

# **Daily Devotions**

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. #### MONDAY // Read John 11:55-12:2, Numbers 9:9-14, 2 Chronicles 30:17

- What O.T. truths motivated people to arrive early at the Passover festival? What was the other motivation?
- In what way were Martha, Mary, and Lazarus taking a risk by having Jesus over for dinner?
- What does this highlight about their devotion to Jesus? How does this encourage you today? Be specific.

### TUESDAY // Read John 12:3-6, Matthew 26:6-9, Mark 14:3-5

- As you read all three accounts of Jesus visiting Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, what is similar and different?
- How does the Gospel of John focus more on Judas? Why is this important to consider when reading John?
- Given that Judas ultimately betrayed Jesus, how is this a warning to all people claiming to follow Jesus?

#### WEDNESDAY // Read John 12:4-6, Matthew 23:1-36

- Why did Judas have a problem with Mary anointing Jesus? In what way was Judas being duplicitous?
- How were the Pharisees similar? Given the disciples trusted Judas, how is this a warning to all Christians?
- What are some ways you can be tempted into spiritual duplicity? Be specific. How will you protect yourself?

## THURSDAY // Read John 12:7-8, Matthew 22:36-39

- Why did Mary anoint Jesus with ointment? (Hint: last rites) How did Jesus correct Judas regarding his perspective?
- In what way was this a priority adjustment? Why will this always be something that can easily happen to Christians?
- How can double-checking motives help? What areas of your life need double-checking? Prayerfully do this now.

### FRIDAY // Read John 12:7-8, Matthew 16:24, Luke 9:23-25, Mark 10:17-22

- When it comes to becoming a Christian, what did Jesus mean by saying "pick up your cross"? Be specific.
- What does this imply about a primary struggle in the Christian life? How did Judas demonstrate this struggle?
- What is God bringing to mind about this issue in your life? How can you prevent a Judas drift from taking place?

### SATURDAY // Read John 12:4-8, Luke 14:7-11, Philippians 2:3, James 3:14-16

- How did Judas covertly elevate himself over Jesus and the other disciples? How is this the opposite of humility?
- What is a primary indicator if you are being self-serving or God-serving? (Hint: relationship to others)
- In what way are you at risk of a Judas drift? What specific steps will you take today to prevent this from happening?
