WHAT'S LEFT

Delaware whipping post uprooted

The traditional way to work punishment on criminals in this state has been flogging. Governor Russell W. Peterson recently ordered the removal of the whipping post on a recent tour of the Kent Correction Facility.

State Representative Jerome N. Unruh called the governor's action premature. He also questioned its legality, because whipping still is a penalty for 26 offenses.

Campus concept for cons

Arthur Quentin Davis, an architect, has sold his idea of collegiate confinement to Louisiana penal authorities. The intended new prisons with their athletic and recreational facilities will look more like university campuses than archaic work-houses.

"What we have here is failure to communicate," Davis said. Davis is attempting to replace the concept of incarceration with the idea of rehabilitation. "We tried to void the obvious, such as double rows of bars. The idea is keep the prisoners in, but if it can be done with a decorative screen instead, why not?"

Bombs

Attacks on the nation's draft boards and military institutions are on the increase. On October 6 a nighttime bomb explosion shattered windows, damaged walls, and blew out a partition at New York City's Whitehall induction center. Inductees must now report to the Brooklyn induction center.

On the same day there was another explosion reported at Texas A and M University, near the ROTC headquarters on campus. Last month in Milwaukee a bomb near draft offices resulted in \$75,000 in damage. At the same time, in Madison Wisconsin, the National Guard Armory on campus, the building housing ROTC, was rocked by a large explosion.

In another incident, a fire at the Summit County draft board on September 26 damaged selective service files.

Cats cradle cancer

A medical news magazine reports that the household cat is "strongly suspect as a transmitter of leukemia." The October 17 issue of *Medical World News* says, "Virologists now suspect the Number 1 U.S. pet as primary host for the oncogenic virus that, in turn, is the odds-on favorite to produce leukemia."

Johannes Clemmensen of the Danish Cancer Registry claimed in the article that "This virus seems capable of crossing to other species." This means that diseased felines may infect other animals, including man.

Dr. Louis Melendez, chief of the microbiology department at Harvard's Primate Research Center, called the report "interesting and an important finding. In what *Medical World* considers a "typical" reaction to the reports, virologist Bernice Eddy is quoted as saying, "It looks very convincing, doesn't it."

There is much evidence proving that in certain ways the cancer virus is communicable. The spread of cat leukemia from parent to offspring and also to other cats has been demonstrated.

Panther HQ vamped

New York (LNS)—A night time raid on the Black Panther Party's Harlem office on October 20 left pounds of food, clothing, medicine and school supplies, intended for the Harlem community, destroyed, and hundreds of dollars worth of typewriters, cameras and mimeograph machines stolen.

The method of entry—the locks were opened by a special electric key, not jimmed or picked—indicates that the vandal-thieves were of the official variety.

People's Park Architect

National award winning architect Neill Smith, formerly of the San Francisco firm of John Carl Warnecke, has taken the job to develop the south campus park site.

Previously, other architectural firms rejected any contract which would not permit a "user developed and maintained park." The UC Regents has come out against the concept of a park for the people.

Smith has taken no stand for a "user developed park." Such a stand would have disqualified Smith for the contract.

Liquor risks

Drinking alcohol at home causes more harmful accidents than had been thought previously, according to a year long study of nearly 8,000 emergency ward patients.

Half of the 45 million Americans injured annually fall victim to accidents in the home, the Medical Foundation of Boston claimed.

Dr. Henry Wechsler, responsible for the research project, said, "This is the first time that a systematic large-scale study using objective measures of alcohol level has implicated alcohol as a factor in home accidents."

Anarchist war plans

The *Strategic Anarchy* Command announces a planned Halloween mock conflict. People's forces will assemble at Willard Park at 6:30 Friday. Centralist will mass at 6:00 in Lower Sproul Plaza. Armbands will be distributed for the peaceful street exercise. Which side are you on?

Judge Downs Mex

San Jose's Chicano population is calling for the removal of superior court judge Gerald Chargin. Chargin made racist claims about Mexican-Americans in a trial of a 15 year old Chicano boy accused of incest with his 12 year old sister.

A transcript from the trial proceedings shows Chargin saying, "Mexican people after 13 years of age think it is perfectly alright to go out and act like an animal." He also said, "We ought to send you back to Mexico . . . You ought to commit suicide. . . Maybe Hitler was right. . . The animals in our society probably ought to be destroyed."

Special forces incompatible

Bob Marasco, the ex-Green Beret captain tied into the controversy over the murder of a suspected Vietnamese double agent, has been granted a divorce from his wife, Denise.

The couple was married on October 17, 1963. They never had children.

Captain Marasco got an Army discharge October 14.

Castro Postpones Christmas

Because of the work necessary to harvest Cuba's bumper crop of sugar cane, traditional Christmas celebrations will be put off until July. Sugar is Cuba's prime source of foreign exchange currency needed to pay for imports. Castro has vowed that the new harvest will reach the ten million mark, more than twice the 1969 harvest.

NEW DEATH CULT

KILL YOURSELF

Information is coming in from all over the world that a new consciousness is rapidly spreading among the young. This consciousness is giving rise to a new international culture. The culture is not a drug culture, nor a new political culture, nor a move toward collectivity. Sexual or ecological activity are no longer where it's at. Death is where it's at.

The life-styles of today are bits and pieces of one overall death-style. The new death-style is the consummation of all previous life-styles. The Death Movement is bringing all other movements to a standstill.

There have been innumerable revolutions in the past. All these revolutions aimed at improving oppressive conditions. All these revolutions succeeded in doing was reinstating the miserable conditions they were supposed to eliminate. One revolution followed another, in an interminable historical dialectic.

In their Zen way, they show that life is not worth it, and if one's life becomes dishonored, Hari-kari is an easy way to off it. Sweden has the world's highest suicide rate. This is natural, considering that Scandanavia is the home of the Lemming, those little rodents that occasionally commit a mass suicide by all running and jumping into the sea. It was this illustration of life's worthlessness that gave the Vikings their indomitable courage.

The Indians of North America tortured war prisoners for long periods of time before death came to the victim. They knew that if they killed him right away they would only be doing him a favor, sending him to the Happy Hunting ground. Thus they inflicted torture on him when he was alive, the only time he could suffer pain.

It has long been known that death brings freedom, that death brings release, and peace, and ultimate

fulfillment. This fact has been sung by poets: "And death shall have no dominion." Philosophers know that the key to life was the riddle of death. Socrates showed his disciples that death is the goal of the true philosopher, bringing true knowledge, and that a philosopher's life was a preparation for death.

Life, wise men know, is misery. Life is bondage. The alive individual is subject to innumerable restrictions. He is oppressed by his own body. At the very least he must breathe, eat, and eliminate. He must go through all sorts of compulsory activities to accomplish even these elementary things. He is subject to many "natural" laws, like the law of gravity, and laws of heat and motion.

Modern man is especially oppressed. Not only does he have to maintain his body, but he must interact socially in conventional ways. This is because they cannot see the decay in very stable things because the decay is so gradual. But all things decay, that is, they change. 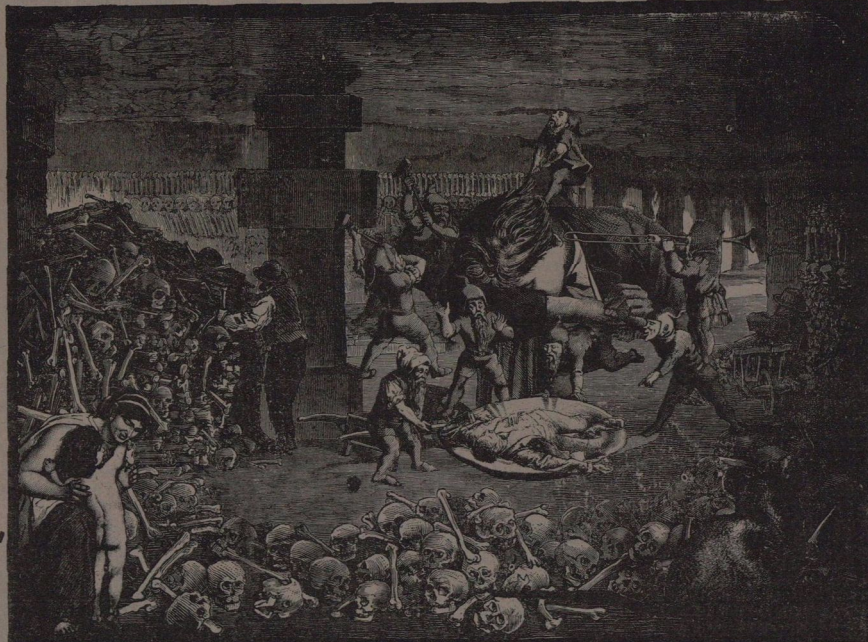

"Memory decays in the mind, mind itself decays. Reality is solidity, but solidity is relative. It decays, as mind decays. Some things the mind never sees change because the change is too slow. Sometimes the mind does not see change because it is too fast. But everything changes. Things are change. Change is change. "Change is death. Change is ego dissolution, is mind decay. Death is no-mind. No-mind is nirvana, is orgasm, is death. Death is absolute. Death is transcendental. It has no limits, no laws, like life. Clinging to life is clinging to reality. Clinging to reality is an attempt to make things solid. This is futile, and only causes pain. It is the mind clinging to itself: pure egoism. The situation is ridiculous: Mind creating a past, then clinging to it, subject to the laws it made up for itself.

"Death has no laws, however. There are no restrictions. Death is infinite. It is no-thing. It is to be worshipped.

Those who are not afraid of death are blessed. They conquer death by surrendering themselves to it. Death is beautiful. Death liberates.

be responsible for himself in this world.

Death is total freedom. It's possibilities are infinite. Death is the answer. The great religious leaders all knew the beauty of death. This is the reason why religions are anti-sexual. Creating more life is the opposite of religious aims. Blissful abode forever with God is their aim.

End The War Now, Mr. Nixon, Or The People Will End Your Administration

On November 15 in the early morning the biggest anti-war demonstration in history will begin in San Francisco and Washington D.C.

It may well prove to be the high-point of the peaceful anti-war movement in the United States.

After it is over the Nixon administration will respond to its demands and then the people in the movement will respond to the Nixon administration's response. If the President doesn't renounce support for the corrupt and unpopular Saigon Regime and, especially, if he refuses to immediately withdraw all U.S. troops from Vietnam, then the anti-war movement will continue. It is questionable, however, whether it will continue to be so peaceful.

Already the Nixon administration is moving hard to counter the planned November anti-war actions. It is widely understood that he will announce "further troop withdrawals" in his Vietnam speech on November 3. And, the highly publicized firing of General Hershey, the so-called year end moratorium on the draft, and the proposals that from now on only 19-year-olds be subjected to call were all attempts by the administration to take some of the punch out of the anti-war movement. Together these actions provide overwhelming evidence of the Nixon administration's view that the people in the movement are motivated only by self interest and not by a clear understanding of the issues involved or a sense of justice or regard for human life or even morality.

Vice-president Spiro Agnew cogently expressed the administration's viewpoint when he said before a GOP dinner in New Orleans that the anti-war movement was "encouraged by an effete corps of impudent snobs who characterize themselves as intellectuals."

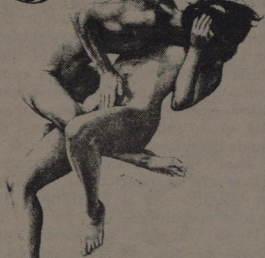
Perhaps the administration is right. Perhaps on November 3 when the President announces further troop withdrawals, he will separate a large number of people who are motivated solely by an ill conceived idea of what is their self interest from a small group of people who sense the moral outrage which is the Vietnam war. But the people who are working to build the November peace actions are betting against it. They are banking their efforts on the belief that the majority of people in this country share their outrage at the continued U.S. involvement in Vietnam and are at long last ready to act to make it clear to the President that they want out now.

200,000 PEOPLE

More than 200,000 people are expected to participate in the November 15 action in San Francisco. That is the figure that is given with no sense of exaggeration by people who are building the action. More than 200,000 people is a figure equal to twice the population of Berkeley. But of course the people won't all be from the Bay Area. They will be from all over the west and they will be the smaller part of a nationwide demonstration.

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Over half a million people are expected to participate in the other half of the demonstration which will take place in Washington, D.C. Obviously, in both Washington and San Francisco, weather is a factor which could limit the size of the demonstrations.

Early in the morning of November 15, before the sun rises above the hills, people will begin assembling at Pier 29 of the Embarcadero in San Francisco. Some of those people will have arrived from as far away as Seattle, Washington and Denver, Colorado. They will have probably spent the night in the homes of fellow marchers from San Francisco. Other people from places nearer such as Los Angeles or Eugene, Oregon will have spent a fitful night on a bus trying to catch some sleep. Still others will have arrived by plane or car from scattered points all over the west.

MARCH TO POLO FIELDS

At 8 a.m., the first demonstrators will begin the 7 3/4 mile march from Pier 29 to the Polo Fields in Golden Gate Park. They will move away from The Embarcadero down Battery Street to Pine Street. When they reach Pine they will begin their trek through the heart of the downtown business district -- the Wall Street of the West.

It used to be that opinion on Wall Street as reflected in The Wall Street Journal supported the War. But then in the minds of some, the war was good for the economy. But now even The Wall Street Journal has its doubts about the war. Now it is clear that the economy is inflated and even the men who some think manufactured the war are questioning whether they would suffer any loss of profits if the war ended. After all, Secretary of Defense Laird probably has a million projects in mind which would be of profit to munition manufacturers. Besides, as Philip Greer reported in the Washington Post on October 19, for the stock market "peace is extremely bullish." And the munition manufacturers own stock.

From Pine the marchers will march to Montgomery Street then down Montgomery to Post Street and heading west on Post they will move through the heart of the downtown shipping center. Though there will probably not be many shoppers or even open shops in the early hours when the first marchers move up Post, the demonstrators know that in reality we are all shoppers in America who contribute to the economy that supports the war in Vietnam.

MORE MARCHERS

While the first group of marchers are moving up Post Street, another group of demonstrators will be assembling in Kimbell Park at Steiner and Geary Streets in the heart of the Black Fill more district. All around them will be evidence of the real cost of the war to America.

And as the second group is still assembling a third group will be on the move from Mission Dolores Park at 18th and Dolores Avenue in the Mission or Chicano district. Many in this group will be the

sons of Mexican-American farm-workers whose blood like the blood of Black Americans is spilled in disproportionate amounts in Vietnam and at home.

Having left Mission Dolores Park at 9 a.m. they will now be heading up 18th Street to Sanchez, then up Sanchez to Steiner where they will join the Kimbell Park group.

Both groups will then move one block down Steiner to Post where they will swell the ranks of the marchers from Pier 29. Together the three groups now numbering many thousands will move west on Post to Presidio Avenue then one block south to Geary and west on Geary.

Meanwhile a fourth group of marchers will be assembling at the intersection of Park Presidio Blvd. and Geary, only two miles from the Polo Fields. These will be people who for one reason or another couldn't make the longer marches but wanted to walk at least part of the way with the people.

MORE MILES

As the anti-war demonstrators move past Park Presidio Blvd., this last group of marchers will fall in step, and together one huge army for peace will continue on down Geary to 30th Street then south on 30th Street and into Golden Gate Park's Polo Fields.

When they reach the Polo Fields, those who left with the Embarcadero group will have walked 7 3/4 miles. Those who left from Kimbell Park will have gone 6 1/2 miles; those from Mission Dolores Park -- 4 miles.

Paul Colvin, who is in charge of arrangements for the march, says monitors are desperately needed. Monitors are people who carry bullhorns and wear armbands and help keep order and direct traffic and collect money in little round boxes during the fund raising part of the rally. If you would like to be a monitor please call 282-4741 and volunteer your services.

Food and drink will be provided by various concerns at the assembly areas and along the routes of march. And, of course, Special Red Cross areas will be designated for those who need an aspirin or a bandage or a pep talk.

RALLY

Hopefully by two o'clock when a rally is scheduled, most of the marchers will have reached the Polo Fields. The rally will consist of a number of short speeches by people representing a wide range of sentiments, but all agreed that the U.S. should get out of Vietnam now.

Speakers who are so far scheduled to speak include: The Reverend Dr. Ralph Abernathy, President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference; Dolores Huerta of the Farm Workers Union; David Hilliard, Chief of Staff of the Black Panthers; Andrew Pulley, of the Fort Jackson 8 (eight GI's who are being tried by the army for engaging in anti-war activities); Rennie Davis, one of the Chicago 8 on trial for being for peace in Chicago (and in Vietnam); and Corky Gonzales, founder of the Crusade for Justice. Former Senator Wayne Morse of Oregon or Dr. Benjamin Spock or Republican Senator Charles Goodell of New York will also probably be on the program. No speaker, of course, will be allowed to pretend that he can speak for the full range of views held by the people in the anti-war movement.

Still being debated is whether or not such top anti-war recording stars as Phil Ochs and Arlo Guthrie will appear.

The people who are planning the November 15 march in San Francisco are coordinating their activities with the people who are planning other activities on November 13 and 14. In fact, in many cases, they are the same people.

MORATORIUM AND STRIKE

November 13 is the first day of the two day November "No Business as Usual" Vietnam Moratorium planned by the National Moratorium Committee to End the War in Vietnam. The Moratorium Committee planned the one day October 15 work strike with the intention of escalating their action each month -- two day strike in November, three days in December, etc. -- until all the troops are home.

On November 14 the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (SMC) is planning a one day student strike to help build support for the November 15 marches. Local SMC's are also planning activities on high school and college campuses around the country, in support of the November 13 and 14 no business as usual Vietnam Moratorium. At San Francisco State, for instance, the SFS branch of SMC is planning a number of activities including a benefit dance and a mock war crimes tribunal modelled after the Bertrand Russell International War Crimes Tribunal.

The November 15 marches are being sponsored by the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (New Mobe). New Mobe is geared to all the people in the country -- workers and students. Both groups however are Umbrella groups which in the words of the Christian Science Monitor, encompass "individuals and organizations of all shades of opinion, from Students for a Democratic Society and other new Left radicals to established religious Society and other new Left radicals to established religious groups." What members of SMC and New Mobe have in common is that they all support the demand that the U.S. get out of Vietnam now.

ANTI-WAR COMMITTEES

The Student Mobilization Committee was formed at a conference in Chicago in December, 1966. Since then it has played an active role in building massive anti-war demonstrations nationwide. It sees its primary role, however, as that of organizing high school and college students in opposition to the war. The fact that students have been the vanguard of the anti-war movement is a tribute to SMC's success.

This year when the National SMC met in Cleveland on July 6 to plan its strategy for fall, 1969, it voted to endorse and work to support the actions planned by New Mobe and the Moratorium Committee.

Jerome Grossman, a Boston businessman, is credited with having come up with the idea for a Vietnam Moratorium, according to a story by Tim Findley in The San Francisco Chronicle. Findley reports that last spring Grossman passed his idea along to "three young men considered intellectuals and moderates in the loose-knit coalition of the 'movement'" The three men: David Hawk, Sam Brown and David Mixner took the idea on

to become the National Moratorium Committee.

New Mobe was formed on July 4 and 5 of this year in Cleveland. It planned a fall offensive which would culminate on November 15 with marches in Washington D.C. and San Francisco. Since July, New Mobe has been planning and organizing to ensure that the November 15 marches will be "the most significant anti-war demonstrations in history."

IN WASHINGTON

In Washington, New Mobe is organizing two marches. The first march, a "March Against Death" will begin at midnight on November 13 and continue for 36 hours through November 14 and into the morning of November 15. It will be, according to New Mobe literature, "a single file solemn procession of 43,000 to 45,000 persons (a number from each state equivalent to the number of Americans from each state who have been killed in Vietnam)." The march will begin from the Arlington National Cemetery and move past the White House to the Capitol. Each marcher will call out the name of one American killed in the war or the name of one Vietnamese town destroyed by U.S. forces as he passes a given point in front of the White House. The marchers will be led by Mrs. Martin Luther King and the parents of U.S. servicemen killed in Vietnam.

The second march planned by the Washington New Mobe is a mass march to the White House on November 15. It is this march that is expected to draw as many as half a million people. At 2 p.m. the march will be followed by a rally.

DEMANDS

As previously stated, the Vietnam Moratorium Committee plans to expand its protests each month until the U.S. withdraws all its troops from Vietnam. It demands immediate U.S. troop withdrawal from Vietnam.

Though in complete accordance with the demand that U.S. soldiers get out of Vietnam now, SMC and New Mobe have added further demands of their own.

One of the quotes from an SMC circular, for example, reads "We are for the immediate and unconditional withdrawal of all U.S. troops from Vietnam; for an end to the draft; against all forms of campus complicity with the war; for self determination for Vietnam and Black America, for free speech for GI's and high school students."

Theodore W. Johnson, a spokesman for New Mobe says, "what we want is the complete withdrawal of American troop and materials (from Vietnam) immediately." New Mobe leaflets expand on Johnson's statement, however. They claim New Mobe also stands behind the following slogans: "self-determination for Vietnam and Black America; stop the repression--free all political prisoners; end AMB and all forms of Militarism; end racism and poverty; free speech for GI's."

TIDAL WAVE

In the October 17, 1969 Christian Science Monitor, staff correspondent Seville R. Davis summed up what might well be the prevailing opinion about the potential of the November anti-war demonstrations. Seville wrote, "Mr. Nixon is a politician and not a dogmatist. If another wave of popular revolutions strikes him like a tidal reaction to the Vietnam war that engulfed President Johnson last year, Washington generally believes that the President would have to...take risk of fast withdrawal."

What can you do to help build this tidal wave? Marcuse

MARCUSE, ANGELA ADDRESS NEW CADRE

Marxian philosopher Herbert Marcuse and black Communist Angela Davis received wild support from a crowd of 4,000 in Lower Sproul Plaza Friday. The two main speakers addressed the students on the "oppressive nature" of capitalism in this country.

The rally began with a statement by Jim Nabors of the Committee on Liberation or Death, an affiliate of the Third World Liberation Front. Nabors discussed the faces of oppression on World Liberation Front led last year's bitter Third World students strike.

Marcuse and Davis were met with massed clenched fist salutes. The crowd stood up for the first speaker, Marcuse.

The importance of the university as a staging area for radical political organization was stressed by Marcuse. In the university, Marcuse said, "the new consciousness, the new values and goals can be developed, the new cadres educated, not to destroy American society, but to

rid it of the powers who destroy it."

Marcuse is the author of several books of a revolutionary philosophical nature, *EROS AND CIVILIZATIONS* and *ONE DIMENSIONAL MAN*.

Marcuse introduced the next speaker, Angela Davis, as "black, militant, highly intelligent and pretty" - more than the State Regents could handle. Davis is a member of the Che-Lumumba Club which is affiliated with the Communist Party of Southern California.

The Regents attempted to dismiss Davis last month because of her politics. A court decision recently stopped the Regents in their efforts to fire her. Course credit was returned to her class this week by UCLA Chancellor.

Marcuse said that the struggle against the class in power "is for all of us who can no longer stand the insanity and brutality of this society, its utter hypocrisy and lies, its economy of waste and death." The fight for Angela's justification, he claim-

ed, "must be only one instance in the fight against those who want to block your minds."

Marcuse asked the large crowd, "Is there any chance that this society is able and willing to abolish these conditions?" He answered his own question, and stated that he had little faith in the American "capitalist system."

Marcuse urged his audience to continue their demonstrations, and in particular, to "arouse conscience and consciousness" in the community and on campus. The students were called upon by

the philosopher to combat the "insanity" which has overtaken the nation.

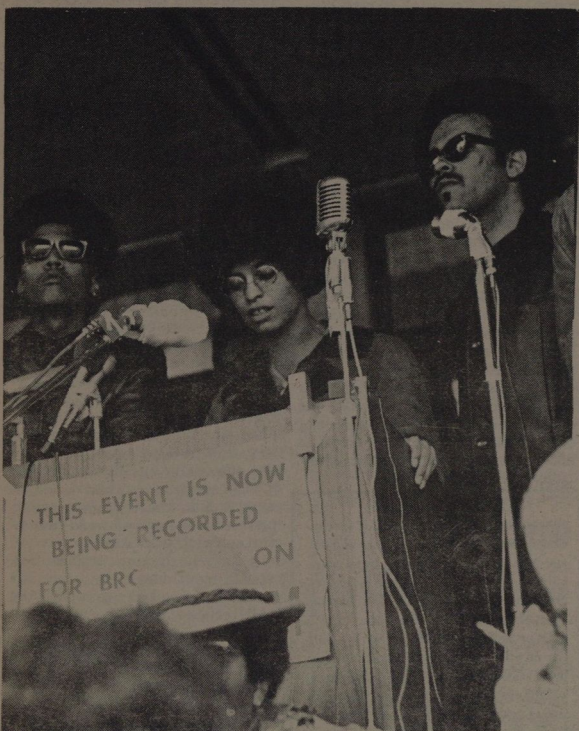
The goal of enjoying life "with a good conscience - without guilt" was laid down by Marcuse. As he concluded, the crowd shouted approval for his demand that the Regents resign.

Returning to the issue of racism which has made itself present in her case, Davis said, "If we aren't able to link up with these struggles for Third World liberation, academic freedom becomes a farce."

Davis denied the importance of

academic freedom unless it is part of "social and political freedom." Academic freedom is a double edged sword, and professors who "use the pretext of academic freedom" to conduct criminal military research should be confronted.

Davis concluded her speech with a proper definition of what academic freedom should involve. The liberty of students to criticize the "oppressive" quality of their lives, Davis said, was the central guarantee of social progress.

Gay Liberation Front

Society has a new nigger. Robert Patterson's article of Saturday, October 25th, is willfully malicious, erroneous, and irresponsible journalism.

The offensive will continue in a massive demonstration at the Examiner building on Friday, October 31st, beginning at noon. We call on all who resent the Examiner's reference to "semi-males" and to "women who aren't

exactly women" and on all those affronted or outraged by the Examiner's libelous contribution to the perpetuation of oppression of a community which numbers over 100,000 of our brothers and sisters in San Francisco alone to support our effort. HALLOWEEN WAR GAMES

The strategic Anarchy Command (SAC) announced Tuesday night its plans to free the Chicago Eight and jail the presiding Judge Hoffman in an organized street action on Halloween night in Berkeley, centering around the University of California campus. Thousands of concerned citizens will mobilize in a forward staging area to launch an assault on a fortified and heavily defended mock court, where the eight

"conspirators" will be receiving generous portions of the man's "justice" at the hands of a guerrilla theater group.

SAC's street maneuvers, incorporating the fundamentals of guerrilla co-ordination, communications, logistics and general tactical strategy, will be designed to foster a sense of readiness and preparedness within the street community.

"This theatrical exercise will serve to inculcate in the participants an awareness of the reality of the situation on both sides when the real shit comes down," a SAC communique announced. Any engagement with actual members of local paramilitary organizations will be discouraged, however.

The street Halloween War Games will also serve to dedicate the new south campus park, now innocuously known as Williard Park, as the "Ho Chi Minh Memorial Park."

Proposals to use the late People's Park in the exercises were firmly

rejected as sacrilegious in light of the ideals of SAC and the Park.

Maintaining the "Court's" defenses will be an all-volunteer elite Brigade of advanced counter-insurgency specialists who will undergo intensive training in the handling of "mob" situations. "To know the enemy, one must emulate him" commented an SAC representative.

Centralists will meet at 6:30 pm at Williard Park, at Regent & Derby in Berkeley. The People's army will meet at 6 pm at Oxford Hall on Oxford, and then will move on to lower Sproul plaza.

Members of the opposing forces will be distinguished with different colored armbands. Contact between opposing forces will be limited to removing the arm band. No weapons will be used, no water balloons or flour bombs or anything.

Campus Cops Get Together

ATHENS, Ga (LNS)—One offshoot of campus rebellions has been the burgeoning of campus police forces. As colleges open across the country, the men who are supposed to keep things from getting out of hand are playing around with vastly expanded budgets and arsenals, including "shotguns, riot helmets with face guards, plastic billies (guaranteed not to break), handcuffs, thumbcuffs, 4 foot super-mace guns, pepper fog, and a \$2400 device called "The Curdler" which emits ear-piercing shrieks and forces rioters to drop whatever they're carrying and cover their ears," says the San Francisco Chronicle.

The International Association of College and University Security Directors held its 11th annual conference at the University of Georgia recently. And the participants seemed to be reveling in a new sense of their own importance. JUST LIKE J. EDGAR AND THE FBI was the themesong, as "Al Romancon, a retired Canadian Mountie who heads the force at Waterloo University in Ontario suggested that wire taps and other bugs be used as often as possible on such groups as Students for a Democratic Society."

Other suggestions show that the campus cops have learned a lot from their brothers in the big time. One scheme for getting around legal difficulties in searching students' rooms for drugs proposed posting notices at all campus gates "stating that anyone entering automatically waives his rights against searches."

The increased status of the campus rent-a-cops was best rewarded by the universities of Illinois and Wisconsin who have elevated their chief pigs to the rank of vice chancellor of the university. At this rate, the "free marketplace of ideas" may outstrip the rest of the country in developing the institutions of a police state.

LIVE OAK HOSTS DEADLY DOINGS

Rumors circulated freely in Berkeley over the weekend concerning strange events in Live Oak Park on Thursday evening. Neighbors of the park reported seeing "flickering lights" and hearing "drums and yelling" and "awful screams" on two different occasions through the night.

"The racket started about eleven-thirty, and it got so bad we couldn't stand it so we called the police," said a live Oak area housewife, "but when they showed up everything quieted down real fast and the lights went out. They searched the area with flashlights, but they left after about five minutes and they looked pretty angry when they left."

"As soon as the patrol car left, everything started up again real fast, even louder than before. When we called the police a second time, they told us to go to bed, and that they were tired of drunks bothering them. I'm sick and tired of paying such high taxes and gettin nothing for them," shesaid.

When questioned by a BARB reporter, a landscape crewman at the park was amazed over what he found in a remote area of the park. "There was a whole bunch of black candle stubs, and a bunch of bloody hatpins I found Friday morning while cleanin' up," said the custodian. "The grass was all messed up in kind of a circle, and somebody lit a fire which really smelled sometin' awful, cuz it was still smokin' when I got there."

Examination of the area showed only that it had been raked by the custodian in the execution of his duties. This incident gives fuel to the rumors circulating about a newly-formed witchcraft cult in the Bay Area.

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MR. MAGOO'S FARCE

CHICAGO (L.A. Free Press)—A complete, serious account of the Conspiracy trial here would be very hard to write. It is even very hard to keep in mind that eight men are facing ten years in jail — eight men without whom the American Revolutionary Movement could not exist. The defendants — Dave Dellinger, Rennie Davis, John Froines, Tom Hayden, Abbie Hoffman, Jerry Rubin, Bobby Seale and Lee Weiner — represent nearly every hue of the Movement spectrum.

The reasons why it is so deathly hard to remain serious lies in virtually every aspect of the situation, from defendants to lawyers (on both sides) to the judge. Especially the judge.

Judge Julius Jennings Hoffman has often been called Mr. Magoo because of his uncanny resemblance to the cartoon character. He sounds like the warped, seventy-four-year-old dwarf he is; his voice sounds like a cross between Professor Irwin Corey's and the croaking of a dying frog.

Unfortunately, this is where the resemblance ends. Unlike his namesake, Magoo is no simpleton. Whereas he is a stooge of the government, he is a very intelligent stooge. So intelligent, in fact, that the prosecuting attorney really need not show up in court—Magoo does the job for them. The government's arguments are held in the most respectful praise, while the defense arguments are always interrupted several times for absolutely no purpose except to create diversion. Whenever the defense cross-examination comes close to shattering the government witness' testimony, the prosecution objects, often merely saying "Your Honor, if the court please, I object" and Magoo upholds the objection. The only motion made by the defense which Magoo upheld was a motion for a four-minute-early dismissal. Magoo then congratulated the defense for winning.

Magoo has this secret passion for locking people up. On the opening of the trial, Julius the just gaped around and couldn't find four of the lawyers who worked with the Conspiracy during the pre-trial motions, Mike Tigar, Dennis Roberts, Jerry Lefcourt and Mike Kennedy. All four were permitted by the defense to leave the case to resume pending trials. When Magoo couldn't find the four, he issued a bench warrant for their arrest. The next day, the four were brought before Julius (two having spent the night in jail), where the learned judge tried to make a deal. If the defense agreed to fire their chief counsel, Charles Garry, he would release the four. (Garry, perhaps the best known movement lawyer, could not make it to the beginning of the trial because of gall-bladder surgery. Magoo couldn't see why he should delay the trial for this trivial reason...) No such deal was even considered; this time Magoo was reversed by a higher court.

Then there's this bit about the jury. In federal courts, the judge has the option of not permitting the lawyers the privilege of asking prospective jurors any questions; they merely submit these questions to the judge, who can do what he wants with them. In this case, Magoo threw the defense questions away.

What was left on the jury were ten women and two men, eleven of which look like they died of old age about a month before the trial began. Number twelve was a pretty young lass of 24, who has a sister in VISTA. Magoo and the Feds gawked around for a few days, trying to figure out how she landed the job. The next day, she and another juror received a note which read "We're Watching You, (signed) The Black Panthers."

The other juror read the letter but saw it as a shuck. The 24 year old wasn't home to receive it, but her mother was. She read it and called the Feds. The next day's testimony went like this:

Magoo expressed shock over the situation, and asked the two if they

could still give an unbiased decision. The one who threw hers away said yes; the mere child said she never saw it. The marshal was then ordered to show it to her. She said that had she received it she might be influenced.

Having been shown the letter, Magoo declared her "contaminated" and dismissed her; a 23 year old Eva Brown substitute from the reserves took her place.

Julius then sequestered the survivors. That means he locked them up. Granted they're locked up in a hotel and not in jail, and they eat good food, however:

The jury can not talk with outsiders, or about the trial among themselves.

The jury can not read newspapers, watch television or listen to the radio.

The jury can not go anywhere unless accompanied by a federal marshal.

I would remind the reader that it is illegal for them to masturbate, but most of these twelve look like they forgot how a long time ago.

Speaking about locking people up, Magoo rarely lets a day pass without threatening the defendants with revocation of bond. Bobby Seale has not been released under bond, being held under a bullshit "suspicion of murder" charge. Magoo wouldn't delay the trial long enough for a bond to be set in arraignment.

Whenever one of the defense lawyers talks back to Magoo, he threatens to jail him for contempt. Lawyer Weinglass has been so charged, his fate will be determined after the kangaroo court.

(Stew Albert, a co-conspirator in the case, rejects the Magoo label. According to Stew, "Julius Hoffman has disgraced Magoo and wears his appearance as an obvious disguise. . . The government picked him as a sure executioner and he is performing with expected dignity.")

With Magoo around, the prosecution has only to go through the motions of presenting a case. Politicians are notorious for bullshitting this way, and the two attorneys here are no exception. Thomas Foran is the Chicago district U.S. attorney, or rather was, because Foran is being held over for the trial, after which he is to be replaced by another robot. He used to have a reputation for being a liberal, but then so did Lyndon Johnson. If he makes good here, this promising young man will go on to bigger and better things in politics. It's sort of a "Send a Nazi to Day Camp" trip.

Foran's greatest talent is name calling. Thus far, he has called Conspiracy attorney Bill Kunstler a "mouthpiece", Perry Mason ("Channel 2, your Honor. Channel 7, your Honor!"), and "a heretic," among others. The government is so positive about their Kangaroo Court they have Bugs Bunny representing them. (One name deserves another, after all.)

Foran's assistant Billy Schultz, on the other hand, is not as insecure as his mentor. At 24, Young Billy could possibly be the youngest living dinosaur. He honestly believes that by sending the eight to jail he is saving Amerika from the terrible Red Menace. Ronnie Reagan should be proud. . .

The Conspiracy has three lawyers. Charles Garry was mentioned earlier; he is now recuperating from surgery.

Bill Kunstler's reputation as a Movement lawyer almost matches Garry's. A hard-biting barrister, Kunstler will not stand for any of Magoo's bullshit, and is not afraid to fight back. He cross-examined police witness after police witness

after police witness without letting up. Lennie Weinglass, the other Conspiracy attorney, has a sharp legal mind and is not afraid to use it. He can literally destroy a pig's testimony in cross examination. If the jury was capable of emotion, they would be as impressed as most of the establishment press is.

The defendants make up the rest of the circus. Not being the types to stay quiet through a four-month trial, they take every opportunity to be heard. When introduced to the jury by the judge, Jerry Rubin waved his hand, Tom Hayden raised his fist, and Abbie Hoffman blew Magoo a kiss.

A few times each day, Bobby Seale rises to protest the fact that he is without lawyer, since Garry is ill. Calling Magoo a racist, Seale reminds Magoo of his sixth amendment right to choice of attorney. Magoo ignores the protest, ordering "the boy" to be quiet. Seale also points out the racism in the court — the fact that blacks are constantly being ejected from the courtroom, including at one time, Seale's wife. Foran leaps up to point out that the court is not racist, half the marshals are Negro. Foran's political future won't be saved by his arithmetic; only two of the eight marshals are Negro. None are black.

It's not easy for Seale to be the government's token black in the Conspiracy indictment. During jury "selection," one black woman was asked her occupation. She mentioned she was formerly under the employ of Attorney Foran. "As a domestic?" Magoo queried. "No, as a legal secretary," the woman replied. Foran then leapt to his feet and shouted out "And a very good one she was your Honor."

In this setting, law and order is carried out and the myth of a fair and honest judicial system is being carved up and dishied out as so much garnished garbage from the table of American-English history.

A prime example of what goes on in the courtroom could be found by reading the transcript of the beginning of Wednesday, October 15, Moratorium Day.

THE CLERK: No. 69 CR 180, United States of America v. David T. Dellinger, et al. Cause on trial.

(The following proceedings were had in open court, out of the presence and hearing of the jury:)

MR. KUNSTLER: Your Honor, just one preliminary application this morning. The defendants who were not permitted by your Honor to be absent today or to have a court recess for the Vietnam moratorium brought in an American Flag and a North Vietnamese Flag which they placed on the counsel table to commemorate the dead Americans and the dead Vietnamese in this long and brutal war that has been going on.

The marshal removed those from the table. First he took the North Vietnamese Flag after directing me to order the client to have it removed which I refused to do, and then he removed it himself and then subsequently — I said North Vietnamese, I mean South Vietnamese, your Honor.

Subsequently he removed the American Flag.

THE COURT: We have an American Flag in the corner. Haven't you seen it during the three and a half weeks you have been here?

MR. KUNSTLER: Yes, but we wanted the juxtaposition, your Honor, of the two flags together in one place.

THE COURT: Mr. Kunstler, let me interrupt you to say that whatever decoration there is in the courtroom will be furnished by the government and I think things look all right in this courtroom.

MR. KUNSTLER: Your Honor, I am applying for permission to have both flags on this Vietnam moratorium day.

THE COURT: That permission will be denied. That is a table for the defendants and their lawyers and it is not to be decorated. There is no decoration on the government's table.

MR. KUNSTLER: That is the government's wish, your Honor. We don't tell them what to do or what not to do.

THE COURT: But I tell everybody what to do as far as the decorations of this courtroom are concerned and we are going to have the North Vietnamese Flag—

MR. KUNSTLER: It is the South Vietnamese—

THE COURT: —on the table, sir. Your motions for flags to be placed on the table, flags of any nation, are denied, and at the same time I point out standing in the courtroom — and it has been here since this building was opened — is an American Flag.

MR. KUNSTLER: I might indicate half hidden by a display.

MR. HOFFMAN: May I be heard your Honor?

THE COURT: No, you may not be heard. You have a lawyer.

DEFENDANT HOFFMAN: We don't consider this table a part of the court and we want to furnish it in our own way.

THE MARSHAL: Sit down.

THE COURT: I will ask you to sit down. Bring in the jury, Mr. Marshal.

(The following proceedings were had in open court, in the presence and hearing of the jury:)

THE COURT: Ladies and gentlemen of the jury, good morning.

Will the witness please resume the stand?

DEFENDANT DELLINGER: Before the witness resumes the stand, we would like to propose —

MR. SCHULTZ: If the Court please —

THE COURT: Mr Marshal, take out the jury.

(The following proceedings were had in open court, out of the presence and hearing of the jury.)

DEFENDANT DELLINGER: We only wanted a moment of silence.

MR. FORAN: Your Honor, this man has announced this on the elevator coming up here that he was intending to do this.

DEFENDANT DELLINGER: I did not. It doesn't matter, I would have been glad to, but I did not.

MR. FORAN: Your Honor, I object to this man speaking out in court.

THE COURT: You needn't object. I forbid him to disrupt the proceedings. I note for the record that his name is —

DEFENDANT DELLINGER: David Dellinger is my name.

THE COURT: You needn't interrupt my sentence for me.

DEFENDANT DELLINGER: You have been interrupting ours, I thought I might finish that sentence.

THE COURT: The name of this man who has attempted to disrupt the proceedings in this court is David Dellinger and the record will clearly indicate that, Miss Reporter, and I direct him and all of the others not to repeat such occurrences.

MR. KUNSTLER: Your honor, I just want to object to Mr. Foran yelling in the presence of the jury. Your Honor has admonished counsel many times on the defense side for yelling, but particularly when the jury was halfway out the door—

THE COURT: I never used the word "yelling".

MR. KUNSTLER: Raising a voice.

THE COURT: If a lawyer representing his client didn't protest that sort of thing, he would be a mighty poor lawyer for his client.

MR. KUNSTLER: But not in the presence of that jury, which was deliberately done, your Honor, as that door was opening.

MR. FORAN: Your Honor, that is outrageous. This man is a mouthpiece. Look at him, wearing a band like his clients, your Honor.

Any lawyer who comes into a courtroom and has no respect for the Court and acts in conjunction with that kind of conduct before the Court, your Honor, the Government protests his attitude and would like to cite — to move the Court to make note of his conduct before this Court.

THE COURT: Note has been duly made on the record.

MR. KUNSTLER: Your Honor, I think that the temper and the tone of voice and the expression on Mr. Foran's face speaks more than any picture could tell.

THE COURT: Mr. Kunstler—

MR. FORAN: Of my contempt for Mr. Kunstler, your Honor.

MR. KUNSTLER: To call me a mouthpiece, and, your Honor not to open his mouth and say that that is not to be done in your court, I think violates the sanctity of this court. That is a word that your Honor knows is contemptuous and contumacious.

THE COURT: Don't tell me what I know.

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THE PIGS WORE BLACK ROBES

The San Francisco State strikers are facing another round in their endless battle with the officious protectors of law and order, the San Francisco judges. This time it's the 3 judge appellate court, made up of judges Harold Caulfield, Alvin Weinberger and Walter Carpeneti. The appellate judges are trying to send the strikers, convicted of participation in a rally on the S.F. State campus last January 23rd, to jail with all undue process. The way they're doing it could make a good script for a Laurel and Hardy movie.

Here's what's happened: All of the groups of strikers convicted on charges of disturbing the peace, failure to disperse and unlawful assembly, stemming from the mass bust, have appealed their cases. The grounds for dismissal are excellent, both on factual and constitutional grounds.

Actually, the trials have been a mockery of the so-called "judicial process." Since the D.A.'s have no case to prove the strikers are guilty of the charges -- because they're on trial for their politics, not for any "unlawful" activity -- the D.A.'s have resorted to basing their case on scaring the juries about the alleged "violence" of the strikers, not on the 23rd, but during the previous months of the strike. The judges have coopera-

ted with the D.A.'s strategy in every way possible, from the simple judicial expedient of overruling all defense objections to the conduct of the case, to the more outlandish practice of kicking defense witnesses off the stand when their testimony incriminates the police, or advising the jury that the real issue in these cases is whether the campuses will be ruled by the administration or by a mob.

The constitutional grounds for appeal are numerous: denial of rights of free speech and assembly, no jury of our peers, prejudicial pre-trial publicity making a fair trial impossible, unusually high bail, denial of transcripts for the appeals case, severe sentences, etc.

However, the appellate judges are trying to dismiss these appeals even before they're presented. The maneuver goes like this: the trial judges refuse to grant the defense lawyer the transcript of the trial which the lawyers need in order to write the appeal brief. The reason given is that the defendants have no right to a free transcript (even though they are all poor enough to require the defense of a public defender). The rationale is that if a defendant has \$100 in the bank, and/or a car, he's not poverty stricken and can afford to pay for the transcript. However, the trans-

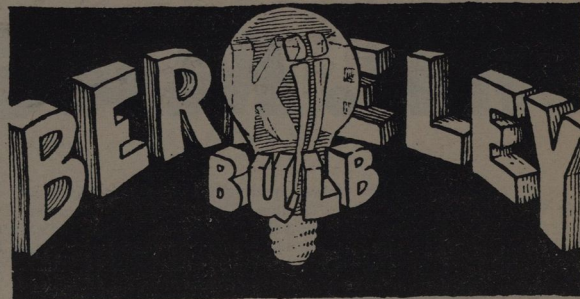
cripts cost about \$6000, because the trials lasted for 6 weeks, and a transcript runs about \$175 per day. If one person in the group is clearly indigent (and it's all up to the discretion of the trial judge), then he can have a transcript, but not until the rest of his group has divided the cost of the transcript (about \$600 per defendant).

Since we can't get the transcripts in order to file the appeals brief, the appellate judges have maintained that the time allotted for filing the appeals brief, the appellate judges have maintained that the time allotted for filing the brief (about 30 days after the sentence) is overdue, and, by default, the defendants have to go to jail.

So far, the lawyers have been on top of this game of judicial one-upmanship, and the D.A. in charge of fighting our appeals is getting more harassed with overwork everyday. And the strikers are still hanging on tight, intent on fighting this insanity in the courts.

Moral of the story -- until the courts are controlled by the people, they'll be no justice for the people. The strikers need your support to continue their fight against the courts. Please send what you can to:

Blame Blame Who Gets The Blame

This is a childhood game we all play -- at times.

When something doesn't turn out well in life, and pain or frustration happens, we've been so trained to feel that making a "mistake" or being "wrong" is a big, tragic deal, that our Conditioned Mind immediately starts to look for an "explanation" -- and the culprit. After all, we're supposed to be perfect and always do the correct thing. Right? Fallibility, limitation, and error are evil -- or at least "stupid" (the modern intellectual equivalent for the medieval conception of "sin").

And the mental Inner Critic is always there, ready and willing, to point out that it's "my" fault. I'm the one who's to blame for whatever it is that's gone wrong.

But, the ego has an out. We look around and find SOMEONE ELSE to pin the blame on. It's not "my" fault -- he, she, or they caused it! What started out to be feelings of inadequacy and guilt become converted into emotions of rage and righteous indignation. I'm a Good Little Boy (or Girl) -- it's THEY who are bad and wrong.

The teen-ager who shop-lifts & steals can avoid inner moral conflict and struggle by reminding himself that Big Business is dishonest and ruthless, that "life is a jungle", or that "society" (whatever that is) owes him the comforts of life because his unloving, ignorant parents gave him a bum deal. An angry black man can justify his hatred and violence by reassuring himself that he's the victim of two hundred years of persecution by "whitey", and is entitled to revenge. Such people don't ACT upon life -- they only REACT.

Some psychologists and existential philosophers, who see the unhealthy pitfalls in this PROJECTION of blame, have swung to the opposite extreme -- and insist that when things go wrong, the ego is at fault and must admit it. "I" am the cause of all my actions, as well as of everything that happens TO me.

They talk glibly about the necessity for the person to assume full RESPONSIBILITY for his behavior, his "symptoms", his neurosis -- even his every existence! They see no need to recognize and come to grips with the reality of genuinely autonomous forces, powers, and collective images within the psyche. There is no UNKNOWN -- or unconscious, independent forces that impinge upon the ego, pushing it this way and that. It's all "me", in disguise, doing all those sad, hurtful things that "I", and other people find so painful.

For "me" to blame "myself" for the things that go wrong in life is actually not much of an improvement though, over the tendency to find the fault in others. It's still based on a magical, childish belief in the power and value of blaming.

Genuine understanding -- and, therefore, the possibility for change -- can only occur when we are willing to go beyond the "blaming" point of view altogether. It doesn't do much good even to "blame" the unconscious -- or the gods. They simply are what they are. If you really want to change them -- or alter the way they affect you -- you've got to become free enough from a critical, judgmental outlook to be objectively curious about the nature of the ideas and images that push you and other people into doing things that are damaging and destructive.

There's a common MIS-understanding of the concept of "understanding" -- especially among women, and certain intellectual men. It equates understanding with ACCEPTANCE. And "acceptance" often turns out to mean IDENTIFICATION.

A mother can empathize so much with her child's feelings of frustration at not getting what he wants, or with the pain and hurt involved in his sense of limitation, that she ends up letting him get away with all kinds of obnoxious, destructive behavior -- because she "understands" him. Nonsense! She's not understanding him at all -- or the real complexity of his struggle with primitive, undifferentiated emotions and impulses, and his need for integration and structuring. She's just sentimentally identifying with one aspect of his total being. She drifts back into memories of assumed childhood "deprivations" -- and ignores her own present personal feelings and needs. So, the child develops an unbalanced, unrealistic view of the world.

A well-meaning sociologist or psychiatrist may be so impressed by the sad, turbulent childhood background of a criminal that he's incapable of rendering a realistic judgment about how to cope with the present danger represented by such an individual.

Explaining the "causes behind the causes" of a phenomenon, and empathically identifying with the person who has experienced them, is NOT an adequate basis for knowing how to deal with him. One must also consult his OWN here-and-now feelings, personal needs, and intuitive intimations of value, truth, and beauty. Otherwise, nothing changes. The past goes on repeating itself, ad infinitum -- or gets worse.

One can "understand" another person, or his behavior, and still dislike, disagree with, and oppose him and it. A teen-ager who sponges off his friends, and parasitically exploits his elders, is still a disagreeable brat -- even though one may recognize that being raised in a split home, living in an affluent society, and witnessing the greed of politicians and the military have all contributed to his attitude. But what does one do about it, NOW?

Sentimentally "accepting" someone, merely because you can tentatively empathize with certain of his feelings, often robs him of the challenge to work toward understanding himself, and dealing with the psychic forces that are driving him. Confrontation with a viewpoint that's different, and experiencing the pain of defeat and frustration, is a powerful stimulus for conducting an inner search, and for coming to terms with those semi-conscious, disruptive mental agencies that cause us all trouble. And if the behavior that's not being "accepted" by other people turns out to be based on needs and images that we regard as genuine and valid, then an inner struggle and clarification can strengthen our resolve to hold on to them all the more -- even in the face of opposition by the outer world.

UNDERSTANDING is not merely "explaining" things in terms of their past causes. And it's not the "blaming" game -- which only adds the element of anger to a presumed explanation of fault. Nor is it just empathy, identification, and "acceptance". It's a total response to the reality of what IS -- both inner and outer -- one's own needs and feelings, as well as what's happening objectively.

RIOT TRIALS AT FORT DIX

General court martials growing out of the Fort Dix stockade riot are getting under way after almost five months delay. The first trials, that of Jeffrey Russell, is scheduled to begin either October 31st or November 3rd.

Jeffrey Russell faces charges of arson, riot, conspiracy and solicitation stemming from a riot on June 5th in the post stockade; a riot in which no one was injured and the participants sought to call attention to, and change the inhuman conditions under which stockade prisoners live. If convicted he faces a possible sentence of 60 years in prison. It was learned today that a group from Columbia University is planning to charter a bus for people interested in attending the trial and supporting Jeffrey and his fellow prisoners.

On October 14th, a pre-trial hearing was held in the case of U.S. V. RUSSELL. A number of motions were presented for dismissal of charges and to bar Russell's upcoming trial. All the motions were denied. Among the motions presented was a motion to bar the trial because of prior punishment inflicted on the accused in the stockade. On June 6th, Russell was subjected to both harassment and solicitation by Army

Criminal Investigation Agents to commit perjury by falsely informing on his fellow prisoners. From June 7th to June 9th, he was held in disciplinary segregation without charges, solely because of his reputation. Disciplinary segregations is the most severe form of solitary confinement. Since June 9th, Russell has been held in administrative segregation, which includes having his bed stripped of the mattress 16 hours a day, and being forced either to sit on the springs or floor, or stand, and with the denial of the right to attend religious movies or other privileges.

Since June 5th, he has been attacked twice by guards, with the acquiescence of administrative officers. One of these attacks occurred while Russell's hands were shackled behind his back. Contrary to regulations, his outgoing mail has been read, and some of it has been improperly returned to him. Incoming mail of a privileged nature (eg., attorney's communications) has been read, and for a period of time he had been denied the right to communicate with an attorney. Visiting rights of a friend of his have been taken away from him. His wife, Kathy, has been harassed and humiliated repeatedly,

both on the post and at the stockade, and her visiting rights have been severely infringed. Russell has been denied the solace of his religion as a Buddhist and has been denied consultation with a Buddhist priest or Lama. He was not even allowed to participate in the only religious services available in the stockade; those of the Protestant and Catholic faiths.

The incidents described in this motion are not isolated incidents of brutality and indifference occurring in one stockade or one post, but part of a pattern of military intimidation and repression. The significance of the trials of Jeffrey Russell and others at Fort Dix lie in the extent to which these point out the oppressive nature of the military and the stockade system.

On October 21st, at the pre-trial hearing of Terry Klug the charge of conspiracy (carrying a ten year sentence) was dropped. This, on the basis of multiplicity, sets precedent for dropping the conspiracy charges against the rest of the defendants. Of the original 38 arrested in the aftermath of the riot only five are still being held on more serious charges.

Two of the prisoners, William Brakefield and Jeffrey Russell, are being defended by WDL attorney Rowland Watts and a WDL special legal military committee. Both men are conscientious objectors, refusing to participate in an "illegal and unjust war." In October, 1968, prior to being committed to the stockade, Brakefield sought sanctuary at City College.

The remaining three (Carlos Rodriguez, Terry Klug and Thomas Catlow) are being defended by Henry deSuvero of the National Emergency Civil Liberties Committee and Fred Cohn of the Law Commune. The five prisoners facing general court martials are felt by the army to be the most militant in the struggle for G.I. rights.

Last week a variety of concerned organizations held a demonstration at Fort Dix to focus attention on the plight of these men and the other stockade prisoners. The 5,000 demonstrators were met with fixed bayonets and tear gas. They were driven off the post. Like the prisoners in the stockade, the demonstrators see the military machine as the oppressor rather than the individual G.I.'s. Many G.I.'s responded favorably to the demonstrators.

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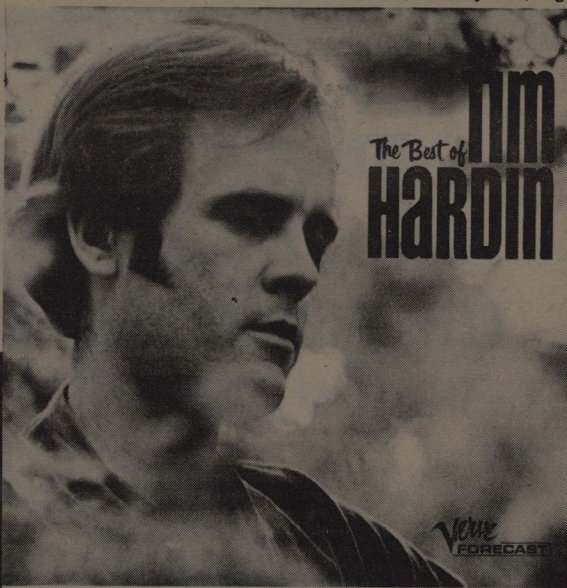
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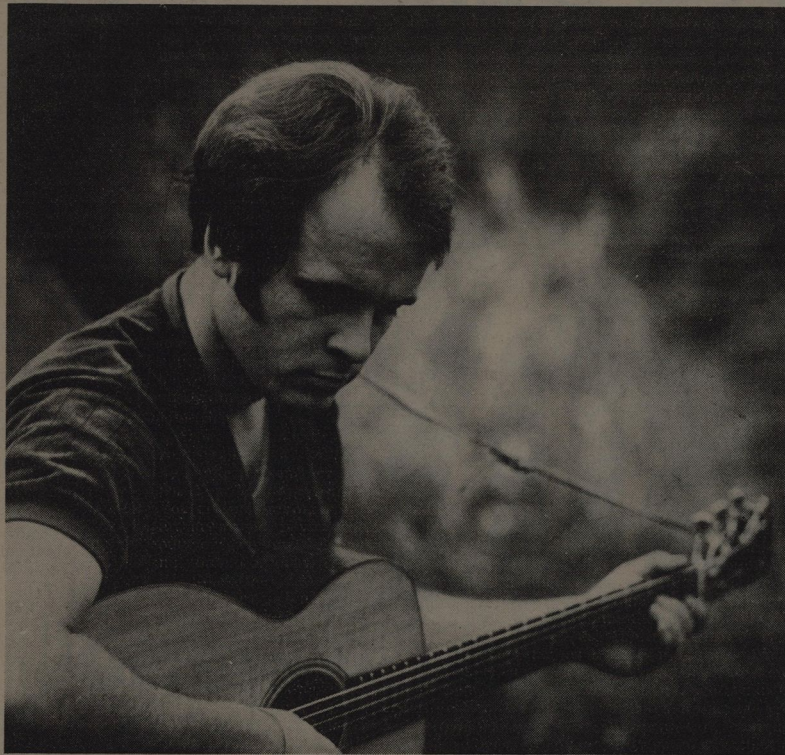

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Berkeley Folk Festival

At the Berkeley Folk Festival you could dance, enjoy yourself, and listen to some of the best entertainers in the fields of traditional folk, country, cajun, and rock music. The festival ran from last Thursday through Sunday afternoon, with plenty of concert dances, workshops, and discussions with various artists.

Music festivals have become a pop phenomenon during the past year, drawing large lemming-like pilgrimages of daylo youth and sizable contingents of reporters and news cameras. In the midst of these narcissistic spectacles the main performers are no longer musicians, but rather the massed members of the psychedelic subculture. All eyes are on the

"Woodstock generation," and the music that brought it together is forgotten. The size of the crowds alone prohibits an effective concert atmosphere. After all this insanity the Berkeley Folk Festival was a delightful and relaxing event.

Two rock bands whose roots are in the fertile soil of folk music highlighted the Thursday night concert in Pauley Ballroom. Country Joe and the Fish and the Youngbloods played to open the festival. The latter group, with Jesse Colin Young's superb singing, was especially well received. The three piece team left on their Eastern tour after their appearance here. Dan Hicks and his Hot Licks provided their own taste of country folk.

Friday night at Pauley we dipped into the song reservoir of cowboy singer Charley Marshall.

Charley was the original singing cowboy on the San Francisco radio western "Death Valley Days." Berkeley's own Joy of Cooking followed with their haunting harmony.

Bayou music with its jumpy syncopation and wailing accordion and fiddle was played by the black cajun band, the Opelousas Playboys. Originally from Louisiana, they have been playing Bay area clubs for some time now. They feature John Semien on accordion and vocals, Ben Guillory on fiddle and vocals, with M. Felton on guitar, and George Brossard on drums.

Everyone got a definitive lesson in the blues from Arthur "Big Boy" Crudup. Crudup was a main source of Elvis Presley's blues material in the fifties, and recently came out of fifteen years' retirement to perform once again. He was followed by the folk blues of Chicago's Billy Joe Becoat.

Becoat does his own material in a powerful style, accompanying himself on the twelve string guitar.

The evening was finished off with the good-times country rock of Commander Cody and his Lost Planet Airmen. The Commander's piano was right on, and so was the West Virginia Creeper's steel guitar. Billy C's vocals were hard and penetrating as usual. Bill Kirchen played a true truck-drivin' lead guitar, and the band introduced their new bass player, "Buffalo" Bruce.

Saturday night at Zellerbach hall the main attractions were Sonny Terry and Brownie McGhee with their brand of the blues. The two have been together since 1938, and have always given rewarding performances, featuring Sonny's fantastic harmonica style, and Brownie's polished singing and guitar work.

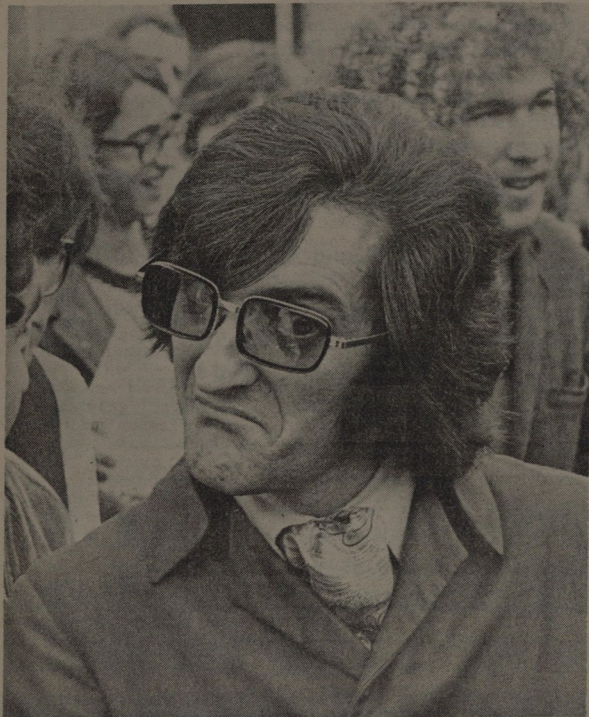
A slick Nashville version of cajun music was provided by the dynamic Doug Kershaw. Kershaw pranced and strutted around the

stage to the accompaniment of Commander Cody and his Airmen. He played his dobro guitar and fiddle and sang the song he wrote about his early life in the Louisiana bayou.

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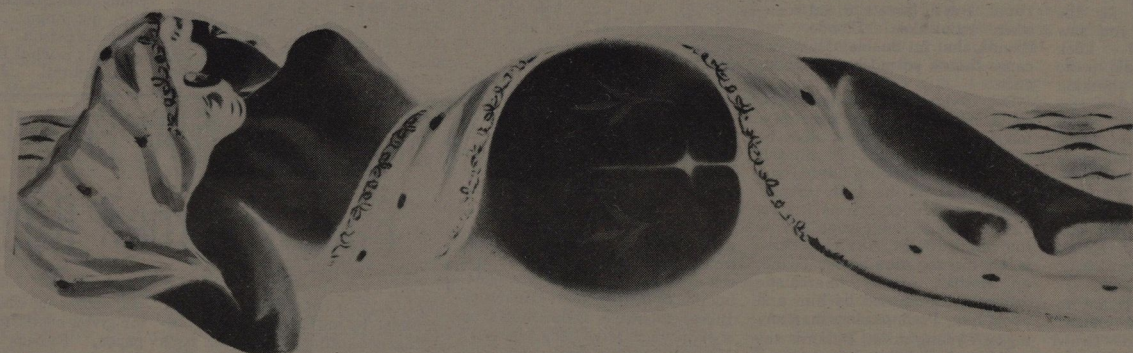
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"DON'T LOOK BACK"

OH MY DAHLIN', listen to the words of this song: I'm just average, common too/ I'm just like him, the same as you/ I'm everybody's brother and son/ I aint no different than anyone/ Aint no use to talk to me, why just the same as talking to you.

Another time around for the Cowboy Angel. Sure, you saw Pennebaker's "Don't Look Back," but what good did it do you? There you go, thinking Bobby Dylan's some kind of special fella. That's where you're wrong, he's just plain folks, folks.

Listen, I know it, we all know it. To review anything by Dylan is to plan on disaster. We want to go giving him titles and things, making something out of him that he would never want to be. Hands off Dylan. All he really wants to do is be friends.

About the time that Dylan recorded "Like a Rolling Stone," he wrote a song called "Crawl Out Your Window." One line runs: You got a lotta nerve to say you are my friend, if you won't crawl out your window. Is Dylan saying that to be his friend you have to take the risks he takes? What does he want, this Dylan? The film makes it clear that he certainly doesn't want other people's trouble. As teenage idol, his generation's spokesman, angry young folk-rock poet, and all the other nasty thing critics have called him, Dylan has sufficient problems of his own.

Dylan is a property. He is worth a great deal to many people. Newsmen exploit him for publication, hangers-on surround him, and listen, what use can you put him to?

Doesn't each of us have something "significant" to say about Dylan. Very heavy dude, am I right? Extremely deep, if you know what I mean. And very spiritual, I even have a friend somewhere who likes Blonde on Blonde, that fat double album, because there's so much talk about on it.

Bob Dylan sings song. You could call him a humdinger of a folksinger. You might also be wrong. He doesn't call himself anything. Oh, misguided Gene Youngblood of the L.A. Herald Examiner. Judging from his review I wonder if he actually saw the film: "FANTASTIC... There is an intense aura about Dylan, an electric, almost anarchistic excitement generated by him and about him. Perhaps more than any modern young artist, Dylan is the spokesman for the new society."

What's the matter with that guy? In the movie, when Dylan reads that a newsman calls him an anarchist he says, "It probably took them a while to think of that name... anarchist. They couldn't say communist." He laughs on. "Anarchist, ohhh. A singer such as I." He finds the whole notion of labels a drag, even a label which stands in opposition to labels. "I don't think it's cool to be an anarchist, though, Dylan says thoughtfully.

But isn't Dylan an anarchist! Perhaps a rough-hewn egalitarian: He cursed me when I proved to him/ and I whispered and said not even you can hide/ you see, you're just like me/ I hope you're satisfied. Dylan admits the right of each man to make his own mistakes.

FAN: It sounds as if you're having a good old laugh.

BOB: Well, don't you like me to have a good old laugh once in a while? Isn't that all right with you?

FAN: If you're not taken seriously and commercialized.

BOB: I don't care. You know different, tho, right? As long as you know, you don't have to worry about anybody else. All the people take care of themselves.

Laughter is the language of the gods, right! You know, like irony. Bob Dylan is de-vine and self-assertive. During the opening "Subterranean Homesick Blues" sequence, Dylan holds up a sign which says "Dig yourself". He also doesn't worry much about what other people think. Dylan tells an interviewer, "You think it would bother me one little bit if you disliked me?"

No regrets, no explanation, no peeking. Dylan tells the man from TIME: "I got nothing to say about these things I write...I don't write 'em for any reason. There's no great message."

They pay Bob Dylan to sing songs. He has a large staff and a highly competent manager, Albert Grossman. People get hung

up trying to define just what Dylan does so well. They want to figure out what he's doing so they can assign him some responsibility. That's a big thing with liberals, responsibility.

A newsman calls Dylan a sermonizer, and then condemns youth for not picking up the MESSAGE. Dylan claims that people value him for the entertainment he can provide. He is most concerned with making music. He once defined a poem as "anything that walks by itself," that is, a complete artistic statement.

When a young rock musician says, "We find it very difficult to get people to listen to the words," Dylan cuts him off, "It's beyond me, you know. I just go out there and sing 'em."

A reporter tells Dylan, "You sound angry in your song." Here we go, the angry irresponsible young man routine. Dylan says, "I'm not angry. I'm a delightful sort of person."

So this is what Dylan wants. To be delightful. Just plain folk.

Servicemen At Fort Lewis Fight For Their Rights

TACOMA, Wash. (LNS)—A recent attempt by military police and intelligence officers to break up a meeting of insurgent GIs at Fort Lewis and to break the spirit of the men — has failed miserably.

Nearly 40 soldiers were attending a meeting of the Fort Lewis chapter of the American Serviceman's Union (ASU) at the Cascadian Service Club — on the base — when a contingent of MPs came and took six people into custody. Three were GIs and three were civilians (including ASU Chairman Andy Stapp, who was passing through town en route to Hawaii).

The arrest of the six persons was apparently designed to break up the meeting, but in fact further business was carried on with even greater determination. Later, the MPs returned and rounded up an additional 36 men.

All were taken to the Provost Marshall's office, where they were all packed into a 10x8 cell. There, one by one, they underwent "interrogation," but as each man left the cell, the others all yelled out, "Article 31" — the military equivalent of the Fifth Amendment, the protection against self-incrimination.

The interrogators asked the soldiers who organized the meeting,

who spoke, and who was responsible for giving out the local underground paper, "Fed-up," but apparently the only answer they got was "Article 31". Within two minutes, each GI was returned to the cell. After trying this with 15 men, the officials gave up, and sent them all back to their company commanders.

Pfc. Bruce Frederick, one of the GIs involved, told LNS about the scene in the jail: "The solidarity was really fantastic. The guys were in great spirits. There was shouting and yelling and singing songs. The MPs couldn't do anything; they couldn't make phone calls or anything because we were making so much noise. Everytime an MP went by, everyone yelled 'Oink!' or 'Pig!' — but the MPs didn't do anything."

Frederick said that 12 of the men were placed on restriction "pending investigation." The report prepared by the provost marshal's office says that the men were "demonstrating."

But the GIs at Ft. Lewis are not impressed at the brass's maneuvers. Another meeting is already planned, and there will be discussion of activities related to the November anti-war actions across the country.

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Critic Fails in "Lions Love"

The day after the Chronicle printed John Wasserman's not so sensational review of "Lions Love", its star, Viva, made a very sensational statement to the press. Since the "pig media" declined to discuss it, the BARB is printing the texts of both persons' statements.

VIVA---I'd like to make an opening statement; which is a little story that happens to be true. John Wasserman of the Chronicle called me up the day after I got here and insisted that I come to his house for an interview... he was so busy that he could only come at night and he wanted to see me alone. Since he gave a good review of "Lonesome Cowboys", I figured he was O.K. (he wouldn't try to rape me or anything). So I went.

The minute I got into the car he started putting down the movie. We got to the house where he said, 'Be quiet. This isn't my house. I live in the basement.' ...He pulled out a sandalwood box with three joints in it. So I lit up. After my third puff I realized there was something fishy in the joint.

He kept drying glasses interminably (which seemed to be taking hours) and going upstairs to get ice and coming back down. Then he said, 'You won't believe this.' He turned out all the lights and left me in the dark (freezing cold) and turned on his light box psychedelic machine, which didn't work.

Then he started cross-examining me. (Which is the only word I can use, since my father is a criminal lawyer and I know all about cross-examinations.) 'What is your real name? What is your real age? Where do you come from? I don't think you have a laughable body.' To which I said 'Thank you, but who said I have a laughable body?' He said, 'Everybody! HA HA HA'

By this time I was so stoned that I was going on a total trip of fear and I decided that he was the ZODIAC. Being the spiritual killer he is... I guess it wasn't hard to make the connection. I mean maybe he is the ZODIAC. I was really afraid. Really really afraid. ...I decided to get out so I said, 'I have to leave'. I started to go for the door, which I couldn't get open because there was a chain on it. I said, 'Please let me out of here!' So he found another door and took me upstairs. He kept saying 'What's the matter? What's the matter?' I said, 'I want to leave that's all. Just let me walk...' He said 'Promise you'll wait here while I call a taxi.' I said, 'O.K. I promise.' I waited on the stairs until he closed the door to call a taxi and then I walked as fast as I could trying to find a house to get into.



"This would never have happened TO A MAN."

John Wasserman, in a statement to KQED-FM, confirmed that Viva's basic facts are correct but that her interpretation of the event was grossly exaggerated. The following is the text of that statement:

WASSERMAN---It's a joke, look back on it now. Her basic facts are accurate... I did pick her in my car. I did go to my house. I did give her a joint. (Which was not only not soaked in anything or filled with anything, but it was sort of a very run of the mill joint.

Where she got the ammunition to go freak out was somewhere other than that joint. I was told by the producer of the film that she'd been under a tremendous amount of pressure lately; and perhaps this explains it. My intentions were purely hospitable. I certainly had no intention of anything. She knew in advance that we were going to my house. (She agreed).

...I did this interview as a favor to her. I don't ordinarily do interviews at eleven o'clock on Thursday nights. ...I've done interviews at my house before, (with men and women) and this is the first time that I've been accused of being the Zodiac, as a result of it. I deny that I'm the Zodiac.

...I gave her a joint. I was trying to be, as I say, hospitable. She and I are from two entirely different worlds and I didn't know how to go about making her feel at home, (which is what I was trying to do.) I didn't smoke anything, not because I was trying to trick her but because I was not interested in smoking anything. I rarely smoke grass at all and certainly not when I'm working.

---That comment about her body, what was that?

---This is a typical example. I was trying to be nice. She's as scrawny as a plucked chicken. I have heard this a number of times, it has been printed a number of times, and I thought it was a sort of friendly thing to say. She spends half her time nude in her pictures. So I presume that she's not self-conscious about her body. I thought I'd be friendly and say, 'You know, I don't think you're so skinny,' and then we'd have a good laugh about that.

...The strangest thing about it

to me was that she never behaved like a lunatic. She just said things that were looney.

...I never laid a hand on her. I asked her her name and her real age because that's what us newspaper reporters are supposed to do. As a matter of fact she wouldn't tell me her age and this is typical of what I was trying to do -- which was to be friendly and so on. I asked her what her age was. She hemmed and hawed and I said, 'Oh forget...Then I said, 'Just between us I'd guess you to be 29-31 but I hope that doesn't offend you.' She smiled and said, 'It certainly doesn't offend me.' (As if to say, 'I'm older than that and I'm flattered by that estimate.) ...I certainly wouldn't call her a lunatic. But the behavior...uh...well.

I was totally taken back when she got up and announced, 'I'm Leaving.' As I say Viva and I are not from the same worlds and I figured if Viva's going to get up and say 'I'm leaving' there's no point in discussing it. ...The chained locked door is my back door,, which I have a chain on for (I presume) the same reasons other people have chains on doors-- to prevent burglars from getting into my apartment. We came in and out of the front door. She almost pulled the chains off the hinges, although I wasn't paying any attention then. (I was still typing or something and she had gone running out and yanked on this door. And then she discovered as a result that I had chain locked her in, was doping her, (where she gets that is really too funny for words,) and then I was perhaps going to reek degradations upon her body -- which was frankly not that interested a proposal.

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
or We Are Yellow Curious

After a week of skirmishes with pigs, movie-land scandals, and films that represent such a wide range of quality that you'd think they'd been picked out of a hat, the pie-eyed festival officials seemed to be in need of some rest. Some of the more memorable moments were films such as "More" which put the audience to sleep and "Antonio Das Mortes" which was shown backwards. Also to the festival's credit was a three hour speech given by Sidney Lumet in which he cited every person responsible for ever having blocked his creative genius. The most notable films so far have been "Z" and "the adventures of Goopy and Bagha". This years Eye Nose and Throat Award for the picture that couldn't be made by a sane society goes to "Futz".

"Z"

One of the most interesting films at the festival was Costa Gravas's entry, "Z". The title comes from the Greek word *zei* which means, he lives. It refers to Gregorios Lambrakis, a leftist member of the Greek parliament. In 1963 he was killed in an accident. During the next three years it was uncovered that the accident was in fact a murder. Furthermore it was established that many high ranking government officials were involved in the plot. Because of the evidence exposing them, they were forced to resign their posts. Six months later there was a military coup. The same officials now rule Greece. The official Greek response to the movie is that it is an example of communist propaganda.

"FUTZ"

The story is told from the point of view of the examining magistrate and from that of a young journalist. As it moves from the event of the murder, it begins to unveil that all too familiar machinery of the police state. Its likeness to that of a "free" country makes this an exceptionally important movie.

"Futz" is a sadly funny story of a man who is in love with a pig. There are parts that are hysterically funny, but the overall idea of the story seems sick. It seems all too clear to me that those who revel in a dung heap to disgust or shock their neighbors, are victims of gross self-neglect. If a society is sick, then it should be our purpose to create alternatives. "Futz" does articulate the diseases of our world, but it doesn't seem to reach beyond. Rather, it seems to want only to change costume.

The combination of surreal photography and Indian music lulls one into an ecstatic reverie. In a country that manifests as much callousness as ours, this film is especially important.

Stones

Two films starring the Rolling Stones will be shown at the end of the festival. The first, which will be screened on Friday, is an Australian flic entitled "Popcorn". It features an interview with Mick Jagger and appearances from Otis Redding and Jimi Hendrix.

The other flic is on Sunday night and is directed by Godard. It includes the Stones recording "Sympathy for the Devil", which is also the title of the movie. The other half of the Godard flic deals with a group of Black Panthers.

"LIONS LOVE"

"Lions Love" is Agnes Varda's fifth feature, her first in America. It stars Viva, femme fatale of "Nude Restaurant", "Lonesome Cowboys", and "Midnight Cowboy". Also playing in it are Jerome Ragni and James Rado, the authors of "Hair". The trio is cast as a typical Hollywood couple during June '68. Its quick pacing creates an exciting yet easy environment where they spoof America, fact or fiction.

On another level, the film contrasts the frivolous lives of the superheroes with the Kennedy assassination. The film is not politically heavy, but does seem to portray some of the detachment of American life.

Only about one quarter of the script was set before they began making the flic. Miss Varda makes great use of the casts "presence" and spontaneity to carry the film. This gives "Lions Love" a wonderfully refreshing quality.

Another explanation of this quality might be that during the making of the flic, Viva lived almost exclusively on rice and organic fruit.

"Adventures of Goopy and Bagha"

"Goopy and Bagha" is the Indian entry to the festival. Satyajit Ray is recognized as one of India's greatest directors and this film is by no means an exception. It is sadly true that our Disneyesque consciousness destroyed much of our ability to appreciate truly sensitive children's stories. Ray's film is a fairy tale about two musicians who are cast out of their respective villages. In their adventures they meet the king of the ghosts who grants them three wishes. From this point on, they're into a fantastic adventure which culminates in saving two countries from going to war.

Hello Central

Grand Central Station, the organization that staged the pie fight at the film festival, will enter the filmed version on Saturday. It is not yet known whether the festival officials will accept it or not. However there will be a showing on Monday, Nov. 3, at 7 p.m. It will be shown every half hour till 9 or 9:30. A one dollar donation will be asked, to raise money for the Bakers' Dozen Defense Fund. (These are the thirteen people arrested for creaming the festival). 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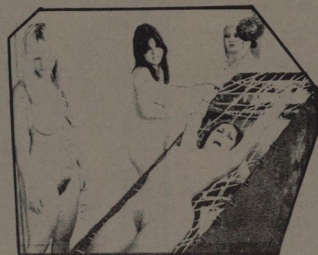

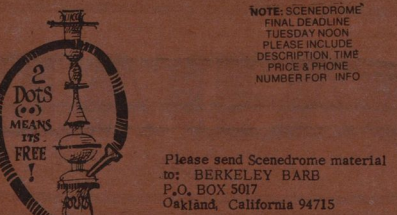
