

Point #1

- a) Read John 18:13-17. Why did Peter lie about knowing Jesus? What does this highlight about the truth of Point #1?
- b) Give an example of how you can fall into this trap. Given lying is satanic (John 8:44), how does Point #1 adjust you?

Point #2

- a) Read John 18:18, 25. Given Peter ended up denying Jesus multiple times, what does it reveal about lying?
- b) Why is Point #2 important to remember? How is God encouraging you to be more on guard? Be specific.

Point #3

- a) Read John 18:26-27. Who knew that Peter was lying multiple times? What does this reveal about Point #3?
- b) Why is this important for every Christian to remember? Be specific. How does Point #3 motivate you to be honest?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message. MONDAY // Read John 18:13-17, Genesis 2:8-9, 15-17, 3:1-4, John 8:44

- How did Satan lie to Eve and ultimately Adam about eating the forbidden fruit? What was the result?
- What does this highlight about the dangers of lying? How did Jesus emphasize this truth in John 8:44?
- In what way do you think Christians have minimized the sin of lying today? How does this adjust you?

TUESDAY // Read John 18:13-17, Matthew 26:31-35, 55-56, 5:37, James 5:12

- In what way did Peter put himself in harm's way by following Jesus after He was arrested? Why?
- How was this different from the other disciples? Why did Peter lie about knowing Jesus?
- What does this highlight about the temptation to lie? How can you fall into this trap? How can you avoid it?

WEDNESDAY // Read John 18:18, 25, Matthew 26:69-74a, Luke 22:54-60a

- Given Peter ended up lying multiple times to those around him, what does it reveal about lying?
- How could Peter have initially responded without lying? What would this have prevented from taking place?
- In what way have you underestimated the impact of a simple lie? What is God teaching you about being on guard?

THURSDAY // Read John 18:18, 25, James 3:6-9

- In what way does James 3:6-9 highlight the need to contain lying? What happens if this doesn't take place?
- Given lying can take place in many ways (i.e., ½ truths, omitting, etc.), how have you rationalized the sin of lying?
- What similar situation do you find yourself needing to be more honest about today? What practical steps will you take?

FRIDAY // Read John 18:26-27, Luke 22:60b-62, Hebrews 12:5-11

- Who knew that Peter way lying about being a disciple of Jesus? What does this reveal about getting away with it?
- Why is this important for every Christian to remember? What will happen if this is minimized or rejected?
- What specific lie do you need to confess and stop doing today? Take time right now to confess and repent.

SATURDAY // Read John 18:13-18, 25-27, Ephesians 4:25, Colossians 3:9, Exodus 20:16

- As you review this week's passage, what has had the most impact on you? Why?
- In what way has this challenged your view of being honest and lying? Be specific.
- What area of deception is God prompting you to address? How will you step into these truths in a practical way?
