Point #1

- a) Read John 8:37-40. What debate was taking place between the Jews and Jesus? How does heritage relate?
- b) Why is this distinction important when it comes to becoming a Christian? How does Point #1 support this truth?
- c) From a spiritual standpoint, how were you raised? What was required in order for you to apply Point #1?

Point #2

- a) Read John 8:41-47. How did Jesus expose the source of the Pharisee's rejection? Why was this important?
- b) What spiritually changes when someone becomes a Christian? How does Point #2 relate? Be specific.
- c) Why does this ultimately lead to spiritual warfare for every Christian? How does Point #2 help confirm your faith?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read John 8:37-40, Genesis12:1-3, 17:15-16, 22:15-18, Hebrews 6:15

- Explain why Jews would base their position before God through Abraham. Why would they be confident?
- In what way did Jesus confront their claim? Be specific. What did Jesus expose by doing this?
- How can a similar confidence occur today when it comes to being a Christian? How does this adjust you?

TUESDAY // Read John 8:39-40, Matthew 4:17, Luke 13:1-5, 9:57-62, Acts 2:36-38

- Explain what is necessary in order for someone to become a Christian. (Hint: choice)
- Why is this important to understand? How can history, heritage, or family faith cause confusion?
- From a spiritual standpoint, how were you raised? How are you similar or different? What does this teach you?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 8:39-40. 3:1-8. Luke 5:10

- Why did Jesus call out the Pharisees plot to kill him? What distinction did He make about Abraham?
- In what way does this highlight becoming a Christian and being saved? How does Luke 5:10 relate?
- Describe how you became a Christian. How would you respond to someone claiming to be born a Christian?

THURSDAY // Read John 8:41-45, 16:4-11, 2 Corinthians 5:17, Titus 3:4-7

- Explain what spiritually takes place when someone becomes a Christian. (i.e., baptism of the Holy Spirit)
- In what way does this help explain why the Pharisees failed to understand the message of Jesus?
- What has been your experience with the leading of the Holy Spirit? How does this help confirm your faith?

FRIDAY // Read John 8:44-47, Genesis 2:15-17, 3:1-5, 1 John 3:8-10

- How did Jesus expose the spiritual source of the Pharisees opposition? Why was this important to do?
- Explain how this relates to every non-Christian. Be specific. How does this help you understand opposition?
- What changes when someone becomes a Christian? How did this happen for you? Be specific.

SATURDAY // Read John 8:44-47, Ephesians 6:10-13, 1 John 4:4

- Why is every Christian involved in a spiritual battle? How is it different than being a non-Christian?
- In what way can this get confused with people, perspective and rational? Give an example.
- What has been your experience with spiritual warfare? How does the promise of 1 John 4:4 make you feel?
