In the spring of 1998, Spirit Union Revival returns to the West Coast on the Caravan Tour. The tour starts in Prescott, AZ, and includes dates at kind venues all over California, Oregon, and Washington. (A list of tour events is included on the back page of this review.)

Last summer the caravan rolled through the National Rainbow Gathering, the Country Fair, Evergreen College's Super Saturday, and the World Hemp Expo. The journey included a circadelic evening at Out of the Fog in Eugene, when the streets were filled with hundreds of dancing folk celebrating an evening with Arizona's Spirit Union Revival.

While on tour, S.U.R. released the C.D. they recorded last spring in Tucson. For the past few years, S.U.R. has been building roots in Arizona, where they and the Living Folklore Medicine Show performed along with many others as the Mother Earth's Healing Circus.

The Circus was a dream that many shared, but due to an overabundance of talented performers, show time constraints, and the economics of sustaining such a large group, the circus was laid to rest in a ceremony in Prescott's Town Square. This was just days before S.U.R. performed at the

nationally publicized "Resurrection of the Hippie," concert, which marked one full Saturn return since the Digger's "Death of the Hippie" in 1967.

Although the Circus was short lived, it gave Spirit Union the opportunity to perform alongside such acts as Clan Dyken, Joules, Peg Millet, The Rainbow Gypsies, and many more. Members of S.U.R. also had the chance to perform in an outdoor collaborative jam with Merry Pranksters Ken Kesey and Ken Babbs. The jam was just days after Jerry Garcia passed on, and Kesey said, "So maybe this is why Jerry had to go, it's time for the next generation to carry the flame."

After the Death of the Circus, S.U.R. left Prescott to open on a series of shows for Merl Saunders and the Rainforest Band. On the final night in Flagstaff, members of the Rainforest Band joined S.U.R. on stage for a finale performance of "The Poor 'ol Beggars Tale," a circus anthem that left the audience singing:

"Give it all away,
and it just keeps coming
back..."

Most of the music is original, although S.U.R. is also known for pulling out a choice cover or traditional tune at the right moment. Songwriters Mel Lopez, Kim Smith, and Ben Jordan weave tender harmonies to share a world of fable and legend with the audience. Violinist Kim Smith blends celtic, middle eastern, and bluegrass influences in with her own original sound to bring a creative warmth and sensitivity to the music. Drummer Buzz Duchring has found his niche in the group, gliding in and out of jams with diverse rhythms. Tim Kleiman, the six-string bassist out of Seattle, gives S.U.R. a powerful rhythmic foundation, while finding space to add in riffs of melody that create his own unique and beautiful sound. Jordan's lead guitar playing, and his interaction with bassist Kleiman, has established S.U.R. as one of the Southwest's definitive jam bands.

Since Spirit Union Revival returned to Arizona in late summer, they have performed at numerous festivals and self-produced concerts. S.U.R. has also been working on new material inspired during and after their Northwest Summer Tour.

On September 12th, S.U.R. performed at the Tucson Convention Center at the Natural Choices Expo. They were featured at the Expo because of the ecologically-conscious messages within their music, literature, and products. Since the Expo, S.U.R. has put out its own T-shirts. The shirts are 100% organic cotton, with a hemp based vegetable ink screen print. The shirts feature the master artwork of R, famed artist of the Mother Earth's Healing Circus.

Spirit Union was also featured in the main ballroom at the Prophets Conference in Phoenix this October. The event featured a wide array of speakers and artists involved in the realm of prophecy. Included in the weekend were appearances by Robert Anton Wilson, Jose Arguelles, Robert Morning Sky, and many others.

Soon after the Prophets, S.U.R. headlined the Harvest Moon Hemp Fair in Tucson, AZ. The day featured speakers, theatre and live music, as well as a wide array of hemp booths.

One week later, Spirit Union Revival hosted the annual Circus Halloween Ball. This was a three-day campover event in the mountains north of Tucson. The weekend featured performances by Spirit Union Revival and the Living Folklore Medicine Show, along with the hilarious trial of Schwagg Man. Included was an afternoon of workshops, featuring a wide variety of subjects from improvisational dance to organic permaculture.

Since their return from the northwest last summer, S.U.R. has been working with the 5th World Network. This is a non-profit organization dedicated to assisting sustainability projects through networking. S.U.R. has helped in facilitating the creation of a new branch of the network called 5th World Productions. This is an event based production company with the goal of creating environmental and peace festivals, educational fairs, healing gatherings, and benefit concerts for various social causes.

On July 11th, 1998, 5th World Productions will be hosting the Arizona Earth Fair in Flagstaff. Included in this event will be speakers, workshops, live music and theatre, informational and vending booths, and much more. Directions To The 1998 National Rainbow Gathering in AZ - (June 28 - July 10)

Rap 151

The temperature at this years gathering will get to around 30 degrees at night, so bring some warm clothes!!!
The elevation is about 9,000 feet for this years gathering, so expect the air to be a bit thinner than you are used to if you live in lower elevations.

Spring Council has consented to a site! Here's the directions.

From the North: From Show Low or Springerville, take Rt. 60 to FS Rd. 117 (near mile marker 372, but it's also labeled as Greens Peak Rd, (CR 3123)) south 5 1/2 miles to FS Rd. 118. Turn left at FS Rd. 118. After 3 1/2 miles on 118, there is a right turn on to 117A. Turn right and stay to your left up the hill, for about 3 more miles.

WELCOME HOME! ♥ ♥ ♥

From the South: From McNary or Springerville, take 260 to FS Rd. 118 to FS Rd. 117a left at Carnero Lake...left at the gravel pit...WELCOME HOME!!

Here's a few routes I scouted out on the map. I've never been on most of these roads, so I have no idea as to road condition. The main thing I've heard so far is "don't take hwy 191. It's windy and slow. I've also been told that hwy is a tough, two lane road for Buses and RV's to navigate. And 260 is a good road, and no trouble at all.

From Flagstaff: Take I-40 east to Holbrook. Go south on hwy 77 to Show Low.

From Phoenix: Take I-17 north to Flagstaff, or the back way is to take hwy 87 east to hwy 260. Follow hwy 260 east to hwy 61. Go NE on hwy 61 to Show Low.

From Tucson: Take I-10 to Phoenix. Or, take hwy 77 N to hwy 60. Follow hwy 60 to Show Low.

From Las Vegas, NV: Take hwy 93 SE to Kingman, AZ. Then go E on I-40 to Holbrook. Go south on hwy 77 to Show Low.

From Albuquerque, NM: Go W on I-40 to Holbrook. Go south on hwy 77 to Show Low. I hear this could be a tough road to navigate in a Bus or RV.

RAP 701

In preparation for leaving... Pack up all your trash and bring to the appropriate recycling areas. Dismantle and disappear your camp. encampment. Vanish ALL traces. Firecocks scattered, ashes cold out and buried, pits filled in. Latrines and compost holes covered over. String and twine get removed from tree limbs. Hardened ground gets aerated with tools for future root growth and moisture catch. All litter is picked up. Help with recycling. Where everyone helps, the effort is easy. When an area is clear and clean, then NATURALIZE! Scatter logs, branches, leaves, duff to disappear trails and camps and renew forest habitat. H2O systems and latrine tops are removed and cleaned for the next time. In parking areas help disabled vehicles and fully dismantle ramps and bridges. Steep places are water-barred to prevent erosion. The final crew reseeds appropriate seed to renew vegetation and a complete process. Transport as many riders as possible to aid our travels. Treat local folks with great kindness. They have been kind to us. Drive safely and share this love wherever you go.

What is the Rainbow Family of living light?

First of all, be prepared for a different answer from each person who responds. Rainbow is different things to different people. Most of us, though not all, who consider ourselves part of the Rainbow Family, have attended the Rainbow Gathering of the Tribes, which takes place from July 1 - 7 every year. The first gathering was in 1972

For many years, there was only the one gathering, and the spiritual focus was foremost in the minds of everyone who attended. Most folks were identified with the "hippie" movement of the times, engaged in establishing alternative social, economic, spiritual, political, and/or environmental consciousness. Many were involved either in the Peace movement in the cities or the communal, back-to-the-land movement in the country. In either case, exploration of alternative spiritual systems and states of consciousness was often a common theme. Sometime around the mid-1980s, folks who felt it was too far or too long to the annual gathering started coming together for smaller, regional gatherings. People all over the country developed local and regional bonds. In the past few years, the spiritual focus has been less obvious, due to the huge influx of people who may not realize the central purpose of the gatherings. These folks may come to party, to hang out, to find like-minded people, to gain support for their political causes, or whatever. Who knows? (I sure don't, since I haven't spoken with all of them.) The interesting thing is that we all consider ourselves to be part of a huge, extended family, no matter what our reason for gathering, no matter what our spiritual or religious or political or economic or social views may be. And many people who have not yet had an opportunity to attend a gathering also feel they are part of this family.

Another interesting thing is that there is no formal organizational structure. There are no membership qualifications, no fees or dues, no leaders, and virtually no rules other than the one of "peaceful respect." Each year, individuals take personal responsibility and work together with others on whatever they are inspired to do, from office work, to scouting, to building the kitchens at the gatherings, to hauling in food and first-aid supplies, to peacekeeping, etc. Every project undertaken operates essentially on a consensus basis. Participation, communication, and cooperation are how things get done. It is nothing short of miraculous.

The gatherings are free and non-commercial, and everyone is welcome. Each person is asked to bring their own camping equipment (this all takes place in remote areas of the National Forest), their own cup, bowl, and spoon, and whatever they might want to share to help the gathering happen (tents, shovels, musical instruments, bulk food, etc.). No one will be turned away because of lack of these things, however. The Magic Hat is passed at mealtimes and around camp. Donations are used to buy food in bulk for the kitchens and whatever else may be necessary for the communal well-being (plywood covers and lime for the latrines, first aid supplies, etc.).

Besides the work that goes on to help the gathering happen, there's also lots of acoustical music, drumming, dancing, workshops, herb-walks, council circles, sister circles, brother circles, brother-sister circles, people hanging out, people bartering, people enjoying nature, people meditating, chanting, and praying, people talking politics, people talking spiritual and personal growth, people visioning the future, people doing bodywork and other healing work... The list could go on forever.

For me personally, the Rainbow Family is where I have found my greatest opportunities to learn, to grow, to celebrate, to be one with my fellow beings and my mother Earth, to serve, to pray, to play. The gatherings for me are living theater, evolution in process, creativity manifest. I am passionately in love.

Picture twenty thousand people in a sunlit meadow, standing silent in prayer, holding hands in one huge, unbroken circle. Picture a parade of children approaching, singing songs, their countenances bright with enthusiasm and face paint, balloons and banners waving in the breeze. Picture the breaking of the silence with a cheer from the circle, then the silence returning once again, to grow slowly into a thrum of voices united in a single OM reverberating through the valley and on to the hills beyond. Hold the OM in your mind. Let it spread through and around and in you. Feel it pass from hand to hand and heart to heart.

The magic, the connection you feel is the essence of the Rainbow Family of Living Light.

Peace, love, and light.
Hey now! I want to thank all of the kind brothers and sisters in the rainbow that made this page, this paper, and the cover of NWR #30 a reality. Fred, Easley, Peace Weaver, Rob, Carla, and all of the kind artists, writers, webkeepers and visionaries who spent hours with a pen, on the web, in my home and on this planet... creating what has become this space... WELCOME HOME

Steep places are shored up to prevent erosion.
Transport as many riders as you can.
Treat local folks with kindness.
The final crew reseeds with natural vegetation.

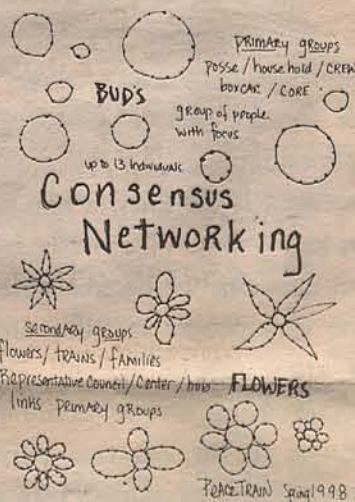

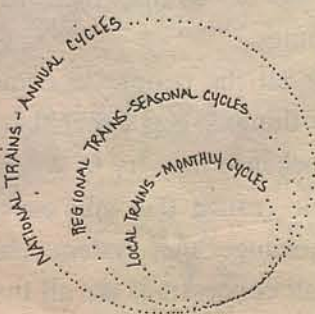

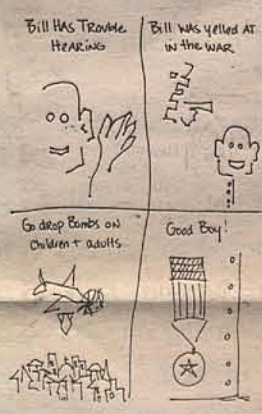

It seems that for the majority of the population of our nation the main source of information and entertainment is the media (radio, television, magazines, etc.) and unfortunately the mainstream media does not provide us with a lot of the most important information that we need to just survive on planet Earth, and beyond survival to evolve as a society to a harmonic balance with ourselves and the Earth. This is not a far out "hippy" idea. This is real and necessary. Think about it. Humans are a part of the biological process of life. Therefore we cannot separate ourselves from our life support system which provides us with food, water and oxygen. Pranayama & Mantra Yoga

Pranayama is the Yogic practice of controlling the rhythm of the breath. The best way to time the breathing is by the use of a mantra. This is the proper way to practice a mantra. Utter it as loudly and slowly as possible ten times, then not quite so loudly and a very little faster ten more times. Continue this process until there is nothing but a rapid movement of the lips; this movement should be continued with increased velocity and diminishing intensity until the mental murmuring completely absorbs the physical. The student is by this time absolutely still, with the mantra racing in his brain; he should, however, continue to speed it up until he reaches his limit, at which he should continue for as long as possible, and then cease the practice by reversing the process above described. Any sentence may be used as a mantra, and possible the Hindu are correct in thinking that there is a particular sentence best suited to any particular man. Some men might find the liquid mantras of the Quran slide too easily, so that it would be possible to continue another train of thought without disturbing the mantra; one is supposed while saying the mantra to meditate upon its meaning. The ideal mantra should be rhythmic, one might even say musical; but there should be sufficient emphasis on some syllable to assist the faculty of attention. The best mantras are of medium length, so far as the beginner is concerned. If the mantra is too long, one is apt to forget it, unless one practices very hard for a great length of time. On the other hand, mantras of a single syllable, such as Aum, are rather jolly; the rhythmic idea is lost. Here are a few useful mantras:

1. Aum.
2. Aum Tat Sat Aum. (This mantra is purely spontaneous.)
3. Aum namo bhagavate namo. (Two trochees between two caesuras.)
4. Aum shivaya namo. (Three trochees.)
5. Aum.
6. Huz alidhu alidhi lalidhi lili Huz.

There are many other mantras. Sri Sahasrati Swami gives a particular one for each of the Cakras. But let the student select one mantra and master it thoroughly.

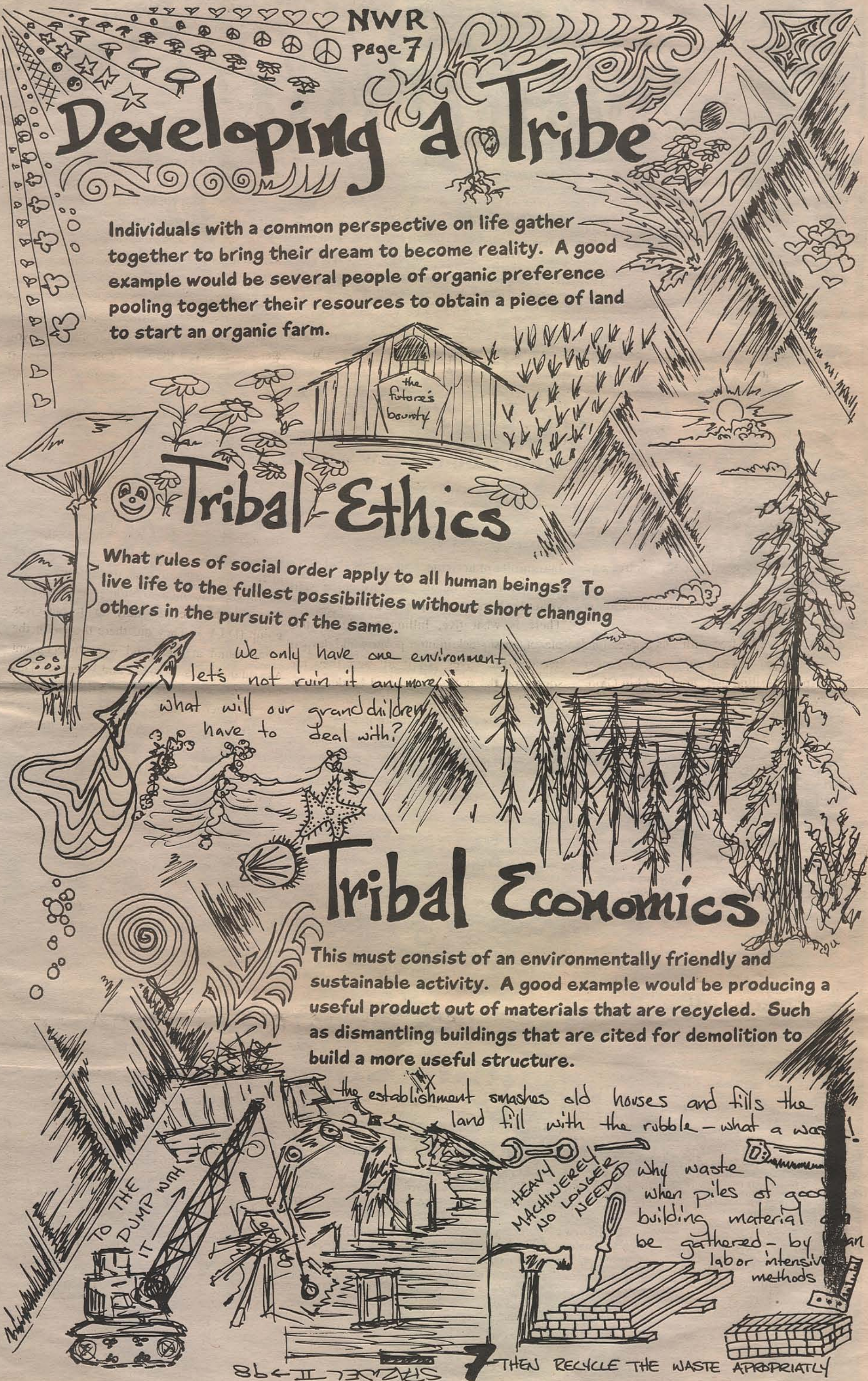
