Berkeley strikers battle police

BERKELEY, Calif.—The University of California campus here became a battlefield Thursday, Feb. 19, as students fought back against riotous police action taken by 400 anti-riot police officers in Berkeley, Calif. The students, who were protesting the Vietnam war, fought back against the police in Berkeley and other California cities. They used a variety of tactics, including tear gas, smoke bombs, and other weapons.
