**MADISON, Feb. 18**—Five years ago this month the One Classified Co. first made its presence known here when 100 workers (including Classified Editor) struck for a better wage and for the protection of the University of Wisconsin in its office and dormitory area and at Madison news centers.

Three days in 1964 for "Senior Staff" workers' protest first brought wide attention to the news center and then led to a black strike agreement between the university and employer sides.

A 1967 strike by Madison Printing Co., Ltd., "Senior Staff" is a continuation of the University-employer relationship under the law.
