 The state legislature has taken several actions which affect the lives of students. The most significant of these is the proposal by the House Education Committee to add a state law which would make it illegal for public school students to use "hard" drugs, such as cocaine, hashish, LSD, etc., in addition to the illegal substances currently outlawed. The proposal has received favorable reaction from the education committee and seems to have enough support to become law.

SENATE BILL 1991 (continued)

After receiving feedback from various interest groups, the Senate Education Committee has decided to add a provision to the bill which would require that all students in grades K-12 receive drug abuse education. The provision, if adopted, would be mandatory and would be implemented by the end of the year.

SB 1263 (continued)

A new section was then added to the bill by the HB 2443 committee, dealing with the federal Title IX of the Education Act. Basis of white supremacy

The expansive nature of the U.S. and colonial British Empire ("imperial power") involved the incorporation of its subjects and the subordination of others. In those same states, however, the slaves were necessary to supply their labor force, which gave them a double character. It was this contradiction which gave rise to the concept of "imperial power" as a political entity.

Oakland 7 acquitted!

OAKLAND Seven Black Panthers, accused of a series of mail bombs in the weeks of their arrest, were yesterday found not guilty.

Defendant's defense attorneys maintained their position after trial.

After the six hours, all the Black Panthers are free again. The 21st Court in the Hall of Justice, 20th Street and Broadway, Brooklyn, N.Y., passed 8:30 p.m. when the verdict was reached.

In court, the six agreed they were guilty of bombing in plot when the Black Panther Party was born in their home state. But they said that they were charged with "revolutionary" acts. The Black Panthers in the courtroom, as most men do in the world, paid little heed.

The judgment here — from Associate Justice Louis J. Newell, 40, was:

"Black Panthers, John Jackson, Bill Seal, and others, defendants, are guilty of the mailing of incendiary devices by mail, conspiracy to commit such acts, and mail fraud. The trial came down hard this week on the Black Panther Party around the country.

In New York City, 21 Panthers were indicted and charged with conspiracy to bomb downtown department stores during the Easter rush. They were held on \$300,000 bail each. One of those arrested was Bob Collier, who was arrested several years ago for the alleged plot to blow up the Statue of Liberty. Collier quit the Panthers several months ago to work for CBS. New York City held a demonstration with 400 people Thursday, another to protest later this week.

In Chicago, 10 Panthers have been arrested in the past 10 days, on charges from mail bombings on up. The arrests came in the wake of an ambush on the Panthers by unknown persons, identified by the media as members of the Blackstone Rangers, a southern Chicago gang. Bobby Blue, the deputy defense minister for Illinois, has been charged with illegal use of a weapon, and released on \$15,000 bail. Fred Hampton, chairman of the BPP in Illinois, currently has 10 charges against him.

Else in Chicago, the pigs killed several members

of the Young Lords, a Puerto Rican youth organization. National Guards and riot-equipped pigs patrolled the west-side ghettos following disturbances Thursday afternoon, as high school students walked out of schools after services commemorating Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. Several hundred people had been arrested when P.D.'s came to protest early Friday morning.

Bobby Blue, chairman of the Black Panther Party, is one of eight persons charged with conspiracy and mail bombing related to mailing a bomb, in connection with the disruption of the Democratic National Convention in August.
