Grow Group Discussion Questions

A grow group is 8-16 people who get together weekly to study God's word and the previous Sunday's message. There is a time of discussion, support, encouragement, and learning how the message applies to daily life. *PCC uses the ESV* (*English Standard Version*).

Point #1

- a) Read John 13:31-35. As Jesus told the disciples He was leaving, why do you think He told them to love each other?
- b) How should this relate to being a healthy church? In what way does Point #1 adjust the way you've viewed church?
- c) How does this challenge your perspective on evangelism? What are ways you can step into Point #1 at PCC?

Point #2

- a) Read John 13:36-38. Why do you think Peter was so insistent on going with Jesus? (e.g. fear, sadness, etc.)
- b) How did Jesus respond? In what way does this relate to Point #2? Why is this important within the context of a church?
- c) Why will Point #2 always be a personal challenge? How can your Grow Group help you grow in this area? Be specific.

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Leviticus 19:18, John 13:2-5, 12-15, 31-34, 1 John 3:11, 23, 4:21

- What does the O.T. teach about loving one another? (Lev. 19:18) Why did Jesus call it a "new" command?
- In what way did Jesus demonstrate a new approach by washing the disciples' feet? Be specific.
- Given this is the ultimate goal for every Christian, what does this imply about a church? How does this adjust you?

TUESDAY // Read John 13:34, Romans 12:10-18, Gal. 5:13, Eph. 4:2, 32, Col. 3:13, 1 Thess. 5:11

- As Jesus was essentially telling His disciples goodbye, what was He anticipating by telling them to love each other?
- In what way did the Apostle Paul tell the 1st century churches the same thing? (e.g. "one another's")
- What does this highlight about the requirement for today's churches? How can you be part of this effort at PCC?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 13:34, 1 Corinthians 12:14-26

- How does the body illustration used in 1 Cor. 12 demonstrate how a church should work together? Be specific.
- What is the ultimate purpose for using spiritual gifts within the church? How does this relate to loving one another?
- How are you using your spiritual gifts at PCC? How is God prompting you to step into Team PCC?

THURSDAY // Read John 13:35, 1 John 3:10, Matthew 5:14-16, 25:31-46

- When you think of effective evangelism today, what do you picture? How did Jesus picture effective evangelism?
- In what way do you think Christians and churches today have confused the issue? Give an example.
- What are some specific ways you think PCC can be more evangelistic according to Jesus? How will you help?

FRIDAY // Read John 13:38, Matthew 26:31-35, Mark 14:29, Luke 22:31-34

- Why did Jesus tell the disciples they couldn't go where He was going? Why do you think Peter wanted to go?
- Given Peter's overconfidence, what does this reveal about his self-awareness? How did Jesus address it?
- What does this reveal about unhealthy spiritual patterns? How can this happen in the church? How can this be avoided?

SATURDAY // Read John 13:36-38, Romans 7:18-20

- Compare and contrast Peter's self-awareness with the Apostle Paul's and describe what is the same or different.
- What does this highlight about the importance of knowing yourself? Why will this always be a challenging topic?
- How will Christians who work on knowing themselves lead to a healthy church? What practical steps will you take?

MEDITATION VERSE: ³⁴A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. ³⁵By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."
