

Point #1

a) Read John 17:1a. Explain what Jesus meant by His "hour" had come. Why is this a critical truth to understand? b) What happens to the Gospel when Point #1 is overlooked? What is at stake? How does Point #1 adjust you?

Point #2

a) Read John 17:1b-3. Who has the authority to "give" eternal life? Why? How does this relate to Point #2?b) How does this also help explain the exclusivity of Christianity? How does Point #2 help protect the Gospel?

Point #3

a) Read John 17:4-5. Why did Jesus ask the Father to "glorify" Him? In what ways does this relate to Point #3?b) Why is Point #3 critical to the Gospel? Be specific. What does it teach you about your afterlife? Be specific.

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read John 17:1a, 2:1-4, 7:1-6, 28-30, 8:20, 12:23-24, 27-28, Mark 10:45

- Why did Jesus often tell others that His hour had not yet come? What changed during the last supper?
- What does this highlight about the purpose and ministry of Jesus? (i.e., the cross) Why is this important?
- In what way has the world redefined the purpose and ministry of Jesus? How does this help you stay focused?

TUESDAY // Read John 17:1a, 1:29, Romans 3:23-25, 6:23, 2 Cor. 5:20-21, Luke 22:17-20, Hebrews 10:1-4

- Given the "hour" refers to the crucifixion of Jesus, how does this relate to heaven and the afterlife? Be specific.
- What does this imply about living a good life and earning your way to heaven? Why does this include everyone?
- In what way has the world today missed this critical truth when it comes to Jesus? How does this adjust you?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 17:1b-2, 3:16-17, Luke 2:11, Ephesians 2:8-10, Romans 10:9-10

- What does it mean that Jesus has "authority over all flesh"? (Hint: sinful nature) Why do we not have this authority?
- Why is it important to also recognize that Jesus has the authority to "give" eternal life? What is the alternative?
- Given this is the central message of the Gospel, explain how Jesus provides for the afterlife. Be specific.

THURSDAY // Read John 17:3, 3:35-36, 14:6, Acts 4:12

- What is Jesus implying by saying the "only true God"? What does He also imply by including Himself?
- What does this highlight about the exclusivity of the Christian faith? How does this protect the Gospel?
- In what way does this always come back to the cross when compared to other religious leaders? Be specific.

FRIDAY // Read John 17:4-5, 1:1, 14, 11:25-26, 1 Corinthians 15:16-17, 1 Peter 1:3-4

- Why did Jesus ask the father to "glorify" Him? What does this highlight about the preincarnate state of Jesus?
- In what way does this also relate to the resurrection? What happens to the Gospel if there was no resurrection?
- What does the resurrection of Jesus teach you about your personal resurrection and the afterlife?

SATURDAY // Read John 17:1-5, Matthew 23:15, 33, Luke 12:1-10, 1 Corinthians 15:19

- Why is it important to believe in hell as much as it is to believe in heaven when it comes to Christianity?
- What happens to the Gospel if the topic of hell is rejected by a non-Christian? (i.e., "saved" from what?)
- How does the topic of hell make you feel? Why should it motivate Christians to share the Gospel?

MEDITATION VERSE: ²⁰...We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. **2 Corinthians 5:20b-21**
