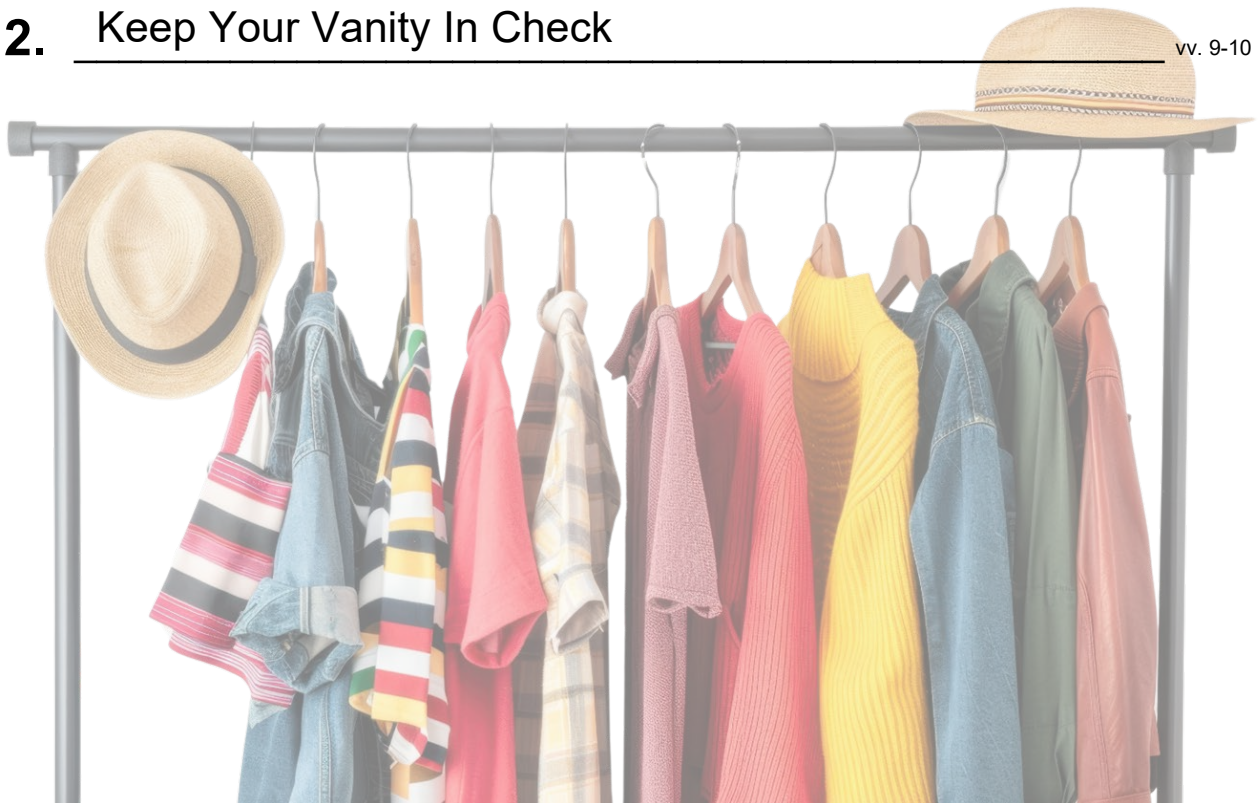

Grow Group Discussion Questions

A grow group is 8-16 people who get together weekly to study God's word and the previous Sunday's message. There is a time of discussion, support, encouragement, and learning how the message applies to daily life. **PCC uses the ESV (English Standard Version).**

Point #1

- Read 1 Timothy 2:8. Explain the problem Paul was addressing with the men in the Ephesian church. Why?
- How does Point #1 relate to how men should look when attending PCC? How can this also relate to women?
- As you consider your relationships at PCC, how does your current approach need to change? Be specific.

Point #2

- Read 1 Timothy 2:9-10. Explain how Paul was addressing a discipleship issue with women in the church.
- Why is this important given today's culture? How can this also apply to men? What is the solution? (i.e., Point #2)
- Given "modesty" and "respectable" are subjective, what do they mean to you? How can you apply Point #2 this week?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read 1 Timothy 2:8, Ephesians 4:3-5, 31-32

- Explain what 1 Timothy 2:8 was addressing with the men in the Ephesian church. Be specific.
- How did Paul do this same thing through his letter to the Ephesians? What was His motivation for the rebuke?
- What does this highlight about the importance of your relationships at PCC? How do you need to change?

TUESDAY // Read 1 Timothy 2:8, Psalm 66:18, Matthew 5:23-24, 6:5-6

- Explain how your relationships at PCC will ultimately impact your prayer life. How did Jesus highlight this truth?
- In what way should this also impact the way you attend PCC? Be specific. How can this apply to men and women?
- Describe a current relationship you are struggling with at PCC. How can you apply 1 Timothy 2:8? Be specific.

WEDNESDAY // Read 1 Timothy 2:8, Galatians 5:19-20, Romans 12:18, Colossians 3:8, John 17:20-23

- In what way did Paul promote the same truth about relationships to both Timothy and other churches?
- When relationships struggle, what is the source of the struggle? How does this help you see this as a priority?
- As you consider your relationships at PCC, how does your approach need to change? What will you do this week?

THURSDAY // Read 1 Timothy 2:9, 1 Peter 3:3

- Why was Paul addressing how women were dressing in the Ephesian church? How does "self-control" relate?
- How is this ultimately an issue of vanity and condition of the heart? How can this damage the church?
- Given that "modesty" and "respectable" are very subjective, what do they mean for you? Be specific.

FRIDAY // Read 1 Timothy 2:9-10, 1 Peter 3:3-4, Ephesians 2:10

- In what way did Paul confront the issue of vanity with the women in the Ephesian church? What was the solution?
- How was this a discipleship issue and adjustment of priorities? (i.e., "good works") How do you see this in culture?
- How can this relate to both men and women? How can you be tempted in this area? How does this adjust you?

SATURDAY // Read 1 Timothy 2:8-10, Colossians 3:17

- As you consider how Paul is encouraging Timothy to address the Ephesian church, what speaks to you?
- How can you relate to both the men and women issues of vanity and relationships? Be specific.
- How does this help keep you in check when it comes to attending PCC? Ask God to make this practical for you.

MEDITATION VERSE: *⁸I desire then that in every place the men should pray, lifting holy hands without anger or quarreling; ⁹likewise also that women should adorn themselves in respectable apparel, with modesty and self-control, not with braided hair and gold or pearls or costly attire...*
