada as a jumping off point for going to Sweden, Yugoslavia, France, or some country where he can be accepted either as an immigrant or political refugee. One way to facilitate this would be to acquire a passport while he is in the service. If not he should keep with him his military (Jp, and/or orders to shipout to Nam. These should be hidden from border officials.

For those deserters who are attempting to get landed immi-grant status from within Canada, there will be a lengthy waiting period of up to three months, during which they are not officially allowed to work. This period of limbo may be cut down by having certain documents available, in-port, including school transcripts, marriage license or diverse papers, birth certificate, letters of recommendation. A few hundred in cash always helps.

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

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HUNGER STRIKE

28 prisoners at the Los Angeles County Jail went on a hunger strike on August 5 to protest their inhuman treatment. After 10 days of abstaining completely from food, authorities held a conference with 5 of the prisoners and promised to correct the grievances.

This Wednesday BARB got ano-ther call from Beaty. He told us that lass Friday he and 4 other strikers met with an Inspector Welch, from Administrative Ser-vices, and discussed their situation with him. Welch said that the pri-son was trying to clean its own backyard out, meaning the prison a ut hor it i es didn't want any out-siders coming in and finding out what has been going on in there. Beaty retorted by saying that when he violated the penal code, the state didn't give him a chance to clean HS backyard out. The Inspector did agree to better quality food, more of it, and more time to eat it. This has already been implemented. Beaty said that "the food has improved 100%. It's even hot." The Inspector agreed to fix the ventilation system, which has been broken for a long, long time, keeping the men "drown-ing in their sweat day and night." Prisoners that do not feel sick enough and complain enough." Beaty has still not seen the D.A. to proceed with his civil suit against the guard that beat him, but the luspector promised that he would see that Beaty could get to the D.A. Beaty said that the prisoners were happy about the changes so far but would still be wary until every grievance was rectified. If there is one thing not set straight, the men will all go on a hunger strike again. These men went 10 days without a bit to eat, to get what they know are their birth-rights, convicts or not, and they will do it again if they have to. That a 32-year-old man with a 20 year criminal record acts like Mahatma Ghandi while the pillars of law and order that guard him act like cowardly sadists seems to

the chips are already stacking up for the Battle of SF State, Part II. Back with us next fall, in the strengthened position of perman-ent president, is S.I. Hayakawa, the favorite college administrator of most people who know nothing about colleges. Also returning for the resurrec-tion will be many of the top student and faculty leaders who led the smothered strike last year. New to the crisis scene will be hundreds of freshmen and trans-fer students, most of them radical and already salivating for a piece of the action, and a beyy of new legislative ammunition in Hayaka-wa's arsenal. Leaving SF State, however, will be probably a few thousand sun-shine radicals, d is ill us ion ed liberals, and mostly "serious stu-dents just here for an education." Despite Hayakawa's strong grip on the college, and possibly be-cause of it, there will be a resump-tion of long-term, intense demon-strations at SF State, whether in the form of a general strike or scattered er uption s like at UC Berkeley. Late last spring, after the strike

They have been too busy rebelling and/or wandering around Tele-graph Ave, or Haight St, to think realistically about alternatives to the present, and thus they not only do not know where they are going, they have failed to command the respect of those who might be pursuaded to help them. Despite the President's Bureau of Consumer Standards, no one has tried to help the consumer of "illegal" drugs, who is often faced with the problem of getting burned. The following information is furn-ished in the public interest by Your Friendly (Honest) Neighbor-hood Dope Dealers of America, Inc.

ACID MARKET:

THE ACID MARKET: There is now lots of good acid available in the Bay Area. One recent batch we saw (going for about \$2.00 a tab) are the so-called "drop-ons". These are vitamin C tablets which are coated with LSD, so that you can get high and stay healthy at the same time. These pills have come up from L.A. They are good, but they have a drawback, since the acid is exposed to the air in a light surface coating, the tabs will lose their strength after a couple of weeks. Storing them in the refrigerator helps to prently available is prepared in the form of small blue, green, and pink pills. They are touted as contain-ing 250 - 300 mics of acid. ORPHANS WITH PARENTS WANT ONE?

In the U.S. today there are 300,000 children in public and pri-vate welfare agencies. Upwards of 100,000 of these kids are prob-ably trapped in foster care, havé little or no hope of rejoining their parents, and are suffering mental napalming by the social welfare establishment.

In a foster home, love is occas-nal, and the child can be moved up 15 times before adulthood. If the ster parents show signs of loving e child, or if the child calls them om and dad, he is moved "to keep m from becoming attached." In-eed it is the social workers that ce responsible for keeping the hildren from being adopted into ermanent homes.

Rev. Calaman continued: "Over one half of the nation's adoptions are arranged on the grey market without the mediation of a social worker. There is no valid evi-dence to suggest that these private adoptions are any less successful than those through social welfare.

The Bureau of Social Services is unnecessary. Any mother who has a child whom she feels she can-not care for can put an ad in the newspaper and the child will disap-pear, adopted. The only problem is that the Bureau of Social Ser-vices can still take the child away from its adopting parents if they don't like them. But there may be a way around this also. When a pregnant mother goes to the hospital, she can take the LD, which belongs to the prospective adoptive mother with her, and the baby is born in the name of the adoptive parents. The natural mo-ther can't get the baby back even if she wants to. In this way, the

Neither Rev. Calaman nor I can recommend that this practice be undertaken, being illegal, but Rev-erend Calaman has people who are ady to adopt. Whatever you do, n't leave your baby with these option agencies or the county, n't leave you child in the care someone who wn't give him love.

Experiments with rats, morkeys and even plants have proven that those living things which are loved flourish, and those which don't receive love don't fare as well. And those which are ignored complete-ly wither and die. For example, a person might take 20 years of bad vibes, but to be ignored is insufferable. In the 20's, every single infant under 2 years who was put in a foundling home, died. Thousands of children died from a disease called Marasmus. The Apollo spacecraft will not be the symbol of the Twentieth Century. Nor will it be the com-puter, or the television, or the tab of LSD. Nor will it be the blooming mushroom cloud over Hiroshima. Unless they can come up with something better, the best expression of our times is bound to be the machinegun on the street-corner.

ary will soluting betty times is bound to be the machinegun on the street-corner. It's the simplest, most common symbol we have. It alone captures the mood and temper of the Third World today. In Algiers and Stan-leyville the people have come to know it well. In Budapest and Prague. In Tel-Aviv, in Korea, and in all the towns of Vietnam. In Havana and Santo Domingo and Mexico City. And in the cities of the far-flung black colony of Am-erica -- in Plainfield and Hough, and in Watts. A great deal depends on where you stand in relation to this fan-fastically effective piece of equip-ment. Wherever the tripod is set, that is the great line of de-marcation, our new Equator. That simply, it divides the world in two.

simply, it divides the world in two. For those caught in front of the machine-gun, their life and culture is one of oppression. Their cul-ture is defined in terms of this oppression, in terms of machine-guns and AK-47's and M-16's. This interview was recorded last week with Panthers Ray "Masai" Hewitt (Minister of Education) and Emory Douglass (Minister of Cul-ture). Both men were in Algiers for the Pan-African Arts Festival.

BARB: The Black Panther Party stands for the culture of the Rev-olution. It stands for an interna-tional culture, a proletarian cul-ture. Could you elaborate on these concepts a little and tell us what these words mean? HEWITT: The quickest way I can explain it is to say that our cul-ture serves our politics and our politics come out of the barrel of a gun. The culture of the op-pressed can only be revolution. When we talk about culture we're not talking about hanging onto heri-tage. Culture is something that must change as your objective con-ditions change; and if your eco-nomic base is one that's constantly been exploited, then the only cul-ture you can have is revolution. Anything else that you pick up or adopt and call it culture is really nothing but bullshit. This is a point that was clear to all the lib-eration fronts from Africa and Asia and Latin America that we met in Algiers. DOUGLASS: That's right. You must understand that bourgeois culture is for the few, for the rul-ing class. Bourgeois culture is decadent. It's something that de teriorates, it dies. It's some-thing that is stagnant. We stand for proletarian culture, which is for the massee. BARE; Well, how was this prole-

for proletarian culture, which is for the masses. BARB: Well, how was this prole-tarian culture manifested at the Pan African Arts Festival? HEWITT: The national liberation fronts were there from all over Africa. And there was one from Haiti. The Vietnamese national liberation front was there. The key emphasis of the conference

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Our center became the gather-ing place, the focal point for all uruly revolutionary forces. Two know, we've been painted as racists all over the world, so that may of the African brothers as-sociated the Panthers with oppres-sion. But when they came to our center and saw who we were and where we were at, they could see that somebody'd been telling them some lies. The thing that was most evident was that the people, the masses of Algiers, responded so favorable, that many of the cultur-al nationalist dignitaries who might have not come to our center, had to come. You couldn't say that you'd been to the festival unless you'd been to the Black Panther's center. We explained that we used the word BLACK instead of some-thing else because of the nature of the make-up of the ethnic groups in the United States -- how black people are congested in one com-munity, the Mexican - Americans are congested in another com-munity, and the whites are con-gested in another. We work in our own particular community. Our main concern is getting our pro-gram across to the black com-munity. That's why we use BLACK. But we also stated that the same program applied to the red com-munity, the white, the yellow, and all the other ethnic groups. BARB: The French student move-ment carries on its struggle on a much higher level than the white left in this country. They have a closer relationship with the work-ers, and they almost brought down the Gaullist regime in 1968. But Cohn-Bendit has made it very clear that their movement is basic-ally anarchistic. They have no helief in vanguard parties. How do the Panthers relate to anarch-ists who have demonstrated in practice that they have support from the workers, that they've done revolutionary work in their countries? Is there any chance that you could get together with movements like these? DOUGLASS: I think we possibly might be able to get together with them in some things, although I couldn't be definite on what if was a move to seize power I don't think we'd be able to work together because they had chance to seize power in France and they didn't do it. They just let that ride.

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

BARB: The Panthers have an in-ternationalist line that they put in-to effect. This is very impor-tant to them. But haven't most of the liberation struggles had a strong nationalist appeal? What's the proper balance to strike be-tween national orientation and in-ternational aliances? HEWITT: The national orientation is for national land, bread, hous-ing, clothing, education, justice and peace. But we saw the African national bourgeoisie at the Algiers festival. There were some very beautiful African sisters there who had outfits on -- it must have taken ten people to carry their wardrobes. But these were the clothes of the bourgeoisie. Any-one who has ever travelled in Afri-ca knew that this wasn't the dress of the everyday African. You saw the difference very clearly in the dress of the Arab oil-bearers, the poor farmers, the working: still trying to get some land and bread. These people were wearing robes that cost two and three hundred dollars a yard, but back home in their neo-colonialized countries, they have people starv-ing to death. The bourgeoise of Nigeria -- I don't see any of them involved in any kind of political discussions at all, and they've got mathess back home at the ranch. BARE: Well, the Algerian festival was a cultural festival and the Black Panthers stand for the culture of the Revolution. What's the best mainfestation of this culture? HEWITT: Well, we say that rev-olution is an art. BARE: What forms does this art take? Who are the artists? What materials are used? DOUGLASS: Well, the artists are

The students would be interdependent but not on a basis of economic exchange. Shri Jaya uses the analogy of the wheel to describe the type of sit-uation he wishes to set up. Each student would simultaneously be the hub and spokes of the wheel. The hub is the individual and the spokes are his various skills, with which he can participate with the group in a pattern of harmonious inter-action. In giving of themselves the students will be deploying their energy and their select skills for the use and benefit of their co-residents. Shri Jaya teaches a complete yoga system, which he breaks into three general levels; beginning, intermediate, and resident, or ad-vanced. He teaches basic hatha yo-ga, and besides teaching asanas and pranayama he gives a conten-

three 5 intermediate, an vanced. He teac ga, and beside and pranayama rual analysis rual analysis

Shri Jaya teaches karma yoga, which delves deeper intobreathing and meditation techniques, and ap-plies classical yoga into action for contemporary living. Nutritional yoga will play a large part in the center, learning about and cooking macrobiotic food, with a detailed examination of fasting and internal cleansing. Through all the levels there will be a systematic development of meditation practices and skills, sensitizing the individual and rais-ing his level of consciousness.

Shri Jaya will give lessons in continuing series and also unit lessons, where one lecture will exhaust a particular topic. Students will pay tuition, probably about \$125 a month for each of the 20 or 30 live-in students (which includes room and board), and non-resi-dents will be charged tuition by the course or lesson. There will be guest lecturers from the US and other parts of the world.




