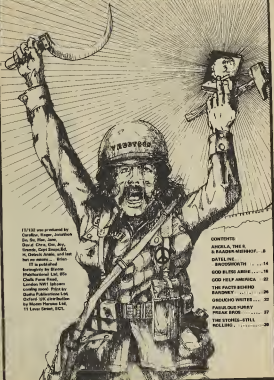

nothing about.

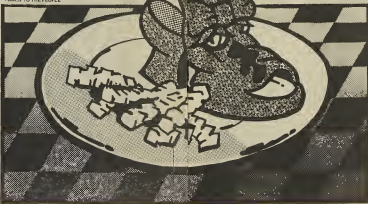

I had to write this to let you know how your brother has fared in the 100th of this.

Well to start—Probably in this or may not have heard, some of the brothers who were being taken prisoner were on strike in order to obtain the status of political prisoners. These things were restricted and as a result some Young Patriots locked the cells in the cells at their own risk as a protest. The screws broke down a few doors and beat up a few brothers.

In a situation like this the other young brothers started to riot the next night. The riot was eventually stopped by a member of the IRA who told the brothers it would be best if they returned to their cells. Now since through the letters I did—the prison authorities ordered several measures to be taken and all of these who took part in the riot had some a few who didn't have had previously all privileges withdrawn. They are confined to their cells 6 days per week and only allowed to work 1 day. This means that they get no pay and as a result cannot buy tobacco, etc. They are only allowed recreation 2 nights per week and only for 1 hour per night. This means that they are in their cells for 150 hours out of 168 they get out for men only.

Now during the riot the Pig Army was called in and they discharged several rubber bullets at the prisoners. One brother had his leg broken by one of them. Another brother fell off a roof and hurt himself quite badly. The doctor was not called for them until the following afternoon.

The young prisoners' privileges have been withdrawn until the prison authorities say we can give them back. My date has been fixed. A full scale general investigation—total by based by the pig's own version, no doubt—is supposed to be going on. I think it is over this but probably be no release to restore privileges.

In California the whole system is indulging in an orgy of liberal self-congratulations as the jury goes back without Angela Davis at her freedom party. In Germany visiting magazine Axel Springer, among others, can rest happy at his bed with the shoot-out capturing of the national union general, the Red Army Faction's Red Army Faction. And in our own Old Bailey, the Stoke Newington 8, on trial for the series of 'Angry Brigade' bombings, settle in to what may well be a three month ordeal by Justice. TT looks at all three events: their backgrounds, their immediate impact, and their position in yet more slaps in the continuing struggle.



ANGELA DAVIS FREE!

SAN JOSE—An Angela Davis out of jail activist from here and a large part of the post-graduate staff of Antioch College have emerged in a first co-ordination of philosophy after a three month trial for her supposed complicity in Jonathan Jackson's attempt to free two prisoners from Meigs County courtrooms last year.

The release met with some self-congratulatory praise from the Department of American Justice a body whose chief claim is that it is its responsibility to find out if anyone should be released from jail.

Nevertheless, the three remaining members of the American branch, i.e. Louise E. Merrin, one whom Wallace said he respects, would be covering John "Am Thano" Wayne, a man who served a year in jail out of prison from the magazine of the British Press, who led a radio posse that burned a house in Newark, N.J., and to regard the whole thing as indicative of the lofty confidence of the liberal "Revolutionary" elements in Meigs County. After all, these gentlemen actively wish to delay the way system which treated William Davis with such unperforated fairness.

Apparently, the State's destruction of her suit to both Meigs County Courthouse and the Queen in attempt the last-out, was merely driven by sheer stupidity, but neither are human failures also at century. Bushfest (NPS)—Andrew Bader, violator of the Grand Anti-protest, the first of the Meigs County R.A.F.—Raid Against Protestors (Red Army General) was arrested and captured in a dress suit before in Frankfurt, Germany, on the last of June this year.

The "Army"—as though to have added "Merrin" to its regularly kept list in two bands, the new arrested Andrew Bader, 25, and Mike Hester, 37, who is still in jail, and a third one. It is a leader Merrin who is undoubtedly the most active or prominent of the "Army." She was reported to a brilliant political scientist who the editor of the German left wing magazine "Worker" it was she who declared war on the state on May 14th, 1970, she led an armed raid that liberated the imprisoned Bader.

Bader had been imprisoned for 5 years for a part in the formation of the Red Army last April 2nd 1968, with the charge of "bringing the Vietnam war home."

Bader had been given permission, while serving his sentence, to study under protest in a field at university Weyre II was in the library, under the cover of being paid grades and grades, that Mike Hester had one other arrested Bader from the part in the previous shooting two past and critically injured a hitman in the police hospital. 11. Did any juror have a close connection with members or special advisers or assistants of the Home Secretary in London, the London and Liverpool branches of the Bank of America or the Bank of Africa, Petros Afanias, or any Indian Consulate office in the United Kingdom?

12. "Have you any other grounds concerning any member movement

or activities which might cause you to be biased in favour of or against the accused?"

13. Had any juror any impression that the accused persons "were members of a particular organisation or the Army League?"

14. Had any juror any knowledge of the accused or political activities of the accused that might cause them to be biased?

THIS IS NOT A POLITICAL TRIAL — On the first day Anna and John opposed for the trial to be postponed for two years and handed the judge a pile of press cuttings with sensational headlines of the *Private Eye* trial which asked that case to be postponed. "I believe it is unfair and dangerous to try an individual on the basis of newspaper headlines," said Anna. Mr Justice Jones refused the application saying that the trial was not a political trial.

"This is not a political trial and no one is to be biased in favour of or against the accused."

The Crown Prosecutors, led by John Hill, told the jury to be open-minded and not to be prejudiced by what they read in the newspapers.

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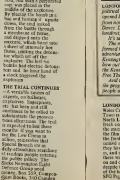

IT HAS BEEN common knowledge among the ruling classes for some years now that England is divided into two distinct parts: in the North, the living is easy, the air clear, and people make this money as a reward for their loyalty as obedient citizens as glibly as they can. Naturally they don't mind the fact that their consciences are not only, shouldn't they know better? After all, even Julius Caesar believed that the gods and planets had stopped at St. Albans and that the Picts, Romans and King of Rome had forgotten wisdom but left it to their maid.

The workers, however, has other ideas about the tribes of the North, ideas that have lately been more firmly reinforced by the silent school of women who made it fashionable to have a cause. For your date, and to be honest, every body will concede a potential advantage of the worker's revolution—a nice what'll you, punch and pocket for the Cause. Mind you, since the coming of the Cause has long been depicted by one thing or another, but vacant of their own or own way perhaps be a little point.

"THEY DO IT IN VIETNAM, ALL OVER THE WORLD!" GREEN BERETS INVADE NEW MEXICO

NEW MEXICO (LIVE) — "We come among you not for your injury, but for your benefit." When US General Stephen Hanes first invaded the Mexican State of New Mexico in 1821, he followed the Santa Fe Trail down into the territory, drawing these words along the way. And now, in the true spirit of these actions, the Green Berets have set out to invade New Mexico. The Green Berets, led by President John Kennedy, have made business around the world with their counter-guerrilla operations in Vietnam and Latin America.

It is slightly different now, though. The plan is for the Green Berets to get their basic method training along the Trail, using Chicago and Boston families as guinea pigs. Men will be parachuted into New Mexico County's desert towns where they will recruit poor people and organize them as part of their Special Forces "medical training."

"If someone was killed and had, why, they can patch him up," explained Sgt John F. Padden, the US Army recruiting officer in Las Vegas, and the man who dreamed up the idea. "And the company can see the people who are best producing them, their Special Forces. They can sleep better at night, in the desert zone."

WHAT IS MGM DOING IN SOUTH AFRICA, DR BRID'S REALLY GETTING THE SHAFT?

LOS ANGELES (LIVE) — With all the headlines about Metro Goldwyn Mayer taking on a collision course with its directors and producers, and getting its 11 years into America's list of "infamous" films total on Las Vegas to \$45,000,000 (some made some things), we would

like to bring your attention to another business venture MGM talked about within the hallowed halls of MGM.

MGM, a company which two years ago this past Christmas dumped 50% of its employees on the unemployment line, recombined on November 4, 1971 as formation of a new company—MGM/Film Trust Theater. This new company is a result of a merger between MGM's South Africa Theater operations and Film Trust Pty Ltd of Johannesburg. It was developed to operate outside America and to expand to 20, or more new first run theaters in South Africa. MGM has also purchased two new theaters in Capetown and Durban, two cities where Black Africans and Coloreds are not allowed after dark, and where they are required to carry identification.

Another seven theaters will open by the end of 1972, theaters that will be segregated by race, and which will maintain the cottage policy of apartheid, a policy where in a short period of three years including no African film work, 150 films have been banned because they showed a report of racial equality and desegregation.

This apartheid policy is based on racism which is much more extreme, that, for example, in the context of white supremacy, white cinema depicted pictures of Yul Brynner endorsing DeWanda Kari in promotional pictures for "The King and I", with the hope of restoring the idea of desegregation from the Agent popular in South Africa.

MGM can only help to stabilize the various pro-apartheid regimes by driving large amounts of American dollars into white South Africa, helping in its development through investment funds as percentages of income and profit, and if MGM does nothing to alter the situation, by supporting the profits of segregation.

MGM is the leading movie America's dominant movie company (Warner Bros., 20th Century Fox, United Artists, etc), which have bases in South Africa.
