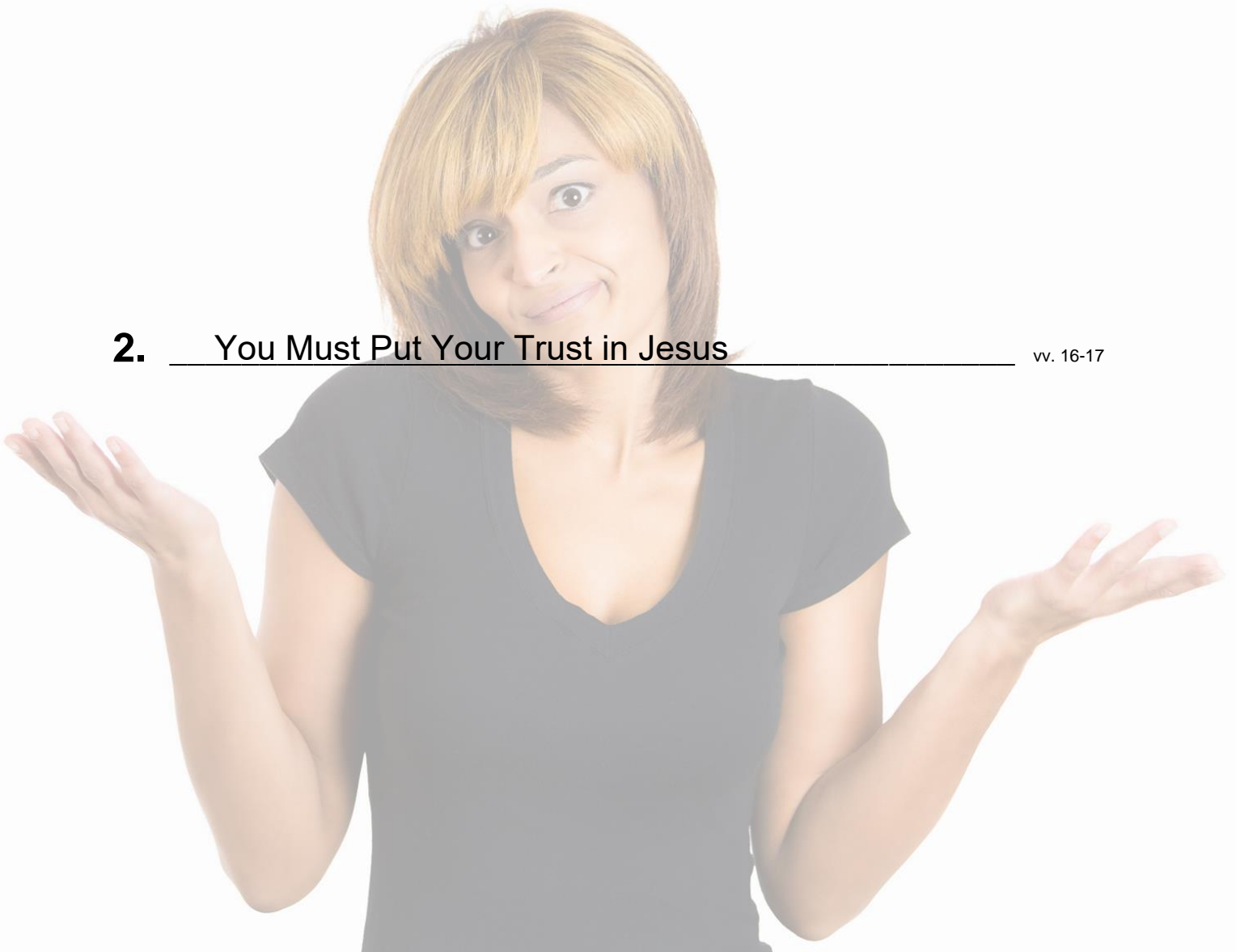

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## Daily Devotions – Passion Week in Chronological Order

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. ### **MONDAY // Read Luke 7:11-15, 2 Corinthians 5:1-9**

- Explain why Paul refers to daily life as living in a tent. What are the timing implications of life and death?
- How does the resurrection of the widow's son prove Paul's point? How does this expand your thinking?
- How comfortable are you with dying? Why? How does today's study adjust your perspective?

### **TUESDAY // Read Luke 7:11-15, John 11:32-44**

- What is similar or different about the two resurrection accounts in today's reading? (i.e., make a list)
- Given that both men (Lazarus and the widow's son) eventually died, what was Jesus actually demonstrating?
- Why is this critically important to understand about death and dying? How should this impact daily life?

### **WEDNESDAY // Read John 20:10-18, 1 Corinthians 15:12-22**

- Why is Easter the centerpiece of Christianity? What would happen if the resurrection wasn't true?
- How does this challenge your view of Christianity? How often do you think about Easter and eternity?
- Why do you think this is a challenge today, especially living in Orange County? What is God teaching you?

### **THURSDAY // Read Luke 7:11-17, John 11:13-27, 45-57**

- Describe the two crowds represented in today's reading in terms of their responses to a resurrection.
- What was the impact? What does this imply about what should be the case on every Easter Sunday?
- Which crowd are you in? Why is this important to recognize? What can you do to help others?

### **FRIDAY // Read Luke 7:16-17, John 3:16-18, 5:24, 10:27-28, 14:6, Romans 5:6-9**

- Why is Christianity different than another religion, philosophy or moralistic ideal today?
- In what way was Jesus sent on a rescue mission? Who needs rescuing? Why? What is at stake?
- How does Easter and the widow's son prove the rescue was a success? Have you been rescued? Explain.

### **SATURDAY // Read Luke 7:16-17, 16:19-31, Revelation 1:1-18**

- Explain what Jesus was teaching in Luke 16:19-31. How does this make you feel? Why?
- In what way do you see this being minimized today? Why? How does this ultimately relate to Easter?
- Why is it important to consider death in your approach to living and living in your approach to dying?
