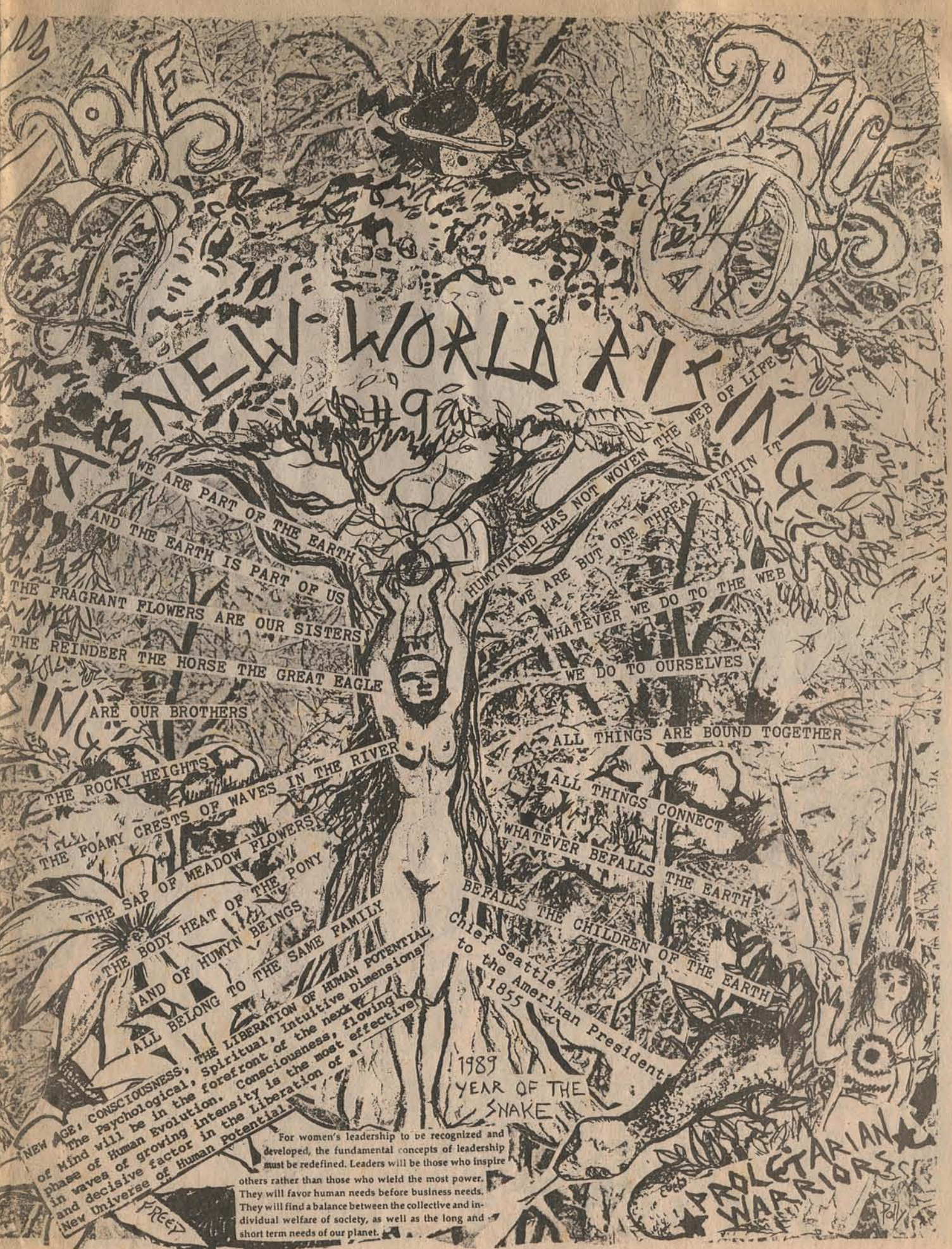

## Planet of the Year

Earth's beating earns it a place on Time's cover

NEW YORK — Time magazine has named the "endangered Earth" its Planet of the Year, departing from its annual Man of the Year tradition to call for "a universal crusade to save the planet."

Since 1927, Time annually has selected the person, group or object that in its editors' views most significantly influenced world events that year. It selected an inanimate object before — the computer, in 1982.

In the cover article of its Jan. 2 issue, released yesterday, Time warned of a series of impending environmental catastrophes: "greenhouse warming of the atmosphere, known as the 'greenhouse effect,' threatening the planet's climate and could flood coastal and inland areas of the world with water."

Other threats include: "Toxic and radioactive wastes dumped in the oceans, polluting the atmosphere and depleting the ozone layer."

That doesn't include another huge, unavoidable expenditure: cleaning up nuclear and toxic waste sites at a combined bill of \$450 billion.

Now, the sea has taken revenge. First, a huge blanket of yellow-green, gelatinous algae slime spread along the Scandinavian and north German coasts, depleting the sea's oxygen supply and extinguishing marine life for miles around. Then the North Sea's 35,000 seals, their immune systems apparently weakened by toxins, fell prey to a marauding virus that previously afflicted dogs. Almost a third are already dead — and scientists say they are powerless to prevent most of the rest from dying.

Now eels and the sea birds that feed on them are starting to disappear off Scotland and Denmark. Harbor porpoises and bottle-nose dolphins are dying, too. And fishermen are throwing away up to a third of their flounder and cod catches because the fish have been disfigured by tumors or are otherwise diseased.

"The catastrophe is here — it's already five minutes past midnight," said a bleak Volker Hoppe, the

## Rising rate of melanoma in young tied to ozone loss

WASHINGTON (AP) — Melanoma, a sometimes-fatal skin cancer, is striking more people at a younger age than ever before, and an expert said the trend could get worse as a result of a thinning of atmospheric ozone.

Ozone depletion by chlorofluorocarbon compounds could be even worse than previously thought, the Environmental Protection Agency said yesterday in urging a stepped up attack on CFC use worldwide.

## DEATH IN THE NORTH SEA

LACTON-ON-SEA, England — No one sunbathed on the broad sand beach, for it was thickly littered with milk cartons, plastic strips and dead birds. No swimmers ventured into the sea, a foaming, filthy brown.

"They say it's safe to swim, but I wouldn't, who would?" said Peter Martin, a laid-off auto worker, walking his spaniel, Beau, along the deserted beach recently. "The sludge barges from London do their dumping off shore, and this rubbish washes back. The North Sea has become Europe's sewer."

First, a huge blanket of yellow-green, gelatinous algae slime spread along the Scandinavian and north German coasts, depleting the sea's oxygen supply and extinguishing marine life for miles around. Then the North Sea's 35,000 seals, their immune systems apparently weakened by toxins, fell prey to a marauding virus that previously afflicted dogs. Almost a third are already dead — and scientists say they are powerless to prevent most of the rest from dying.

Now eels and the sea birds that feed on them are starting to disappear off Scotland and Denmark. Harbor porpoises and bottle-nose dolphins are dying, too. And fishermen are throwing away up to a third of their flounder and cod catches because the fish have been disfigured by tumors or are otherwise diseased.

Although the games can be played by anyone, they seem to appeal most to boys from the pre-teen years through young adulthood.
