Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read John 12:36b-38, Isaiah 53, Matthew 23:37-39

- How does John 12:38 support John 12:37? What does this highlight about the need for Isaiah 53 to be fulfilled?
- Why will unbelief always be part of sharing the Gospel? How does God feel about this truth? (Mt. 23:37-39)
- How does this help your perspective when talking to non-Christians about Jesus? Be specific.

TUESDAY // Read John 12:39-40, Isaiah 6:10, Romans 1:24, 26, 28

- Explain the dynamic that takes place when someone continues to harden their heart toward God.
- How does "God gave them over" relate? In what way can this truth be misunderstood? Be specific.
- In what way is this a warning for every non-believer to keep an open heart? How does this challenge you?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 12:37-41, Matthew 13:10-15, Luke 8:9-15, 1 John 2:19

- Why did Jesus start teaching in parables after He was well into His ministry? How does this relate to John 12:37-41?
- In what way does the Parable of the Sower also emphasize this truth? (i.e., open heart, types of seed, etc.)
- How can keeping an open heart, surrendered heart, and teachable heart apply to both Christians and non-Christians?

THURSDAY // Read John 12:42-43, 19:38-42, Acts 6:7, 15:1-5

- Why did John contrast the unbelieving crowd to some believing Pharisees? Why were the Pharisees challenged?
- What does Acts 15:1-5 highlight about the spiritual baggage that can take place? Be specific.
- In what way can these same challenges occur today? Give an example. How can you prevent this in your life?

FRIDAY // Read John 12:44-48, 3:16-17, Matthew 25:31-46

- Describe the purpose and mission of Jesus and His coming 2000 years ago. How will it be different at His return?
- In what way did Jesus try to build credibility with the crowd He was speaking to in John 12:44-48?
- How was it also a warning? Why do most non-Christians today avoid this truth? Why is this critically important?

SATURDAY // Read John 12:49-50, 14:6, Matthew 10:28, 23:15, 2 Peter 2:4-9

- What is eternally at stake when a non-Christian decides to follow Jesus? Be specific.
- What does this highlight about counting the cost? How can this get lost today? (e.g. deconstruction)
- How does reframing the Gospel in terms of a commandment challenge deconstruction? How does it challenge you?

MEDITATION VERSE: ⁴⁶I have come into the world as light, so that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness.
