#### Read Luke 15:1-10, 5:31-32

- 1. Briefly summarize the four primary points of Sunday's message.
- 2. Why is this message important for today's Christians? What can happen if this is overlooked? Be specific.
- 3. How were you either encouraged or challenged by Sunday's message? Which point spoke to you?
- 4. What would it look like if you applied these truths in your life? What specific steps will you take this week?

## **Daily Devotions**

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. #### MONDAY // Read Isaiah 53:6, Romans 3:23

- What are some ways you have recently been distracted or tempted to wander away from God? Give an example.
- Take some time to prayerfully confess the wandering sin in your life and ask God for forgiveness. Be specific.
- What are some practical steps you can take this week to protect yourself and stay connected to God?

### TUESDAY // Read Luke 19:10

- Jesus' mission was to "seek and save the lost". What does this imply about non-Christian relationships?
- How does this challenge your current approach? How can thinking through your schedule help build relationships?
- Pray for two people you know who are non-Christians. How can you be more intentional about Jesus? (i.e., invite)

## WEDNESDAY // Read Luke 15:1-2

- Why do you think tax collectors and sinners were drawn to Jesus? What made Him attractive? Be specific.
- As a follower of Jesus, how can you be a person who non-Christians want to be around? (i.e., more like Jesus)
- Given the Pharisees (religious leaders) avoided non-believers, how does this make you feel? How will you change?

#### THURSDAY // Read Luke 15:3-4, 8, Romans 5:8, 2 Corinthians 5:21

- How did the shepherds and the woman go to great lengths to find what was lost? How does this challenge you?
- In what way did God go to the incredible effort to rescue you from sin? Give the highlights of your testimony.
- Who have you given up on to become a Christian? How does 2 Corinthians 4:4-6 encourage you to hang in there?

### FRIDAY // Read Luke 15:5-7, 9-10

- What happens in heaven when someone becomes a Christian? How can this truth be missed by Christians today?
- What will ultimately be the result? How does this encourage you to share your faith? What steps will you take?
- How can you also keep the "joy of your salvation" (Psalm 51:12) throughout the day? Be specific.

### SATURDAY // Read Luke 15:3-32

- What part of the lost son's story is the same or different than the lost coin or sheep? Why was the older son lost?
- What part of the son do you relate to? How is the heart of God expressed in the father? Be specific.
- How does this encourage you? What are some ways you can apply this truth today? Pray about it right now.
