Tim was at the Stones Concert at Altamont, but we missed him. In the ensuing conversation, he tells us of his experience at the Chicago Seven trial, lessons learned from Altamont and Woodstock, views on the moon, and what about Leary for Guv?

O.K. Ask me the questions. Alright. The Chicago Trials. Your, ah, sensings. Well, ah, I went to Chicago to testify for Jerry and Abbie, attesting to their peaceful intent and their joyous motives, In going to Chicago, I was very pleased right up front to sense the high morale of Jerry and Abbie and they are really together and survived this long, gruelling situation beautifully and william Kuntsler, their lawyer is an absolute hero. He's a beautifull man and extremely effective and he is grooving beautifully with Jerry and Abbie and that was good to see.

Secondly, I was depressed to see what a stainless-steel like operation the government has going there the Judge automatically rules in favor of the government on each motion and I've been a witness at many trials and I've never seen such piston-like synchronicity between Judge and prosecution which really indicates that there's no pretense at fair trial or impartial justice.

"Groovyl I really want to play there," said Dave Crosby when he first heard the plan, "But please don't tell anyone I'm coming,"

"I sense a need for scale here," Coyote said. "The media is funny—it needs images. Once you have an image you can hang anything on it. You can even hang Henry Manson on it."

Coyote leaned out over the railing of the small balcony and looked out from under his brown, turned down cowboy hat, "My name is Coyote," he said.

His lean sharp features met in a thin wisp of a goatee. His argument broke the atmosphere of inplicit trust that had dominated the meeting thus far. It had been felt that everyone there shared the same dream, Coyote's testimony made it clear that there

were some very clear differences.

"The vision I see in the media is one of old-style doper pilgrims, and that is not the visible life style I see around me. There are families of ingenious, happy, well-fed people out there. People who are living their lives with what is available," he said.

"The trouble with ecology is that it's based on science, and science never taught anyone respect for life. In my high school biology class the teacher took a dead frog and stuck a pin through its brain. That's what science taught me."

There are those among us that hold technology responsible for the problems threatening this planet. And there are those who look to technology for the answer.

A group calling themselves Pneumads — space cowboy envirnmentalists — circulated a leaflet



BASTA YA

Our two kids, the best walking psychic barometers in the business, began to freak out all over the Basta Ya Restaurant at 260 Valencia Street in San Francisco.

They'd found two other kids and the wolf pack raced up and down the narrow storefront eating place just above Valencia and 14th Street whooping and hollering. They shot out onto the night-shadowed sidewalk perfectly happy and at home. Very much turned on by this little island of revolutionary aspirations translated into a political office, neighborhood gathering place, oratorical platform, community dining room and center of resistance here in the heart of the heavily Chicano Lower Mission.

No one paid any attention to the noisy kids. The rapid, lively conversation — between WASPs, Blacks, Chicanos — anyone who happens in from the street — continued as usual. Kids in the barrio are taken for granted. The tenements swarm with them.

Life in the midst of poverty perpetuates itself, noisily indifferent to economics, space, the sensibilities of ear and eye. It jumps and laughs and yells and shines in its own bright beauty. Nothing outside of its own feeling of balance can surpress it.

And that, in essence, is what makes the Basta Ya, now about two months old, such a fantastic experience. For it is SO much more than a restaurant.

A young Chicano girl with blazing eyes (dark-ringed now with fatigue) who wears a taco-stained apron and waves a delicate pair of bird-fluttering expressive hands at me (speaking between them a Latin language of their own) tells me about the Basta Ya as my children run up and down the sidewalk laugh-

ing.
(One of the little waiter boys —
he couldn't have been more than
10 — joins them and soon has
tossed his paper hat into the group
like a football. They tear it to
shreds as they dance in the chill

evening light.)

"The Basta Ya is a living room to our community," says Miranda Bergman. "We provide a non-exploitative meeting place where everyone can get dinner for under \$1. It's also the office of the Los Siete political organization and we use the proceeds from the meals to help in the defense of our brown brothers in jail.

"On weekends, Friday and Saturday night, we have bands in like Kwani and the Kwandidos and the Peace, Bread and Land Band, or street theatre groups like the East Bay Sharks.

"On Wednesday nights, we show films," she continues. "Often Newsreel shorts or classic silent

films.

"Any neighborhood group that wants to meet here is welcome free. A high school union is forming here.
"All of us who work here do it without pay. I also help every morning at the Los Siete Breakfast Program at St. John's Church and I'm getting pretty fucking tired. Please excuse me. It's been a long day. Come back another night and I'll tell you more about Basta Ya.

Peter Graves (not the Mission Impossible actor) spoke for a group called Aquarian Ventures. "The energy is there, all you have to do is tune in," he said. He spoke of 100 foot video screens and nation wide television hookups. He sought to interate Earth People's Park with Buckminster Fuller's computerized World Game.

"Are you going to put us in the computer?" asked one frighted girl. The thing is there is no way you can stay out of the computer.

And Keith Lampe was waying that faith in technology is dangerous, and that media foster's rhetoric. Someone pointed out that probably half the people there are from the

Ken Kesey did the old Orson Bean routine — making a paper eucalyptus tree which he planted in the middle of the table. At a thick point in the argument about media he rose to speak.

He pointed out that microphones and cameras are something put between us and the people we are talking to. You have to remember whose movie it is. You can't let yourself get confused, he said, "and that is motion, the freedom from being pinned down, You have to remember who is doing the talking. I'm going out and buy some wine," He left.

And others left. Hugh Romney and the Hog Farmers suggested that everyone in the room hold hands, Soon a long chain was formed and Hugh asked people to concentrate on certain parts of the body. He moved the consciousness from the feet up through the body to the head, Finally all was released in a scream that went through the room, It was a gimmick to regain solidarity, and it worked for most of those that remained,

calm like an expert hunter. He knew what he was doing and everyone left him alone.

Two men died casually on San Francisco's Skid Row Thursday. Richard Vargas, 21, received two fatal bullet wounds while traveling down the holiday Mission sidewalks. His fate, a black man called John Henry Price, squeezed off the rounds which ended Vargas and sent another man to the hospital.

Shortly after hitting Vargas, Price shot himself in the head. He was killed instantly by the blast.

Sometime around eleven o'clock last Thursday Richard was walking up toward Fourth on Mission.
The usual traffic cop on the busy intersection had not yet come on duty. The sidewalk was peopled with Christmas shoppers, working men and women, and the resident derelicts.

For two days thereafter I walked this same neighborhood. The cop on the corner, the shoppers, the street workers, and the derelicts—all were there. Only Vargas and Price were not there.

AN OPEN TUNNEL
Both Vargas and Price needed work. The dead youth's mother thought her son was in the neighborhood of the shooting on his way to the State Unemployment Insurance office on Bryant Street.
The Unemployment building is not a nice place, People rush through its broad glass door all day only to wait for hours inside. They are out-of-job-workers trying hard to make it. The men I

Richard was out of a job, Rose Vargas said her son hurried off early Thursday to go around for work: "He asked me if he looked OK and I said he did, He was wearing bell bottom pants, a nylon shirt, and those boots the young fellows wear," The dead youth lived with his family on Oxford Street.

Sometime before eleven o'clock he walked up toward Fourth on Mission, John Price stood calmly by the doorway of Troy of California -- a discount center. Several minutes earlier Price obtained a 8mm Mauser from Argonaut Jewelry and Loan, He had carried a saco of shells and the exposed semi-automatic weapon for close to two blocks with a hitch.

"They brought this information to us, and asked for our help," revealed the spokesman. "We visited the tenants of the building and found two male students renting one of the apartments. This did it.

"We immediately confronted Golden Gate with these facts, and threatened to hit them with a racial discrimination suit," he said. "Golden Gate was quick to reverse their refusal; now the two are moved into the apartment they wanted."

BARB asked the BTU how strike pledges were coming; they mentioned more than 250 new pled-ges were given in the past few weeks. BTU says this month's focus is on recruiting Mason Mc-Duffy pledge signers and building organizers. BTU voiced optimism about support from these renters.



Easy Streets manager, Phil, told BARB he is in the midst of an involved court proceedings which "could set some unattractive precedents if they can succeed in closing us down."

"The basis for the action is the Red Light Abatement Act," Phil told BARB, "which was originally enacted to control whorehouses. If we lose, many other area businesses could be closed along with us, this appears to be a state wide attempt to prevent people from enjoying our films and other products."

"We have contacted the Sexual Freedom League, and the American Civil Liberties Union, and they have agreed to help us in our de-

fense.

"If anyone wouldcare to come and see our films and testify later in our behalf, we wouldwelcomeit."
Phil said "this issue affects far more people and businesses than just the Easy Street Theater".

The Berkeley police -- somebody finally called their hand.
For the past three weeks working
under a new policy together with
U.C.'s finest the local gestapo
have been out in doubled force,
shaking down the kids on Telly
like the blackjack dealers at the
fastest, loosest house in Reno.
The foot patrol is now an even
dozen assigned to cover half as
many blocks on the south campus.
Supposed to cover the entire
area, presumably including the
sidestreets off the main drag, they
are usually found clustered in strategic groups of three on the blocks
between Dwight Way and Channing.
They stand about the corners lounging languidly in front of the Forum
or by Cody's bookstore looking
bored and vaguely hostile as they

suspiciously eyethe parade of longhaired kids who regard the avenue
as their own public preserve.

"I want your identification" says
the cleanly shaven crisply dressed
cop." Let's gol Let me have your
drivers license or your draftcard.
What are you doing here?" He
demands brusquely, sneering unsympathetically at the nervous kid
he has indiscriminately approached.

"Nothing..." the kid answers,
as he reaches into his back pocket,
finally he gets his wallet out of
the leather jacket folded next to
him on the fender of the car.
He has just been leaning against
the car watching the people go by.
He is told to keep off the street.
A few more youths are approached in this manner, A small
crowd gathers to see what's coming down. They too are told to
produce identification or harshly

ordered to "get moving, and mind your own business!"

It seems that without anything else to occupy them, or under a specific order to clear the streets, cops have taken it on themselves to indiscriminately harass anyone whose looks displease them. Arbitrarily, they'll approach someone, put him against a storefront and go through all of his cards, Finally they are forced to let him go, but not without a warning to keep off of the street, or get more of the same!

That is the issue. There's a law that says someone can be stopped and checked out on the street if there is a reason to suspect him of a crime. Under the new paramilitary tactics of the last few weeks it seems that anyone found on the street is suspect.

The pressure seems to be on to clean the avenue of its unconventional traffic through intimidation. The tension has gotten pretty high. Nobody here is very happy about it.

Meanwhile the more violent

rape -- continues to increase unhampered by the forces of order and law.

Somebody finally called the cop's bad hand. People looked at the deal and what they saw was police harrassment. A meeting was called for two p.m. last Sunday to discuss the problem.

Downstairs in the basement of Moe's bookstore a group of about forty sat crowded on the cold cement floor waiting to discuss what could be done about what was coming down on them.

They were mostly young, streetpeople, radicals, concerned students, who consider the avenue their street. Some of the older concerned members of the community were also in evidence among this uneasy group. I didn't see any blacks, but this was not going to be another meeting to discuss abstractions. Everyone there, was in one way or other directly involved.

Moe sat on a chair in the center of this group puffing anxiously on his enormous cigar.

"I called the chief of police" he announced, trying to give the meeting some structure. "They said they'd send someone over to listen to us." The basement was filled by low muttered growls and mutterings. "Yeah, good, let 'em hear what's the matter," was the general consensus out of the angered confusion.

That was when I had the nightmare Joe Hill. He came down the stairs, larger than life, ducking his tall shoulders beneath the door jamb as he entered the crowded room. Somebody announced itas he came in.

"Captain Joe Hill of the Berkeley police."

Joe Hill is now a cop!

His appearance was greeted by a chorus of laughter and shouts. He just stood there rubbing his cropped head and chewing his gum, easily the largest man in the room.

The meeting was taken into a larger room but Joe Hill left his blue nylon jacket on. He still seemed uncomfortable with this group and didn't even seem to know was, he was the P.R. cop today, and that he had to look concerned and answer peoples questions and complaints as nice and cool as a wedge of apple pie.

Two of the group who lived on Chilton way around the corner complained, Meanylie, the foot patrols

Joe Hill nodded and looked concerned. "The police were doing everything they could to prevent violent crime" he said sympathetically. "What about all those cops on the avenue" The meeting shouted at him. What about all of the unnecessary harrassment?" "Have any of you filed personal complaints," he asked his upset audience.

He listened as they told him case after case of personal infringe-

ones:

"Listen, one Officer told me that if I continued to complain about his taking my property without cause, he would personally take care of me. What am I supposed to do?"

"We see the erection of this building as an act of cultural genocide; it threatens the communal life style of the people who live in the older houses in this neighborhood."

The speaker is Larry Kline. A new ticky-tacky apartment building at 2252 Parker Street is what he's after.

Kline, and a number of other re-

sidents in the neighborhood are picketing the building and its management. Kline's group live in most of the older shingled two-story houses in the neighborhood. They view their neighborhood as a small community.

Kline said that the group had no connection with the Tenant's Union, and when the Union was asked by

BARB they said it was news to them. Asked to comment on the protest, the building manager said, "the issues are too complex and involved to simply explain our position, we have no comment to make on this issue."

"Many of the older buildings in Berkeley are being ripped off by developers," Larry explained, "and the new structures they build represent the cancerous growth of cities in the 20th century. Our block is a small community, and the developers threaten this community and others like it with their buildings."

Kline explained the focus of the picketing: "You can't have a community in an apartment building, apartments are a threat to communal life styles."

A fire bombing had ocurred recently at the building, Larry said disavowing any connection of his group with this incident, He said the management had used german shepherd dogs and had hired guards after the fire.

"The bombing shows us that we are not alone in our concern about all this new building going on in Berkeley," said Kline
"We hope for mas action to down zone Berkeley if possible," Kline pointed out, "and we hope to be able to force landlords to improve existing structures rather than ripping them off,"

Larry described how the protesters picketed and passed out leaflets on Saturday, "but mostly to people who passed by on foot and in cars, hardly anyone showed up to look at the apartments. It rained on Sunday, and the Monday picket was the same as Saturday."







The Free University of Berkeley got its use permit last night on a 3-1 ruling by the Board of Adjustments. FUB moved into 2200 Parker this fall and when the Free Church moved out their use permit went with them.

A few neighbors seized on the opportunity to rid themselves of free-everything and filed a complaint.

Thirty-five others who signed a hastily circulated petition thought otherwise; the Board concurred. The Free U is there to stay though its rent remains doubled. (\$350 a month for those who wonder where the fees go.)

The Free Y winter quarter begins in February. The winter catalogue will be out January 16th. This means that class starters (and that's anyone who wants to start a class or even teach) must have their course descriptions in by the 29th of December.

"That's it, that's final, that's the last date" says FUB co-ordinator Meredith Smith. However, anyone who has an idea after that time is welcome to post it in the FUB offices at Parker and Oxford.

of the park has been open for use by students who live in dormitorles.

But now this has also been changed. That lot is or will shortly be made available to students who do not live in Berkeley and who commute to the campus by automobile.

Since the Thanksgiving break a student-street boycott of university facilities built on the People's Park site has been successful in keeping the facilities unused.

The latest moves by the university are some indication of the success of the boycott.

First, the change from a dorm parking lot to a commuter parking lot to a commuter parking lot defacto recognizes that students who live in Berkeley are being kept aware of any plans the university has for the site. Several merchants in the area have expressed opposition to such use of the site and are preparing communications to chancellor Heyn's office to express this opposition.

"Bishop Antulio Parillo is actively involved in the anti-war movement in Puerto Rico," Reverend Dick York told BARB, "He is here in Amerika on a pilgrimage to visit political prisoners who are victpms of repression for their beliefs."

The Bishop plans to visit Treasure Island stockade and the Presidio, York said, to meet with Gl's "who are being unfairly held for their anti-war stand."

The visitor was denied permission, in writing, to visit McNeil Island and Fort Lewis when he asked for it. He also plans to visit Black Panther leaders now in jail, and he is attempting to include other political prisoners on his tour.

York told BARB the bishop's

York told BARB the bishop's visit would be "a one man demonstration of the plight of prisoners held for repressive political reasing this country." The Bishop plan meet with a number of anti-war activits around the country.

Drive for funds undertaken by the Free Church is encouraging York said. He discerns "a note of contidence in the church from the Berkeley community! The financial crisis arose from stoppage of funds from the "straight" churches because of the involvement of the church in politics, according to York.
