


The 2-Step Process

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read John 12:20-24, Romans 6:11-12, Galatians 2:20, Colossians 2:11-13

- In what way did Jesus respond to the request by the Greeks? How did He potentially address their selfish agenda?
- Explain the spiritual application of a grain of wheat that dies. (i.e., dying to self) Why is this important?
- Why will this be a challenge? How might God be calling you to die to self and be fruitful this week? Be specific.

TUESDAY // Read John 12:24-25, Matthew 16:24-28, Luke 12:16-21

- What priority lesson was Jesus teaching when it comes to "loving" and "hating" life? Be specific.
- How can this potentially be taken out of context? How does verse 24 keep verse 25 in context?
- In what way does this challenge your current focus and priorities? How does this encourage you to change today?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 12:24-25, Philippians 2:3-12, 1 Peter 5:6

- Why will humility always be the way to a fruitful walk with Jesus? How was Jesus the ultimate example of this?
- In what way does this relate to John 12:24-25? How does this help you better understand dying to self?
- How might God be humbling you this week? What choice can you make to stay under God's "mighty hand"?

THURSDAY // Read John 12:26, 15:5-6, 10, Galatians 3:24, Luke 14:27

- What do you picture relationally when it comes to a servant and master? How would you describe a good servant?
- Given Christians are called to follow Jesus like a good servant, what does this imply about obedience?
- Why is this a different discussion than legalism? Be specific. What area of your life do you need to be a better servant?

FRIDAY // Read John 12:26, Ephesians 4:30-32, Galatians 5:22-26

- In what way will God's Spirit prompt us to biblical obedience? What will it ultimately look like? Give an example.
- What spiritually happens when disobedience takes place? What does this imply about Christianity that works?
- How would you rate your level of biblical obedience? What is God teaching you about getting in step with Him?

SATURDAY // Read John 12:25-26, Luke 18:18-23

- In what way did the discussion between Jesus and the rich ruler directly relate to John 12:25-26?
- How does this rich ruler demonstrate the same struggle we have in Orange County, California?
- What does this imply about the risk we all face? How has God been speaking to you this week? Be specific.
