Point #1

- a) Read John 1:29. Explain why John would refer to Jesus as "the lamb of God". Why is this important?
- b) What does Point #1 prevent from happening when talking about Jesus with non-Christians? Be specific.
- c) In what way can this important truth get lost today? Give an example. How does this reminder help you?

Point #2

- a) Read John 1:30-34. Given John was preaching a baptism of repentance, why did Jesus get baptized?
- b) What is meant that Jesus would baptize with the "Holy Spirit"? How does this relate to Point #2?
- c) In what way can this both challenge and encourage? What has been your experience with Point #2?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read John 1:29, Exodus 12:1-14

- Explain the history of the Jewish sacrificial system as presented in Exodus 12. What did it provide?
- When Jesus is described as the "lamb of God", what does this imply? How would Jews have understood this?
- In what way have you seen "Passover" celebrations continue with Jews today? Why are Christians different?

TUESDAY // Read John 1:29, Isaiah 53:6-7, Matthew 26:1-5, 1 Corinthians 5:7

- How does Jesus being the lamb of God explain Him being a Savior? How does the cross relate?
- In what way did Jesus fulfill the perpetual Jewish sacrificial system? (i.e., "takes away the sin of the world")
- Why is this important when talking to a non-Christian about Jesus? How can this easily get lost in a discussion?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 1:29, Ephesians 2:8-9, 1 Peter 2:24

- In what way does Jesus being the lamb of God relate to God's mercy and forgiveness? Be specific.
- How does this also relate to saving faith? What happens when this is removed from the identity of Jesus?
- What has been your experience with people talking about a different Jesus? How can you protect against this?

THURSDAY // Read John 1:30-32, Matthew 3:13-17, Mark 1:9-10, Luke 3:21-22, Matthew 28:20

- Given that John was preaching a baptism of repentance, why did Jesus get baptized? (i.e., Jesus was sinless)
- In what way did the baptism of Jesus reveal the trinity? How did it also demonstrate Jesus being anointed?
- How does this change your perspective? Given baptism is now Christian obedience, how does this effect you?

FRIDAY // Read John 1:33-34, 3:1-5, Ephesians 3:13-14, 2 Corinthians 5:17

- What did John mean by saying Jesus would baptize with the "Holy Spirit"? How did this relate to Nicodemus?
- What does this imply about Jesus being a life changer? In what way does this happen to every Christian?
- How should this help build confidence in being a Christian? How has this happened to you? Be specific.

SATURDAY // Read John 1:29-34, Revelation 5:5-17

- Since the beginning of John 1, Jesus was referred to as the Logos, Light, and now Lamb. How do they relate?
- In what way will the "Lamb of God" continue to be an eternal name that will refer to Jesus? Why?
- How does this truth highlight the real identity of Jesus? Why will this be countercultural today?
