



According to Environmental Medicine (AAEM) The American Academy of paper on Genetically Modified recently released its position foods stating that "GM foods" pose a serious health risk". The AAEM reported that "Several animal studies indicate serious health including infertility, immune problems, risks associated with GM food, 0 0 regulation, and changes in major organs faulty insulin accelerated aging, and the gastrointestinal system. Most developed nations do not consider GMO's to be safe. In nearly 50 countries around the world, including Japan, Australia, and all of the countries in the European Union, there are significant restrictions or outright bans on the sale and production of GMO's. The United States government, however, has approved GMO's based on studies conducted by the same organizations that not only created GMO's but also profit from their sale. Progressively, more and more Americans are taking matters into their own hands and choosing to opt out of the GMO experiment. Currently, this is hard to do because there are not labels on GM food and President Obama just passed a Monsanto Protection Act, leaving GM foods nearly transparent in the grocery stores. In the United States today, 10 major crops are genetically modified. The total harvest of four of them is primarily GMO, which includes: corn, cottonseed, soy, and canola. A few tips to help avoid buying GMO foods include: by organic, buy local, look for "Non-GMO Project Verified" labels, and avoid the 4 "at risk" labels mentioned above Also, a list of brands to avoid (such as Kellogg, Nestle, Campbell, Kraft, Pepsi, Gatorade, etc.) can be found at www.organicslant.com.

They believe that the cause may quite possibly be a combination of a fungus, and genetically modified crops. Crops that grow their own pesticides from within. Crops that contain the neonicotinoid pesticide.

Being that I have always been environmentally conscious, this episode of Nature, and the serious demise of the bee population worldwide, affected me greatly. I am very concerned. I worry that most all the foods in my diet may disappear in my lifetime. My heart is heavy for the loss of a wide variety of plants, and even animals in the food chain, due to this manmade collapse of bee colonies. 


