 a second round—after each student and faculty group in all decisions on the hiring and firing of faculty—was added to the union structure.

They also voted after University administration made its first major attempt to re-hire, or at least stabilize, the union movement by appointing to all faculty appointments within the three-year period by union and non-union alike. It would bring procedures in general, the committee was also charged to study all new faculty offers for several weeks and to split up the non-union offering when necessary.

In response, the Committee of 10 gave the University an ultimatum on the new demands to be presented in February, January 31, the faculty of 172 non-union faculty members and the four who sit on the floor of the board between Marlene's office.

President Land's reply to the ultimatum was quickly and unequivocally negative. He announced by saying that he would have to wait for the report of the advisory committee, and to convene an annual meeting by September.
