

that occurred in Saigon for the same period.

The map above, compiled by Scanlan's, on guerilla acts of sabotage in the United States from 1965 - 1970 gives a very clear picture of what has been taking place.

Scanlan's was unable to bring out this particular issue of their publication in the fascist community of America, due to duress by the ruling class who were afraid of the true

facts being told.

RACIST SLUMLORD KILLED IN RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA TRYING TO KILL TENANT

Looking objectively at the relationship of the slumlord to his tenants, poor people in general and black people in paricular, one clearly sees that the last thing the slumlord has in mind is the living conditions of those who live in the dwellings he rents. Instead of making the necessary repairs that would make day-to-day living more comfortable for his tenants. the slumlord is only interested in making a profit by collecting rent which he does not deserve. Black people are subjected to slumlords who rent unfit housing and who have even worse attitudes in regards to Black people as human beings.

If one correctly analyzes the

situation he will conclude that the problem must be eliminated if things are to get better. If a slumlord does not take the interest of his tenants to heart, if he only wants to take his tenants' money (or life) then his tenants should eliminate the problem by snuffing out the racist dog's life. Jack Swaim was such a slumlord, Donald Boston eliminated the pro-

One day in late November, Donald Boston's girlfriend, Johnnie Pennington returned to her house only to find her young son unable to enter, However, at the same time Mrs. Swaim, the racist wife of the slumlord, and an ap-

praiser (one who determines how much a house is worth) and a little boy were inside of Johnnie's house. Since she didn't have a key to the house, Mrs. Swaim had put the boy through a window and had him let her and the appraiser in-

When Johnnie saw what was going on she asked Mrs. Swaim for an explanation. The racist responded by calling the sister "nigger", and made other derogatory remarks. At this point Johnnie jumped on this inconsiderate racist and showed her that she (Johnnie) would not accept those violations of her human rights.

Determined to get revenge Mrs. Swaim tried to file charges against the sister but she soon found out that nothing could be done by the pigs because she was trespassing on the sister's property. So the Swaims sold the house and had a realtor tell Johnnie and Donald that they would have to move by January, This still wasn't enough, so racist Mrs. Swaim talked some courage into her husband and had him try to get revenge on Johnnie Pennington.

On Monday December 8th, racist slumlord, Jack Swalm drunk, was outside of Johnnie Pennington's residence armed with a gun and a knife. He was asking a little brother from the neighborhood would the brother like to see him shoot the windows out of the sister's house. The brother, recognizing the slumlord as a diehard racist left and told Johnnie

Then on Tuesday, December 9th. Swaim returned, drunk again, he went around the house looking through the windows. When he determined that no one was at home this racist dog attempted to enter the house. He was unsuccessful in his attempt because a neighbor asked him what he was doing. Slumlord Swaim replied that he was going to paint the house. Upon hearing this idiotic reason for trying to break into the house. the neighbor told Swaim not to go into the house. At this point the doomed fool left, only to return for the last time Wednesday night.

At approximately 6:30 p.m. Wednesday night the drunken slumlord, Jack Swaim, returned. He was making so much noise until he attracted many peoples attention, including several neighbors, Johnnie Pennington, and Donald Boston, Upon hearing the commotion outside Donald looked out a window and saw the drunken racist staggering toward the house with a .38 revolver hanging out of his clothes. Donald grabbed a .22 revolver and went to the door where he met Jack Swaim,

Swaim started talking about painting the house, but since he no longer owned the house Donald told him to go talk to the realtor. Slumlord Swaim continued to shout about painting the house, but since

he was equipped with a gun instead of a paint brush, Donaldtold him to go home and sober up. At hearing this Swaim made his last statement, "I'm going to make you change your mind - I've got something for you", and started fumbling for his gun.

As the racist dog leveled his gun, Donald began firing, hitting the dog in the neck and fatally wounding him.

When the pigs came on the scene they found the racist dog slumlord dead, still clutching his .38. The pigs took Donald to jail. Even though the pigs wanted to keep and eventually execute Donald Boston for killing one of their colleagues, the pigs had to release him because too many people said it was a clear case of self-defense.

We must understand that Donald Boston has set an example that many of us must follow. For too long Black people have been subjected to indecent housing and flagrant attacks on our human dignity at the hands of racist slumlords. If we expect better housing conditions and more humane treatment we will have to follow the example set by Donald Boston. When slumlords begin to hear of other slumlords dying like flies, all across Babylon, the surviving pigs will have to straighten up

their hands or suffer the same fate as their slain colleagues, the wrath of the armed tenants. ALL POWER TO THE PEOPLE

As one White 1615 E, 23rd, Street man stated, "We have no trouble until outsiders come in," This proved to be true on Sunday, November 29, when a racist fool attacked Mrs. Lillie Lawson because she was talking to a white neighbor, After Mrs. Lawson got into her house the same white racist went and got his shotgun, tore down the Lawson's door and beat Mr. Lawson in the head when he ran to the door to protect his home. He shot at a guest of the Lawson's when he said he was going to get the police.

When the pigs did come they only cited the racist, Winky Duggins, to court. We well know and understand that the Winston-Salem Police Department is also racist. If this had been a Black that attack-

ed a White he (the Black) would have been put in jail and given a bond or held until time for court. Instead, by letting this fool stay on the street they allowed him another chance to attack other Blacks simply because they are Black. Therefore, the pigs only work hand in hand with the ra-

We urge everyone to support Mr. and Mrs. Lawson even though we know there is no justice in the courts for poor people in general and Black people in particular; but this will serve as another example for the people to see the unjust tactics of Winston-Salem

BROOKLYN PIGS BRUTALIZE AND RAILROAD BROTHER SAMUEL SMITH

On December 10, 1970, Mrs. Ibidum Smith came to the Black Panther Party office in Brooklyn. Like so many others who have visited our office, Mrs. Smith needed legal assistance for her husband.

On the night of October 26, 1970, a robbery of a grocery store allegedly took place in the Flatbush section of Brooklyn, in which two white police officers were shot and critically wounded. The incident took place, according to the pig press, about 9:00 PM. The New York Police Department arrested a suspect that matched the decription given over the the dispatch radio near 120th Street and Morningside Drive in Harlem about one hour later, A while later, another brother, a second suspect, Samuel Smith (25) of Brooklynwas picked-up and taken to the Empire Boulevard police station, booked and taken to court. He was held on charges of attempted murder, robbery, and illegal possession of a gun and bail was set at \$10,000.

brother Samuel is still charged with attempted murder and illegal possession of a gun. His bail was set at \$50,000.00 for attempted murder and \$15,000.00 for illegal possession of a gun; a total of \$65,000,00 ransom,

Brother Samuel was beaten so viciously by the arresting pigs. that he could not recognize his wife or mother in court. He did not even remember being arrested; the last thing that he remembered was that he was on his way home and was waiting for the train at the Sutter Avenue Brooklyn. 



lon has taught that no Black person can receive true justice in the courts. For members of the Black Panther Party even the pretense of justice is ignored, a trial is a complete sham.

Every Chapter of the Black Panther Party has, in the last year and a half experienced mass arrests of its membership. In every case, the outcome of these arrests was a large number of people being charged with murder, conspiracy to commit murder or other related charges.

Around April 30, 1970, seventeen people were arrested in Baltimore, Md. for murder, torture, kidnap and binding. All of the seventeen were either Panthers, ex-Panthers or Party sympathizers. They were charged in the July 12th, 1969 shooting death of 20 year old, Eugene Leroy Anderson, in Leakin Park. As in all murder cases involving Panthers, the alleged motive for the killing

Historical experience in Baby- was that Anderson was suspected secution's case, Hillary D. Caplan, of being a police informer.

> The first of the defendants togo to trial was Irving "Ochika" Young. Ochika's trial began and ended in less than six days. The first day, in 3 1/2 hours, a jury for a murder trial was chosen from a panel of less than 60 jurors. Present in the courtroom during the jury selection were the prosecution and defense attorneys, the jury panel and about 40 plain clothes pigs. The ten women and two men who were selected were all white and in their mid-thirties

> All of the state witnesses (including 3 ex-Party members) delivered well versed, cold and calculated testimony against Ochika. It was brought out that although the skeleton of the alleged victim was found in October, the defendant was not arrested until 6 months later because the prosectulon needed that time to build a solid case. At the close of the pro-

prosecutor, brought the jury to near tears in a long sermon praising the 'victim'. On the other hand, he indicted without mercy, Ochika Young for first degree murder.

The third day, the case for the defense began and on the sixth day the jury went out. After an hour and a half of deliberation, the jury returned a verdict of guilty in the 1st degree.

Irving Ochika Young is now a convicted political prisoner. At this point in history, his sentence is irrelevant because experience in the fascist courts and pig pens have taught all Black people and particularly the Black Panther Party that if we want freedom we have to fight for it. Liberate all political prisoners.



NEGRO SPOKESMAN IN BERKELEY DISTORTS COMMUNITY CONTROL OF POLICE INITIATIVE

In April the community control of police charter amendment will be placed on the municiple ballot. Because over twenty thousand signatures were initially secured to place the initiative on the ballot, the Berkeley power structure has begun its campaign to sabotage the police initiative by molding and shaping public opinion. With the help of the fascist Berkeley Gazette the pig power structure is projecting two endorsed spokesmen as the torch-bearers of the anti-initiative campaign. In the white community, Capt. Plummer (the pig who put together the armored assault plan on the old Black Panther Party Headquarters on Shattuck) is the endorsed spokesman for the White community. important for the Black community to understand is that Wilmont Sweeny, vice mayor and city councilman, is the Negro endorsed spokesman used by the pigs power structure to project a positive and trusting image of the pig department to the Black community while at the same time projecting a negative and suspicious image toward the petition and those responsible, while he is projected as the rational, articulate Negro spokesman for the Black community.

The Black community has always been victims of these projected images created by the pig media. Eact time, it is for the purpose of molding and creating a desired mood in the Black community to counter-act any mass movement on the part of brothers and sisters inside the zone of occupied territory. Wilmont Sweeny is typical of the countless number of Negroes who have been used to proje the image that all is well in the community, and that we are content with our humillat- by Berkeley pigs in the Alcatraz ing position as an occupied people. because the Black Panther Party is not a step backward, but several steps forward, we want an immediate end to police brutality and murder of Black people. One way of doing this is to organize and educate the people toward the necessity of setting up the necessary machinery to rid the community of the occupying army which has been responsible for the real separation of people from the control of

Sweeny further claims that the initiative would destroy the police department and establish three separate communities. He claims that separate police departments would make it virtually impossible to mobilize a majority of police swiftly to handle an emergency in any particular part of town. If we properly analyze this statement we understand that it's not so much the division by the petition of Berkeley into three separate communities because the geographical boundaries are natural ones. The Black community has in reality always been isolated geographically from other sections of society. The underlaying concern of those who would write Sweeny's speech is that if the initiative passed, the pigs could not mobilize 500 pigs to swiftly move against the Black community. The Black community would no longer be held in check by occupying armies because these pigs would be replaced by elements in the community who had the interest of the community at heart.

Sweeny goes on further to say that the worst feature of the plan is that it redefines who has the right to bear arms. "Anybody with the right to bear arms are potentially dangerous. It's not the police who commit crimes, other

murdering each other. I wouldn't want every Tom, Dick and Harry to live in my neighborhood to have a gun." The potentially dangerous act which Sweeny speaks of is an existing constitutional right that every US, citizen may bear arms - that each home is entitled to a shot-gun. This must be understood by every Black brother and sister in the community, because we know who the real criminals are and what we must do to protect our community and its people. We know we are not criminals if we pick up a gun and run out of our houses the true criminals who for four hundred years have come to rob us, murder us, starve us and de-humanize us. No, the true criminals are the barbarians who have declared war against Black people and the Black Panther Party in particular, Vietnamese, Koreans, Africans, Latin Americans, and all oppressed people throughout the oppressed world.

Finally Sweeny claims that Berkeley has the finest police department because of its rigid qualifications for recruiting fine police officers and strict guidelines on the use of weapons. But of course, we know this is the most notorious lie Sweeny has told. We know that this projected image will not be accepted by brothers and sisters in the community, because we see objective reality everyday. Objective reality is armed members of the Berkeley pig department shot to death an unarmed Black youth in the back of the head with his hands up, at close range on Tenth Street and University Avenue with double-'O' buckshot. We recognize that these acts aren't carried out by fine, disciplined officers but by vicious undisciplined madmen whose job it is to contain Black people in a position of ever-lasting servitude while protecting the interest of those elements which occupy the Black community while they exploit Black people on every conceivable level of human existence.

The negative image projected by Wilmont Sweeny, Negro, vice-mayor, city councilman, is potentially dangerous if taken as a truth by some elements of the Black community. It is dangerous because it attempts to nulli-

councils would be the mechanism by which this could be made a possible reality. The present structure of the pig department gives no one any legal redress when criminal acts are committed by those criminals - the upholders of law and order - who have no respect for human life. How many times have we heard the words justifiable homocide' echoing from the corridors of the Hall of Justice after a young Black brother has been murdered by the pigs? With the present structure, the city manager, the mayor, the police, the judges, the city councilman all collaborate in a city manager type government to deny people proper legal redress against those who would act in the manner of criminals.

In this type of operation, the city manager hires all employees, plus police chief. The city manager is appointed by the city council, and the chief of police is responsible to the city manager not the city council. People of the community have no control over determining the police actions except to vote funds. The council itself has no control over determining police action or policy. The police are responsible to one man, Secret Pig Hanley, the city manager who is not an elected official by the people, but an appointee of the ruling circles.

ruling circles. The charter amendment offers, not a step backward as boot-licking lackey Wilmont Sweeny would have us believe, but a step forward to implement a plan of mutual cooperation where the people would have total and complete involvement in the administering of justice. In each of the three districts, the people would elect neighborhood councils from the respective areas who would in turn select a police commissioner. Policy rules of conduct, recall, hiring, and all other functions of the police departments would be determined by the people in the com-

For Black people it would mean that the occupying army would have to leave because the people would be chosen from the people in the community. Captain Young has already pointed out that the majority of Berkeley police live outside Berkeley. We would know who best represented our needs.

We would simply replace the real criminals with the people of the community. Who is Wilmont Sweeny and all the other endorsed spokesmen who try to project to the people lies piled on top of more lies? We say he's a tool used by the Berkeley power structure to mislead Black people. We say the petition is desirable because it is a practical solution to Point No. 7 of the Ten Point Platform and Program: We



fy the special value the petition has for the Black community. For too long, our people have been victims of wanton physical aggression on the part of those pigs occupying our community. Those foreign invaders who wear the mask of the people's servants, but who in reality use physical force to intimidate, to bend, to break the spirit of Black people. Decentralization of the pig department would set up the necessary machinery to check the brutal hand of repression by removing this occupying army from our community.

AN OPEN LETTER TO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS- FROM KATARA, N.Y. 21

At noon of October 1, 1970, the men of the Long Island City Jail, Branch Queens, stood up and demanded the animalistic treatment being meted out to them cease, and that they be treated as men by being given treatment afforded to men, according to their human rights as human beings. To punctuate these demands, prisoners of war were made of nine of their former jailers, for the system for which these men work is at a constant state of war with these men by denying them their civil and human rights.

It is to be pointed out that none of these P.O.W.'s were harmed or abused in any way, as they themselves have stated. For acting in this manner of giving humane treatment to P.O.W.'s, these brothers were brutally beaten and victimized by the fascist pigs upon the release of their prisoners. Out of this group of more than 300 men, 39 decided it was better to die fighting than to peacefully submit to these beatings and certain death for some. On October 6, 1970 these 39 brothers, leaving only after being assured of being treated as men, were transferred to another concentration camp and isolated from all other prisoners of war. On Friday. October 29, 1970 pig D.A. Markel. read four indictments on brothers that had been in Branch Queens,

charging them with kidnapping, riot, etc.

If any of you have come to the Panther 21 trial or any of the numerous political trials going on around the country, you know of the blatant fascism that is going down in the courts, which has now been exposed in all its gore in the prison system. We, the inmates. have always known of its existence and now it has been exposed to the public. Racism, exploitation and brutality were and still are a part of the prison system and now the pigs, with the rising level of political awareness among the prison population, are taking their wanton brutality to a higher level.

To combat this situation the bro-

thers are turning to you, the people, and asking for your support in our struggle to gain our human rights. We, the survivors of Branch Queens, come to you, the high school students, because we know of your high level of political awareness, as shown by your actions. The students of today are the leaders of tomorrow; therefore, there are but two ways that you can go; either you will become leaders of the reactionary pig forces of repression or leaders of the people's forces in their just fight for liberation. We must understand that all America is a prison as far as people of color are concerned, the streets of the ghetto are patrolled nightly, the invisible wall that separates the ghetto is nonetheless there, the lock-ins come in the form of loitering charges and spot car checks that tend to keep you in your houses. All the features of the maximum security prison ([ail) are shown in the minimum security one (the streets). WE CAN'T WAIT ANOTHER DAY

In four hundred years of the existence of black people in this country, there has been a constant struggle for survival, From the days of chattel slavery, up to the present day, inadequate food, improper clothing, and unfit housing have plagued the masses of our people.

During the period of chattel one of the tools used in the struggle for freedom was music. During the time of the underground railroad and slave revolts, what is being passed off today as "Negro Spirituals" by bootlicking preachers, were in fact songs of resistance. They were songs and music of the people. "Steal Away to Jesus" wasn't talking about pie in the sky; it was a rallying song for those who were following Nat Turner. When that song was sung in the fields it was sung to let the people know that a meeting was going to take place. "Swing Low Sweet Chariot" was sung only when the underground railroad was coming to get the people off those plantations.

Songs and music were used throughout the chattel slavery period as a means of resistance; their content had meaning to the people because they had created them out of the need to survive. They were in religious code only to fool the slavemaster and the bootlicking

overseers.

After the period of chattel slavery and the jive reconstruction, the long chain of tricks and lies from the power structure and the open hostility of the racist society set the stage for the birth of the Blues. As a result of the South losing the war, the country was transformed into an industrial society. Black people were, of course, left out. The absence of political redress and economic deprivation made black people slaves without chains. Thus from the South the Blues was born. The music of a weary and confused people.

At the turn of the century, before the war, everything was fastly becoming industrialized. With the advent of new electrical devises such as the radio and phonograph, a new industry was born --- therecording industry. Because of the effect of the Blues on the people, it power stucture.

After the "war to end all wars" Black people returned to find that they had been once again used by the government. The new freedom promised was never delivered; and rebellion came. Black people took to the street in just protest to the injustice that was handed out by the racist U.S. Government.

It's significant to note that during the fifties, the Mafia began, with Sammy Davis Jr., their domination of black entertainers and the whole ethnic music field.

With the Civil Rights agitation of the late fifties and early sixties something new was added --- a strong sense of nationalism --which opened a new field. With Curtis Mayfield's "We're a Winner," and James Brown's" Pm Black and I'm Proud," the Mafia and other avaricious record producers had every nigger that they could find to sing some "black" record.

At first the people supported these early efforts as being political. But James Brown and all the others exposed themselves as bootlickers, pimping off the people's just struggle and not really being involved past the point of making money. DELEGATES TO THE R.P.C.C. DENIED PASSAGE ON AIRLINES

The Capitalists of the transportation industry revealed their role, in the fascist and racists U.S. system of government Sunday night, November 29, 1970. At Dulles Airport in Virginia (just outside of Washington D.C.), American Airline Administrators with the support of local and federal pigs. intimidated, harassed, and completely denied 14 delegates of the Revolutionary People's Cconstitutional Convention transportation back to Los Angeles.

Returning from the Revolutionary People's Constitutional Convention, the delegates, inspired by the speech of the Minister of Defense and Supreme Commander of the Black Panther Party, Huey P. Newton, boarded the airport mobile lounge at 5:50 PM. Excited and making plans to accomplish the program set down at the convention, the delegates were immediately met and stunned by the hostility and rudeness of American Airline agents, At 5:52 PM one sister (the 15th member of the original 25 who flew from Los Angeles) was coming toward the lounge. Although the scheduled flight departure was 5:55PM, the racist pig in full knowledge of the fact that another passenger was outside, maliciously closed the door in her face.

Once aboard the plane, the delegates were faced with other overt hostile acts by these employees. Stewardesses became highly emotional and rude, And when one brother calmly asked what was wrong, one stewardess began acting completely hysterical, A few minutes later, the Captain came

back and directing himself to the delegation, asked what was the problem. The other passengers told him that the delegation wasn't causing any type of disturbance and asked why the plane wasn't in the air. Then minutes later (6:05 PM) Captain House announced on the loud speaker that the plane would be departing soon. But at the same time plain clothes pigs began boarding the plane. The pigs stood all around the delegation and then began walking up and down the aisles, taking pictures of the delegates.

After a verbal complaint regarding this activity was made to the stewardess, an American Airline Supervisor appeared. He told the group to get off the airplane, due to an undefined complaint against them made by an unknown person. Rather than create a more serious incident, especially in view of the fact that two members of the delegation were 11-years old, the group left the plane. They were transferred back onto the mobile lounge, moved in the middle of the airfield and held hostages for approximately 10 minutes. The lounge was surrounded by Virginia State troopers and F.B.L. agents.

By 8:30PM all of the 14 people were left stranded. No other American Airline flights were leaving for Los Angeles that night and the other airlines had followed suite by not allowing space; which further provoked the situation. Denied the right to know the complaint before being put off the plane, held hostage aboard the mobile lounge, intimidated and

harassed, the people found that they were victims of another fascist attack.

We must realize that pigs are not the only invaders in uniform who patrol our communities, but they can also be without uniform and working for the schools, stores, airlines, etc. We must expose all the institutions of this fascist establishment, knowing that to change one, the entire existing structure must be transformed into one that will meet the needs and desires of all the people. American Airlines is only part of the same power structure that is keeping our people without food and clothing. When people try to secure even these basic rights by having a constitutional convention, the fascists move on them as usual.

The people that had boarded that plane had come over 3,000 miles to join with other people in adopting a Revolutionary People's Constitution. They had come to Washington to adopt guarantees for our freedom, peace and future security and happiness. And because they came, the temporary authority of the land did everything possible to stop them.

Howard University, the superall-star-negro-college, waited till the day before the convention was scheduled to begin to deny the use of its facility. But the people understood what Comrade Huey P. Newton meant when he said that even a revolutionary convention is only a piece of paper

This communique is being written out of necessity, not desire. Because of the high rise of so-called justifiable deaths of Blacks and other oppressed peoples I find it an urgent thing to disseminate the following compiled methods of Police surprise and night raids, raid tactics inside buildings, raid tactics upon the approach of your homes, etc ...

L. Raid Principles

Whenever possible police raids are executed under conditions and at such times as will be complete surprise to the raided victims, (1) (i.e...raid on Chicago Panthers at 4:00 in the morning, where Fred Hampton and Mark Clark were murdered.) > V. Raid Tactics-approaching buildings or barricades

In speaking on this stage of the actual assault we must understand the vicious nature of an attacking raid band. In recognition of this we should begin to institute safety measures (mesh screens, iron gates, first aid, gas masks, sand- | police will resort to demolitions, bags, alarm systems, tunnels etc.) Basically the following methods are iniated by the raiders:

(!) whenever possible, tear gas and obscuring smoke are used.

(2) fields of fire are set to cover all (known) exits. Machine guns or riot shotguns are concentrated on areas where a break might occur or gunfire is most likely.

(3) tires on cars are shot out or demobilized by means of the motor. (4) police with rifles are usually located farther away in order to maintain a good 'kill position', (5) advancing raiders are usually flanked. Most protective vests and shields will not protect against high-velocity rifle fire. (If you are protecting yourself from behind a car it should be kept in mind that the engine blocks provide the best protection.)

(6) well-trained snipers and observers with telescopic rifles are used with great advantage in a raid. (7) The charge on your home is usually done in a cover-run-coverrun manner. When the raiders are ready to try and break into your home, usually one will run toward the door or desired locaton after

a spray of fire from his cohorts then another run, another spray of fire, etc.

(8) when you are well secured in such a manner where you can only be attacked frontly, a truck or automobile with its rear compartment loaded with bullet resisting material is used. Packet newspapers. magazines, firewood, sandbags, and sacks of coal are used. (For your home also) Then the vehicle is backed up in the area of attack. Bundles of magazines and newspapers tied together compactly, will provide a satisfactory shield against small firearms, twenty pounds of newspaper tied in a bundle (full-sheet size) will stop ordinary handgun and shotgun pellets, but not high-velocity rifle bullets. Magazines being a higher quality paper, can be made into even more effective shields. Scoop shovels, heavy planks, sacks and boxes of dirt or coal, pieces of furniture, doubled up mattresses, etc., can be used. In improvising such shields it is only common sense to consider the armament that will be used against them and circumstances permitting.

(9) in a large attack, especially at night the protective cordon placed around the area usually includes several pursuit cars faced in the direction of the escape (the police will steal trash cans, logs, dog houses, barbedwire and other property from neighboring guards and lawns to seal off the community). (10) when CN tear gas CS or observing smoke are not available, dynamite sticks with short fuses are used as concusion grenades, to be thrown through windows, dropped down chimneys, through skylights,

This is part I of several communiques to come to inform the communities throughout the country of the methods and tactics used by occupying troops. There is not too much doubt in the minds of Black people who the real terrorist are. The need for Black people and all oppressed people to dwell within the confines of their communities and homes without the fear of occupying troops weilding mercinary weapons is a great one. The 2nd amendment to the constitution gives everyone the right to bear arms andestablish a militia. The 6th amendment gives everyone the right to be secure in their persons, houses, papers and effects against unreasonable search seizures. Anyone who violates these rights should be considered part of the problem and dealt with in that

ON FOLSOM PRISON STRIKE


The Folsom Prison Strike, which began November 3, is now over. The strike, a refusal to support the prison system which exploits and oppressed them, lasted 18 days. The 2,300 Folsom prisoners spent those 18 days in constant lock-up, without exercise and surviving on two sandwiches a day, The warden locked up all prisoners in response to the overwhelming support for the black, brown and white prisoners for the strike and the 29 demands of the inmates for human prison conditions. Immediately at the end of the strike, 78 prisoners chosen by prison authorities as "leaders" were thrown into the "hole," many of these were brutally beaten to serve as examples to all the inmates of the "official" reaction to demands for human dignity. What the fascists have revealed is the courageous spirit of the people in America's concentration camps and the undying will of the people to confront oppression.

REPORT ON THE TRIAL OF CHAIRMAN BOBBY SEALE AND

ERICKA HUGGINS



December 7, 1970

Fourth panel now exhausted.

Today 28 candidates were examined and 27 were excused for what are becoming very familiar reasons. Specifically:

-because of prejudice against the Party of defendant

-because of exposure to pretrial publicity

-because of hardship

-because of opposition to the death penalty.

The juror chosen is a 41-year old black woman who works as an Avon representative. She lives in Waterbury andreads the Waterbury American, but says that she does not know much of anything about the case and has no opinion.

A young black woman who had been chosen was excused today. It was decided among the attorneys in the judge's chambers that she

should be excused, and no reason was publicly given.

Two of the most promising white people to take the stand so far appeared today and state's attorney Markel used peremptory chalenges on both of them. The first was a white woman about 35 or so who referred to herslef as a 'poor white." She defined "militant" as "standing up for what you want" and said that, although she did not believe in violence, she did believe in "picketing," in making people know how you feel. At one point she said, "When I came to court the other day, I didn't think of either of the defendants as human beings; they were just disrupting my time. But now I know that they are real, they are people, just like me." Although she said that she had no opinion and that she would consider capital punishment, Markle, predictably, excused her.

The second was a young white woman who said that she has gone to Panther rallies "to hear it from the horse's mouth." She knew about the 10-Point Program, and said that while she agrees with much of the Panther's ideology, she questions their means." She said that she had not formed an opinion, that she 'finds it difficult to believe everything that she reads." She was reluctant to consider the death penalty, but she would, She seemed very alive, and pretty open. When she left, she and Ericka smiled at one another. (Almost without execption, the jurors do not even look at Bobby and Ericka.

Before the proceeding began this morning, Charles Garry made a motion that the charges be dismissed on the grounds of the negative publicity that has been given to the case and to Bobby Seale in the last week. He referred to J.Edgar Hoover's report to the Senate given last week. Garry said "He (Hoover) is going out of his way to further poison and contaminate the atmosphere (around this triai)." Nearly one fifth of Hooover's 27-page report concerned the Panthers and was an elaboration of his calling them "the most dangerous group in America," which he did during the jury selection of Lonnie's trial. It was a very uneventful day, The jurors, save one, were dull. The one exception was a young black woman, the one black on the whole panel. She said that she knew almost nothing about the Party or the case, and even said she could consider capital punishment. Apparently, Markle thought she was hipper than her actual answers indicated, because he excused her immediately. When he did so, Garry rose to enter on record that she was 22 and black and that the defense took exception to the use of peremptory challenges against the one person in fifty who represented the peer group of Ericka and Bobby. Markle, in a vain effort to be amusing, later rose after a juror was dismissed to enter on the record that she was white. However, even his sick sarcasm is not likely to hide from any observer the ridiculous under-representation of non-white people.

December 9, 1970 Fifth Panel Exhausted: Still Only Three Jurors

About 20 people were questioned trial publicity and excused for that mythical "fair and impartial" jury goes on. Nearly all were excused because of prejudice. The defense used three peremptory challenges; bringing their total remaining challenges to 45. The prosecution used one,

bringing theirs down to 49. The inflammatory statement made by J. Edgar Hoover were the grounds again today for a motion by the defense for a dismissal of the charges. This time the motion was prompted by coverage of the report, referred to on Monday of this week, expaned Hoover's earlier statement that the Panthers were "the most violent group in America," It is worth noting, as defense attorney David Rosen did on Monday that it was on the eve of Lonnie's trial that Hoover made his original statement, and it is on the

eve of this one that he chooses to elaborate on the original.

Ericka's lawyer takes exception to excuse young women with children: No new jurors

Saying that it is prejudicial to her client, Attorney Roraback took exception to the statutary exemption granted in this state to young mothers. According to the law, any woman with vey young children can be excused upon request from jury duty. This makes it that much harder for a young defendant to get a jury of her peers. Obviously, the state should accept the responsibility for the care of jurors' children. As with the state's refusal to adequately compensate jurors financially, this neglect drastically restricts the defense in its efforts to obtain a cross section of the community.

Dear Mr. McDougall,

I would like to request action by you on a matter of great concern to me. As your records will show, I was granted permission to visit Mr. Lonnie McLucas on October 1, 1970, when he was an inmate at Somers Correctional Institution. I am enclosing a copy of the original authorization letter. As your records will further show, I did indeed visit Mr. McLucas on at least 4 occasions following October 1st. A BROTHER IS DYING IN OF THE U.S.A. BEC IT'S THE SAME AS THE BLACK COMMUNIT

On Monday, November 31st Graylon Whitehead, bothered by severe headache pains called the University Health Service to make an appointment, He was unable to get one. Tuesday he was able to get an appointment, but was only given darvons and tranquilizers. Wednesday morning the pain had become so intense he woke his room-mate up with shouts and screams. He was rushed to the Health Service at about 5:30 a.m. and the nurse denied him immediate emergency entrance because she said it was not serious enough to disturb the doctor. From 6:00 a.m. until 8:30 a.m. Graylon was denied admittance to the Health Service and denied treatment. As a result from being turned away from the Health Service the brother had to seek refuge in the Kappa House in pain until the Health Service opened at 8:30. Furthermore, the brother didn't get a chance to see a doctor until 11:00 a.m.

Graylon was admitted to the Health Service for observation at II:00, At this time Graylon was still conscious. The doctor then diagnosed his case as just a headache and gave Graylon some darvons and sedatives so he could sleep. The interesting thing about this diagnosis is that the doctors had in their possession Graylon's medical record, consequently, they knew that the brother had been in an auto accident this summer (August) and that he had received head injuries. As a result of these injuries Graylon was unconscious for 2 1/2 hours and was taken to Doctor's Hospital and later to Health Service. The question that comes to my mind is why then wasn't Graylon given this time a head x-ray after being admitted to the Health Service instead of darvons and sedatives? Why did the Health Service personnel tell his fraternity brothers that he was in satisfactory condition and improving when they inquired about the brother? Why was his parents notified for the first time at 3:30 a.m. Thursday morning, 22 hours after Graylon had tried to get emergency treatment, and 4 hours after a nurse at the Health Service had discovered Graylon had stopped breathing and rushed him to Doctor's Hospital? These are very pertinent questions that the people demand to be answered.

On Friday December 4th a group of brothers proceeded to investigate the case and in an interview with Dr. Clarke (attending physician at the Health Service) they discovered that Graylon was admitted to the infirmary around 11:00 Wednesday afternoon, He was checked over and given pain pills and a sedative. Graylon later was described by the doctor as becoming psychotic. This was because Graylon refused to accept the doctor's diagnosis of a simple headache. Graylon knew that it was far more serious than that and demanded that he be given a thorough examination, Because of this reaction on the part of Graylon the doctor interpreted his mental state as being psychotic (insane). In the condition that Graylon was in, administering pain pills and sedatives was one of the most destructive things that could happen. A blood clot pressure was building up on the capitaries bringing blood to his brain, If allowed to continue the blood and the oxygen going to his brain would be cut off and his nervous system would go into shock, affecting and paralyzing the body. And this is exactly what exactly what happened.

On Monday December 7 Graylon has not regained consciousness and there is a 90% chance that he never will. He is confined to an iron lung. At one time the brother stopped breathing and since then there has been no body movement at all.

When Mrs. Whitehead arrived she in-

quired about Graylon's condition and she was told that he had suffered from pressure on his brain. Because of this pressure he had suffered a massive stroke, Furthermore, the doctor (John Powell) told Mrs. Whitehead that her son probably wouldn't live through the night. However, by Friday afternoon Graylon was still holding on, Mrs. Whitehead then asked Dr. Powell if there was any hope that Graylon would recover, the doctor replied without any semblence of professional procedure that, "There's no hope, just isn't any hope, there's nothing more we can do" in spite of this pessimistic attitude on the part of the doctor, Mrs. Whitehead, brothers and sisters still have hope that Graylon will get better.

Perhaps Dr. Powell feels justified in giving up hope on Graylon because he knows how limited Doctor's Hospital is unequipped with professional help. Mrs. Whitehead has inquired about the possibilities of either moving Graylon to one of Chicago's hospitals or importing a brain specialist here to Carbondale. The hospital administration is in favor of the former but hasn't assisted Mrs. Whitehead in getting the necessary technical equipment needed to make such a move. For reasons unknown, the hospital administration is unfavorable to the suggestion to bring a brain specialist here, despite the fact that they admit that they can't do anything else for the brother. We say too much time has been wasted already and that if such a specialist can be found that Doctor's Hospital shouldn't object to letting the specialist use the hospital facilities.

It is true that often jokes are made about how hard it is to get to see a doctor at the health service. A brother is dying because of apathy. It's the same as if you were in South Africa. Only this is apathy Babylon style, but it's the same "White folks

get well, black folks catch hell." Only in this case one of the blacks is on the verge of death. In fact a few weeks ago the hospital evacuated 4 of Carbondale's finest who had been wounded by black guerillas. They were treated in the hospital in St. Louis. Once again a double-standard. And a 20 year old Afro-American is the victim of an institutionalized method of genocide, And we must take the position that we will not allow this to happen again. We will stop this kind of thing. must SEIZE THE TIME expose the contradicitions and create functional machinery that will safeguard this from ever happening again. Demand adequate medical care, free health clinics, and the peoples justice.

"It is necessary for us to make loud noises and to sometimes interrupt the normal courses of action because we are writing history and the acts that we commit and the things that we accomplish will be owed to prosperity and paid to humanity."

GENE ROBERTS- WANTED BY THE PEOPLE FOR CONSPIRACY TO RAILROAD THE NEW YORK PANTHER 21

For more than 18 months, members of the N.Y. Panther 21 have been incarcerated in concentration camps in New York for allegedly conspiring to blow up five mid-town department stores, police precincts and various public places. These brothers and sisters are facing up to 175 years in concentration camps, Gene Roberts, a member of B.O.S.S. (Bureau of Special Services) since April 4, 1964, and a lackey for the pig power structure, infiltrated the Black Panther Party in July 1968, his assignme 1 - to destroy the N.Y. Chapter of the Black Panther Party--by any means necessary. Gene Roberts, as well as Ralph Wyatt, Carl Woods, Raymond Fulton and Lester Eggleson were assigned to infiltrate the New York Chapter of the Black Panther Party, with the sole purpose of fabricating a conspiracy bust of the N.Y. Panther leadership. Gene Roberts is the main wit-

ness for the prosecution, whose construed lies and fabricated incidents and occurrences will be used to railroad 13 members of the New York Chapter of the Black Panther Party. The people will judge Gene Roberts, who we charge with conspiracy to deny the people food, clothing, housing, and the basic needs for survival. We also charge Gene Roberts with conspiring with Nixon, Agnew and Hoover to railroad the New York Panther 21. In order for the people to judge this lackey, it is necessary to give an account of the swines' activity for the past 6 years.

On April 4, 1964, Gene Roberts was sworn in as a special agent for B.O.S.S. The pigs of the power structure had Gene Roberts trained specifically as a special agent. He never went to a police academy and he never walked a bear as the everage member of the gestapo does, Gene Roberts was never put into a position where a gun was needed until April 2, 1969, the day of the N.Y. Panther 21 bust

Gene Roberts played his part of being a "brother" well enough to become Malcolm X's bodyguard, after infiltrating the O.A.A.U. (Organization of Afro-American Unity). At that time J. Edgar Hoover felt the O.A.A.U. to be

a threat to the U.S. security and assigned Gene Roberts to infiltrate with the intent of destroying Malcolm X and the O, A, A, U, Malcolm began to educate the masses more and more to the need for armed struggle and the pigs of the power structure began to intensify their fascist tactics. Talk of revolution had the pigs of the power structure in a very precarious position, thus causing them to feel the need to stop Malcolm and his talk of revolution.

On February 21, 1965, Malcolm was to speak at the Audobon Ballroom. By this time Gene Roberts had shammed his way into the position of being Malcolm's bodyguard. On February 21, 1965, at the Audobon Ballroom in New York, Malcolm was gunned down--assassinated -- while Gene Roberts "supposedly" guarded Malcolm with his life. To continue his facade, Pig Gene Roberts went so far as to give Malcolm mouth to







At Camp LeJeune, North Carolina, on Thursday, November 12th, a military judge ordered that charges against Lance Corporal Barry D. Couter, U.S. Marine Corps, be dropped and his case dismissed. Coulter, from Harlem, New York City was accused of throwing a hand grenade into a Military Police Headquartes in Viet Nam. The incident occurred last April 11th while he was serving his second tour in Viet Nam. He was charged with intent to commit murder and faced a possible 60 years confinement and a dishonorable discharge.

The prosecution attempted to introduce remarks Coulter made to a Marine officer who heldhimself out as a lawyer and promised Coulter that his remarks would be confidential. The officer, Lt. Grayson, was then serving as a Battalion Legal Officer in Viet Nam, though he was not an attorney. In fact Greyson had been assigned to investigate the bombing of the M. P. Head-

Grayson admitted to the court that he had offered legal advise to Coulter, and that he had promised their discussion would be confidential. At a pretrial motion Judge ruled that an attorney-client privilege was established and as such Grayson's testimony was Inadmissible. Also, two other black witnesses, who had ben expected to testify for the prosecution, refused to do so. The government then stated there was insufficient evidence to proceed and the Judge dismissed the case. Coulter is to receive an immediate honorable discharge. of the people. REPORT ON N.Y. 21 TRIAL: PIG GENE ROBERT'S TESTIMONY FULL OF CONTRADICTIONS

The obvious attempt by the court-prosecution team in he N, Y, 21 frame-up to validate their theory of a Panther Bomb Plot andtransform this fascist theory into a factual conviction of the 13 members of the Black Panther Party was given a setback by Defense Attorney Gerald Leftcourt today.

Pig infiltrator Gene Roberts under cross examination was forced to reveal that he did not receive any instruction to bomb anything. Also, Roberts reluctantly admitted that he had conveniently omitted certain key aspects in his testimony before the jury.

Primarily, Roberts had testified under direct examination that defendant Kinshasa (William King) would teach guerilla warfare to that he had emitted the word 'sim- Kinshasa's section. Running dog

ulated." Therefore, what pig lackey Roberts had really been told was: "Kinshasa will start teaching simulated guerilla tactics." Needless to say, the pig media ignored all of this and concentrated on Robert's newspaper account of Malcolm X's murder. Pig Roberts, who was supposedly a bodyguard of the late Malcolm X, attempted to worm his way out of his connection with this assassination and the mass media assisted him whole heartedly. The entire week of testimony by Roberts just served to reinforce the inconsistencies of Robert's testimony. The major contradiction in the N.Y. 21 case is one primarally of the right of those who are oppressed to move in assuring their survival by what ever means necessary, and the pigs alleged and self-imposed right



to label those who move in this manner, as outlaws and criminals, to try these revolutionaries in the courts of the oppressor, where a fair trial is impossible.

LUMUMBA AND KINSHASA OF THE NEW YORK 21 INDICTED FOR NEW YORK PRISON REVOLT

The conditions in which Black people. Puerto Rican people and other oppressed groups of New York City are forced to live in are some of the most wretched conditions that exist on the planet earth, Wall Street, the nerve center of world imperialism, is only a few minutes away from Harlem, El Barrio and Brownsville, yet these communities suffer from more police brutality, dope addiction and inhuman living conditions than just about any community in the world. The same conditions that exist in the medium security prisons (communities) of New York, are also prevalent in the maximum security prisons of New York City. The New York City Prison revolts of October will testify to this fact.

Since the prison revolts which resulted in the take over by prisoners of four of the cities seven jails, more than 30 brothers have been indicted on various charges ranging from conspiracy to kidnap and kidnap, to conspiracy to commit murder. The latest attempt by the Lindsay Administration to place the blame for the inhuman conditions that exist in the city prisons of New York City, has fallen on the heads of William (Kinshasa) King and Lumumba Abdul Shakur of the N.Y. Panther 21. Virtually all of the "leaders" of the prison revolts have been indicted and the conditions inside the maximum security prisons have not changed one iota. If anything, they have grown systematically worse.

tion have been met with tokenism, when they have been met at all.

During the negotiations, when the inmates were still holding the guards as hostages, the brothers were told that no reprisals would be taken against them. But even while the Mayor of New York was lying in the face of the incarcerated leaders of the revolt, sadistic guards were trying to beat the rest of the prisoners to death.

No reprisals was what the inmates were told. Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm swore by the power of her office, Herman Badillo swore by his following in the Puerto Rican community and Minister Louis Faroukquan of the Nation of Islam swore by the will of Allah that no reprisals would be taken against the brothers. Since the time that these empty words were uttered, Comrade Julio Roldan of the Young Lords Party and Comrade Laverne Moore (one of the leaders of the prison revolts) have been murdered by guards in the Tombs, while others have been brutally beaten in the other penal institutions throughout


The official prison reports said that Julio Roldan and Laverne Moore both committed suicide. Julio was supposed to have hung himself with the shoe laces from his shoes. Yet he had on buckled shoes. Laverne (Red) Moore was supposed to have hung himself. An autopsy was performed by the prison doctor at the Tombs and it showed that the brother had a brain concussion. The pigs stated that while they were in the process of cutting him down, he fell and his head hit the concrete floor.

Another autopsy was done by a private physician and it proved occured long before the alleged the Queen's D.A. was unprecedenthanging took place.

The ten members of the N.Y. 21 who are still incarcerated were transferred from the Old Branch Men's House of of Detention to the "Rock." (Rikers Island) All of them are confined in what Lumumba calls "triple isolation" and only see one another or are allowed to leave their cells when they go to court or when they have visitors. The total prison population housed in the Tombs are under twenty-four hour lock-up.

It should be reiterated that the prison revolts emanated (came) from within the general prison population at the Old Branch Queens Men's House of Detention and the Panthers did not come into the picture until they were freed from isolation by their fellow inmates and asked to deal with some type of direction in terms of leadership, Ironically enough, the black prison guard have stated publicly that it was the Panthers who were responsible for saving the hostages lives.

Immediately after the prison revolts, the attorneys for the N.Y. 21 filed a motion in the courts stating that if any of the N.Y. 21 were indicted by a grand jury, they reserved the right to be notified in advance of any such action. The pigs completely ignored this and the attorneys are moving to have the indictment dismissed whenever the pigs decide to have an arraignment.

In the mean time, the people who are imprisoned in the medium security prisons of New York City cannot rely on the empty promises of Pig Lindsay, Shirley Chisholm, Herman Bradillo or Louis Faroukquan. Our brothers and sisters in the maximum security prisons are still being murdered and brutalized and the conditions aren't getting better. Babylon has a prison population of nearly 10 million people; 80% of which are black, brown, red and yellow. Our prison population suffers more than any of the other oppressed communities.

The hour is late and the situation becomes more ghastly by the moment, Just as the liberation of our community is Inter-connected with the liberation of all oppressed communities, the destiny of the prison communities are equally inter-connected with the destiny of oppressed communities around the world.

It is inevitable that another prison revolt of a larger proportion is bound to take place in the city jails of New York. The fascist American imperialists are forcing people in both the maximum and medium prisons to use the only power that they have and that is the power to disrupt

Editor's note: This article was written by Lois Newton, a member of the Black Panther Party who on November 28, 1970 was beaten and arrested by the vicious dog police at N.Y. Port Authority and as a result lost her unborn baby. This is Lois' report on her meeting in jail with sister Angela Davis.

I met Angela Davis on December 1, 1970. She knew me right away and greeted me with a smile. She was very much at ease and did not appear to be worried at all about her case. Angela and I rapped for half an hour about the revolutionary struggle and I left her knowing she was strong, dedicated and unselfish regardless of the publicity and support which she has received.

Since it was my first 'offense'. I requested to be placed on the sixth floor with the other prisoners. At first I was told that only adolescents were placed on the sixth floor. (This is the floor that comrade Angela is presently on) The next morning Imade a request again, and again I was refused. This time I was told that I couldn't be on the same floor with Angela, Again I made the request, more adamantly this time. and within half an hour I was placed on the sixth floor.

Angela and I talked that day and we very seldom mentioned her situation. The welfare of the people and the intensification of the struggle were her major con-

Angela excercises everyday, practices karate stances and because of her high degree of understanding of the people's love and their desire to communicate with her, writes by match light until the late hours of the morning. has gotten several sisters to do exercises along with her, which has been very relaxing. Angela helps sisters to forget their problems for a while. Her presence makes "D" corridor a little less tense. She does not demand special attention or consideration, but all the sisters know how much she

loves them and how she has sacrificed her life for them and many, many more.

Angela is unique in the sense that she has put eyeything she has (wisdom, knowledge, experlence, love), into the struggle; and she has practiced what so many others merely talk about. Her ultimate goal is the liberation of her people and the destruction of the oppressive system. The masses must not forget her, must stand by her, and not allow her to be extradicted. Her life which she has dedicated so unselfishly to the revolutionary struggle will be a grave loss if she is incarcerated. And it will be a reactionary death if she is allowed to die.

The anti-Japanese guerillas armed themselves thoroughly with the firm idea that the thorough accomplishment of the Korean revolution was a way to assist the working classes of other countries and accelerate the world revolution, and were boundlessly true to this cause.

In this connection Comrade Kim II Sung said:

"The anti-Japanese guerillas were members of the one family of Communists from the start. The guerillas held fast to Marx's idea 'Workers of all countries, unite!' and firmly armed themselves with the ideas of proletarian internationalism."

Such were the character and features of the anti-Japanese guerilla army founded by Comrade Kim II Sung.

Under the personal leadership of Comrade Kim II Sung the anti-Japanese guerilla army continued to develop the armed struggle vigorously, surmounting and tiding over all the hardships and difficulties over the historical period of 15 long years from the outset of its founding up until August 1945 when it defeated Japanese imperialism and achieved the restoration of the fatherland.

The anti-Japanese armed struggle was an arduous struggle the like of which is rarely to be found in the history of the world.

Firstly, it was connected with the fact that anti-Japanese guerillas waged an armed struggle against enormous odds - the Japanese imperialists.

From its earliest stage Japanese imperialism had military-feudal features and assumed the most brigandish and predatory nature.

Japanese militarism launched aggressive wars on over ten occasions beginning with the invasion of Taiwan in 1874 to the day of its defeat, and seized wide areas of eleven countries as its colonies or semi-colonies.

In this course, Japanese imperialism became all the more ferocious and brutal burglar and found it unable to live even a single day without exploitation and plunder, aggression and war. The rapacious monopolistic ruling circles of Japan who fattened on the aggression and colonial plunder of other countries, ran wild to expand the armaments, sending bellicose fascist elements from war to war.

In the early 1930's, the Japanese inperialist aggressor army had already grown into a huge army two million strong. The Kanto army troops hurled into the operations against the anti-Japanese guerilla units and mobilized in the preparation for invasion of the Soviet Union from the late 1930's to the early 1940's alone, ran into one million.

ON THE FOUNDING OF THE ANTI-JAPANESE GUERRILLA ARMY AND THE INTENSIFICATION OF THE ARMED STRUGGLE

The Japanese imperialist aggressor army was equipped with up-to-date weapons and combat technical materials which they bragged as "highly efficient", and had modern ground, naval and air forces. The Japanese imperialists who were armed to the teeth had the active support and patronage of the United States, Britain and other imperialist powers in their aggression against other countries and peoples, and had such brigandish allies as fascist Germany and Italy.

Secondly, the arduousness of the anti-Japanese armed struggle was connected with the fact that the anti- Japanese guerillas had to secure all they needed entirely by their own efforts without any fear of the state or aid from outside in the struggle against this formidable Japanese imperialism.

Backdu base newly cstablished and, relying on it, the change-over to a positive offensive against the enemy being effected. And in this period, the Communists, on the basis of the most correct revolutionary line of Comrade Kim II Sung, carried on actively and on a nation-wide scale the anti-Japanese united national front movement and the work of the preparations for founding a Marxist-Leninist Party, along with the anti-Japanese armed struggle.

In this period, the anti-Japanese guerillas more actively carried on small-unit guerilla activities for annihilating the enemy and political activities and waged vigorously on a large scale, among the masses of the people, while exerting efforts on preserving and fostering their own forces and on military training and politico-theoretical study in order to meet the great event of national liberation actively.

> In this period, the Japanese imperialists, confronted with the crisis of ultimate downfall, frantically tried to strangle the armed struggle. But they could never halt the triumphant advance of the anti-Japanese guerillas, nor could they keep their revolutionary influence from being exerted on the entire Korean people.

Together with the news of the strenuous and vigorous struggle of the anti-Japanese guerillas, the fame of Comrade Kim II Sung, the ever-victorious iron-willed genius-commander, spread far and wide to all corners of the country just as in a legend, setting every heart of the Korean people afire with hopes of national regeneration and vigorously inflaming their passion for struggle. The fame of Comrade Kim II Sung, the respected and beloved Leader of the Korean people, spread with such a great attraction even in the horror-inspiring atmosphere of Japanese imperialist colonial rule under which Korea had been turned into a prison covered with networks of army, police. intelligence and speical agents This was illustrated by the following instance:

After Japanese imperialism's defeat in World War II, a certain Kamada, a scholar in the pay of Japanese imperialism, wrote a book, "New Tales of Korea", in which he said as follows in recollection of those days:

"Around 1944, I gave a lecture to the sixth-year and second-year pupils of a primary and a secondary school together in South Korea. Then I asked them, 'Who do you think is the greatest man among the contemporary Japanese (including Koreans)? Express your views honestly by secret ballot. To my surprise, 67 per cent of the bat lots were for Kim II Sung."

Even in the grimmest days of the closing period of Japanese imperialist rule the attempts to form clandestine anti-Japanese organizations and join the anti-Japanese guerilla units of Comrade Kim II Sung in the armed struggle rapidly grew as a general trend among

As the Japanese imperialists admitted, the numerous "cases of attempts to form associations" in which broad sections of youths and students were involved in those days were "designed to achieve their rebellious aims at the first opportunity, and this was based on the blind conclusion that the defeat of Japan in the war was a sealed fact, and in most cases, the concrete method they sought to follow was to establish contacts with Kim II Sung whom they worshipped sincerely or place themselves under his command and carry out an armed uprising..." ("Secret Service External Affairs Monthly No. 46," August 1943, of the Police Bureau of the Japanese Government-General in Korea.)

Let's keep up the great revolutionary upsurge in response to the call of the Party and the Leader!

Under the conditions in which Korea had already been reduced to a complete colony of the Japanese imperialists, our country had no revolutionary political power nor military foundation of the nation itself to render powerful assistance to the anti-Japanese armed struggle.

In the course of the struggle against the formidable enemy, therefore, the Korean Communists had to organize and expand the armed force, secure weapons, ammunition, provisions, clothing and so on by their own efforts and educate the masses of the people toorganize and mobilise them to strug-

In these conditions, the armed struggle could not but assume unheard-of arduousness from the outset.

Thirdly, the arduousness of the anti-Japanese armed struggle was connected also with the fact that the struggle had to be waged over a prolonged period of time.

The anti-Japanese armed struggle extended over 15 long years, from the time when Japanese imperialism was fascistized and its colonialist policy of tyranny reached its height until it was

ruined. Under the leadership of Comrade Kim II Sung, the Korean Communists, foreseeing the arduousness and protractedness of the anti-Japanese armed struggle form its early stage, prepared and organized the armed struggle in such a way as to be able to cope with

In strengthening the political and ideological work among the masses of the people and the anti-Japanese guerillas, the Korean Communists concentrated their efforts on enhancing their ennuty against Japanese imperialism and its stooges and their confidence in the final victory of the revolution and particularly on cultivating in them the indomitable lighting spirit of surmounting all difficulties and trials and the revolutionary spirit of self-reliance.

Under the difficult conditions in which everything was either in short supply or lacking, the anti- Japanese guerillas fought the enemy invariably in the stubborn lighting spirit of "Let us beat the enemy even if we die hundreds of million times."

The anti-Japanese guerillas had to nass the winter in the cold forests around 40 degrees below zero and comtime their struggle sometimes allaying thirst with melted snow and living only on roots of grass. But thanks to the sagactous leadership of Comrade Kim II Sung, the anti-Japanese guerilla army

armed struggle was organized and

This was the period when the revolutionary forces were preserved and fostered and thorough preparations were made for extending the armed struggle to still wider areas and for going over to a positive offensive in the future, while the guerilla bases - liberated areas were set up in the vast regions covering the northern borders of our country and the eastern Manchuria and the armed struggle was developed by rely-

ing on them. The Communists led the people to abolish the old socio-economic relations, establish the people's revolutionary power and enforce various democratic reforms including the land reform in the base areas.

They also formed communist organizations and various forms of mass organizations in the base areas, united the broad revolutionary masses in those organizations and educated them and brought up cadres through practical struggle.

As for the combat actions in this period, the anti-Japanese guerilla units, operating from the base areas, concentrated at first on capturing weapons and carrying on small-scale battles and thus reinforced their armaments and, afterwards, emerged out of the base areas and conducted large-scale offensive battles on the enemy's walled towns. And as the offensives of the enemy were intensified, battles for defending the base areas were also waged on a comparatively large scale.

Drawing on these successes in the struggle, Comrade Kim II Sung merged the guerilla units active in various areas under a unified military commanding system and reorganized them into the People's Revolutionary Army in 1934.

Following the formation of the People's Revolutionary Army, the military activities became more active and assamed larger dimensions.

Around that time, the enemy concentrated his armed forces on punitive operations against the guerilla bases in the hope of wiping them out.

In the teeth of the enemy's general blockade and large-scale punitive offensive, however, the anti-Japanese guerillas and the masses of the people, under the leadership of Comrade Kim Il Sung, fought heroically without the slightest vacillation and with firm confidence in the victory of the revolution, and firmly defended the revolutionary bases as long as four to five

nese guerilla army was formed and the tionary movement centering around the anti-Japanese armed struggle achieved a great upsurge as a whole, despite the unprecedented intensification of the Japanese imperialists' colonial policy of tyranny and the enemy's reactionary offensive.

Under the personal command of Comrade Kim II Sung the anti-Japanese guerillas successively waged battles, big the people. and small, including such offensive operations in the homeland as the Bochonbo battle on June 4, 1937 and the of the Musan area in May 1939. thereby dealing fatal blows at Japanese imperialism from behind which was wildly expanding its war of aggression on the continent and preparing for invasion of the Soviet Union.


The activities of the political organizers dispatched to all parts of the country were intensified in combination with the active waging of the anti-Japanese armed struggle. In face of the enemy's strict surveillance, they skillfully carried on underground political activities and vigorously organized and mobilized broad masses of the people to the anti-Japanese struggle along the bright road indicated by the Ten-point Program of the Association for the Restoration of the Fatherof the Association everywhere.

In this way, even in the grim years when the Japanese imperialists, fascist tyranny reached its height, the Korean people derived strength from Comrade Kim II Sung and, had faith in the ultimate victory in the restoration of the fatherland, looking up, as the great Leader of the Korean revolution and the outstanding Leader of the entire people, to Comrade Kim II Sung, the peerless patriot and ever-victorious iron-willed genius-commander who carried forward the revolutionary struggle unremittingly, bearing the destiny of the fatherland on his shoulders.

Placing all their hope and expectations solely on Comrade Kim Il Sung. they rose as one man in the sacred war for the liberation of the fatherland following the road indicated by him.

The third stage of the development of the anti-Japanese armed struggle covers the period between 1941 and 1945. This way the period when the struggle was waged for the restoration of the latherland, the final victory of the anti-Japanese armed struggle, switching over from the former big-unit guerilla activities to the small-unit ones to cope with the changed international and domestic ofuations caused by the outbreak of

What We Want What We Believe

1. We want freedom. We want power to determine the destiny of our Black Community.

We believe that black people will not be free until we are able to determine our destiny

2. We want full employment for our people.

We believe that the federal government is responsible and obligated to give every man employment or a guaranteed income. We believe that if the white American businessmen will not give full employment, then the means of production should be taken from the businessmen and placed in the community so that the people of the community can organize and employ all of its people and give a high standard of hying.

3. We want an end to the robbery by the CAPITALIST of our Black Community.

We believe that this racist government has robbed us and now we are demanding the overdue debt of forty acres and two mules. Forty acres and two mules was promised 100 years ago as restitution for slave labor and mass murder of black people. We will accept the payment in currency which will be distributed to our many communities. The Germans are now aiding the Jews in Israel for the genocide of the Jewish people. The Germans murdered six million Jews. The American racist has taken part in the slaughter of over fifty million black people; therefore, we feel that this is a modest demand that we make.

4. We want decent housing. fit for shelter of human beings.

We believe that if the white landlords will not give decent housing to our black community, then the housing and the land should be made into cooperatives so that our community, with government aid, can build and make decent housing for its people.

5. We want education for our people that exposes the true nature of this decadent American society. We want education that teaches us our true history and our role in the present-day society.

We believe in an educational system that will give to our people a knowledge of self. If a man does not have knowledge of himself and his position in society and the world, then he has little chance to relate to anything else.

6. We want all black men to be exempt from military service.

We believe that Black people, should not be forced to fight in the military service to defend a racist government that does not protect us. We will not fight and kill other people of color in the world who, like black people, are being victimized by the white racist government of America. We will protect ourselves from the force and violence of the racist police and the racist military, by whatever means necessary.

7. We want an immediate end to POLICE BRUTALITY and MURDER of black people.

We believe we can end police brutality in our black community by organizing black self-defense groups that are dedicated to defending our black community from racist police oppression and brutality. The Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States gives a right to bear arms. We therefore believe that all black people should arm themselves for self-defense.

8. We want freedom for all black men held in federal, state, county and city prisons and jails.

We believe that all, black people should be released from the many jails and prisons because they have not received a fair and impartial trial.

9. We want all black people when brought to trial to be tried in court by a jury of their peer group or people from their black communities, as defined by the Constitution of the United States.


We believe that the courts should follow the United States Constitution so that black people will receive fair trials. The 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution gives a man a right to be tried by his peer group. A peer is a person from a similar economic, social, religious, geographical, environmental, historical and racial background. To do this the court will be forced to select a jury from the black community from which the black defendant came. We have been, and are being tried by all-white juries that have no understanding of the "average reasoning man" of the black community.

10. We want land, bread, housing, education, clothing, justice and peace. And as our major political objective, a United Nations-supervised plebiscite to be held throughout the black colony in which only black colonial subjects will be allowed to participate, for the purpose of determining the will of black people as to their national destiny.

When, in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume, among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. That, to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed; that, whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it, and to institute a new government, laying its foundation on such principles, and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their safety and happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and, accordingly, all experience hath shown, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But, when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same object, evinces a design to reduce them under absolute despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such government, and to provide new guards for their future security.

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RULES OF THE BLACK PANTHER PARTY

NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS 1048 PERALTA STREET OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA

Every member of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY throughout this country of racist America must abide by these rules as functional members of this Party. CENTRAL COMMITTEE members, CENTRAL STAFFS, and LOCAL STAFFS, including all captains subordinate to either national, state, and local leadership of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY will enforce these rules. Length of suspension or other disciplinary action necessary for violation of these rules will depend on national, state or state area, and local committees and staffs where said rule or rules of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY WERE VIOLATED.

Every member of the Party must know these verbatum by heart. And apply them daily. Each member must report any violation of these rules to their leadership or they are counterrevolutionary and are also subjected to suspension by the BLACK PANTHER PARTY.

THE RULES ARE:

- No Party member can have narcotics or weed in his possession while doing Party work.
- Any Party member found shooting narcotics will be expelled from this Party.
- No Party member can be DRUNK while doing daily Party work.
- 4. No Party member will violate rules relating to office work, general meetings of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY, and meetings of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY ANYWHERE.
- 5. No Party member will USE, POINT, or FIRE a wrapon of any kind unnecessarily or accidentally at anyone.
- 6. No Party member can join any other army force other than the BLACK LIBERATION ARMY.
- 7. No Party member can have a weapon in his possession while DRUNK or loaded off narcotics or weed.
- 8. No Party member will commit any crime against other Party members or Black people at all, and cannot steal or take from the people, not even a needle or a piece of thread.

 9. When arrested BLACK PANTHER MEMBERS will give
- only name, address, and will sign nothing. Legal first aid must be understood by all Party members.
- 10. The Ten Point Platform and Program of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY must be known and understood by each Party member.
- 11. Party Communications must be National and Local.
- 12. The 10-10-10-program should be known by all members and also understood by all members.
- 13. All Finance officers will operate under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Finance.
- 14. Each person will submit a report of daily work.
- Each Sub-Section Leader, Section Leader, Lieutenant, and Captain must submit Daily reports of work.
- 16. All Panthers must learn to operate and service weapons correctly.
- 17. All Leadership personnel who expel a member must submit this information to the Editor of the Newspaper, so that it will be published in the paper and will be known by all Chapters and Branches.
- 18. Political Education Classes are mandatory for general membership.
- 19. Only office personnel assigned to respective offices each day should be there. All others are to sell papers and do Political work out in the community, including Captains, Section Leaders, etc.
- COMMUNICATIONS—all Chapters must submit weekly reports in writing to the National Headquarters.
- All Branches must implement First Aid and/or Medical Cadres.
 All Chapters, Branches, and components of the BLACK
- PANTHER PARTY must submit a monthly Financial Report to the Ministry of Finance, and also the Central Committee.

 23. Everyone in a leadership position must read no less than
- 23. Everyone in a leadership position must read no less than two hours per day to keep abreast of the changing political situation.
- 24. No Chapter or Branch shall accept grants, poverty funds, money or any other aid from any government agency without contacting the National Headquarters.
 25. All Chapters must adhere to the policy and the ideology
- laid down by the CENTRAL COMMITTEE of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY.
- 26. All Branches must submit weekly reports in writing to their respective Chapters.
