<u> Point #1</u>

a) Read John 17:20-23. How might the accolades of Palm Sunday prompted Jesus to pray for the disciples' unity?

b) In what way will Point #1 be a powerful testimony for the Gospel in today's world? Give some examples.

c) How does this adjust your spiritual priorities? As you consider your struggling relationships, how can Point #1 help?

Point #2

- a) Read John 17:24-26. Why is loving others the most important practice in your walk with Jesus? (1 John 4:7-8)
- b) How can this get easily overlooked in the name of other spiritual disciplines? How has this happened to you?
- c) Review 1 Cor. 13:4-8 and share the areas of your life that God is prompting you to change. Be specific.

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read John 17:20-21, 10:30-33, Matthew 26:57-66

- Why did Jesus highlight the unity between Him and the Father in His prayer? (i.e., who was listening?)
- Given that Jesus has mentioned this truth multiple times to the disciples, what does this highlight? Be specific.
- In what way did the trial of Jesus also highlight this truth? Why is this important to recognize? (i.e., modeling)

TUESDAY // Read John 17:22-23, Luke 22:24-27, 19:29-38

- Given Palm Sunday had already taken place, how might the disciples have been tempted to be competitive?
- In what way could this have prompted Jesus' unity prayer? Why will a competitive spirit always lead to division?
- How do you think Christians today have missed this important part of discipleship? How does this adjust you?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 17:20-23, Matthew 5:23-24, Ephesians 4:3-5, Galatians 5:19-20, Romans 12:18

- Jesus prayed the disciples would be one so that others would "believe". What does this highlight about the Gospel?
- What does this also highlight about the value of unity? Why will unity always be a challenge and require effort?
- As you consider your struggling relationships, how is the gospel being represented? How do you need to change?

THURSDAY // Read John 17:24-26, 3:16, 1 John 4:7-8, 1 Corinthians 13:1-3

- Why is love so important to Jesus? In what way does His prayer reflect this truth during passion week?
- Why should this be the most important practice for every Christian to engage in? (c.f., John 3:16)
- How would you rate your focus on loving others? Why? How does this redefine your "best practices" this week?

FRIDAY // Read John 17:26, 1 Corinthians 13:4-8, Matthew 22:36-40

- Love can be a very confusing word based on emotions and how one feels. How does 1 Cor. 13:4-8 help?
- Why will loving others be a challenge? How does this also relate to unity? How can identifying self-love help?
- As you review the list in 1 Cor. 13:4-8, what specific areas of love do you need to work on today?

SATURDAY // Read John 17:26, Ephesians 4:14-16, Philippians 1:9-11

- In what way has spiritual maturity been defined in today's Christian churches? Be specific.
- Where do you think "love" honestly lands on the list? Why do you think this has happened?
- Before this study, how would you have measured your spiritual growth? Be specific. What do you need to change?

MEDITATION VERSE: ²²The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, ²³I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. **John 17:22-23**
