

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read John 8:12, Exodus 13:18-22, Psalm 27:1

- How does the Old Testament present light and darkness in terms of spiritual truth? Be specific.
- Given that Jesus was talking to the Pharisees in John 8:12, how would they have interpreted it?
- Why would this have been challenging? In what way can this same interpretation apply in today's culture?

TUESDAY // Read John 8:12, 1:2-5, 9, 1 John 1:5-7, Ephesians 5:8-10, Romans 13:1, Colossians 1:13

- Explain the difference between walking in darkness vs. walking in light. Why is this only a Christian truth?
- In what way does this relate to daily decision making? Give an example. Why is this important to understand?
- How does this truth encourage you to stay focused on Jesus throughout the year? What steps will you take?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 8:12, Psalm 119:105, Proverbs 6:23, 2 Peter 1:19

- Given the Jews viewed the Old Testament as providing light for everyday life, how does this relate to Jesus?
- What does this imply about the importance of the New Testament in the life of every Christian today?
- How will you take this same perspective into 2023? Be specific. How can "Daily Devotions" help?

THURSDAY // Read John 8:13-17, Deuteronomy 17:6, 19:15

- Why did the Pharisees tell Jesus "your testimony is not true"? How were they upholding the law?
- In what way did the response of Jesus uphold the law and challenge the Pharisees' viewpoint?
- What did Jesus demonstrate when it comes to responding to spiritual pushback? How does this help you?

FRIDAY // Read John 8:13-20, 15:18-19, Matthew 10:22

- What underlying motives did the Pharisees have when it came to the ministry of Jesus? (i.e. arrest Him)
- Why were they not successful in accomplishing their goals? How did this relate to God's timing and will?
- In what way does this relate to every Christian who tries to follow Jesus? How does this encourage you?

SATURDAY // Read John 8:12-20, Matthew 5:14-16, 2 Corinthians 4:1-6

- Explain why living out the Christian life will have both a positive and a negative response on others.
- How can this be easier around Christmas time compared to the rest of the year? Be specific.
- What can happen if this truth isn't understood? (i.e., compromise, etc.) How does this prepare you for 2023?
