Grow Group Discussion Questions

Point #1

- a) Read John 20:24-27a. Why do you think Thomas wouldn't believe the disciples testimony about the resurrection?
- b) What were his conditions for believing? How did Jesus respond? What does this highlight about Point #1?
- c) Why is this important to remember when sharing with skeptical people? How does this personally encourage you?

Point #2

- a) Read John 20:27b-31. How did Jesus' response hold Thomas accountable for his conditions to believe?
- b) Why is Point #2 important to understand when interacting with doubters and skeptics? (i.e., seeking vs. making excuses)
- c) In what way will faith always be a part of becoming a Christian? How has this been true in your life? Be specific.

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read John 20:24-25, 3-8, 14:1-6

- When you compare the response of Thomas with John ("other disciple") to the resurrection, what do you see?
- How was this side of Thomas also expressed in John 14:1-6? What does this reveal about certain people?
- Why is this important to understand when sharing your faith with non-Christians? How does this help you?

TUESDAY // Read John 20:24-27a, Matthew 9:35-38

- What did Thomas require in order to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead? Be specific.
- Why do you think he didn't believe the others' testimony? How might trauma have had something to do with it?
- How did Jesus respond? In what way does this encourage you with doubters in your life? Pray for them by name.

WEDNESDAY // Read John 20:24-27a, 2 Peter 3:8-9

- Given Thomas was struggling with doubt and fear, when did Jesus respond to his conditions to believe?
- Why do you think Jesus took so long? Be specific. What does this highlight about God's timing and our timing?
- In what way can you struggle with God's timing? How does this truth help you trust God and not lose hope?

THURSDAY // Read John 20:27b-29, 15:20

- What did Jesus say to Thomas after He met his conditions to touch and see? How did this hold him accountable?
- Why is this important to understand when it comes to skeptical people? (i.e., true seekers vs. making excuses)
- In what way did Thomas reveal a seeking heart? How can you protect yourself from the skeptical cycle of excuses?

FRIDAY // Read John 20:27b-29, 5:24, Romans 10:14-17

- How did Thomas respond to Jesus showing him His hands and side? How was this a confession of belief?
- Given that Jesus isn't physically here today, what will be required for unbelievers to believe?
- Why will believers today be more "blessed" than Thomas? What does this highlight about a skeptical heart?

SATURDAY // Read John 20:30-31, 3:36, Hebrews 11:1, 6

- Why do you think John let his readers know that he didn't write down all the signs Jesus gave His disciples?
- What does this imply about enough is enough? What does this also imply about the need for proof vs. faith?
- How would you respond to someone who needs more and more proof to believe? How does this adjust you?

MEDITATION VERSE: ²⁴Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life.
