

Point #1

- a) Read John 10:1-10. Why do you think Jesus used a sheep/shepherd allegory to present the benefits of the Gospel?
- b) What is the function of a door in a sheepfold? How does this relate to Jesus and being "saved"? Be specific.
- c) In what way is Point #1 the primary benefit of becoming a Christian? Share how you walked through the door.

Point #2

- a) Read John 10:11-13. Explain what Jesus was highlighting by calling himself the "good" shepherd.
- b) In what way is this different than a "hired hand"? What does this imply about value? How does Point #2 relate?
- c) How does this challenge a typical view of God? (e.g., judge, punishment, etc.) How does Point #2 adjust you?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read John 10:1-6, Psalm 23, 79:13, 80:1, 100:3

- Why would an allegory about sheep and a shepherd have been familiar to those listening to Jesus?
- What would have been the spiritual application from an Old Testament perspective? Be specific.
- Why would the crowd have not understood the application Jesus intended? (c.f., v. 6). What does this teach you?

TUESDAY // Read John 10:7-10, 14:6, Matthew 7:7-8, Revelation 3:7-8

- Explain the function of a door as it relates to a sheepfold. Why is this necessary and what does it provide?
- What spiritual truth was Jesus teaching by referring to himself as the door? How does "abundant life" relate?
- In what way is this the central truth & benefit of the Gospel? How does this encourage you to walk through the door?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 10:10, Jeremiah 23:1-2, Matthew 21:13, 23:13, 15, 25

- Given a sheepfold door protects the sheep, how might Jesus have been contrasting the Pharisees to Himself?
- How were the Pharisees spiritually stealing and destroying? Give an example. Why is this important to recognize?
- How can this same thing happen today? What does this highlight about the benefits of becoming a Christian?

THURSDAY // Read John 10:11-13, 3:16, Mark 10:45, Romans 5:7-9

- Why did Jesus refer to himself as a "good" shepherd? In what way was this different than a "hired hand"?
- Why is this important to understand when it comes to a New Testament perspective of God? How is it a benefit?
- What typically happens if this isn't understood? How does this challenge or adjust your perspective about God?

FRIDAY // Read John 10:11, 15:13, 1 John 3:16, Ephesians 2:8-9

- In what way is a shepherd who "lays down his life" for his sheep unusual? What is implied about value?
- Given that Jesus willingly died on the cross for you, what does this highlight about His value for you?
- How is this truth different than most religions today? (i.e., legalism) Take some time and thank Jesus right now.

SATURDAY // Read John 10:1-13

- As you read and ponder this allegory, what specifically stands out to you and why? (e.g., door, hired hand, etc.)
- How does it encourage and/or challenge you? In what way does it highlight the benefits of Christianity for you?
- Take some time to pray right now, asking God to show you where you have possibly overlooked these benefits.
