


Delaware whipping post uprooted

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End The War Now, Mr. Nixon, Or The **People Will End Your Administration**

by Paul Cantor

On November 15 in the early morning the biggest anti-war de-monstration in history will begin in San Francisco and Washington

in San Francisco and Washington D.C. It may well prove to be the high-point of the peaceful anti-war movement in the United States. After it is over the Nixon admini-stration will respond to its demands and then the people in the movement will respond to the Nixon admini-stration's response. If the Presi-dent doesn't renounce support for the corrupt and unpopular Saigon Regime and, especially, if he re-fuses to immediately withdraw all U.S. troops from Vietnam, then the anti-war movement will continue. It is questionable, however, wheth-er it will continue to be so peace-ful.

ful, Already the Nixon administra-tion is moving hard to countermine the planned November anti-war ac-tions. It is widely understood that he will announce "further troop withdrawals" in his Vietnam speech on November 3, And, the highly publicized firing of General Hershey, the so-called year end moratorium on the draft, and the proposals that from now on only 19-year - olds be subjected to call were all attempts by the admini-stration to take some of the punch out of the anti-war movement, Together these actions provide ov-erwhelming evidence of the Nixon administration's view that the peo-ple in the movement are motivated only by self interest and not by a clear understanding of the issues involved or a sense of justice or regard for human life or even mor-ality. Already the Nixon administra-

clear understanding of the issues involved or a sense of justice or regard for human life or even mor-ality. Wice-president Spiro Agnew co-gently expressed the administra-tion's viewpoint when he said before a GOP dinner in New Orleans that the anti-war movement was "en-couraged by an effete corps of im-pudent snobs who characterize themselves as intellectuals." Perhaps the administration is right. Perhaps on November 3 when the President announces fur-ther troop withdrawals, he will separate a large number of people who are motivated solely by an ill conceived idea of what is their self interest from a small group of people who sense the moral out-rage which is the Vietnam war. But the people who are working to build the November peace actions are betting against it. They are baking their efforts on the belief hat the majority of people in this country share their outrage at the countnued U,S, involvement in Viet-nam and are at long last ready to act to make it clear to the President that the want out now.

200.000 PEOPLE

More than 200,000 PEOPLE pected to participate in the Novem-ber 15 action in San Francisco, That is the figure that is given with no sense of exaggeration by people who are building the action. More than 200,000 people is a figure equal to twice the population of Berkeley. But of course the people won't all be from the Bay Area. They will be from the Bay Area. 

November 13 is the first day of the two day November "No Busi-ness as Usual" Vietnam Mora-torium planned by the National Moratorium Committee to End the War in Vietnam. The Mora-torium Committee planned the one day October 15 work strike with the intention of escalating their action each month – two day strike in November, three days in Decem-ber, etc. – until all the troops are home. On November 14 the Student Moratoriation Committee to End the War in Vietnam (SMC) is plan-ning a one day student strike to help build support for the Novem-ber 15 marches. Local SMC's are also planning activities on high school and college campuses around the country, in support of the November 13 and 14 no busi-ness as usual Vietnam Moratorium. At San Francisco State, for in-stance, the SFS branch of SMC is planning a humber of activities including abenefit dance and a mock war crimes tribunal. The November 15 marches are bijasthon Committee to End the War in Vietnam (New Mobe). New Mobe is geared to all the people in the Country -- workers and organizations of all shades of pointor, encompass "individuals and organizations of all shades of opinion, from Students for a Dem-ocratic Society and other new Left radicals to established religious groups." What members of SMC and New Mob have in common is that they all support the demand thow.

ANTI-WAR COMMITTEES

AN II-WAR COMMITTEES The Student Mobilization Com-mittee was formed at a conference in Chicago in December, 1966, Since then it has played an active role in bullding massive anti-war demonstrations nationwide. It sees its primary role, however, as that of organizing high school and college students in opposition to the war. The fact that students have been the vanguard of the anti-war movement is a tribute to SMC's success. This year when the National SMC met in Cleveland on July 6 to plan its strategy for fall, 1969, it voted to endorse and work to sup-port the actions planned by New Mobe and the Moratorium Commit-tee,

Marxian philosopher Herbert Marcuse and black Communist Angela Davis received wild sup-port from a crowd of 4,000 in Lower Sproul Plaza Friday. The two main speakers addressed the students on the "oppressive na-ture" of capitalism in this coun-tre.

ture" of capitalism in this count try. The rally began with a state-mittee on Liberation or Death, a affiliate of the Third World biseration Front. Nabors dis-used the faces of oppression on world Liberation Front led last deats bitter Third World stu-tents trike. Marcuse and Davis were met with massed clenched fist sal-ties. The crowd stood up for the first speaker, Marcuse. The importance of the univer-sity as a staging area for radi-al political organization was stressed by Marcuse. In the university, Marcuse said, "the new consciousness, the new val-be and goals can be developed, destroy American society, but to

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ed, "must be only one instance in the fight against those who want to block your minds."

Marcuse asked the large crowd, "Is there any chance that this society is able and willing to abolish these conditions?" He answered his own question, and stated that he had little faith in the American "capitalist sys-tem."


stated that he had little faith in the American "capitalist sys-tem." Marcuse urged his audience to continue their demonstrations, and in particular, to "arouse conscience and consciousness" in the community and on campus. The students were called upon by

the philosopher to combat the "insanity" which has over taken the nation. The goal of enjoying life "with a good conscience - without guilt" was laid down by Marcuse. As he concluded, the crowd shout-ed approval for his demand that the Regents resign.

Returning to the issue of ra-cism which has made itself pre-sent in her case, Davis said, "If we aren't able to link up with these struggles for Third World liberation?, academic freedom becomes a farce." Davis denied the importance of

academic freedom unless it is part of "social and political free-dom." Academic freedom is a double edged sword, and profes-sors who "use the pretext of academic freedom" to conduct criminal military research should be confronted.

Davis concluded her speech with a proper definition of what academic freedom should in-volve. The liberty of students to criticize the "oppressive" quality of their lives, Davis said, was the central quarantee of social progress.

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tuitive infimations of value, truth, and beauty. Otherwise, nothing changes. The past goes on repeating itself, ad infinitum — or gets worse. One can "understand" another person, or his behavior, and still dislike, disagree with, and oppose him and it. A teen-ager who sponges off his friends, and parasitically exploits his elders, is still a disagreeable brat — even though one may recognize that being raised in a split home, living in an affuent society, and witnessing the greed of politicians and the military have all contributed to his attitude. But what does one do about it, NOW? Sentimentally "accepting" someone, merely because you can ten-tatively empathize with certain of his feelings, often robs him of the challenge to work toward understainding himself, and dealing with the psychic forces that are driving him. Confrontation with a viewpoint that's different, and experiencing the pain of defeat and frustration, is a powerful stimulus for conducting an inner search, and for coming to terms with those semi-conscious, disruptive mental agencies that cause us all trouble. And if the behavior that's not being "accepted" by other people turns out to be based on needs and images that we re-gard as genuine and valid, then an inner struggle and clarification can strengthen our resolve to hold on to them all the more — even in the face of opposition by the outer world. UNDERSTANDING is not merely "explaining" things in terms of their past causes. And it's not the "blaming" game — which only adds the element of anger to a presumed explanation of fault. Nor is it just empathy, identification, and "acceptance". It's a to tal response to the reality of what IS — both inner and outer — one's own needs and feelings, as well as what's happening objectively.

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

Another time around for the Gowboy Angel. Sure, you saw Pennebaker's "Don't Look Back," but what good did it do you? There you go, thinking Bobby Dylan's some kind of spe-cial fella. That's where you're wrong, he's just plain folks, folks. Listen, I know it, we all know it. To review anything by Dylan is to plan on disaster. We want to go giving him titles and things, making something out of him that be would never want to be. Hands off Dylan. All he really wants to do is be friends.

he would never want to be 'theme off Dylan. All he really wants to do is be friends. About the time that Dylan re-corded "Like a Rolling Stone," he wrote a song called "Crawl Out Your Window." One line runs: You got a lotta nerve to say you are my friend, if you won't crawl out your window. Is Dylan say-ing that to be his friend you have to take the risks he takes? What does he want, this Dylan? The film makes it clear that he certainly doesn't want other peo-ple's trouble. As teenage idol, his generation's spokesman, an-gry young folk-rock poet, and all the other nasty thing critics have called him, Dylan has suf-ficient problems of his own.

Dylan is a property. He is worth a great deal to many peo-ple. Newsmen exploit him for publication, hangers-on surround him, and listen, what use can you puthim to? Doesn't each of us have some-thing "significant" to say about Dylan. Very heavy dude' am I right? Extremely deep, if you know what I mean. And very spi-ritual, I even have a friend some-where who likes Blonde on Blonde, that fat double album, be-cause there's so much talk about on it.

Blonde, that fat double album, be-cause there's so much talk about onit. Bob Dylan sings song. You could call him a humdinger of a folksinger. You might also be wrong. He doesn't call himself anything. Oh, misguided Gene Youngblood of the L.A. Herald Examiner. Judging from his re-view I wonder if he actually saw the film: "FANTASTIC... There is an intense aura about Dylan, an electric, almost anarchistic excitement generated by him and about him. Perhaps more than any modern young artist, Dylan is the spokesman for the new society." What's the matter with that guy? In the movie, when Dylan reads that a newsman calls him an anarchist he says, "It prob-ably took them a while to think of that name ... anarchist, They couldn't say communist." He laughs on. "Anarchist, ohhh. A singer such as I." He finds the whole notion of labels a drag, even a label which stands in oppo-sition to labels. "I don't think it's cool to be an anarchist, though, Dylan says thoughtfully.

But isn't Dylan an anarchist! Perhaps a rough-hewn egalita-rian: He cursed me when I proved to him/ and I whispered and said not even you can hide/ you see, you're just like me/ I hope you're satisfied. Dylan admits the right of each man to make his own mistakes. FAN: It sounds as if you're having a good old laugh. BOB: Well, don't you like me to have a good old laugh once in a while? Isn't that all right with you?

while? Isn't that an infine while you!? FAN: If you're not taken ser-iously and commercialized. BOB: I don't care. You know different, tho, right? As long as you know, you don't have to worry about anybody else. All the peo-ple take care of themselves.

ple take care of themselves. Laughter is the language of the gods, right! You know, like irony. Bob Dylan is dee-vine and self-assertive. During the open-ing "Subterranean Homesick Blues" sequence, Dylan holds up a sign which says "Dig yourself". He also doesn't worry much a-bout what other people think. Dy-lan tells an interviewer, "You think it would bother me one little bit if you disliked me?" No regrets, no explanation, no peeking. Dylan tells the man from TIME: "I got nothing to say about these things I write..I don't write 'em for any reason. There's no great message." They pay Bob Dylan to sing songs. He has a large staff and a highly competant manager, Al-bert Grossman. People get hung

up trying to define just what Dylan does so well. They want to fi-gure out what he's doing so they can assign him some responsibi-lity. That's a big thing with lib-erals, responsibility.

A newsman calls Dylan a ser-monizer, and then condemns youth for not picking up the MESSAGE. Dylan claims that people value him for the enter-tainment he can provide. He is most concerned with making mu-sic. He once defined a poem as "anything that walks by it-

self," that is, a complete artis-tic statement. When a young rock musician says, "We find it very difficult to get people to listen to the words," Dylan cuts him off, "It's beyond me, you know. I just go out there and sing 'em." A reporter tells Dylan, "You sound angry in your song." Here we go, the angry irresponsible young man routine. Dylan says, "Im not angry. I'm a delight-ful sort of person." Bo this is what Dylan wants. To be delightful. Just plain folk.


Servicemen At Fort Lewis **Fight For Their Rights**

TACOMA, Wash, (LNS)—A recent attempt by military police and in-telligence officers to break up a meeting of insurgent GI's at Fort Lewis and to break the spirit of the men — has falled miserably. Nearly 40 soldiers were at-tending a meeting of the Fort Lew-is chapter of the American Ser-viceman's Union (ASU) at the Cas-cadian Service (Lub — on the base —when a contingent of MPs came and took six people into custody, Three were GIs and three were civilians (including ASU Chairman An dy Stapp, who was passing through town en route to Hawaii).
