Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Exodus 2:23–25 // John 8:31–36

- Where have you been managing a sin you were meant to be delivered from?
- God “heard,” “remembered,” “saw,” and “knew.” Write down the thing you have not yet said out loud to Him. He already sees it, and He moves toward the groaning, not away from it.

TUESDAY // Read Genesis 3:1–7 // Colossians 3:1–4

- The serpent's offer was never just fruit, it was a new identity: you will be like God. What area of your life are trying to “lord over”?
- Paul says your life is hidden with Christ in God, not displayed, not defended, not earned. What would it mean to you to rest not in what you do, but who are you loved by?

WEDNESDAY // Read Exodus 6:6–7 // 1 Corinthians 6:19–20

- “Redeem” is a market word. It means a price was paid to free someone who could not free himself. You were not coached out of slavery; you were bought out of it.
- What would change today if you truly believed your worth was set by the price He paid rather than the results you produce?

THURSDAY // Read Leviticus 25:39–42 // Galatians 5:1, 13

- God releases His people from slavery and then says, “they are my servants.” Freedom is not the absence of a master. It is being given the right one.
- Christ set us free for freedom, but Paul warns that freedom can be spent on self. How can you use your freedom to serve others today?

FRIDAY // Read Isaiah 43:1–4 // Romans 8:1, 15–17

- “I have called you by name, you are mine.” Your name is not what you have accomplished, what you own, or what was done to you. It is what He calls you.
- Meditate on the word “Abba.” Slaves do not speak to a master that way. Sons and daughters do. What does it mean to be the son/daughter of God rather than His servant?

SATURDAY // Read Deuteronomy 10:17–19 // Acts 16:32–34

- Israel's hospitality was rooted in memory: love the sojourner, for you were sojourners in Egypt. People who remember being rescued make room for others.
- The jailer washed their wounds and set a table the same hour he believed. Freedom showed up as an open door. Whose name comes to mind when you ask, “who could I invite in this week?”

MEDITATION VERSE: “So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.” — John 8:36
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
