Point #1

- a) Read John 15:22-25. Why did Jesus encourage the disciples that the opposition will be held to account?
- b) Why would Point #1 be an encouragement? How might they have been tempted to respond without this truth?
- c) In what way can you be tempted to impose your own justice toward non-Christians? How does Point #1 adjust you?

Point #2

- a) Read John 15:26-16:1. How did Jesus encourage the disciples to fulfill the Great Commission? (Matthew 28:9-20)
- b) Why might they have been hesitant to "bear witness"? How would verse 26 have helped them to step into Point #2?
- c) How often do you "bear witness"? What does this say about a spiritual battle? How can your Grow Group help you?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read John 15:22-23, Matthew 23:1-36

- Explain the truth behind John 15:22. What does this highlight about accountability and the spiritual battle?
- In what way can those who oppose Jesus still claim to follow God? Give an example.
- How can this happen today? Why is this important to recognize in light of the spiritual battle? Be specific.

TUESDAY // Read John 15:24-25, 8:31-41, Hebrews 2:1-4, Matthew 11:21-24, Psalm 35:19

- If you remove the miracles of Jesus from His ministry, what ultimately happens to His authority? Be specific.
- What does Jesus say takes place when people attempt to do this? How does this relate to a spiritual battle?
- In what way do you see this taking place today? How does the warning from Jesus help you to not bog down?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 15:22-25, Romans 12:19-21, Matthew 13:24-30, Hebrews 10:26-31

- Why does Jesus encourage the disciples that those who oppose them and the Gospel will be held to account?
- How might they have been tempted to react? Why? What does this highlight about the temptations of the enemy?
- How can you be tempted to impose your own justice toward those who reject the Gospel? How will you avoid this?

THURSDAY // Read John 15:26, 14:7, 14:16-17, Acts 1:7-8

- In what way would the promise of a "helper" (Holy Spirit) have been an encouragement to the disciples?
- Why is the work of the Holy Spirit necessary in a spiritual battle? How will the Holy Spirit actually "bear witness"?
- How does Acts 1:7-8 play into it? What does this imply takes place when you share your faith with non-Christians?

FRIDAY // Read John 15:27-16:1, Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 2:1-14

- In what way did Jesus hold the disciples accountable to the Great Commission? Why might they have bailed out?
- In what way did Peter demonstrate the interaction with the Holy Spirit and a responsibility to share the Gospel?
- What does this imply about your role in the spiritual battle to "bear witness"? What changes do you need to make?

SATURDAY // Read John 15:22-16:1, John 3:1-13, 7:45-52, 19:38-39

- As you read the account of Nicodemus the Pharisee, how does he demonstrate an open heart to truth?
- In what way was this different than the other Pharisees? Why is this important to recognize?
- How does this week's study help you with SOP's needed to handle today's spiritual battle? Be specific.
